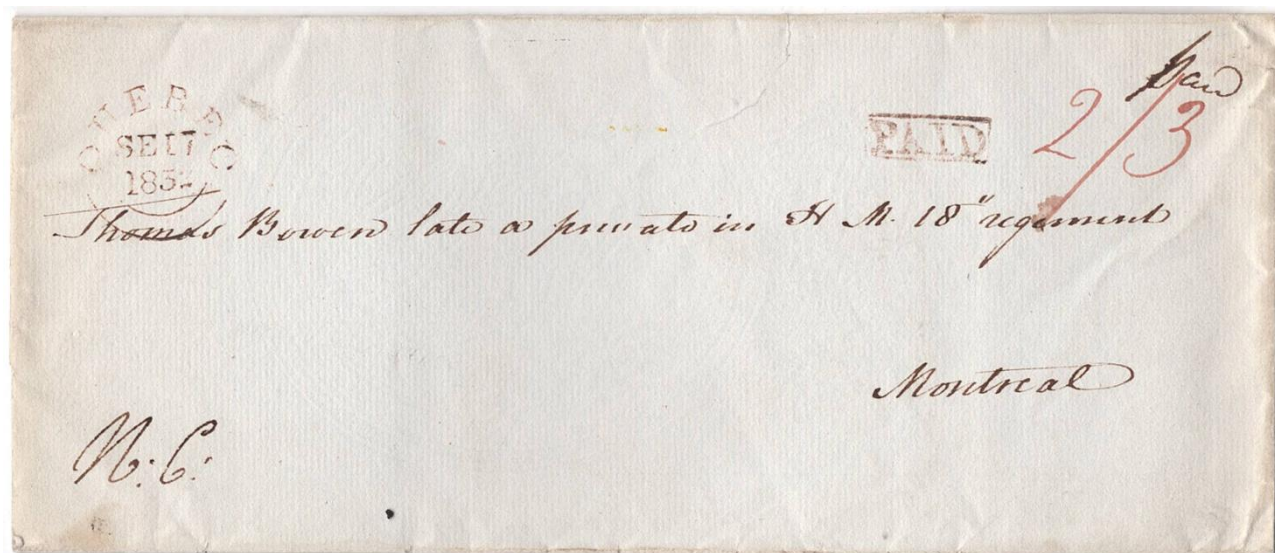

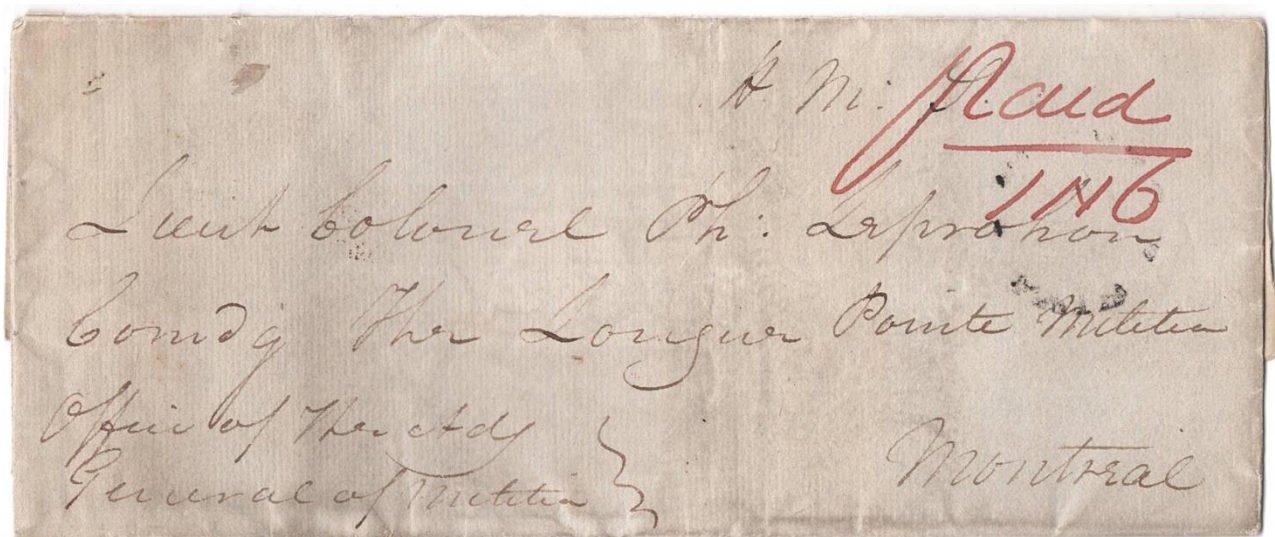

Item 636-01 – **British garrison in Montreal - advertised for 4 months** – 1832, folded cover from Quebec paid 2/3 paying the triple 9d rate to Montreal. Addressed to Pte Thomas Bowen of His Majesty 18th Regiment. Advertised until JA 7 