




Item 629-01 – <u>Toronto free, Editor of The Mail</u> – 1882, free franked cover from Toronto to Ottawa with The Mail letterhead signed by Martin Griffin (1847-1921), 4 pages, committing to a notice for the Register. In a banter in reply to something to Henry Morgan has written, Griffin notes "But, my dear boy, I know I have enemies, I have eaten and drank with reptiles". And continues "I get up every morning to make enemies, I have not made as many as Sir John or Sir Charles or Sir he Toronto and the rest of them". A very unusual free franked letter from an editor. \$75.00 SOLD



Item 629-02 – J.M. Vernon Manager of Portland and Boston Railway – 1875, 3¢ SQ tied by Montreal CE Berri duplex cancel, with letter, paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa. Autograph letter signed accompanies, by J.M. Vernon, the manager of the Portland and Boston Railway, 2 pages, headed City Bank Chambers, referring to Cartwright's application, requesting a copy of the Premier's address on Public Works especially on the Pacific Road, and noting purchasing of the steel rails. Noting that Douglass has promised to send all the plans and specifications now ready and noting lists of all improvements to the Lachine and St. Lawrence canals. \$75.00



Item 629-03 – Regina NWT, Nicholas Flood Davin (MP and poet) – 1894, Regina NWT 7 pages autograph letter signed from Nicholas Flood Davin (1843-1901), lawyer, newspaper founder, Member of Parliament and poet. A remarkable biographical letter written in an agitated state, extolling his achievements and mentioning supportive letters received from Lord Dufferin, Lord Lansdowne, Goldwin Smith and Sir John A. Macdonald to his contribution to Canadian Monthly and his poetry published as "Eoa – An Epic of the Dawn and other poems". Touches on Ontario politics of the 1870's also. Addressed to Henry Morgan, the Canadian author and editor. \$100.00

Moylan – 1901, autograph letter signed from James George Moylan (1826-1902) teacher, editor, publisher and civil servant. 4 pages headed Dale Avenue (Ottawa) to Henry Morgan. Moylan is sending additional biographical material on his great friend, Thomas D'Arcy McGee. He writes in part: "McGee and myself having been so closely and intimately associated, personal and politically, however much I desired to do so, I could not leave out the ego and do justice to what I had to pass in review. I think you should use every line by McGee in the letter I have quoted from except perhaps what he says of myself. Sending along Mrs Moylan's photo of Mrs McGee and asking for its return. \$75.00





Autograph letter signed from Kivas Tully accompanies (1820-1905) architect and civil engineer. 8 pages datelines Toronto AP 2 97, sending along enclosed a two-page biographical typescript from the Canadian Architect and Builder, June 1896. Tully was a founding member and officer of the Royal Canadian Institute and Mason. \$150.00

Item 629-07 – William Alexander Foster (Liberal nationalism in Canada) – 1875, cover mailed from the House of Commons, Thomas Moss MP free franked, with autograph letter signed 1-page datelined Toronto MR 3 75 from William Alexander Foster (1840-1888) to Ottawa. Foster was a barrister and essayist, best remembered as a co-founder of the Canada first movement and for contributions to liberal nationalism in Canada. The letter is addressed to Morgan regarding political intrigue and the need for Morgan to guide Samuel Platt. "He seems to vote opposition every time, I relied upon you keeping him all right, he thinks of you in the highest terms". Foster was a leading spokesman for a Toronto centered group of intellectuals and public men who in the wake of Confederations came to believe that without a unifying sense of purpose Canadian national hood would succumb to American hostility, British indifference, racial animosity and political partisanship. \$200.00



Item 629-08 – Mayor of Toronto Robert J. Fleming – 1896, typed letter signed by the Mayor of Toronto and business leader, Robert J. Fleming. Dated Mayor's Office FE 6 96, 3 pages, to Canadian author and editor Henry Morgan. Text is water stained and ink bleeding, signature highly smudged. A terrific biographical letter recounting for the first time, his family history and the details of his public life. Makes special note of his commitment to labor and to the Temperance cause. A terrific biographical letter. \$150.00

Item 629-09 – William Haughton (Canadian poet under the pen Silvicola) – 1865, autograph letter signed by William Haughton, Canadian poet who published in Canadian Newspapers, and the American Magazine Graham's, under the pen name of poet Silvicola. Lived in Keppel UC. 3 pages, a detailed biographical letter outlining the publication of various poems in local press. \$75.00



