





Item 659-01 – <u>St. Thomas Tannery (Elgin County)</u> – 1861 stampless cover from St. Thomas, UC, showing the striking M.T. Moore & Son Tannery cameo advertising, paid 5¢ through charge box No. 45 paying the letter rate to Strathburn via Glencoe (b/s). The tannery promoted its manufacture of leather of all kinds, including harnesses, saddles, trunks, and valises. An exceptional and highly elusive Southern Ontario advertising cover of the 1860s, only the second example I have handled. \$750.00



Item 659-02 – Montreal produce and commission merchant circular – 1864, 1¢ Decimal tied by Montreal CE Berri duplex on Thomas W. Raphael Produce & Commission Merchant 3-page circular to Peterboro, paying 1¢ circular rate. Contents list produce, leather, hardware, fruit, petroleum, tobacco, etc., with customs import statistics and Customs House returns for Port of Montreal. Attractive and informative 3-page circular. \$150.00



Item 659-03 – Goderich CW Berri duplex cancel – 1863, 1¢ Decimal tied by Goderich CW Berri duplex on cover paying 1¢ drop letter rate. Berri recorded 1860–1864. \$150.00







Item 659-04 – <u>St. Francois de Beauce LC registered</u> – 1865, 5¢ Beaver tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from St. Francois Beauce LC to Murray Bay, Charlevoix County, paying 5¢ letter rate. 2¢ registry fee paid in cash. Quebec transit (b/s). Postmarks struck in black and dark red registered handstamp. An attractive cover. \$150.00





Item 659-05 – Mourning cover to Kingsey CE and to Drummondville – 1867, 5¢ Beaver tied by Montreal CE Berri duplex on mourning cover to Elm Free Farm, Kingsey CE, paying 5¢ letter rate (double circle b/s). Routed via Drummondville and Richmond (b/s), then redirected to Drummondville (b/s). \$150.00







Item 659-06 – <u>Fitzroy Harbour CW registered (Carleton)</u> – 1864, 5¢ Beaver tied by concentric ring cancel on Montreal Transcript reply cover from Fitzroy Harbour CW to Montreal, paying 5¢ letter rate; 2¢ registry fee paid in cash. Routed via Pakenham and Brockville (b/s). Early printed reply envelope. \$150.00




Item 659-07 – 10¢ Consort – Newcastle CW mourning cover – 1861, 10¢ Consort (printing order 4C, brownish purple) cancelled by concentric ring on mourning cover from Newcastle CW to Illinois, paying 10¢ cross-border letter rate. An early Berri duplex and Hammer II for Newcastle, Durham County. \$300.00



Item 659-08 – <u>American Express Co. from Toronto CW</u> – 1864, law paper and money package from Toronto with red label "Money Package forwarded by American Express Company from Toronto C.W." to Perth. Paid manuscript dated 2/1/64. Docketing notes: parcel belongs to Sheriff of Perth County, Stratford, with signature. Address to Perth scratched out and redirected to Stratford. American Express Co. competed with registered mail system; American and British Express Companies merged October 1861. Very pretty! \$750.00

Item 659-09 – **St. John N.B freight circular to Maine U.S.** – 1869, 1¢ Large Queen tied by two-ring 7 cancel on Scammel Brothers Merchants large freight circular from St. John N.B. paying 1¢ circular rate to Wiscasset, Maine. Lists schooners and freight options to the coast and South America, detailed vessel listings from St. John to Cuba and other informative content, issued in the context of declining cotton and grain markets. \$250.00





Item 659-10 – Georgetown PEI registered – 1891, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by fancy cancel on cover from Georgetown PEI paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Charlottetown (b/s). \$100.00





Item 659-11 – <u>Cardigan Bridge PEI registered</u> – 1892, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by heavy grid cancel on cover from Cardigan Bridge PEI paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Charlottetown (b/s). \$125.00





Item 659-12 – <u>Stanley Bridge PEI registered</u> – 1892, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by heavy grid cancel on cover from Stanley Bridge PEI paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Charlottetown (b/s) via Breadalbane (b/s). \$100.00



Item 659-13 – <u>Cherry Grove PEI registered</u> – 1892, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by grid cancel on cover from Cherry Grove PEI paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Charlottetown (b/s) via Souris West (b/s). Cherry Grove PEI Canada 3-part date. \$125.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 659-14 – <u>Summerside PEI registered</u> – 1891, 3¢ SQ, 5¢ RLS tied by heavy grid cancel on cover from Summerside PEI paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Charlottetown (b/s). \$100.00





Item 659-15 – <u>Stouffville Ont registered (York County)</u> – 1885, 3¢ SQ and 5¢ RLS tied by fancy cancel on cover from Stouffville Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Philadelphia via Toronto and Buffalo (b/s). Oval Registered Toronto handstamp (b/s). \$125.00



