
Item 639-01 – **1788 letter from Quebec to Madeira Archipelago** – 1788, grain market and exchange letter from Quebec dated July 6 1788, signed Robert Lester Company, to Newton Gordon & Johnson (*spirits and wine merchants*), Madeira Islands, Portugal. Endorsed "per Steamer Brothers" Capt Flynn. Most likely a West Indies private trader. Lester was an Irish Quebecer businessman, militia officer, politician, and landowner. He arrived at Quebec around 1770, and by 1772 he had established himself there as a merchant. In the winter of 1775–76, during the siege of the city he was a captain of militia. His residence and business were at 7 Rue Saint-Pierre. Gradually he built up a trade based principally on the import, for wholesale marketing, of cloth and spirits and on the export of wheat. Some separations at fold. \$2,000.00



Item 639-02 – Newcastle UC "across Lake Ontario" to U.S. – 1848, business folded letter from Newcastle UC paid 7d to the exchange office and 10¢ US collect to Pennsylvania. The letter was carried to Toronto (b/s) and carried by Lake Ontario steamboat summer service on the Toronto/Rochester route. The rate from Newcastle around the lake would have been 9d, across the lake 7d. The letter relates to a property dispute. Rare. \$500.00



Item 639-03 – St. Therese de Blanville LC (the nicest double circle) – 1848, business folded letter written in French from Sainte-Thérèse-de-Blanville LC rated 4½d collect to Montreal (b/s). The letter relates to finance and a dept to the municipality. This is, by far, the nicest St. Therese de Blanville double circle that I have seen, clean and readable. No doubt an exhibit piece. \$250.00 SOLD



Item 639-04 – <u>Deputy Adjutant-General of the Militia</u> – 1855, folded cover from Quebec with Paid Quebec LC and Paid 3 to Cornwall UC. The cover is signed by D. Macdonald, Lt. Colonel. Deputy Adjutant-General of the Militia. Macdonald was from Glengarry County, St. Raphael area. \$150.00





Item  $639-05 - \underline{1859 \text{ clock to indicate time of mailing}} - 1859$ , stampless free franked cover from Quebec to Toronto (b/s). Reverse with a very unusual clock illustrated to indicate time of mailing. "Mise à la poste". Staining. \$100.00 SOLD





Item 639-06 – <u>Cacona LC spelling error</u> - 1870, stampless cover from Cacouna LC paid 3 to Quebec (b/s). This is the Cacona hammer III with spelling error. A trio of spelling error hammers exist: Cocona hammer 1 (1833-1851), Cacona hammer II (1846-1851) and then Cacona hammer III (1865-1870). \$100.00



Item 639-07 – Newspaper mailed to St. Hermas Que -refused – 1892, Terrebonne County l'Echo des Deux-Montagnes newspaper mailed from Ste. Scholastique Que to St. Hermas. 3 mentions "refused" and returned to Ste. Scholastique. An interesting item for any delayed/refused/returned/Small Queen era mail collection. \$200.00





Item 639-08 – <u>Post Office Inspector William Henry Griffin</u> – 1879, Post Office business free franked cover from Ottawa, signed W.H. Griffin, to Toronto (b/s + carrier mark). \$50.00 SOLD

Griffin was a public servant. In 1833 he became postmaster of Quebec City and then he served as post office surveyor or inspector from Kingston to Fredericton. He was also the clerk to Deputy Postmaster General Stayner. In 1857, he assumed the position of DPMG. As a result of confederation, the post offices of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick became the charge of the dominion government, and in 1868 Griffin was made deputy postmaster general of the enlarged operation. During Griffin's years with the dominion, he created the post office savings bank, a postal convention was negotiated with the Americans and over the entire period the number of post offices grew from some 3,500 to more than 7,500.





On page 2, the reply signed by the director on district letterhead with original cover accompanies. An interesting correspondence with seldom seen administrative markings. \$75.00

Dear Sir:-

We have your letter of the 28th instant on the subject of air mail between Canada and San Juan, Puerto Rico, and in reply may say that the air mail rate to that country is  $25 \not\in$  per  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounce.

As regards the difference between the rates in the opposite direction, the air mail rates from Canada are based of necessity on the charges we have to pay for intermediary services en route to destination. In this case such charges for intermediary services are set by the United States, and we have no option but to pay whatever they ask and set our rates accordingly.

We would like to be able to offer a lower postage rate for air mail to Puerto Rico, but until lower transportation rates beyond the United States are available we will not be in a position to do so.

The rates from Puerto Rico are, of course, a matter over which we have no control as the Postal Administration of Puerto Rico properly has the right to fix whatever rate it chooses.

I should like to add, however, that the situation is being kept under close observation, and should any change occur that would afford us an opportunity of reducing our air mail rates, we would be only too glad to take advantage of it immediately.

The Hutchinson house was built in 1855 for James Hutchinson's son and adjoined the market square in St. Thomas on the south side of Talbot St. (between Stanley and Church Streets). According to the "Illustrated Historical Atlas of Elgin County", Cole & Loyd were the proprietors in 1877. Demolished in 1905. \$100.00
