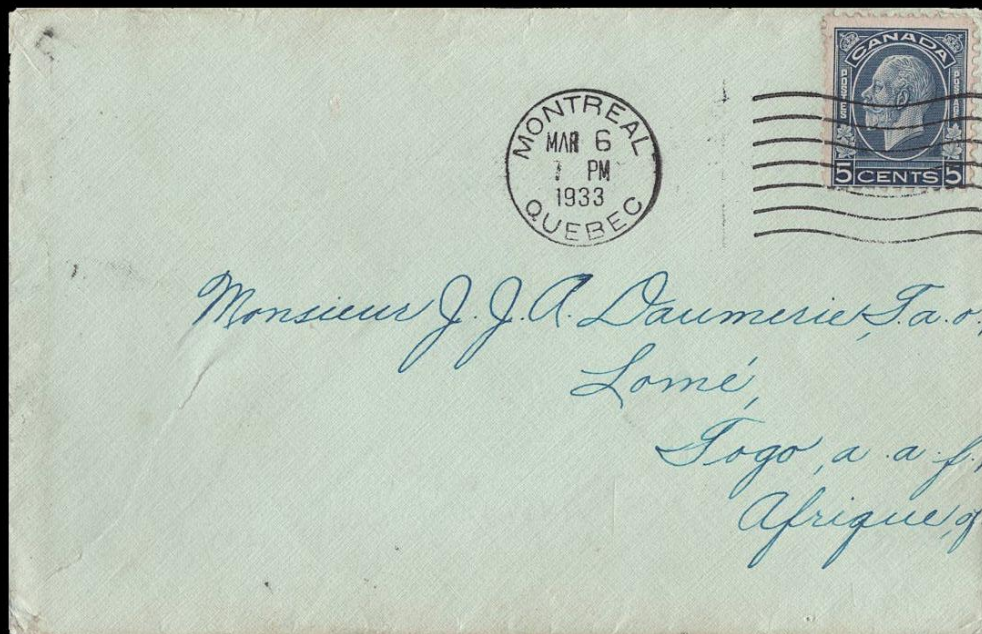

Item 626-01 – **Niagara paid 2/8 to Montreal** – 1845, stampless folded cover from Niagara paid 2/8 paying the double 1/4 rate to Montreal (b/s). Somewhat a huge sum prepaid. \$50.00

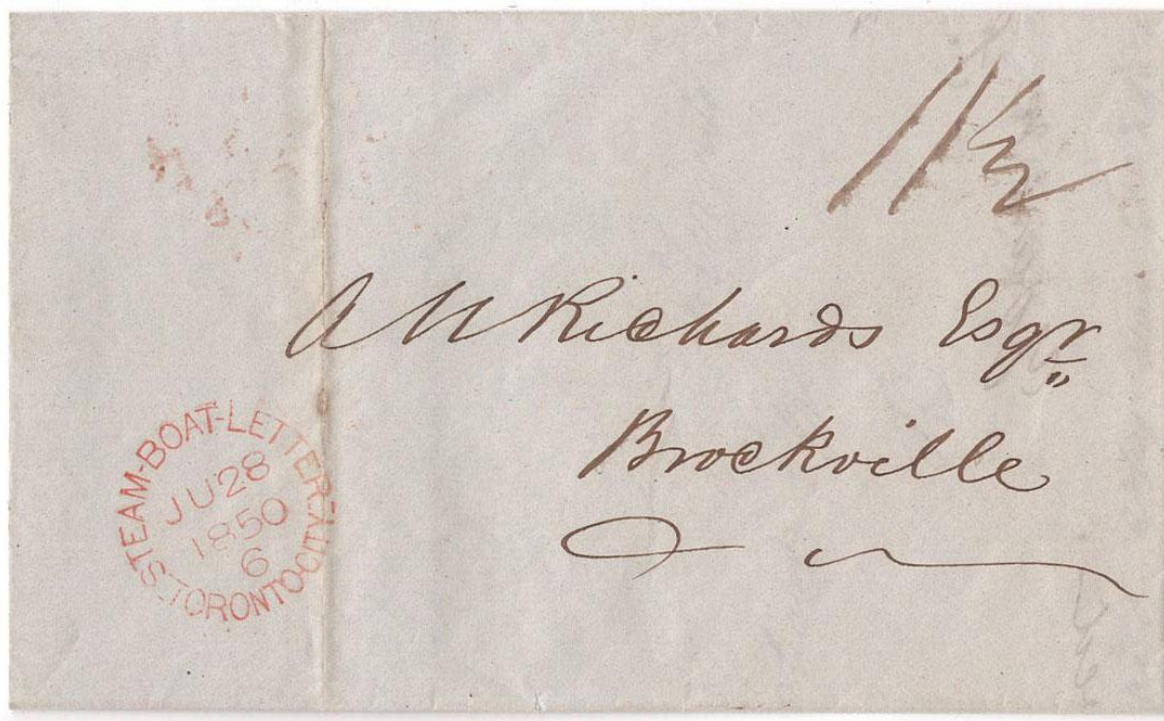


Item 626-02 – **Niagara UC double circle in black** – 1823, folded letter of legal nature mailed from Niagara UC, double circle in black with typeset dated AU 21 23, rated 4½d collect to Hamilton. Diameters: outer 32mm and inner 19mm. \$150.00 **SOLD**



