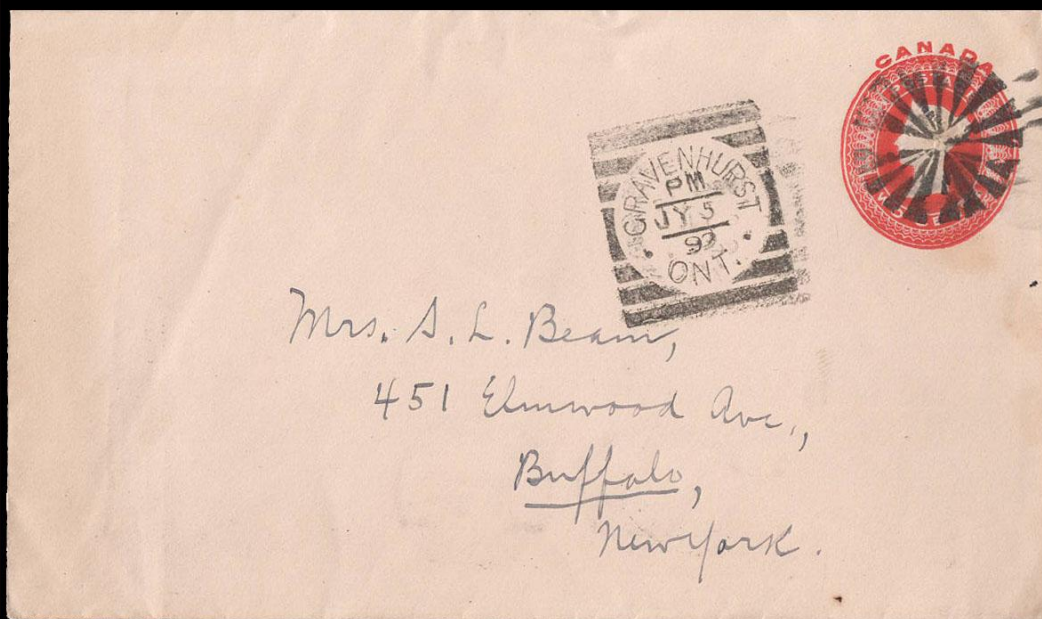

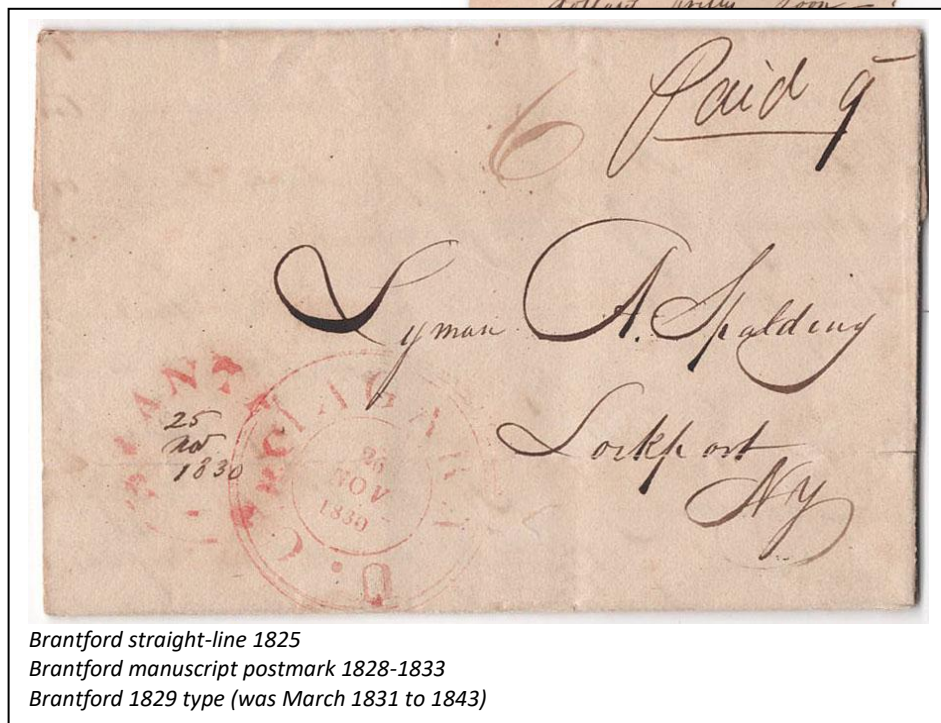
Canning Nov 23 1830

Dear Brother I have got fairly to work - I opened shop this morning and things look very fair - We have some trouble with our friends Field & Harting they seem to be very trivial about a good many things they want all of the Barn and they want the bull chain and a chain that fastens the Broom to the saw mill and they and Hamilton & Wilson are paying cash for grain to distill which in my opinion is contrary to all former understanding - H. & Wilson offer \$1500. for the still if we will put on about \$200. in repairs - the only way in my opinion to fetch them to the work is to buy grain and stock the still when N. & Bliss do not furnish which they cannot unless they pay cash which I think they have no right to do, by H. & W. paying cash for grain and filling the still any they are making a good profit and they don't care much about buying - but if I can put a stop to that thing they will I think be willing to buy and pay the \$1500.

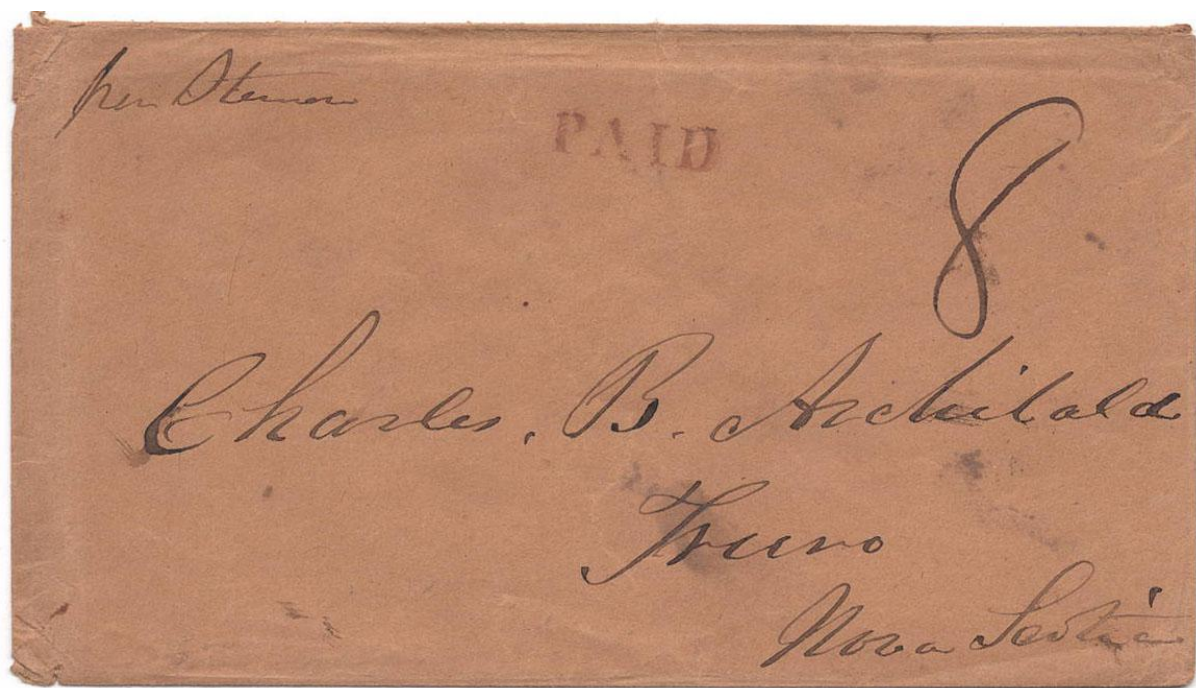

Brantford 1829 type (was March 1831 to 1843)

