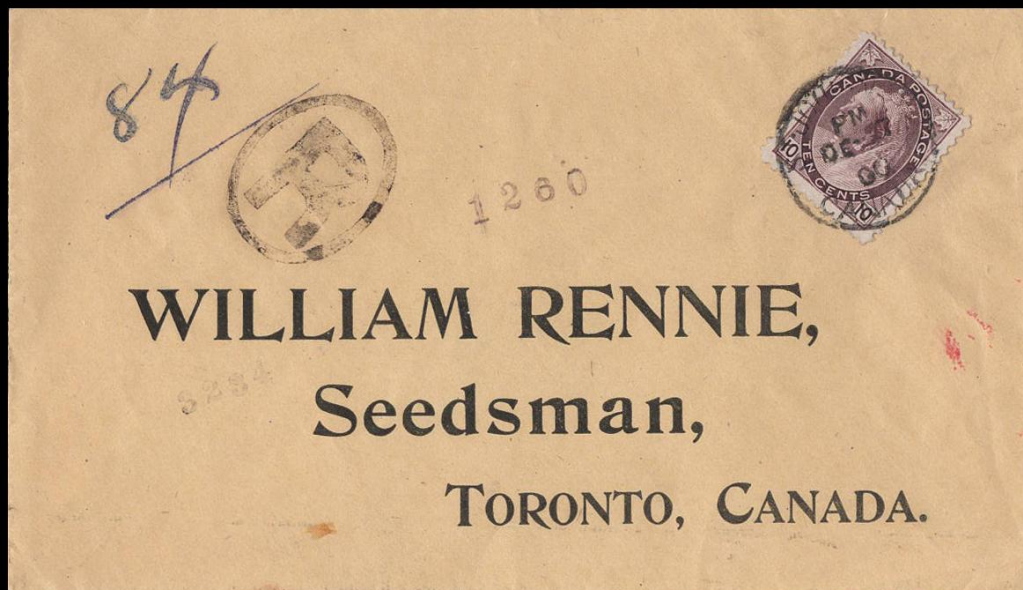

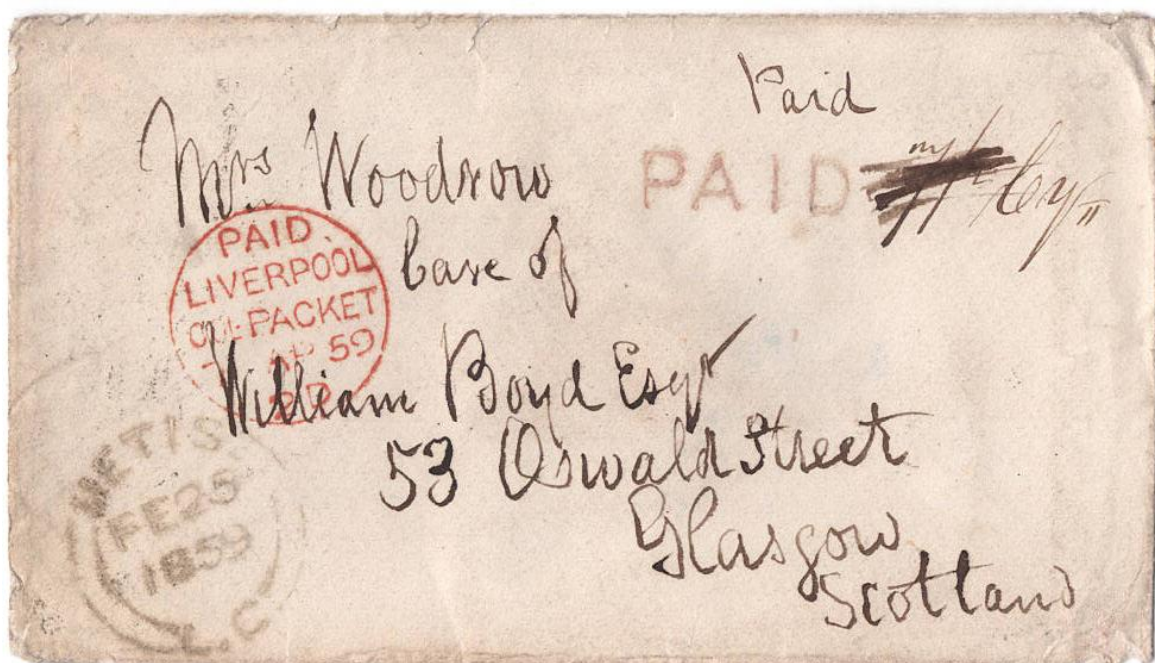
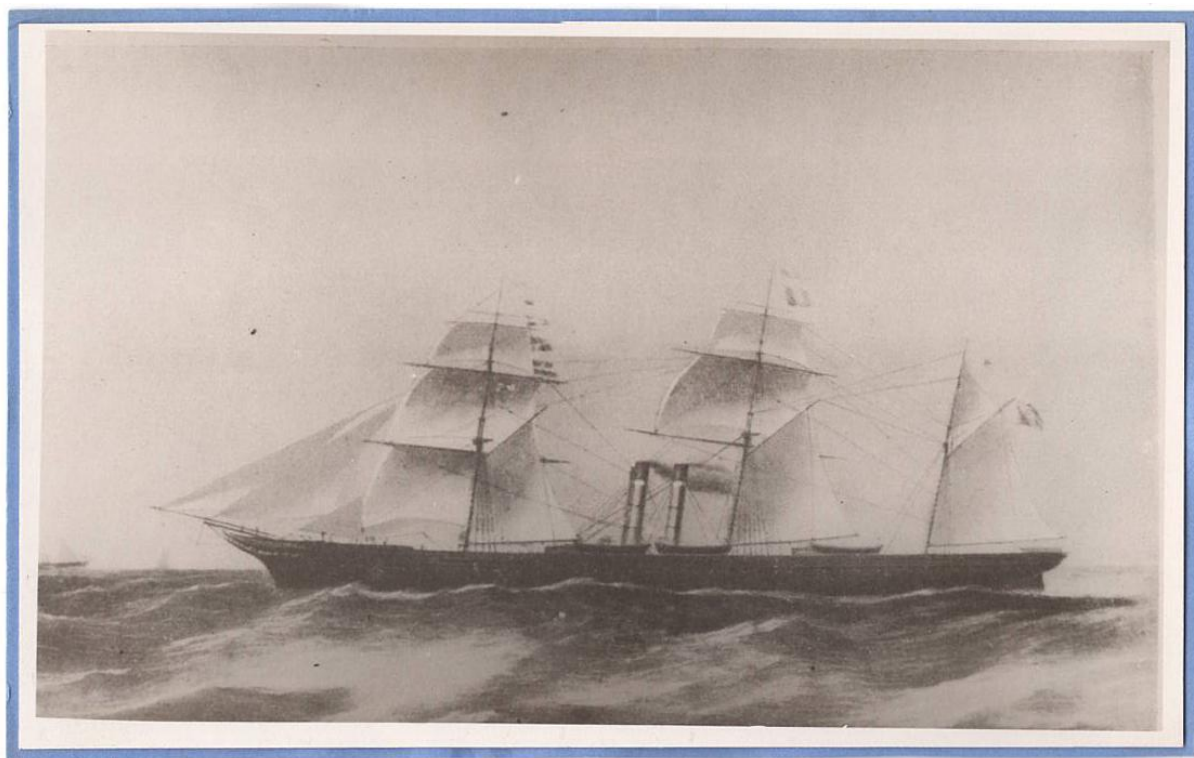




Item 637-01 – Toronto CW double and fully prepaid to France – 1856, stampless cover with letter from Toronto CW fully prepaid to Boulogne-Sur-Mer, France. Paid 5/2 Stg and 6/4 Currency (*double 2/7 Sterling or 3/2 Currency*) prepaying the double weight as per rate regulations effective JA 1 55 to JA 1 57 (*1/4½d Sterling -1/3 Currency prepaid per ¼ ounce Canada to France, total 2/7 Sterling or 3/2 Currency for ½ to ¼ ounce*). Rate break down: 8d BNA internal, 3/4 British sea transit and internal postage, 4d US transit and 10d French postage to Boulogne (A huge 62 pence = 5/2). London Paid handstamp plus PD. Carried by Cunard Arabia 16th voyage out of Boston. 10 pages letter accompanies and written into flap. A rare double and fully prepaid letter to France. \$750.00 **SOLD**



Item 637-02 – **US turned cover and cross border to Montreal** – 1851, stampless cover from New York to Grand Rapids Michigan, undated but likely pre-April 1851, dated 10 March, then turned and reused from Grand Rapids paid 10¢ to Montreal (b/s SP 10 1851). The Montreal cover is addressed to Thomas Nye, the famous lawyer (1807-1877). \$300.00



