Item 654-01 – <u>Double Paid at Quebec Crown</u> – 1846, folded letter from the Bank of Montreal in Quebec to New York, bearing two clean double "Paid at Quebec" Crown handstamps, paid 11½d and 10¢ to fully cover Canadian and U.S. postage. Scarce and nice, making an excellent candidate for display. \$200.00.



Item 654-02 – <u>Eaton CE (Compton County)</u> – 1851, stampless folded cover from Eaton CE to Montreal, paid 9d with two well-struck markings. Mailed just two months before the British Post Office relinquished control of Canada's postal system. An interesting Eastern Twp cover. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 654-03 – <u>Huntingdon LC registered</u> – 1862, stampless registered cover from Huntingdon LC to Quebec (b/s), paid 5¢ for postage with 2¢ registry fee paid in cash. Routed via Montreal and notably backstamped with the rare Montreal Ruggles handstamp struck in black, a marking typically associated with delayed or advertised, unclaimed mail. In over 25 years, I've recorded only four examples of this scarce postmark. The black staining around the red markings results from oil in the ink mixture. A rare and characterful Quebec registered cover. \$200.00




Item 654-04 – Montreal money letter to Martintown UC (SDG) – 1846, folded "Money Letter" without content from Montreal, paid 7d, to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Concession Roxborough, Martintown near Cornwall (b/s). Some staining is present, and the back appears refolded, but the cover retains its charm and character. A scarce and appealing example of early money letter usage to a rural Canada destination. \$100.00



Item 654-05 – Quebec LC money letter – 1842, folded "Money Letter" without content from Quebec LC, rated 3/6 collect representing triple the 1/2 rate, to Kingston. Features a clean and straight "Money Letter" strike. Docketing notes indicate the payment enclosed was from Peter Patterson for logs cut in 1842 for the Crown Land Department. \$100.00 SOLD






Item 654-06 – <u>Sandwich UC 1829 usage (the actual ERD)</u> – 1829, folded H.M.S. "*Money Letter*" without content from Sandwich UC, rated 2/9 representing triple 9d, to York. Endorsed Her Majesty's Service, with docketing notes indicating the enclosed sum was for an Ale and Beer license fee. The reverse bears a clear Sandwich postmark dated JY 20 29 and notably, this strike represents the earliest recorded date for this 1829-type marking for Sandwich. An exceptional and historically significant letter of great interest to collectors of Essex County and the Western District. \$400.00



Item 654-07 – <u>Cross Point LC to Paspebiac CE</u> – 1871, stampless cover with letter from Cross Point, L.C., rated 3¢ prepaid, to Paspebiac (b/s). The letter, written by Mary Ann Fraser to her father, is primarily family-related but includes a brief mention of the Bay of Chaleur steamer operating between Cross Point and Dalhousie. \$75.00 **SOLD** 



Item 654-08 – <u>Sabrevois CE – mailed at St. Jean to New York</u> – 1868, 4-page family letter datelined Sabrevois FE 9 68, mailed from St. Johns, C.E. to New York. Rated 10¢ to pay the cross-border letter rate, with red "Canada—10—Cents" exchange marking. A late Decimal-era cover. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>

Item 654-09 – England to Cobourg UC via Halifax and Quebec – 1836, family folded letter from Lincolnshire, England to Cobourg, U.C., carried by the *Opossum*, the December Falmouth Packet to Halifax, then forwarded via Quebec. Rated 2/2 Stg, converted in Halifax to 2/5 Currency, plus 1/8 to Quebec and 11d to Cobourg, totaling 5/ collect. The letter concerns the Forster/Boulton estate. \$200.00




Item 654-10 – <u>Cambria Maiden Voyage, quadruple rate to Quebec</u> – 1845, timber trade folded letter dated JA 4 45 from Liverpool to Quebec. Carried by Cunard Cambria from Liverpool to Halifax and Boston on her maiden voyage. Rated 4/8 Stg, converted to 5/2½ Currency collect. The Cambria served from 1845 to 1856 before being sold to an Italian businessman. Maiden voyage letters are exceptionally scarce, especially at such a high rate. \$250.00