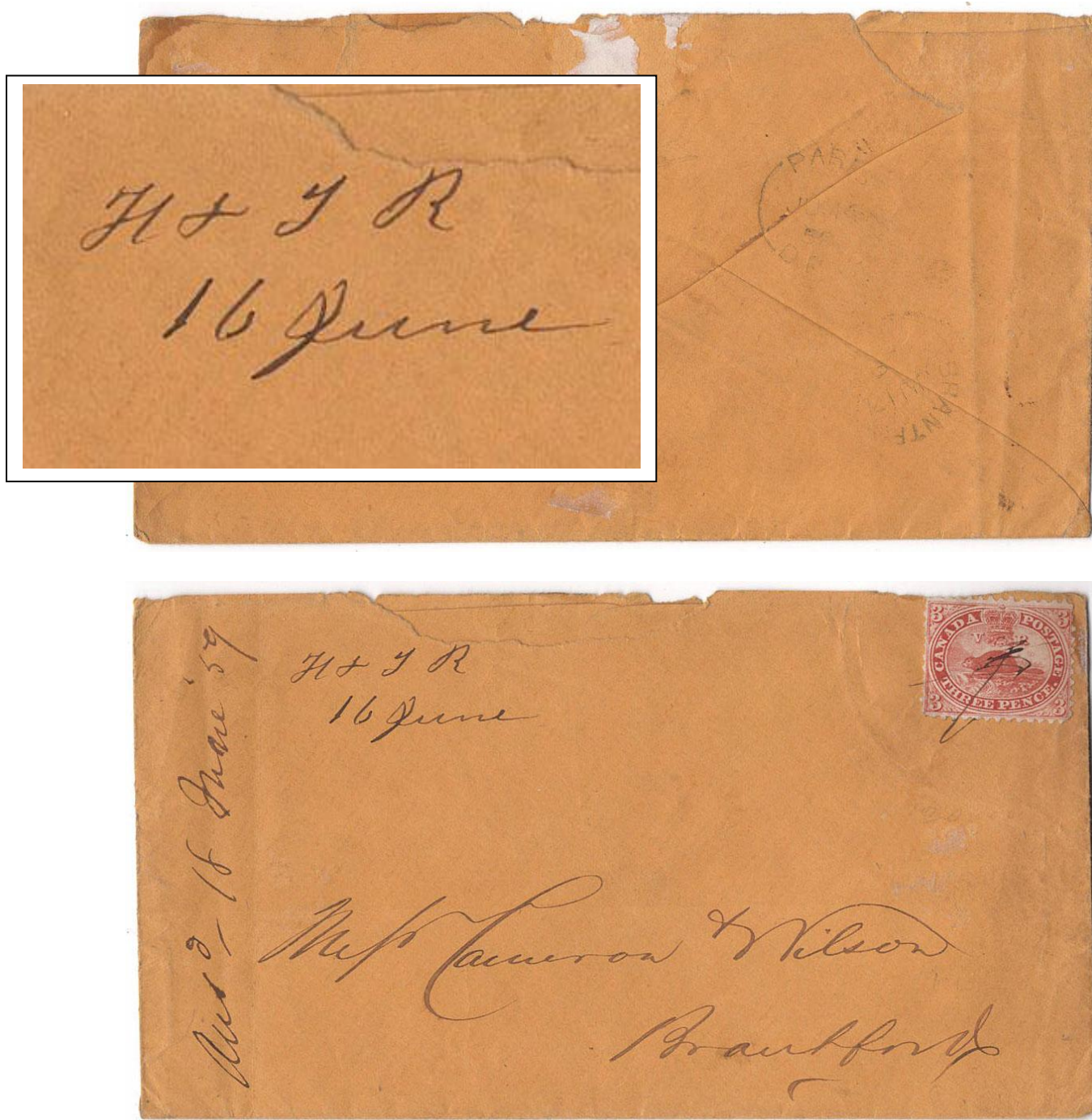
Item 625-01 – **The earliest recorded Brantford 1829 type** – 1830, family folded letter datelined Canning 23 NO 30, entered the mail in Brantford to New York State with the earliest recorded date for the 1829 type (25 NO 30). Paid 9d to the line and 6¢ US collect to Lockport. The letter relates to grain to distill. \$300.00



Item 625-02 – US to Truro NS via steamer to Halifax – 1852, US stampless cover, endorsed “Per Steamer”, paid 8 to Truro (b/s) via Halifax with Ud States Halifax JA 23 1852 packet office transit marking. A scarce Halifax postmark. \$150.00



Item 625-03 – **Maple UC to England via Ontario Simcoe & Huron Railroad** – 1857, stampless cover from Maple UC paid 7½d to Lancashire England (b/s). Carried by Ontario Simcoe & Huron Railroad (RY-131, 1855-1861, RF E) and then to Montreal and Quebec. Then by Allan Line from Quebec to Liverpool. Fully prepaid. A very pretty York County cover. This departure from Quebec is currently not listed in Arnell. \$300.00



Item 625-04 – **Pence – manuscript Hamilton & Toronto Railway** – 1859, 3d Beaver cancelled and tied by pen cancel on Hamilton & Toronto Railway cover, manuscript H + T R postmark, paying 3d letter rate to Brantford (b/s) via Paris DPO (b/s). This rare RPO manuscript postmark is dated within the period of ON-206 Ham & Tor R. Way P.O. Conductor No.1 (1856-1859) – Ludlow O-115 (*two strikes recorded only*) This cover originated on the H & T Ry line somewhere between Toronto and Hamilton. At Hamilton it was transferred to a westbound train on the GWRy Niagara Falls-Hamilton-London-Windsor main line. At Paris DPO it was transferred to an eastbound Buffalo & Lake Huron Ry to Brantford. Hamilton & Toronto Ry was controlled by The Great Western Railway. A spectacular RPO manuscript pence cover. Roughly opened at top. \$1,500.00



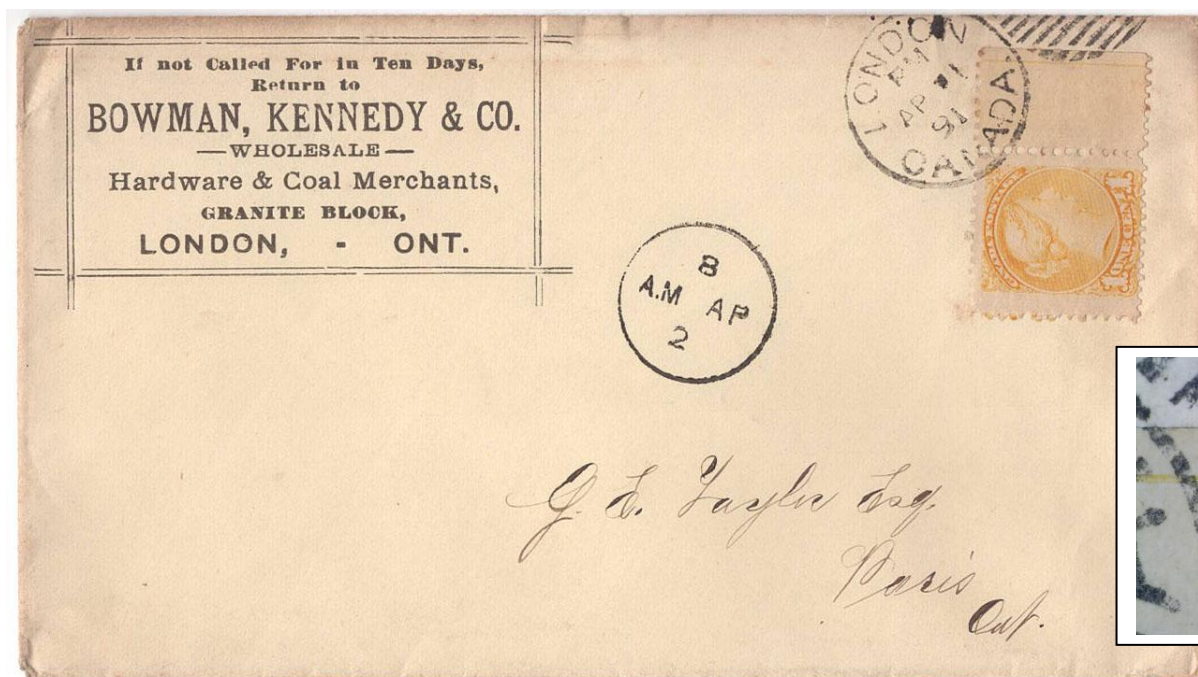
Item 625-05 – **Hartford UC (Norfolk 1852-1919)** – 1869, 3¢ Large Queen tied by large grid cancel on cover from Hartford UC, ms date, paying 3¢ letter rate to St. Ann (b/s). Waterford CW and Grimsby transit with St. Ann Lincoln receiver (b/s). \$125.00



Item 625-06 – **Oval registered Toronto + segmented cork** – 1885, 3¢ SQ (2), 2¢ RLS tied by numerous segmented cork cancels on cover from Toronto, oval Registered Toronto Canada NO 26 85, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Rhode Island (Buffalo transit b/s). According to Harrison, only 7 covers are recorded with this oval Toronto D7 handstamp (p.377 table 42). Interestingly, the franking violates postal regulations with the use of 3¢ and 2¢ RLS stamps paying the 5¢ registry fee. \$250.00



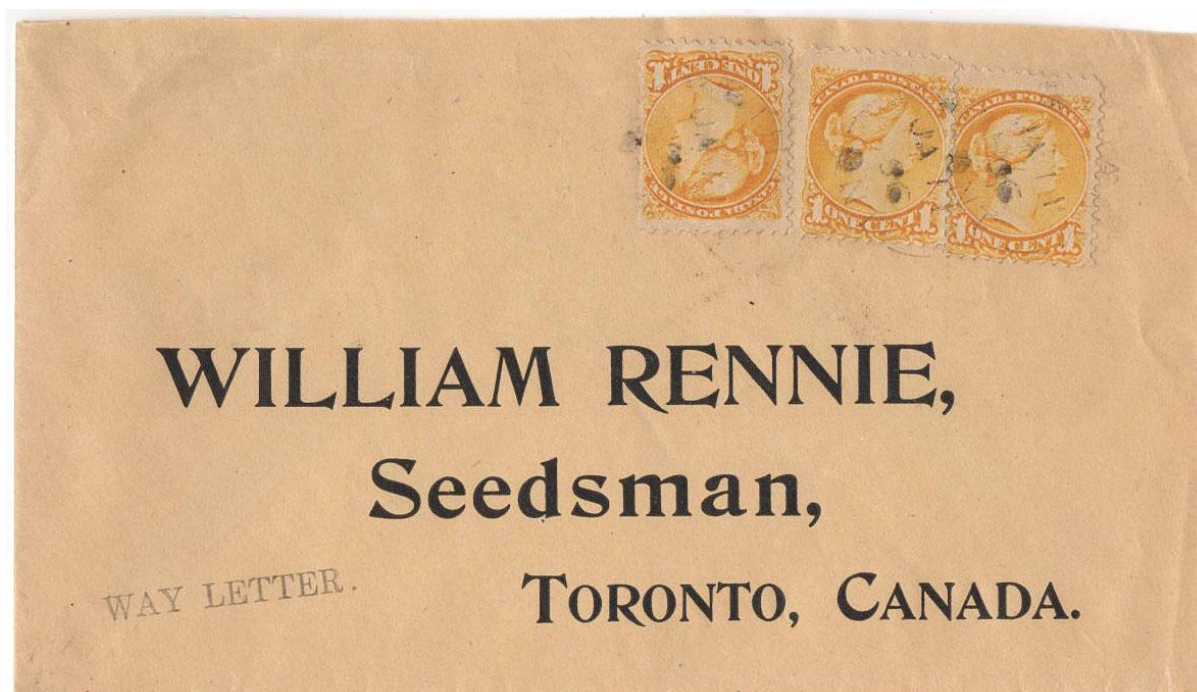
Item 625-07 – Spadina Ave 12¢ pre-UPU to New Zealand – 1890, 2¢, 5¢ (2) SQ tied by Spadina Ave Toronto duplex cancel on cover (DON-1833, 3 in circle in vertical killer bars) paying 12¢ pre-UPU or non UPU letter rate to Nelson New Zealand (b/s) via Windsor Ont and San Francisco (b/s). The 12¢ per ½ oz pre-UPU letter rate to New Zealand via the U.S. was in effect from January 1889 thru September 1891. Repaired tears on front and one 5¢ stamp with a crease. Still worth the price. \$500.00



