


Item 631-01 – <u>Chippawa advertised in Cayuga</u> – 1871, folded letter from Chippawa Ont rated 5¢ collect to Cayuga (b/s). Advertised in Cayuga with the seldom seen tiny "Advertised" struck in red. An interesting delayed cover with a rare auxiliary marking. \$200.00






Item 631-02 – <u>Pelham UC (Welland, closed in 1856)</u> – 1848, folded cover from Pelham UC paid 4½d to Drummondville (b/s) via Chippawa (b/s). Reverse with Office of District School Board waxseal. \$150.00







Item 631-03 – 1¢ LQ on private bill of The Ontario Peat Company – 1869, 1¢ Large Queen (pre-affixing fault) tied by Ottawa fancy cancel on private bill for the Ontario Peat Company (peat fuel) paying 1¢ printed matter rate to local. Unusual. \$200.00






Item 631-04 – <u>St. Thomas gang plow manufacturers</u> – 1892, 3¢ SQ tied by St. Thomas Ont duplex cancel on McKenzie gang plow and implement manufacturers advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. \$100.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 631-05 – <u>Aylmer Riding and Driving Park</u> – 1894, 3¢ SQ tied by Aylmer Ont squared circle on G.A. Bingham Fancy Groceries cover (reverse with Bingham cinderella), Aylmer Riding and Driving Park advertising, paying 3¢ letter rate to New York (b/s). A spectacular Elgin County horse race related cover. \$200.00 **SOLD** 




Item 631-06 – <u>St. Thomas Ladies College</u> – 1891, 1¢ SQ tied by cork cancel on Alma Ladies College of St. Thomas Ontario paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Toronto (b/s). Choice. \$125.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 631-07 – Toronto Heintzman Pianos – 1897, 3¢ SQ tied by Toronto Orb cancel on Gerhard Heintzman advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to New York (b/s). Heintzman & Co was a Toronto based piano manufacturer for more than 100 years, producing pianos in Toronto from 1866 to 1978. Pretty. \$100.00






Item 631-08 – Rodney livestock dealer to Moose Mountain NWT – 1888, 3¢ SQ tied by grid cancel on C.A. Brown dealer in Grain and Livestock cover from Rodney Ontario paying 3¢ letter rate to Moose Mountain ASSA NWT. Redirected to Fleming ASSA (b/s) via Moosomin NWT (b/s). Moose Mountain was in operation without postmark from 1883 to 1888. A seldom encountered Southeast Saskatchewan cover. \$400.00





Item 631-09 – The only recorded Dutton Ont manuscript postmark – 1874, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Dutton Station Ontario with the only recorded example Dutton manuscript postmark, dated DE 3 74, to London. The Dutton Station Post Office opened on OC 1 74 under the Postmaster Archibald J. Leitch. The name of the office was changed to Dutton on JA 1 87. No cancelling device had yet been received. It is notable that the town was being called simply Dutton in 1873 even though the Post Office did not officially drop the "Station" until 1887. The card relates to change of the writer's mailing address from Wallacetown to Dutton. Elgin County. \$300.00






Item 631-10 – <u>Woodstock Ont Crockery, China and Lamps</u> – 1882, 1¢ stationery card from Woodstock MO Ont to Hagersville (Thomas Goodwin Esq, Hotel, Hagersville). Reverse with Woodstock Crockery, China, Lamps and Bohemian Glassware advertising. Wow! \$100.00 **SOLD** 





Item 631-11 – **St. Jerome Quebec Thibaudeau Rinfret** – c1903-6, 2¢ Numeral tied by St. Jerome Que duplex cancel on Prevost & Rinfret Barristers c/c cover to St. Eustache. A Wilfrid Laurier patriotic postcard accompanies pictured with Thibaudeau Rinfret. A nice match that would make a nice page. \$60.00






Item 631-12 – <u>Welland Vale Bicycles Manufacturers Co.</u> – 1898, 1¢ Numeral stationery card with Welland Vale advertising, mailed from St. Catharines to Lansdowne (b/s). Axes, saws, picks, forks etc and bikes. \$50.00 **SOLD** 





Item 631-13 – Montreal experimental machine cancel – 1902, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Montreal with X2(a) rimless experimental machine cancel to Brockville. 15 covers or cards are recorded; this card is a late use and listed No.12 on the list. Recorded from JA 6 02 to JA 28 02. A nice clean beauty!. \$200.00 SOLD







Item 631-14 – <u>American Express Company</u> – 1902, 2¢ Numeral tied by St. Thomas & Windsor MC W cds on American Express Company Money Order advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to London. ON-505. \$100.00





Item 631-15 – <u>Ingersoll Packing Company to Ireland</u> – 1901, 2¢ Numeral (2, *all-over perfs gum toned*) tied by Niagara Falls & London RYPO cds on Ingersoll Packing Co. advertising cover paying 4¢ double weight Empire letter rate to Ireland. Cheese exporters, pork packers etc. \$175.00 **SOLD** 