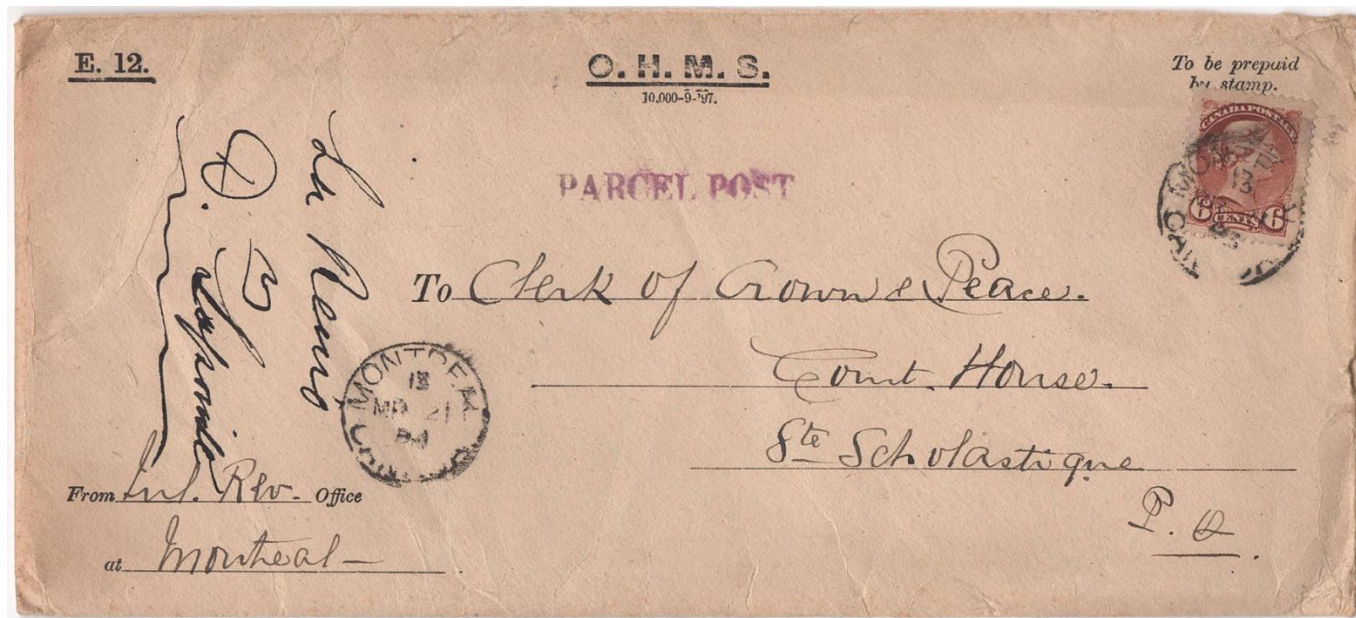
Item 637-03 – **Metis LC to Scotland (Gaspé Peninsula)** – 1859, stampless cover from Metis LC paid 7½d paying the Allan Line letter rate to Scotland (b/s) via Quebec (b/s). Paid Colonial Packet Liverpool on front. The closed bag missed the Quebec ship and was sent from Quebec to Portland, then carried by Allan Line North Briton (photograph above and accompanies) from Portland departed MR 6 59 to Liverpool (AP 7 59). An interesting Gaspé Peninsula cover. \$200.00



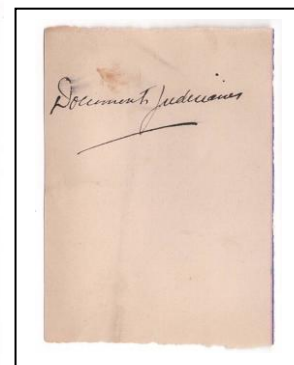
Item 637-04 – **NYC Boyd's City Express cross border to Toronto** – 1845, business folded letter signed by E. Briggs from New York to Toronto. Carried in NYC by Boyd's City Express with black and green 2¢ stamp. Scott 20L4 with huge margins, fourth issue, cancelled by typical faint red postmark. Rated 10½d at the border representing the New York 10¢ (6d) and 4½d to Toronto (across the lake rate, around the lake was 7d, total would have been 1/1). Toronto receiver on front. Boyd's City Express operated in NYC from 1844 to 1882 as a private carrier. The letter relates to shipping of goods by the Montague. A very unusual Toronto letter. Ex Golden. \$500.00



Item 637-05 – **6¢ Allan Line rate to Ireland** – 1874, 3¢ SQ (2, orange, Montreal printing, 11½) tied by Montreal CE Berri duplex cancel on cover paying 6¢ Allan Line letter rate to Ireland (b/s). Carried by Allan Line Prussian from Quebec. \$200.00



Item 637-06 – **6¢ Chestnut - 6¢ parcel post rate** – 1893, 6¢ SQ Chestnut (jumbo margined example) tied by Montreal cds on OHMS cover, “Parcel Post” handstamp, paying 6¢ 4th class matter rate to Ste. Scholastique (b/s). Postal guide page xiv: “closed parcels not exceeding five pounds in weight may be posted... for each parcel weighing not more than 4 ounces, 6 cents. Condition for the rate that no letter be enclosed”. A rare 6¢ SQ cover paying 4th class. \$300.00



Item 637-07 – **48¢ 3rd class matter rate to Ste. Scholastique Que** – c1898, 15¢ LQ, 10¢ SQ, 20¢ Widow, 3¢ Maple Leaf tied by grid cancel on cover front paying 48¢ 3rd class matter rate to Ste. Scholastique (Deux-Montagnes County). Small piece with “Law Papers” was found with it and illustrated at right. The book packet rate, part of the 3rd class matter, was 1¢ per 4 ounces and limited to 7 pounds. According to what we see, this would be a 12-pound printed matter package, not book packet. A spectacular franking. \$500.00



Item 637-08 – ½¢ Large Queen one with spur mixed with 2¢ SQ - 1876, ½¢ LQ (2, middle stamp 21iv spur in scroll left of H) and 2¢ SQ tied by tied by Montreal CE duplex cancel on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to St. Jerome. \$400.00



Item 637-09 – 1876 2¢ RLS use – 1876, 3¢ SQ, 2¢ RLS tied by Wales CW Berri broken circle on cover, dated JU 29 76, paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). The letter is datelined South Finch, both with Wales were in Stormont County. Rare. \$300.00 **SOLD**



Item 637-10 – **Lot of fancies** – Lot of 50 1¢ Small Queen stamps (incl early orange printings) with fancy cancel, noting: a few "8" Lacelle 89 Simcoe, two "E" Lacelle 385, Intersecting designs, radials, stars and rays, bogey 1 on pair, boxed XI, one fingerprint, frog, rings etc. blocks reinforced by hinge mentioned for the record, condition generally fine or better. \$250.00



Item 637-11 – **Lot of postmarks including Honolulu squared circle** – Lot of 45+ 1¢ Small Queen stamps (and some others) with squared circles: Mute 3rd Class on 1¢ Numeral, Honolulu mute on Hawaii one cent stamp (Ex Kemp), Wolseley type II, Saskatoon broken circle 1897, 1¢ lemon imperforated (lower right of scan), some Western Canada cds etc. Condition generally fine or better. \$150.00



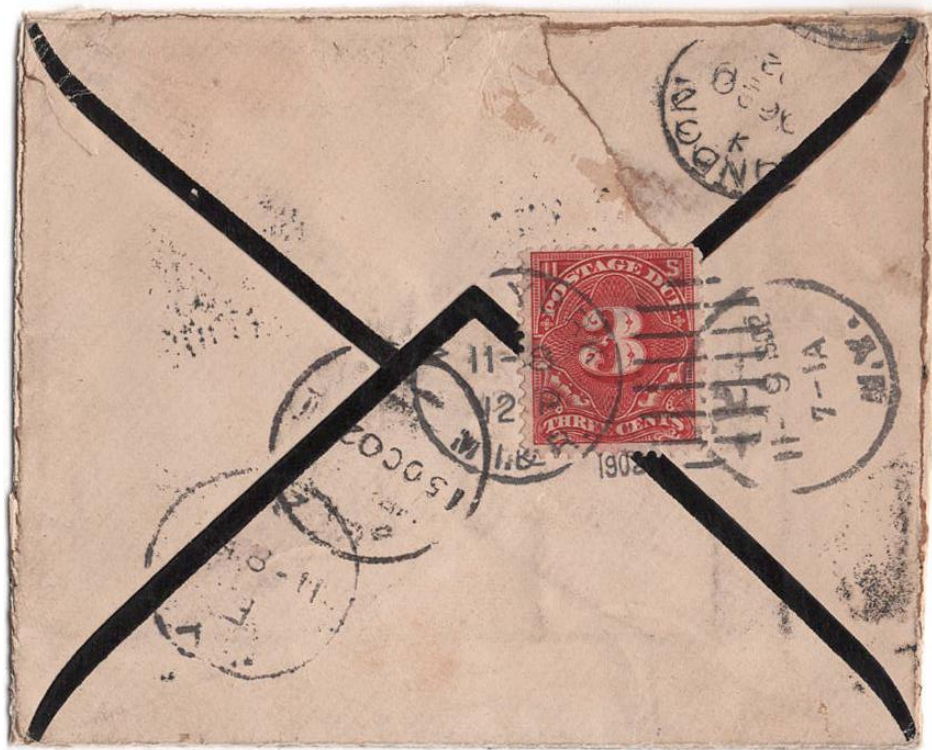
Item 637-12 – **10¢ Numeral single on Rennie Seeds** – 1900, 10¢ Numeral tied by St. John NB cds on Rennie cover overpaying 9¢ double weight registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s), 1¢ convenience. \$450.00



Item 637-13 – **Wrapper - 9¢ periodical rate to England** – 1900, 2¢ Numeral (4) tied by Halifax roller cancel on 1¢ post band paying 9¢ for up to 18 ounces periodical rate to England. Receiver at the London Newspaper Branch NPB. Redirected to Plymouth but papers had been lost and marked "Found in inland section without contents". A spectacular wrapper that lost its content. \$400.00