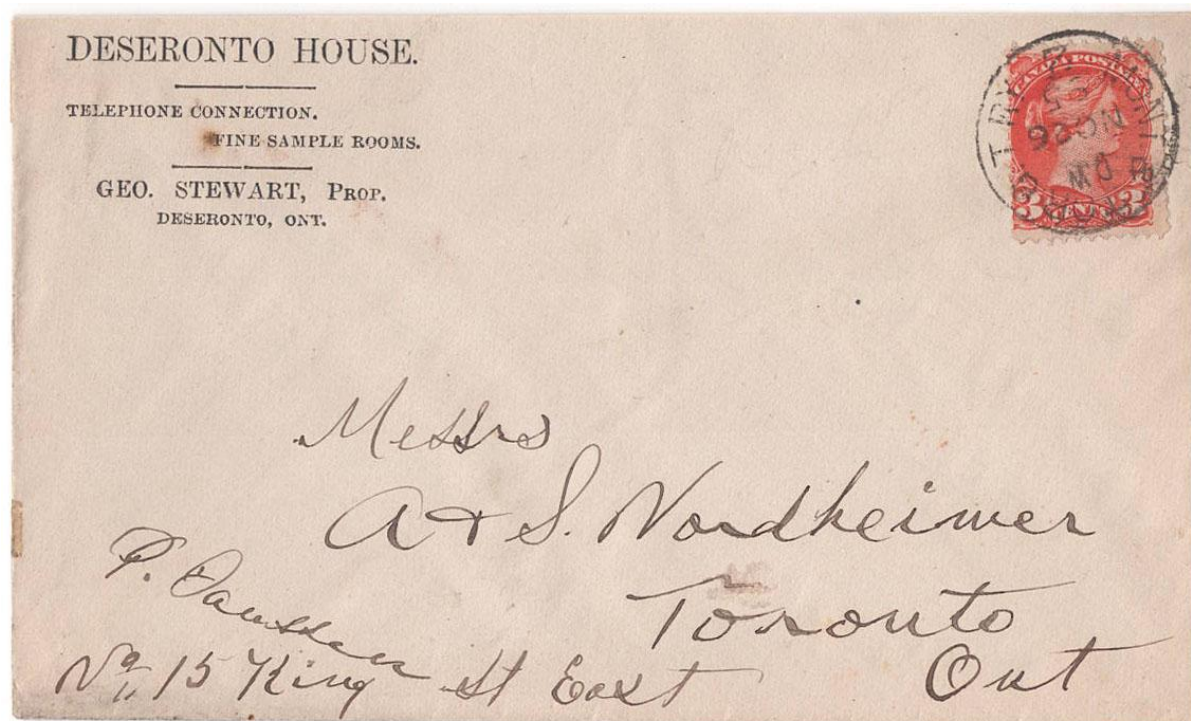
Item 625-08 – **1¢ SQ sheet margin copy with plate line on cover** – 1891, 1¢ SQ margin copy tied by London duplex cancel on Bowman Kennedy & Co. Hardware and Coal advertising cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Paris. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 625-09 – **3¢ SQ with printing variety on cover** – 1888, 3¢ SQ with printing variety, mid lower left corner, tied by smudge cancel on cover from Walsingham Centre Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Tillsburg (b/s). For more discussion, see 3¢ Small Queen book by Ken Kershaw #15, p.399. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 625-10 – **Way letter to Bethany Ont and to Toronto** – 1896, 1¢ SQ (3) tied by Bethany Ont broken circle on Rennie cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. Carried as Way Letter to Bethany, entered the mail at this location and then sent to Toronto. Durham County. A very scarce “Way” straight-line marking. \$200.00

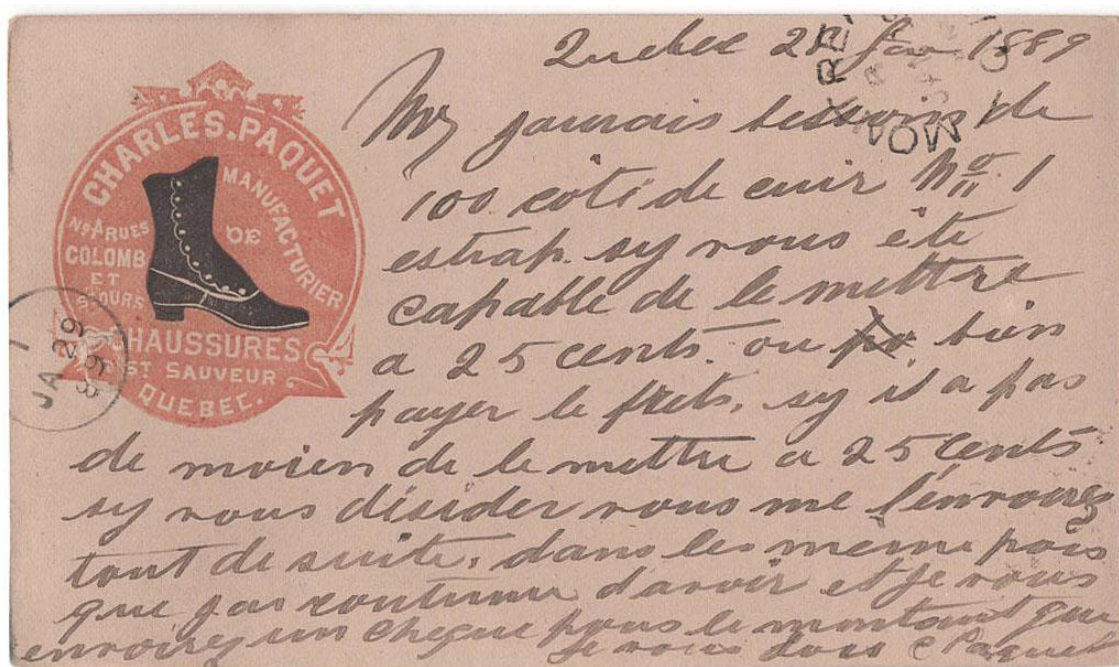


Item 625-11 – **Deseronto House** – 1895, 3¢ SQ tied by Mont & Tor GTRy 2 cds on Deseronto House c/c cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). \$75.00 **SOLD**

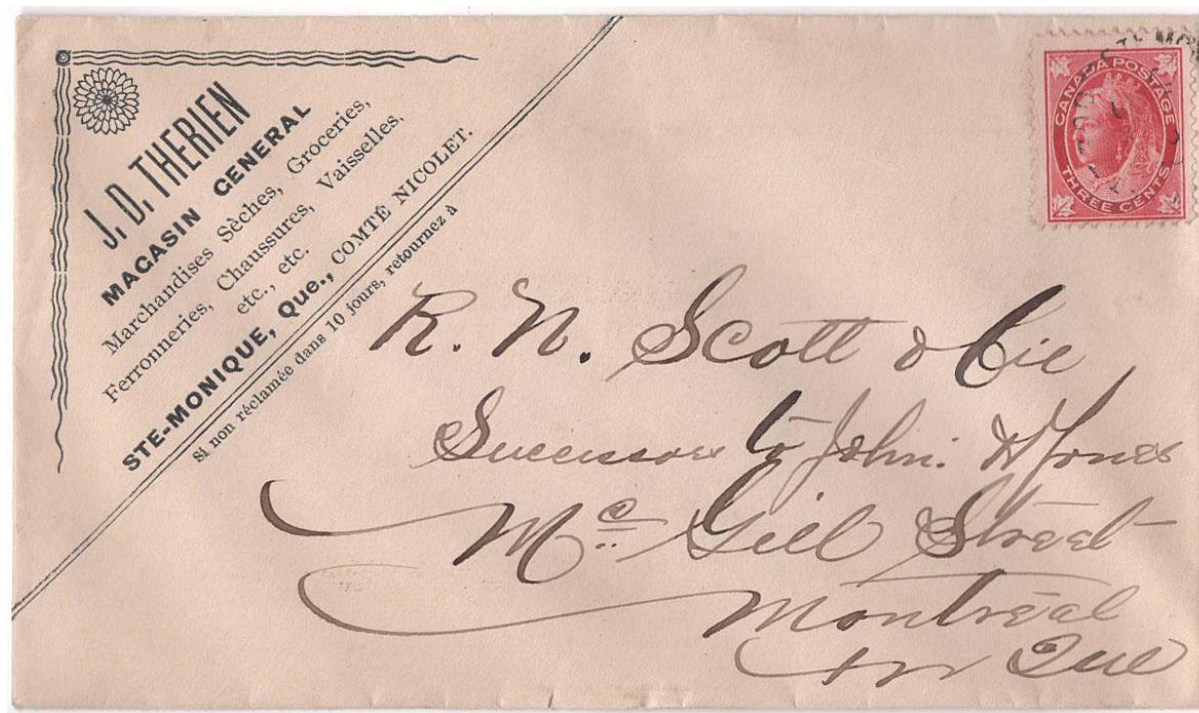
Item 625-12 – **CA Southern R** – 1877, 1¢ stationery from Eagle Ont paying 1¢ postcard rate to Wardsville (b/s). Mailed onboard train of the Canada Southern Railway, CA Southern RY-33 (1874-1886). Elgin County. A great strike! \$100.00