Item 631-16 – Port Stanley for canoeing, fishing and boating – 1899, 2¢ Map tied by Port Stanley Ont cds on Walter Mitchell General Merchant c/c cover, with holiday and vacation promotional, paying 2¢ letter rate to London (b/s). Port Stanley "An ideal summer home". Certainly, one of the finest Map advertising cover. \$250.00 SOLD



Item 631-17 – <u>The Central Hotel of Aylmer (Elgin County)</u> – 1899, 2¢ Map tied by Aylmer West Ont cds on Central Hotel advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Brantford (b/s). \$125.00



Item 631-18 – <u>Port Stanley Beach illustrated</u> (Elgin) – 1910, 2¢ Edward (margin copy) tied by Port Stanley Ont duplex cancel on Port Stanley Beach illustrated cover paying 2¢ letter rate to London. \$100.00






Item 631-19 - 20¢ Edward vertical strip of 3 on registered fur tag - 1912, 20¢ Edward vertical strip of 3, 1¢ Admiral tied by Balgonie Saskatchewan roller cancel on Corry Hide & Fur Co. mailed tag, from Edenwold Sask, paying 61¢ 4th class registered matter rate to Pennsylvania. 1¢ for each ounce plus 5¢ registry fee. Manuscript "raw furs no duty" along with a U.S. Customs marking. Staining. No doubt a very scarce 20¢ Edward use. \$400.00



Item 631-20 – Rhodes Island special delivery cover with E1 – 1912, US 2¢ Washington tied by oval Providence RI handstamp, 10¢ Special Delivery E1 tied by Toronto "50" MAY 22 1912 handstamp on cover from Providence RI paying 12¢ special delivery letter rate to Toronto (b/s). E1 cancelled at destination as per regulation. A very scarce and appealing E1 use. \$350.00 SOLD




Item 631-21 – <u>Dawson Yukon to Tasmania</u> – 1907, 2¢ Edward booklet stamp tied by Dawson YT duplex cancel on cover paying 2¢ Empire letter rate to Tasmania via San Francisco (b/s). Tasmania, the scarcest destination of the 8 Australian States and Territories. \$125.00



Item 631-22 – <u>Inverted Toronto for Third Class precancel on cover</u> – 1907, 1¢ Edward with inverted precancel "Toronto – For Third Class Matter Only" on Ontario Medical c/c cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Arnprior. 1¢ Edward 4-89-1. A very common stamp but seldom seen on cover. Staining. \$60.00 **SOLD** 







Item 631-23 – <u>WW1 1<sup>st</sup> Royal Newfoundland Regiment – inventor of the British Smoke Hood</u> – 1915, OAS censored cover from APO S.Z.2, Gallipoli Turkey, self-censored and signed by Captain Cluny MacPherson to his wife in St. John's Newfoundland (b/s). Dr. Macpherson was commissioned Captain and Medical Officer of the newly formed 1<sup>st</sup> Newfoundland Regiment. He served with his unit in Belgium, France, Greece, Turket and Egypt. The German army used poison gas for the first time against allied troops at the second Battle of Ypres in Belgium on AP 22 15. MacPherson created a gas mark which fitted over the entire head (*known for inventor of the British Smoke Hood*). A few days before this cover was mailed, MacPherson and his Regiment as part of the 29<sup>th</sup> British Army landed in Gallipoli, he was more likely stationed in the Island of Lemnos where was all the hospitals. After war injury he returned to Newfoundland in October 1916 and retired as Lt-Col. \$750.00 **SOLD** 





Item 631-24 – <u>WW1 1<sup>st</sup> Royal Newfoundland Regiment – FPO 88</u> – 1915, OAS censored cover from FPO 88 (1<sup>st</sup> Royal Newfoundland Regiment in Cape Helles Dardanelles, Gallipoli peninsula, Turkey) dated MY 21 15 to the Campbell Hospital, Hyde Park, England. Further research could bring more interesting facts on this cover. For now, the FPO 88 was in operation as early as April 1915 at the beginning of the amphibious landing on the Gallipoli peninsula. Rare. \$500.00




Item 631-25 – Regina Sask Snowball Iceless Refrigerator – 1918, 1¢ Admiral (3) tied by Regina Sask International machine cancel on Saskatchewan Utilities and Specialties Co. advertising cover, Snowball Iceless Refrigerator, paying 3¢ letter rate to Hamilton. \$85.00 SOLD



Item 631-26 – <u>The Globe advertising card</u> – c1925, 1¢ Admiral stationery card with The Globe advertising mailed from Toronto, 3<sup>rd</sup> class machine, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Powassan. Message relates to subscription expiry warning. \$25.00 **SOLD** 





Item 631-27 – Miniature postcard (against postal rules) – 1916, 2¢ Admiral tied by Mount Brydges Ont duplex cancel on miniature postcard paying 2¢ postcard rate to Brockville. Measurement 83mm x 54mm which is a little bit too small to meet the postal rules. The 1916 Postal Guide p.13 art 26. states that a postcard or a private postcard shall not be less than 3¼ inches in length (88.9mm) by 2¼ inches in width (63.5mm). An interesting item for a collection of oddball postcard postal history. \$45.00 SOLD