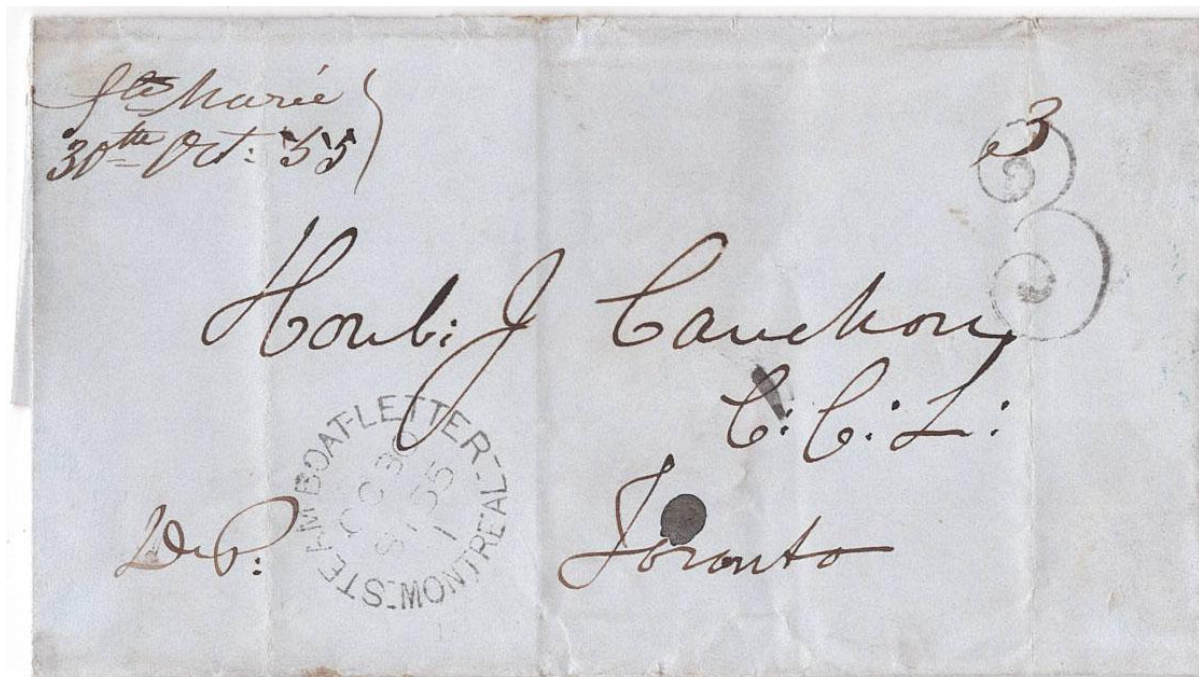


Item 626-03 – **Asphodel UC (Peterboro, office closed in 1861)** – 1860, stampless folded letter datelined Westwood FE 3 60, entered the mail in Asphodel UC and routed via Keene and Peterboro, paid 10¢ paying the cross-border letter rate to Portland, Maine. The letter is addressed to Edmonston Allan Co. and Royal Mail Steamboat Office in Portland. A late use of a double circle, a few months before it closed permanently. Rare. \$400.00



Item 626-04 – **Toronto City Steamboat Letter conductor 6** – 1850, folded letter from Toronto rated 11½d collect to Brockville (b/s) via Kingston (b/s). Carried by Toronto City Steamboat and processed onboard by conductor No.6. Exhibit quality. The letter relates to taxation etc. \$500.00 **SOLD**



