



Item 646-01 – <u>PEI No.5 sheet MNH with position 54 TWC</u> – 1862-5, PEI 2¢ Victoria sheet of 60, MNH, intact selvedge all around, hand applied gum, some gum disturbed and light adherence. Interestingly, the sheet is showing No.5f TWC instead of TWO position 54. A lovely and somewhat fresh, late printing. Light toning and foxing on selvage, small paper adherence UL. \$500.00 **SOLD**







Item 646-02 – Keenansville Ont private order postmark (Simcoe) – 1879, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Keenansville Ont with private order postmark struck in blue paying 1¢ postcard rate to Barrie. Recorded from 1879 to 1881 only. Reverse with Cardwell Sentinel Office Editor c/c. Very scarce. \$125.00 SOLD



Item 646-03 – Toronto unofficial duplex DUN-127 (2 recorded ERD strikes) – 1880, 1¢ SQ tied by Toronto unofficial duplex cancel, "Toronto" in the obliterator, Cloutier DUN-127 dated MY 24 80, paying 1¢ drop letter rate. Reverse with letter carrier cds (b/s). This is a very scarce postmark recorded from MY 24 80 to JU 23 80. This one here is of the two reported examples of the earliest recorded date (MY 24 80). \$200.00 SOLD



Item 646-04 – <u>Simcoe Ont Marble and Granite Dealers</u> – 1893, 3¢ SQ tied by fancy cancel (Lacelle 1163) on T.R. Atkinson & Co. cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Brantford (b/s). The Atkinson Marble Works had its origin in the Gore Marble and Granite Works. Founded on the corner of Young and Colborne Streets around 1888. It was owned by Colonel Thomas Atkinson who was also Mayor of Simcoe 1895-6, but the business was run by his nephew. Upon his death in 1922, the company was purchased and run by P.O. Austin. A rare cover with a grave illustrated. \$150.00





Item 646-05 – <u>Hamilton & North Western Railway</u> – 1878, 1¢ stationery card from Vittoria to Hamilton via Simcoe (b/s) and delivered by letter carrier (b/s). Carried by Hamilton & Northwestern Railway (Ham & Nor – Wstn R.R., RY-90, 1878-1888, RF D). \$50.00







Item $646-06 - \underline{\text{Brantford Victoria Foundry}} - 1880$, 1¢ stationery card from Brantford Ont paying 1¢ postcard rate to Oakville (b/s). Reverse with Detroit Stove illustrated and Victoria Foundry. \$60.00



Item 646-07 – **2¢ Jubilee strip of 4 - Marine and Fisheries** – 1898, 2¢ Jubilee vertical strip of 4 tied by Quebec Canada cds on Marine and Fisheries Dept cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Three Rivers (b/s).\$200.00



Item 646-08 – <u>3¢ Jubilee – Thomson Tailoring</u> – 1897, 3¢ Jubilee tied by Brantford squared circle on Thomson Tailoring advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Paris. \$125.00




Item 646-09 – <u>Hamilton Pork Packers</u> – 1900, 2¢ Numeral tied by Hamilton Bickerdike machine cancel on F.W. Fearman & Co. Pork Packers advertising cover to Moncton (b/s). \$50.00




Item 646-10 – <u>Canadian Express Company</u> – 1901, Canadian Express Company advertising on 1¢ stationery card mailed in Hamilton, Bickerdike machine JUL 8 13-0 01 to local. Reverse with in bond and freight notice \$25.00



Item 646-11 – <u>E1 – Uphill Ont Postmaster special delivery</u> – 1900, E1 10¢ Special Delivery tied by Uphill Ont cds on 2¢ postal stationery envelope, John McRae General Store c/c (<u>and Postmaster from 1897 to 1910</u>), paying 12¢ special delivery letter rate to Toronto (b/s). 1900 and pre-1900 uses of the E1 stamp are scarce to rare. \$300.00



Item 646-12 – <u>Pictou NS Biscuits and Confectionery</u> – 1903, 2¢ Numeral tied by Pictou NS duplex cancel on G.J. Hamilton & Sons Biscuits and Confectionery advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Mahone Bay (b/s). Cream Soda, Biscuits etc. \$40.00





Item 646-13 –P15 - Toronto 2¢ UPU to Scotland – 1898, 2¢ UPU stationery card reverse with William Briggs c/c, Webb P15, mailed from Toronto AP 6 98 paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Scotland (b/s). A perfect Toronto Bickerdike and Edinburgh receiver. \$60.00



This postcard shows the "Exercise of the SOKOLS in Canada. The SOKOLS were members of an exercise/nationalistic organization of SOKOL (Hawk), which was founded in the second half of the 19th century guiding with the "A healthy principle, mind in a healthy body." Such exercises, usually accompanied by special music composed for the occasion, were performed in Prague once every few years, with thousands

