

Duke of Connaught real photo postcards, at the opening ceremony of the Winnipeg Exhibition and with Princess Patricia at the Country Club at Winnipeg. Both unused, both published by Lyail Commercial Photo Co. Pair \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 643-02 – Raymore Saskatchewan – 1909, 1¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on Raymore Sask real photo postcard showing a farmer operating his machinery, mailed from Copeland Sask, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Neepawa. Agriculture farming machinery and equipment. \$75.00 SOLD





Item 643-03 – <u>Kelwood Manitoba</u> – c1910, two Kelwood Manitoba street view real photo postcards, both unused on Solio paper. Mountain Avenue card with wagons and carriages etc and the Main Street with men, kids and ladies posing in front of a paint shop etc. Main Street card UL corner crease. Pair \$125.00



Item 643-04 – <u>Yorkton Saskatchewan</u> – 1907, Prairie Schooners from Nebraska on Broadway at Yorkton Saskatchewan real photo postcard, in front of Collacott's Hardware. Unused, on Velox paper. \$75.00



Item 643-05 – <u>Strathburn Ont Post Office and General Store</u> – c1905, Strathburn Ont D.H. McRae General Store and Post Office real photo postcard. Photo by Hadden on AZO paper. The card is showing McRae and his daughter posing in front of his store etc. McRae was the Postmaster from 1891 to 1914 until its closing. A rare Middlesex County postcard. \$150.00 SOLD







Item 643-06 – <u>Norfolk County tobacco field postcards</u> – 1940-1950, trio of tobacco field real photo postcard, Norfolk County Ontario: inspecting, harvesting etc. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 643-07 – <u>Guelph uniformed letter carrier brigade</u> – 1915, Guelph Ontario letter carrier brigade real photo postcard, in uniform with GPO cap badge and collar etc mailed from Guelph to Whiby. Stamp torn. A rare postcard published by Fleming Photo of Toronto. \$200.00





Item 643-08 – 12¢ Inman Line - steamer City of Washington – 1871, Newfoundland 12¢ Victoria (2<sup>nd</sup> printing) cancelled by grid cancel on cover from Greenspond Newfoundland (Bonavista Bay) paying 12¢ Inman Line letter rate to England (b/s). Carried overland by GNMR postal courier to St. John's (b/s) then by the steamer City of Halifax and then by the City of Washington leaving Halifax AP 7 71 to Queenstown AP 15 71. 33 days in transit from St. John's. The overland route branched off near Middlebrook, Freshwater Bay for an approximate 30-mile route to Greenspond on Bonavista Bay. \$350.00





Item 643-09 – 2¢ Seamen's letter rate to England – 1898, Newfoundland 2¢ Royal Family tied by fancy cancel on cover from Bay Islands Nfld, dated OC 17 98, paying 2¢ Seamen's letter rate to England (b/s). Carried by rail from the west coast of Newfoundland reverse with N.N. & W. Railway TPO (b/s), to St. John's for onward transit by Allan Line steamer Acadian. The letter is from J.T. Corsam, Petty Officier First Class, aboard HMS Pelican, St. George's Bay while on Royal Navy fisheries patrol on the French Shore (the west coast of NFLD) Initialed by the ship's Commanding Officer. NCO, soldiers and seamen while employed in HM service were entitled from 1875 to send and receive mail at the rate of 1d or 2¢ per letter. In 1891, NFLD stamps were authorized for use on this type of mail. Belongings and signature to be specified and signed. Soldier's and sailor's letters are very rare when posted from Newfoundland. Only 5 covers with Newfoundland stamp are recorded, only 2 are related to HMS Pelican. \$4,000.00





Item 643-10 – <u>Double Interprovincial rate Quebec to Halifax</u> – 1836, folded letter on mourning paper from Quebec dated SP 27 36 rated 3/4 prepaying the double Interprovicial rate to Halifax. 1/8 for 600–700-mile distance. The letter is the last page only of the entire. It relates to relatives being in Chicago "The Far West", land speculation, ladies in Boston and more ladies living in splendid mansion and being quite aristocratic. Found disgusting and mortifying on government choices and a few words on British feeling indefensible. At the end, he was told that a Rebellion is in the march. A rare prepaid 1830's interprovincial letter. \$300.00 SOLD



