Item 660-01 – Montreal to Champlain refused – 1849 folded cover from Montreal rated 9d collect to Champlain (double circle in black with manuscript date), carried via Three Rivers (b/s); boldly marked "Refusée" manuscript on both sides, receiver possibly protesting the charge and likely diverted to the Dead Letter Office. A scarce early refusal endorsement with a lovely Champlain double circle as receiver. \$150.00 SOLD





Item 660-02 – <u>Nova Scotia turned cover</u> – 1859 N.S. 3d cover from Londonderry dated MY 11 59, stamp removed after paying the 3d letter rate to Lower Stewiacke; turned in early 1860 and re-used, franked with N.S. 3d three-margined copy tied by oval grid on the same cover dated FE 11 60, paying the letter rate from Truro to Halifax. A scarce turned usage with re-franking. \$350.00



Item 660-03 – Western Fair and Line McDonald & Co. – 1897, 3¢ Small Queen tied by London Orb cancel on Western Fair advertising cover with Line, McDonald & Co. corner card, paying the 3¢ letter rate to Amherstburg (b/s). Very pretty!. \$150.00 SOLD



Item 660-04 – North Williamsburg Ont (3rd hammer 1888-1890) – 1890, 3¢ SQ tied by partial North Williamsburg, Ont. broken circle on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s) via Morrisburg (b/s). The cover bears a very pretty North Williamsburg free strike of the 3rd hammer, 20mm, with period after "Ont.", recorded only from 1888 to 1890. Scarce short-lived hammer usage. Dundas County. \$75.00





Item 660-05 – Henry Hechler to New York stamp dealer – 1888, ½¢ SQ block of 6 (upper right stamp notably jumbo, VF, with large margin) tied by Halifax duplex cancel on Burger & Co. Stamp Dealer reply cover from Henry Hechler, paying 3¢ letter rate to New York. Henry Hechler, German-born Halifax tobacconist and photographer turned leading stamp dealer, prolific advertiser, military captain, and president of the Canadian Philatelic Association later the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada. \$100.00 SOLD





Item 660-06 – <u>Stratford Ont to Indianapolis (Perth County)</u> – 1881, 3¢ Small Queen in a bright orange shade with 5¢ RLS, both tied by fancy cancel on cover from Stratford, Ont., paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Indianapolis (b/s), carried by GWR to London (b/s), one of the best GWR strike seen as they are usually faint, nice fancy cancels. \$125.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 660-07 – <u>Cedar Dale Ont registered (scythes, forks, hoes)</u> – 1885, 3¢ SQ and 2¢ RLS tied by faint smudged fancy cancel on A.S. Whiting Manufacturing Company advertising cover, paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Halifax (b/s), addressed to Henry Hechler. Whiting produced many different advertising designs over the years, but this early 1880s example is much scarcer and especially elusive in registered form. A striking Ontario County office cover, closed in 1924. \$250.00



Item 660-08– Moore's Mills N.B. (Charlotte County) – 1897, ½¢ SQ block of 6 with 5¢ Small Queen, both tied by oval grid cancels on M.R. Knight of Oak Hill cover mailed from Moore's Mills, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to St. Stephen (b/s). Addressed to the Postmaster, Daniel Sullivan Jr. An interesting cover with Postmaster addressee interest. \$100.00 SOLD






Item 660-09 – Massey Manufacturing Co., Toronto West Branch – 1884, 3¢ Small Queen and 2¢ RLS tied by the rare Toronto West Branch Office duplex cancel on Massey Manufacturing Co. advertising cover (DON-1844, in use only three years), paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Armadale (Unionvale b/s customary on covers to Armadale). A tough and desirable West Branch usage, Ex Greene. \$350.00 SOLD





Item 660-10 – <u>Oval "Registered Ottawa Free" to U.S.</u> – 1896, Department of Public Printing cover from Ottawa with oval "Registered Ottawa Free" dated SP 25 96, paying the free franking registered rate to the United States (b/s); addressed to Judd Paper Co., Holyoke, Massachusetts. Routed via Montreal and Boston (b/s). Although a foreign destination, stamps were not required on official mail to the U.S. in 1896. The Postal Guide (p. xxxvii, art. 21) specified that correspondence franked as official by competent authority in the U.S. would be delivered in Canada free of postage, with the same privilege extended to duly franked Canadian correspondence addressed to the United States. \$200.00