Item 625-13 – **Charles Paquet Chaussures, St. Sauveur de Quebec** – 1889, 1¢ stationery card from St. Sauveur de Quebec to Montreal, reverse with Charles S. Paquet Shoe Manufacturers advertising. The card, signed by Paquet himself, relates leather jackets etc. A great piece for the Quebec City collector. \$65.00



Item 625-14 – **Jubilee on Bell Telephone Company** – 1897, 3¢ Jubilee tied by Hamilton Orb cancel on Bell Telephone Co. c/c cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Waubausene (b/s). \$50.00



Item 625-15 – **Ste. Monique de Nicolet - General Merchant** – 1898, 3¢ Maple Leaf tied by Ste. Monique de Nicolet Que broken circle on J.D. Therien General Merchant advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Therien has been the Postmaster of Ste. Monique 45 days in 1908 but he was not at the time of this cover. Dry goods, groceries, shoes, china and ironwork. \$50.00 **SOLD**



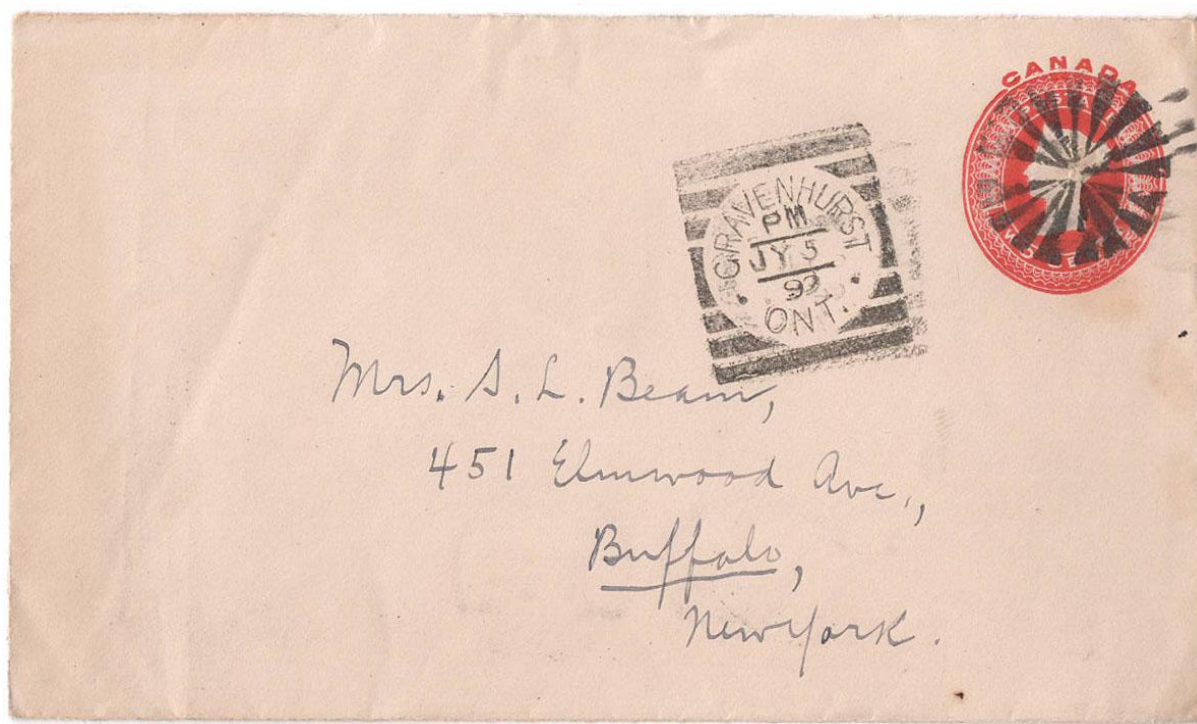
Item 625-16 – **Exeter Central Hotel (Huron)** – 1903, 2¢ Numeral tied by London & Wingham MC on Central Hotel advertising cover from Exeter Ont paying 2¢ letter rate to Sombra (b/s). \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 625-17 – **Toronto Dunlop Tire Company** – 1900, 1¢ Numeral tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on Dunlop Tires advertising unsealed cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Waterville NS (b/s). \$60.00 **SOLD**



Item 625-18 – **Embossed Hamilton Jeweller George H. Lees & Co.** – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by Hamilton Bickerdike machine cancel on George H. Lees & Co. advertising cover, numerous embossed maple leaves, paying 2¢ letter rate to London (b/s). A beauty, Ex Greene. \$100.00

