

Item 630-01 – <u>St. Thomas Tannery (Elgin County)</u> – 1861, stampless cover from St. Thomas UC with gorgeous M.T. Moore & Son Tannery cameo advertising, paid 5 through charge box account paying 5¢ letter rate to Strathburn (b/s) via Glencoe (b/s). Middle fold. \$750.00



Item 630-02 – **Toronto experimental (1886 only)** – 1886, 1¢ stationery card from Toronto to local with the very scarce experimental *+Toronto-Canada+* double circle. 24.5mm, tiny and dotted inner circle, Maltese crosses on either side. Also called the "scarifying cds". Recorded from July 1886 to November 1886 only. The nicest that I have seen. \$175.00 **SOLD**







Item 630-22 – <u>Political beginnings of Horatio Hocken</u> – 1906, 1¢ Edward (pre-affixing fault) tied by Toronto machine cancel on Toronto Board of Control election related card paying 1¢ postcard rate to local. Horatio Clarence Hocken (1857-1937) was a Canadian politician, Mayor of Toronto, social reformer, a founder of what became the Toronto Star and Grand Master of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America from 1914 to 1918. \$50.00




Item 630-23 – <u>Conboy's Roller Top</u> – 1909, 1¢ Edward stationery card with Conboy's Roller Top advertising mailed from Toronto paying 1¢ postcard rate to S.S.R.D. Nova Scotia. Punch holes and priced accordingly. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 630-24 – **2¢ Edward imperforated on KEVII postcard** – 1909, 2¢ Edward imperforated tied by Winnipeg cds on KEVII and Queen Alexandra postcard paying 2¢ postcard rate to Ohio. This is the first non philatelic 2¢ Edward imperf use on a postcard that I have seen. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 630-27 – Toronto experimental cancel on special delivery – 1903, 2¢ Edward, 10¢ Special Delivery E1 tied by Toronto experimental unofficial duplex cancel on North Bay Pacific Hotel advertising cover paying 12¢ drop special delivery letter rate. This device named Orb 2-T3 was previously an experimental duplex cancel known as DUN-148, changed to Orb cancel. This peculiar device is recorded as duplex from April 9, 1901 to January 10, 1902. Then, recorded as Orb cancel from Jamaury 13 1902 to September 1903. An exhibit cover and rare! \$400.00






Item 630-39 - Two Salada postcards with reply attached and prepaid

c1920, 1¢ Admiral tied by Toronto 3^{rd} class machine cancel on two Salada postcards, with prepaid reply and order card attached, paying 1¢ 3^{rd} class matter rate to Tillsonburg. The blue one staining and aging, the orange one pretty! Lot of 2 \$100.00 **SOLD**





Item 630-40 – An interesting Chibougamau flight – 1929, 5¢ Airmail C1, 20¢ Special Delivery E3 tied by Chibougamau PQ cds on flight cover to Oskelanec underpaying 35¢ airmail registered special delivery rate to Halifax. The registry was unpaid and then charged 20¢ the double deficiency. Reverse with Oskelanec (b/s), Quebec transit and Halifax receiver as well as the payment of the dues. An interesting E3 shortpaid flight cover. \$75.00 SOLD



Item 630-42 – Edmonton via Herschel Island Yukon to California – 1930, 5¢ Airmail C1, 20¢ Special Delivery E3 tied by Edmonton Alta machine cancel on Macdonald Hotel advertising cover to California (b/s). Endorsed via Herschel Island NWT (AU 2 30), Herschel Island Yukon using NWT broken circle from 1925 to 1930, via Aklavik (AU 3 30). \$75.00





Item 630-43 – Rutledge flight cover to Tanganyika Terr., East Africa – 1930, 5¢ Airmail C1, 10¢ Scroll tied by Calgary Alta cds on flight registered cover paying 15¢ airmail registered to Turney Valley Alberta. Endorsed by Rutledge Air Service. Once in Turney Valley, redirected to Tanganyika Territory, East Africa. Reverse: Winnipeg, MacLeod & Calgary RPO, Okotoks Alta, Montreal B&F etc. \$75.00





Item 630-44 – <u>Englehart Ont to Argentina via Montreal flight</u> – 1930, 5¢ Airmail C1, 10¢ Scroll tied by Englehart Ont cds on registered airmail cover to Argentina, via Montreal flight to Moncton and then to St. John. Carried by North Bay and Cochrane RPO and routed via Montreal B&F and New York. Timiskaming District. \$50.00






Item 630-46 – <u>Calgary Postmaster signed cover</u> – 1932, 6¢ Airmail C3 tied by Calgary machine cancel, white aircraft facing right in slogan, on Postmaster signed cover, paying 6¢ airmail rate to New York. \$25.00 **SOLD**





Item 630-47 – <u>Campbell's Condensed Soups</u> – 1932, 2¢ Arch, 3¢ Provisional tied by Toronto roller cancel on Campbell Soup Company Ltd advertising cover paying 5¢ double weight drop letter rate. Rough opening affecting back flap. \$45.00 **SOLD**



