

Item 641-01 – **Postmaster General Stayner letter** – 1832, autographed letter by Thomas Allen Stayner, Postmaster General of Upper and Lower Canada, requesting Postmaster Francis Walsh of Vittoria to reconsider resigning on his Postmastership. Walsh had recommended a successor etc. \$400.00

Dear Sir:
You are personally unknown to me
yet I address you as a friend seeing you name in
the list of Upper Canada legislators - bid you show
this to your constituents that they may see I have
still an eye to the welfare of the Province & that they
may know that my opinion is the same as ever
as to sending home a Commission to obtain full &
free enquiry into the state of the Province - both
this Canada may yet become the sweet invaluable
spot on the face of the earth - Every body here
would be glad to see you independent of your
appointed governors - Every body would be benefited
by your being as free as the people of the United States
and all may be obtained for the asking - allow

than any other individual; and that on both, the general ignorance
is deplorable.

I am now to make an offer at the risk of prolonged confinement
on the plea of insanity. It is this: let me be visited, examined, and
assisted in this house, and I shall undertake to draw out a plan, in a
few weeks, by which 50,000 people shall cheerfully remove them-
selves every year from the United Kingdom into the Colonies; and
whereby Government may have an annual payment of £500,000 by
sale of the public lands. This plan shall begin for the advantage,
as well of the Mother Country as the Colonies, next spring, and be
in full operation by the end of five years, to continue without abate-
ment, till the whole of the good land abroad is occupied. Till my
plan is fairly in operation, and found to be effectual, I shall remain
within these walls: and should I fail to make it appear practicable,
shall willingly be imprisoned for life.

My Lord, what is the national debt, but the record of millions
carried by the skill and industry of the people of this country,
washed in war and misery? Think, then, what may be earned, if,
during a period of peace and happiness, the same skill and industry
had increased room for action and was rightly stimulated! Think
of this, my Lord, while you have yet some days of the long vacation
to spend in the country, free from the stupefying effects of law, and
unconfining by the littleness of the Cabinet.

To His Most Excellent Majesty George the Fourth, Sovereign

House of Correction, Cold-bath-fields,

Sire!

This letter is written in expectation that it will be read, or
even listened to, by your Majesty. Had my former letters been sub-
mitted to, your Majesty's gracious consideration, I would not have
been here, or had occasion again to entrust, for form's sake, such a
document to the hands of a Minister. This letter is written to satisfy
my own mind, that no stone is unturned in a good cause; and that
as I have spoken boldly hitherto, I may be entitled to continue to
do so.

Bills were introduced into Parliament last session, and passed,
allowing Ministers to treat with companies for the sale of public
lands in Canada and Van Diemen's Land. Against the first of these
I protested by petition to the House of Commons, and against both
by petition to the Lords.

The law, as it now stands, permits Ministers to sell the lands; but,
up to this time, it is hoped no bargain has been concluded. It has
come to my knowledge that a value of three shillings and sixpence




Portrait located in Toronto's

Fields as a dangerous person of unsound mind,
having tapped Henry Brougham with a riding
crop in the House of Commons lobby for failing
sufficiently to advocate his cause. He chose
continued incarceration rather than give weight
to the charge of insanity by seeking bail.

Item 641-03 – **Robert Gourlay imprisoned at Coldbath Fields Prison** – 1825, folded letter datelined House of Correction Cold Bath Fields, dated NO 15 1825, autographed signed by Robert Gourlay, a prominent reformer and author. The letter includes typeset copies of letters sent by him to the British Prime Minister and to King George IV on the Upper Canada question. The letter is addressed to F.L. Walsh MPP at Vittoria via New York and Lewiston. Carried by private trader to New York, ship in red, rated 27¢ US converted to 1/7 including the unofficial ferriage fee in effect at the time, plus 7d from Queenston to Vittoria. \$1,000.00



Item 641-04 – **Political printed paper postage paid** – 1841, printed election circular from the Clerk of the Peace Office in Simcoe, Prov of Canada Secretary printed on page 2, folded and endorsed "Printed Papers" with "Paid" to Vittoria. A second printed letter with 16 signatures to support the campaign for re-election of William Wilson accompanies. "Supporters of William Wilson Esq held at Mrs Ritchie's Hotel for promoting that gentleman's return to the House of Assembly. Etc. An interesting political related Norfolk County letters, interestingly printed paper postage prepaid. \$300.00




Item 641-05 – **Woodstock UC money letter 1/10** – 1842, money folded letter from Woodstock UC rated 1/10 collect to Kingston. Endorsed “Double Only” a practice initiated by the Postmaster at London, to indicate the number of sheets comprising the mailing. It seems this practice was adopted by the Woodstock office perhaps due to its proximity. The letter contained the sum of £2.10 covering the amount of a fine imposed for the sale of spirits without a license. Exhibit quality. \$150.00




