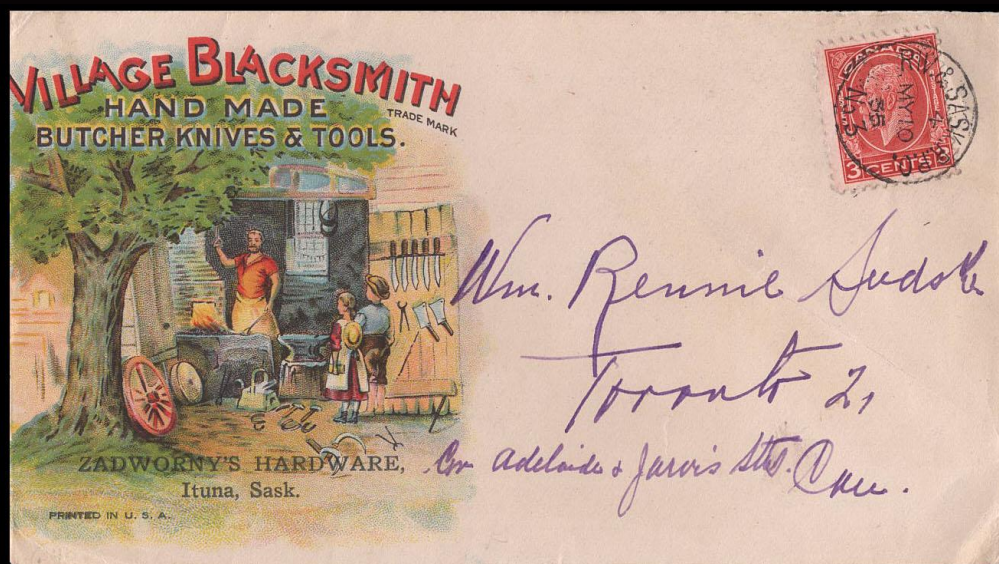

Item 633-01 – **Brome manuscript postmark as receiver** – 1851, family folded letter from Plattsburgh NY paid 10 to Brome CE via Montreal and St. John's (b/s). U.States scroll exchange marking and all other markings applied in Whitehall. Reverse with Brome manuscript postmark as receiver - 24 OC 51. Whitehall previously known as Skenesborough was established as a summer exchange with St. Johns LC on or about 1831 via steamboat on Lake Champlain. At the time of this letter, the exchange had moved. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 633-02 – **England to Illinois missent to a small Lanark County Office** – 1854, Electric Telegraph Company stampless cover from London England to Illinois. Carried by Collins Line Atlantic to New York with 24¢ collect. In an unexpected way, the letter was received at Bennies Corners Lanark County (*the earliest recorded by 5 years for this postmark*), rated 3 and then 6 both struck out by concentric rings. Rerated 10¢ applied at Brockville and routed to U.S. via Ramsay, Brockville and Morristown. A spectacular "missent" cover with a connection to Eastern Ontario. \$750.00

Item 633-03 – **Before the opening of Indiana UC (Haldimand 1841-1876)** – 1839, folded letter datelined Indiana JA 20 39 mailed from York with manuscript postmark paid 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ d to Niagara. The Indiana office apparently opened in 1836 but has no record and again in 1841. This is the earliest reported York manuscript postmark which is recorded from 20 FE 39 to 24 NO 40. The letter relates to an hotel license. \$200.00 **SOLD**



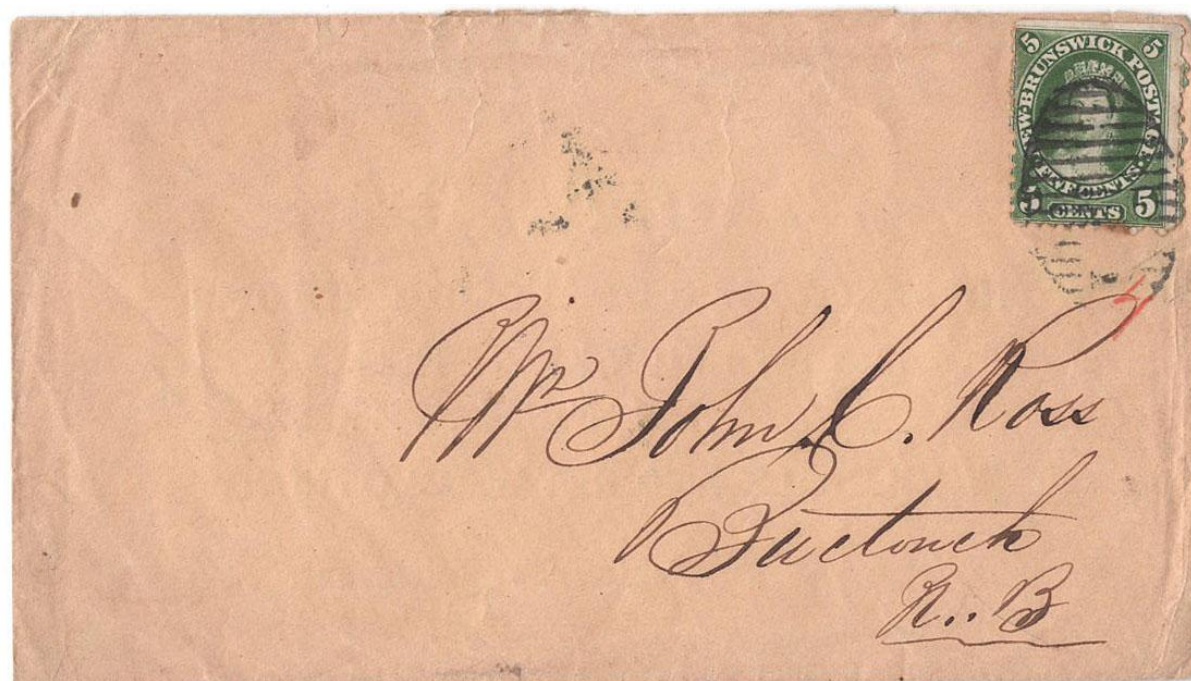
Item 633-04 – **Amherstburg UC to Michigan** – 1858, stampless cover from Amherstburg UC paid 6d to Ann Arbor Michigan via Windsor (b/s). Oval Canada 10 Cents 29mm x 22mm applied in Windsor and used from 1855 to 1859. \$75.00