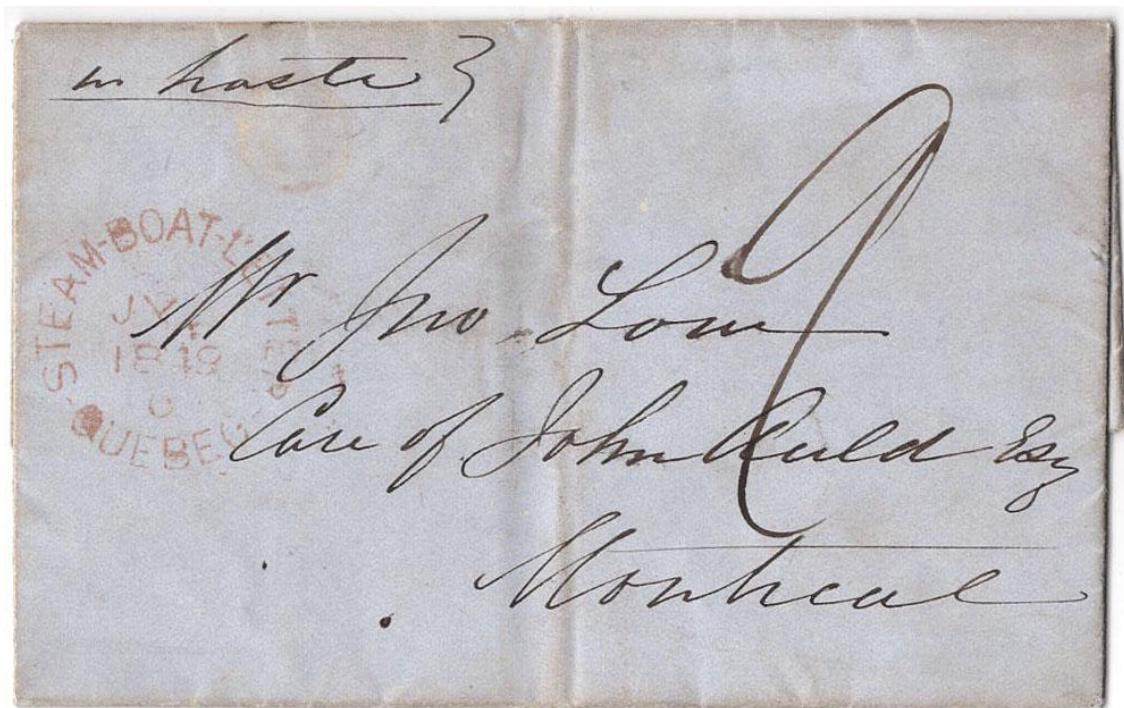


Item 626-05 – **Ste. Marie de Rouville via Montreal Steamboat No. 1** – 1855, folded cover from Ste. Marie LC (manuscript postmark, OC 30 55, Rouville County) rated 3d collect to Toronto (b/s) via Chambly (b/s). Carried by Montreal steamboat with conductor hammer No.1. A rather nice strike of this rare steamer handstamp, particularly so on a letter from Rouville and Chambly. \$400.00 **SOLD**

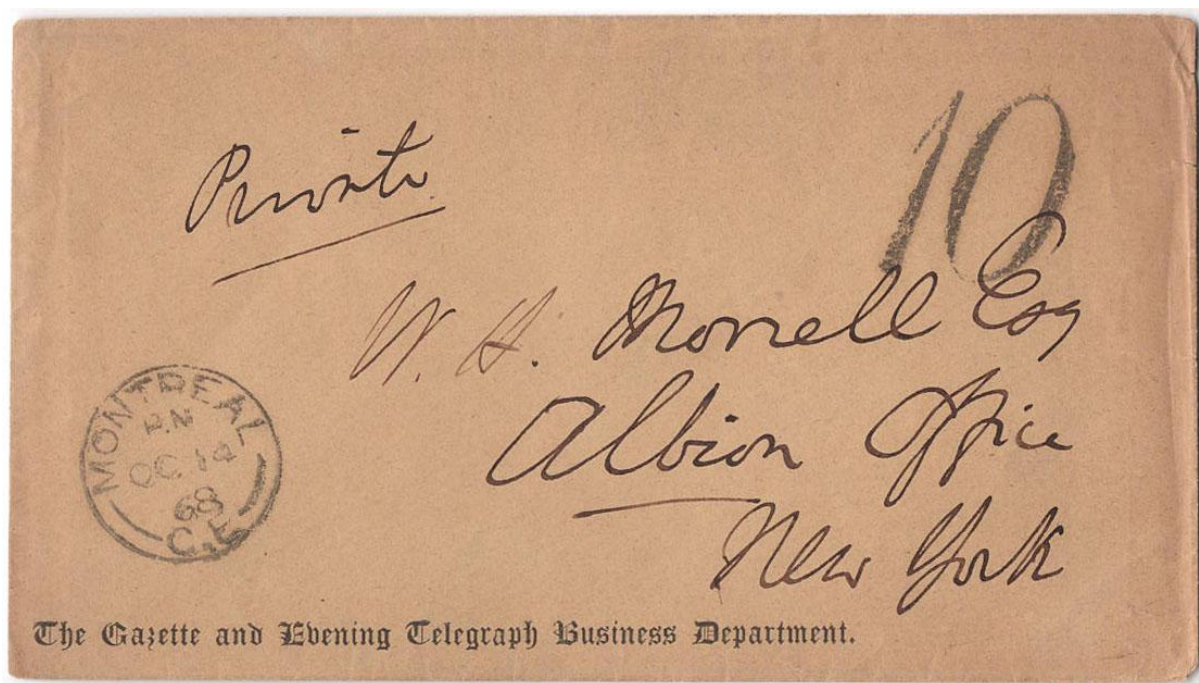


Item 626-06 – **Montreal Steamboat Letter 2<sup>nd</sup> hammer** – 1852, folded cover from Montreal with Steamboat Letter Montreal hammer II dated SP 25 52. The characteristic of the 2<sup>nd</sup> hammer is the upright of the letter E of Montreal passed through the B and O of BOAT. For the 1<sup>st</sup> datestamp it passes through the left part of the letter B in BOAT. Rated 6d collect to Quebec. Exhibit quality. \$175.00





Item 626-07 – **Quebec Steamboat Letter conductor 0** – 1849, shipping business letter from Quebec rated 9d collect to Montreal. Carried by Quebec Steamboat and processed onboard by conductor 0 - hammer 0. The letter relates to freight. \$75.00



