
Item 622-01 – **GB 1d black PI.1a FG** – 1840, GB 1d black PI.1a. (*three margined and fine example position lettered FG*) tied by red Maltese Cross on business folded letter from Gainsborough to Barton. Gainsborough dateline and backstamp. \$500.00



Item $622-02 - \underline{\text{GB 1d black Pl.3 CH}} - 1840$, GB 1d black Pl.3. (four margined, close, clear and fine example position lettered CH) tied by red Maltese Cross on folded cover To Mounmouth. \$500.00



Item 622-03 – <u>1/4 Currency on clothiers letter to Kingston</u> – 1846, Tailors & Army Clothiers folded letter from London England to Kingston UC. This tailor's account was posted unpaid, carried by the Cunard Hibernia from Liverpool to Boston and charged 1/2 Stg converted to 1/4 Currency collect. Arnell attributed this handstamp to Quebce and Montreal. The letter is dated January 1846 supporting the hypothesis that the marking was applied in Montreal. \$100.00



Item 622-04 – In old German, Port Colborne UC to Buffalo – 1840, folded letter written in old Germany mailed from Port Colborne UC to Buffalo. Paid 4½d to the line, exchanged in Queenston and Lewiston and rated 6¢ collect to destination (for up to 30 miles). There were both Mennonite and Amish settlements in Upper Canada including in Port Colborne and Buffalo. The first settlers arrived in 1786. \$100.00



Item 622-05 – <u>Kingston CW Paid 12½¢ - 6d Stg</u> – 1865, stampless cover from Kingston CW paid 12½¢ paying the Allan Line letter rate to Taunton, England (b/s). Carried by the Belgian out of Portland. 6d Stg handstamp (Arnell E9, a year later than recorded) applied in Kingston. \$125.00 SOLD





Item 622-07 – <u>G.F. Nesbitt & Co.essay stationery envelope</u> – c1865, U.S. firm Nesbitt and Company embossed red stamp Canadian essay stationery envelope, diagonal laid paper with lines 27mm apart, 139x83mm. Listed as Webb EN-E4 p.370. \$500.00



Item 622-08 – <u>EN-14 2¢ violet uprated and registered</u> – 1903, 2¢ Jubilee, 1¢ Numeral, 2¢ Provisional tied by fancy cancel on 2¢ violet postal stationery envelope mailed from Ottawa paying 7¢ registered letter rate to St. Catharines (b/s). Reduced at left. EN-14 postally used are very scarce. \$150.00



Item 622-09 – <u>Masonic Cross and Crown privately added</u> – 1899, 2¢ Victoria postal stationery envelope, 148x87mm cross flap, with privately added Truro Masonic Cross and Crown return address c/c. \$25.00




Item 622-10 – Madoc Ont Canada with fancy (1879-1881) – 1880, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel on lady cover from Madoc Ont (3-part dater with Canada) paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa (b/s). This postmark is from recorded from 1879 to 1881 only. Hastings County. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 622-17 – <u>Stony Mountain Manitoba</u> – 1907, 1¢ Edward stationery postcard mailed from Stony Mountain Manitoba, broken circle dated JU 12 07, to New York. The message is a catalogue request. \$20.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 622-18 – Mount Pleasant BC (1891-1908) – 1907, 1¢ Edward tied by Mount Pleasant BC cds on postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to Seattle. A very uncommon Vancouver area office, RF D 1891-1908. \$50.00



Item 622-19 – Knowlton Que florist and seedsman – 1908, 1¢ Edward pair (perfs gum toned) tied by Knowlton Que cds on Raymond Ball Florist and Seedsman c/c cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Hamilton (b/s). \$20.00




Item 622-20 – Mark's Stamp Co. private postcard – 1911, 1¢ Edward tied by Toronto International machine cancel on Mark's Stamp Co. private postcard paying 1¢ PC rate to Ohio. Message relates to Bosnia stamps. \$45.00