Item  $654-11 - \underline{\text{Liverpool to Montreal}} - 1819$ , business folded letter from Liverpool to Montreal, carried by private trader to New York. Rated as an incoming ship letter at 20%¢, representing 2¢ ship fee plus 18%¢ U.S. postage to the border. From the border to Montreal at 4%d, for a total of 1N7 collect. \$100.00



Item 654-12 – Scotland to Quebec via New York Black Ball Line – 1832, merchant's four-page letter from Arbroath, Scotland to Quebec, with Aberbrothwick backstamp. Carried by Black Ball Line American packet Canada, which departed Liverpool on April 1 and arrived in New York on May 1, a full month's transatlantic voyage. Forwarded by closed bag to Montreal. Endorsed "per first packet from Liverpool." Scottish postage prepaid with boxed PAID in black, rated 1/7½d to cover outgoing ship fee, inland postage, and Scottish road tax. On arrival in New York, rated as ship letter at 20¾¢ (2¢ ship fee plus postage to BNA), converted to 1/2 Currency plus 11d for to Quebec via Montreal. \$200.00



Item 654-13 – <u>Canada Official Gazette PMG prepaid wrapper</u> – c.1870 wrapper with imprinted Canada Official Gazette addressed to the Registrar of Vittoria, Ontario. Struck in red with the handstamp "Paid in account with the P.M.G. W.H. Griffin" indicating postage was prepaid under official privilege. Likely used during the 1868–1875 period, when the newspaper rate was 5¢ per quarter for weekly issues. William Henry Griffin served as Deputy Postmaster General from 1857 to 1888. A scarce and appealing official wrapper. \$300.00



Item 654-14 – <u>5¢ letter rate Waterdown to Newbury</u> – 1864, 1¢ Victoria (5) tied by concentric ring cancels on cover from Waterdown, U.C. paying 5¢ letter rate to Newbury (b/s). Routed via Hamilton (b/s). The cover features a highly unusual stamp arrangement, adding visual appeal to this scarce franking. \$500.00





Item 654-15 – <u>Clinton Masonic Lodge No.84</u> – 1865, 1¢ Victoria tied by Clinton U.C. double broken circle on Masonic Lodge No. 84 circular, listing lodge officers, paying 1¢ circular rate to Picton (b/s). Routed via Brighton (b/s). A nice fraternal letter with lodge content. \$100.00





Item 654-16 – <u>London CW Berri duplex (DBE-46)</u> – 1865, 5¢ Beaver tied by London CW Berri duplex cancel on cover paying 5¢ letter rate to Port Burwell (b/s). Ingersoll transit (b/s). Cloutier DBE-46, diameter 20mm, arcs 12.5mm. \$75.00 **SOLD** 




Item 654-17 – <u>P1 1¢ stationery card with non-constant plate varieties</u> – 1875, 1¢ stationery card from the Bank of Toronto to Georgetown, without postmark, identified by Earle Covert as plate 19, 5<sup>th</sup> state, plate B, position 9, re-entries by definition. Three photographs document the non-constant plate varieties visible on this example. \$100.00





Item 654-18 – P1 1¢ stationery card with printing variety – 1875, 1¢ stationery card from Brantford to Princeton, plate and position unidentified but originating from the Earle Covert holding. A single photograph accompanies the card, highlighting a doubling of the imprint "British American Bank Note Co. Montreal Ottawa." Based on my observations, this doubling appears to be a non-constant variety. \$100.00 SOLD






Item 654-19 – <u>EN22a capital "C" and major re-entry</u> – 1906, ½¢ SQ (14 stamps, some with gum-toned perforations; one showing a notably strong re-entry, the one pencil-marked as "major") tied by smudge cancel on a 2¢ on 3¢ postal stationery envelope paying 9¢ double-weight Empire registered to South West Chaplaincy, England (b/s). Webb EN22a exhibiting capital "C" characteristics. Routed through Montreal (b/s) in Canada, and within England via Bristol, London, Stockwell, and Paddington, each bearing oval registered markings dated the same day. \$150.00 SOLD



