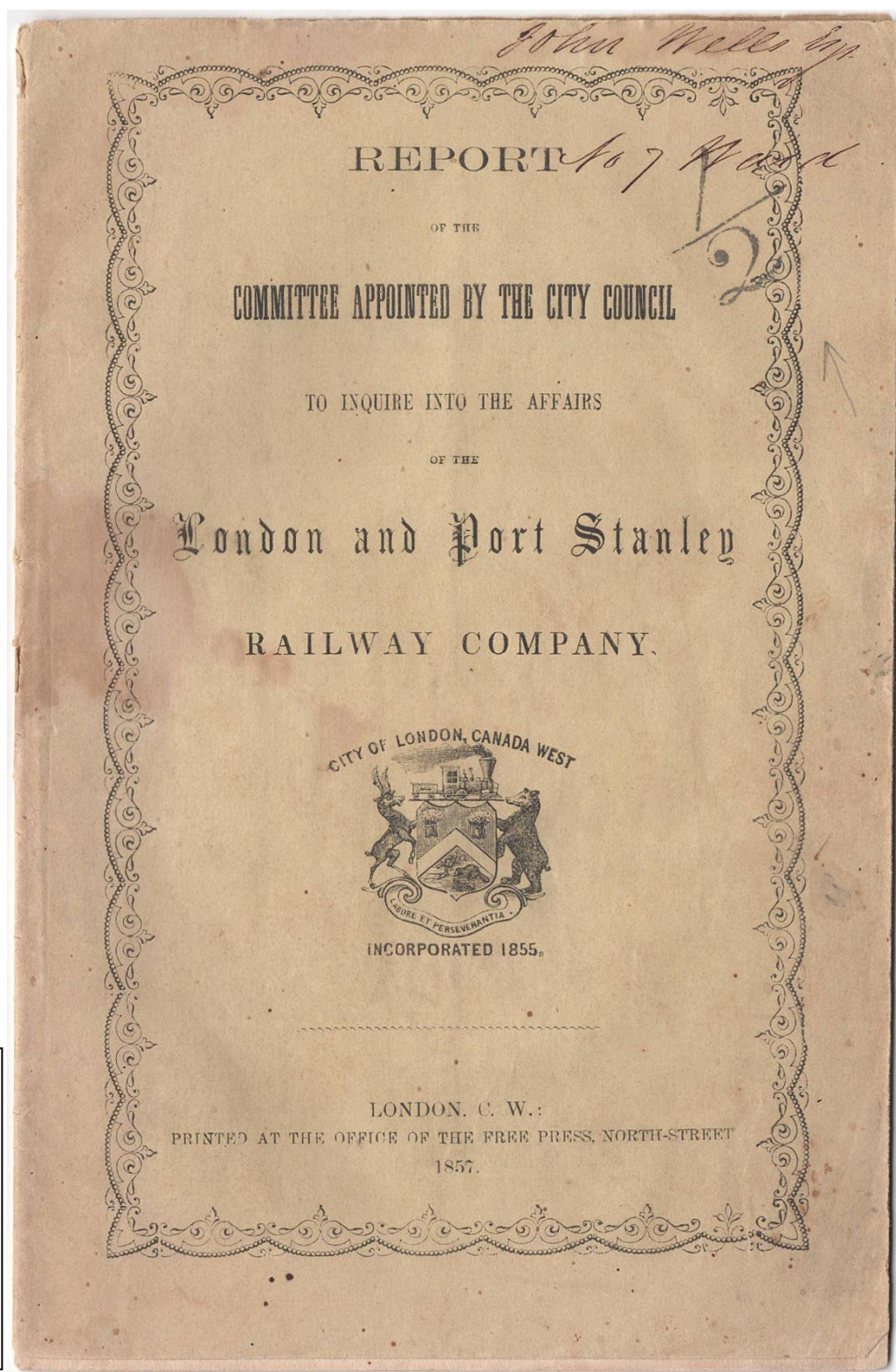




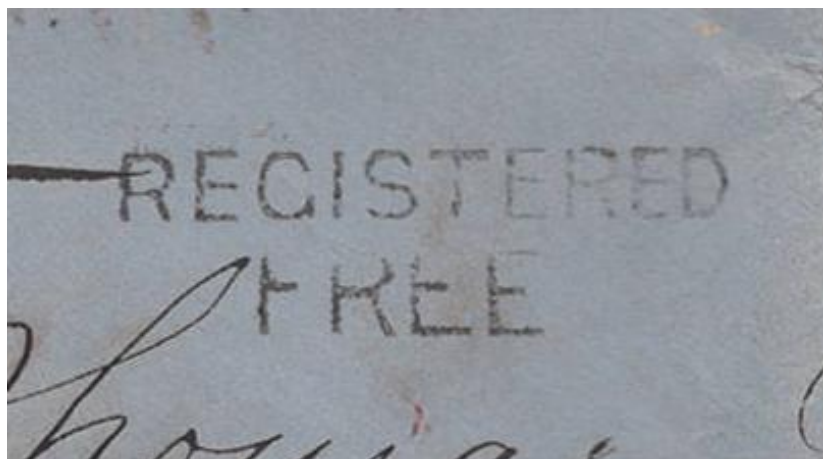
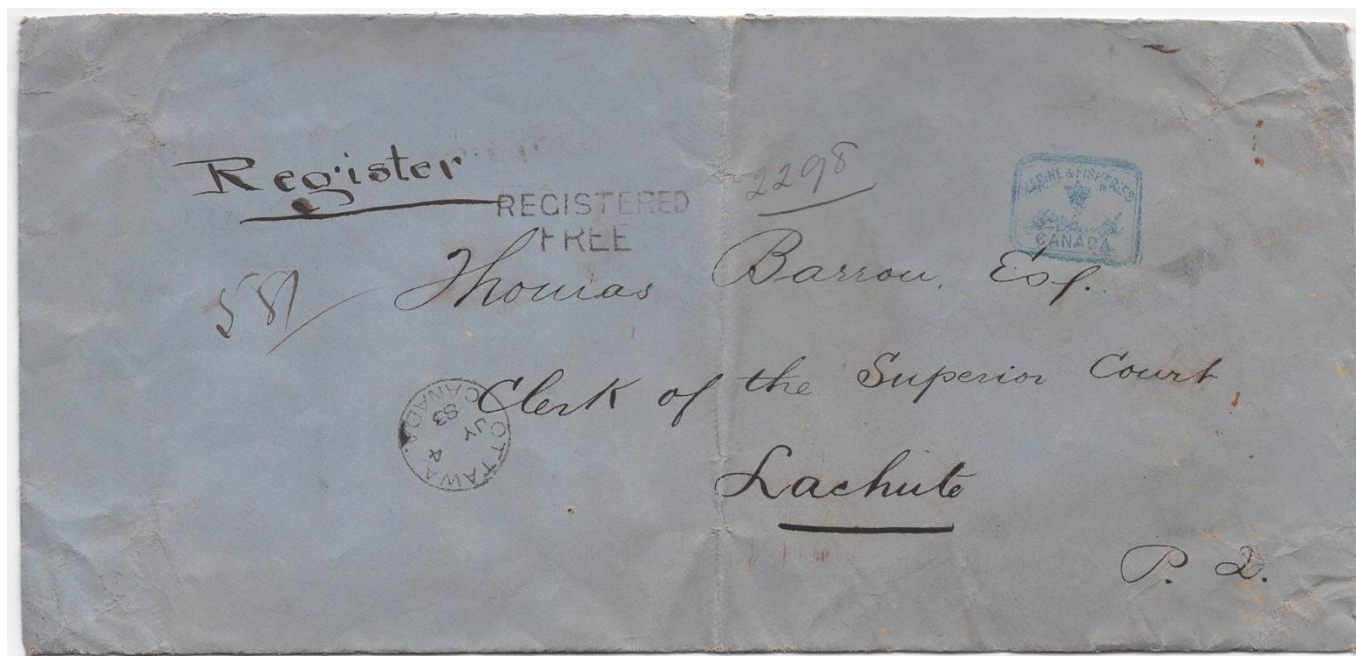
Item 640-01 – **Double Paid at Quebec Crown** – 1845, Bank of Montreal folded letter from Quebec, double Paid at Quebec Crown, paid 1/11 and 20¢ prepaying the full postage to New York. \$200.00