1833 at the Montreal Post Office. Very scarce. \$200.00

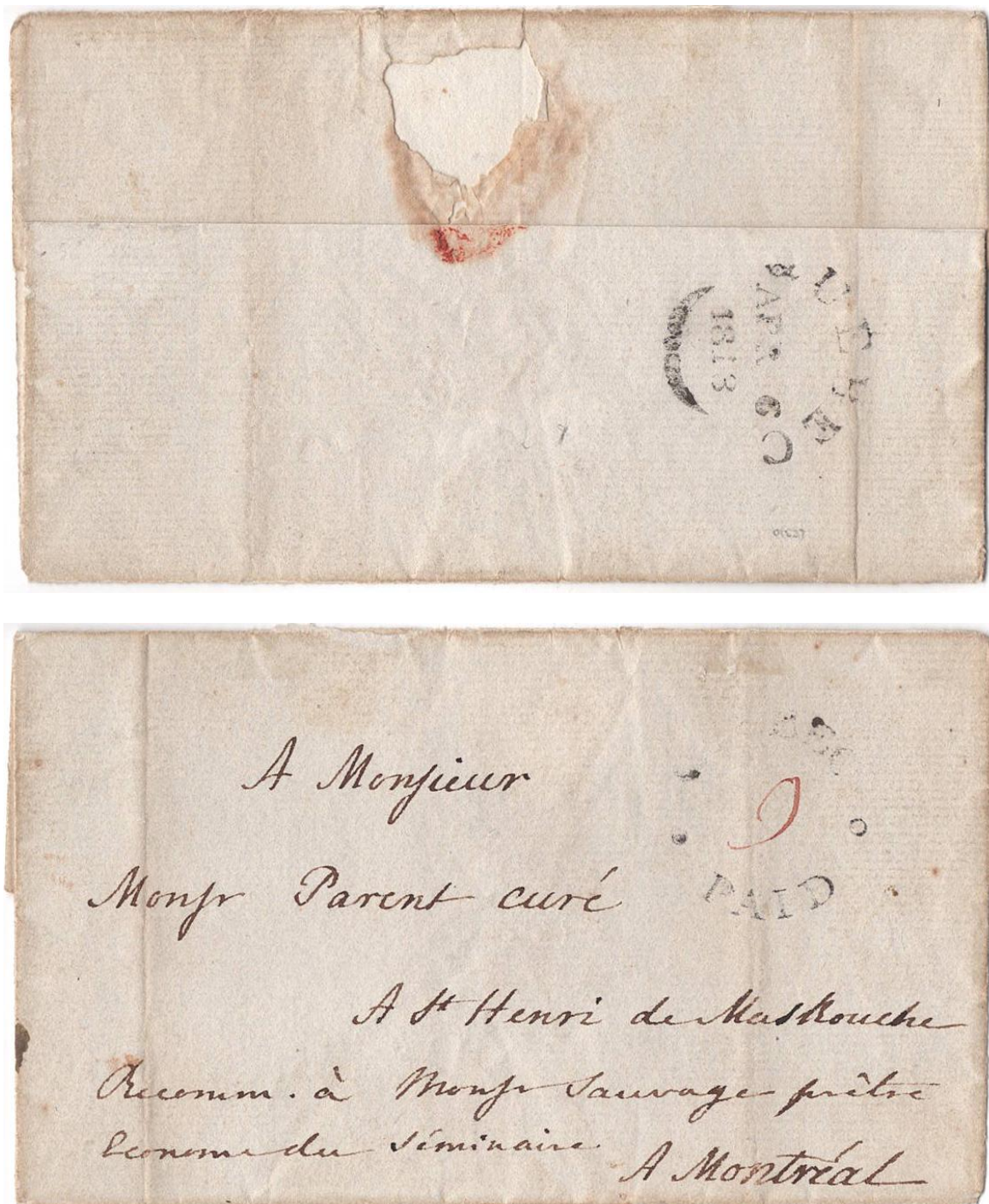
In 1832, the 18th (Royal Irish) Regiment of Foot was stationed in the West Indies and North America. The regiment had a long history in Canada, with one of its battalions serving in Quebec during the 1837-38 Rebellion.



