

Item 658-01 – Montreal to France "Colonies Par Le Havre" – 1827, folded letter from Montreal to Belley, France. Carried by private vessel and entered as a ship letter at Le Havre with the marking "Colonies Par Le Havre" No BNA or U.S. postage, confirming carriage by a private trader. Rated 15 decimes: 1 decime ship letter fee (taxe par voie de mer) plus 14 decimes French inland postage from Le Havre to Belley. The three-page letter, written by Madame Malard of Montreal to her niece in France, is primarily of legal nature. It briefly mentions family matters, including the death of her husband and an injury to her leg, but focuses on legal considerations. She notes widespread corruption and discusses creditors of ancestral debts, power of attorney, an estate property, a mortgage, a will, a curator, and the destruction of documents deemed useless by the judge and clerk etc. Exhibit quality. \$250.00 SOLD




Item 658-02 - Terrebonne LC perfect strike in black (Mascouche) - 1841 folded cover from Terrebonne, LC, bearing a perfect strike of the Terrebonne 1829-type postmark. Rated 9d collect to Quebec. Docketing notes indicate the letter originated in Mascouche and concerns William Edgeworth and P.W. Desbarats regarding a parcel of land in Hemmingford. While a common usage of this postmark, this example shows an exceptionally sharp strike. \$100.00






Item 658-03 – Molsons Bank 3¢ drop registered not called for – 1888, 1¢ Small Queen and 2¢ RLS (F1d rose carmine, possibly Gazette Printing) tied by Woodstock, Ont. duplex cancel on Molsons Bank cover paying 3¢ drop registered letter rate. Not called for and returned via the Dead Letter Office, with backstamps dated SEP 7 and SEP 13, 1888. \$250.00 **SOLD**





Item 658-04 – London attorney letter to Sarnia/Point Edward – 1892, 1¢ Small Queen tied by grid cancel on cover from London Ont paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Sarnia (backstamp JA 1 92). Addressed to Sarnia but received in Point Edward, just north of the city, the same day. Returned to London and delivered back to the sender by letter carrier. The printed enclosure concerns debts and payment. \$50.00



Item 658-05 – Richelieu & Ontario Navigation Co. – c.1880, 1¢ Small Queen tied by grid cancel on Richelieu & Ontario Navigation Co. advertising cover from Montreal, the green version, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Coteau Landing. Addressed to S. & J. Carrière of Coteau Landing, confirming his role as agent for the Richelieu & Ontario. A very attractive and desirable cover. Ex Greene, Brassler. \$200.00 SOLD




Item 658-06 – Richelieu & Ontario Navigation Co. – c.1880, 1¢ Small Queen tied by grid cancel on Richelieu & Ontario Navigation Co. advertising cover from Montreal, the rare fuchsia version, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Coteau Landing Addressed to S. & J. Carrière, confirming his role as agent for the Richelieu & Ontario. Many speculate that Carriere was a seller of steamer tickets at his Coteau Landing General Store, now we know. Light staining. Ex Greene. \$200.00



Item 658-07 – <u>Lachine Locks Que (to Deaf and Dumb Institute)</u> – 1888, 3¢ Small Queen tied by grid cancel on cover from Lachine Locks, Que., paying 3¢ letter rate to Montreal (b/s plus carrier mark 8 DE 24 88). Addressed to the Deaf and Dumb Institute, a notable social institution of the era. A scarce postmark. \$50.00




Item 658-08 – Guelph triple-cross fancy cancel – 1875, 3¢ Small Queen tied by triple-cross fancy cancel on cover from Guelph, Ont., paying 3¢ letter rate to Armadale (Unionville b/s). Fancy cancel similar to Lacelle 1173. Cover reduced at right. \$100.00






Item 658-09 – <u>Allumettes Islands Que Canada (closed in 1883)</u> – 1880, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Allumettes Islands Que (3-part dater with Canada at base) paying 1¢ postcard rate to Bryson Village Que via Fort Coulonge. Datelined Chapleau SE 22 80. A very scarce Pontiac postmark (1852-1883). \$125.00 SOLD