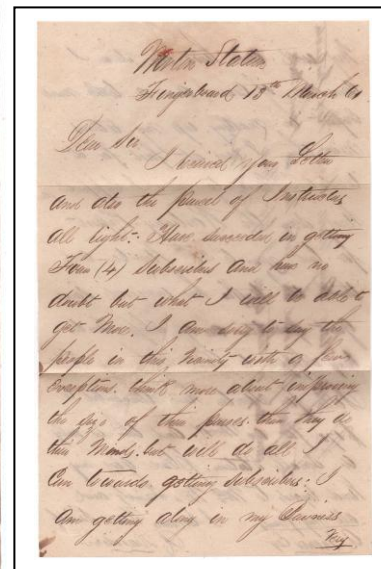
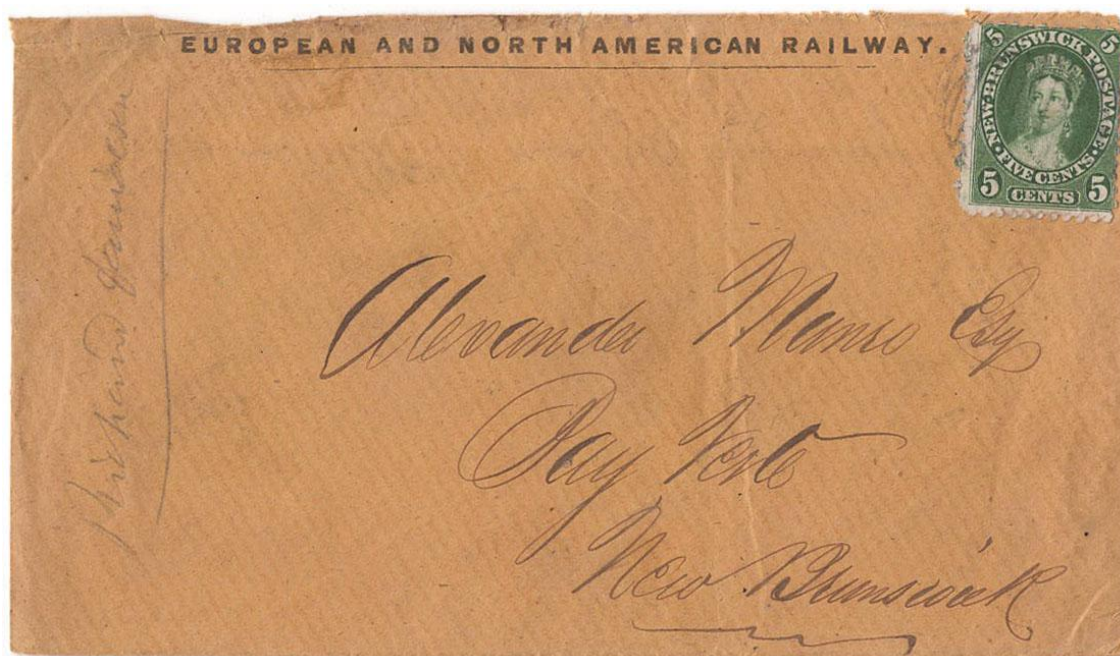
Item 633-05 – **Freight Money letter to England** – 1839, family folded letter from Dunnville UC to England via New York and Liverpool. Carried by private New York trader with paid 4½d, 25c, 12½d paying postage to New York including freight money for a private U.S. sailing ship. Rated "1/6" Stg on arrival for incoming ship letter plus inland rate from Liverpool to Melchbourne. In 1838, authority was given for the collection in Canada of additional postage known as "Freight money" on letters to be carried out of U.S. ports by private American ships. 25c for steamships and 12½c for sailing ships. The money had to be collected in Canada and passed to the U.S. for remittance to the US ship. The practice was never authorized by the British Post Office and was stopped in December 1840. This is one of the earliest Freight Money Letters. \$750.00



Item 633-06 – **Registered at the H. of Assembly – carried by Welland Rwy** – 1874, Ontario Treasury stampless cover with printed "Paid and Registered", mailed from the House, paid 5 paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Welland (b/s). Blue Treasurer Province of Ontario with crown. Three-line straightline "Registered at the House of Assembly Ontario". Carried by Welland Railway to St.Catharines West. Double circle RY-203 and boxed Registered Welland-R RY-204 (RF C and D). \$400.00



Item 633-07 – **Hunter Clothing Store advertising** – 1860, NB 5¢ tied by oval #1 grid cancel on Hunter Clothing Store advertising cover, dated SP 4 60, paying 5¢ letter rate to Buctoche (Acadia Peninsula). This is an early use of advertising mail in St. John as well as of the sap green 5¢ stamp which had been available only since mid-July. Hunter operated a wholesale and retail clothing and home furnishing business from premises located on North Side King Street near the bottom of the hill. His business would have been spared from the Great Fire if it still existed at the time. \$250.00



Item 633-08 – **E&NA Railway – Port Elgin to Bay Verte NB** – 1861, NB 5¢ tied by oval grid cancel on European and North America Railway cover mailed from Port Elgin paying 5¢ letter rate to Bay Verte (b/s). The letter relates to timber business and freight cost as well as to Mrs Munro, family and friends. At the time of this cover, the E&NA line was not yet running from Portland, the terminus of Amercain railways, to Halifax (Maine to St. John, to Shediac and to meet the Intercolonial track running to Halifax). In 1853, the project was to build St. John to Shediac but the builder went bankrupt during the contruction. The NB Gov took it over in 1857 and the line was completed in 1860 from St. John to Point-du-Chene, which had better wharf facilities than Shediac. It took until 1872 to join lines with the ICR. \$300.00 **SOLD**

All quotations are duty paid, unless otherwise stated.

Commercial Report.

BREADSTUFFS.—Our flour market continues without animation. The continued low quotations in the West have had the effect of still further depressing rates here. The only business doing is in the merest retail way—no wholesale buyers being in the market. It would be impossible to place round lots in the present

Item 633-10 – Saw Mill Creek NS (Annapolis 1859-1895) – 1880, 3¢ SQ tied by Saw Mill Creek NS broken circle in blue on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Clementsport NS Canada (3-part dater), Annapolis transit (b/s). Family letter accompanies. \$75.00 **SOLD**



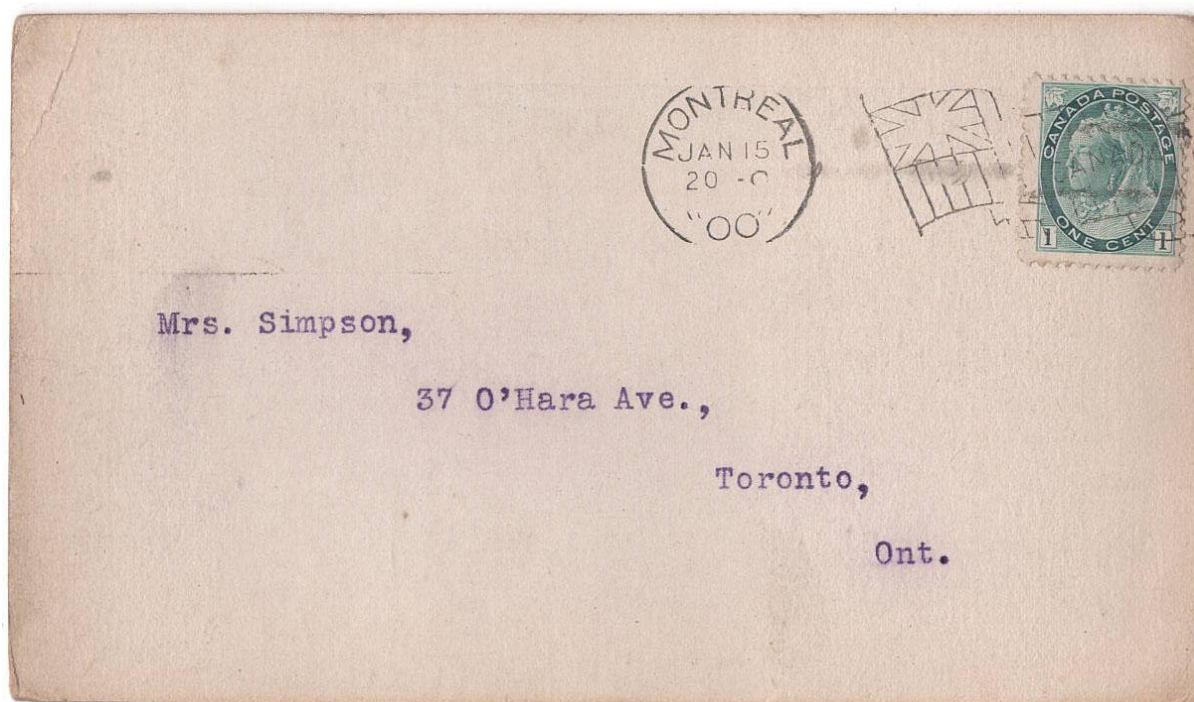
Item 633-11 – **Louis-A Senécal mourning card (French Légion d'honneur recipient)** – 1888, Louis-Adélard Senécal (1829-1887) was a Quebec businessman and political figure. He was a Conservative member in the 1st Canadian Parliament representing Drummond—Arthabaska (1867–1872), represented Yamaska in the Legislative Assembly of Quebec (1867–1871) and was a member of the Senate of Canada for Mille Isles division in 1887 until his passing. During the 1880s, he was also president of the Montreal City Passenger Railway Company, the North Shore Railway and the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company. In 1883, he received the cross of commander in the French Légion d'honneur. He was the father in law of Charles Igance Gill, uncle of FX Archambault. The bottom of the card is a RIP for LtCol J. Dansereau (by union). \$15.00 **SOLD**