Item 631-28 – St. Catharines Ont 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Holland – 1921, 3¢ Admiral tied by St. Catharines Ont machine cancel on postcard paying 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Holland. An early example. \$75.00 SOLD





Item 631-29 – St. Catharines Ont 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Holland – 1924, 1¢, 2¢, 3¢ Admiral tied by Winnipeg Man machine cancel on postcard paying 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Holland. A nice three-color franking. \$50.00 SOLD





Item 631-30 – <u>Kandahar Saskatchewan registered</u> – 1919, 2¢, 3¢ (2) Admiral tied by Kandahar Sask broken circle on reply cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Missouri (b/s). Winnipeg transit and Yorkton & Saskatoon RPO (b/s). \$65.00





Item 631-31 - \$8.45 registered money packet -1927, 5¢, 20¢ (2), \$1 (8) tied by smudge cancel on bank mailing tag from Montreal paying \$8.45 registered money packet to Ottawa. \$100.00

Item 631-32 – <u>Sudbury registered postcard with MR4 pair</u> – 1918, 2¢+1¢ Wartax MR4 (2) tied by Sudbury Ont broken circle on 1¢ postal stationery card paying 7¢ registered postcard rate to local. The card is from Town Treasurer's Office and relates to an unpaid electric light bill. Very scarce! \$250.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 631-33 – Halifax banking tag (before April 1, 1922) – 1920, 3¢ (2), 50¢ Admiral tied by oval registered cancel on bank mailing tag from Halifax paying 56¢ registered money packet rate to Bass River NS. Keyhole marking. Until March 31, 1922, the registered money packet rate was only 2¢ per ounce and confused. Much scarcer. Usual crease affecting stamps. \$150.00





Item 631-34 – <u>E3 special delivery cover</u> – 1929, 2¢ Confederation, 20¢ Special Delivery Confederation E3 tied by Belleville Ont cds on cover paying 22¢ special delivery letter rate to Virginia (b/s). Rouses Point & Albany RPO (b/s). \$85.00

Item 631-35 – <u>5¢ Laurier block of 10 (Confederation)</u> – 1927, 5¢ Confederation block of 10 tied by Woodstock Ont cds on distribution of circular receipt, 1¢ per circular. A most unusual Laurier block use. \$150.00



Item 631-36 – <u>Tavistock Milling Co.</u> – 1933, 3¢ Medallion tied by Tavistock Ont duplex cancel on Milling Company advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Hamilton. \$30.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 631-37 – <u>E9 in period (1 month window)</u> – 1939, 6¢ Airmail C6, 10¢ Special Delivery E9 tied by Tillsonburg Ont machine cancel on cover dated MR 31 39 paying 16¢ airmail special delivery letter rate to Tennessee (b/s). A nice E9 in period cover, before 10¢ green E7 was issued. A tough one! \$100.00



Item 631-38 – <u>4 Edmonton cinderella stamps</u> – 1930-1935, 4 flight covers from Edmonton, reverse with return address "Bob of the North Land" and cinderella stamps: Fur Farming, Tourist (hunting, fishing, golf), two Tar Sands with one with red printing off set. \$45.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 631-39 – <u>John Deere parts mailing tag</u> – 1945, 8¢, 20¢ War tied by Welland Ont large rubber cds on John Deere Farm Implements mailing tag, parts made in Canada, paying 28¢ parcel rate to U.S. – American Parcel Post 15¢ C.O.D. marking. A real wow War Issue item. \$125.00




Item 631-40 – <u>India to Toronto to New York</u> – 1947, Jubbulpore India airmail letter to Toronto, remailed to New York with 4¢ War Issue added to pay the surface rate to the new destination (receiver). The letter is dateled The Training Institute for Women, Hawabagh, Jubbulpore. (Women's College). \$50.00



Item 631-41 – <u>Travelling Letter Box special delivery</u> – 1943, 4¢ War, 10¢ Special Delivery on cover mailed onboard a train to Toronto with "*This Mail Was Carried In Travelling Letter Box to Toronto*". Gray RY-197. This postmark was applied at Toronto Union Station to uncancelled mail received from trains arriving in Toronto. Stamps cancelled by Toronto roller. The letters posted on train are always regular mail. Very rarely have we seen either registered mail or special delivery letters with the travelling marking (Toronto or Halifax). This is the first time I've seen this kind of special delivery way mail. No doubt one of the most special E10 cover that I have seen. \$250.00 **SOLD** 



Item 631-42 – <u>Dominicana to RCAF Flight School</u> – 1943, Republica Dominicana airmail and censored cover to RCAF Flight School in St. Thomas Ontario. 2 diff St. Thomas MPO cds and duplex cancels on recto. Redirected to Wireless School in Calgary. \$75.00