Item 640-02 – **E11 7½d Currency** - 1857, stampless cover mailed unpaid from London via Liverpool with B.U. Crown datestamp in black, representing the evening duty shift, to Toronto. Carried by Allan line Indian to Quebec. On arrival it has been charged 7½d Currency (applied in Toronto). Previously unrecorded by Arnell but provisionally allocated E.11 by Montgomery with assignment to Toronto. This is the only example that I have seen (Y into C). \$350.00

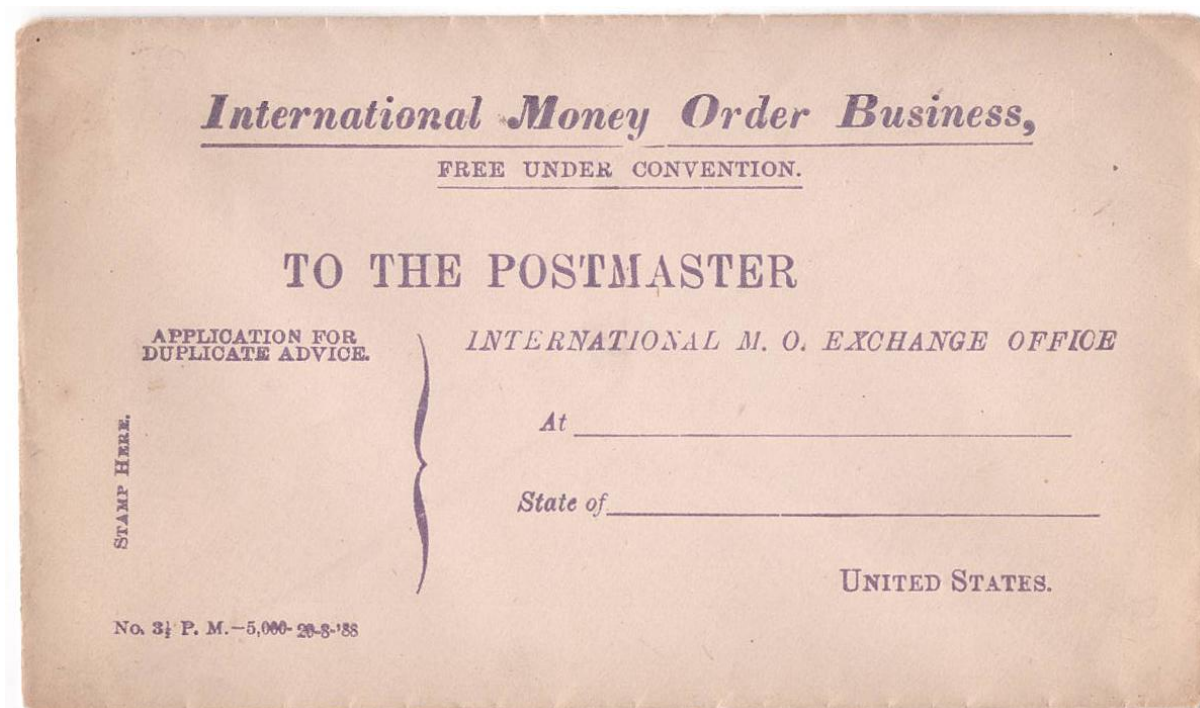


Item 640-03 – **24-page report London & Port Stanley Railway Co mailed** – 1857, 24-page inquiry report on the London & Port Stanley Railway Co. rated half penny collect paying the domestic printed matter rate to John Wells Esq, #7 Ward. From 1854 to 1859, the domestic printed matter rate was ½ pence per oz prepaid or unpaid. This report is 0.95 oz. A spectacular half penny use. \$500.00

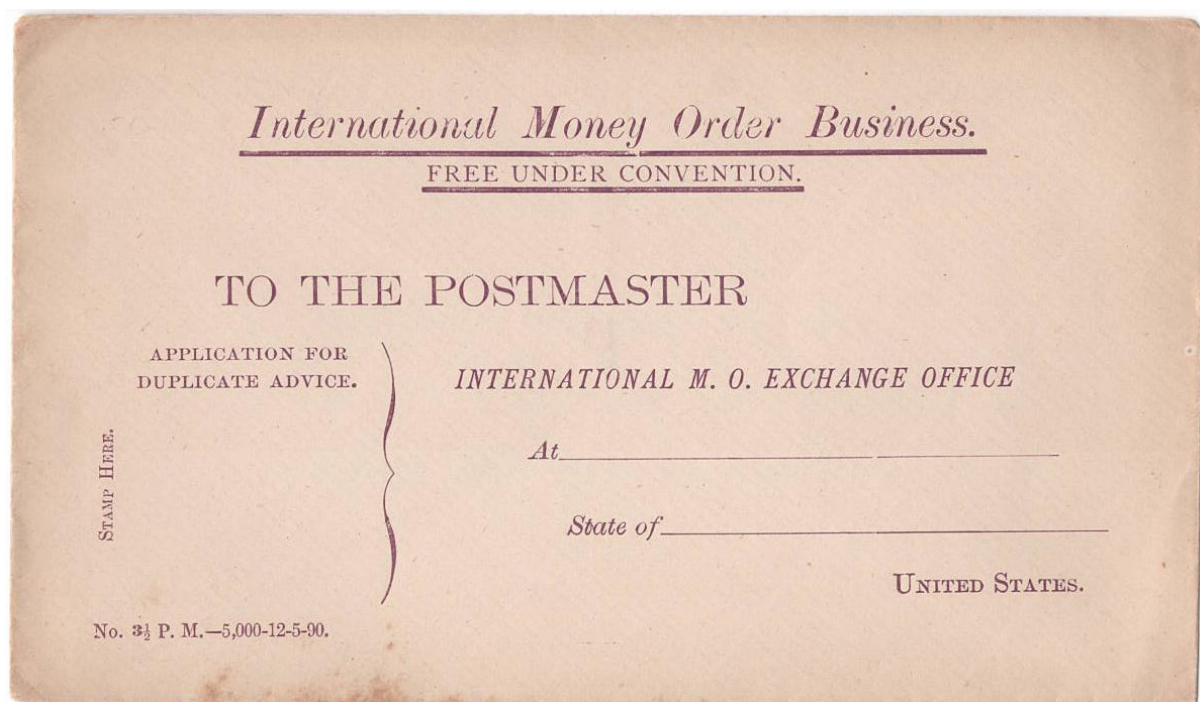


Item 640-04 – **Possibly the only reported Registered Free handstamp** – 1883, Marine & Fisheries Canada cover, William Smith Crown in blue, mailed from Ottawa with the possibly newly recorded “Registered Free” handstamp to Lachute (b/s). No doubt a rare Ottawa rate marking. Provenance: Lawrence Ball Archives (*outside the Postal History world*). A showpiece! \$400.00 **SOLD**