Item 660-11 – Ottawa in grid cancel – 1881, 5¢ Small Queen olive-grey shade, Montreal printing perf 12, tied by Ottawa in-grid cancel on cover, signed "LL" and initially unfranked, sent to the Ottawa exchange office where the 5¢ stamp was applied, paying the 5¢ UPU letter rate to London, England. Reverse shows seal cutout. Still a desirable Ottawa in-grid cover, Lacelle 689 FE 1881 to AP 1882. \$150.00



Item 660-12 – Ottawa Barred Circle – 1892, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Ottawa with Barred Circle SP 3 P2 92 paying 1¢ postcard rate to Montreal. Delivered by letter carrier with two strikes MT SP 3 92, the same day. The Barred Circle postmarks are often referred to as the forerunners or precursors of the squared circles. \$50.00






Item 660-13 – <u>By Allan Line Polynesian from Quebec</u> – 1873, 6¢ Small Queen tied by Quebec CE duplex cancel on cover paying 6¢ Allan Line letter rate to Clitheroe, England (b/s), carried by the Polynesian from Quebec to Liverpool (JY 19, JY 28). Reverse with horseshoe and belt blazon. \$150.00



Item 660-14 – **By Allan Line Sarmatian, Winnipeg to France (Chateau)** – 1888, 6¢ Small Queen tied by Winnipeg Man duplex cancel on cover overpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Bordeaux, France (b/s). Endorsed via New Yprk and Le Havre. Routed via London and entered in France in Calais. From Bordeaux, redirected to Château de Canteloup. Carried by the Allan Line ship Sarmatian from Quebec to Liverpool (MY 17, MY 27). \$150.00



Item 660-15 – Mont Morin Que (Terrebonne, closed in 1901) – 1897, 1¢ Jubilee stationery card mailed from Mont Morin, Que., paying 1¢ postcard rate to Montreal, carrier mark. Mont Morin is a difficult Quebec office in Terrebonne County, closed in 1901. Scarce. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 660-16 – <u>Unfinished flag cancel (type 9-1)</u> – 1897, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Ottawa with Bickerdike machine cancel type 9-1, the unfinished flag cancel, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Ottawa. \$75.00 **SOLD**






Item 660-17 – <u>Ulverton Que registered (Drummond)</u> – 1898, 1¢ (2), 3¢ (2) Numeral tied by oval registered and Ulverton Que cds on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). A decent 3¢ Numeral use. \$50.00



Item 660-18 – Montreal Imperial machine M3 – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by Imperial machine cancel M3 (1899-1900) on Herald Publishing Company c/c cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. Perfect strike. \$50.00






Item 660-19 – <u>Lisle Ont 8¢ Numeral use in period (Simcoe)</u> – 1898, 8¢ Numeral tied by Lisle, Ont. broken circle on cover dated <u>NO 1 98</u>, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Barrie (b/s); carried by Hamilton & Allandale MC and Beeton & Collingwood MC (b/s). The 8¢ Numeral stamp was issued SE 24 98 and considered in period until DE 31 98. An exhibit cover. \$200.00



Item 660-20 – Ross Mount Ont registered to London seedsmen – 1903, 2¢ and 5¢ Numerals tied by grid cancel on Darch & Hunter Seedsmen reply cover mailed from Ross Mount, Ont., paying the 7¢ registered letter rate to London (b/s); routed via Port Hope and carried by Mont & Tor GTR (b/s). Ross Mount, a Durham and Northumberland County office, closed in 1924. A very scarce cover from this short-lived office. \$75.00



Item 660-21 – A.R. Williams Machinery & Co. – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by York Street Toronto squared circle on A.R. Williams & Co. Machinery advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Brantford (b/s). Illustrated with views of the Head Office and factory, the London factory, the Montreal warehouse, and Union Station. An attractive multi-view Victorian advertising design. \$125.00



Item 660-22 – <u>Toronto Commercial Nurseries</u> – 1903, 2¢ Numeral tied by Toronto machine cancel on Commercial Nurseries advertising cover, illustrated with Governor Wood cherry, Rose Marshall, Bartlett pear, and Grapes of Moore, paying the 2¢ letter rate to Smithfield (b/s), with Brighton transit (b/s). Attractive multi-fruit advertising cover. \$100.00 SOLD