Item 659-16 – <u>Bervie Ont (Bruce County and the 2nd recorded example)</u> – 1884, 3¢ SQ and 5¢ RLS tied by cork cancel on cover from Bervie Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Philadelphia, via Kincardine, Hamilton and Buffalo (b/s). Postmark is the 2nd recorded example, and the earliest of the two. Records span DE 6 84 to SE 7 85 only. \$250.00





Item 659-17 – <u>St. John 20¢ triple wgt registered to England</u> – 1889, 5¢ SQ (3) and 5¢ RLS tied by grid cancel on cover from St. John N.B., dated JA 28 89, paying 20¢ triple-weight registered rate to England (b/s). Oval Registered London FE 12 89 and receiver FE 13 89 (b/s). \$250.00



Item 659-18 – <u>12¢ registered printed matter rate with Jubilees</u> – 1898, 2¢ and 10¢ Jubilee tied by oval Registered cancel on cover from Toronto to Windsor, paying 12¢ registered printed matter rate. 7¢ for 7 oz plus 5¢ registry fee. Foxing present. A rare and unusual franking, seldom seen combination on printed matter cover. \$400.00



Item 659-19 – **17¢ quadruple weight registered to U.S.** – 1897, 2¢ and 5¢ (3) Jubilee tied by London Ont. cds cancel on cover paying 17¢ quadruple-weight registered letter rate to Mount Vernon, Indiana. Windsor and Detroit transit (b/s). London Postmaster handstamp on official envelope, form 31-15,000 28-10-96. Rare franking and striking usage. \$500.00







Item 659-20 – **8¢ registered cover with Jubilees – L.C.D.** – 1898, 2¢ and 6¢ Jubilee tied by Ottawa roller cancel on cover from Ottawa, boxed Registered Ottawa, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Addressed to McGill College Avenue with St. Catherine St. Montreal Letter Carrier Depot LCD (b/s). A lovely 6¢ Jubilee domestic use. ¢\$400.00



Item 659-21 – **9¢ double wgt Empire registered to New Zealand** – 1903, 1¢, 2¢ (4) Numeral tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Charlottetown PEI paying 9¢ double-weight Empire registered letter rate to New Zealand. Routed via Montreal, Chicago and San Francisco, with SF registry exchange label affixed. Large cover folded in half before mailing, postmark struck across backflap. A pretty registry label use. \$400.00



Item 659-22 – Loring Ont, Parry Sound, 2¢ printed matter rate to England – 1903, 2¢ Numeral tied by grid cancel on E.H. Kelcey General Merchant wrapper from Loring Ont., endorsed "cards only," paying 2¢ printed matter rate to England (1¢ per 4 oz). Redirected within. Edward Kelcey, General Merchant and Postmaster of Loring, served 1886–1913. Spectacular rate cover. \$150.00





Item 659-23 – A pair of 5¢ UPU letter rate covers to Spain - 1902, two Numeral-franked covers from Toronto, each paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Spain via New York. One cover overpaid 1¢ for convenience; the other mistakenly addressed to England before correction, originally directed like the first to Cuevas del Almanzora. Both with receiver (b/s). An impressive and rare pair, Spain a very scarce destination in all periods. \$500.00





Item 659-24 – <u>Baxter Ont (Simcoe 1890-1914)</u> – 1899, 1¢, 3¢ (2) Numeral tied by grid cancel on Rennie cover mailed from Baxter Ontario paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Routed via Angus and carried by Hamilton & Allandale M.C. (b/s). A tough Simcoe office and scarce 3¢ Numeral use. \$50.00





Item 659-25 – <u>Utopia Ont (Simcoe Coutny)</u> – 1899, 1¢, 3¢ (2) Numeral tied by grid cancel on Rennie cover mailed from Utopia Ontario paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Carried by Hamilton & Allandale M.C. (b/s). A decent 3¢ Numeral use. \$35.00




Item 659-26 – <u>Dutton Ont (Elgin Coutny)</u> – 1901, 2¢, 5¢ Numeral tied by Dutton Ont cds on cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). \$30.00



Item 659-27 – <u>Brougham Ont (Ontario Coutny)</u> – 1900, 2¢, 3¢ Numeral tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Brougham Ont paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Greenwood (b/s). \$40.00

Item 659-28 – <u>Peterborough Bookstore added to 1¢ Maple Leaf postcard</u> – 1899, 1¢ Maple Leaf stationery card with privately added advertising for Stratton & Co. and Peterborough Bookstore paying 1¢ postcard rate to Preston. \$40.00 **SOLD**