Item 654-20 – Thamesville Ont Agricultural Fair booklet, mailed – 1890, 1¢ SQ tied by Thamesville, Ont. cds and segmented cork cancel on a complete 15-page Thamesville Ontario Agricultural Fair booklet, paying the 1¢ printed matter rate to Wardsville. From the archive of Colonel O'Malley. The publication, titled "The Fall Fair of the East Kent Agricultural Society will be held on the Society's Grounds Thamesville Village...", was printed by the Herald Book and Printing Office. Folded, with considerable edge wear throughout, an exceptional surviving example of a mailed fair booklet. \$450.00

Item 654-21 – Return statute labor, turned and remailed – 1874, return statute labour large-format notice mailed free from Langton, Ont., MR 28 74, to Walsingham Centre. The enclosure lists names of individuals alongside a printed Council Chamber letter from the township. Subsequently remailed with a 1¢ Small Queen (deep shade), tied by Langton broken circle cancel JU 18 74, paying the 1¢ printed matter rate to Walsingham. Norfolk County. \$100.00



Item 654-22 – 1¢ very fine centering on card to Germany – 1896, 1¢ Small Queen (very fine centering, fresh) tied by Toronto Orb cancel on 1¢ stationery card, uprated to pay the 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Germany. Routed via London. The message discusses music, piano, and instruments. While cards to Germany are common, this example is seldom seen with such a choice stamp. \$50.00



Item 654-23 – <u>St. Thomas Agricultural Implement Manufacturers</u> – 1884, 3¢ Small Queen tied by St. Thomas, Ont. duplex cancel on Cochrane Manufacturing Company advertising cover, agricultural implements, paying 3¢ letter rate to Clinton (b/s). Ex Greene. \$100.00





Item 654-24 – <u>Boyne Ont (Halton, hammer II with ms date)</u> – 1897, 3¢ Small Queen strip of three, cancelled by two distinct types of pen cancel on cover from Boyne, Ont overpaying 8¢ registered letter rate to Hamilton (b/s). This is the Boyne Ont hammer II, featuring a period after "ONT" and an unusual manuscript date SE 17 97 written on top the indicia AU 4 97. Routed via Milton with square circles SP 17 97, carried by the Hamilton & Allandale M.C., and received at Hamilton the same day. Boyne is a relatively scarce Halton County office, closed in 1914. \$100.00




Item 654-25 – <u>Halifax Baldwin & Co. advertising and registered</u> – 1891, 3¢ SQ and 5¢ RLS tied by oval registered cancel on Halifax Baldwin & Co. advertising cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Cape Breton. Baldwin china, glass, earthenware and fancy goods. Light stain at foot (accentuated by the scanner); reverse bears a few annotations. A charming Victorian registered cover with an illustrated oil lamp. \$200.00



Item 654-26 - Rarity Factor "G", P. Dover & L. Huron RR -

1876, 1¢ stationery card mailed from South Middleton, C.W., paying 1¢ postcard rate to Simcoe (b/s). Struck with the South Middleton Berri hammer, the lone documented example. Routed via Tillsonburg (b/s) and carried on the Port Dover & Lake Huron Railway, bearing the rare RF G "P. Dover & L. Huron R.R." postmark (Gray RY-133, 1876–1877), one of the rarest post-1870 Ontario RPO markings. A remarkable item combining a unique Norfolk County postmark and a highly elusive RPO strike on the same card. \$450.00 **SOLD** 








Item 654-27 – <u>Lindsay squared circle registered cover</u> – 1897, 8¢ Small Queen tied by Lindsay, Ont. squared circle, dated PM DE 21 97, paying the 8¢ registered letter rate to Massachusetts (b/s). Routed as customary via Montreal (b/s). Despite some light staining, a nice cover overall with great strikes. \$100.00.