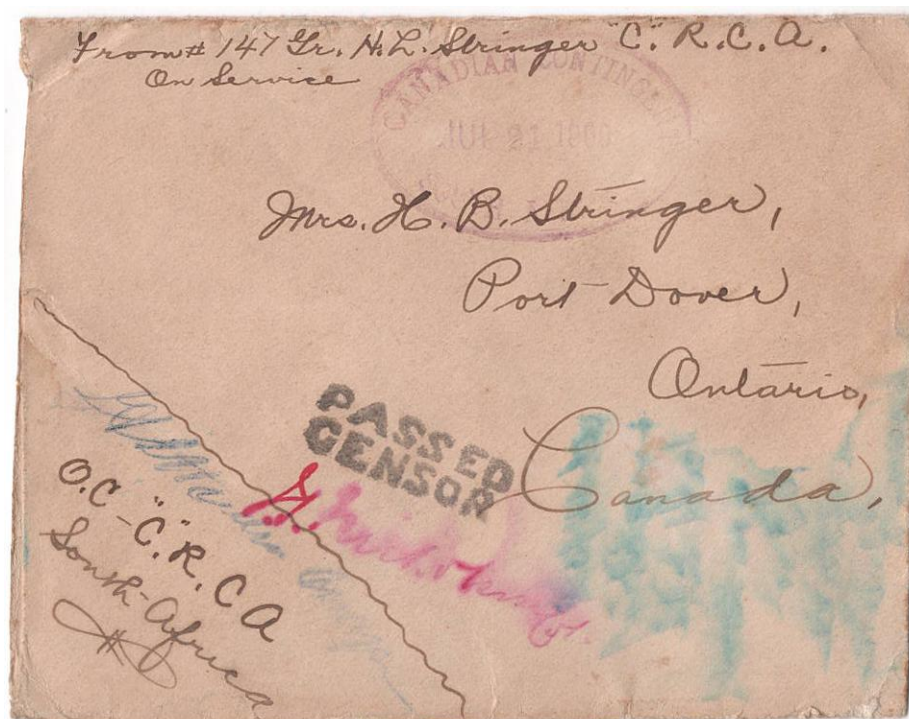

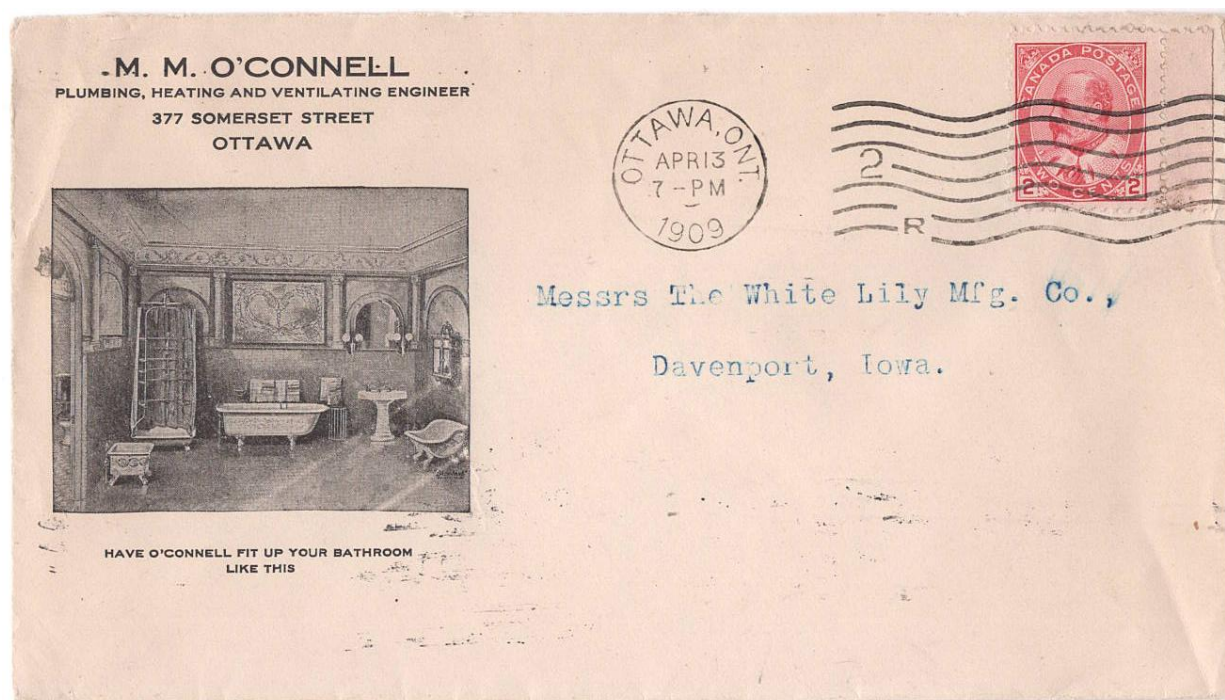
Item 640-07 – **The rare Dept of Interior V R Crown** – 1878, 3¢ SQ tied by target cancel on cover from Woodford Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa (b/s). Grey County. The cover is addressed to Crown Land Department with the rare Dept of Interior V R Crown handstamp as receiver. Little is known of this marking, but this cover possibly confirms that it was in use at Crown Lands. Rare. \$350.00



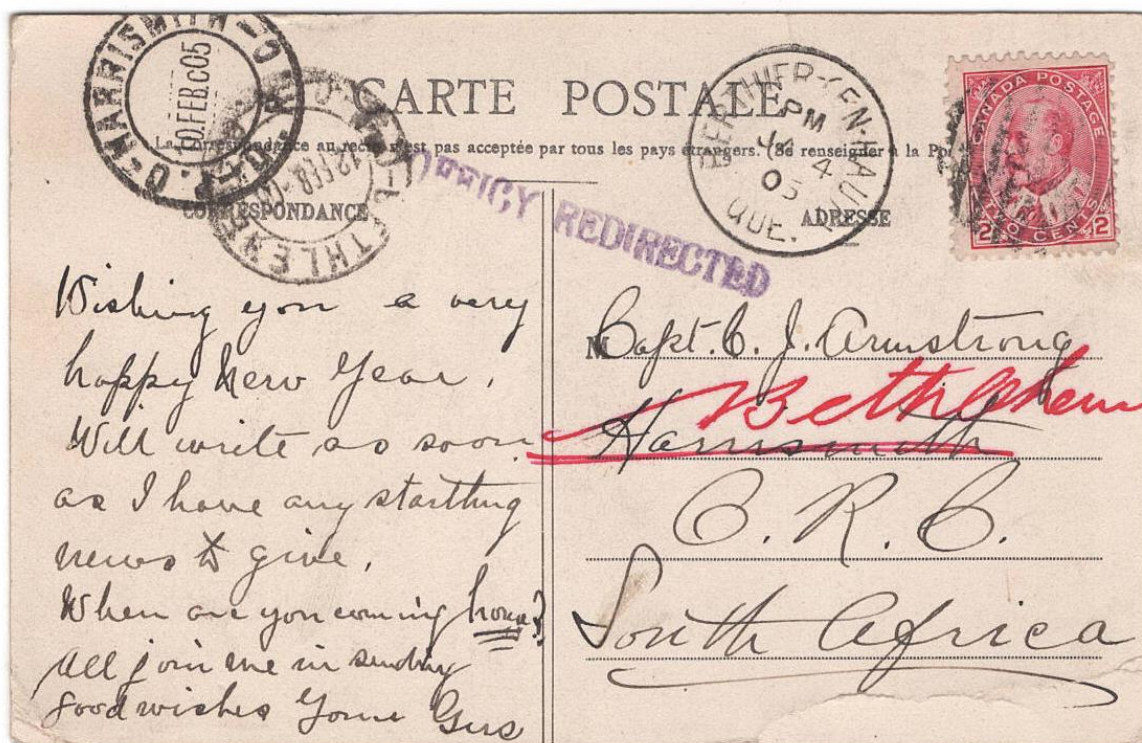
Item 640-08 – **20¢ Widow use on parcel piece to England** – 1893-1895, 2¢ SQ (2), 20¢ Widow tied by Ottawa roller cancel on parcel piece to England. Reverse showing a fibrous and brown kraft paper type. The parcel post rates to England varied over the year from 20¢ to 28¢ for 1lb. \$250.00