Item 629-10 – <u>Kingston to New York via Cape Vincent</u> – 1852, banking folded letter from Kingston UC rated 20¢ US collect (double 10¢) with Canada arc in red exchange marking to New York. Routed via Cape Vincent. Most letters from Kingston to New York are going through Cape Vincent exchange but rarely we have the Cape Vincent 30mm circular datestamp accompanies. \$75.00



Item 629-11 – <u>Albany NY to Queenston CW</u> – 1854, stampless cover from Albany NY paid 10 with *United-States Paid 6d* exchange marking, paying 10¢ cross border letter rate to Queenston (b/s). The United-States Paid 6d marking is scarce, 47mmx12mm applied in Buffalo. \$60.00



Item 629-12 – <u>Portsmouth NH to Frost Village UC (Shefford)</u> – 1841, family letter from Portsmouth New Hampshire to Frost Village UC via Derby and Stanstead (*written Derby, not Derby Line*). Rated 18¾¢ collect converted to 11½d plus 4½d to Shefford County total 1/4 collect. The letter relates to the Ladd Family. \$125.00



Item 629-13 – London to Montreal – Shipment of staves – 1851, shipping company folded letter from Montgomerie & Greenhorn of London to Edmonstone Allan & Co. in Montreal. Mailed unpaid with British claim 1/2 Stg and charged 1/4 Currency on arrival. The letter relates to ships: The Great Britain, The Polly who had met with severe weather and being repaired in Valparaiso (Chile) etc. The letter reads in part: "We note the shipment of staves you receipt of the Quebec invoice shall endeavour to have them sold to arrive - We hope the city would not be long after the Great Britain in sailing". \$100.00



Item 629-14 – <u>Anglo-Saxon from Quebec</u> - 1858, stampless cover with letter from Quebec CE (Ruggles 21 MAY 1858 in red) paid 6d Stg paying the Allan Line rate to England (7½d paid by sender). Endorsed and carried by the Anglo-Saxon departing Quebec MY 22 to Liverpool JU 3. The Anglo Saxon later was wrecked neat Cape Race in 1863. The letter is from Captain Oldfield stationed at Quebec to his wife. Paid 6d Stg Arnell E.1 marking p.219. \$250.00 SOLD



Item 629-15 – <u>Anglo-Saxon for Quebec</u> - 1858, stampless business letter from Glasgow to Ramsay CW (b/s) via Montreal (b/s). Mailed unpaid, carried by Allan Line Anglo-Saxon to Quebec and rated 7½d collect. Montreal and Toronto had handstamps for unpaid incoming letters of 7½d, although this Arnell handstamp E10 has not been recorded for Quebec, its use there cannot be ruled out, however the letter has a Montreal transit (b/s). A great strike! \$150.00



Item 629-16 – Rondeau CW to England (Kent County, 1860-1882) – 1858, large cover from Rondeau CW to Bourton-on-the-Water England. Rated with a huge 5/10 Currency converted to 5/4 Sterling collect (7 times the single rate). Carried by Cunard Asia departing Boston SE 22 58 to Liverpool (Pkt Letter Liverpool b/s). Routed via Chatham and Hamilton (b/s). Bourton is a village in the rural Cotswolds area of South-Central England. A huge sum and a spectacular Transatlantic cover! \$250.00



Item 629-17 – **1875 Paid 6 (¢) on Transatlantic cover** – 1875, stampless cover with letter from Windsor Ont (*struck in blue*) paid 6 paying 6¢ Allan Line letter rate to England (b/s) via Hamilton (b/s). A very interesting Paid 6 Arnell E.2 previously recorded in Toronto in 1870 and Hamilton in 1864. Carried by Allan Line Moravian from Portland to Liverpool. Letter accompanies. This cover looks ordinary, but it is not and possibly the second recorded example of this Paid 6 marking to England. Interestingly, a very late Transatlantic stampless, payment by stamp mandatory and rate changed to 5¢ on October 1, 1875. A real wow cover! \$200.00



