

Item 656-01 – <u>Vittoria UC Postmaster free</u> – 1832, Postmaster free-franked letter from Francis Leigh Walsh, postmaster at Vittoria, addressed to James Crooks in Flamborough West. Crooks (1778–1860) was a prominent businessman and political figure in Upper Canada, serving as Member of Parliament for Halton and active in military supply, shipping, and the production of beer, spirits, and potash. He fought at the Battle of Queenston Heights during the War of 1812 and later sat on the jury at the Bloody Assize of 1814. Walsh (1789–1884), born in Maryland and settled in Norfolk County in 1793, succeeded his father as registrar in 1810, served in the local militia during the War of 1812, and became captain in 1824. He represented Norfolk in the Legislative Assembly of Upper Canada from 1820 to 1828 and again from 1834 to 1836, and was appointed justice of the peace for the London District in 1821 and for the Talbot District in 1838. \$250.00



Item 656-02 – <u>Toronto ½d printed circular</u> – 1854, printed circular blue cover, likely originating from Toronto, rated ½d collect to pay the circular rate to Whitby. Ruggles receiver struck in blue on reverse. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 656-03 – John A. Macdonald (as Attorney General) – 1861, free franked cover from Quebec signed by John A. Macdonald, then Attorney General for Upper Canada in the Cartier–Macdonald administration (1858–1862), addressed to Judge James Robert Gowan in Barrie. Initials "J.A. McD" and A.G. appear at lower left. The recipient, Sir James Robert Gowan (1815–1909), was a judge and later senator, and served as one of the Royal Commissioners appointed to investigate the Pacific Scandal. Cover shows opening tears, repaired. \$250.00





Item 656-04 – <u>Senator Pierre Baillargeon MD</u> – 1874, letter and cover from the Senate of Canada to Ottawa, sent by Senator Pierre Baillargeon, M.D., to Henry Morgan. Features the Senate Canada crown and belt free marking in pink. The letter relates to a Q&A for Morgan's Canadian Parliamentary Companion, a reference work he published. Baillargeon (1812–1891), a physician and political figure in Quebec, was born on Île-aux-Grues in the St. Lawrence River, studied medicine at Harvard, and pursued a distinguished career in both medicine and public service. 
Item 656-05 – <u>Sir Hector-Louis Langevin</u> – 1851, folded cover from Montreal rated ½d collect, paying the drop letter rate. Signed "H.L.L." by Hector L. Langevin, who would later become one of the Fathers of Confederation. Langevin (1826–1906), a Canadian lawyer and politician, was called to the bar in 1850 and was involved in the administration of crown lands at the time. Filing fold and docketing notes on front. An early and scarce Langevin item. \$100.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 656-06 – <u>Isle aux Noix LC (Richelieu River)</u> - 1842, folded letter from Isle aux Noix LC rated 11d collect to Quebec. Written by Edward Roden to James Kerr, the letter relates to the appointment of an attorney. Isle aux Noix, located in the Richelieu River near the U.S. border, is notable for its long military history, fortified by the French in 1759, later by the British in the 1820s, and used as a strategic staging ground by American forces during the War. A great strike! \$200.00 SOLD




Item 656-07 – <u>Baillieboro CW (Durham Northumberland)</u> – 1864, 5¢ Beaver tied by grid cancel on cover from Baillieboro, C.W., with Berri hammer dated MR 11 64, paying the 5¢ domestic letter rate to South Monaghan. Red backstamp on reverse. \$100.00 <u>SOLD</u>







Item 656-08 – Partially prepaid New York to Montreal – 1872, U.S. 3¢ Washington tied by New York cds on counsellor c/c cover to Montreal, underpaying 10¢ cross-border rate. No credit was given for the partial prepayment, and the cover was charged 10¢ collect on arrival (Montreal b/s). At the time, unpaid or underpaid letters were treated as fully unpaid and rated the full amount to the addressee. A seldom-seen example of this practice. \$150.00 SOLD