Item 659-29 – <u>Toronto wooden postcard postally used</u> – 1908, 2¢ Edward tied by Toronto Ont duplex on patriotic wooden postcard with Legislative Building real photo attached, paying 2¢ letter rate to Belleville. Wooden postcards were permitted but required letter postage. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>






Item 659-30 – <u>Postcard mailed in glassine</u> – 1908, 1¢ Edward on novelty postcard ornamented with bird and envelope enclosing written message, mailed in glassine; cancelled by Waterford Ont broken circle, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Hillsborough NB. Mailing postcards in glassine was common practice to prevent injury to workers and damage to machines, though attachments such as this were contrary to regulations. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 659-31 – GTR5C Islands of Kawartha Lakes (Sepia) – 1905, 1¢ Edward GTR freight stationery card mailed in Toronto to local, Webb GTR5C. \$30.00



Item 659-32 – <u>Cobalt Stocks (mining related)</u> – 1906, 2¢ Edward tied by Toronto machine cancel on J.T. Eastwood & Co. Brokers corner card and Cobalt Stocks advertising, paying 2¢ letter rate to Maine (b/s). Mining-related. \$25.00



Item 659-33 – <u>Fireproof Gyproc KP55b</u> – c.1924, 1¢ orange and ½¢ blue Admiral on Gyproc advertising stationery card, depicting workers hanging drywall, insulating a home, and a house on fire; Webb KP55b, 153×101 mm, mailed from Paris Ont to Hamilton. Spectacular and among the rarest stationery items. \$600.00



Item 659-34 – Jusqu'a cover to Puerto Rico – 1929, 5¢ Airmail C1 tied by Vancouver BC cds on cover, endorsed "Airmail to New York" with jusqu'à marking, paying 5¢ rate to Puerto Rico. Carried by airmail to New York, then surface to San Juan. \$100.00





Item 659-35 – Military Service Act registered cover – 1917, M.S.A. OHMS free-franked window cover, mailed registered free from Calgary to Penhole (b/s); appears signed J.M. Carson. Slight rough opening at left. \$40.00 SOLD







Item 659-36 – Witley Canadian Military Camp Surrey, England – 1919, trio of unmailed postcards, The Camp, published by Eatons The Bookstall; one written and dated 1919, a second also dated 1919, and a third unused. Camp Witley was a temporary army camp on Witley Common, Surrey, established by the Canadian Army. After the Armistice of 1918, the camp remained in operation as a staging area before troops returned to Canada. Trio \$100.00 SOLD



Item 659-37 – <u>Posted by a wounded soldier</u> – 1918, Canadian soldier's letter with cover from Shenstone House hospital near Manchester, dated JA 16 18, to Vancouver. Cover bears the rare "*Posted by a Wounded Soldier*" handstamp in purple. In his letter, Sapper W.H. Bremmer notes being wounded on NO 6 17 at Passchendaele, arriving in England on NO 13 17, and remaining bedridden at the hospital for at least a month; he thanks Miss Mary Howe for the parcel she sent. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 659-38 – <u>Canadian School of Musketry RPPC</u> – 1916, Canadian School of Musketry CEF 1st Course real photo postcard, Rockcliffe Ottawa, photo by Pittaway; unused, on Azo paper. \$75.00





Item 659-39 – Royal Flying Corps, not in Baghdad – 1918, 2¢+1¢ War Tax tied by Bishops Crossing Que cds (Wolfe County) on cover to RAF airmen in London (*Buy National War Bonds receiver on front*). Redirectional manuscript in red: Queens College Oxford, Uxbridge; not Baghdad. Address unknown at Armament School RAF, undeliverable marking and Air Ministry Personal Letter Section (b/s). Returned to sender via Ottawa Dead Letter Branch (Orb cds). In 1918, the RFC was actively supporting Britain's Mesopotamia Campaign in and around Baghdad against the Ottoman Empire, flying reconnaissance etc. A spectacular Royal Flying Corps cover. \$350.00 SOLD





Item 659-40 – Toronto soldier mail returned DLO – 1916, 1¢, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto International machine cancel on cover to Pte. J.W. Long, Motor Transport Army Service Corps, APO London (Lee S.E. receiver b/s). Redirected to Avonmouth, ms "for overseas" and with "unknown" manuscript. Location uncertain, insufficiently addressed markings. Returned to sender via Ottawa Dead Letter Branch (Orb cds). Reverse bears manuscript "Opened," though unclear if at DLO or in England. \$150.00