Item 646-14 – <u>Amherst NS Czech Contingent returning home</u> – c1917, Amherst Internment Camp Nova Scotia No.45 RPPC, the text on the card says "POW", but in fact the soldiers depicted were part of the Czech Contingent returning home after service in Russia. They stopped over at Amherst on their way across Canada (See the CMMSG Anthology II, page 76). Written but not posted. \$100.00 SOLD




Item 646-15 – <u>Kingsmill Ont J.E. Grandy Store and Post Office</u> – c1910, Kingsmill Ontario Grandy's Store and Post Office real photo postcard. Unused with reverse showing Bill Graham ownership handstamp. J.E. Grandy was the Postmaster from 1910 to 1928 starting when he took over as owner in October 1910. A tough Elgin County postcard!!! \$100.00 **SOLD**





Item 646-16 – Giroux Lake Ont (TSK, 1906-1927) – 1907, 2¢ Edward booklet stamp tied by grid cancel on Temiskaming mining scene real photo postcard, mailed from Giroux Lake Ont, paying 2¢ UPU postcard to Belgium (b/s). The message is written in Flemish but reads in part and confirms: "Cobalt Central Mine Giroux Lake". \$75.00 SOLD



Item 646-17 – Munson Bicycles private postcard – 1905, 1¢ Edward tied by Toronto machine cancel on Munson Bicycles private postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to Hamilton. \$45.00





Item 646-18 – <u>Sturgeon Lake Ont (Kawartha Lakes region)</u> – 1921, 1¢ Admiral (both faulty) tied by Lindsay Ont machine cancel on Greenhurst Grocery Store of Sturgeon Lake real photo postcard to Lakefield. The message is datelined Greenhurst Aug 12th. Rare. \$75.00

Pte Davies, 1054739, B Company 244th Battalion (Kitchener's Own). The first such CEF printed postcard that I have seen. \$75.00 **SOLD**




Item 646-20 – <u>McCormick Manufacturing Company</u> – 1920, 2¢ Admiral tied by Montreal machine cancel on London McCormick Mfg Co. advertising private postcard paying 2¢ PC rate to St. Polycarpe. Rouletted. Candy and cookie factory. \$150.00





Item 646-21 – <u>HMS Dreadnought - the revolutionary warship</u> – 1913, 1¢ Admiral tied by Brockville machine cancel on Prudential Insurance postcard, showing HMS Dreadnought the revolutionary warship, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Lansdowne. \$45.00






Item 646-22 – MR7 coil on Massey Harris fold-out – 1917, 2¢+1¢ Wartax coil MR7 tied by Toronto flag cancel, type 23-11, on Massey Harris advertising fold-out paying 3¢ letter rate to Nixon. Staining at right. MR7 stamp on covers are relatively rare! \$75.00 SOLD





Item 646-23 – <u>CNR and Lithography Company beach advertising</u> – 1920, 2¢ Admiral tied by Winnipeg machine cancel on Bulman Bros Lithographers, Canadian National Railways, Grand Beach and picnic park advertising cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. \$200.00







Item 646-24 – **2¢ Customs Duty** – c1933, US 1½¢ New York precancel on dentist supply company postcard to Dr. Cowan, Hamilton Ontario. 2¢ Customs Duty stamp applied in Toronto or Hamilton, tied by National Revenue cds. Duty stamps were applied to printed advertising matter. \$50.00



Item 646-25 – John Deere cameo illustrated – 1914, 2¢ Admiral tied by Welland Ont duplex cancel on Dain Mfg Co. and John Deere advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to New York. \$45.00



Item 646-26 – <u>Port Dover White Wyandottes</u> – 1912, 1¢ Admiral pair tied by Pt Dover & Hamilton RyPO cds on John Martin Breeder of White Wyandottes advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Maine. \$85.00







Item 646-27 – Simcoe Ont – The Norfolk House – 1913, 2¢ Admiral tied by Simcoe Ont duplex cancel on Norfolk House advertising cover with letter paying 2¢ letter rate to Smithville (b/s). Letter with matching handwriting accompanies. The original Norfolk House was destroyed by fire in 1863, rebuilt and opened in 1865. George Battersby (see the letterhead) was the proprietor until 1876. Fire again struck the building in 1909 when the opera house was attached. The opera house was then eliminated in the ensuing restoration. Then, I. Whitehead became the owner. Finally lost again to fire in 1957. \$65.00






Item 646-28 – <u>Japanese rice paper illustrated cover with letterhead</u> – 1917, 3¢ Confederation tied by Petrolia Ont duplex cancel on rice paper illustrated cover with letter paying 3¢ letter rate to Strathroy. A lovely cover and letterhead depicting pretty images of Japanese women in traditional attire and kimono. Crackling paper, separations and fragile. \$200.00 **SOLD**





Item 646-29 – <u>S.S. Tutshi four-fold menu mailed at postcard rate</u> – 1931, 2¢ Arch tied by grid cancel on S.S. Tutshi four-fold menu, in a postcard form, mailed from Carcross Yukon paying 2¢ postcard rate to New York. The S.S. Tutshi was on the White Pass and Yukon Route. A very unusual item. \$75.00



