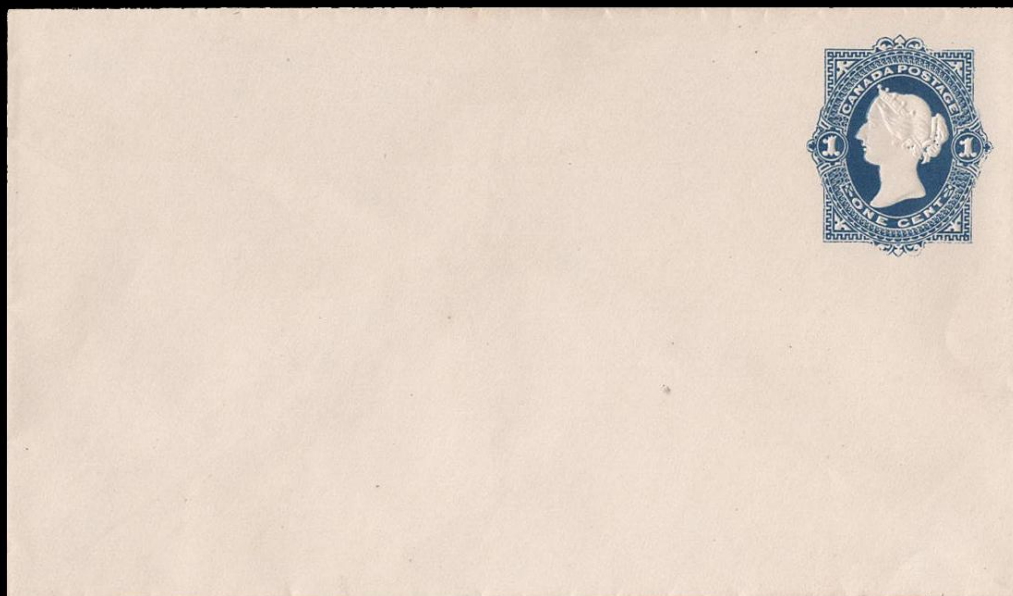

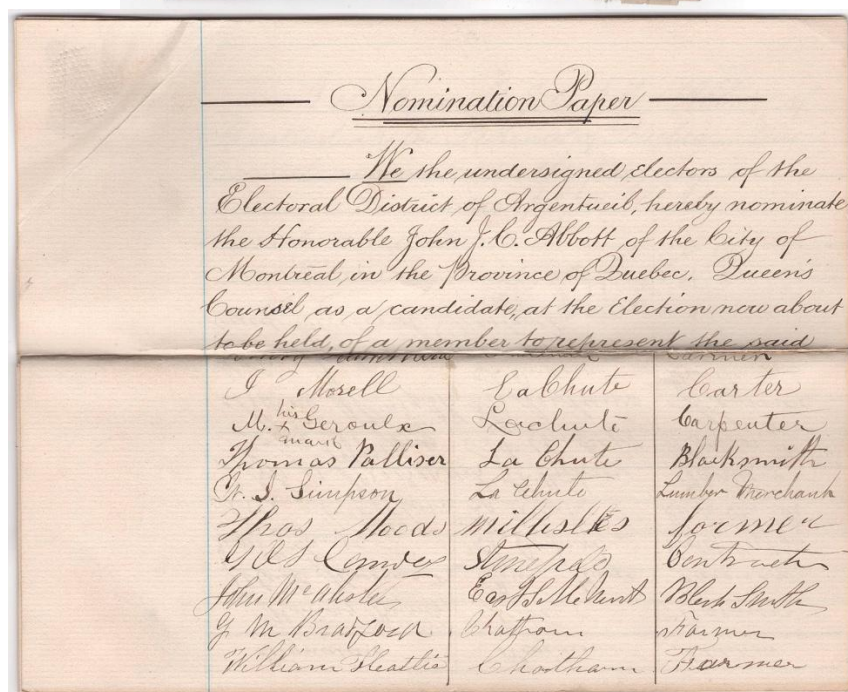
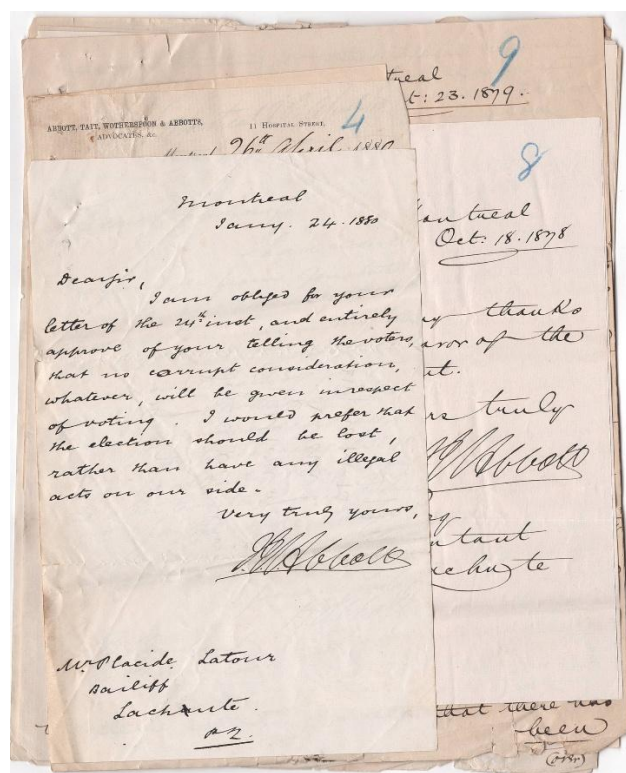

Item 638-01 – **Sir John Joseph Caldwell Abbott, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Prime Minister of Canada** – 1880, nomination paper for candidate in Argenteuil County Quebec for John Abbott (on a Pirie Sons watermarked paper 1877) plus a group of 12 autograph letter signed by Abbott (1878-1880), who later became the 3<sup>rd</sup> Prime Minister of Canada (1891-1892). Sir John Joseph Caldwell Abbott PC KCMG QC (1821-1893) was a Canadian lawyer and politician. He was born in St. Andrews, Lower Canada. He studied law at McGill University and became one of Montreal's best-known lawyers. Leader of the Conservative Party. He was the first native-born Canadian prime minister. He was an Orangeman and Freemason. He commanded the 11<sup>th</sup> Argenteuil Rifles Volunteer Militia throughout the Fenian Raids. He was mayor of Montreal from 1887 to 1889. \$2,000.00 **SOLD**