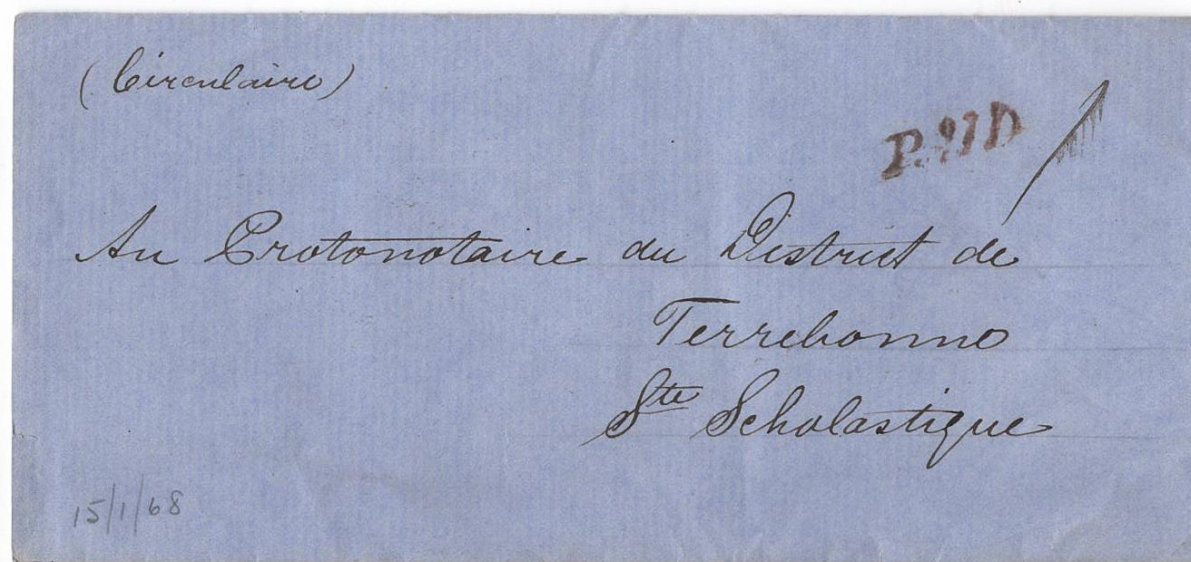
Item 636-02 – **The Longue Pointe Militia of Montreal** – 1824, folded cover from Quebec, endorsed His Majesty Service H,M.S., paid 1N6 paying the double 9d to Montreal. The cover is addressed to Lieutenant Colonel Leprohon, commanding officer of the Longue Pointe Militia. Reverse with “8 Battn Militia” manuscript. \$300.00