Item 660-23 – <u>The Hamilton Herald</u> – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by Hamilton Bickerdike machine cancel on The Herald advertising cover, illustrated with Dominion of Canada 1889 One Cent coin, paying 2¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Notably, no 1-cent coins were struck for 1889, as minting in England coincided with the change in Queen Victoria's profile between 1888 and 1890, with production resuming in 1890 under the new design. An attractive coin-themed advertising cover. \$75.00






Item 660-24 – <u>Haliburton Ont registered cover</u> – 1902, 2¢, 5¢ Numeral tied by grid cancel on F. Freeman c/c cover from Haliburton Ont paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Ohio (b/s). Via Toronto and Buffalo (b/s). Carried by Lindsay & Haliburton MC (b/s). \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 660-25 – Ontario Silver Company advertising – 1902, 2¢ Numeral tied by Niagara Falls, Ont. duplex cancel on Ontario Silver Company advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to London (b/s). The firm were silverplate manufacturers, chiefly associated with Oneida Silversmiths. Pretty! \$150.00




Item 660-26 – J.H. Still & Co. St. Thomas Ontario – 1903, 1¢ Numeral pair tied by St. Thomas, Ont. duplex cancel on J.H. Still & Co. Ltd. Lumber Mill advertising cover, paying the 2¢ letter rate to Halifax (b/s). James Still first established business in St. Thomas on Talbot St. in the late 1860s, later relocating Still's Handle and Turning Works from Tilbury to the southeast corner of Wellington and Railway St. (now Princess Ave.), destroyed by fire in 1898. The J.H. Still operation was then opened on Elm St. in the Crystal Palace of the Southern Counties Fair, which had just ceased operations. A fine advertising usage with rich local history. \$150.00






Item 660-27 – New York special delivery to Toronto – 1908, US 2¢ Washington tied by New York duplex cancel, with Canada 10¢ Special Delivery E1 pen-cancelled, on Schepp & Co. cover from New York paying 12¢ special delivery letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Correspondence serial no. 1596. Before Jan. 1, 1923, US special delivery mail required Canadian special delivery stamps to obtain service; these were not to be cancelled in the US. Attractive E1 cover of the Tercentenary/Edward era. \$250.00



Item 660-28 – Montreal boiler makers, steam fitters and plumbers – 1911, 1¢ Edward stationery card with Thomas Robertson & Co. of Montreal advertising, mailed from Hawkesbury paying 1¢ postcard rate to Prescott. Thomas Robertson & Co. Ltd., a major Montreal firm, supplied engineers, boiler makers, steam fitters, plumbers, tinsmiths, and railways as importers, hardware, and metal merchants. Known for extensive trade catalogs, the card relates to a representative's visit. \$75.00




Item 660-29 – <u>Lady illustrated, shampooing & bathing</u> – 1910, 1¢ Edward (2) tied by Toronto International machine cancel on Eureka Toilet Co. advertising cover promoting "Neato" for shampooing and bathing paying 2¢ rate to London (b/s). The cover features a lady illustration in mirror motif, hair styled voluminously, holding bottle of Neato. Lightly reduced at right. \$75.00





Item 660-30 – <u>Kenaston Sask registered</u> – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on newspaper reply cover mailed from Kenaston Sask paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Regina & North Battleford RPO No.1 6 (b/s). \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>





Item 660-31 – <u>Swift Current Sask registered</u> – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on newspaper reply cover mailed from Swift Current Sask paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Moose Jaw & Calgary No.6 (b/s). \$25.00 <u>SOLD</u>






Item 660-32 – Rokeby Sask registered – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on newspaper reply cover mailed from Rokeby Sask paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). York & Sask RPO No.3 (3 strikes). \$50.00 SOLD





Item 660-33 – <u>Southey Sask registered</u> – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Southey Sask duplex cancel on newspaper reply cover 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Brandon & Saskatoon RPO No.1, Winnipeg & Moose Jaw RPO No.13 (b/s). \$40.00 <u>SOLD</u>



Item 660-34 – A.R. Williams Machinery & Co. – 1915, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto machine cancel on A.R. Williams Machinery & Co. advertising cover, featuring wax-seal logo within scroll design, paying 2¢ letter rate to Greenwood (b/s), with Whitby transit (b/s). \$40.00