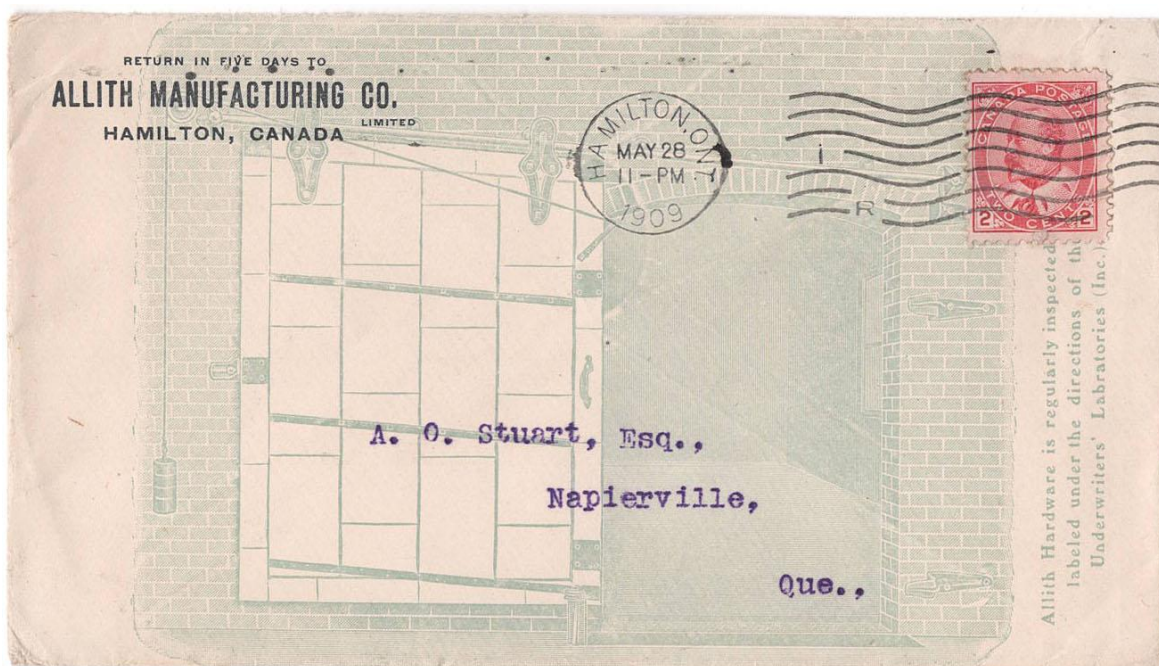

Item 633-14 – **Indian Tea colour advertising postcard** – 1900, 1¢ Numeral tied by Montreal Bickerdike machine cancel on Rose & Laflamme Grocers private postcard, Pure India Tea advertising, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Toronto. \$125.00 **SOLD**



Item 633-15 – **Hamilton sliding door on rails** – 1909, 2¢ Edward tied by Hamilton machine cancel on Allith Hardware Manufacturing Co. advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Napierville. Sliding door on rails illustrated. \$100.00

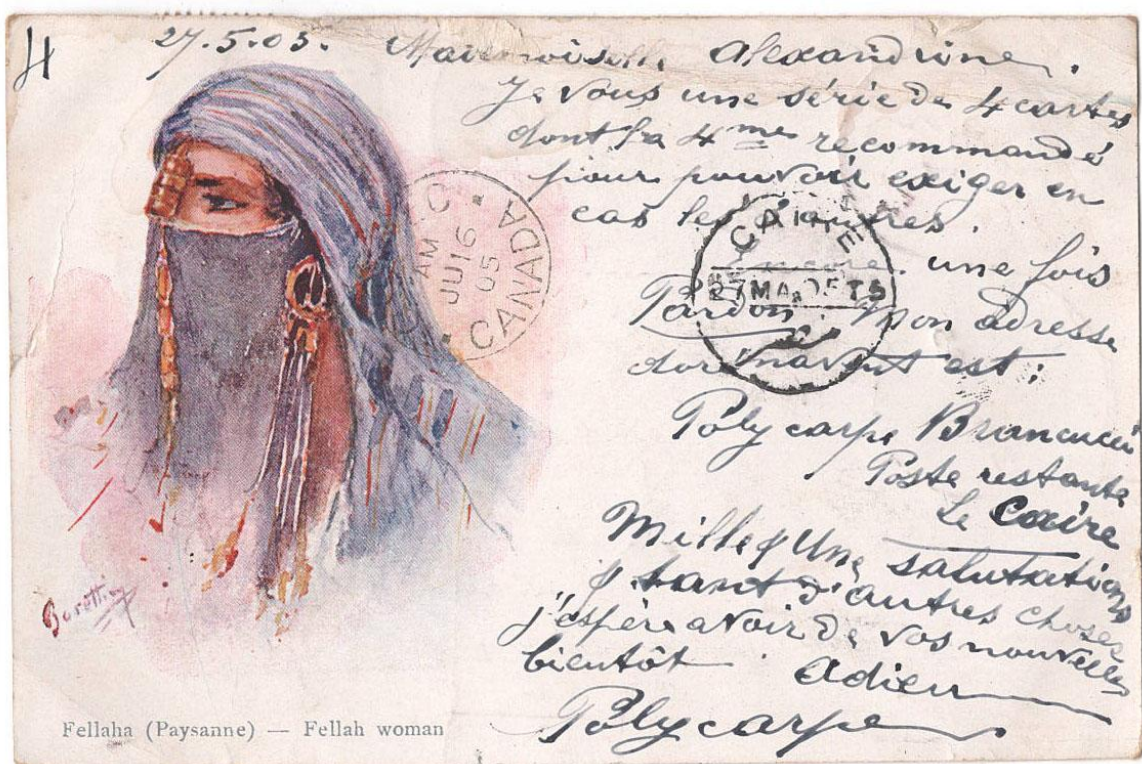
In 1906, Norman Slater acquired the Allith Manufacturing Company. A year later, T.H. Barnard started a foundry operation in the west end of Hamilton. In 1910, a group of Hamilton businessmen founded the Canada Steel Co. (later to be known as Burlington Steel Limited). Barnard and Slater joined forces in 1912, and soon later in 1917 established Slater and Barnard Limited in Barnard's factory which was an amalgamation of Allith, Acme Stamping and Tool Works, and Safety Door Hanger Company. S.B.L. manufactured shell casings and aircraft part for the WW1 war effort.