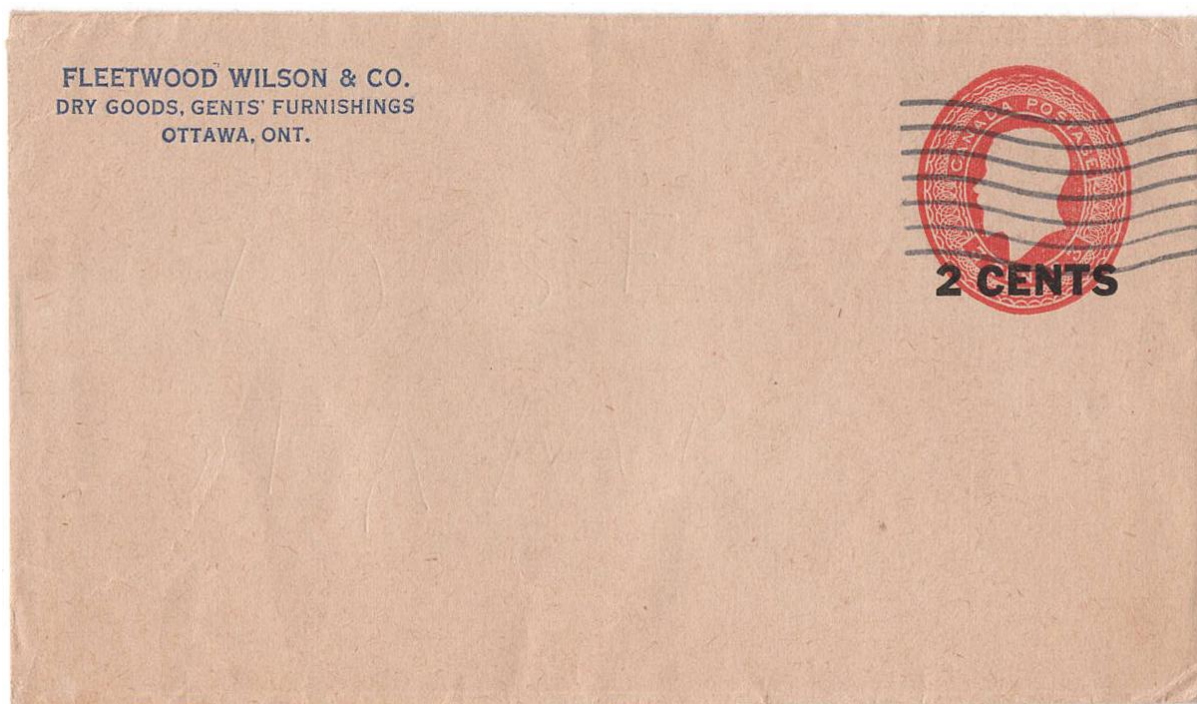
Item 640-09 – **Boer War in Rustenburg – Canadian Contingent JY 21 00** – 1900, Canadian Contingent South Africa cover dated JY 21 00 from CRCA Gunner Huron Lee Stringer to his mother in Port Dover. Passed by censor and countersigned by the Commanding Office. Hamilton and Port Dover (b/s). According to the note on reverse “Rustenburg”, this location played a significant role in the Second Boer War as it became a battleground, with huge clashes and guerrilla warfare between British and Boer forces. \$350.00



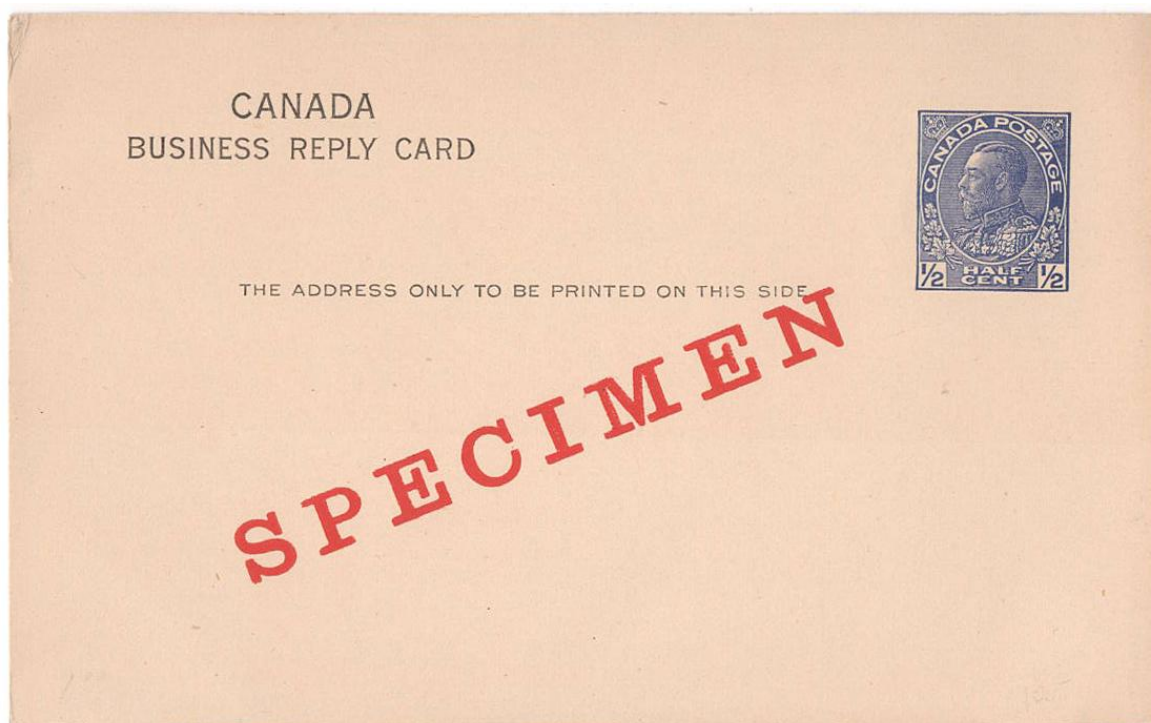
Item 640-10 – **Ottawa plumbing and heating** – 1909, 2¢ Edward tied by Ottawa machine cancel on M.M. O'Connell Plumbing, Heating and Ventilating Engineer cover, bathroom illustrated, payign2 ¢ letter rate to Iowa (b/s). \$125.00



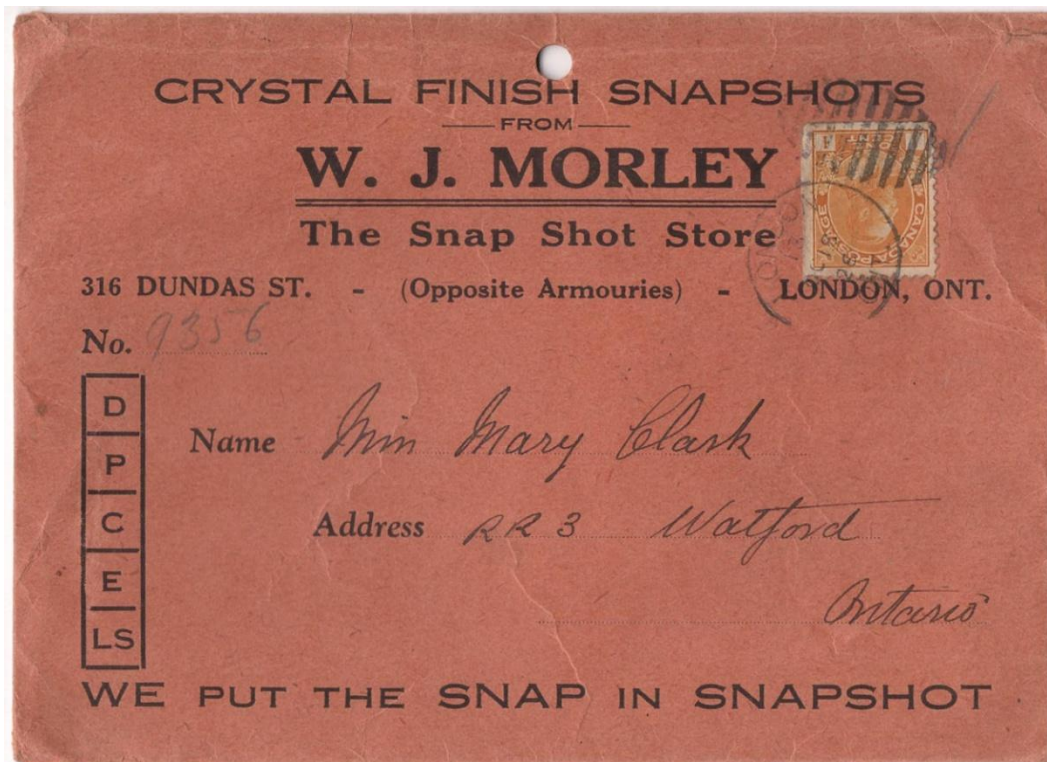
Item 640-11 – Berthier Que to Orange River Colony – 1905, 2¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on Pinsonneault postcard No.2 (Berthier, Edouard Street) paying 2¢ Empire postcard rate to Harrismith, Orange River (b/s). Redirected to Bethlehem (b/s). The card is addressed to Captain G.J. Armstrong. \$100.00