Item 643-11 – New Ireland LC to Harvey Hill Mines CE (Megantic County) – 1864, stampless cover from New Ireland LC paid 5 to Harvey Hill Mines CE via Quebec, Leeds and Somerset (b/s). Harvey Hill Mines is an exceedingly rare office, in operation from 1860 to 1892, this Berri hammer C.E. is recorded from 1862 to 1865 only. Interestingly, the Harvey Hill Mines Que hammer is only known as a proof (1888). Tear visible on front, average condition, but a rare Megantic cover. \$250.00 SOLD





Boxed Registered handstamp. Pontiac County. Very scarce. \$250.00 SOLD





Item 643-13 – Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year – 1870, 6¢ Large Queen tied by Montreal CE Berri duplex cancel on cover, with a Christmas gilded card and Merry Christmas bird illustrated cinderella, paying 6¢ cross border letter rate to New York. Back flap fault. Ex Shorting. \$250.00

Item 643-24 – <u>The only recorded London Ontario 33<sup>rd</sup> Regiment handstamp</u> – 1910, 1¢ Edward tied by Niagara Camp cds on postcard, JU 14 10, paying 1¢ postcard rate to London. The card is addressed to Lt Roy Bundle, 33<sup>rd</sup> Regiment, London Camp. This is the only recorded Orderly Room 33<sup>rd</sup> Regiment oval handstamp. In a simplified way, the OR is a room in barracks occupied by the Adjutant, the clerks, chief clerk and sometimes the deputy commander. This is also where the records and archives are etc. An exhibit piece! \$500.00

Crease. From MY 1 23, it was no longer a requirement to postage affixed to each and every unaddressed circular which qualified for delivery to boxholders, to box at Post Office or on rural route. Item 643-43 – RCAF Camp Borden registered – 1937, 5¢, 8¢ Mufti tied by grid cancel on RCAF cover from Camp Borden Ont paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Edmonton (b/s). Routed via Toronto with Hamilton & Meaford RPO No.3, Calgary & Edmonton RPO No.8. A scarce 8¢ Mufti use. \$75.00





Item 643-44 – **75¢ airmail letter rate to Philippine Islands** – 1938, 1¢ Mufti, 6¢ Airmail C6 block of 4, 50¢ Pictorial of 1938 tied by Schomberg Ont cds on cover paying 75¢ airmail letter rate to Manila, Philippine Islands (b/s). Carried transcontinental by air and transpacific by China Clipper from San Francisco. \$200.00



Item 643-45 – Montreal airmail to passenger on ship in Kenya – 1939, 6¢ Airmail C6 tied by Montreal Place d'Armes duplex cancel on cover paying all-up 6¢ airmail letter rate to Mombasa, British East Africa (Kenya). Endorsed via S.S. Ile de France. It is addressed to a passenger onboard S.S. Columbus Deutsche Ost-Afrika Line. Rough opening at top. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 643-46 – **5¢ UPU letter rate to Belgium** – 1939, 1¢ Royal Visit, 4¢ Mufti tied by Montreal machine cancel on censored cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Belgium. Odd franking with Royal Visit and 4¢ Mufti. \$25.00




Item 643-47 – General Vanier PC DSO MC CD – 1939, 10¢, 20¢ Pictorial tied by Montreal Place d'Armes duplex cancel on cover to George Vanier (serving as Ambassador) paying 30 cents airmail rate to France. Oval Canadian Legation Sept 5, 1939, receiver on front. General Vanier was a Vandoo officer. Later, he served as the 19<sup>th</sup> Governor General of Canada (1959-1967). This cover is very interesting as it was sent Aug 28, 1939 (before the war). GB declared war on Germany on Sept 3 and as a colony Canada was therefore at war too. Canada officially declared war itself on Sept 10. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 643-48 – <u>3¢ Empire to Jerusalem</u> – 1940, 3¢ Mufti tied by Montreal Rosemont Postal Station duplex cancel on charity reply cover paying 3¢ Empire letter rate to Jerusalem. Filling holes at left. \$75.00



Item 623-49 – **To North China, Mail Service Suspended** – 1941, 5¢ Mufti tied by St. John Enlist Now flag cancel on censored cover, "There'll Always Be An England" patriotic cinderella, paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to North China. Amazingly routed via Tiverton Nova Scotia (b/s NO 25 41). Mail Service Suspended and returned to sender. \$200.00



Item 643-50 – <u>Radio licence renewal card and reminder notice</u> – 1942-3, Deputy Minister of Transport radio licence renewal card from Ottawa to Coleraine Station PQ (Megantic County) along with the reminder notice card 1943. The issuance of the licences is managed by a house-to-house organization. Pair. \$15.00 **SOLD**