Item 622-21 – <u>Flying over the bridge, Lethbridge Alta</u> – 1911, 1¢ Edward tied by Lethbridge Alta duplex cancel (AU 18 11) on "flying high over the bridge" real photo postcard paying 1¢ PC rate to Castor. Perhaps Eugene Ely flying the first ever airplane in Lethbridge, on 14 July 1911. Ely did two flights at the Lethbridge Exhibition that day. \$200.00 SOLD





Item 622-22 – Montreal Engineering Building fire – 1907, 1¢ Edward tied by Montreal duplex cancel (dated AP 8 07) on Engineering building fire real photo postcard to Calgary. Soon after it was gutted by fire on April 5, 1907, the east wall, three upper storeys, most of the roof, and several profesors' work were destroyed. \$50.00



Item 622-23 – <u>6 Alberta covers to Scotland</u> – 1905, lot of 6 Alberta covers franked with 2¢ Edward paying 2¢ Empire letter rate to Scotland (all with Colinton receiver). Offices: Noelton, Midnapore (2, one backflap off), Macleod, High River, Calgary. \$45.00




Item 622-24 – Canadian Siberian Exp Force carried by the Nascopie – 1919, On Active Service censored cover from Army Post Office P.B.2 (Archangel, Northern Russia), Canadian Siberian Expeditionary Force, to Markham Ontario (b/s). Oval PE/C/32 censor marking. This cover was carried aboard the Nascopie from Archangel to England and then to Canada. Canada sent an expeditionary force to Northern Russia from 1918 to 1919. The only Russian ports available were the ice free ports of Murmansk and Archangel. The Nascopie was a unique ship in 1918 as she was the only British vessel that could operate in ice-packed waters. Captain Smellie was in command of this tour of duty. \$750.00





Item 622-34 – Scroll Issue - 8¢ UPU letter rate to Beirut, Syria – 1929, 2¢ Scroll coil strip of 4 tied by Woodstock Ont machine cancel on cover paying 8¢ UPU letter rate to Beirut, Syria (b/s). At the time the First Syrian Republic and today Lebanon. After World War I and the collapse of the Ottoman Empire, Beirut, along with the rest of Lebanon, was placed under the French Mandate. Lebanon achieved independence in 1943. Small opening fault UL. A rare Scroll cover. \$250.00


Item 622-36 – **2¢ Silver Jubilee franking with CPR perfin** – 1936, 1¢ Pictorial, 2¢ Silver Jubilee (7) all with CPR perfin tied by Tompkins Sask cds on CP cover paying 15¢ double weight regsitered letter rate to St. Jean Port Joli. Numerous RPO markings via Montreal and Quebec City. Winkled at right and bottom right affecting stamps but still a very scarce and attractive CPR perfin cover with Silver Jubs. \$75.00




Item 622-37 – <u>Advanced Posting Service with circular datestamp</u> – 1933, 2¢ Medallion tied by Saint John NB DE 22 33 (indicia 24) circular datestamp on cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. A much scarcer APS cover with a cds instead of machine. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>




Item 622-38 – Windermere BC Experimental Station - c1930, 10¢ Library (4) tied by grid cancel on Experimental Station Windermere BC mailing tag paying 40¢ parcel rate to New Westminster. Crease, very pretty and scarce. \$175.00







Item 622-39 – <u>Bache Peninsula NWT (1926-1933) via S.S. Beothic</u> – 1930, out of date 2¢ Maple Leaf stationery card mailed from Bache Peninsula NWT to Oakland Calif. This Post Office was in operation from 1926 to 1933 with Police Officer Cpl. H.W. Stallworthy as Postmaster (1930-1933, see reverse). The card was carried aboard the S.S. Beothic (*the Canadian cargo ship in service 1925–40*), entered the mail in North Sydney N.S. The Beothic could not reach the post at Bache Peninsula, so landed at near by Cape Rutherford and mail exchanged at this location and time. Hertzberg philatelic origin card. \$250.00