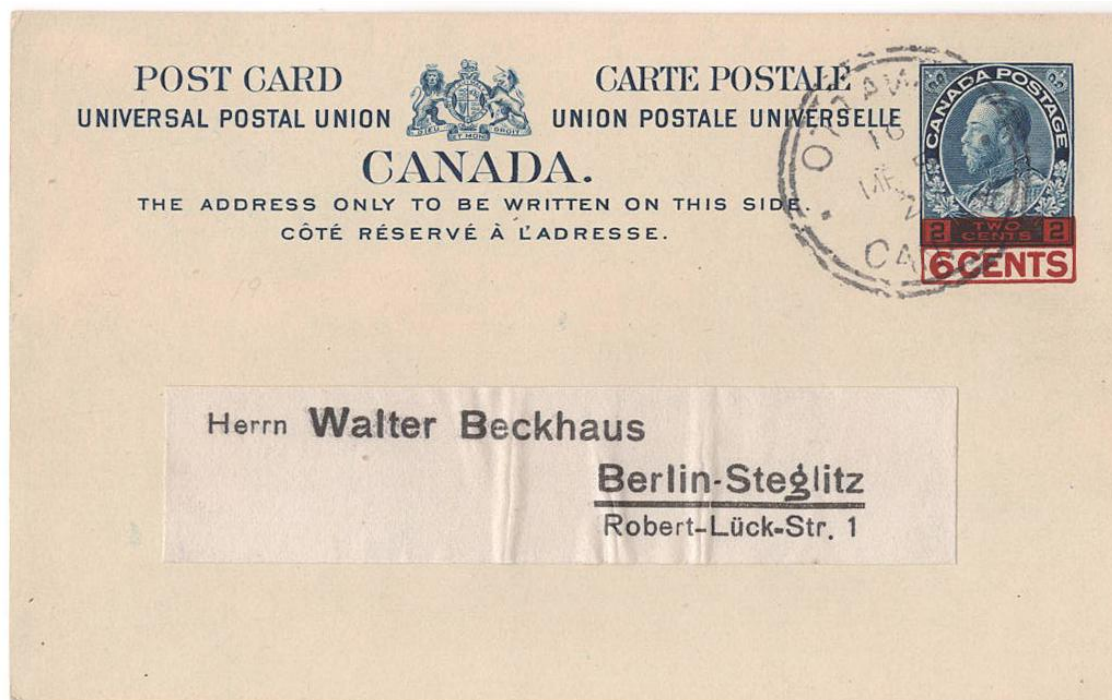
Item 640-12 – **ENX12-1 unlisted precancel** – c1926, George V postal stationery envelope with Fleetwood Wilson & Co. c/c, precancelled, revalued typographed oval issue, 2¢ on 3¢ red, 152x89, manila paper with side seams. \$150.00



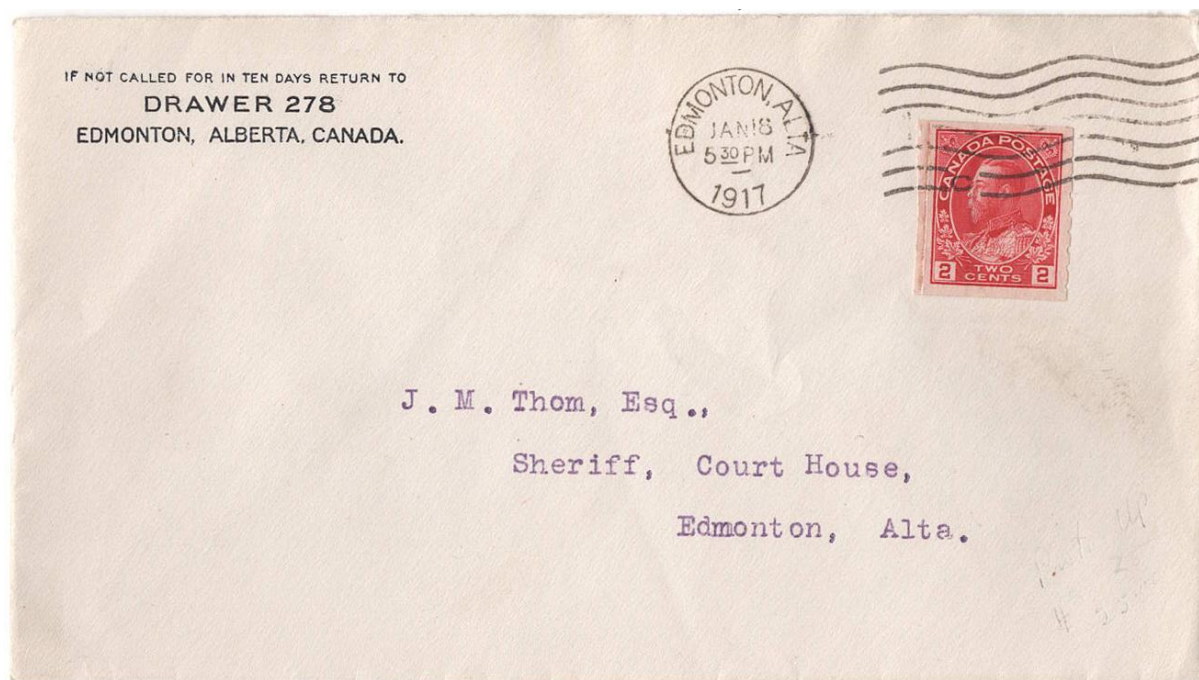

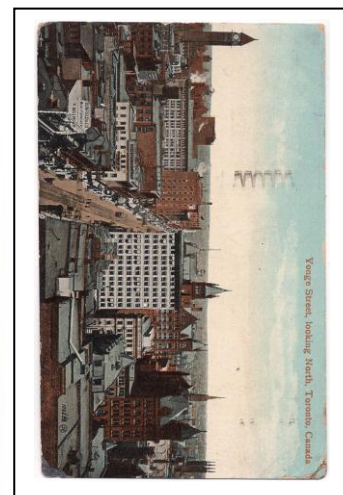
Item 640-14 – London photo shop – 1926, 1¢ Admiral tied by London Ont duplex cancel on W.J. Morley Snapshot Store photo mailer paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Watford. The 1¢ appears to be position 100 of the sheet. \$40.00



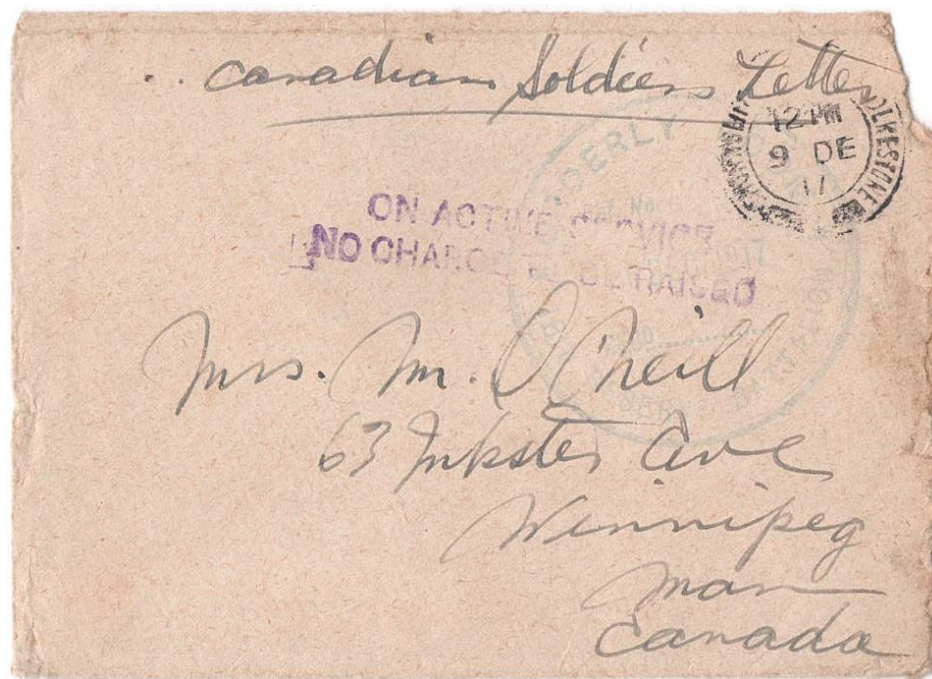
Item 640-15 – Philatelic use of Webb P83 in period – 1923, 6¢ on 2¢ blue stationery card, type 17 die B mailed from Ottawa to Germany paying 6¢ UPU postcard rate. Reverse blank. Webb cv\$550 for a non-philatelic use, in period (1921-1925). \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 640-16 – **2¢ Admiral coil paste-up single possibly position 1** – 1917, 2¢ Admiral coil paste-up single affixed by Multi-Post device tied by Edmonton International machine cancel on cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. The stamp and the remainder of the removed portion is pink in colour. This would normally signify the starter strip of a roll of 500 coils and if so this stamp is position 1 on the plate. \$60.00 **SOLD**