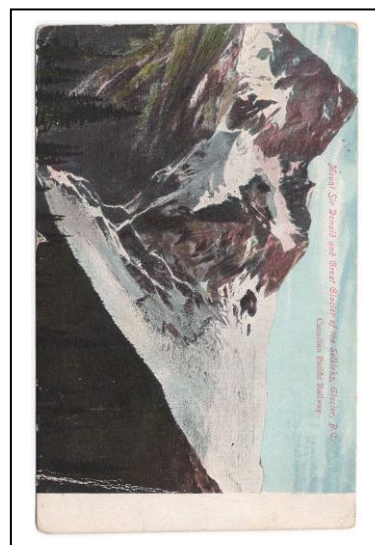
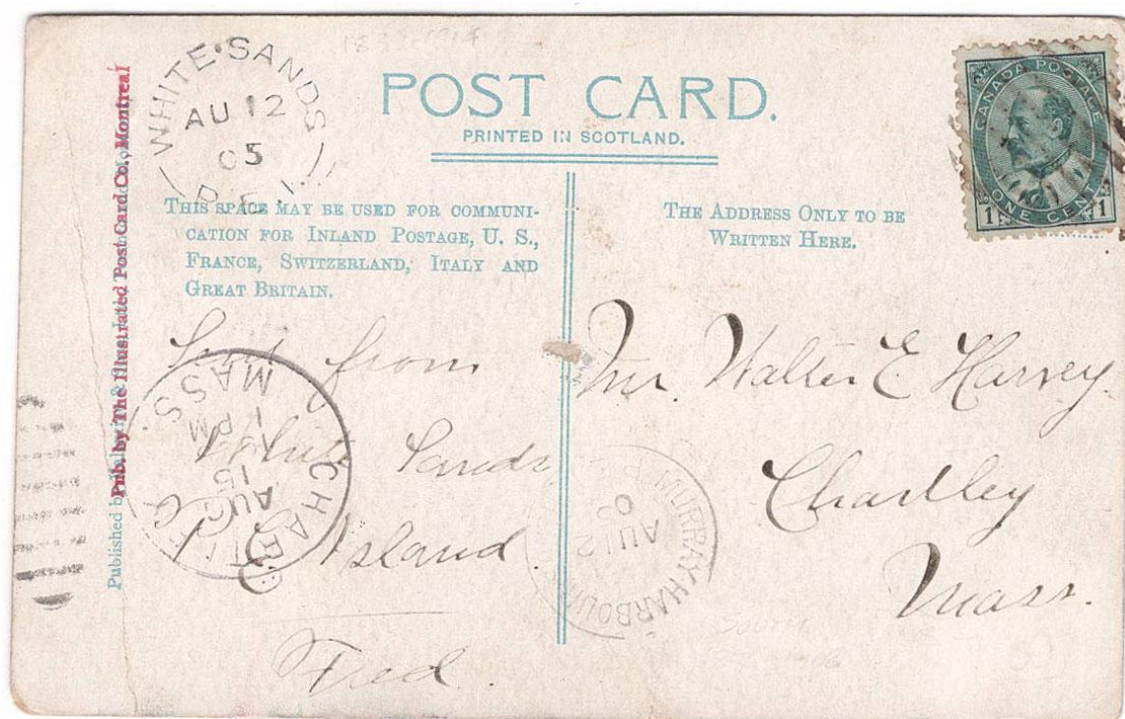

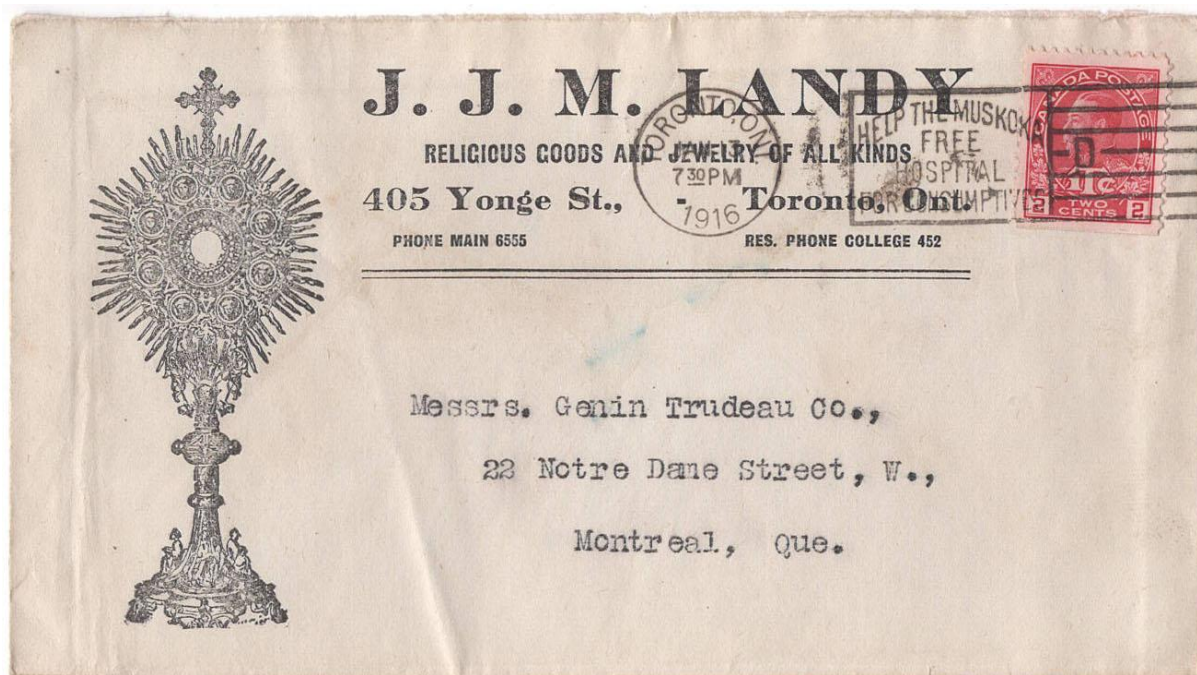
Item 633-18 – **Edwardian Era - Egypt UPU registered postcard rate to Canada** – 1905, 2m Egyptian stamps (7) tied by Hilwan cds on postcard paying 14m UPU registered postcard rate to St. Jean Port Joli Que. Routed via Cairo, London England and Quebec City. A spectacular incoming UPU registered postcard to Canada. A great item for the Edwardian Era collector who is looking for the other way around. \$500.00



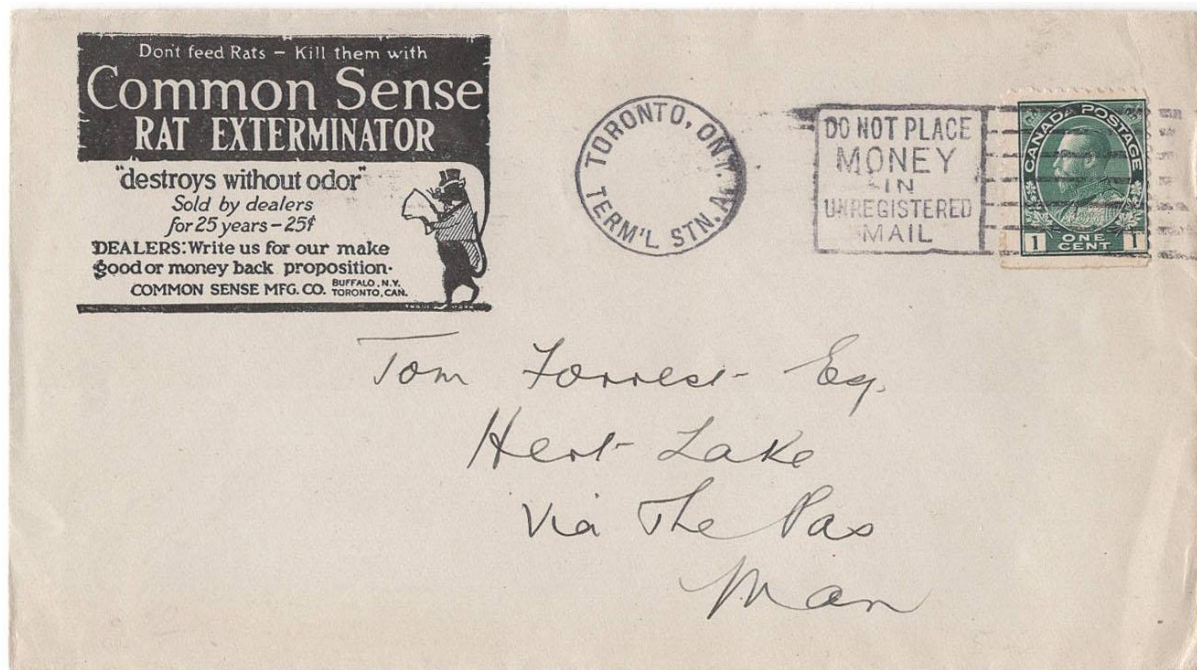
Item 633-19 – **White Sands PEI (1839-1859/1880-1914)** - 1905, 1¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on postcard from White Sand PEI paying 1¢ postcard rate to Massachusetts. Routed via Murray Harbour. White Sands RF D. \$50.00