Item 658-10 – <u>St. Philippe de Laprairie Que</u> – 1899, 1¢ stationery card mailed from St. Philippe de Laprairie, Que., paying 1¢ postcard rate to Toronto. Message in French concerns leaded solder wire to be sold on addressee's behalf. \$25






Item 658-11 – 1¢ stationery card with plate number – 1881, 1¢ stationery card with plate number at upper right, mailed from Kentville, N.S., to St. John, N.B. A scarce usage showing plate number. \$50.00




Item 658-12 – Waterford Ont Norfolk County "Way Letter" – 1881, 1¢ stationery card from Waterford, Ont. (Norfolk County), paying 1¢ postcard rate to St. Thomas. Carried as a way letter by train to Toronto, where it entered the mail stream and was then forwarded to St. Thomas. Likely handed to a mail clerk in the Waterford train yards on an eastbound through train to Toronto. An outstanding Norfolk County way letter, considerably scarcer than northern counterparts (Parry Sound, Simcoe County, etc.), and notably addressed not to Toronto but to adjacent Elgin County. A remarkable and rare usage. \$100.00 SOLD






Item 658-13 – <u>Steamer Alexandria in the Picton Harbour and Bay of Quinte</u> – 1897, 1¢ Jubilee stationery card from unknown origin, possibly Picton or Prince Edward County. Delivered to the steamer Alexandria while in Picton Harbour or mailed onboard, dated OC 11 97 to Trenton. Carried through the Bay of Quinte, entered and postmarked at Trenton with squared circle OC 12 97. The Alexandria, operated by the Montreal Rochester Transit Co. (*Bay of Quinte Line*), later Ontario & Quebec Navigation Co. Crease. Rare usage. Ex Bruce Graham. \$400.00



Item $658-14 - 2^{nd}$ Anglo-Boer War eleven stereoview cards -1897-1901, lot of 11 Anglo-Boer War stereo view cards, published by Underwood, Universal View Co. and James Davis; 10 of 11 with Toronto or Ottawa branch imprint. Depicting scenes from the Second Boer War (1899–1902). Real-photograph curled cards in fine condition, with only minor staining or edge faults on a few; photos show light age fading. Stereoscopes, popular in the late-Victorian and Edwardian eras, created a three-dimensional effect by viewing paired photographs mounted on card. An appealing and historic lot. \$325.00



Item 658-15 – Canada Stamp Company with view of Quebec – 1901, ½¢ Numeral strip of 4 (one stamp with pre-affixing fault) tied by Quebec duplex cancel on Canada Stamp Company advertising cover, design shows view of Quebec with Citadel and Dufferin Terrasse, paying 2¢ letter rate to Detroit, Michigan (b/s). Pretty! \$150.00



Item 658-16 – <u>Toronto binder twine advertising</u> – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on Plymouth Binder Twine Agency advertising cover, paying 2¢ letter rate to Armadale. A choice agricultural advertising cover, especially relevant to grain and hay thematic collections. \$50.00




Item 658-17 – <u>Toronto plants seeds and bulbs</u> – 1898, 1¢ Maple Leaf stationery card mailed from North Toronto Ont to Glencairn. Reverse with Grainger Bros Growers of plants, seeds and bulbs. \$25.00



Item 658-18 – <u>Long Reach N.B. registered</u> – 1899, 1¢, 3¢ (2) Numeral tied by long Reach N.B. broken circle on cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to New York (b/s) via St. John (b/s). Kings County. Exhibit quality. \$50.00





Item 658-19 – <u>Spy Hill Sask</u> – 1911, 1¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on postcard from Spy Hill Saskatchewan paying 1¢ PC rate to Massachusetts. \$25.00





Item 658-20 – <u>Pearceton Q (Q broken circle)</u> - 1907, American postcard from Ohio to Pearceton Que with Pearceton Q broken circle as receiver, then redirected to Abbotts Corner. The "Q" broken circles belong to a select group of about two dozen offices without the standard "QUE" provincial designation. Pearceton "Q" recorded 1897–1908. Mississquoi County. \$50.00