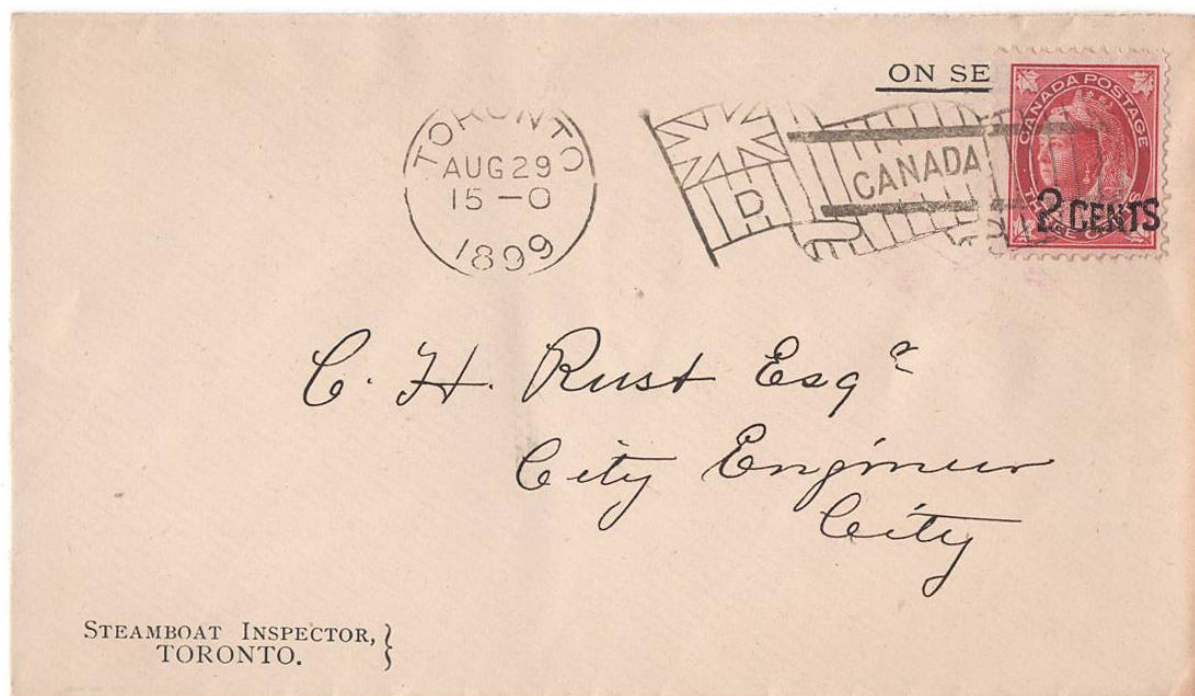
Item 637-14 – **10¢ UPU registered to Surinam via New York** – 1900, 1¢, 2¢, 5¢ Numeral tied by Halifax cds on 2¢ postal stationery envelope paying 10¢ UPU registered letter rate to Surinam (b/s). Routed via New York (b/s) with New York registry exchange label. Ex Don Shorting and Danny Cantor. An exceedingly rare destination for a registered UPU cover. \$1,500.00



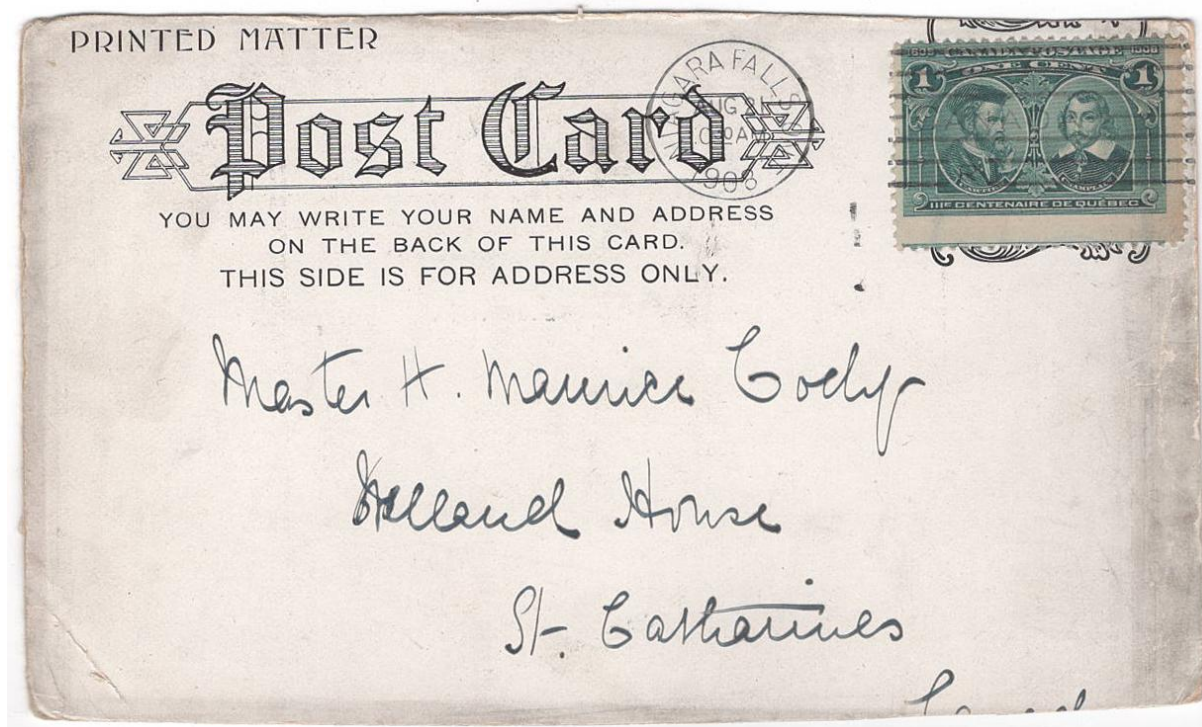
Item 637-15 – **Shortpaid mourning cover to Suez, Egypt** – 1902, 2¢ Numeral (ink smear left margin) tied by Halifax duplex cancel on mourning cover underpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Suez (b/s) via London (b/s). Taxed 15 centimes with Egypt 1m and 2m postage due “À percevoir” stamps. Redirected to New York, charged 3¢ on arrival reverse with US 3¢ postage due tied by New York duplex (NO 8 00). A real wow cover! \$1,000.00



Item 637-16 – **Toronto Exposition flag die "A" to Sandon BC** – 1901, 2¢ Numeral tied by Toronto Exposition flag cancel on cover, flag type 10-1 die A, paying 2¢ letter rate to Sandon BC (b/s) via Nelson (b/s). \$50.00



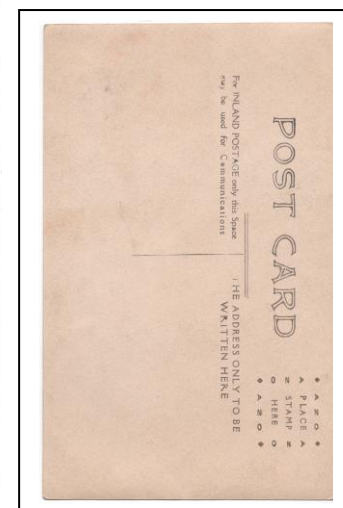
Item 637-17 – **Toronto Steamboat Inspector** – 1899, 2¢ Provisional tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on "On Service" Steamboat Inspector cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. \$75.00



Item 637-18 – **1¢ Quebec dramatic misperf** – 1908, 1¢ Quebec dramatic misperf with light ink smear in bottom margin tied by Niagara Falls International machine cancel on postcard, cutdown at bottom, paying 1¢ postcard rate to St. Catharines. \$50.00



Item 637-19 – Quebec fabricant de vin de messe – 1908, 2c, 5c Tercentenary tied by Quebec Que cds on Toussaint & Cie Fabricants du Vin de Messe St-Nazaire et de Carmes c/c cover paying 7c registered letter rate to St. Eustache. Montreal (b/s). Communion wine. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 637-20 – The Jenckes Hockey Club – 1908, The Jenckes Hockey Club of Sherbrooke Quebec real photo postcard, winner of the Stadium Cup, azo back, unused. \$150.00 **SOLD**