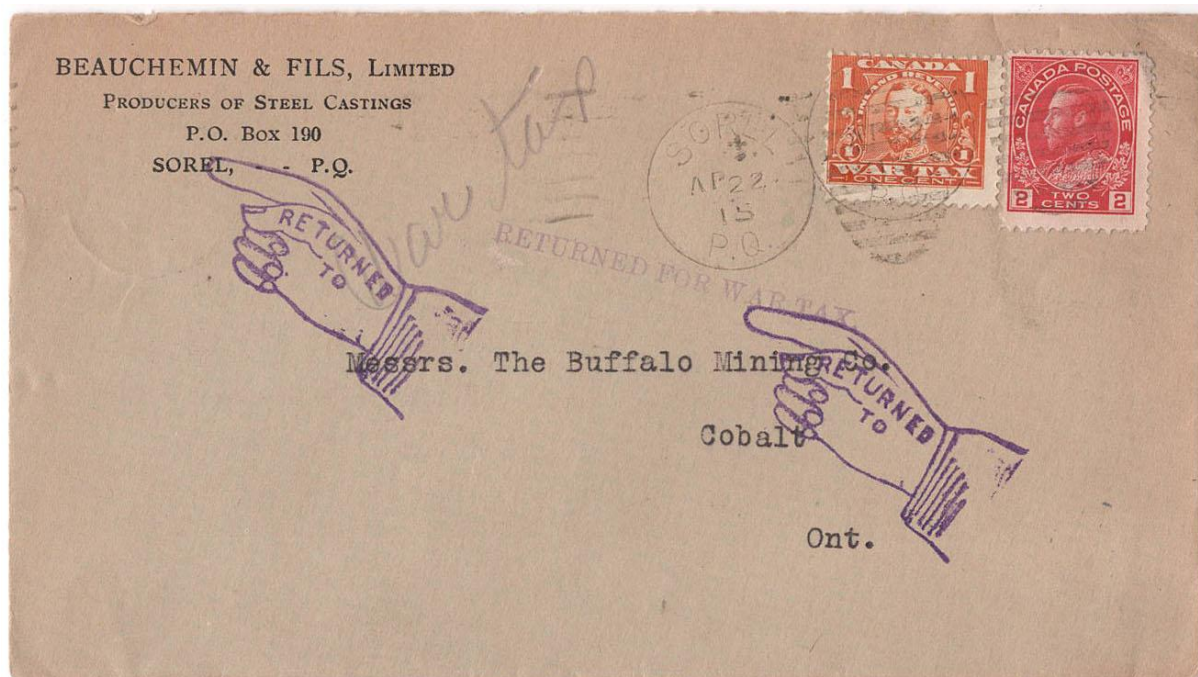
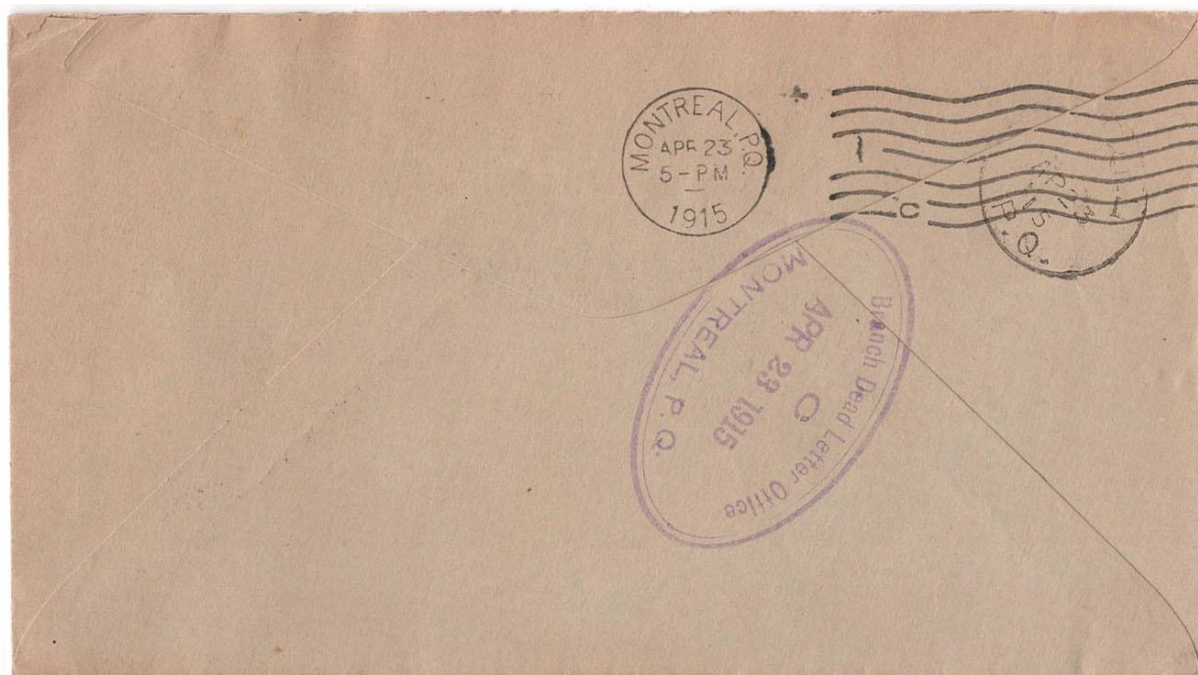
Item 633-20 – **The very scarce DON-1773 (2 month use)** – 1919, 1¢ Admiral tied by 23.5mm Toronto duplex D cancel on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to New York. Recorded from June 29 1920 to August 24 1920. Indicia "15". \$25.00 **SOLD**



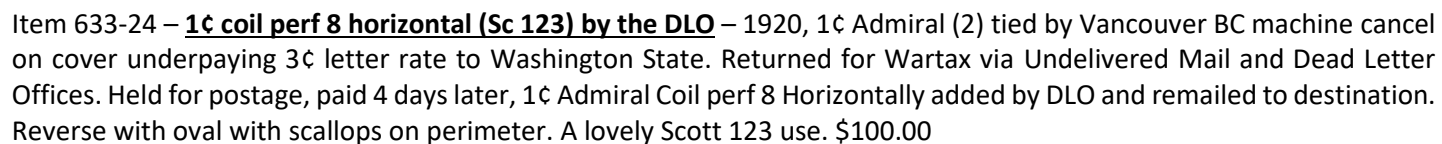
Item 633-21 – An early MR3 cover dated JA 13 16 – 1916, 2¢+1¢ Wartax MR3 tied by Toronto Muskoka Hospital International machine cancel, dated JA 13 16, on Landy Religious Goods and Jewelry advertising cover. Back flap off. MR3 die 1 was issued JA 1 16. Such early usages are hard to find. \$75.00