Item 626-08 – **Large Queen era unpaid cover to New York** – 1868, Gazette and Evening Telegraph cover from Montreal, OC 14 68, mailed unpaid to New York with 10¢ collect. This rate became effective April 1 1868, complete prepayment was required for 6¢ rate, any partial payment less than 6¢ was ignored and a full US 10¢ was still due from the addressee upon delivery. A stunning "10" handstamp. \$100.00 **SOLD**





Item 626-09 – **Lincoln County Murray family archive** - 1835-1837, lot of 4 Murray family letters datelined Commonsidge England, to Robert, William and John Murray baker in St. Catharines UC. All signed Jane or John Dickson and addressed to son, daughter, brother and sister. One entered the mail in Dundas rated 4½d collect, one to Galt by way of New York and via Alex Hamilton, one in Toronto rated 7d collect and one through Halifax and Quebec. Condition varies drastically but content intact with separations at fold etc. An interesting Lincoln County family archive. \$250.00





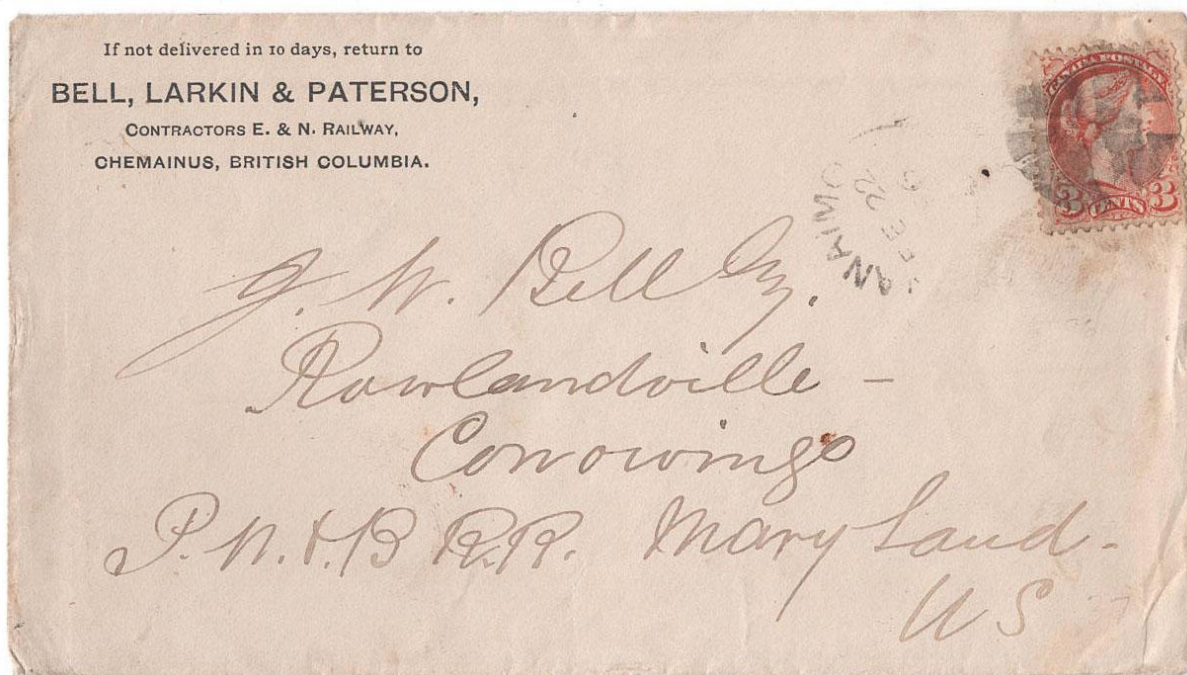
Item 626-10 – **The rare Prince Edward Island 1/6 Currency** – 1858, mourning letter with cover from Blackburn England to Charlottetown PEI, carried by the Allan Line Indian via Liverpool (b/s). Rated 1/6 Currency collect with 9d Stg British claim accountancy marking. During the summer of 1851, PEI devalued its currency against the Sterling. For the marking of collect mails arriving from England, a handstamp was required showing the 1/ Stg rate as 1/6 Currency. This handstamp evidently was prepared locally and no record in GPO proof book was found. According to researchers, only 9 strikes of the Arnell E-24 marking has been reported total. This one here is one of only three reported examples used outside of the normal 1851-1852 period. An exceedingly rare PEI marking. The letter confirms it is a real mourning letter as uncle Francis is dead. Cover a bit rough. Steinhart had only one E-24 1/6Cy as well as Smith. \$650.00