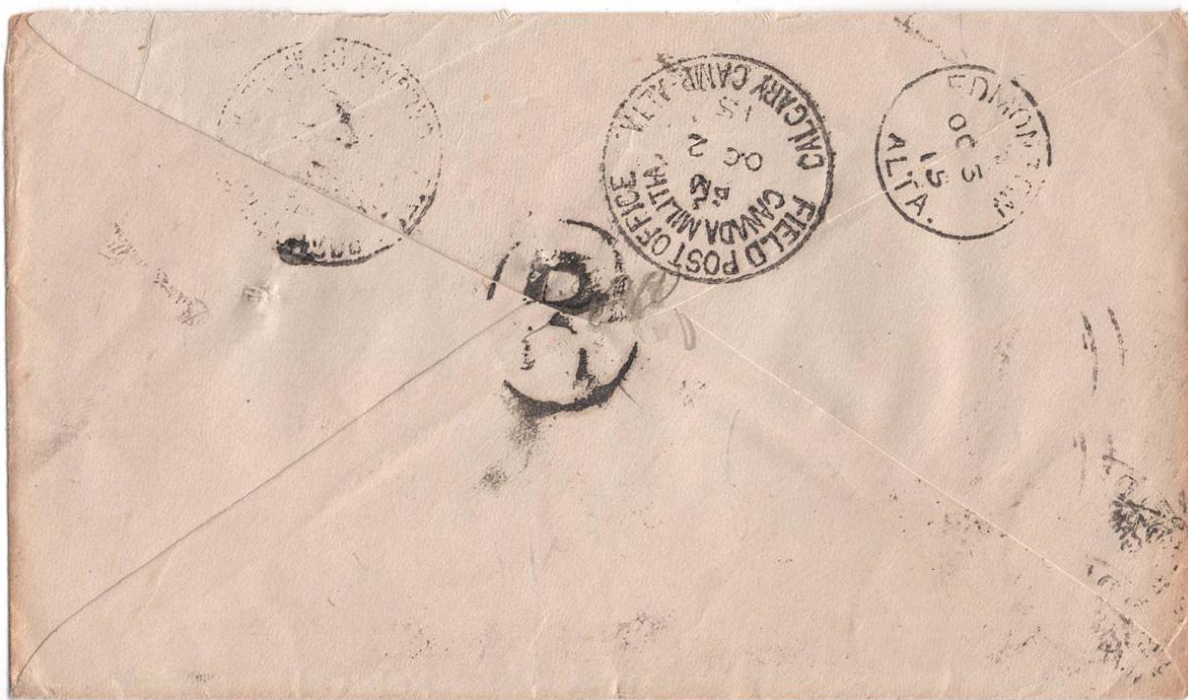
Item 640-17 – **Brockville 2¢ UPU PC rate to Russia (just before the revolution)** – 1916, 1¢ Admiral (2) tied by Brockville Show International machine cancel on postcard paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Moscow, Russia (b/s). Only a few months before the February 1917 Bolshevik Revolution and Russian Civil War. \$300.00



Item 640-18 – **"On Active Service - No charge to be raised"** – 1917, Canadian Soldier cover mailed from Shorncliffe Folkestone to Winnipeg. OR 18th Reserve Battalion marking on front. On arrival in Canada, stamped "On Active Service - No charge to be raised" in purple. This is a seldom encountered marking that I have seen similar only on Royal Navy covers. This one being Army and the first that I have acquired and handled. Furthermore, it is the domestic alternative to the 2¢ Admiral franked covers to avoid addresses being taxed. Opening tear UR. Very scarce if not rare. \$250.00



Item 640-19 – **CEF 63rd Battalion patriotic cover** – 1916, 1¢, 2¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on cover from Lestock Station Saskatchewan on CEF 63rd Battalion patriotic cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Dundalk, Ireland (b/s). Foxing. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 640-20 – Calgary Camp registered – 1915, 2¢ Admiral (4) tied by several Calgary Camp Alberta cds on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Edmonton (b/s). \$200.00 **SOLD**

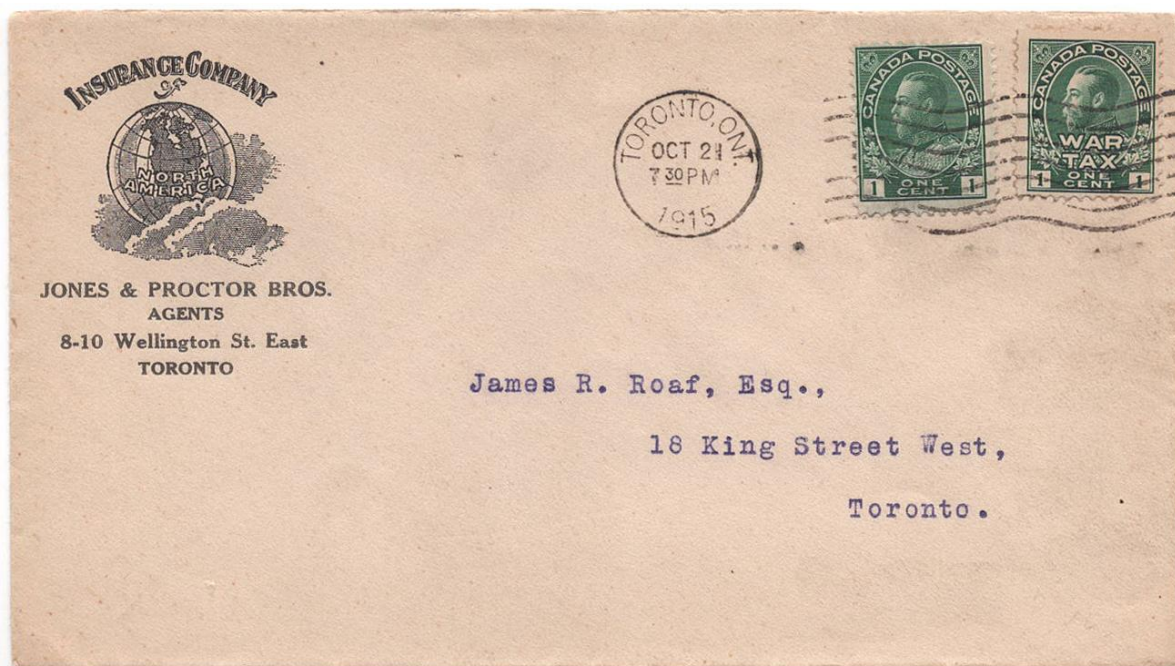

Item 640-21 – **114th Battalion in Borden en route to Halifax** – 1916, 1¢ Admiral (2) tied by Halifax & Camp RPO on YMCA private postcard paying 2¢ postcard rate to Nanticoke. The card was written en route after having left Camp Borden, on train to Nova Scotia. The 114th Battalion (Haldimand), CEF, also known as "Brock's Rangers," was an infantry battalion of the CEF. A scarce "On Train" OAS card. \$75.00 **SOLD**