Item 641-06 – **Niagara money letter rated 4/ (triple 1/4)** – 1840, folded cover “Money Letter” from Niagara UC rated 4/0 collect paying the triple 1/4 to Montreal (Niagara to Montreal was 480 miles). A very nice strike of the so-called UK Brass Money Letter handstamp. \$200.00





Item 641-07 – **February 1837 transatlantic** – 1837, partial folded letter dated FE 2 37 from New Glasgow LC to London England. Entered the mail in Montreal and fully prepaid to New York. Paid 6d representing 4½d plus 1½d special border fee and 18¼¢ to New York. Carried by Swallowtail Line sailing packet George Washington from New York to Liverpool (b/s). 1/7 collect in London paying the 8d ship letter fee and 11d inland postage to London. British G.F. handstamp struck in red representing "General Post" (Allcock & Holland book p. 55). Manuscript in red "Brockville and William Wood New Glasgow 40 miles of Montreal" on front. On FE 22 1837, the P.O. elimination of ferriage charge was implemented, and the special border was terminated in March 1837. The letter is addressed to Andrew Reed, English Congregational minister and humnwriter, prominent philanthropist and social reformer. It relates to life in Canada from what we can read out of it. A key date with significant changes to rates and fees. Ex Palmer. \$250.00



Item 641-08 – **Mon & Kings Gd Trk R.W. Post Office No.2** – 1859, stampless cover from Angus UC (20mm, ERD by 2 years) rated 7¢ collect to Quebec via Montreal. Carried by Grand Trunk Railway with Mont & Kings Gd Trk R.W. Post Office No.2 C Down dated NO 5 59 (1859-1862) Gray QC-190 RF F. Very scarce 1859 use. \$350.00




Item 641-09 – **City of Ottawa CW Ruggles hammer B** – 1859, OHMS free franked cover from Ottawa with City of Ottawa CW indicia B handstamp to Toronto (b/s). The City of Ottawa Ruggles was used from 1857 to 1861. The indicia B was possibly used from 1859 to 1861, the second half of the period of use. A nice strike!. \$100.00




Item 641-10 – **West Williamsburg UC money letter** – 1842, customs collector money letter datelined Port of Mariatown West Williamsburg UC dated AP 15 42. Endorsed on public services and mailed from West Williamsburg UC (double circle, became Williamsburg), 1/9 collect to Kingston. Dundas County (SDG). \$200.00




Item 641-11 – **Quebec to St. Hyacinthe via William Henry** – 1843, partial folded letter from Quebec with Paid at Quebec Crown rated 9d to St. Hyacinthe via William Henry (struck on both sides). The letter is written in French and is from John Shea to Louis Turcotte. It is a very unusual route, possibly carried by steamboat to Sorel/William Henry and then overland to St. Hyacinthe. \$150.00 **SOLD**




Item 641-12 – **Dalhousie NB with Paid 3d insert** – 1853, stampless cover from Dalhousie NB with Paid marking with Paid 3d insert paying 3d letter rate to Bathurst (b/s). The cover is endorsed to William Carman (1809-1896), prominent lawyer located in Bathurst. A lovely insert dual marking. \$150.00



Item 641-13 – **St. John Gordon Forbes Solicitor** – 1866, NB 5¢ cancelled by grid cancel (perfs gum toned) on Albert Fire and Life Insurance Co. of London advertising cover, Gordon Forbes c/c, paying 5¢ letter rate to Dorchester. Saint. John Venning dater FE 3 66 (b/s). Forbes was a solicitor and an agent for the English firm of Albert Fire. His offices were located on Prince Willam St. The building was destroyed in the Great Fire. \$100.00



Item 641-14 – **Boston to Halifax by Brig Janus, Capt Wales** – 1830, business folded letter from Robinson & Tyson Co. of Boston to Halifax. Endorsed "Per Brig Janus, Capt Wales", a two-masted sailing brigantine. Rated in Halifax 2½d collect ship letter fee. \$200.00



Item 641-15 – Prime Minister Arthur Meighen speech mailed from the House – 1921, House of Commons Debates official 22-page report on Prime Minister Arthur Meighen, speech on budget, dated MY 13 1921. Mailed from the House of Common with House of Commons Canada Free rimless marking to Spencerville and to Cardinal. The cover is signed by John Dowsley Reid 1859-1929, minister of Railways and Canals and long-standing PM for Grenville South. Arthur Meighen was the 9th Prime Minister and served from 1920 to 1921 only. \$300.00



Enclosed a political pamphlet from Mowat to Northern Ontario electors with a copy typeset nomination letter signed by Wilfrid Laurier on Prime Minister's Office letterhead. Laurier lost to Robert Borden later in October. A late Laurier/Mowat mailing. \$350.00 **RED**

Or "declare," do solemnly and sincerely promise and *swear that I will faithfully perform all the duties required of me by my employment in the service of the Post Office of Canada, and will abstain from everything forbidden by the laws for the establishment and government of the Post Office Department of Canada. So HELP ME GOD.