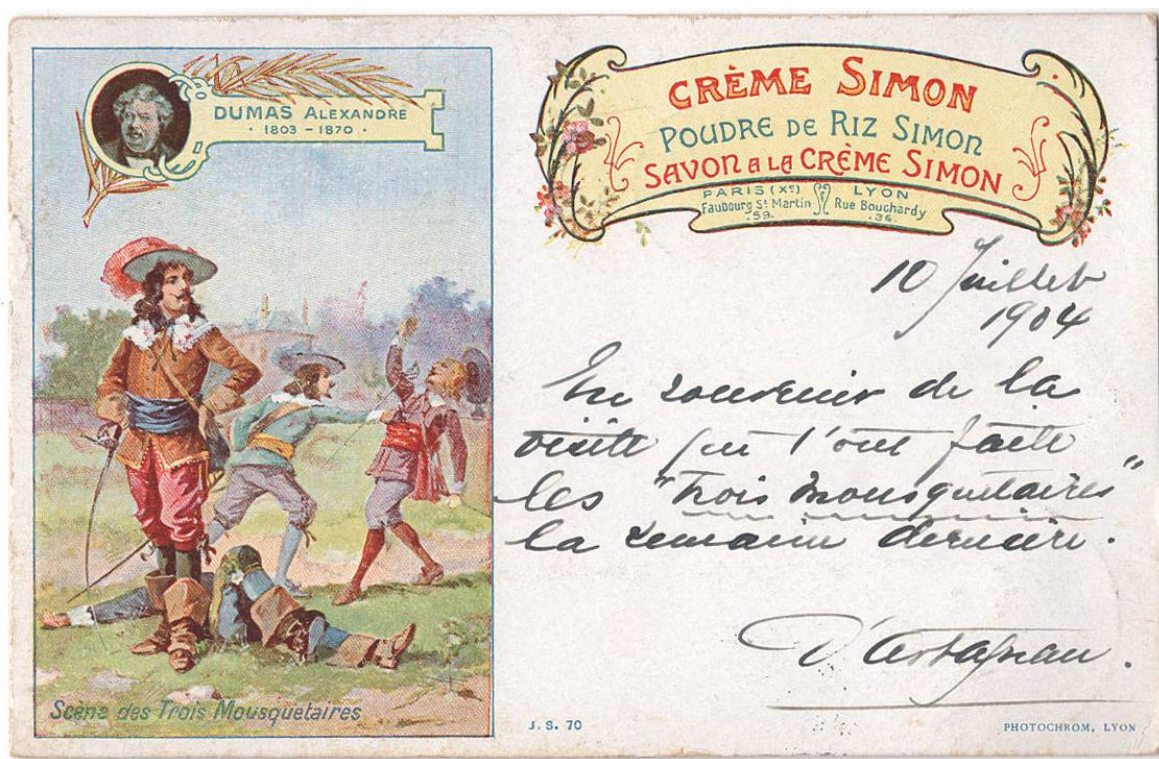

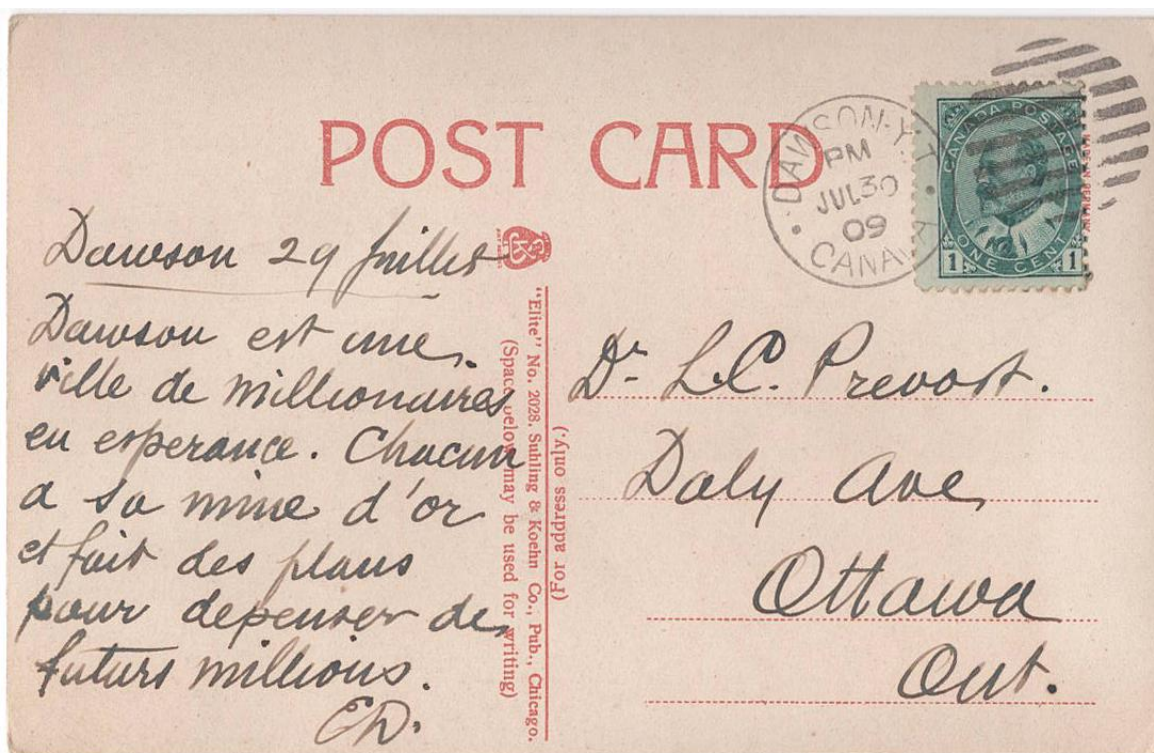
Item 637-21 – **License application for hotel and liquor permit** – 1911, 1¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on legal affidavit application for and hotel in Ste. Adele Que (*and for a permit to sell spirit and liquors*) mailed from St. Eustache Que paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Ste. Adele (b/s). A very scarce 1¢ Edward single use. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 637-22 – **Printer die cut round advertising postcard** – c1904-5, 1¢ Edward Toronto For Third Class Matter Only precancel on Copeland-Chatterton die cut round advertising postcard paying 1¢ printed matter rate to St. Pierre les Becquets Que. Die cut postcards should have been letter rated but since it is only printed and no message, it was mailed as printed matter. The company was founded by R. J. Copeland and A. E. Chatterton in Brampton in 1893. Oddball and rare. \$125.00 **SOLD**



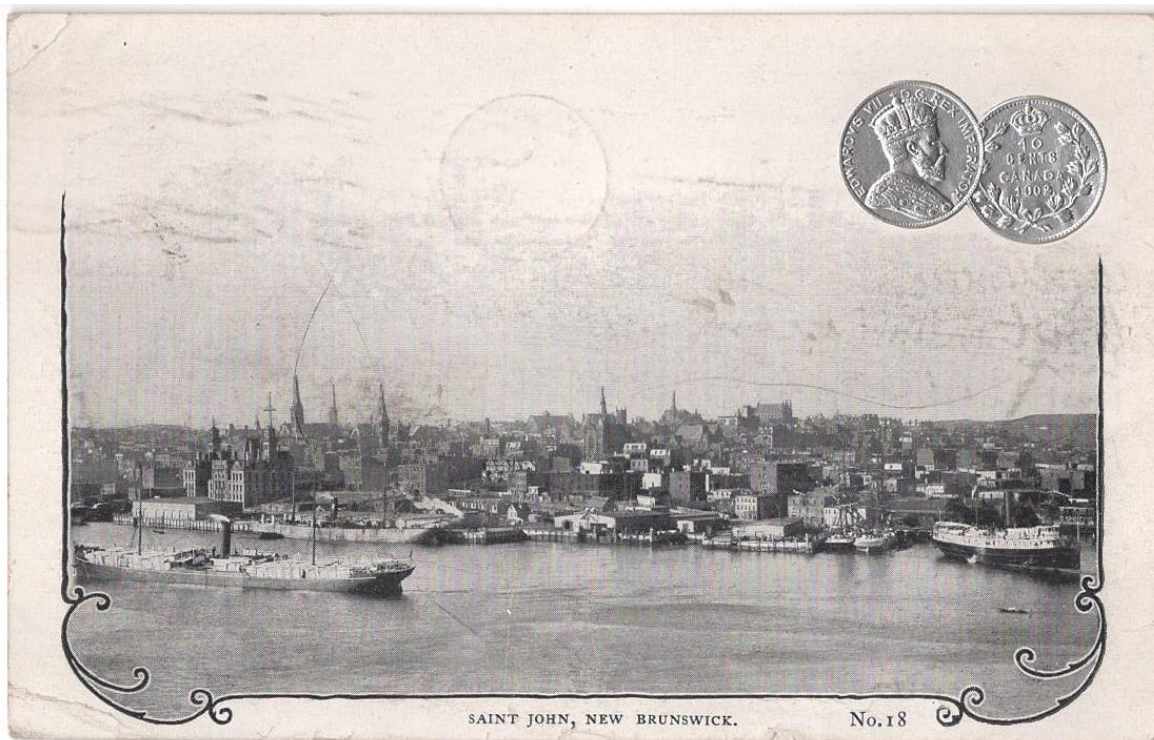
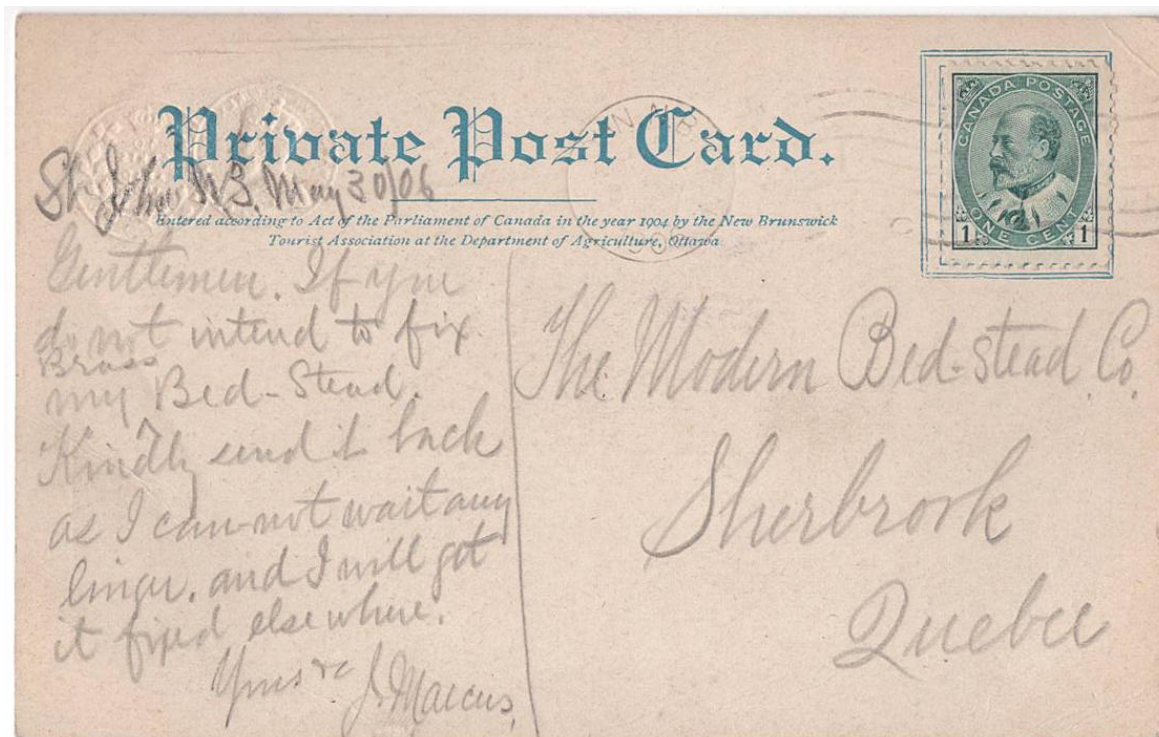
Item 637-23 – **Soap advertising postcard with The Three Musketeers** – 1904, 1¢ Edward tied by Ottawa machine cancel on Crème Simon Poudre de Riz Simon undivided advertising postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to New York. The card shows a Three Musketeers scene and signed by D'Artagnan. Crème Simon was a French soap and perfume company located in Paris and Lyon. A very scarce Canadian use. \$50.00 **SOLD**