Item 658-21 – <u>Guelph's Old Home Week advertising</u> – 1908, 2¢ Edward tied by Guelph Ont International machine cancel on Guelph's Old Home Week advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Greenwood via Whitby (b/s). Reverse with J.B. Armstrong Manufacturing Company (fine finished carriages) c/c. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>






Item 658-22 – <u>London Camp Ontario</u> – 1918, 7¢ Admiral tied by FPO Canada Militia London Camp Ont cds on paymaster and payment account form paying 7¢ double weight drop registered letter rate. London (b/s). A very scarce London Camp registered cover. \$250.00





Item 658-23 – <u>Sussex Camp N.B. on comic pickpocket theme card</u> – 1911, 1¢ Edward tied by perfect strike of Sussex Camp N.B. cds on humorous postcard paying 1¢ rate to Lakeville N.B. Depicts two businessmen in front of wine & cigar shop, police officer patrolling nearby, one pickpocketing watch of the other naïve gentleman. Publisher unknown, but certainly U.S. origin. \$125.00





Item 658-24 – <u>Montreal Experimental Keyhole</u> – 1911, 7¢ Quebec Tercentenary tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Stanstead Que paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Halifax (b/s). Carried by Sherbrooke & Stanstead M.C., then to Montreal, where the rare Montreal Experimental Keyhole was applied, then forwarded to Nova Scotia. \$200.00






Item 658-25 – 7¢ Tercentenary, Oxford Nova Scotia – 1908, 7¢ Quebec Tercentenary tied by two Oxford N.S. broken circle strikes on cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Amherst (b/s). Carried via Halifax & St. John M.C. \$125.00 SOLD



Item 658-26 – <u>3¢ Admiral coil, Margaretsville N.S.</u> – 1933, 3¢ Admiral coil tied by grid cancel on cover from Margaretsville, N.S., underpaying 5¢ double-weight letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Assessed 4¢ postage due and paid with a pair of 2¢ Second Issue postage due stamps. \$25.00



Item 658-27 – **1¢ GEOV stationery envelope cutout, to U.S.** – 1915, 1¢ GEOV stationery envelope cutout affixed to 2¢ GEOV stationery envelop, paying 3¢ letter rate to Halifax and redirected to New York. Although cutouts from postal stationery were not valid for postage, this unauthorized usage was overlooked or tacitly accepted. Remarkably, accepted within the U.S. without charge as well. \$45.00





Item 658-28 – <u>Hardware private postcard with Excise tax stamp</u> – 1925, 2¢ Admiral coil (miscut) tied by St. John, N.B., machine cancel on W.H. Thorne & Co. private postcard, paying 2¢ postcard rate to Bass River, N.S. Reverse bears 2¢ Excise tax stamp tied by pen cancel. \$35.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 658-29 – <u>Halifax postcard mailed unpaid to England</u> – 1912, Halifax fire scene picture postcard published by Connolly, mailed unpaid from Halifax to England with T20 UPU centimes converted to 2d stg. Initially struck T10, corrected with two strikes of T20. The message, dated MR 3 12, relates to the fire: *big block on fire here*. \$45.00 **SOLD**



Item 658-30 – Westley BC (RF E, 1903-1913 / 1929-1930) – 1912, 2¢ PSE from Westley, B.C. (1st period 1903–1913, RF E), paying 2¢ letter rate to England. No Westley reported in 2nd period (1929–1930). An elusive and highly desirable rarity from this short-lived office. \$400.00 SOLD



Item 658-31 – <u>Vancouver BC Sub No.32 registered (1922-1947)</u> – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Vancouver Sub No.32 cds on cover paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Vancouver (b/s). Very scarce. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 658-32 – P45a 1¢ Admiral precancelled – 1931, 1¢ Admiral stationery card with Post Office precancel, Webb P45a, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to local. Reverse shows Toronto municipal election polling location and related information. \$75.00



Item 658-33 – P55 1¢ and ½¢ reply attached advertising – c.1920, 1¢ and ½¢ Admiral stationery card with reply attached, bearing G.A. Stimson & Co. advertising, mailed from Toronto to Belmont, Ontario. Stimson was a Toronto-based Canadian bond company. Listed as Webb P55, typographed. Very scarce, with both halves illustrated. \$75.00 SOLD