Item 636-03 – **Free to Postmaster of Gananoque** – 1838, folded letter signed H.G. Forsyth, mailed at Quebec rated free, to Gananoque Postmaster John C. McDonald (PM from 1832 to 1854). The letter relates to lands, noting names: John Hamilton, David Mallory etc. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 636-04 – **Carried by Indigenous priest to St. Henri de Mascouche** – 1813, folded cover from Quebec with Quebec Paid, 9 in red and nice Fleuron (b/s), translated endorsement “To Messr Savage / Prieste of the Seminary”, to Roman Catholic priest Louis-Francois Parent in Saint-Henri-de-Mascouche. In 1809, Bishop Joseph-Octave Plessis of Quebec named him curé of the parish of Saint-Henri-de-Mascouche. According to the Dictionary of Canadian Biography, he was probably one of the richest Catholic parish priests in the 19th century. \$300.00

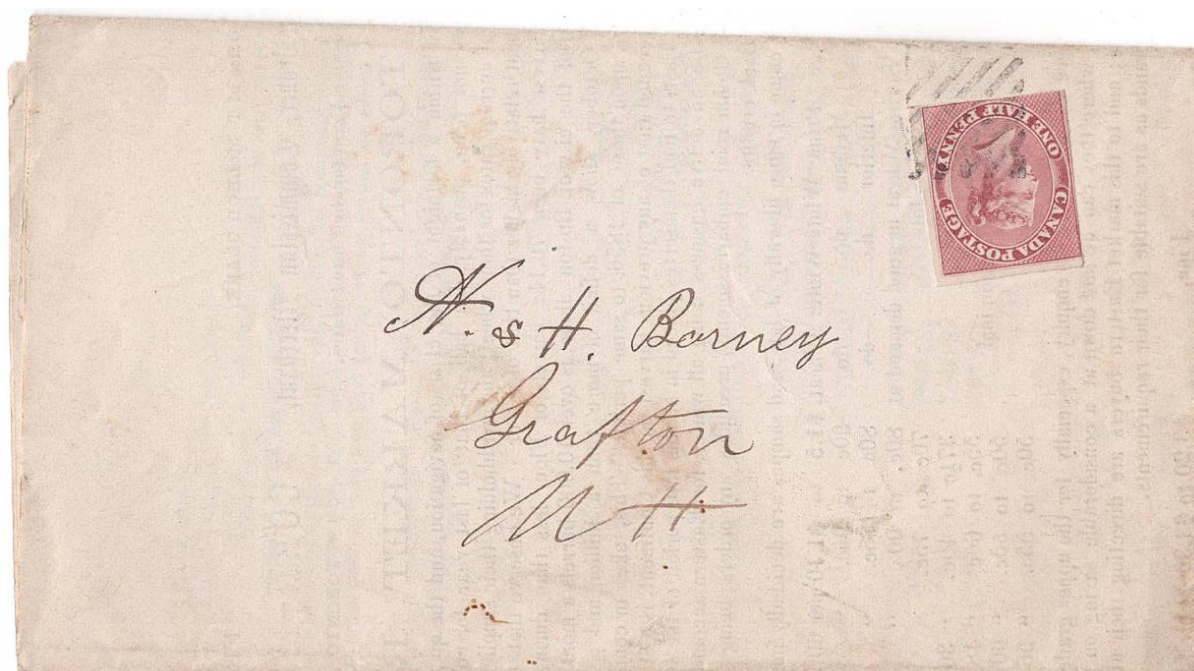

Carried by Quebec & Riviere du Loup GTR, handstamp No.3, QC-443 (1865-1873, RF E). The circular is datelined JA 15 1868. Handstamp No.3 was ordered by the Post Office Dept from D.G. Berri on March 3, 1865. Exhibit quality. \$350.00

