



Item 661-01 – Grimsby UC money letter (Lincoln) – 1840, folded money letter with content from Grimsby, UC, paid 1/2 to Vittoria. Originally postmaster free-franked, then crossed out; subsequently double-rated at 9d, also crossed out; finally paid 1/2, representing double 7d. Addressed to Crown Lands for the Talbot District and containing four dollars from Ryan McCurdy for the registration of two deeds. Recipient's notation on reverse indicating 7½d still owing for postage. \$150.00




Item 661-02 – **Queenston UC money letter (Lincoln)** – 1841, folded money letter with content from Queenston, UC, rated 2/9 collect to Kingston, representing triple 11d. Black straight-line Money Letter handstamp. Contained £68/10 in duties collected by the Customs Collector at Queenston. \$125.00



Item 661-03 – <u>Wardsville CW registered (31mm Ruggles)</u> – 1857, folded registered letter from Wardsville CW, with 31 mm Ruggles handstamp dated DE 25 57, paid 3 to St. Thomas (b/s) with registry fee paid in cash. This postmark is recorded from NO 12 57 to JY 4 64. A scarce postmark. Staining. \$125.00



Item 661-04 – <u>Death filing form used in London</u> – 1894, County of Middlesex "*Death*" filing form, mailed free-franked within London to local officials, delivered by letter carrier the same day. Relates to the Deeley family. \$150.00




Item 661-05 – <u>England to St. Catharines UC, 2½d collect</u> – 1846, family folded letter from Longport, England (Stoke-on-Trent), via Newcastle-under-Lyme, Staffordshire (b/s), to St. Catharines, UC. Carried by Cunard Cambria on her 7th voyage from Liverpool to Boston. "More to pay 2d" converted to 2½d; 2½d Arnell handstamp B3 applied at Montreal. Paid 1/ for the packet letter rate, with 2½d inland BNA postage collect. \$125.00






Item 661-06 – <u>Geological Survey Dept, Registered Free</u> – 1892, Geological Survey Dept cover, free-franked and registered, with oval Registered Ottawa Free MY 27 92 to Toronto. Purple Alfred Richard Cecil Selwyn signature handstamp; Selwyn was a British geologist and public servant, director of the Geological Survey of Victoria (1852–1869) and of the Geological Survey of Canada (1869–1894). File fold. \$150.00 SOLD







Item 661-07 – <u>Marriage license form mailed from London</u> – 1889, County of Middlesex "Marriage" clergyman filing form, mailed free-franked from London to Wilton Grove. An interesting free mailing. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 661-08 – <u>C.W. Gordon Insurance and Banker</u> – 1882, 3¢ SQ tied by London duplex cancel on C.W. Gordon Insurance and Banker (*money-to-loan*) c/c cover paying the 3¢ letter rate to Lucan (b/s). \$50.00



Item 661-09 – <u>Toronto Palmer House advertising</u> – 1893, 3¢ SQ tied by Toronto squared circle on Palmer House advertising cover, paying the 3¢ letter rate to Berlin (b/s). \$100.00






Item 661-10 – <u>Calgary squared circle SQ registered</u> – 1896, 8¢ SQ tied by Calgary, Alta., squared circle dated DE 16 96 on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to New York (b/s). Routed via Winnipeg and St. Paul, Minnesota (b/s). \$200.00 SOLD




Item 661-11 – 6¢ SQ chocolate brown – 1892, 6¢ SQ chocolate brown tied by Toronto Canada Barred Circle dated JU 15 92 on banking cover, paying 6¢ double-weight letter rate to London (b/s). \$150.00




Item 661-12 – West Lorne, Victorian oval mirror-style return address – 1878, 1¢ and 2¢ SQ tied by cork cancel on cover from West Lorne, Ont., with pretty and unusual Victorian oval mirror-style return address, paying 3¢ letter rate to Wardsville (b/s). Reduced at right. \$100.00






Item 661-13 – 1¢ Jubilee card, J. Winer & Co. Druggists – 1897, 1¢ Jubilee stationery, reverse with J. Winer & Co., Wholesale Druggists of Hamilton advertising, mailed from Listowel paying 1¢ postcard rate to Whesley. Jubilee stationery cards with advertising are all very scarce. \$125.00





Item 661-14 – 1¢ Maple Leaf card, J. Winer & Co. Druggists – 1899, 1¢ Maple Leaf stationery from Hamilton with Bickerdike machine dated FE 2 99, front with J. Winer & Co., Wholesale Druggists advertising, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Glencairn. \$75.00 SOLD



Item 661-15 – Winona fruit and nurseries – 1899, 1¢ Numeral tied by Winona, Ont., squared circle on Helderleigh Fruit Farms and Nurseries advertising unsealed cover, paying 1¢ printed-matter rate to Moncton (b/s). Lovely. \$75.00 SOLD