Item 658-34 – Spanish Influenza postcards – 1918 and 1919, 2¢ Admiral stationery cards, both from Courtland, Ont., to the Public-School Inspector at Simcoe, Ont. The 1918 card concerns the Spanish Influenza and school closing. The 1919 card dated January 12, 1919, from Rose Jackson to Mr. Cook, notes she was off duty with a cold, hoped to return to school by Wednesday, observed influenza spreading more severely than ever before, and reported Mr. Burnett's death the previous Saturday night from pneumonia. \$100.00





Item 658-35 – **20¢ Historical single franked registered cover** – 1928, 20¢ Historical tied by Portage La Prairie, Man., cds on banking cover paying 20¢ quintuple-weight registered letter rate to Poplar Point, Man. Oval Winnipeg registered handstamp, transit marking, and Winnipeg & Bins RPO (b/s). The envelope was unusually thick, the top tear almost certainly caused by parcel rope. A rare and desirable single-franking usage. \$100.00



Item 658-36 – <u>Private order ENX24-3</u> – 1927, 3¢ GEOV Lined Hair Issue stationery envelope, private order Webb ENX24-3 with Anaconda American Brass Ltd corner card, mailed from New Toronto, Ont., to Toronto. Duplex cancel recorded as DON-1112 (1922–1928). \$40.00






Item 658-37 – 1¢ Arch with major re-entry 163ii – 1931, 1¢ Arch (163ii major re-entry in right "1", top of cent, position 96, plate 2 die 1) tied by faint Brampton duplex cancel on banking cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Hamilton. A scarce and seldom-seen re-entry usage on cover, highly desirable for specialists. \$100.00 SOLD



Item 658-38 – <u>Private order ENX8-1</u> – 1931, 2¢ GEOV Oval Issue stationery envelope, private order Webb ENX8-1 with Ellis McIntyre Motors corner card and window, from Hamilton paying 2¢ drop letter rate. \$30.00



Item 658-39 – **E4 use from Stratford to North Owen Sound** – 1933, 3¢ Medallion with 20¢ Special Delivery E4 tied by Stratford, Ont., cds on cover dated AU 18 33, paying 23¢ special delivery letter rate to North Owen Sound (Owen Sound b/s, same day). This E4 usage falls within the E5 period, when the unilingual "Twenty Cents" was redesigned as "20 Cents 20." Slightly out of period, but a scarce and desirable use to Grey County. \$100.00 **SOLD**





Item 658-40 – <u>Port Dover Canning Company</u> – 1932, 3¢ Ottawa Conference tied by Port Dover, Ont., cds on Port Dover Canning Company advertising cover to Hamilton, promoting Dove, Culverhouse and Arrow brand canned goods. \$25.00 **SOLD**




Item 658-41 – <u>Private order ENX21-4</u> – 1933, 2¢ GEOV Lined Hair Issue stationery envelope, private order Webb ENX21-4 with London Box 643 corner card and window, mailed at London paying the 2¢ drop letter rate. Strong fiber, possibly manila. \$45.00




Item 658-42 – <u>Private order ENX34-8</u> – 1933, 3¢ Medallion Issue stationery envelope, private order Webb ENX34-8 with Canadian Wrappers Ltd corner card and window, mailed In Toronto with Royal Winter Fair slogan paying 3¢ domestic letter rate. \$25.00





Item 658-43 – Niagara Camp by favour or to order – 1937, 3¢ Mufti tied by FPO Niagara Camp Ont cds on unaddressed MFB299 cover; cancelled by favour/CTO. \$40.00





Item 658-44 – <u>The Royal Hamilton Light Infantry</u> – 1940 Royal Hamilton Light Infantry embossed stationery (cover plus letter) with blazon illustrated mailed from FPO 247 dated AU 16 40 to Toronto. This unit was also called the Wentworth Regiment, motto SEMPER PARATUS ("always ready"). Orderly room marking same day. Rare. \$75.00