Item 654-28 – <u>Brantford Odd Fellow's Demonstration</u> – 1892, 6¢ Small Queen and 5¢ Registration Letter Stamp, both tied by Brantford fancy cancel on Odd Fellow's Demonstration illustrated advertising cover, paying 11¢ double-weight registered letter rate to New York. Montreal and Buffalo transit (b/s). The cover features a detailed image of an officer in plumed hat, belt, and saber, standing at attention. A spectacular Canadian Brigade registered cover combining the 6¢ SQ and 5¢ RLS. \$400.00



Item 654-29 – RLS, buckle, horse, stamp dealer, bazaar – 1879, 2¢ Registration Letter Stamp illustrated advertising cover from the Dominion Bazaar Company in Toronto. An unused example with all-over orange advertising, prominently depicting the 2¢ RLS. Accompanied by an original letterhead written and dated AP 30 79, which also features the 2¢ RLS, along with a vivid illustration of a man on horseback holding a stamp store advertisement with a beaver illustrated, and an old-style belt and buckle emblem at right, symbolizing friendship, loyalty, and fidelity. The letter bears a few closed punch holes; the cover is very fine with light edge reduction. Together, they form a great and uncommon pair. \$300.00 SOLD



Item 654-30 – Montreal, Forman Importer of Electrical Supplies – 1909, 1¢ Edward stationery card with John Forman Electrical Supplies advertising, Imperial Crown illustrated, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Galt (receiver marking on front). A mechanization issue occurred, shown by the Montreal International machine cancel, with dater at right and wavy lines at left. A nice card related to electricity. \$50.00






Item 654-31 – <u>Edward Stern & Co. seal stamp</u> – 1909, 1¢ Edward and Edward Stern & Co. postscript stamp, both tied by Goderich Ont duplex cancel on postcard paying the 1¢ postcard rate to Ravenswood via Forest. Features a very unusual and ornately designed cinderella label inscribed "One Today is worth Two Tomorrows" (a quote attributed to Benjamin Franklin). A charming and distinctive item. \$45.00 SOLD



One bears red printed text on the reverse: "This is an apple from Maplewood Orchards Zone 2-175"; the other is blank. The font style and printing suggest these are tags from the 1910s era. 






Item 654-34 — <u>Kingston Crockery, Glassware, Lamps and Novelties</u> — 1903, 1¢ Edward tied by Kingston Ont. duplex cancel on Robertson Bros private postcard, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Chantry (receiver on front). Robertson Bros specialized in the wholesale of crockery, glassware, lamp goods, and novelties. The message relates to an acknowledgement of remittance. A charming and visually appealing card. \$100.00



Item 654-35 – <u>Toronto Electric Motor Rotor illustrated</u> – 1912, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto machine cancel on illustrated advertising cover from the Electrical Maintenance and Repairs Company, Electric Motor Rotor illustrated, paying 2¢ letter rate to Greenwood. A nice industrial-themed cover. \$40.00






Item 654-36 – **6¢ UPU postcard rate to Italy, short with dues** – 1922, 3¢ Admiral tied by Hamilton machine cancel on postcard underpaying the 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Palermo, Italy. Marked with a T30 due handstamp for 30 UPU centimes, converted and paid with a 30-centesimo Italian postage due stamp, tied by Palermo cds. A nice card and well struck. \$125.00




Item 654-37 – Paris Ontario, Thomas Evans Paint and Varnishes – 1924, 3¢ Admiral tied by Paris Ont. duplex cancel on Martin-Senour Paint and Varnishes illustrated advertising cover, paying the 3¢ letter rate to Edmonton Alberta. Accompanied by a business-related letter from Thomas Evans to his son, discussing a note to be paid and difficulties collecting on another account, possibly involving executors and trust arrangements. A nice letter for the Brant County collector or historian. \$60.00







Item 654-38 – A lovely Banff stationery card to Japan – 1925, 2¢ Admiral pair tied by Banff, Alberta Winter Sports duplex slogan cancel on 2¢ stationery card, paying the 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Japan. The reverse features a hand-drawn illustration of Lake Louise, with message written in Japanese. The postmark is listed as Cloutier DAB-25 (recorded from 1925-06-04 to 1925-09-25) and also catalogued as a slogan cancel under Coutts B-50, recorded in 1925 and 1926. A spectacular folk art–illustrated card with an uncommon international use of this Winter Sports slogan cancel. A real standout Banff item. \$150.00 SOLD