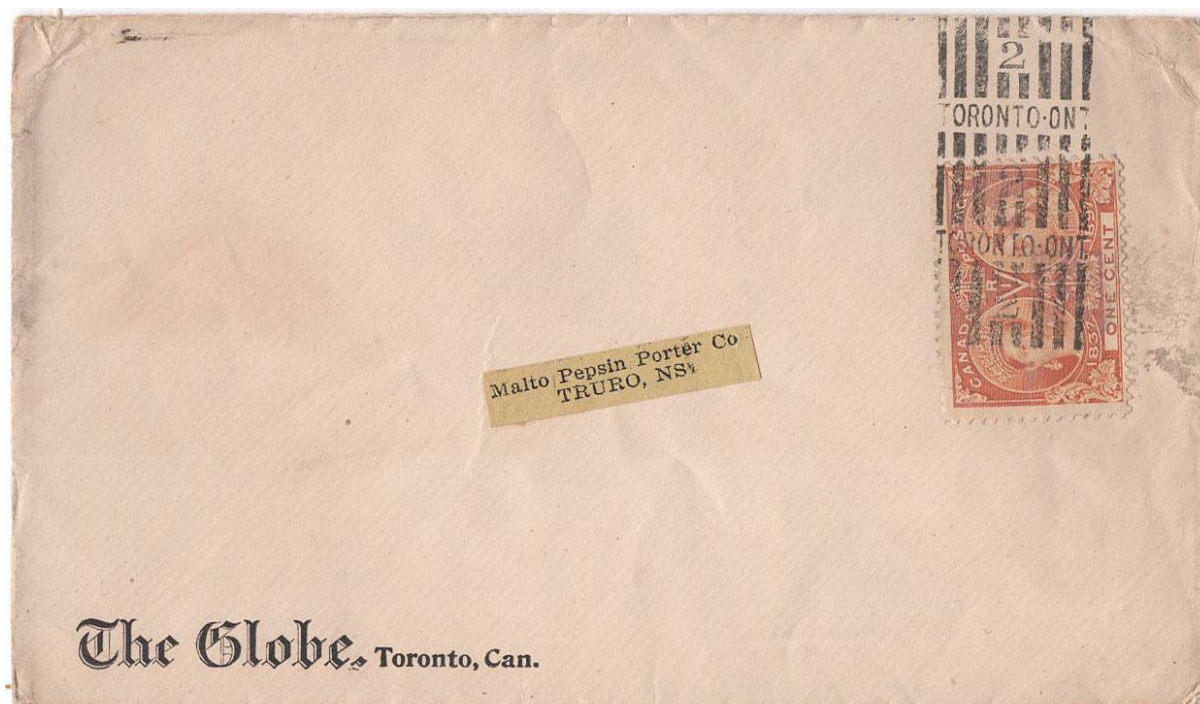

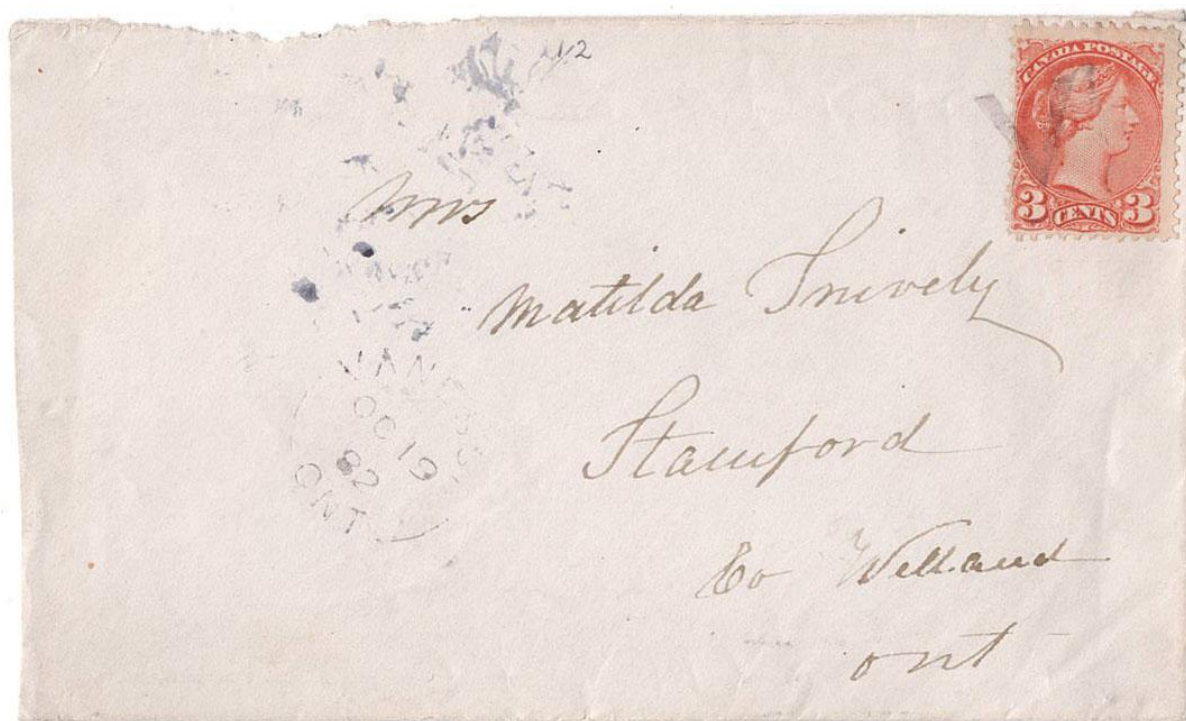

Item 626-14 – **Toronto roller No.2 ties 1¢ Jubilee** – c1897, 1¢ Jubilee tied by a neat Toronto roller No.2 on The Globe unsealed cover with address label paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Truro NS. \$100.00