Item 630-48 – <u>Vancouver E.A. Morris cigarette and cigar maker</u> – 1933, 3¢ Medallion tied by Vancouver machine cancel on EA Morris tobacconist advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to North Carolina. (b/s). Morris was established in 1892 in Victoria BC. \$40.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 630-49 – <u>Hudson Hope BC registered mailing tag</u> – 1935, 5¢ Medallion, 20¢ (2), 50¢ Pictorial tied by Hudson Hope BC on handmade registered mailing tag paying 95¢ registered money packet to Royal Canadian Mint in Vancouver. Routed through Edmonton Alta. \$150.00






Item 630-50 – Fort St. John BC to Edmonton signed flight cover – 1937, 6¢ Airmail C5 tied by Fort St. John BC cds on FFC to Edmonton, signed by Postmasters and pilots etc. This service was performed by E.W. Kubicek of United Air Transport, intended stops at Peace River, Grand Prairie, Dawson Creek. The aircraft was unable to land at Dawson Creek and due to the aircraft not landing, there were not entirely flown. Trucked to Edmonton. \$50.00



Item 630-51 – **3¢ UPU postcard rate to Malaya – Refused** – 1938, 3¢ Mufti tied by Tavistock Ont duplex cancel on boring Toronto Exhibition postcard paying 3¢ UPU postcard rate to Perak, Malaya. Refused, tax 5, T10 centimes, 4 cents Malayan postage due stamp tied by Ipoh and then sent to the Dead Letter Office. A show piece. \$350.00



Item 630-52 – <u>Drill and skilsaw</u> – 1938, 1¢ GEOV stationery card mailed from Toronto to Vancouver reverse with drill illustrated and skilsaw advertising. \$30.00








Item 630-53 – Shedden Ontario air crash – 1941, airmail cover from Mount Kisco New York to Napa California reverse with "Recovered from Plane Damaged Oct 30 1941 at / Shedden Ont. Canada" in violet, salvaged from American Airways flight AM7 New York to Chicago via Detroit. Caught fire and crashed in a field near Shedden at 10:10 PM Oct 30, 1941. Some 694 pieces of mail were salvaged in burned condition and forwarded from Detroit in ambulance cover (above). Envelope handstamped with a matching violet "Important Official Mail / No Postage Required See Par 3 Sec 511 PL&R / Airmail". \$300.00 SOLD



Item 630-54 – <u>DLO 3¢ due ambulance cover from Quebec PQ</u> – 1942, Dead Letter Office ambulance cover, form 100,000 7-2-39 mailed from Quebec City to Duchesnay (b/s) via St. Raymond (b/s). Then redirected to Deniau, L'Islet County. Lower left shows boxed DLO Quebec PQ Central des Rebuts. \$75.00



Item 630-55 – **20¢ subsequent AR fee card** – 1939, 20¢ Pictorial tied by St. Catharines Ont cds on Post Office AR card from to Yugoslavia paying the exceedingly rare 20¢ subsequent delayed acknowledgment of receipt fee. A spectacular and exceedingly rare AR card that will bring brownie points on rarity to an exhibit. \$450.00



Item 630-56 – <u>13¢ War Issue trio on OAT cover</u> – 1945, 1¢, 13¢ War (3) tied by Montreal roller cancel on OAT and censored cover paying 40¢ airmail letter rate to Sweden. Onward Air Transmission. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>






Item 630-57 – **25¢ airmail rate to Colombia** – 1945, 7¢, 8¢, 10¢ War tied by Toronto machine cancel on censored cover paying 25¢ airmail letter rate to Colombia (b/s). An interesting cover with the 8¢ Farm Scene. \$30.00




Item 630-58 – <u>Edmonton underpaid airmail cover to South Africa</u> – 1946, 10¢, 20¢ War tied by Edmonton Alta machine cancel on cover underpaying 50¢ airmail letter rate to South Africa. Shortpaid 20¢, then rated T200 centimes (T1/8) or 20d postage due. A short-live rate in effect from July 1946 to October 1946 only. A very pretty cover! \$300.00



Item 630-59 – <u>Toronto Baseball Club</u> – 1952, 2¢ Postes Postage (2) tied by Toronto machine cancel on Toronto Maple Leaf Baseball Club advertising cover paying 4¢ letter rate to Wisconsin. First in "52" added Cinderella lower right. In 1952, the triple A club was affiliated with the St. Louis Browns of the major league. Two file folds. \$30.00 SOLD



Item 630-60 – <u>Salvaged from Moose Jaw air crash with ambulance cover</u> – 1954, cover from Saskatchewan to Banff Alberta, salvaged from the Air Canada DC-8 Moose Jaw air crash (April 8, 1954). Forwarded to destination with Canada Post Office ambulance envelope with apology letter accompanies. \$200.00