Item 646-30 – Rotary mimeograph illustrated – 1932, 3¢ Ottawa Conference tied by Winnipeg Labour Day machine cancel on Richardson & Bishop Stationers advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. Rotary mimeograph illustrated. \$60.00



Item 646-31 – <u>Brantford Re-Union and Convention</u> – 1937, 1¢ Pictorial tied by Brantford machine cancel on Ex-Imperials Re-Union and Convention advertising cover paying 1¢ printed matter rate to local. Troops marching, warships, aircrafts illustrated. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 646-34 – **50¢ Pictorial single to Colombia** – 1937, 50¢ Pictorial tied by Toronto machine cancel on cover paying 50¢ airmail letter rate to Colombia (b/s). \$60.00





Item 646-35 – RCAF – Deceased – 1942, 3¢ Mufti tied by Nanaimo BC machine cancel on cover to Pte R.A. Roy B74556, RCAF, stationed in Camp Borden Ontario. Return address Sgt Thompson 1st Irish Fusilier V.R. Camp Nanaimo (The Vancouver Regiment). At Borden, manuscript "Unknown in RCAF". Redirected overseas to FPO SC.10 (38mm postmark in black) and ends in "Deceased" label. Returned to Nanaimo via the Base Post Office Canada in Ottawa. \$150.00 SOLD





Item 646-36 – Stormont Dundas & Glengarry Highlanders – Deceased – 1944, 3¢ War tied by Ottawa machine cancel on cover to Lt J. Hartley, 49 Company, 10 Canadian Base Reinforcement Unit CAO, stationed in England. Lt Hartley was from the SD&G Regiment. Return address in Cornwall Mrs. Hartley. Regret handstamp and large "Deceased" marking blacked possibly by family. Hartley was killed in action AU 17 44 but first reported missing. Returned via Ottawa MPO 318 (b/s). \$100.00 SOLD





Item 646-37 – Stormont Dundas & Glengarry Highlanders – Deceased – 1944, 3¢ War tied by Ottawa machine cancel on cover to Lt J. Hartley, 49 Company, 10 Canadian Base Reinforcement Unit CAO, stationed in England. Lt Hartley was from the SD&G Regiment. Return address in Cornwall Mrs. Hartley. Regret handstamp and clean "Deceased" marking in red. Hartley was killed in action AU 17 44 but first reported missing. Returned via Ottawa MPO 318 (b/s). \$200.00 SOLD






Item 646-38 – **Jean Brillant PQ airmail letter – Reported POW** – 1944, 10¢ War tied by Jean Brillant PQ cds on airmail letter, written in English, paying 10¢ airmail rate to Lt A.R. Royall serving with the BEF (FPO 788 b/s). Reported Prisoner of War with the very scarce "It is regretted that this item could not be delivered because the addressee is reported Prisoner of War". Army Post Office in grid struck in purple (b/s). Returned to sender (receiver on front). \$300.00 **SOLD**


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
Item 646-39 – <u>POW 133 Lethbridge with transcript</u> – 1945, family folded letter from German Army Pte Helmut, POW in Lethbridge Alberta Camp 133 to Rochester, NY. Censored by DB 377. Transcript in English accompanies. It reads in part: thank you for questioning the Red Cross about forwarding parcels to me. I hope you get permission very soon because I need the articles. I'd like to be with you but I'm still Prisoner of War. I should stay with your family forever; my native country is now occupied... \$60.00




Item 646-40 – <u>Short-lived experiment postage due meter</u> – 1946, Brantford Ontario postcard mailed unpaid to Toronto. Caught and charged 6¢ the double deficiency. Paid in Toronto with the short-lived experiment postage due NCR meter tape. National Cash Register. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 646-41 – <u>Dated ENX41-3 precancelled plus meter</u> – 1951, Toronto 1¢ meter on 1¢ precancel 4530 stationery envelope, Webb ENX41-3, Catholic Church private order, paying 2¢ printed matter rate to Montreal. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 646-42 – <u>American Icebreaker - commercial cover from Alert NWT</u> – 1952, 5¢ Postes Postage tied by grid cancel on cover from Alert NWT overpaying 4¢ letter rate to Florida. Possibly a lack a 4¢ stamps out there. Return address Lt Gifford, USCGC Eastwind. The USCGC Eastwind was a Wind-class icebreaker of the United States Coast Guard. Decommissioned in 1968. A rare commercial cover from Alert. A real piece of mail. \$250.00 SOLD



Item 646-43 – Official cover from Alert NWT – 1952, 4¢ Postes Postage OHMS overprinted tied Alert NWT cds on Dept of Transport cover paying 4¢ letter rate to Toronto. Addressed to the controller of the Meteorological Services. A rare Official cover from Alert. Another real piece of mail from Alert. \$175.00 SOLD