Item 626-15 – **V fancy cancel Lacelle 847 – Vanessa Ontario** – 1882, 3¢ SQ (pimple on neck) tied by "V" fancy cancel on cover from Vanessa Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Stamford (b/s) via Toronto (b/s). Lacelle 847 p.85. Some paper lost UL. Norfolk County. \$200.00

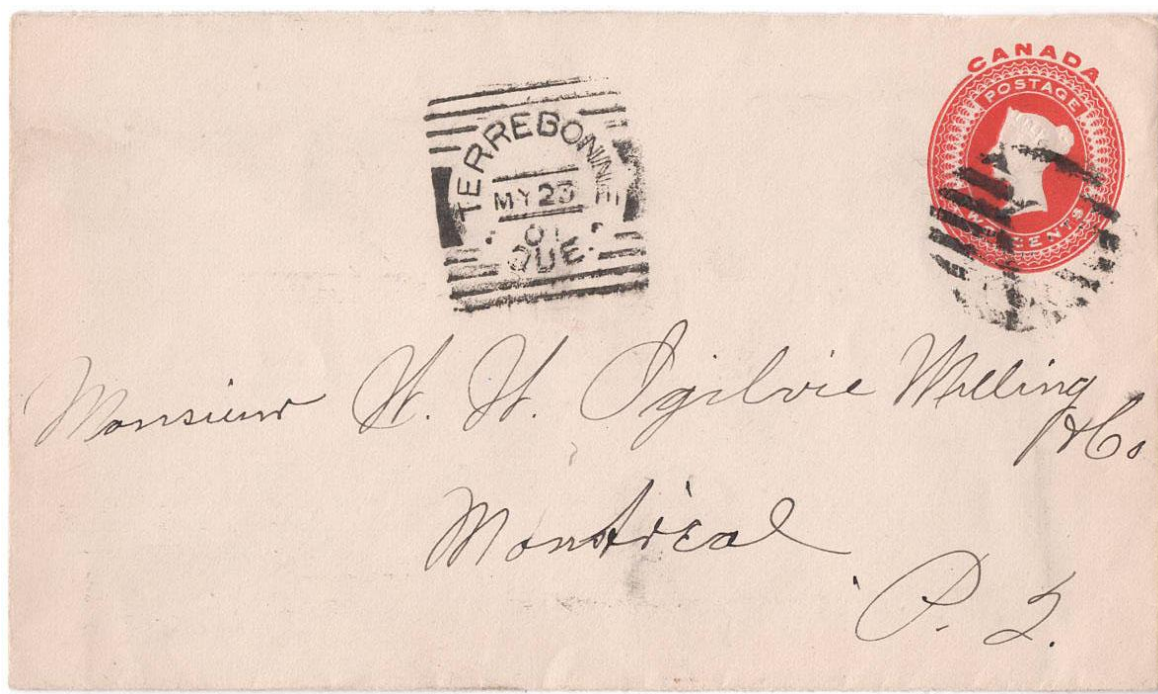


Item 626-16 – **Vanessa Ont carried by Canada Southern Railway** – 1880, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by circular grid cancel on cover from Vanessa Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Hamilton (oval Registered Hamilton Ont. b/s). By horse to Windham Centre or Waterford and put on Canada Southern Railway which had reached the area in 1872. RY-33 CA Southern R broken circle (1874-1886) and RY-34 boxed handstamp (1875-1893). Norfolk County. \$175.00