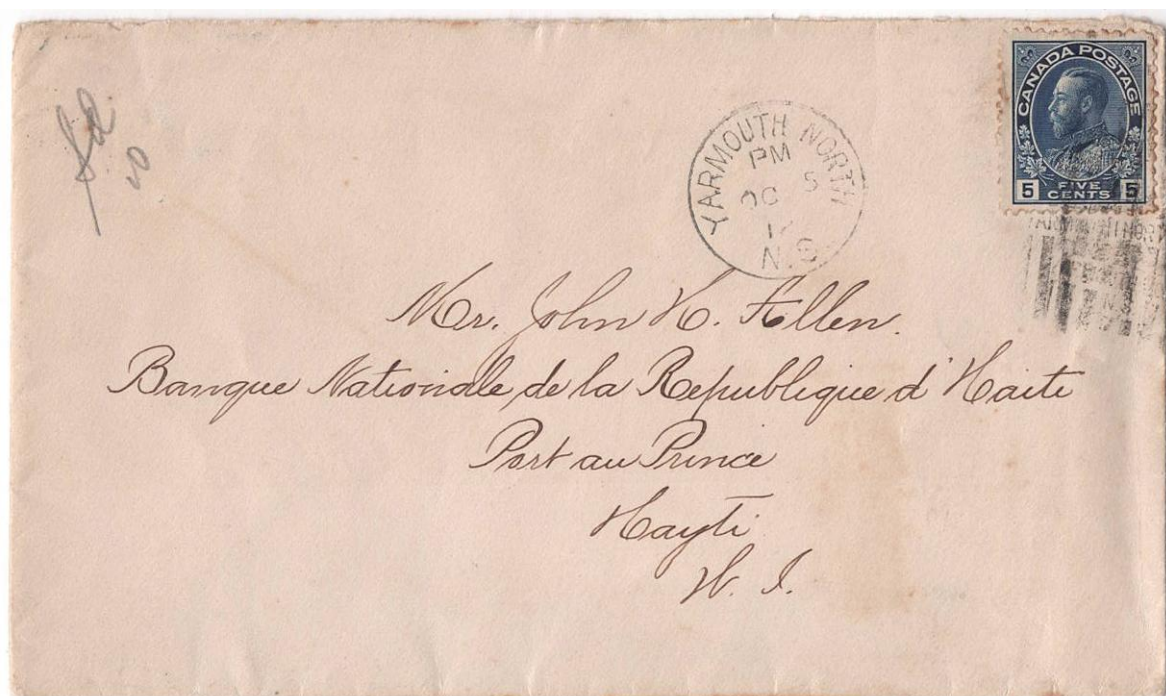
Item 640-22 – **6¢ UPU postcard to Sweden shortpaid** – 1923, 1¢ Admiral stationery card from Montreal underpaying 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Sweden. T50 postage due converted to 30 Ore. Lovely! \$150.00 **SOLD**



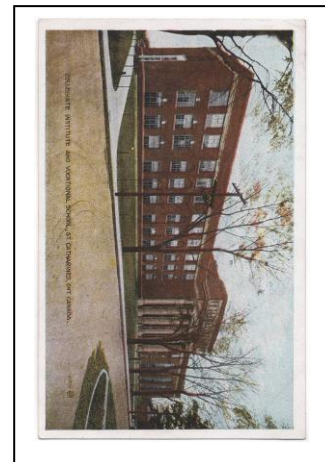
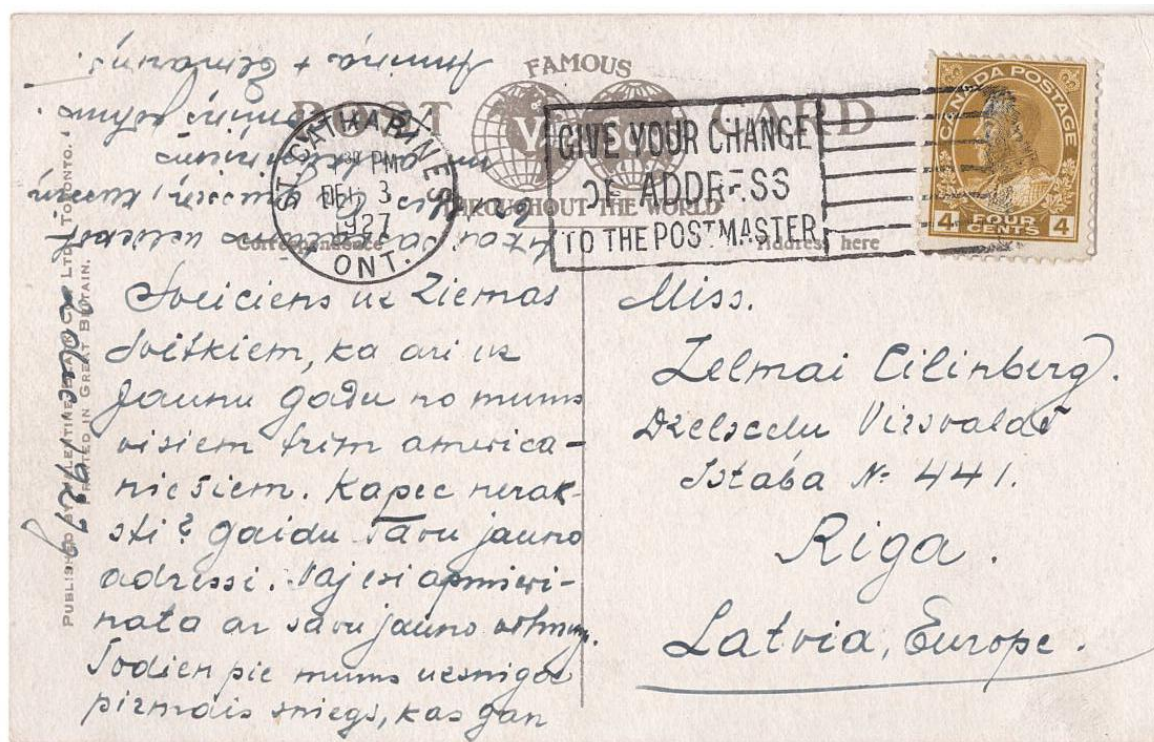
Item 640-23 – **2¢ drop letter rate with MR1 Wartax configuration** – 1915, 1¢ Admiral, 1¢ MR1 tied by Toronto machine cancel on North America Insurance Co. c/c cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. A nice clean 1915 cover showing 1¢ plus 1¢ Wartax paying drop. Prior to the beginning of Wartax, the Post Office announced that war tax to be paid, implying it had to be Wartax stamp. Then the Post Office released clarification one month later that any postage could pay it in any convenient manner. A nice little cover with the mixed configuration. \$25.00



Item 640-24 – **Montreal plumber** – 1912, 1¢ Admiral tied by Montreal Child Welfare Exhibition slogan cancel on Philemon Pagé Sanitary Plumbing advertising cover paying 1¢ drop letter rate. \$75.00



Item 640-25 – **5¢ UPU letter rate to Haiti** – 1912, 5¢ Admiral (perfs gum toned) tied by Yarmouth North NS roller cancel on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Port au Prince, Haiti (b/s). To the Republic National Bank. \$300.00



Item 640-26 – **4¢ UPU postcard rate to Riga, Latvia** – 1927, 4¢ Admiral tied by St. Catharines Ont machine cancel on college postcard paying 4¢ UPU postcard rate to Latvia. In the 1920's, Latvia was an independent country. \$150.00



Item 640-27 – **17¢ Empire registered to Hong Kong** – 1925, 3¢, 4¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Windsor Ont cds on cover paying 17¢ Empire registered letter rate to Hong Kong. Routed via Chicago (b/s). \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 640-28 – **18¢ UPU registered to Italy** – 1928, 8¢ Admiral, 5¢ McGee (2) tied by Toronto Station F cds on cover paying 18¢ UPU registered letter rate to Italy (b/s). Montreal B&F transit (b/s). A very scarce mixed issue franking with McGee. Ex Verge. \$150.00 **SOLD**