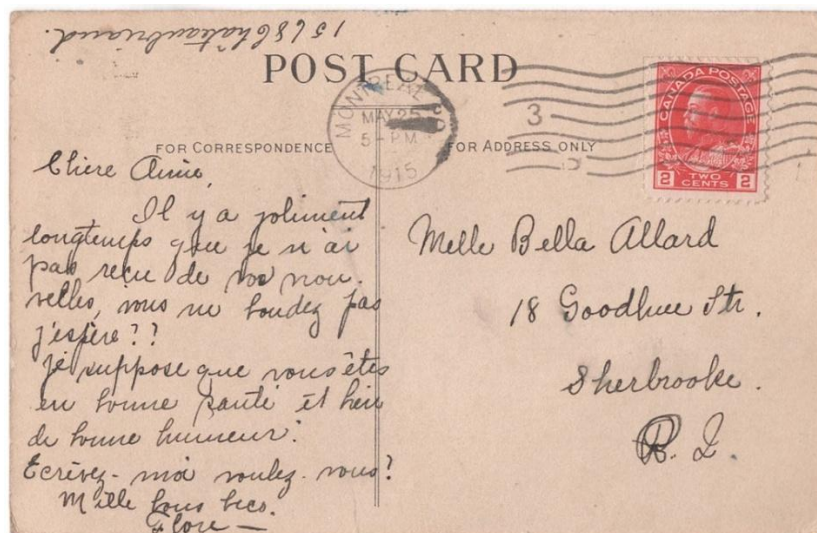
Item 637-24 – **Dawson Yukon** – 1909, 1¢ Edward tied by Dawson Yukon duplex cancel on Lower Dominion Creek postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to Ottawa. The card is published by Zaccarelli's Fruit Store of Dawson. The message translated is: *Dawson is a city of millionaires in hope. Everyone has their own gold mine and plans to spend millions of dollars in their future.* \$40.00 **SOLD**



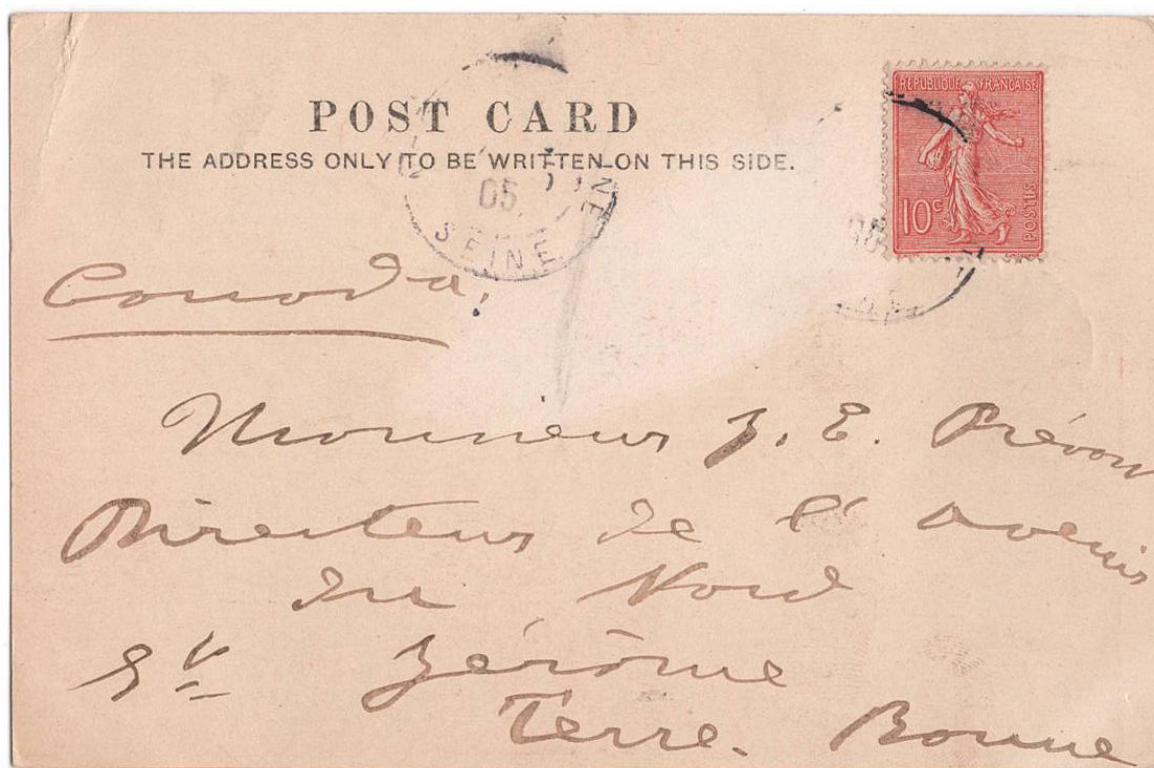
Item 637-25 – **Baby's Own Soap advertising postcard** – 1904, 1¢ Edward tied by Ottawa machine cancel on Baby's Own Soap advertising postcard, a monkey barber shop scene, paying 1¢ postcard rate to New York. A rare postally used advertising card. \$75.00



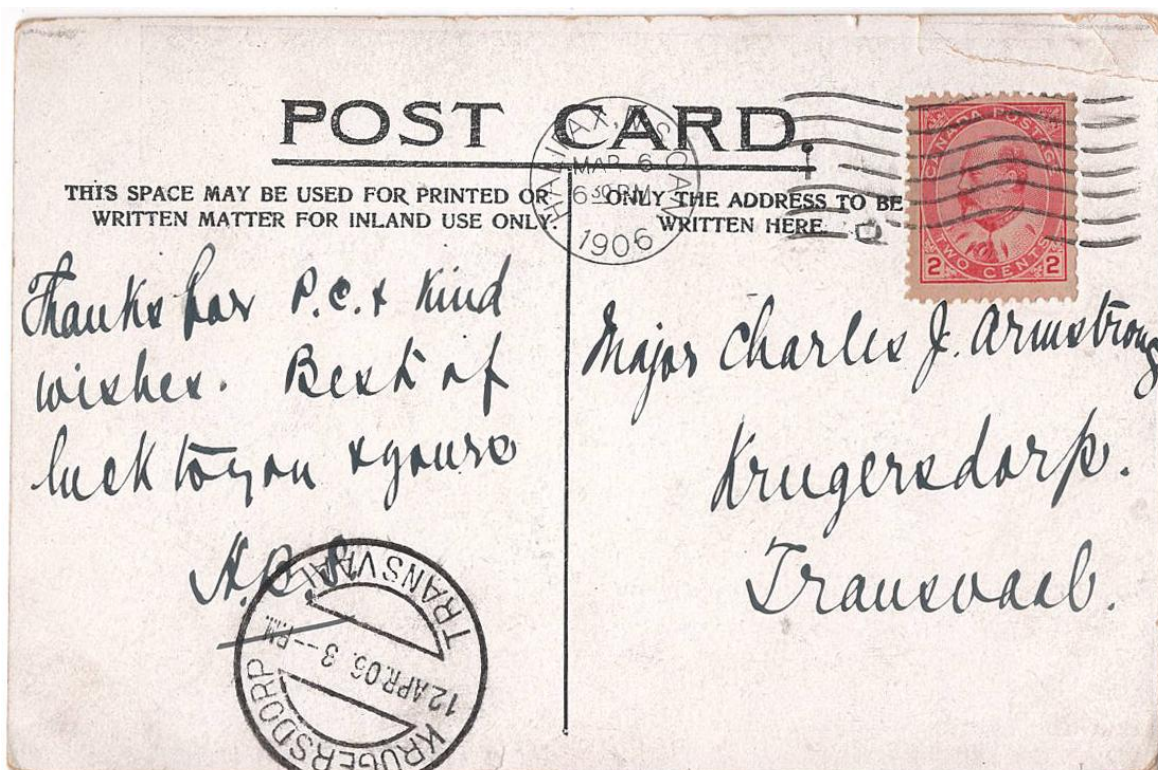
Item 637-26 – **McCoy patriotic postcard No.18** – 1906, 1¢ Edward tied by St. John NB machine cancel on McCoy patriotic postcard No.18 paying 1¢ postcard rate to Sherbrooke Que. \$35.00



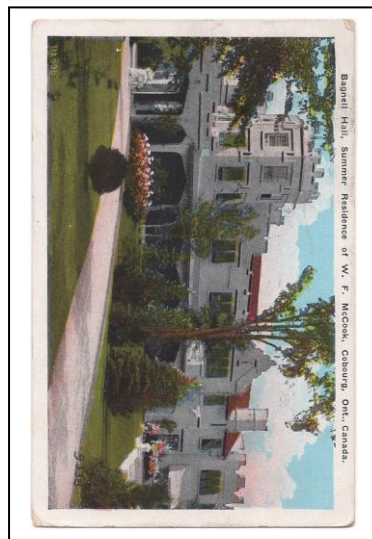
Item 637-27 – The Bontex Girl Sewing Week advertising – 1915, 2¢ Admiral tied by Montreal machine cancel on Bontex Sewing Week advertising postcard paying 2¢ postcard rate to Sherbrooke. This card is scarce because it is postally used. \$50.00



Item 637-28 – **Edward VII and Alexandra Coronation postcard to Canada** – 1905, France 10c Semeuse on Edward and Alexandra Coronation patriotic postcard mailed from Bry-sur-Marne Seine to St. Jerome Que (b/s MY 15 05). Message: *here is the postcard in great demand these days on the boulevard / I wanted to send you one.* Boulevard refers to an area with a high concentration of stamp shops and other paper collectibles. \$50.00