Item 661-16 – <u>Sevenoaks GB to Regina, underpaid</u> – 1908, GB ½d tied by Sevenoaks cds on postcard underpaying the 1d postcard rate to Regina, Saskatchewan (b/s). T10 and T(L), with circular "Postage Due 2 Cents" applied on arrival; postage paid with 2¢ Postage Due First Issue stamp tied by oval clerk handstamp. \$50.00



Item 661-17 – <u>WW1, Mess Dinner place card with General's signatures etc</u> – 1918, Anniversary Dinner place card with menu, held at Villers-Chatel on JU 9 18, card of Lt. Col. S. W. Watson (*DSO for distinguished service*). Signed by numerous senior Canadian officers and Generals, including Capt. Corrigan, Brig. Gen. Thacker, Maj. Gen. MacDowell, Maj. Gen. Loomis, Capt. Saunders, Maj. B. W., Capt. Mitchell, A. G. L. McNaughton, Maj. Earnshaw, Maj. Templeton, Brig. Gen. Tuxford, Lt. Matthews, Lt. Col. Currie, etc. Research papers and notes accompany. \$750.00 SOLD





Item 661-18 – **2¢ UPU postcard rate to Russia (Odessa, Ukraine)** – 1917, 2¢ Admiral stationery card from Montreal paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Odessa, Ukraine, Russia (at the time). Heavily written and censored. Sent during the chaotic months following the Russian Revolution, when Odessa then a major Black Sea port was caught between collapsing imperial authority, revolutionary councils, and emerging nationalist movements. Mail routes into southern Russia were unstable, censorship was strict, and foreign correspondence often delayed or intercepted. A rare and historically difficult destination. \$300.00 **SOLD**






Item 661-19 – **2¢ UPU postcard rate to Egypt** – 1913, 1¢ Admiral (2) tied by Montreal machine cancel on postcard paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Ismailia, Egypt. Ismailia, a strategic city on the west bank of the Suez Canal, served as an important administrative and military centre for the canal. Two receivers. \$100.00





Item 661-20 – 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Denmark – 1922, 5¢ Admiral tied by Edmonton Alta machine cancel on postcard underpaying 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Denmark. Marked "T" and ms 25 for 25 øre collect, paid with a Porto 25 øre Danish due stamp tied by Skanderborg cds. A pretty 5¢ Admiral violet use. \$200.00





Item 661-21 – 2¢ Admiral perf 8 horizontal coil to Belgium – 1920, 2¢ Admiral perf 8 horizontal coil (pulled perf LL) tied by Montreal machine cancel on postcard paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Belgium. A very scarce use of the perf 8 horizontal. \$100.00





Item 661-22 – <u>Middlebro Manitoba, 6¢ UPU to Denmark</u> – 1923, 2¢ Admiral (3) tied by grid cancel on postcard from Middlebro Man paying 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Denmark. \$100.00



Item 661-23 – Fort Garry 4¢ UPU to Belgium – 1926, 2¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on 2¢ Admiral stationery carc from Fort Garry, Man., paying 4¢ UPU postcard rate to Belgium (505 receiver). Message from a Franco-Manitoban correspondent regarding a magazine or journal not received, requesting that an example be mailed to him. \$75.00





Item 661-24 – <u>Hamilton to Toronto returned for Wartax</u> – 1917, 2¢ Admiral tied by Hamilton flag cancel on cover underpaying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto. Returned for War Tax via the Toronto Dead Letter Office; 1¢ Admiral added then forwarded to destination. A nice Wartax-era instructional usage. \$100.00

Item 661-28 – Skookum Gold Mines illustrated stationery card – 1936, 1¢ GEOV stationery card mailed from Toronto to Brockville, with advertising on both sides relating to Northern Miners, Skookum Gold Mines Ltd., and investment promotions; includes map-style illustrations showing Red Lake and surrounding mining locations. A rare and desirable stationery card. \$100.00 SOLD





Item 661-29 – <u>Arntfield Gold Mines illustrated stationery card</u> – c.1936, 1¢ GEOV stationery card mailed locally in Toronto, with reverse advertising showing the facilities, plant, and mill of Quebec Arntfield Gold Mines Ltd. The Arntfield property lay about 20 km west of Rouyn-Noranda, near the Ontario border, during the early development boom of the Abitibi gold fields. A rare postally used example. \$100.00




Item 661-30 – Ottawa District Emergency No.1 (RF G) – 1942, 3¢ Mufti tied by Ottawa District Emergency No. 1 cds on cover paying 3¢ domestic letter rate to Ottawa. Listed in Gray as E-60.01 (RF G); footnote p.393 notes possibly use on the Montreal–Rigaud–Ottawa RPO, recorded from OC 12 42 to DE 02 42. This example may represent the earliest recorded date. \$250.00