Item 660-35 – <u>E2 42½mm Ottawa to Halifax</u> – 1929, 3¢ Admiral and 20¢ Special Delivery E2 (*dry printing, 42½ mm wide*) tied by multiple Ottawa Orb cancels on cover paying 23¢ special delivery letter rate to Halifax. Halifax JY 4 (b/s). Confederation and Scroll issues were current at the time. \$50.00





Item 660-36 – <u>La Beauce to Massachusetts via Sherbrooke</u> – 1928, 12¢ Confederation tied by St. Joseph de Beauce PQ duplex cancel on cover paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Massachusetts (b/s). Carried by Ste. Sabine & Beauce Junction RPO QC-497 (Ste. Sabine & Bce. Jct), then by Levis & Sherbrooke RPO to Sherbrooke. A seldom-encountered route! \$50.00







Item 660-37 – <u>Tree Line Navigation Co. (Fort Willam/Montreal)</u> – 1929, 2¢ Scroll tied by Hamilton machine cancel on Tree Line Navigation Company advertising cover, illustrating shipping routes through the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River, paying 2¢ drop letter rate. The company operated in Great Lakes–St. Lawrence trade, linking growing grain traffic from the Lakehead (Fort William/Port Arthur) to eastern markets via Montreal. \$50.00 SOLD



Item 660-38 – **8¢ UPU letter rate to Columbia** – 1929, 2¢ Scroll (4) tied by Ottawa machine cancel on cover paying 8¢ UPU surface rate to Colombia. No receiver, but 16 DE 29 handstamp struck in purple on front. \$50.00



Item 660-39 – <u>KP84d blue coloured stock reply card</u> – c1929, ½¢ Scroll blue coloured stock stationery card with added private precancel on Warbutton's promotion card from Hamilton, boxholder to "*The Man Who Wears Good Clothes*". Webb KP84d (p.172). \$75.00 **SOLD**





Item 660-40 — 1¢ Scroll postcard underpaid (Carleton County) — 1930, 1¢ Scroll tied by Toronto machine cancel on postcard underpaying 2¢ domestic postcard rate to Osgoode. Rated 2¢ collect, paid with 2¢ Postage Due First Issue tied by Osgoode Station cds. \$40.00





Item 660-41 – Ottawa \$7.85 registered money packet – 1932, \$1 Scroll, 5¢, 20¢, 50¢ Arch (50¢ with fault or pre-affixing fault), and 10¢ Cartier tied by oval registered cancels on Bank of Toronto mailing tag from Ottawa, paying \$7.85 registered money-packet rate to Toronto (b/s). Represents 155 ounces plus 10¢ registry fee. \$300.00



Item 660-42 – Montreal PQ roller 118 – c.1930, 1¢ GEOV wrapper mailed from Montreal with a very fine strike of roller No.118, paying 1¢ printed-matter rate to Rosemont (within the Island). Unclear whether the black bar represents a "1" for 1¢ postage due. Attractive strike of roller 118. \$35.00 SOLD




Item 660-43 – St. Francois Xavier de Brompton Que MOOD (Richmond) – 1933, 3¢ Ottawa Conference tied by St. François Xavier de Brompton Que MOOD cancel on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. \$40.00 SOLD



Item 660-44 – <u>Chambord Junction Que MOOD (Lac St. Jean)</u> - 1933, 1¢, 2¢ Medallion tied by Chambord Junction PQ MOOD cancel on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. Closed in 1934. \$50.00 <u>SOLD</u>




Item 660-48 – ENX33-6 2¢ Medallion private order "Specimen" – c.1933, 2¢ Brown Medallion Issue window envelope, private-order specimen stationery, Webb ENX33-6, with scalloped Specimen Only handstamp and initials. 100.00



Item 660-49 – <u>Toronto Photo Service mailer with 3¢ Medallion precancel</u> – 1936, 3¢ Medallion 4530 precancel tied by Toronto machine cancel on Photo Service mailer paying 3¢ triple-weight printed-matter rate to Lansdowne (b/s). Precancel clearly tied. 50.00