Item 656-09 – Sault Ste. Marie Ont squared circle – 1897, 2¢ SQ tied by Sault Ste. Marie squared circle on 1¢ Jubilee stationery card, overpaying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to England. Redirected upon arrival with Paddington cds on front. Reverse datelined "Sault Ste. Marie, Lake Superior" with a message from a son informing his father that he had sent him two newspapers from the region. As for the 2¢ adhesive, one theory suggests the sender may have overpaid it to ensure delivery, regardless, the card is clearly overpaid. A charming and scarce Sault Ste. Marie usage with squared. Ex Kerzner. \$100.00 SOLD



Item 656-10 – <u>Ottawa bookseller registered</u> – 1895, 8¢ SQ tied by oval registered cancel on James Hope Booksellers c/c cover, with boxed "Registered Ottawa" marking, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). A clean and attractive example of printers/stationers/booksellers registered mail. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 656-11 – <u>Kamouraska Que to Old Orchard Beach</u> – 1880, 3¢ SQ tied by concentric ring cancel on petite lady's cover from Kamouraska Que paying 3¢ letter rate to Old Orchard Beach, Maine. Old Orchard backstamp on reverse. A pretty little cover. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 656-12 – <u>Granby Que fancy star cancel</u> – 1876, 3¢ SQ (slightly over edge) tied by a striking star-shaped fancy cancel on cover from Granby Que, paying 3¢ letter rate to Rougemont. Montreal transit b/s. The cancel resembles a radiant sunburst with a central bullet or numeral, an eye-catching design unrecorded in Lacelle. \$75.00




Item 656-13 – **2¢ Jubilee, drop and delivered by carrier** – 1897, 2¢ Jubilee tied by London Orb cancel on Heyer c/c cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. Delivered by letter carrier with 8 AM JY 24 marking. \$75.00




Item 656-14 – <u>Lacolle Que registered</u> – 1902, 2¢ and 5¢ Numeral tied by Lacolle Que broken circle cancel on cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Napierville, routed via St. John (b/s). \$30.00



Item 656-15 – **10¢ Numeral single use** – 1900, 10¢ Numeral tied by St. John, N.B. cds on Rennie Seeds reply cover to Toronto (b/s), paying the 9¢ double-weight registered letter rate, with 1¢ overpayment for convenience. A particularly attractive and scarce single-franking use of the 10¢ Numeral on a Rennie. \$450.00



Item 656-16 – Montreal Engine Co., wrenches and tools – 1900, 2¢ Numeral tied by Montreal Bickerdike machine cancel on Laurie Engine Company advertising cover featuring a detailed wrench illustration, paying 2¢ drop letter rate. A visually striking industrial-themed cover. \$75.00 SOLD





Item 656-17 – Le Breton Flats Ont Registered (Carleton) – 1899, 1¢, 2¢ (3) Numeral tied by Le Breton Flats Ont. cds on cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Brantford, with Ottawa and Brantford backstamps. A penny coin was used to press the wax seal, leaving a crisp impression. Le Breton Flats is a scarce Carleton office; the area was amalgamated into Ottawa around 1919. A charming and uncommon registered cover. \$75.00






Item 656-18 – Melville Cross Ont (Peel) – 1901, 1¢, 2¢ (3) Numeral tied by Melville Cross Ont broken circle on cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Carried by the unusual Toronto & Owen Sound M.C. North, dated NO 11 01. This represents the latest recorded use of the Melville Cross postmark, a rare Peel County office that closed in 1916. A scarce cover. \$100.00 SOLD




Item 656-19 – Wortman and Ward Manufacturing Co. – 1902, 2¢ Numeral tied by London duplex cancel on Wortman and Ward Manufacturing Company advertising cover, paying the 2¢ drop letter rate within London. Features a bold industrial design from a prominent local manufacturer. \$40.00



Item 656-20 – Western Canada book advertising card – 1911, 1¢ Edward stationery card with William Briggs Publishers advertising for Where the Buffalo Roamed, a picturesque and engaging book apparently on the story of Western Canada, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Jerseyville, Ont (b/s). Light crease from postal handling. \$40.00 SOLD



Item 656-21 – Western University advertising – 1904, 2¢ Edward tied by London machine cancel on Western University advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to U.S. \$60.00