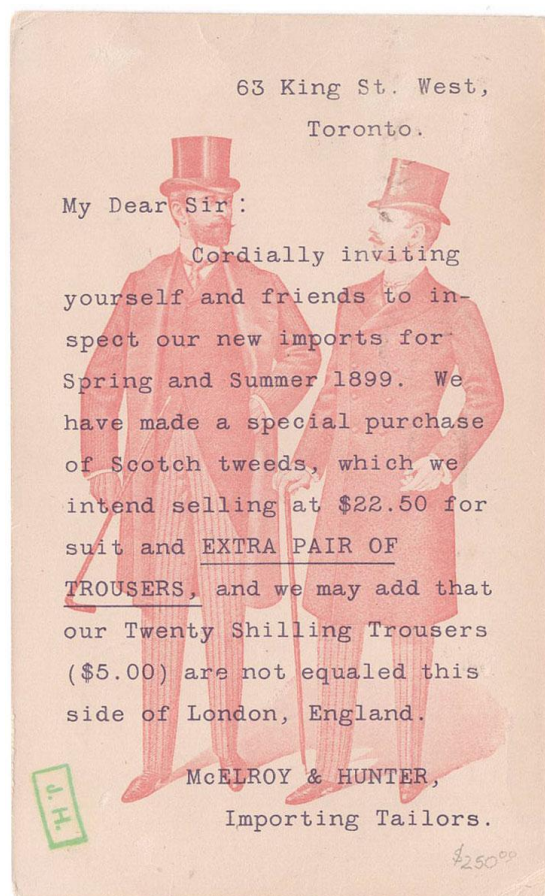

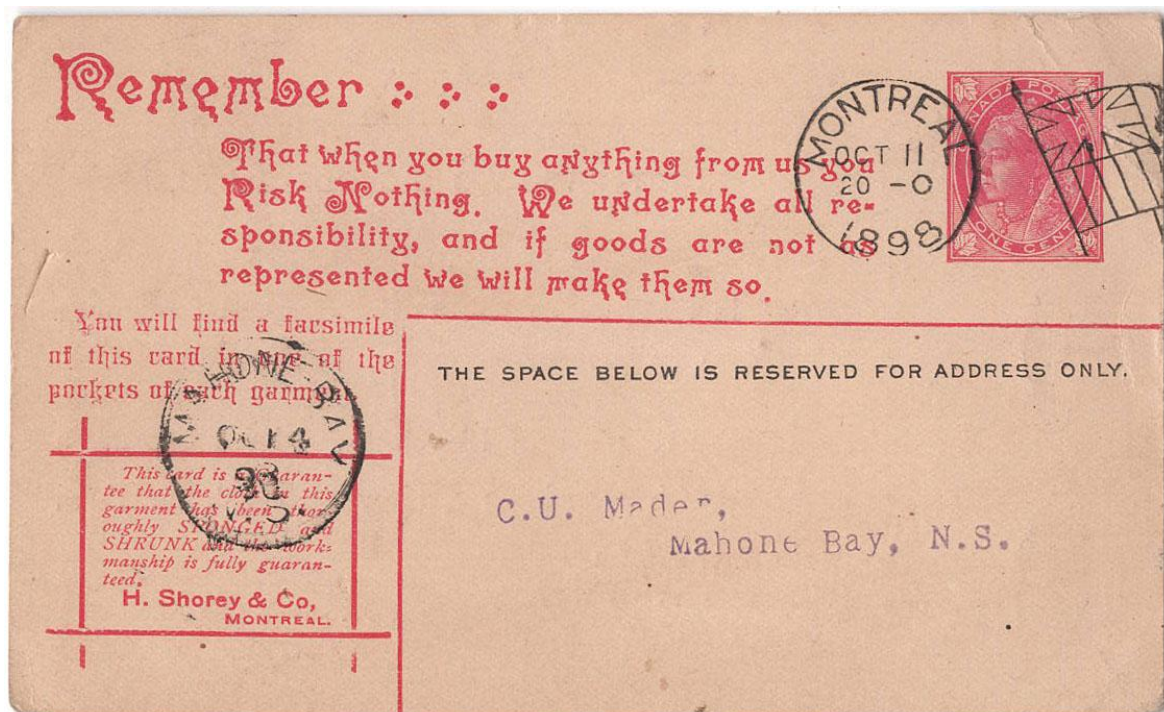

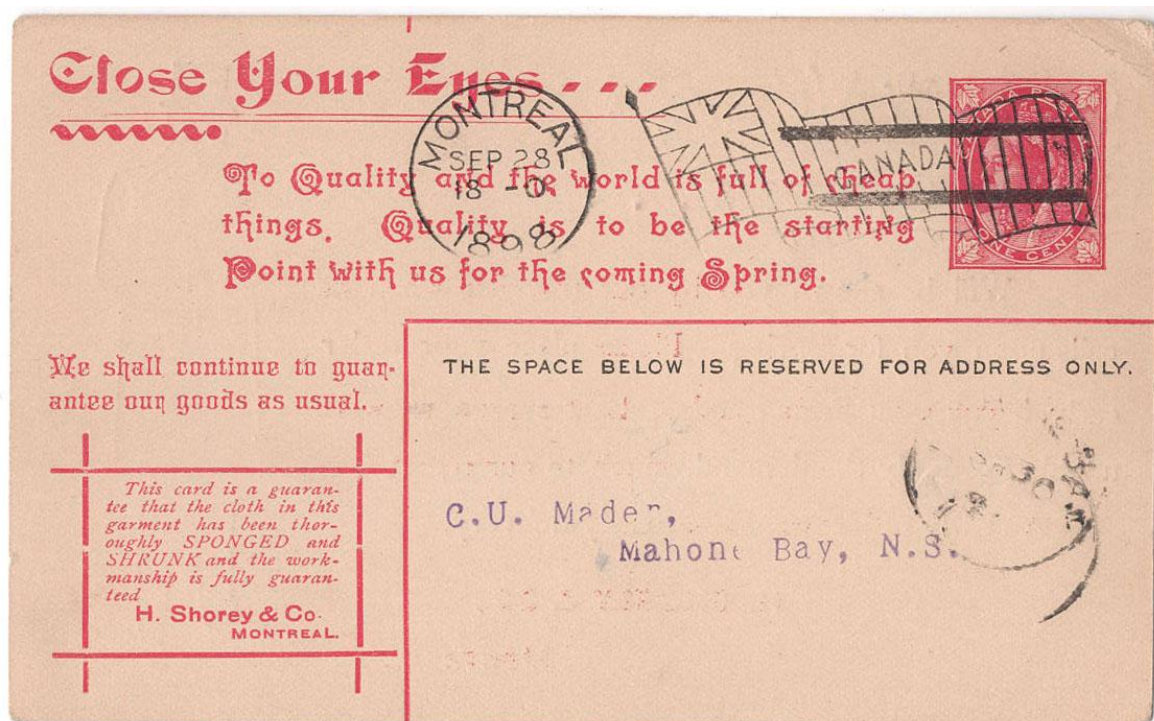

Item 625-21 – Toronto importing tailors private postcard – 1899, 1c Numeral tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on McElroy and Hunter Importing Tailors advertising private postcard paying 1c postcard rate to local. Reverse with typewritten message and two gentlemen in top hat standing talking to each other. A beauty! \$200.00 **SOLD**



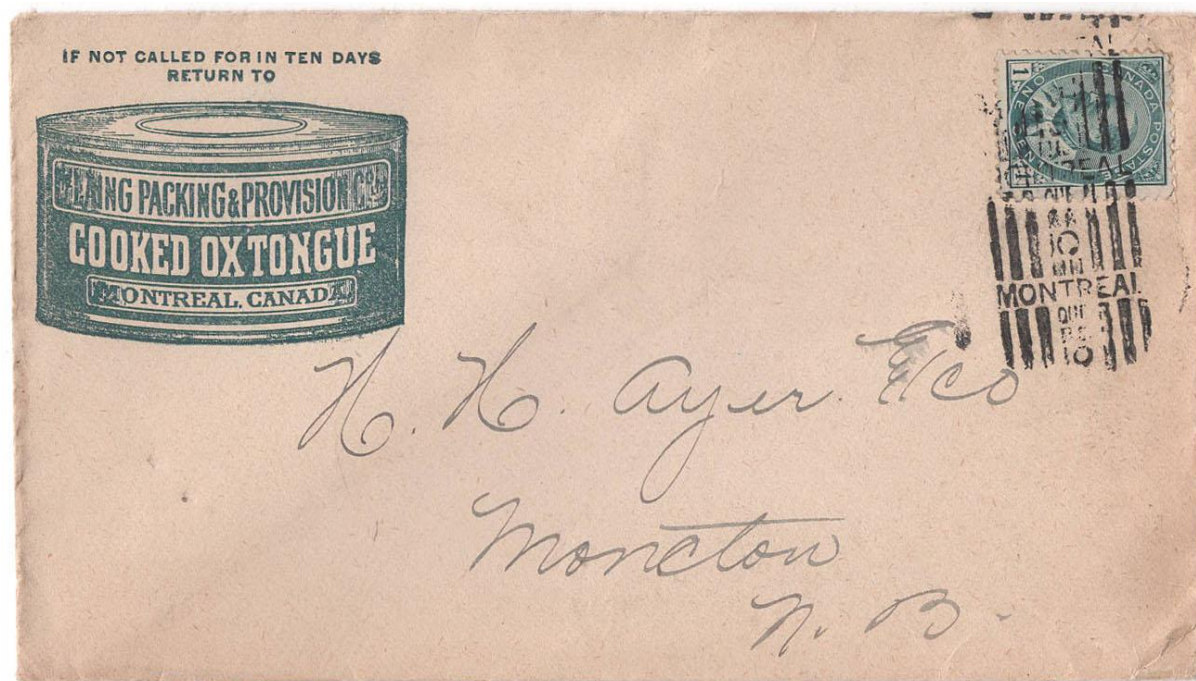

Item 625-23 – **Shorey & Co. Spring Overcoats** – 1898, 1c Maple Leaf stationery card with H. Shorey & Co. advertising, from Montreal, spring overcoats, paying 1c postcard rate to Mahone Bay (receiver on front). \$100.00



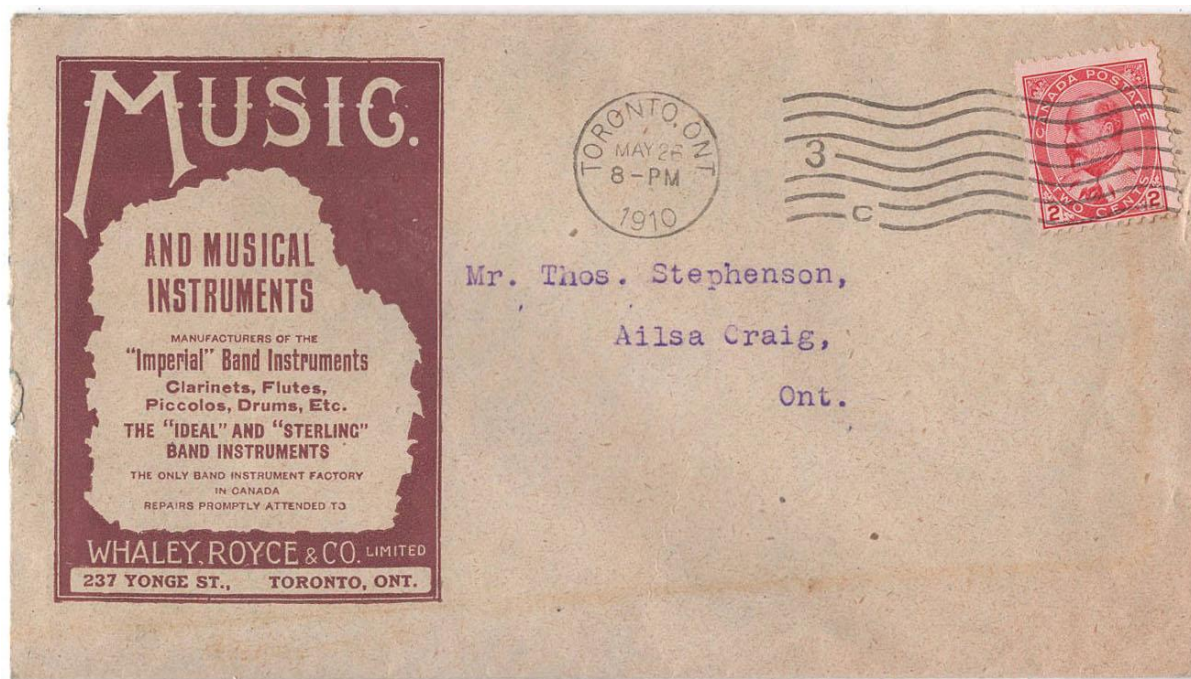
Item 625-24 – **St. Williams Ont Palace Hotel (Norfolk)** – 1903, 2¢ Numeral tied by grid cancel on Palace hotel advertising cover from St. Williams Ont paying 2¢ letter rate to New Hampshire (b/s). A very small-town hotel with a neat advert showing a lady, her hat, holding a big wood stick paddle to row the boat on the river along with two dogs. 4 rounded corners and reduced at right. Rare. \$85.00



Item 625-25 – **Ox tongue advertising in green** – c1905, 1¢Edward tied by Montreal roller No.10 on Laing Packing and Provision Co. advertising cover, cooked ox tongue in green, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Moncton. A seldom seen roller (large Montreal, small Que)! \$60.00