Item 654-39 – The iconic Quebec Bridge to Japan - 1925, 1¢ and 3¢ Admirals tied by Montreal machine cancel and duplex "F" cancel on 2¢ stationery card, paying the 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Japan. The reverse features a hand-drawn illustration of the iconic Quebec Bridge with a ship, accompanied by a message written in Japanese. A striking 3-colour franking on a visually appealing card—an excellent companion to the Banff Lake Louise item above. I hope these Japanese tourists enjoyed their Canadian tour! \$100.00










Item 654-40 – <u>Pharmacist W.R. Warner & Co. stationery cards</u> – 1928–29, 2¢ Admiral stationery cards in two distinct green shades, both with privately added advertising and return address. One is Type 6, die II; the other, a more bluegreen shade, both unused reply cards. Both promote Agarol Mineral Oil. An unusual pair. \$40.00



Item 654-41 – Western Canada Airways CL40 complete NH – 1927, 10¢ Western Canada Airways Ltd CL40, mint never hinged complete pane of 50 with full selvedge all around. Shows the "ONE OZ. TEN CENTS" imprints at both top and bottom. Folded once, with some separations. A fresh and very fine sheet. \$375.00






Item 654-42 – Williamsburg Ont Goodrich Tires – c.1935, 1¢ GEOV stationery card featuring an invitation from A.J. Casselman of Williamsburg, Ontario, advertising a Goodrich Tires demonstration. This card is showing the synergy between rural entrepreneurs and urban infrastructure in the 1930s. A.J. Casselman, based in Williamsburg, harnessed Toronto's printing and mailing services to promote his business back into his own community. A pretty example of small-town entrepreneurship amplified by big-city resources. \$35.00 SOLD




Item 654-43 – **20¢ collect on a compulsory registered cover** – 1931, 2¢ Arch tied by Windsor Stn A machine cancel on collection agency c/c cover paying the 2¢ drop letter rate. The letter was refused, bearing a "*Refused*" pointing finger handstamp along with straight-line markings, and was returned to sender as compulsory registered mail with 20¢ postage due. This amount was paid (by the agency) using a pair of 10¢ First Issue postage due stamps. As outlined in the 1931 Postal Guide (Article 174), a letter intended for registration should not be simply deposited in a mailbox, as no certificate of registration can be issued in such cases. It appears this item began as a routine drop letter but, once refused, was deemed to contain valuable content and was returned under registration with due charges. A remarkable and instructive example of postal procedure in action. \$200.00 **SOLD** 





Item 654-44 – Nascopie, Bache Peninsula NWT to South Georgia (297 days) – 1933, 3¢ Arch coil tied by grid cancel on philatelic-inspired cover from Bache Peninsula NWT, dated AP 12 33, to South Georgia, a remote sub-Antarctic Island located 900 miles east of the Falklands. Carried aboard the RMS Nascopie, with backstamp dated SE 7 33 while docked at Robertson Bay, Greenland. Entered the mail stream in Montreal on the return voyage and was forwarded by surface mail, likely via Argentina. Received in South Georgia DE 30 33, then returned to sender and routed back to Pennsylvania (the return address) via Argentina and New York, arriving FE 3 34. A remarkable 297-day journey. \$275.00.



Item 654-45 – <u>Ste. Julie de Vercheres PQ MOOD</u> – 1934, 3¢ Medallion tied by grid cancel on cover from Ste. Julie de Verchères Que., paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. Features the rare Type 1 money order office datestamp (MOOD) for Ste. Julie PQ, a striking and unofficial use on cover. The MOOD handstamp, produced by Pritchard and Andrews of Ottawa, was originally intended for dating money order and registration receipts. A rare Quebec MOOD and desirable Verchères office cover. \$50.00




Item 654-46 – <u>Black Cape PQ MOOD</u> – 1937, 1¢ Pictorial tied by Black Cape PQ money order office datestamp on cover, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Toronto. A very scarce MOOD from the Bonaventure and Gaspé Peninsula region. \$30.00 SOLD