Item 656-22 – <u>Gas ranges with asbestos</u> – c.1910, Orillia Power Dam unused postcard published by W.G. MacFarlane, Toronto. The reverse features added advertising for Jewel Gas Ranges (*noted for their asbestos insulation*) and Adams Furniture Company. An interesting marketing card. \$30.00



Item 656-23 – <u>CPR46 to England, redirected</u> – 1915, 1¢ Admiral stationery card depicting Windsor Street Station and Dining Room, Webb CPR46, die 1A, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to England; redirected on arrival to Kent. A very pretty card with two receivers. \$75.00




Item 656-24 – <u>Wellandport Ont (Lincoln)</u> – 1912, 2¢ Edward and 5¢ Admiral both tied by faint concentric ring cancel on cover from Wellandport Ont paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Hamilton (b/s), with St. Ann transit (b/s). Attractive Edward–Admiral combination. \$50.00






Item 656-25 – Gas Line Ont (Welland 1900-1916) – 1912, 1¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Easter postcard from Gas Line, Ont., paying 1¢ postcard rate to Buffalo. A scarce short-lived Welland office, closed in 1916. \$25.00 SOLD




Item 656-26 – <u>Anger and dissatisfaction with the appraisal of furs</u> – 1913, 2¢ Admiral tied by Neudorf Saskatchewan duplex cancel on cover paying 2¢ letter rate to the U.S. The cover bears an illustrated directive to the Postmaster, showing a man kicking another down the stairs with the caption: "if you don't land in five days, return for a better start to". Enclosed is a scathing letter that fiercely denounces an American fur house as dishonest and untrustworthy, blasting its insultingly low valuation of thirty muskrats and one good weasel. The writer angrily insists that far better returns could be obtained in Toronto, Ontario, and closes with the emphatic rejection: "Yours no never," followed by initials. \$100.00





Item 656-27 – Oyama BC winter scene RPPC to Spain – 1914, 2¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on real photo postcard depicting a dramatic winter scene near Oyama, Vernon, British Columbia paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Spain. The image shows two men, one carrying a rucksack and holding his boots, the other appearing more official, set against a striking snow-covered landscape. A real wow Vernon area real photo card to a rare destination. \$150.00





Item 656-28 – <u>Grimsby East Ont (Lincoln, 1912-1926)</u> – 1914, 1¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on postcard from Grimsby East, Ont., paying 1¢ postcard rate to Toronto. A short-lived Lincoln office, opened in 1912 and closed in 1926. \$20.00 SOLD





Item 656-29 – <u>Toronto – Royal Flying Corps / RAF (ARF WING)</u> – 1918, 2¢ + 1¢ Wartax tied by Toronto machine cancel on RAF cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Enosburg Falls, Vermont. This is an early example showing the erroneously printed and distributed "ARF" wing, which was quickly recalled by official order and replaced with wings correctly marked "RAF.". The Royal Flying Corps operated from 1912 until April 1, 1918. Light reduction and tiny tear at foot. \$150.00 SOLD





Item 656-30 – RAF, Leaside Camp, North Toronto – c.1919, 2¢ Admiral (uncancelled) on Burrard Inlet, B.C. view card addressed to service no. 72673-2, Air Mechanic Second Class Ernie F. Hine, RAF, Leaside Camp, North Toronto. The card is undated but bears a day/month notation of July 25 (likely 1919, after the War). The message notes, "I got different reports saying you would be back,". Camp Leaside, home of the Royal Flying Corps was largely decommissioned in 1919 following the end of the War. By 1920, Canada's wartime military aviation arm had effectively ceased to exist, and with it the need for the camp. \$200.00 SOLD



Item 656-31 – <u>Toronto Little Norway Ont</u> – 1942, 2¢ Mufti tied by Toronto "Little Norway" cds on patriotic cover to Toronto. "Little Norway" was the Norwegian Army Air Service/Royal Norwegian Air Force training camp in Canada during the Second World War. Philatelic in nature, but very scarce and virtually the only way to obtain an example of this postmark. \$100.00 **SOLD** 







Item 656-32 – 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Denmark – 1925, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto machine cancel on postcard underpaying 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Denmark. Marked "T40" for 40 centimes postage due converted to 32 øre, paid upon arrival with a striking three-colour Danish due franking and tied by København cds (Copenhagen). Two Afhentes markings translated to "pick up". A rare and visually impressive UPU underpaid usage with vibrant due markings. \$300.00