Item 633-22 – Rat Exterminator to Herb Lake Manitoba – 1922, 1¢ Admiral tied by Toronto 3rd class machine cancel on Common Sense Rat Exterminator advertising cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Herb Lake Manitoba (1920-1961 RF C). Address endorsed "Via The Pas". Herb Lake (also known as Wekusko Lake) was a gold mining town in the 1920s that eventually became a ghost town. Gold was first discovered there in 1914, and the Rex Laguna Gold Mine operated until 1945. \$60.00 **SOLD**



Item 633-23 – **Sorel Que – Illegal and returned for War Tax via DLO** – 1915, 1¢ Wartax FWT7, 2¢ Admiral tied by Sorel PQ duplex cancel on Beauchemin Steel Castings c/c cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Buffalo Mining Co. in Cobalt. Illegal revenue stamp usage for postage, caught and returned for Wartax via Montreal Dead Letter Office. Not forwarded to destination but returned to Sorel instead (b/s). No Cobalt receiver. \$125.00 **SOLD**

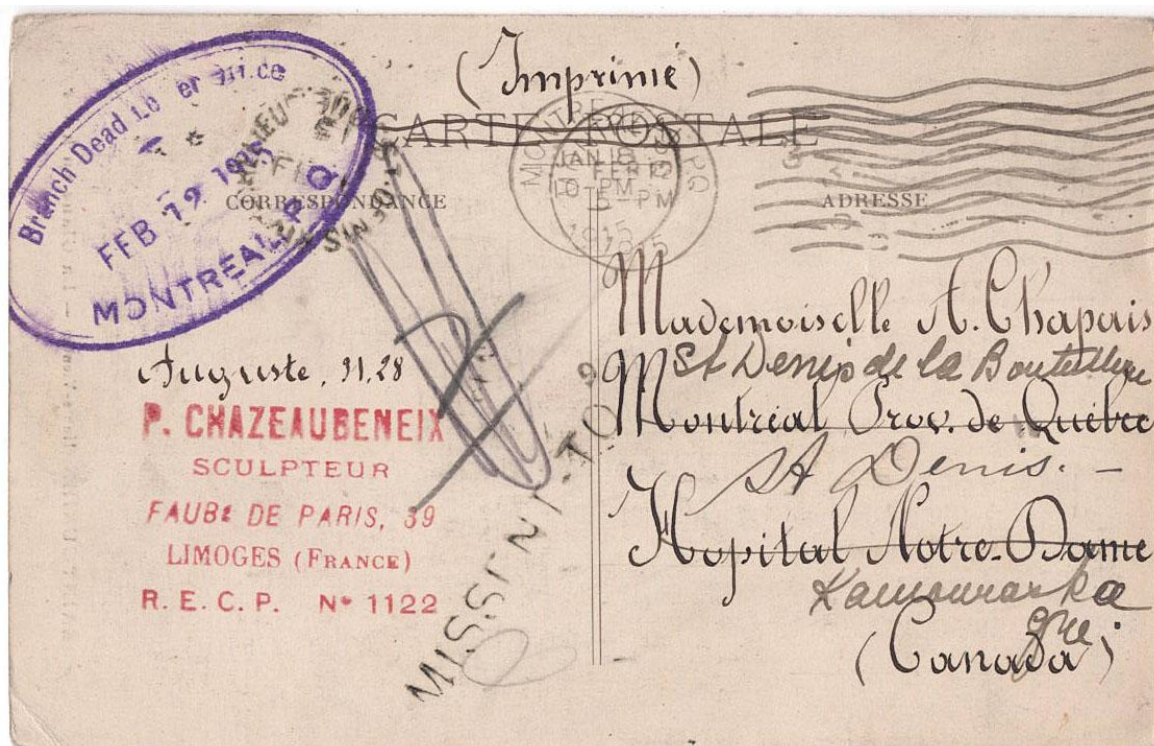

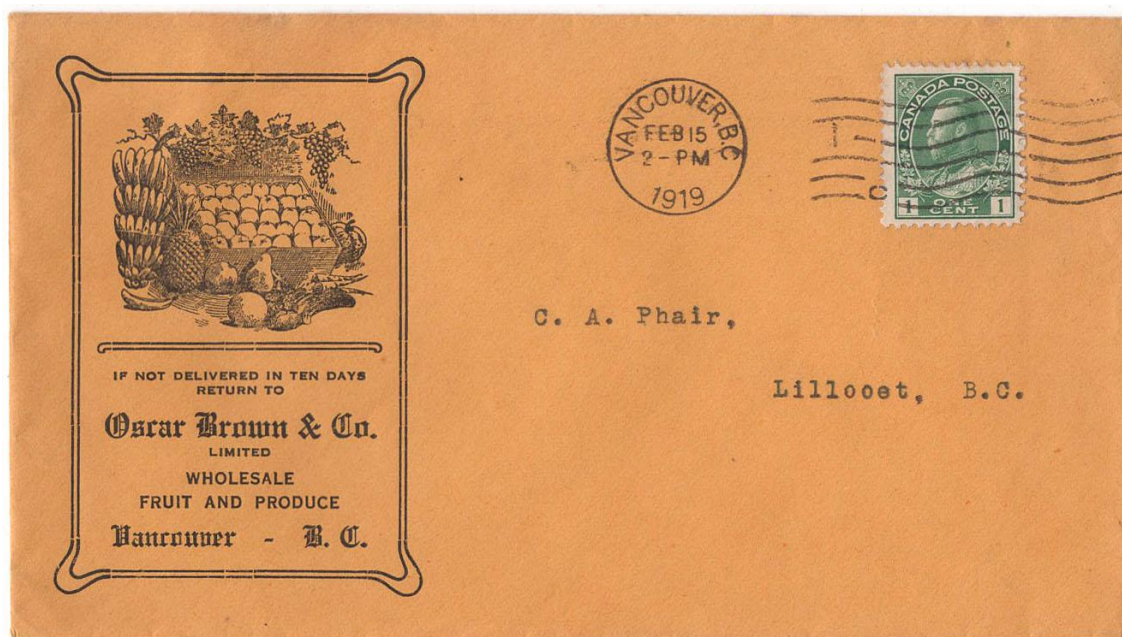

Item 633-25 – Montreal Westmount MOTO on circular receipt – 1928, \$1 Admiral single tied by Montreal PQ Westmount MOTO handstamp on receipt for domestic distribution of circulars for Cantilever Shoe Shop. A nice \$1 single use but more interestingly with the Westmount Money Order Transfer Office handstamp. A beauty! \$100.00



Item 633-26 – **France postcard to Quebec “Missent To” and DLO** – 1915, France postcard mailed unpaid from Limoges to the Notre-Dame Hospital in Montreal. Redirected to St. Denis de la Bouteillerie (Kamouraska County) but missent to St. Denis Riviere Richelieu (St. Hyacinthe County). Went through the Dead Letter Office before the redirections. Not charged. The card is addressed to Amélie Chapais, daughter of Jean-Charles Chapais, a Canadian Conservative politician, and considered a Father of Canadian Confederation for his participation in the Quebec Conference to determine the form of Canada's government. The card is signed by the artist/ sculptor “P. Chazeaubeneix”. \$50.00