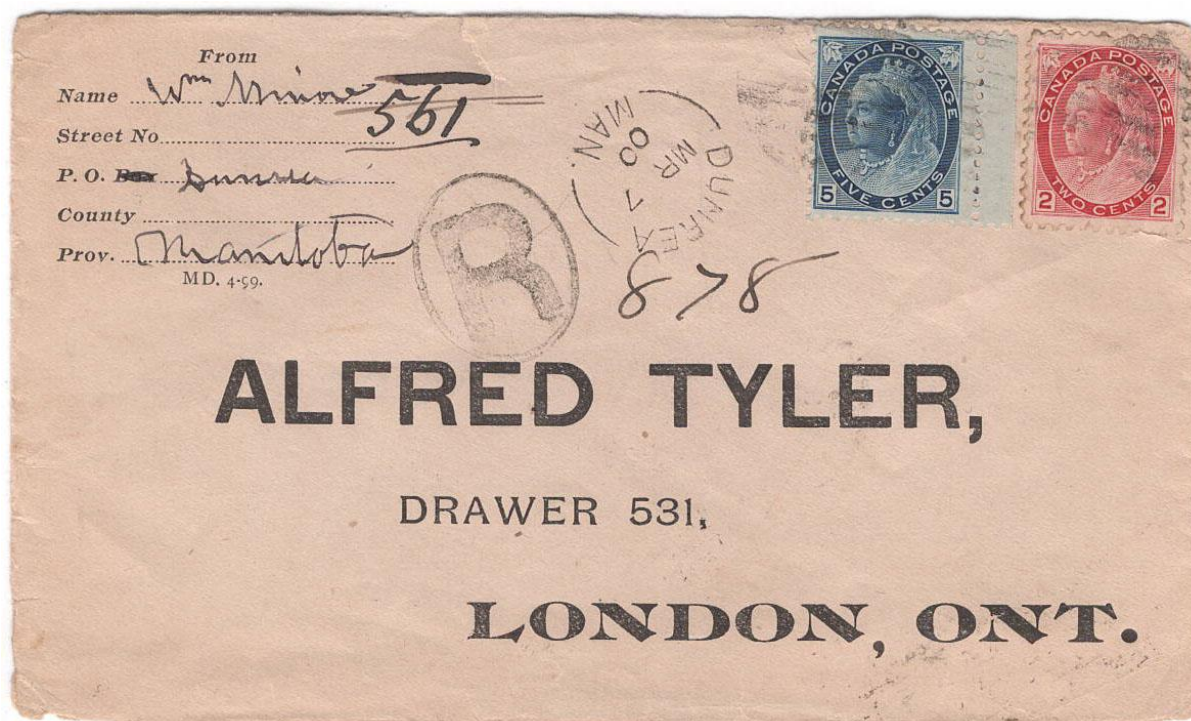

Item 626-64 – U-Boat U331 - Red Cross Express Message to Camp Lethbridge – 1944, Red Cross Express Message on delicate paper form from The Netherlands to Lethbridge Camp, from a volunteer at the Air Force Hospital, Amsterdam to NCO Hand Brunsbach, a survivor of the sinking of U331, struck in circular rose Internment Operations Lethbridge censor at LR. The recipient of this message served on U331, one the first U-Boats to enter the Mediterranean. She landed troops in Tobruk and El Alamein in November 1941. Sunk the following year. 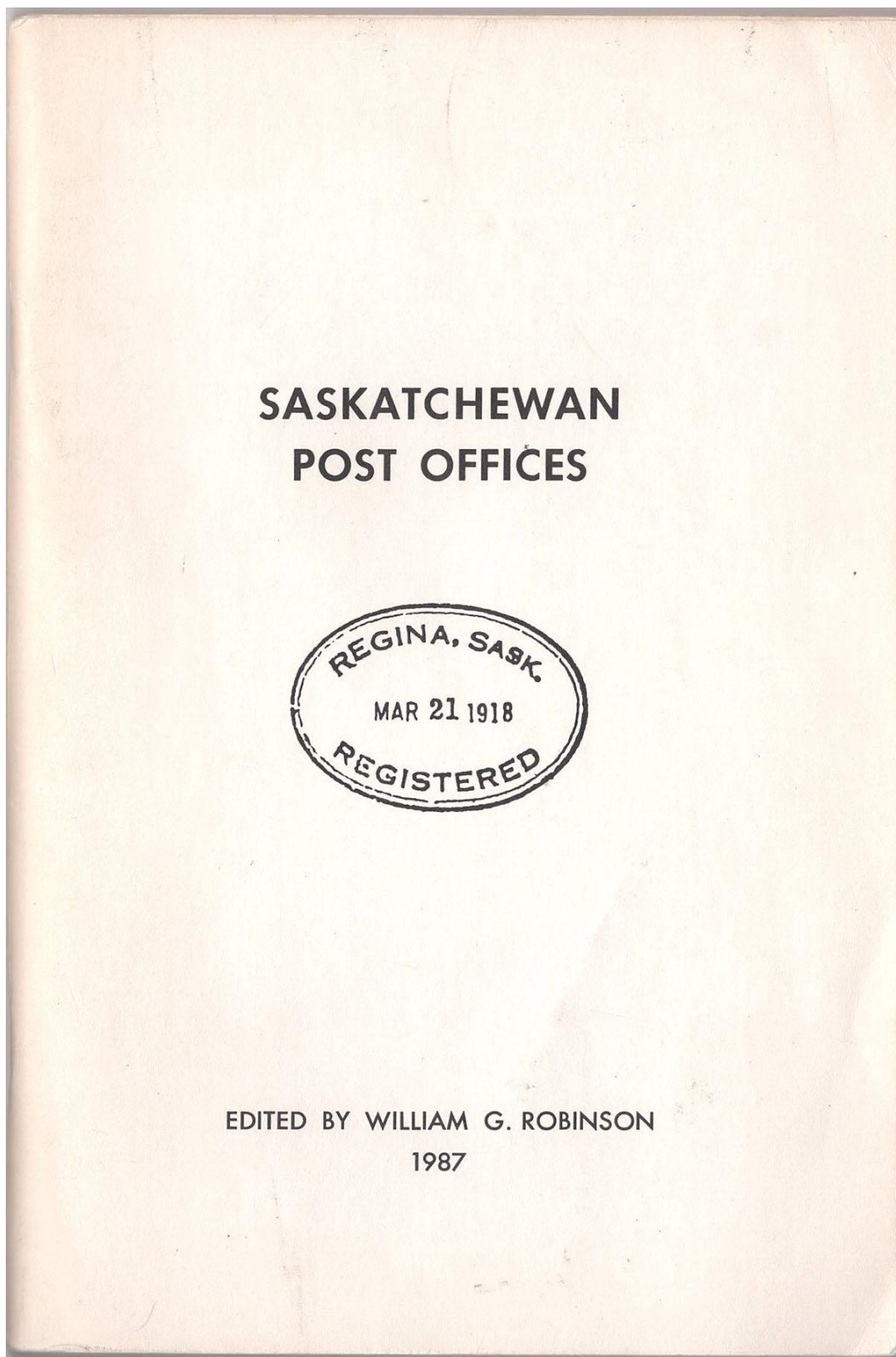