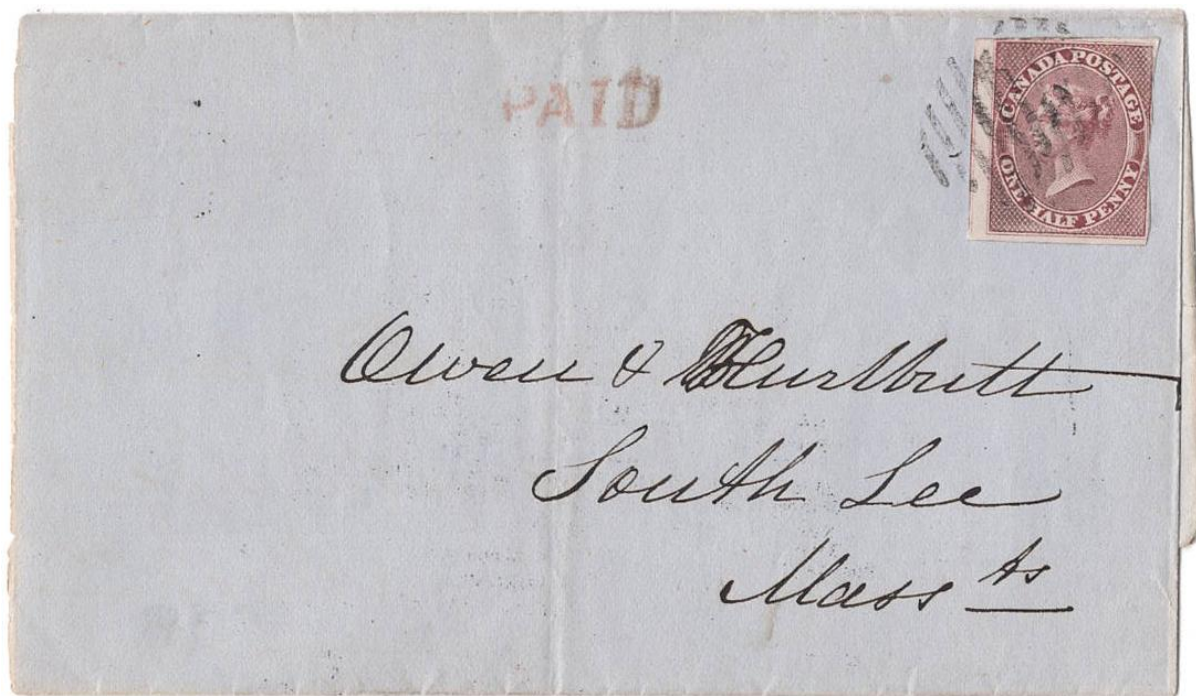

MEXICAN EXPLORATION. Engineer Selby, in charge of the mining properties of this Company, at Etzatlan, Mexico, reports three very rich strikes in the San Domingo Mine, which will increase their daily output from \$2800 per day to at least double that amount. *This favorable information regarding the San Domingo properties, of which the Mexican properties are a direct extension, warrants the Mexican Co. in now going ahead on their properties, and Mr. Selby has been instructed to proceed at once with the driving of the tunnel to cut the main fissures of the ledge and from this time on there will be no delay in forcing the development work of the mining department as fast as possible.*

HOMESTAKE EXTENSION. The steam drilling outfit has been installed in the tunnel—which is now in 200 feet—and is working fine. Assays are running from \$5 to \$10 a ton. The vein is fully 400 feet wide—and with these values it will be an enormously profitable proposition.

OSAGE OIL. Owing to the extremely cold weather, (12 degrees below zero, which is most unusual for that section), work has been abandoned for nearly two weeks. The weather has now moderated and everything is moving along in first-class shape. The wells on leases 198 and 67 are pumping fully up to the average, as expected. The pipeline is taking care of all the oil produced. Well No. 3, lease 67 is expected in this week. Dividends will be at the same rate as December; although it is probable that the February dividends will be at a rate considerable higher. Owing to the delay, by reason of the cold weather, the officers of the company deemed it advisable not to increase the dividend rate for January.

CASA GRANDE. Telegram received from Tucson, states that the parties negotiating for the purchase of the property would deposit \$30,000 with the Consolidated National Bank, upon receipt of proper authorization for sale. These papers will all be passed on at the Annual Meeting on the 31st.

DIVIDENDS FOR 1905. From present indications, beginning with February, one company can be added to the Dividend List each month, during practically all the year.

Reports of Annual Meeting, to be held on January 31st, will be mailed all stockholders during February.