Item 633-27 – **Vancouver fruit and produce** – 1919, 1¢ Admiral tied by Vancouver machine cancel on Oscar Brown & Co. Fruit and Produce advertising cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Lillooet BC. \$60.00

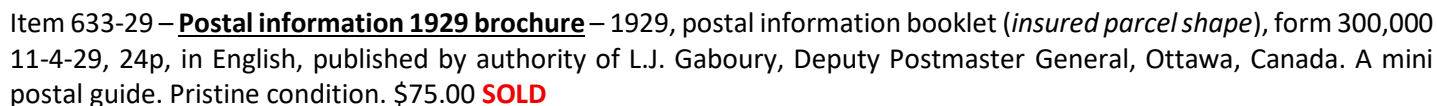


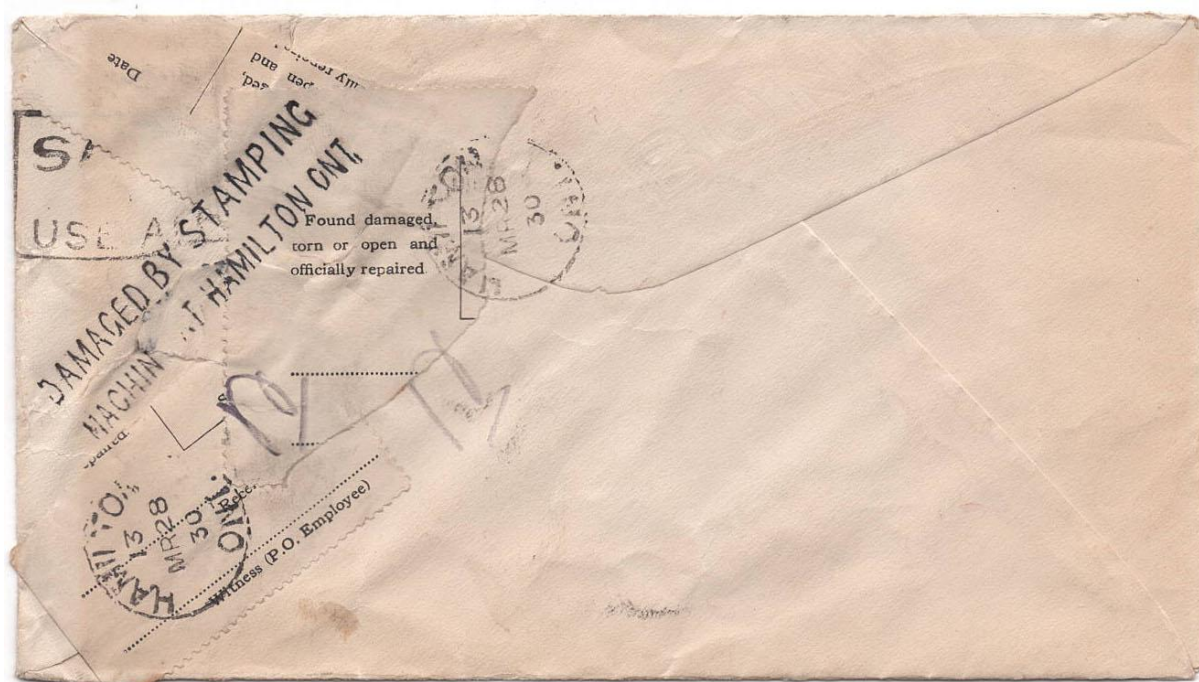
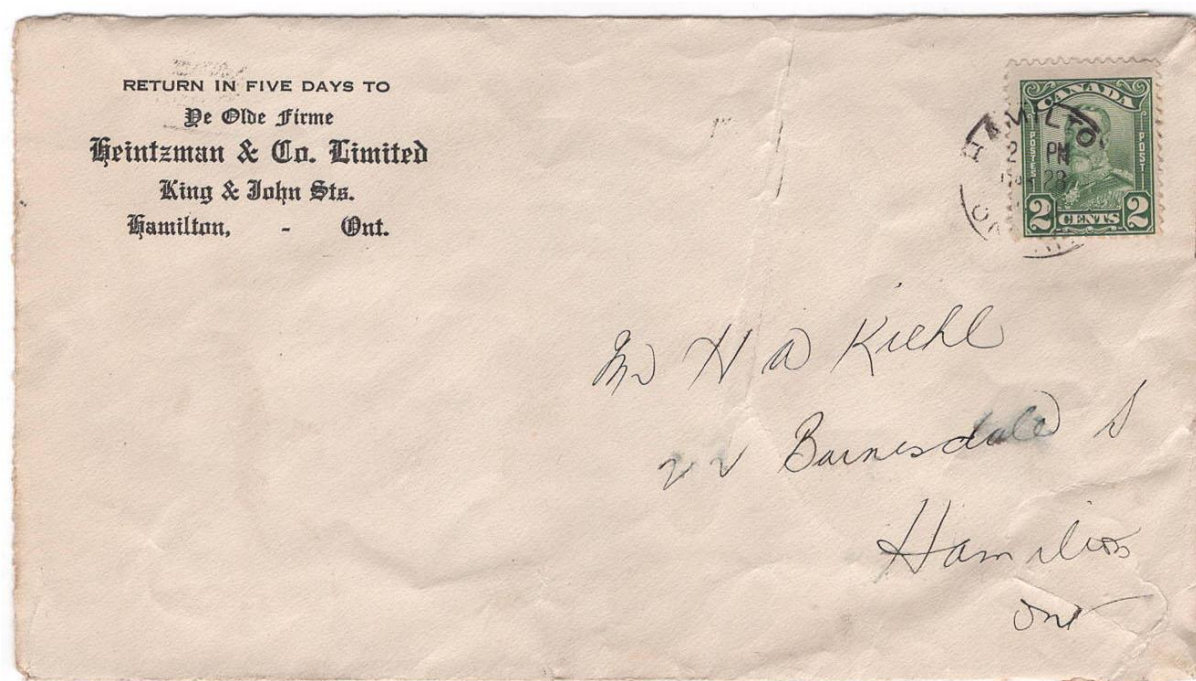
Item 633-28 – **Birch Cliff Ont (York 1908-1925)** – 1912, 2¢ Admiral tied by Birch Cliff Ont broken circle on Fred Kennedy Breeder of Campine chickens advertising cover paying 2¢ double weight printed matter rate to Nova Scotia. "This package contains a valuable book on Campineology" no longer present but an interesting note to Postmasters. \$75.00

Item 633-30 – **Damaged by Stamping Machine at Hamilton** – 1930, 2¢ Scroll tied by Hamilton machine cancel on Heintzman cover, stamp cancelled although a mechanization issue, paying 2¢ drop letter rate. Reverse with official Post Office repair labels tied by two Hamilton cds and " *Damaged by Stamping Machine at Hamilton*" handstamp. \$40.00

Item 633-31 – **Victoria BC AR registered cover Switzerland** – 1934, 5¢ Medallion, 10¢ Cartier tied by Victoria BC cds on cover with AR Avis de Réception requested paying 15¢ UPU registered letter rate to Switzerland (b/s) via Montreal (b/s). Top of back flap clipped. The cover is addressed to Hungarian born stamp dealer Béla Sekula. In the 1930's, newspapers reported and referred to Béla as the world's biggest stamp dealer. In August 1931, He founded his first company, the Cosmophilatelist Ltd. Lucerne, with offices in the Geneva. \$100.00