Item 625-26 – **Young's Point Summer Resort (Peterborough)** – 1910, 2¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on South Beach Hotel Summer Resort advertising cover from Young's Point Ont paying 2¢ letter rate to Kingston (b/s) via Lakefield (b/s). Redirected to Orillia (b/s). Passengers boarding steamer at dock illustrated. \$75.00



Item 625-27 – **Whaley Royce Music** – 1910, 2¢ Edward tied by Toronto International machine cancel on Whaley, Royce & Co. Music and Musical Instruments advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Ailsa Craig (b/s). Manufacturers of Imperial Band Instruments incl piccolos, drums etc. \$50.00

Wychwood Park a very scarce Toronto office, 1895-1896 and 1903-1920. An ugly cover but a great strike and so scarce. \$100.00



Item 625-32 – **Sault Ste. Marie flag cancel 28-3** – 1917, 2¢+1¢ Wartax tied by Sault Ste Marie \$25.00 for \$21.50 flag cancel, type 28-3 dated MR 28 17, paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa. An outstanding strike! \$60.00 **SOLD**



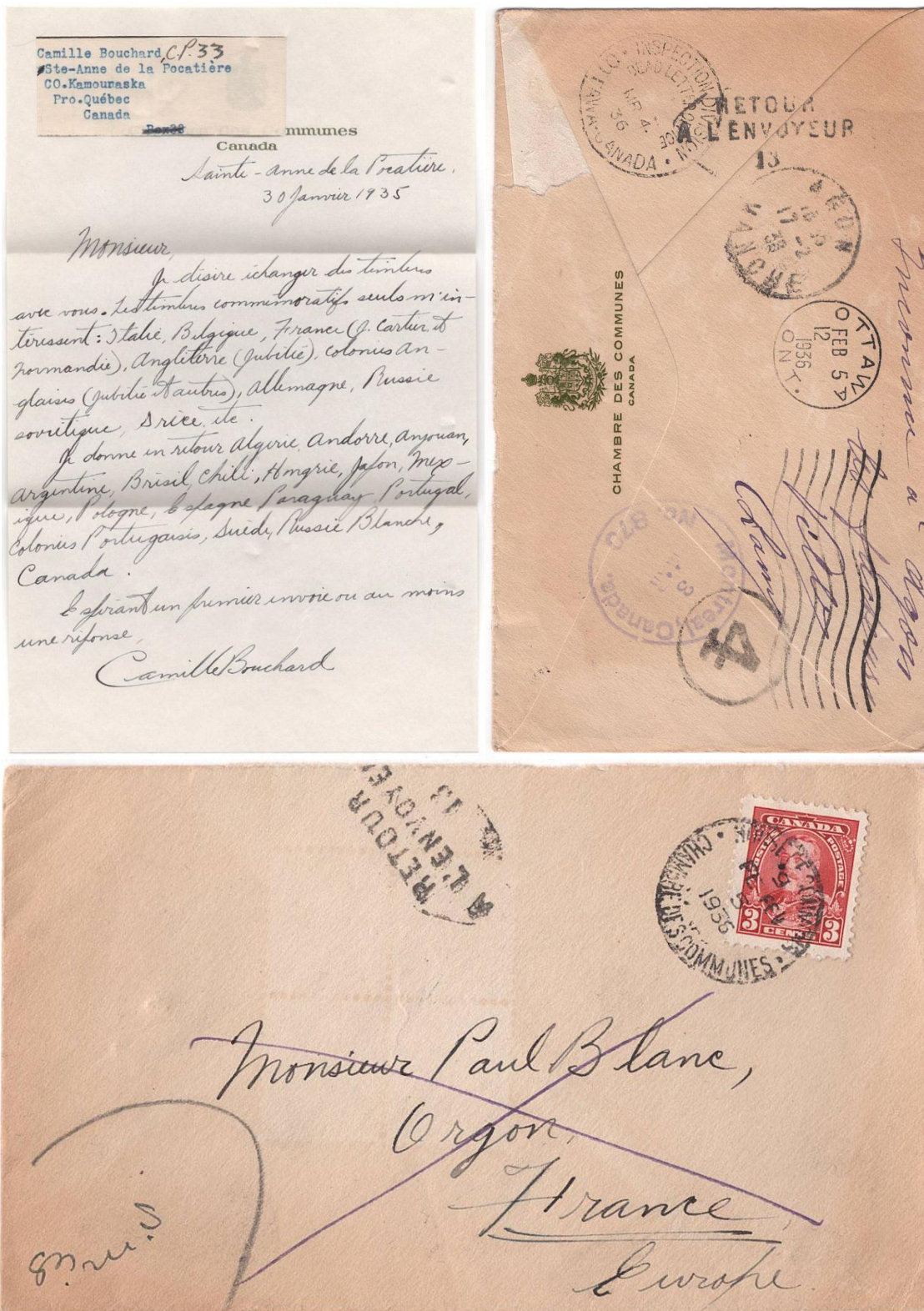

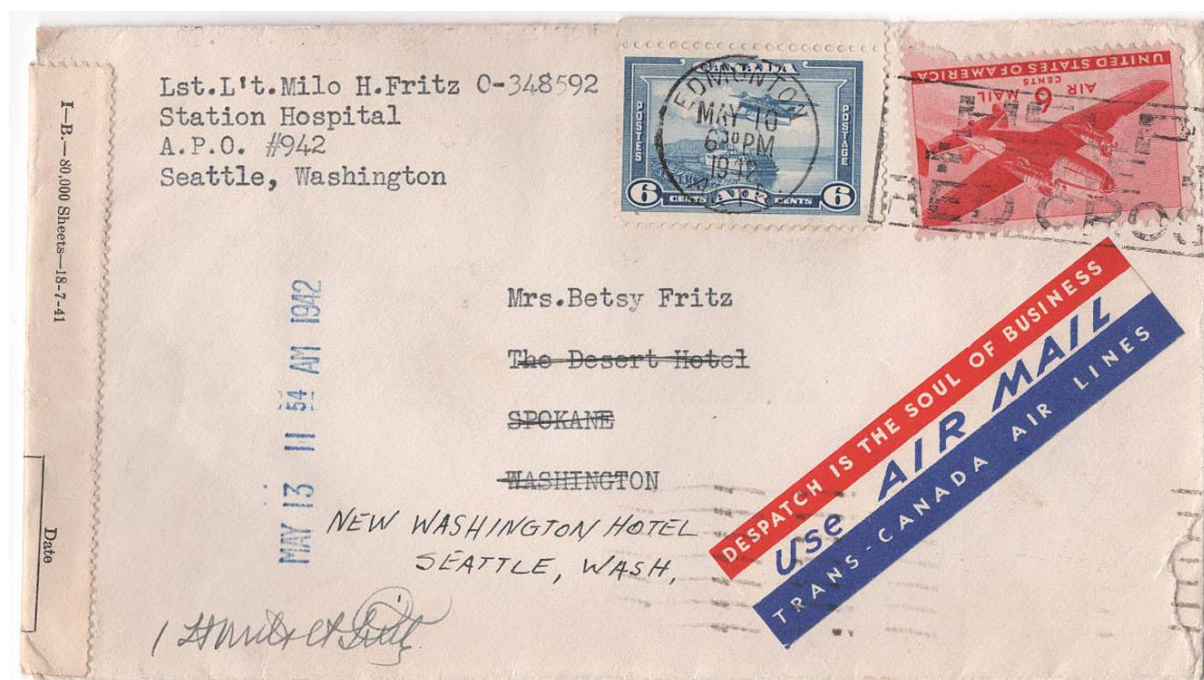
Item 625-34 – **Brantford Ont flag cancel 25-1** – 1917, 2¢ Admiral tied by Brantford flag cancel on Stedman postcard, type 25-1 dated JUL 14 17, paying 2¢ postcard rate to New Brunswick. Welland street view on reverse. Stedman was a book and magazine publisher as well as postcards. \$20.00



Item 625-35 – **23¢ special delivery with 20¢ Niagara Falls** – 1936, 3¢, 20¢ Pictorial tied by Brantford Ont duplex cancel on cover paying 23¢ special delivery letter rate to Hamilton. Roughly opened, visible from the back. \$40.00



Item 625-36 – **Ste. Anne de Kamouraska to France mailed from the House** – 1935, 3¢ Pictorial tied by House of Commons cds on cover (with letter accompanies) paying 3¢ preferred letter rate to France (b/s). The letter is from Camille Bouchard and relates to stamp exchange. It was mailed by his brother Joseph Georges Bouchard Member of Parliament for Kamouraska. Unknown and returned to Canada via the Ottawa Dead Letter Office (b/s). \$60.00



Item 625-37 – Alaska APO 942 mailed from Edmonton – 1942, 6¢ Airmail C6, US 6¢ Airmail tied by Edmonton Alta machine cancel on FECB cover paying 6¢ airmail rate to Washington State. Trans-Canada Air Lines label. Return address APO 942 Seattle, troop located in Anchorage Alaska. Passed for export in Vancouver. \$75.00 **SOLD**