Item 622-40 – Moravian Missions, Nain Labrador – 1913, Newfoundland 2¢ Victoria UPU stationery card mailed from Nain Labrador, AP 18 13, written in German by Carl A. Martin, Superintendent of the Moravian Missions in Labrador to Germany. Labrador TPO and St. John's (b/s). \$200.00





Item 622-41 – <u>S.S. Beothic Newfoundland and Labrador Patrol</u> – 1914, 1¢ Admiral (2, perfs gum toned) tied by North Sydney NS cds on postcard paying 2¢ Empire postcard rate to England. The message is datelined S.S. Beothic c/o Job Brothers St. John's N.F. January 1914 (*the first Beothic ship owned by Thetis Steam Ship Co Ltd*). The card entered the mail in North Sydney, the ship worked as a sealer of Newfoundland and Labrador. In 1915, she struck a submerged iceberg off the Newfoundland coast and she was able to return to St. John's. Reverse is Grand Falls Exploits Rover view No.1, by E.W. Lyon. \$350.00

The Georgiy Sedov was a Soviet ice-breaker fitted with steam engines. She was originally the Newfoundland seal fishery support vessel S.S. Beothic, renamed after Russian captain and polar explorer Georgy Yakovlevich Sedov in 1915. She was the first Soviet drifting ice station, the culmination of a decade of high-latitude exploration.





Item 622-42 – Northwest Passage – 1938, 3¢ Mufti tied by Coppermine NWT cds (JUL 23 38) on cover to Edmonton, carried by motor ship "Fort Ross" to Perry River arriving SEP 1938. Left Perry River NWT by motor ship Tudlik reaching King William post, Gjoa Haven Harbour in OC 1938. Left King William by dog team in April 1939 to catch motor ship Aklavik. The Aklavik returned to Gjoa Haven and delivered the mail to M.S. Seal which arrived at Fort Ross SEP 17 39. Too late to connect with the Nascopie that year. Left Fort Ross SEP 12 1940 by the RMS Nascopie stopped at Ivigtut Greenland, Montreal OC 14 transit, Edmonton OC 17 1940 (b/s). The cover is signed and certified by the Postal Supt R. Hale as first mail going through the Northwest Passage Route (West to East). Further signed by Postmaster Coppermine, HBC staff at Fort Ross, EAP staff, Bishop of Arctic and JRE Sparks, the Postmaster of the Nascopie. \$500.00






Item 622-43 – **Bowring Brothers Ltd Coastal Mail Service** – 1912, Newfoundland 2¢ Coat of Arms tied by grid cancel on Bowring Brothers Ltd Coastal Mail Service cover from Coastal North TPO paying 2¢ letter rate to New Jersey via St. John's (b/s). This letter was carried by coastal steamer has a Coastal North TPO JY 15 12. The Bowring Brothers had the mail contract for the Labrador coast with more than 40 offices to service. The growth of the postal system in Labrador was certainly due to the use of the coastal ships. It is interesting that the first RPO was started on the Labrador ships in 1880. \$250.00 **SOLD**





Item 622-49 – <u>Two official airmail cinderella stamps</u> – 1946, 10¢ Peace, 17¢ CE3 tied by Montreal cds on cover paying 27¢ airmail registered special delivery letter rate to New Jersey via New York (b/s). Reverse with two official airmail cinderella stamps. These airmail stickers were issued by the Canadian Post Office Department in 1939. Six different designs were made, they are very scarce on covers!!. They were directed to be placed directly on the letter and not the envelope to encourage a prompt reply by airmail. They were offered to public in booklets containing 5 panes of all English or all French stamps. Rouletted, gummed. Lafrenière p.292. \$125.00 SOLD



Arrived at Vancouver wicket enquiry office OC 29 62 and charged 4¢ paid with two 2¢ Wilding regular stamps. Roughly opened at top. \$75.00 SOLD