This oath was sworn and subscribed before me the 16th day of March A.D. 1925

N.B.—The above oath should be duly taken before the person subscribing enters upon the duties of his employment.
When the oath is taken by a Postmaster or an Assistant Postmaster, the name of the Post Office should invariably be given in full, when taken by Mail Contractors or Couriers the Mail Route upon which they travel should be specified.
District Superintendents and Post Office Inspectors are empowered by law to administer this oath; but it may also be taken before a Justice of the Peace. In all cases the form is to be lodged with the District Superintendent of Postal Service.


Item 641-17 – Udora Ontario Postmaster oath form (York) – 1925, Postmaster or Assistant Postmaster oath form (10,000 28-2-23), York County Ontario, signed by Keith Umphrey possibly the son of Udora Ontario Postmaster J.N. Umphrey (PM 1908-1959) for a postal clerk assignment. A thank you letter accompanies (found with the certificate). A seldom encountered Post Office form. \$150.00




Item 641-18 – Ireland to Quebec – a very early Allan Line cover – 1856, GB 2d strip of 3, Plate 5, position AC AD AE, thick line, S.G. 34 perf 14 tied by diamond grid 303 on mourning cover from Limerick Ireland (AU 4 56) paying 6d Allan Line letter rate to Quebec (AU 23 56). Carried by a very early Allan Line vessel, the North American from Liverpool (b/s) to Quebec. 1d claim accountancy marking in red which ties the right stamp. The cover is addressed to William Downes a Special Constable working in Court Services. A real wow penny blue cover from Ireland to Lower Canada. \$1,000.00




Item 641-19 – **Waterford CW Foundry and Machine Shop** – 1869, 6¢ Large Queen tied by concentric ring cancel on Green's Foundry & Machine Shop advertising cover from Waterford CW paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to Michigan. Plow and wood stove illustrated within the promotional text of the advertisement. Owned by James Loder Green, the Waterford's Postmaster from 1842 to 1864. \$600.00



Item 641-20 – **In French Ontario and Richelieu Navigation Company** – 1877, 3¢ Small Queen (2) tied by Montreal Que duplex cancel on "La Compagnie de Navigation du Richelieu et d'Ontario" advertising cover paying 6¢ double weight letter rate to Aldershot Ont (b/s). The Richelieu Navigation Company was established by Jacques-Félix Sincennes and other Montreal businessmen. Later in the 1910's, after many merges etc etc the company became the famous Canada Steamship Lines. This is the first O&R Nav Co. cover in French that I have seen. Some hinge reinforcements. \$150.00



Item 641-21 – **Delhi Canning Company advertising** – 1897, 3¢ SQ tied by London & Canfield Jct RyPO cds on Delhi Canning Company advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Hamilton (b/s). A very pretty multi-colour food related cover. \$200.00

Item 641-22 – **Anti-Tobacco Book advertising** – 1880, 3¢ SQ tied by grid cancel on Anti-Tobacco Book advertising cover from Kelvin Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to New York. This cover relates to the publication "The sin of tobacco smoking and chewing" by the Rev. Albert Sims. Published in Toronto in 1878, printed by W. Lightfoot & Son. Kelvin was a small community on the border of Norfolk County and the County of Brant. \$250.00



Item 641-23 – **Agricultural implements registered advertising** – 1892, 3¢ SQ (fault being over the edge), 5¢ RLS tied by grid cancel on M. Moody & Sons Manufacturers of Agricultural Implements advertising cover from Terrebonne Que paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Charlottetown PEI (b/s). Montreal transit (b/s). \$250.00 **SOLD**

Item 641-25 – **25th Battalion and Lt Wright gone to Manitoba** – 1883, 3¢ SQ tied by cork cancel on J.D. McDiarmid Factory c/c cover from Aylmer Ont paying 3¢ letter rate to Wardsville. The cover is endorsed OHMS and addressed to Lieut-Col O'Malley 25th Battalion. About the cover, John McDiarmid reopened the old Weisbrod and Ferguson Hub, Spoke and Bending Factory in 1881. It was destroyed by fire in 1882. He reopened it in 1883 with David Price as a partner, but it went bankrupt in 1889. Capt Weisbrod 25th Battn letter accompanies. \$500.00