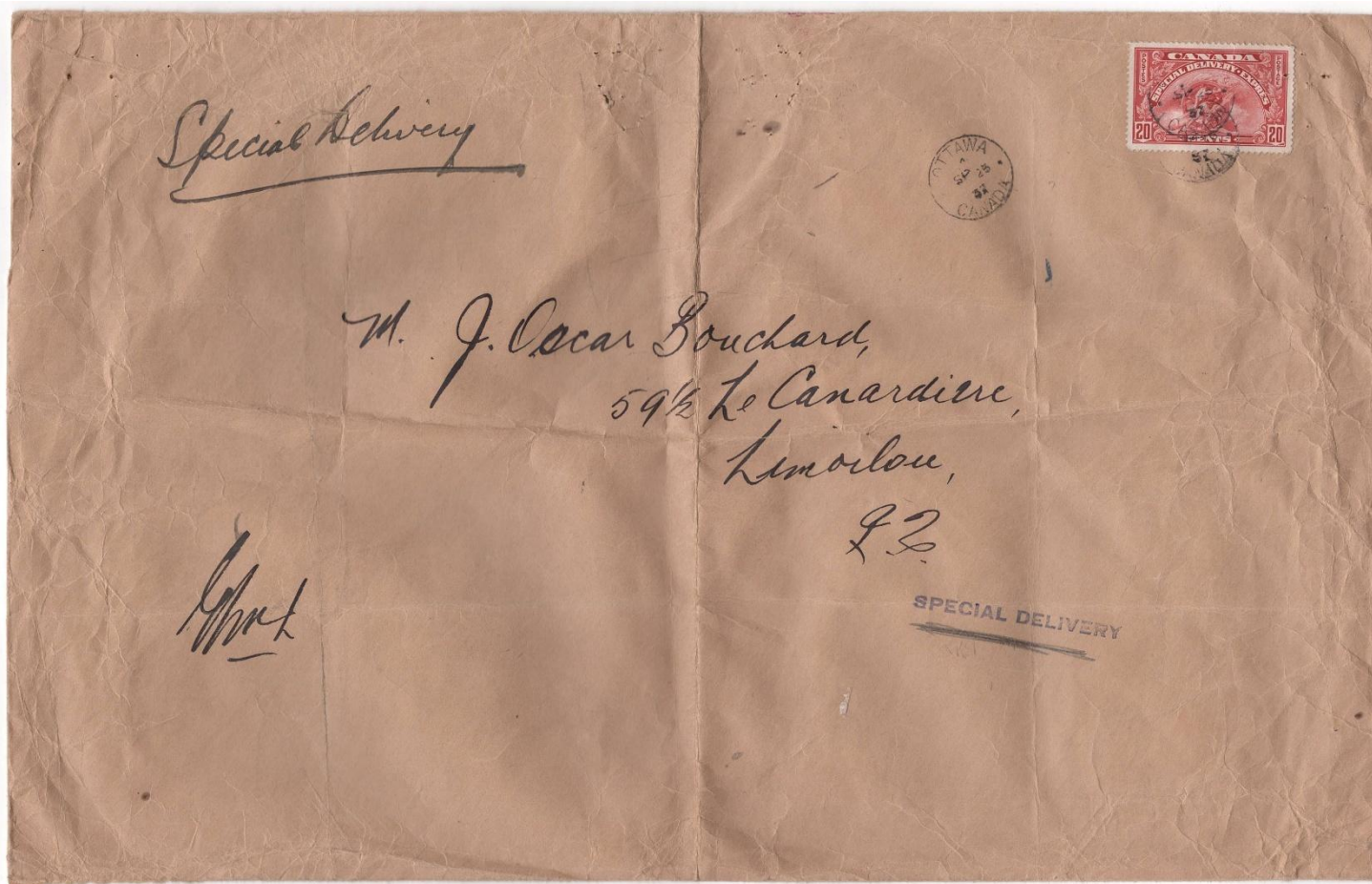

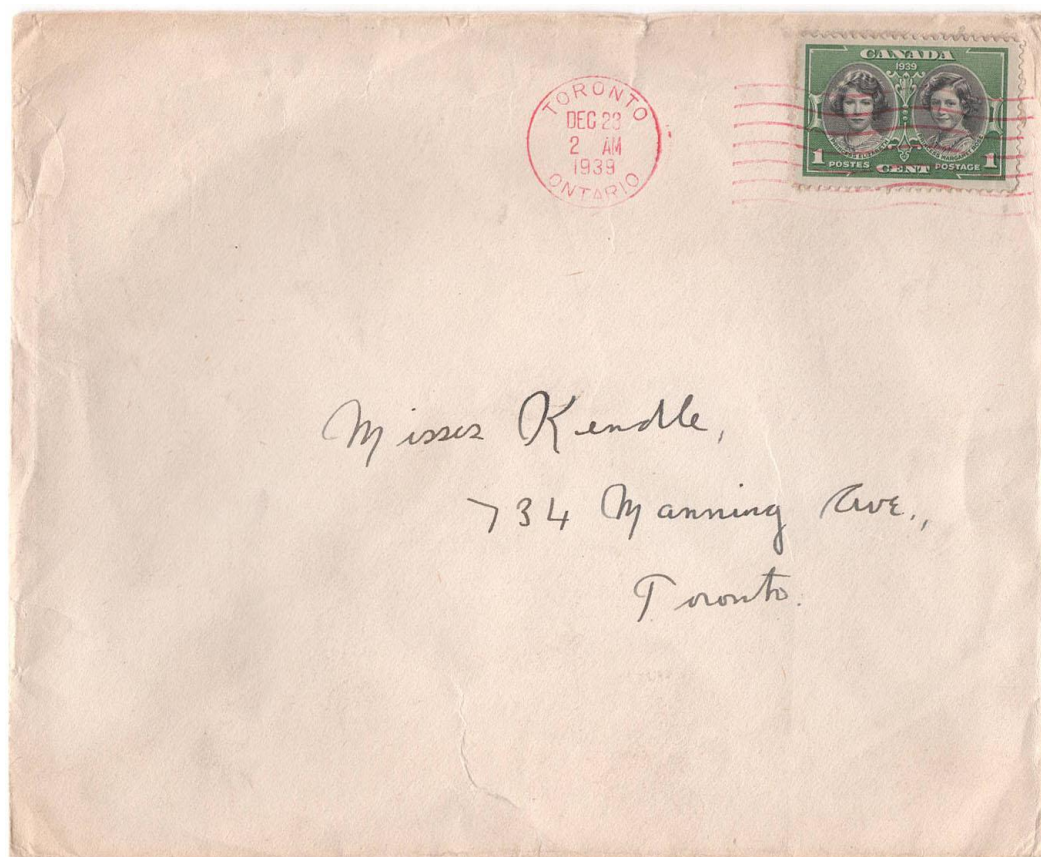

Then he moved to other portfolios as Minister of Labour, and then Secretary of State in the cabinet of Mackenzie King. A seldom signature. \$100.00



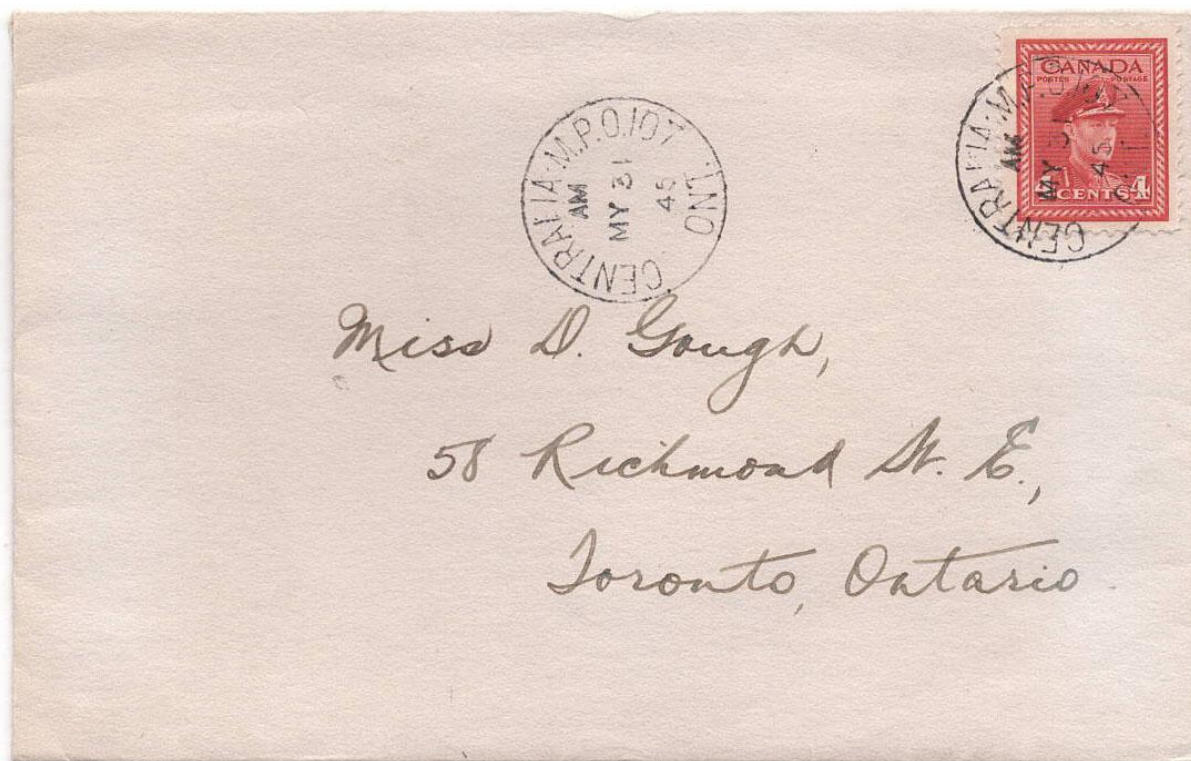
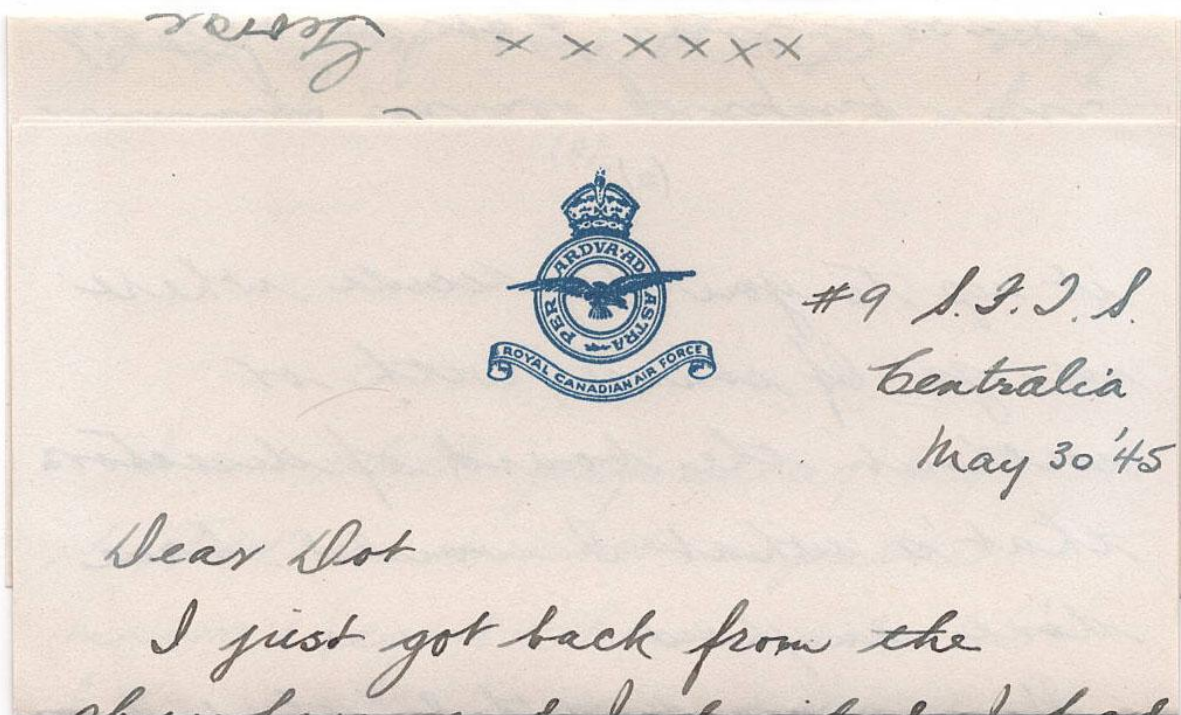