Item 661-31 – Registered onboard Guelph & Owen Sound RPO – 1943, 4¢ War Grain Elevators (4) tied by Guelph & Owen Sound RPO Train 172 cds on cover, registered onboard with ms "Reg #172" and ms "710"; paying 16¢ double-weight registered letter rate to Guelph (b/s). Rare RPO-registered usage. \$150.00 SOLD





Item 661-32 – <u>Salvation Army Christmas card from Elgin Regiment</u> – 1942, FPO 625 cds dated NO 13 42 on patriotic Salvation Army Christmas card and CAO, from Elgin Regiment unit to London Ontario. FPO 625 was used by the 10th Infantry Brigade in the UK at the time. A warm wartime greeting from a dad to his son. \$100.00




Item 661-33 – <u>Christmas Issue 1944, thanks for the smokes</u> – 1944, Armed Forces Air Letter Christmas Issue 1944, mailed from FPO 130 postage free, to a jeweller in Ottawa. The message reads in part: *please accept my kind thanks for the 300 Canadian cigs* etc... signed by Pte Oliver COSPD (Canadian Provost Corps). \$125.00 **SOLD**





Item 661-34 – <u>St. Casimir Que to Madagascar</u> – 1945, 4¢ War tied by St. Casimir, Que., cds on cover underpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Isotry, Antananarivo, Madagascar (b/s). T10 centimes postage-due marking, representing the double 1¢ deficiency. A scarce Eastern Africa destination post-war period. \$200.00 <u>SOLD</u>






Item 661-35 – <u>Hospital bill and Medical Co-Op registered advertising</u> – 1945, 4¢, 10¢ War tied by Melfort Sask cds on Medical Co-Op advertising cover, illustrated with a man in military helmet examining his medical bill under the caption "You never know when you're going to get a hospital bill, protect yourself", a reminder that sometimes the scariest battles aren't fought on the front lines but in the accounting office; paying 14¢ registered letter rate to Quebec City. \$50.00






Item 661-36 – **45¢ airmail registered to Paraguay** – 1945, 5¢ and 20¢ (2) War tied by Toronto Station F cds on cover paying 45¢ airmail registered letter rate to Paraguay (b/s). Unexpectedly routed via Ottawa Station C (b/s), then through the usual Miami transit (b/s). An impressive War-issue registered airmail rate to this landlocked South American destination. File punch holes. \$250.00





Item 661-37 – <u>French Occupation of Saigon</u> – 1947, 3¢ War tied by Matane, P.Q., machine cancel on town-view real photo postcard paying 3¢ postcard rate to Phnom Penh (Cambodia), French Navy and Colonial Forces; redirected to G.A.S. Avalanche (possibly Specialized Action Group Avalanche). Sent during the early phase of the First Indochina War (1946–1954), when France relied heavily on naval and colonial units throughout Indochina before their withdrawal following the fall of Dien Bien Phu in 1954. \$150.00 **SOLD**





Item 661-38 – <u>Household cleaning advertising to lady of the house</u> – 1947, 1¢ GEOVI stationery card with Snap Household Cleaning advertising, addressed to "the lady of the house," paying the 1¢ printed-matter rate. A clean and appealing advertising use. \$50.00 SOLD





Item 661-39 – <u>Underpaid 20¢ double weight airmail rate to Haiti</u> – 1948, 1¢, 2¢, 4¢ War tied by Toronto machine cancel on cover underpaying 20¢ double wgt airmail letter rate to Haiti (b/s). T78 marking (78 \div 2 = 39 \div 3 = 13 + 7 = 20). A good airmail cover to the Greater Antilles and Caribbean Sea. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 661-40 – **5¢ UPU to Aden, Arabia, shortpaid** – 1948, 4¢ War tied by Toronto machine cancel on cover underpaying the 5¢ UPU letter rate to Aden, Arabia. T6 marking for the 1¢ deficiency. Steamer Point was the heart of British colonial Aden, a key port and coaling station on the Arabian Peninsula. \$150.00 **SOLD**




Item 661-41 – Official 13¢ drop special delivery – 1953, 3¢ Karsh O35 and 10¢ Fur Resources O26 stamp tied by Hamilton machine cancel on OHMS window cover, paying the 13¢ drop special-delivery letter rate (b/s). \$50.00



Item 661-42 – **20¢ Paper Mill single paying registration** – 1957, 20¢ Paper Mill tied by Brampton Ont cds on 5¢ return postage prepaid meter cover together paying 25¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Out of the ordinary! \$40.00 **SOLD**