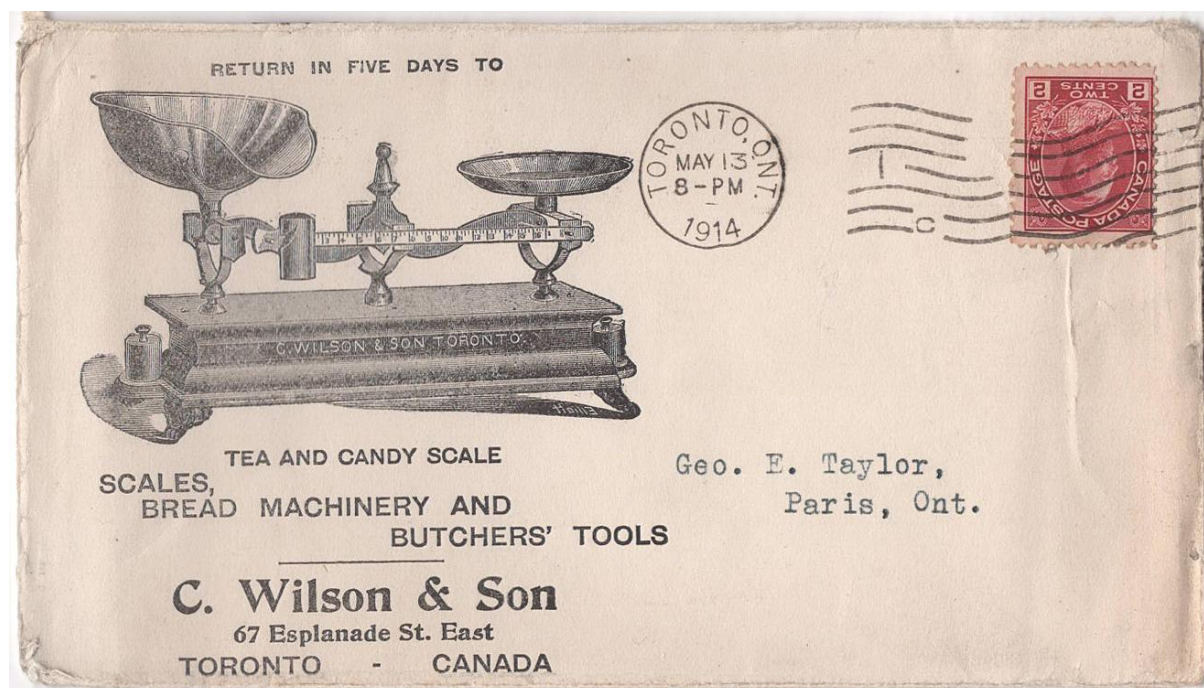

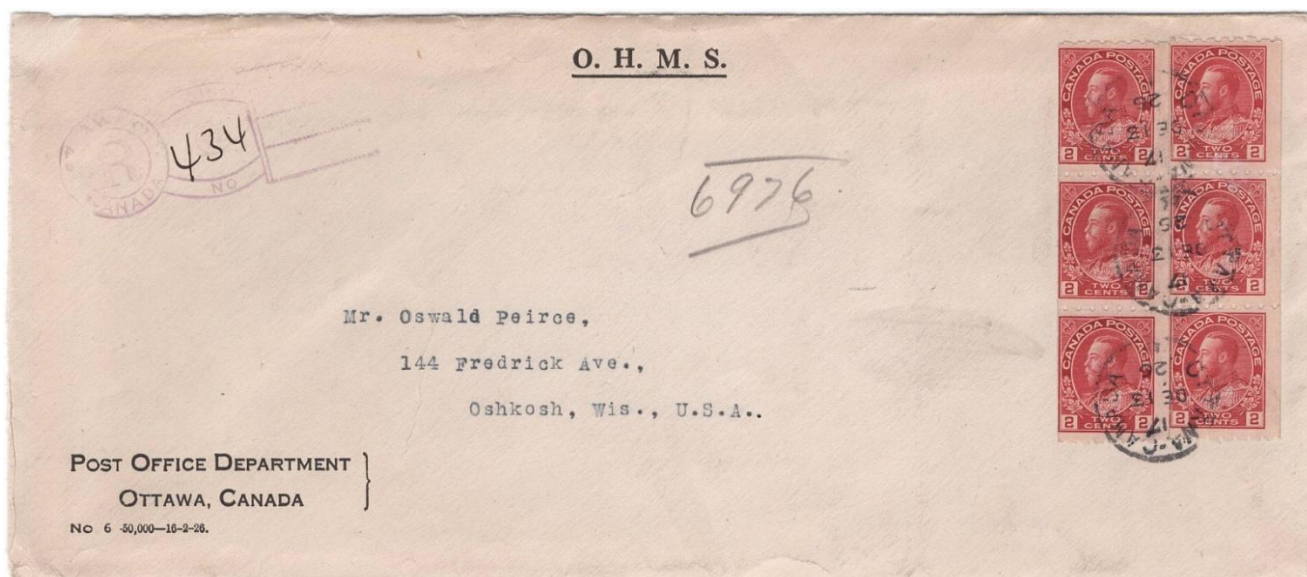
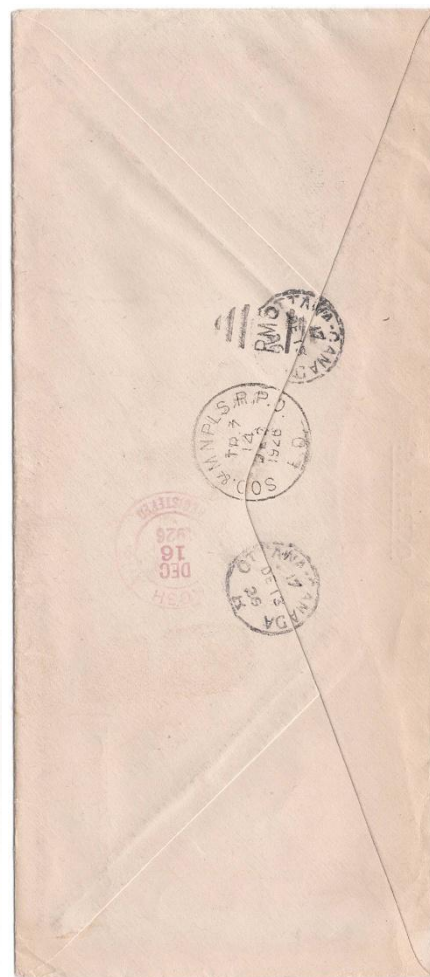
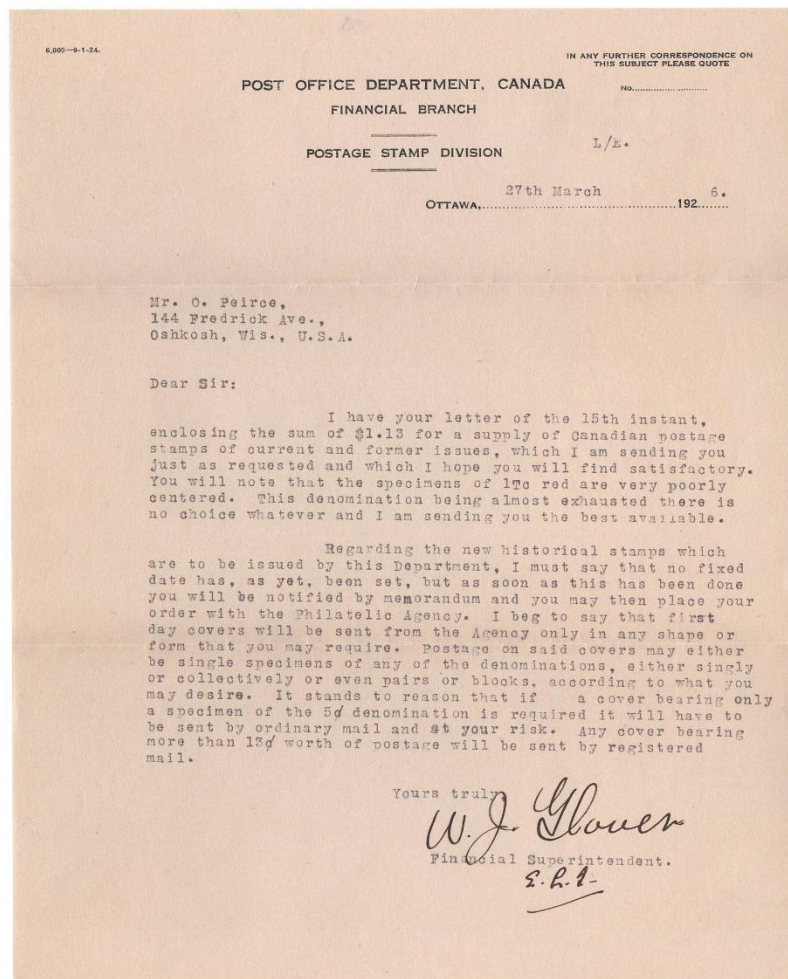
Item 637-31 – **Diamond Jubilee flag 43-5** – 1927, 1¢ Admiral vertical pair tied by two Diamond Jubilee flag cancels on OHMS military cover (MFB 299 form), flag type 43-5, paying 2¢ letter rate to Kingston. \$25.00