Item 658-45 – <u>Nascopie – Craig Harbour NWT</u> – 1940, 1¢ Royal Visit tied by Craig Harbour NWT cds on Dog Team illustrated cover paying 1¢ unsealed printed matter rate to U.S. Carried by the Nascopie with oval SE 8 40 (b/s). \$75.00 **SOLD**





Item 658-46 – <u>NFLD registered via Truro and Sydney RPO Edwin Crowe</u> – 1941, 5¢ Grenfell block of 4 tied by St. John's Registered rubber handstamp on RBC cover, DE 1 41, to Westville N.S. (b/s).Carried and handled by Truro and Sydney RPO Edwin Crowe train 6, MT-362 RF D (1941-1948). \$100.00 SOLD




Item 658-47 – <u>An emergency dater removed blackout machine</u> – 1943, 3¢, 4¢ War tied by Esquimalt FMO machine cancel on patriotic "*Sinks Ships*" cover, censored, paying 7¢ airmail to Toronto. Dater hub removed as an emergency measure to protect operational security, though return address often negated the blackout's intent. This example shows HMCS return with seaman's name and service number strengthens naval provenance. A very elusive precursor blackout cover. \$75.00 <u>SOLD</u>






Item 658-48 – 1st Canadian Scottish Regiment "batman" – 1943, pair of 4¢ War Issue tied by Winnipeg machine cancel on cover dated AP 14 43 to Pte Bachan K57484, 1st Canadian Scottish Regiment, Base APO Ottawa. Received at FPO SC 11, FPO 483, and FPO SC10 (b/s), then handled by the Postal Corps for tracing. Forwarded from the front to CMHQ Q Branch, the Canadian Military Headquarters logistics branch in London. UL annotation "C.C. Batman" referring to a personal valet responsible for maintaining officers' uniforms, equipment, personal effects, valise, and sometimes even their vehicle. \$60.00 SOLD





Item 658-49 – Peterborough Ont - 4¢ Empire to Jamaica – 1943, 4¢ War Issue tied by Peterborough Ont machine cancel on censored cover paying 4¢ Empire letter rate to Jamaica (b/s). \$30.00 SOLD



Item 658-50 – Delhi Stoddard Hotel advertising – 1944, 4¢ War Issue tied by Delhi Ont duplex cancel on Stoddard Hotel advertising cover paying 4¢ letter rate to Tillsonburg (b/s). Norfolk County. \$35.00




Item 658-51 – <u>Two different Waterford florist covers</u> – 1942 and 1944, 3¢ Mufti and 4¢ War Issue tied by Waterford Ont duplex cancel on two different National Floral Co. advertising covers. \$35.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 658-52 – <u>Chippawa 30¢ airmail to CAO</u> – 1944, 10¢ and 20¢ War Issue tied by Chippawa Ont cds on cover paying 30¢ airmail letter rate to Canadian Army Overseas. Addressed to Sig J.J. McKenzie B147468, Canadian Signals Reinforcement Unit (CSRU). "Transatlantic Service" in red crayon. \$75.00



Item 658-53 – <u>30¢ double weight airmail to France</u> – 1948, 20¢ War Issue tied by Montreal Canada clerk rubber handstamp on air letter sheet underpaying 30¢ double-weight airmail rate (15¢ per ¼ oz) to France. Shortpaid 10¢, assessed 100 UPU centimes, converted to 20 Fr in France. A colourful and attractive usage. \$100.00





Item 658-54 – Mono Road Station Ont registered (Peel) – 1946, 14¢ War Issue tied by matching Mono Road Station Ont broken circle on cover dated JA 7 46, paying 14¢ registered letter rate to Hamilton (b/s). Latest recorded date for this hammer (Hammer IV, previously recorded to OC 25 43). Hamilton & Meaford RPO No.3 (b/s). A scarce Peel County cover. \$40.00 SOLD



Item 658-55 – <u>Underpaid 5¢ UPU to Holland</u> – 1946, 4¢ War Issue tied by Toronto machine cancel on cover underpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Amsterdam, Holland.