Item 656-33 – <u>Fort William Ont registered</u> – 1918, 1¢, 2¢ (2) Admiral <u>booklet stamps</u>, 2¢+1¢ Wartax tied by multiple oval registered markings on cover from Fort William Ont paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Ingersoll (b/s) via London (b/s). Carried by North Bay & Fort William RPO. A scarce booklet stamp cover. \$75.00 **SOLD** 







Item 656-34 – Glasgow Packet – 1913, 1¢ Admiral tied by Glasgow 21 cds on Allan Line R.M.S. Grampian picture postcard to Chesley, Ont. (Bruce County), bearing a crisp straightline "Paquebot" handstamp. Mailed underpaid while onboard, with a message reading in part: "Expect to be in Glasgow at 10 AM, I only had 3 days sickness" A charming Admiral-era postcard posted en route to Scotland. \$75.00 SOLD






Item 656-35 – Fort Frances Ont hardware calendar postcard – 1915, 1¢ Admiral tied by Fort Frances Ont machine cancel on Johnson Hardware Company calendar and advertising postcard, paying the 1¢ printed matter rate locally. The obverse is designed for use as a kitchen calendar, while the reverse features Christmas gift suggestions for children and adults. A very pretty card. \$75.00 SOLD





Item 656-36 – **St. Catharines Ont coal calendar postcard** – 1914, advertising and calendar postcard from D. Dittrick & Scranton Coal, St. Catharines, Ont. The front features a painting by Edwin Lamasure Jr., noted landscape artist, along with the April 1914 calendar. The reverse promotes winter coal and highlights the promise of a big return on money. \$40.00





Item 656-37 – **3¢ Admiral 12x8 with an important date** – 1931, 3¢ Admiral perforated 12x8 tied by Quebec machine cancel on illustrated S.S. Laurentic postcard, <u>dated JY 4 31</u>, overpaying the 2¢ UPU postcard rate to the U.S. The 1¢ Wartax had been reinstated just days earlier, on <u>July 1, 1931</u>, though it applied only to letters, suggesting possible confusion by the sender. The 12x8 provisional was issued on <u>JU 24 31</u>, making its presence aboard the ship remarkable, given that Atlantic crossings in 1931 typically took five to seven days on fast liners (both ways), and up to two weeks on slower vessels. The message notes they are on the St. Lawrence River, likely headed toward Quebec City, enjoying "pretty scenery on both sides." According to Marler p.532, he has seen one copy on a cover postmarked <u>JY 6 1931</u> (book published in 1982). A scarce and legitimate postcard use with a 12x8 provisional, with intriguing postal timing. A spectacular provisional use. \$350.00






Item 656-38 – Postage due paid in Kenora – 1911, GB ½d tied by Sandgate Kent cds on postcard underpaying the Empire postcard rate to Kenora, Ont., Canada. Marked "T2" with a losange "L" tax handstamp, and struck with a Canadian "2" due marking. Postage due paid on arrival in Kenora with a 2¢ First Issue Postage Due stamp. A scarce taxed usage to a less commonly seen destination. \$45.00 SOLD



Item 656-39 – <u>CL40 Western Canada Airways to Pickle Lake Ont</u> – 1928, 2¢ Admiral tied by Sioux Lookout Ont. duplex cancel on philatelic Western Canada Airways semi-official CL40 cover to the company office in Pickle Lake, Ontario. Although Harold Farrington made the flight and return on DE 31 28, research confirms he did not carry mail; the cover was likely flown on JA 2 29. The service was established to transport mail to the Central Patricia Gold Mines at Pickle Lake. Franked with the 1928 second printing of 10,000 stamps in pale red to salmon red shade. Flight WC2817-CL40. A well-documented philatelic semi-official usage. \$60.00