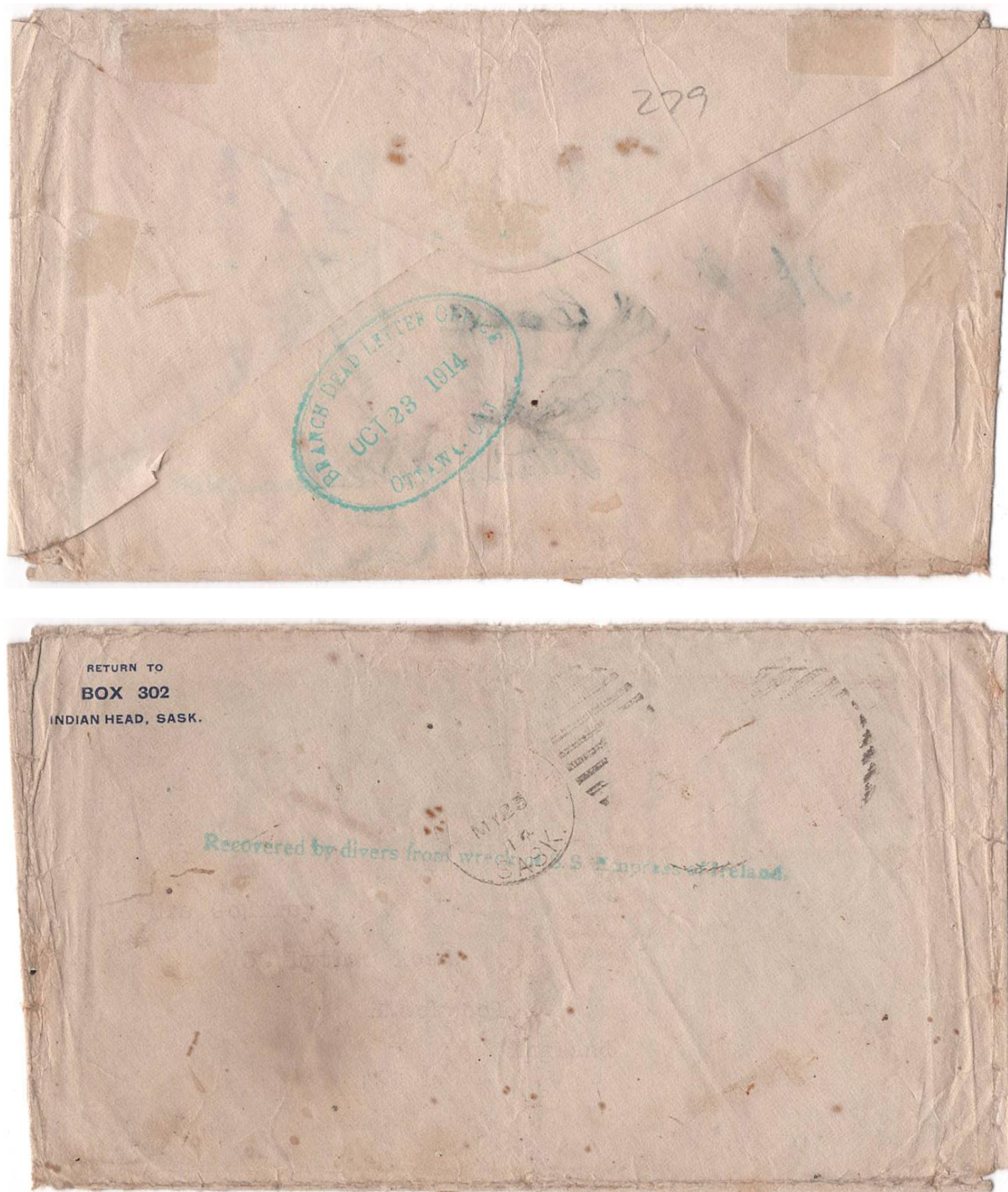
Item 637-32 – Wilson & Son Tea and Candy Scale – 1914, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto machine cancel on Wilson & Son Scales, Machinery and Butchers' Tools advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Paris (b/s). Paris Station (b/s). \$75.00



Item 637-33 – H.P. Sauce – 1916, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto machine cancel on HP Sauce and W.G. Patrick & Co. Manufacturers Agents and Importers advertising cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. \$40.00



Item 637-34 – Two 2c Admiral coil strips 124 – 1926, two 2c Admiral coil perf 8 horizontally strips of 3 tied by Ottawa Canada "R" cds on Post Office cover paying 12c registered letter rate to Wisconsin (b/s). Carried by Soo Line (b/s - Minneapolis, St. Paul and Sault Ste. Marie Railroad). The letter relates to the Historical stamps to be issued in 1927 etc. \$200.00



Item 637-35 – **Indian Head Sask cover recovered from Empress of Ireland** – 1914, cover with two 2¢ Admiral stamps off (having floated off while immersed) from Indian Head Sask paying 4¢ double wgt Empire rate to Blackpool England, recovered by divers from the wreck of SS Empress of Ireland. Very pretty handstamp straight-line struck in emerald ink, reverse with complete scalloped oval Dead Letter Office OC 23 1914. \$500.00



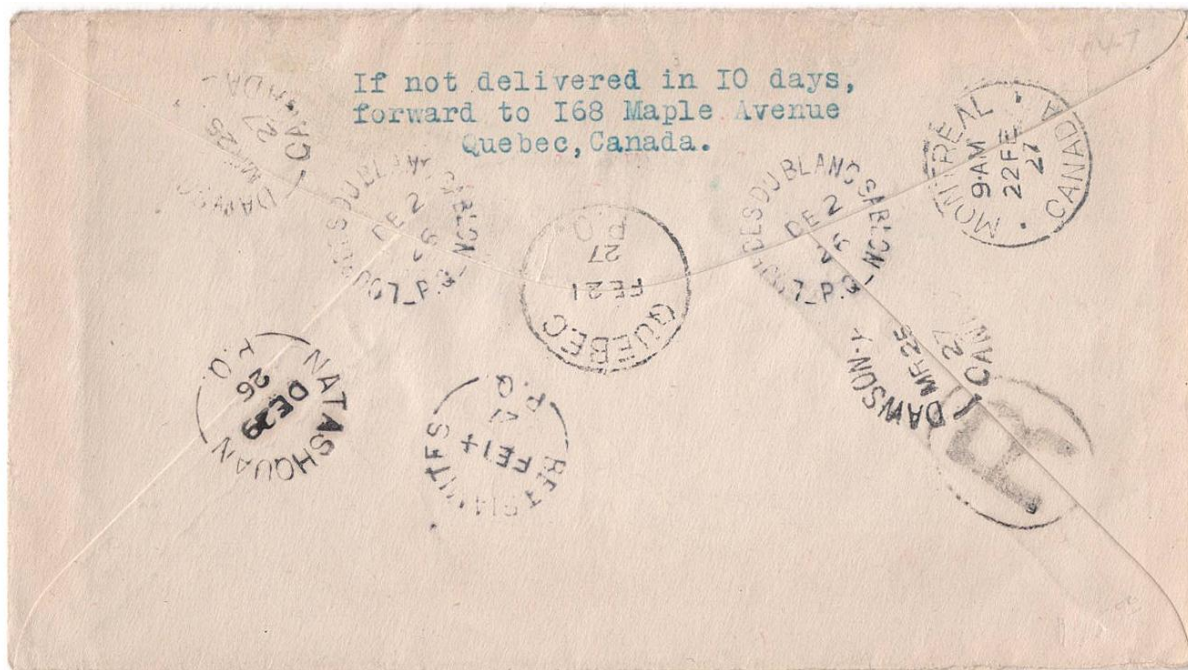

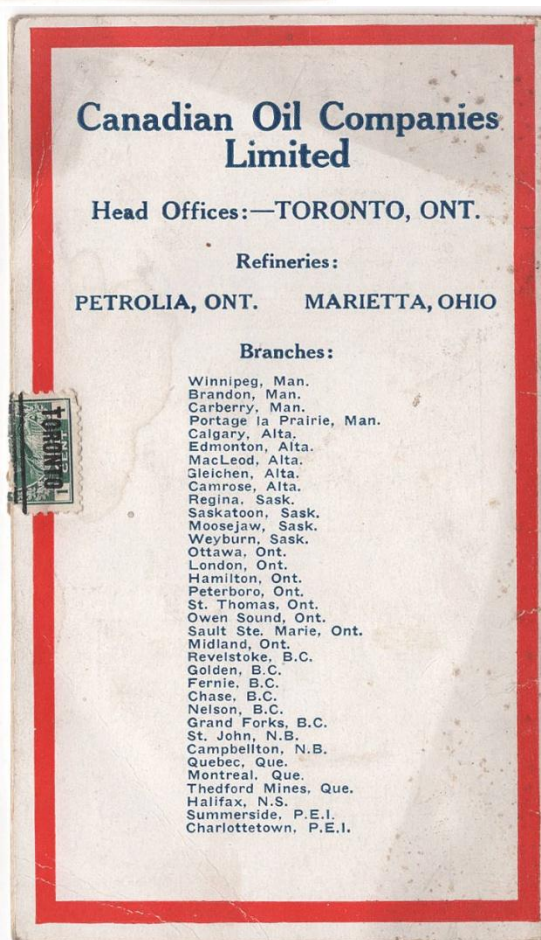
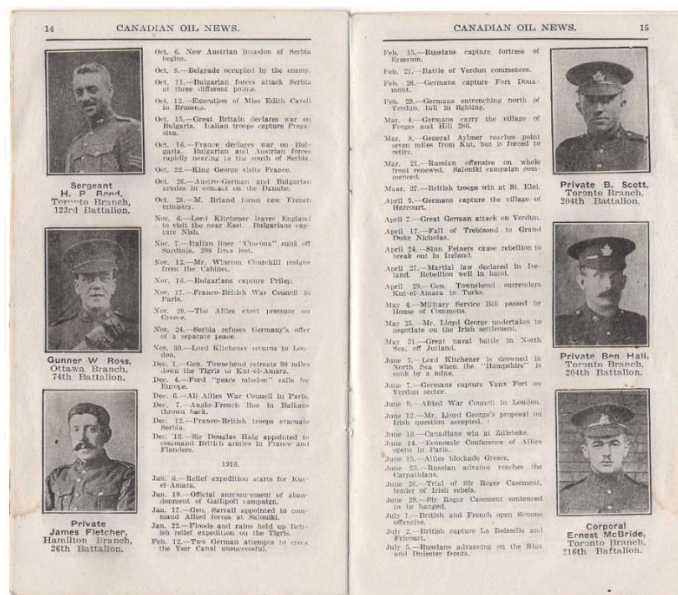