Item 660-50 – <u>Hamilton Homeside registered</u> – 1939, 4¢ and 8¢ Mufti tied by grid cancel on cover from Hamilton Homeside sub-office, paying 12¢ drop registered letter (b/s). The Homeside P.O. was located on Kenilworth Ave. and operated in seven separate periods between 1917 and 1977; this example falls in the 4th period, 1934–1942. \$60.00






Item 660-51 – 6¢ Empire All-up airmail rate to Holy Land 14 mils postage due – 1938, 1¢ and 2¢ Mufti tied by Toronto machine cancel on cover to Ramat Gan, Palestine, underpaying the 6¢ half-ounce letter rate Empire All-up airmail rate. T30 with advisory marking, converted to 14 mils due, refused, charge not collected, and returned to Canada. A spectacular shortpaid cover with postage due stamps left unpaid and returned. \$500.00 SOLD



Item 660-52 – <u>Pilot Walter McManus MIA/KIA correspondence</u> – 1941–42 correspondence to and from Canadian Pilot Walter B. McManus J5469, serving with RAF/RCAF in Northern Ireland and other Great Britain stations, variously redirected. Spousal correspondence between Mrs. McManus and P/O McManus from Hamilton, St. Thomas, and Merritton, Ontario. Includes <u>two Reported Killed</u> handstamp covers with regret label, a <u>Reported as Missing</u> handstamp, and a <u>printed CAO</u> cover. Numerous airmail rates, most censored. \$700.00



Item 660-53 – **5¢ double weight Empire surface to New Zealand** – 1940, 3¢ Mufti uncancelled on Canadian Pacific B.C. Coast Steamship cover underpaying the 5¢ double-weight Empire surface rate to New Zealand. Mailed onboard ship. On arrival in Auckland, marked *To Pay / 4d / Double Deficient Postage* for the double deficiency, then paid in Richmond with four 1d postage due stamps tied by the receiver cds. \$300.00




Item 660-54 – <u>15¢ airmail to Bermuda, T60, 10d due</u> – 1941, 3¢ (2) and 4¢ War issue tied by Rothesay, N.B. cds on college c/c cover underpaying 15¢ airmail letter rate to Bermuda. Shortpaid 5¢; assessed T60 centimes UPU for the double deficiency, then converted to 10d on arrival in Bermuda. \$75.00 **SOLD**






Item 660-55 – **5¢ surface to French India, T6** – 1949, 4¢ War issue tied by Nanaimo, B.C. machine cancel on cover underpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Pondicherry, French India, not considered within the British Empire. Marked T6 for the 1¢ deficiency. Pondicherry was transferred to India on 1 November 1954, becoming a Union Territory, with the treaty formally ratified by France in 1962. \$150.00 **SOLD**






Item 660-56 – **FECB Toronto to Argentina returned to Montreal DLO** – 1943, 4¢ War issue tied by Toronto machine cancel on FECB banking cover dated JY 12 43, paying 4¢ preferred letter rate to Argentina (b/s). Censor label DB.52. Multiple Buenos Aires markings; addressee unknown and returned to Canada via Montreal DLO JA 31 44 (b/s). 100.00




Item 660-57 – **5¢ UPU letter rate to Sweden, shortpaid** – 1949, 4¢ War issue tied by Toronto machine cancel on press and publisher c/c cover underpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Sweden. Marked T6 for the 1¢ deficiency. \$25.00





Item 660-58 – <u>Airgragh to Peterboro Ont, illegally by elderly civilian</u> – 1942 airgraph letter datelined West Dereham, Norfolk, NO 18 42, to Peterboro, Ontario. An interesting and unusual illegal use of the military free-frank system by an elderly civilian; her husband was likely employed by the military and used their facility to save postage. A very uncommon usage. \$50.00







Item 660-59 – <u>Two Salvaged from air crash covers, Moose Jaw DC-8</u> – 1954, 1¢ and 4¢ Karsh tied by Toronto machine cancel on cover with enclosure relating to Canada Railway News and Reliable Toy Company. Accompanied by a second Toronto cover addressed to Canada Railway News, Vancouver, bearing "Salvaged from TCA Wreck" handstamp. Moose Jaw Postal Inspector handstamp and explanatory letter included. On April 8, 1954, TCA Flight 9 (Canadair C-4 North Star) collided mid-air with an RCAF Harvard Mark II over Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan; both aircraft crashed. \$250.00 SOLD