Item 629-18 – <u>Toronto Paid – 8 Paid 10</u> – 1857, business folded letter from Toronto with Toronto Paid 24 AU 57 circular datestamp, rated 8 Paid 10 (Arnell D.8 8d Stg 10d Currency handstamp) paying the Cunard rate to Kirby Stephen, England. Carried by Cunard Canada out of Boston arriving in Liverpool SP 5 57 (on front). Two cities Toronto and Hamilton used handstamp 8 Paid 10 with no currency designations, to indicate letters prepaid for the British Packets out of U.S. ports. \$150.00



Item 629-19 – <u>Toronto 1/2 Stg Arnell A.10 handstamp</u> – 1858, stampless cover from Toronto to Godstone Surrey, England (b/s). Rated 1/2 Sterling collect. From 1853, the Toronto office used a 1/2 handstamp to show the postage due in Sterling on mail to England. Carried by Cunard Line Canada from Boston to Liverpool (b/s). A choice example of the Arnell A.10. \$150.00




Item 629-20 – <u>Kagawong Ont (Manitoulin)</u> – 1877, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by fancy cancel on cover from Kagawong Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Manitowaning Lake Huron (b/s) via Collingwood (b/s). Possible carried by steamer to Spanish River and then back to Manitoulin Island. 7 days journey. A neat cover. \$175.00



Item 629-21 – Rainy River KEE – 1891, 3¢ SQ tied by cork cancel on Fotheringham Lumber c/c cover from Rainy River KEE paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Back paper lost and rounded corner LR (the usual condition on Crown Lands correspondence). \$450.00





Item 629-22 – <u>Canadian Pacific Railway British Columbia</u> – 1895, 3¢ SQ tied by CPRy MC Brit Col (East) cds on mourning cover with letter from Vancouver paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa. RPO RY-22, 2nd period RF D or E. Henry Morgan family related. \$125.00



Item 629-23 – Clayton & Sons Provincial Exhibition – 1897, 3¢ Jubilee tied by Halifax squared circle on Nova Scotia Provincial Exhibition and Clayton & Sons c/c cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Arichat (b/s). Reverse with paper lost due to opening UL and priced accordingly. \$100.00 SOLD





Item 629-24 – Newfoundland registered to Germany – 1899, 3¢ Victoria #55 (2), 5¢ Seal #60 (1) tied by oval registered St. John's NFLD on red registered cover to Kenzingen Baden, Germany (b/s). \$200.00



Item 629-25 – Bernier et Cie of St. Hyacinthe Que – 1900, 2¢ Numeral tied by St. Hyacinthe Que duplex cancel on Bernier & Cie Merchants of Floor, Grain, Seeds all-over advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). \$100.00



Item 629-26 – McDonald Iron Works Co. Dawson YT – 1901, 1¢ Numeral (2, perfs gum toned) tied by Dawson YT Canada cds on McDonald Iron Works c/c cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. \$100.00 SOLD



Item 629-27 – Montreal J.T. Ewart Coal and Wood – c1900, unused J.T. Ewart Coal and Wood advertising cover showing Steamer Prescott, Nun's Island and the Victoria Bridge. \$50.00






Item 629-28 – <u>Canadian Contingent EN ROUTE</u> – 1900, Boer War stampless cover with oval Canadian Contingent EN ROUTE South Africa dated JA 30 00 to Bryson Quebec (b/s) via Ottawa (b/s). The cover is from Lieutenant LeRoy, onboard the S.S. Sardinian en route to South Africa, serving with D Field Battery RCA. 2nd Contingent. Postage due on Boer War service mail was sporadically applied, this one free. One of the nicest en route strike that I have ever handled. \$1,500.00



Item 629-29 – <u>Collection of Lake Megantic Que postcards</u> – 1910-1920, Small collection of 22 Lake Megantic Quebec postcards, real photo postcard and patriotics, town views, steamers, docks, street scenes with automobiles, numerous Maple Ave. 12 were mailed (Lake Megantic Que, Lac Megantic PQ etc), if not posted most are written. A nice little group. \$575.00











Item 629-36 – **1c Admiral yellow booklet stamps** – 1931, 1¢ Admiral booklet stamps (3) tied by Quebec PQ machine cancel on "Canadian Service" Anchor-Donaldson Line lettercard paying 3¢ letter rate to Massachusetts. Headed S.S. Athenia dated JY 3 31. The writer mentions being on his way to Europe from Montreal, now in Quebec City, plans to visit the British Isles and Paris, Montreal was hot etc. \$45.00