Therese de Blainville Que duplex cancel on cover, with Keyhole, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to St. Hermas Que. Reverse with Railway Post Office clerk handstamp Mont & Calumet RPO M. Villeneuve West AUG 11 1923. Similar clerk marking to QC-146 but with short Montreal. Unlisted and presumably a new Quebec RPO discovery. \$300.00



Item 637-38 – **Mutual Life perfin and registered** – 1915, 2¢, 5¢ Admiral, 1¢ Wartax MR1 with MLC perfin on Mutual Life cover from Waterloo Ont paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Minnedosa Manitoba (b/s). Oval Registered No. ___ Waterloo handstamp, reverse with three RPOs: Toronto St. Mary's & London, Fort Willam & Winnipeg No.5 and Winnipeg & Toronto No.2. A real wow cover! \$150.00



Item 637-39 – **Registered dog team Blanc Sablon to Dawson** – 1926, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on 2¢ postal stationery envelope from Lourdes du Blanc Sablon Que, philatelic Labrador Dog-Team privately added, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Dawson Yukon (receiver on front). Reverse with routing: Betsiamites, Natashquan, Quebec and Montreal. About 4 months in transit. The cover is addressed to Tanner Green, philatelist, collector, well-known Post Office inspector and later superintendent of postal service. \$100.00



Item 637-40 – **Great War - Canadian Oil News brochure "The Patriotic Number"** – c1916, Canadian Oil News brochure "The Patriotic Number" mailed from Toronto with 1c Admiral precancel used as postage and seal paying 1c printed matter rate to Richmond Que. Complete with some loose pages. Incl: appeal of King George at this grave moment, extract from an appeal to every Canadian by Sir Robt Borden, list of Canadian Oil Co. employees on active service etc. 18 pages. \$125.00 **RED**

"C" Force was the Canadian contingent involved in the Battle of Hong Kong in December 1941. Members of the contingent were the first Canadian soldiers to see action against Japan. The Canadian units involved in the defence of Hong Kong were the Winnipeg Grenadiers and the Royal Rifles of Canada. 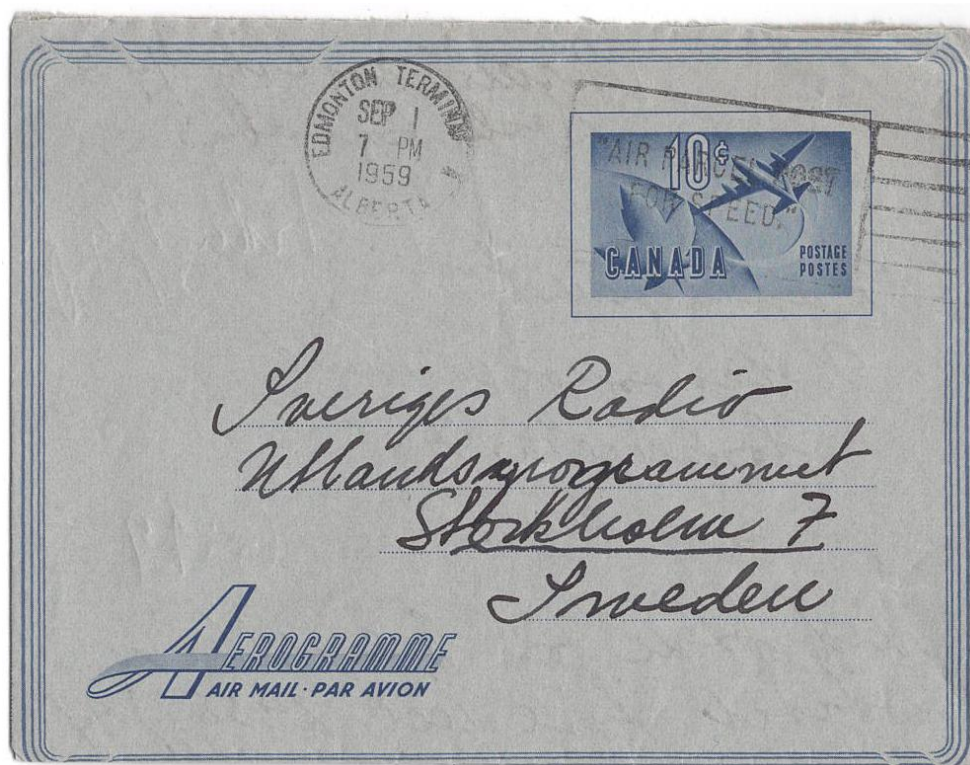
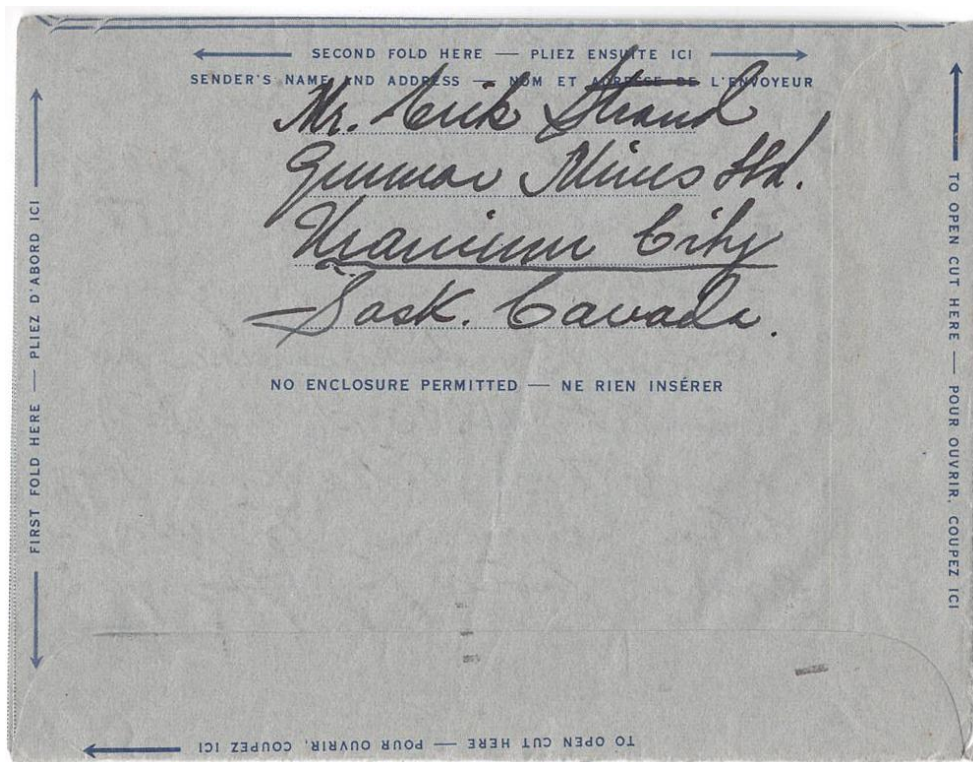

making industry in Canada. Like many another firm, finances had to be augmented with by-products of the industry. So they devised the first dustproof watch keys made in Canada, also a very serviceable glass cutter, both of which were ingenious and distinctly profitable. Planning, patenting, making and selling with one end in view they equipped a small factory and produced all told about one hundred and fifty movements. Apart from students at the horological school in Toronto they enjoy the distinction

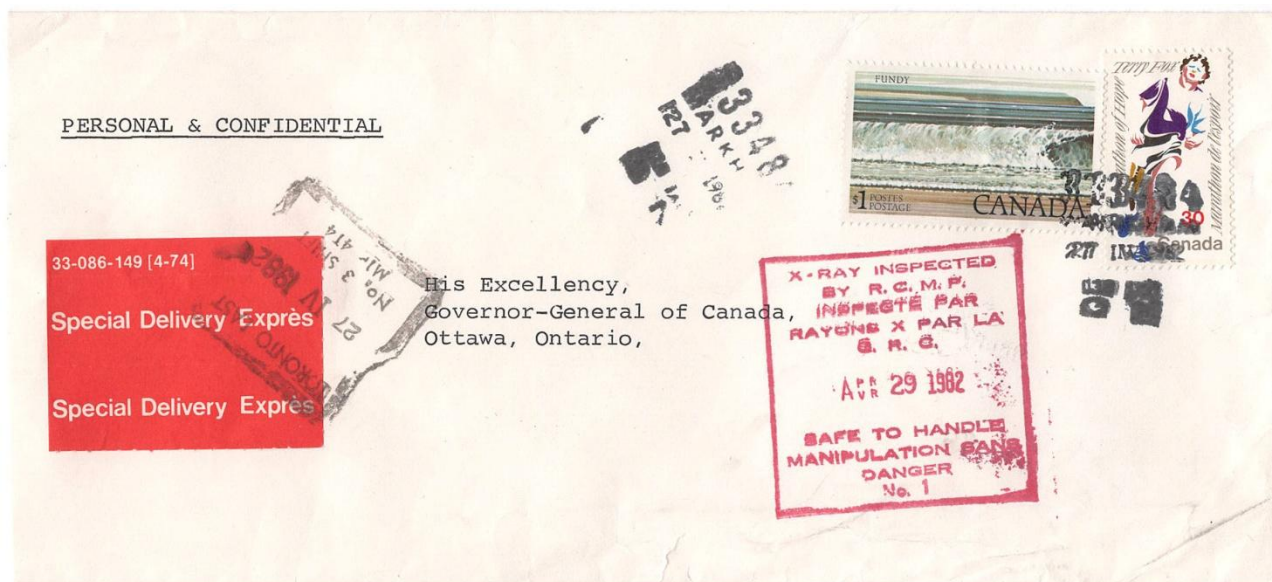
of being the only watchmakers Canada ever had. Mr. A. C. Skinner, who knew both of these men personally and who is responsible for this pamphlet, states that the first Henry watches were undoubtedly key-wind, and the one now in possession of Mr. Arthur Speid of Lennoxville, is still in good running order. Concerning the Edgell watch Mr. Skinner relates an interesting story told to him by George Henry. It seems that Mr. Edgell was a good friend of his father's and knew that he needed money.