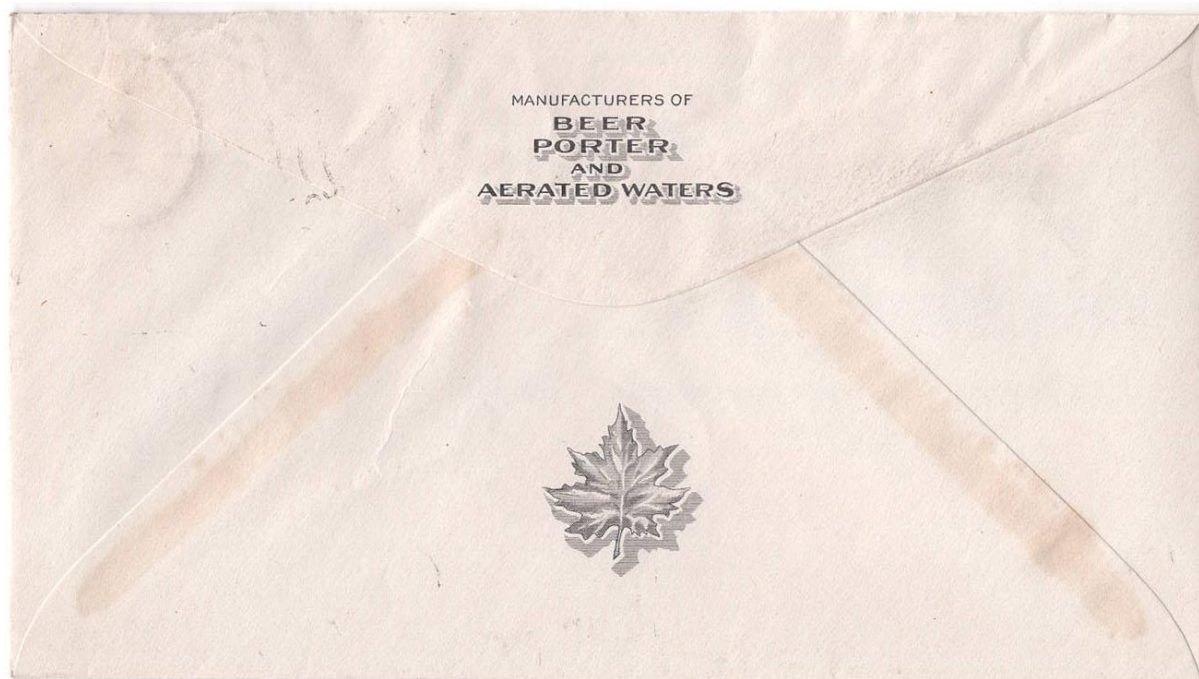

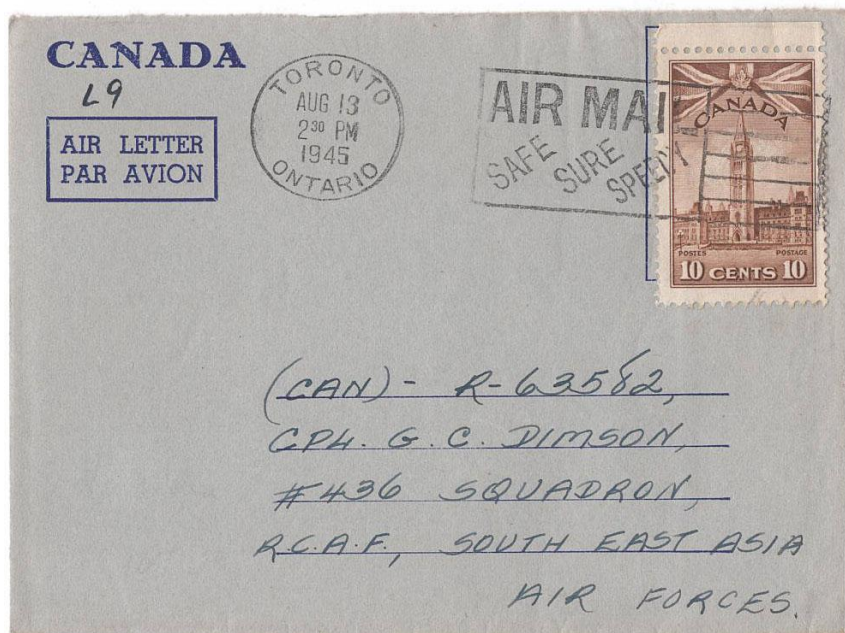

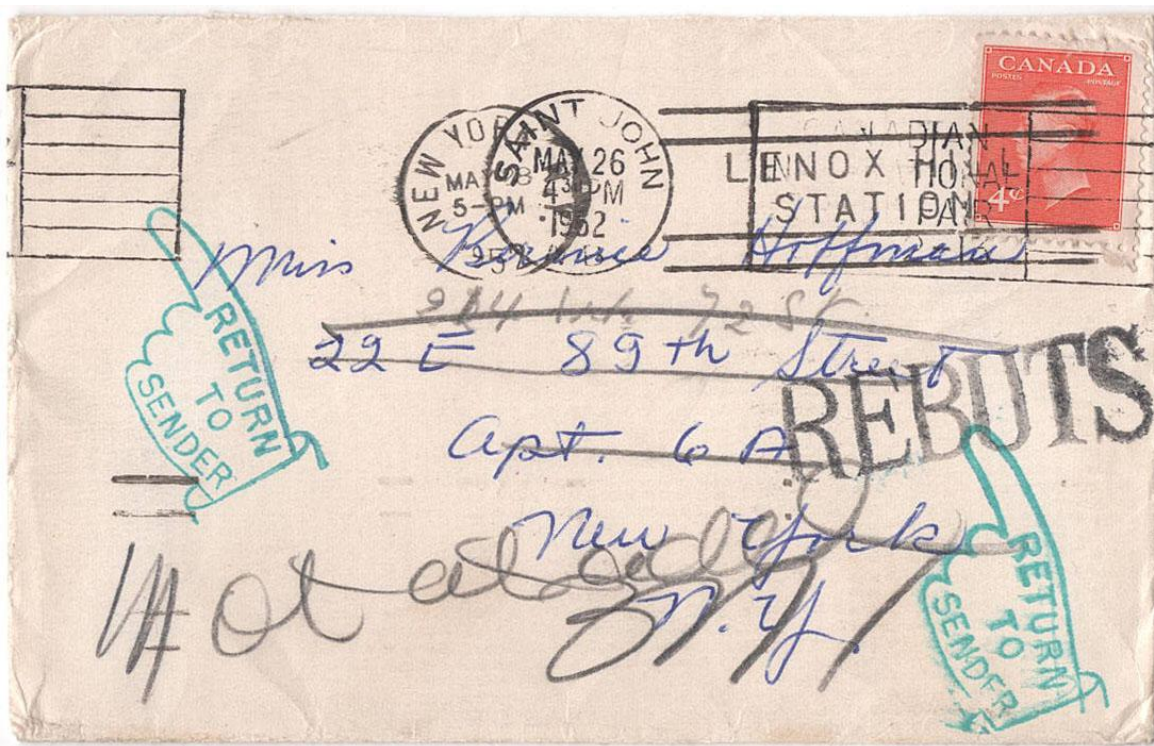

Item 633-37 – **Playing card stamp**

1947, 1¢ Playing Cards Excise Tax Paid stamp on three decks, two completely sealed, one slightly opened from plastic crackling, trio on Slater Shoe and Compagnie Paquet of Quebec City. Van Dam FPC1 (p.34). The stamp was printed by American Bank Note Co. According to Van Dam: unopened decks with stamps are scarce to rare. Lot of 3 \$150.00 **SOLD**