Item 659-41 – Registered to Canadian in France, died of wounds – 1918, GB 3d tied by Aylesbury cds on registered cover to Robert R. Edwards, 512078, 8th Canadian Field Ambulance, BEF France. Canadian Contingent Record Office Postal Despatched marking, with numerous FPO and APO backstamps (7, RP3, C7). Endorsed "Died of Wounds" and returned. Driver Edwards was from Winnipeg Manitoba, had served with the 8th Field Ambulance since June 1916. Hospitalized at No. 39 Field Hospital (MR 15 17), transferred to Base Depot (JY 3 17), then to No. 51 General Hospital (JY 14 17), and died (JU 12 18). A seldom-seen registered cover to a Canadian ambulance driver, marked "Died of Wounds.". \$300.00 SOLD





Item 659-42 – Paris Ontario soldier mail returned DLO – 1915, 2¢ Admiral and 1¢ War Tax MR1 tied by Paris Ont duplex cancel on cover to Thomas A. Martin, 2 Sqn, 4 Tp, Fort Garry Horse, Canterbury, England. Redirected to BEF France, unable to trace; no record at CCAC Folkestone. Returned to sender via echelons, FPOs, and Record Office Postal Despatched, arriving at Ottawa DLO AU 12 16. In April 1915 the Fort Garry Horse moved to Canterbury to form the Canadian Cavalry Depot, where for nine months they trained and reinforced the Canadian Cavalry Brigade, then fighting dismounted in France. Thomas Martin, from Winnipeg, later served in the Battle of the Somme. \$200.00 SOLD





Item 659-43 – <u>Victoria BC soldier mail to Halifax, sailed</u> – 1917, 2¢ + 1¢ War Tax tied by Victoria BC cds on cover to George Arthur Munford, 2044114, Div. of Ammunition Depot CEF, Halifax. Manuscript "sailed," then forwarded to England. At APO London, Munford was untraceable; redirected to APO 2 Canadian Section (JU 27, JY 4). No evidence of return, perhaps successfully delivered. Research notes Munford was a surveyor from BC, enrolled in the militia before the War with the 5th Regiment. \$150.00 **SOLD**





Item 659-44 – Toronto registered to soldier, died of wounds – 1917, 5¢ Admiral, 2¢+1¢ War Tax tied by Toronto Sub No.116 cds on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to a serviceman of the 19th Canadian Battalion in France (numerous FPO postmarks b/s, including S.28 Wimereux, France). Addressed to Pte. Clarence Abbey of Toronto. Records show he embarked at Halifax AU 8 16 on the S.S. Cameronia, arrived Liverpool AU 19 16, and was assigned to the 19th Battalion OC 11 16, having previously served with the 123rd Battery, A Company. He died of wounds JU 3 17. Abbey was a Toronto pattern maker before enlistment. Cover bears numerous tracing markings, including manuscript "hospital," together with multiple backstamps. Returned to Canada via Ottawa DLO (b/s). \$400.00 SOLD





Item 659-45 – Ottawa to servicemen of the 27th Battalion – 1916, 2¢+1¢ War Tax tied by Ottawa Exhibition machine cancel on cover to Pte. Edward Mulvey, 27th Battalion, 2nd Canadian Contingent, BEF, England. FPO 9X receiver b/s; likely wounded as cover redirected to 3rd Northern General Hospital in Sheffield. Traced by 3rd echelon with Canadian Record Office "Postal Despatched" (b/s). Sheffield receiver on front. Rough opening with paper loss at LR. \$100.00





Item 659-46 – <u>Victoria BC to Officer, died of wounds in La Somme</u> – 1916, 2¢+1¢ War Tax perforated 8x12 MR5 tied by Victoria machine cancel on cover to Lt. J.R. Horton, Canadian Regt and Div, BEF France. Field Post Office 1X receiver (b/s). Undeliverable marking with Canadian Contingent Record Office "Postal Despatched." Lt. Robert Horton died of wounds in the Battle of the Somme. Records note Horton was a Victoria architect before enlistment. He served with the 88th Battalion (Victoria Fusiliers), CEF. \$300.00 SOLD





Item 659-47 – Wolverhampton to servicemen of the Canadian Scottish – 1917, GB 1d tied by Wolverhampton machine cancel on cover to Pte. Thomas John Buckley, Canadian Scottish, France. Buckley had previously served in the British Army with the East Kent 11th Battalion, later emigrated to Canada, and reenlisted in the Canadian Army at Winnipeg, Man., in 1916. Records note he was a real estate agent. Likely wounded, as the cover was redirected to the 16th General Hospital in Arlington. Traced by Canadian Record Office "Postal Despatched" (b/s), with FPO TP1 and APO 2 Canadian Section. \$150.00





Item 659-48 – <u>St. Catharines, highly decorated Major, 10th Battalion (a doctor)</u> – 1916, 2¢+1¢ War Tax tied by St. Catharines Ont machine cancel on cover to Major John Clement Ball, OBE, DSO, 10th Battalion, 3rd Brigade, France. 