Item 656-40 – <u>CL6 Jack Elliot Air Service to Rolling Portage</u> – 1926, 3¢ Admiral cancelled by faint but matching Rolling Portage, Ont. broken circle on cover dated MR 6 26, originating from Red Lake (partially struck oval) and addressed to Rolling Portage. Reverse bears CL6 Jack Elliot Air Service semi-official stamp, tied by oval Kenora–Red Lake cachet. Listed as flight JE2601-CL6a, with 500 covers presumably flown. According to Derek Rance, no flight occurred on MR 6; both of Jack Elliot's aircraft were damaged in accidents on MR 5. The covers were postmarked in anticipation of the inaugural flight, which ultimately took place on MR 10. Interesting! \$85.00



Item 656-41 – CL13 Patricia Airways Exploration Ltd – 1926, 1¢ Admiral tied by Red Lake Ont. broken circle on Roessler philatelic cover to New Jersey. The reverse bears a CL13 Patriotic Airways semi-official stamp, tied by Red Lake cancel dated JY 16 26. On that day, the company operated a flight from Rolling Portage to Sioux Lookout, followed by a leg from Sioux to Red Lake. In fact, we don't know if that Roessler cover was flown. A.C. Roessler was a prominent stamp and coin dealer active from 1894 to 1942. Renowned for his cachet-making, he produced a wide array of artistic and innovative designs for airmail covers that became highly sought after by collectors. He published several philatelic resources, including his weekly A.C. Roessler's Stamp News and the A.C. Roessler Historical Souvenir Air Mail Catalog. Despite his popularity, Roessler was a controversial figure due to his strained relationship with postal authorities, culminating in a suspended sentence in the 1930s for questionable overprinting and cachet practices. He was also known by nicknames such as A.C. Roe and "The Old Reliable Stamp Dealer". \$85.00




Item 656-42 – <u>Bigwood Ont registered (Sudbury, opened in 1911)</u> – 1913, 1¢, 2¢ (3) Admiral tied by grid cancel on cover from Bigwood Ont paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Lands and Forests in Toronto (b/s). House Assembly Ontario (b/s). A Scarce Sudbury office. \$60.00 SOLD




Item 656-43 – **2¢ Confederation First Day Cover with Ottawa flag** – 1927, 2¢ Confederation tied by Ottawa Diamond Jubilee flag cancel on Mooers reply cover, dated JU 29 27 the first day of issue paying 2¢ letter rate to Kingston. An attractive example with the appearance of a commercial first day cover. \$125.00





Item 656-44 – <u>Smith's Falls Old Home Week slogan</u> – 1925, 2¢ Admiral tied by the scarce Smith's Falls Old Home Week slogan cancel on Rideau Lake postcard, Coutts S-1080, paying 2¢ PC rate to Pictou. \$25.00 **SOLD**



Pair \$40.00 **SOLD** 



Item 656-46 – <u>Coaldale Alberta registered</u> – 1930, 2¢, 10¢ Scroll tied by Coaldale Alta duplex cancel on cover, Cloutier DAB-139 (1928-1937) paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Calgary (b/s). RF A. \$30.00



Item 656-47 – <u>Private order stationery ENX7-2</u> – c.1925–30, 2¢ George V private order unused stationery envelope, Webb ENX7-2, with Carpenter-Hixon Co. corner card of Blind River Ontario. A clean and well-preserved example of commercial private order PSE from Northern Ontario. \$40.00





Possibly used for Rexall Drug Store Customer Service and promoting the "One Cent Sale." A scarce and visually appealing example of Webb P97A. \$75.00






Item 656-50 – Tanner Green dog-team stationery cover – 1930, 2¢ GEOV postal stationery cover with added "Par Cométique / By Labrador Dog-Team Post" and illustration. Prepared by Tanner Green, the Quebec City postal inspector and addressed to himself. Mailed from Quebec JA 21 30, endorsed for carriage by Air Mail from Quebec to Seven Islands, paying 2¢ letter rate to Lourdes du Blanc Sablon. Routed as customary via Natashquan and Havre St. Pierre (b/s), bearing Seven Islands MOOD handstamp (b/s). Reverse showing Lourdes du Blanc Sablon "30" inverted indicia, MR 7 03 not repeated on obverse MR 15 30 a few days later. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 656-51 – **5¢ Ottawa UPU Conference** – 1933, 5¢ Ottawa UPU Conference issue tied by Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan machine cancel on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Switzerland. A fine cover. \$25.00