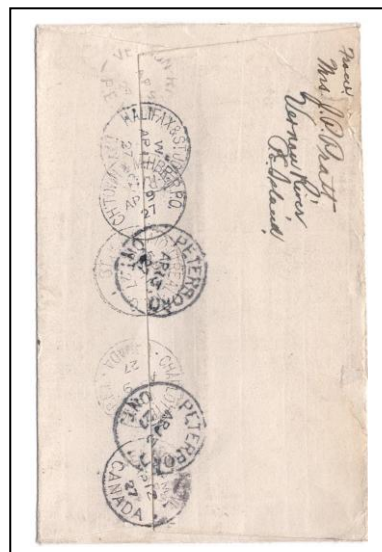

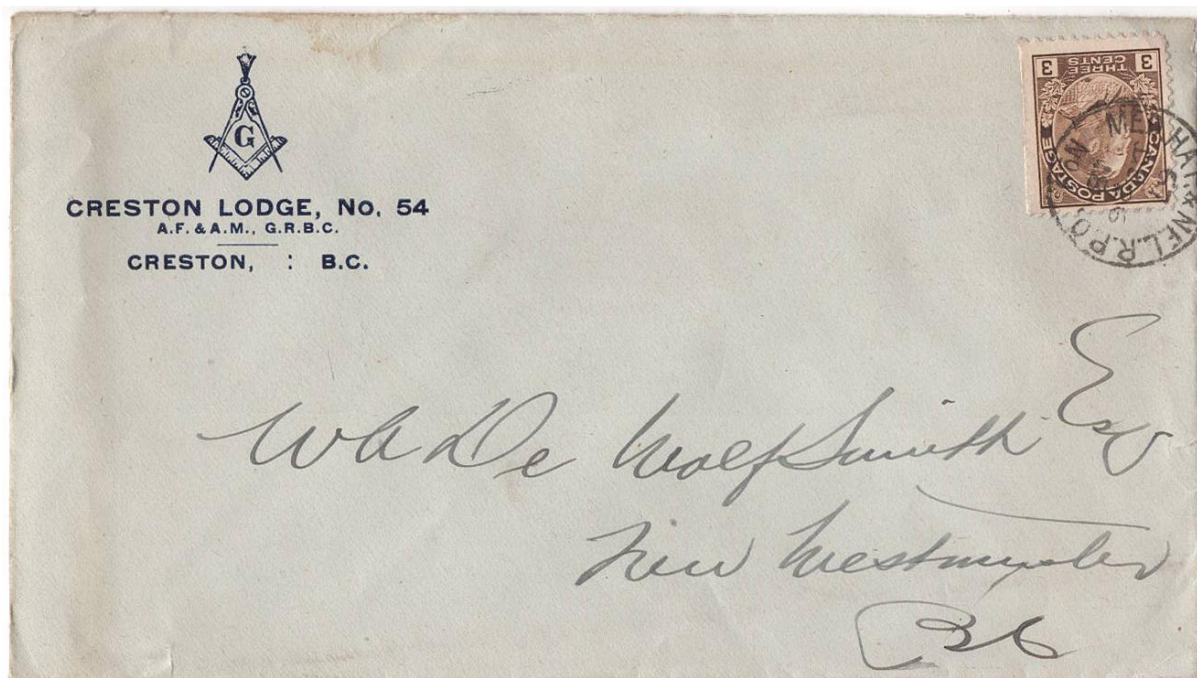

Windsor Mills return address. Isle Pont & Montreal RPO night shift (b/s). Reduced at left. \$40.00



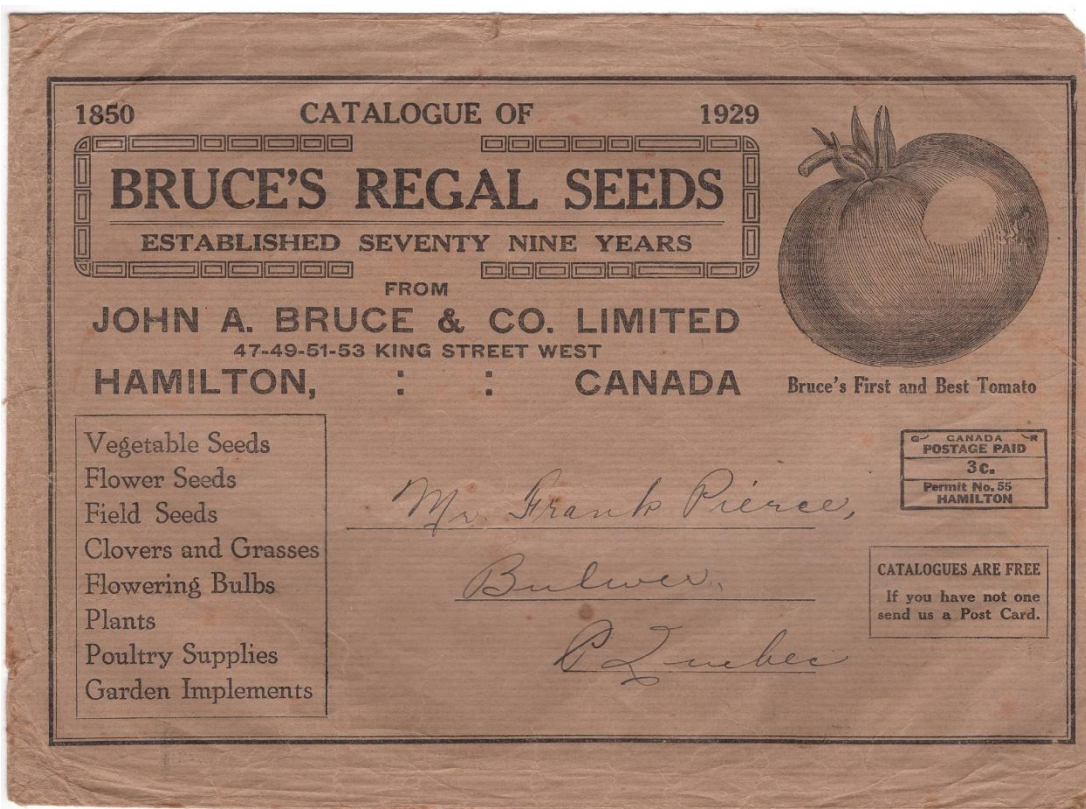
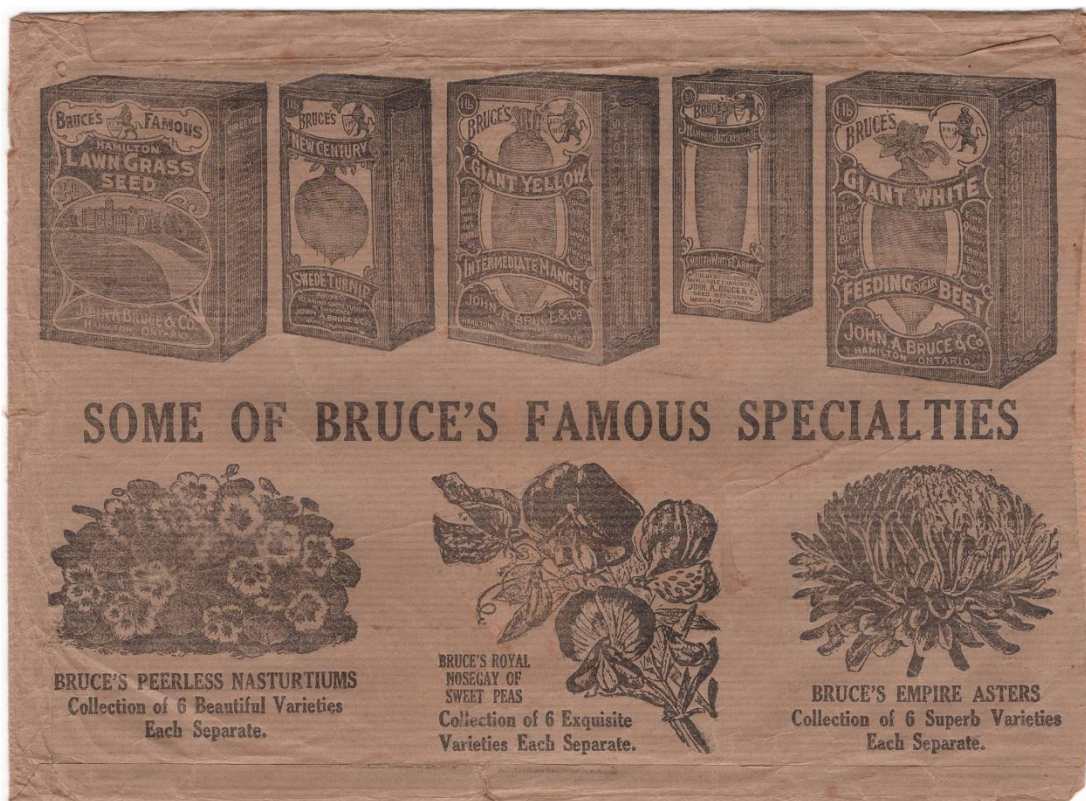