The cover is signed at lower left and the addressee Oscar Bouchard is listed as a Post Office employee at the Upper Town Quebec office. Numerous pinholes and filing fold otherwise a very pretty E6 single use on cover. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 625-40 – **A seldom seen Royal Visit cacheted cover** – 1939, 1¢/3¢ Royal Visit set tied by Royal Train cds MY 15 39 on Their Majesties cacheted cover to Ottawa. A seldom seen example. \$25.00 **SOLD**



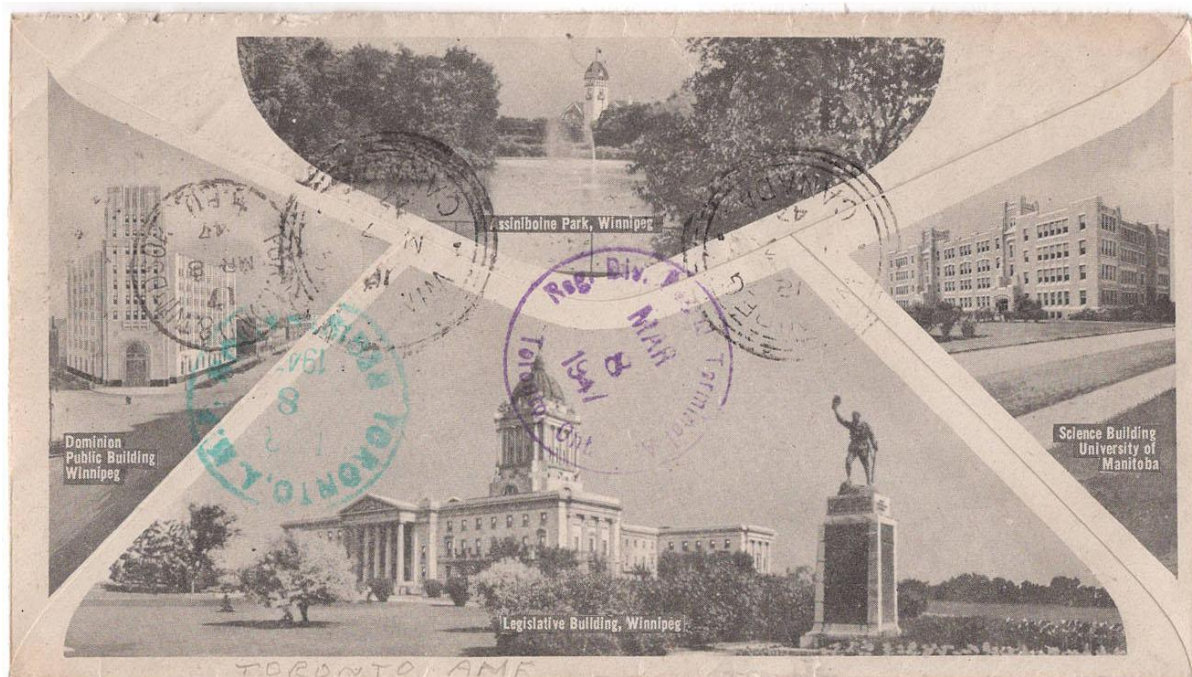

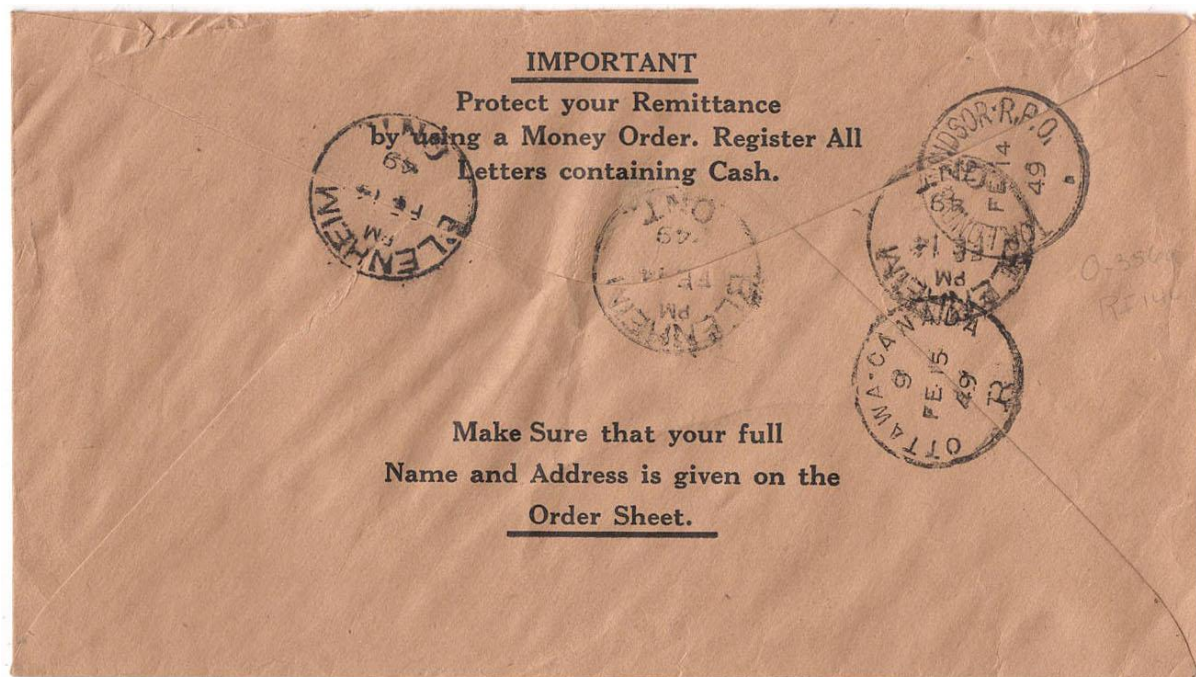

Well my board of directors has taken up the matter and after due consideration, they decided I should go somewhere with you and that I should leave it up to you to decide where we go.....* \$35.00

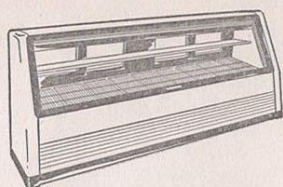

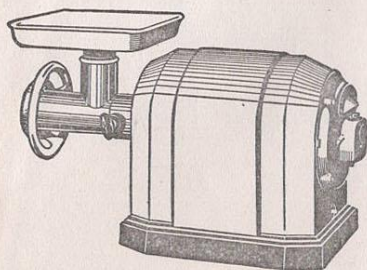

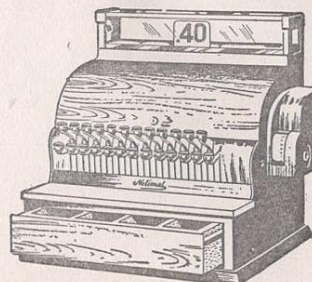