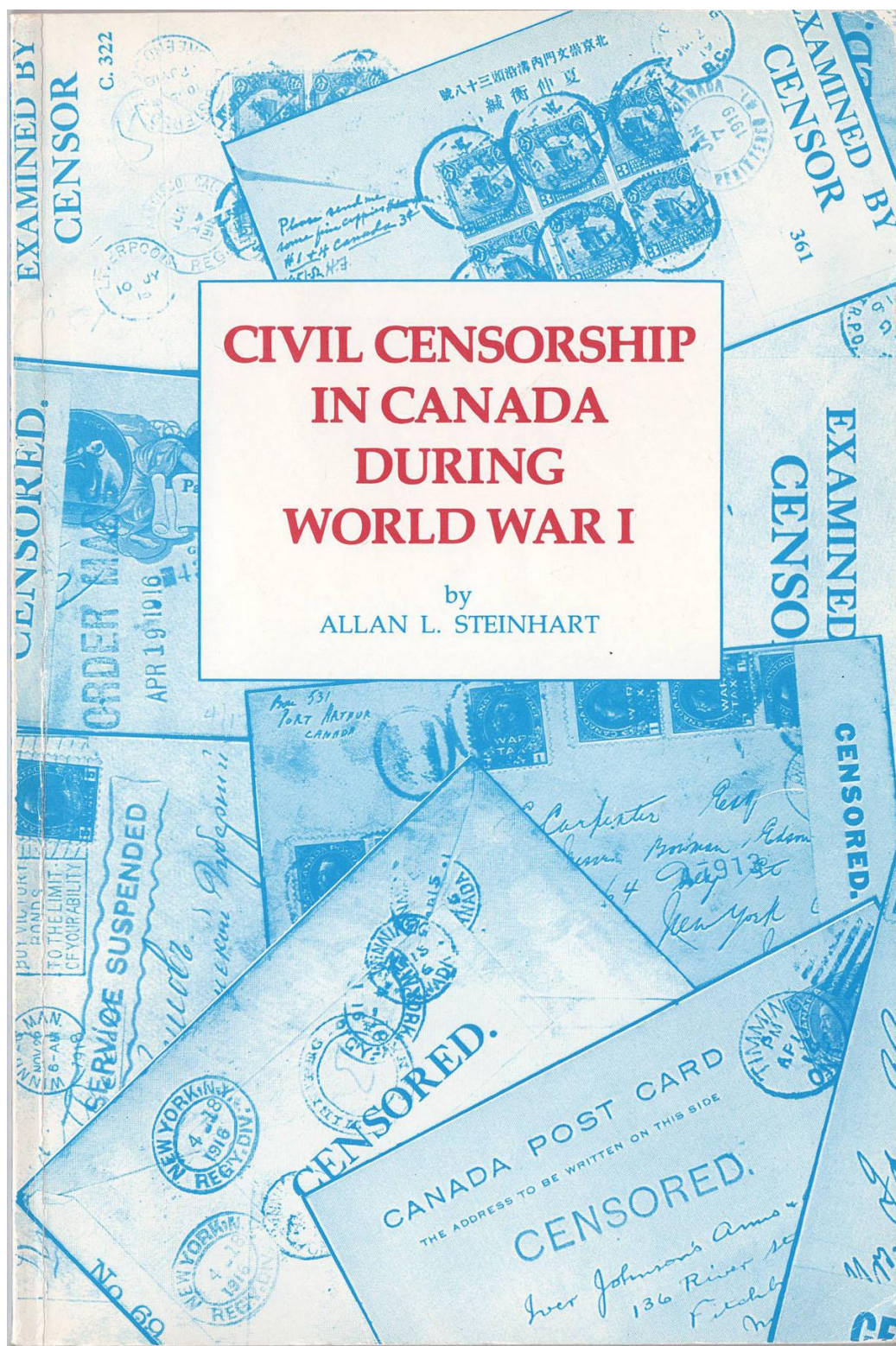

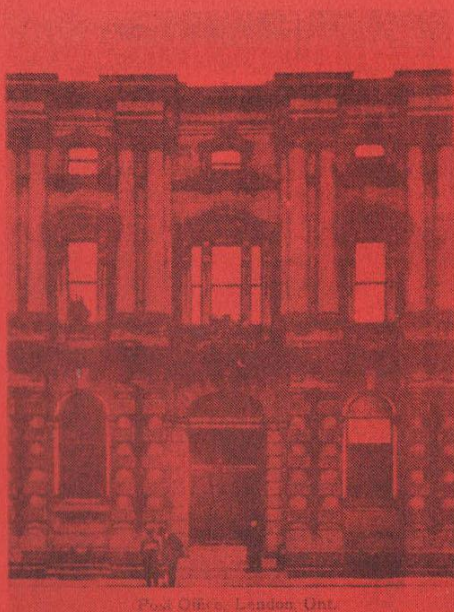
