Item 662-01 – **The earliest recorded Port Royal UC postmark (Norfolk)** – 1852, family letter from Port Royal, UC, paid 6d, with Canada Paid 10 Cts exchange marking paying the cross-border rate to Scottsville, New York State. Routed via Simcoe, Brantford and Hamilton (b/s). The postmark is the earliest recorded Port Royal marking, dated AP 5 52. The office opened on OC 6 51 and remained in continuous operation until NO 1 1914, when it was replaced by rural mail delivery service. A scarce early Port Royal usage. \$400.00



Item 662-02 – **Montreal money letter to Kennedy in New York** – 1845, banking money letter from Montreal, fully prepaid to New York with red "M", Paid 4½d, and Paid 10 markings. The letter relates to a bill exchange of £1000 and is addressed to Kennedy on Wall Street. A nice early cross-border money letter. \$150.00








Item 662-03 – **Pennsylvania to Charlotteville UC (Vittoria - Long Point UC)** – 1820, folded letter datelined Greene County Pennsylvania OC 8 20, endorsed “Per favour of Mr. Elias Moor” to Francis Walsh, Charlotteville Province of Upper Canada. The Long Point Post Office which had been opened at Charlotteville in 1816 had been moved to Vittoria in 1819, the year before this letter was written. A rare and early Lake Erie letter. \$500.00



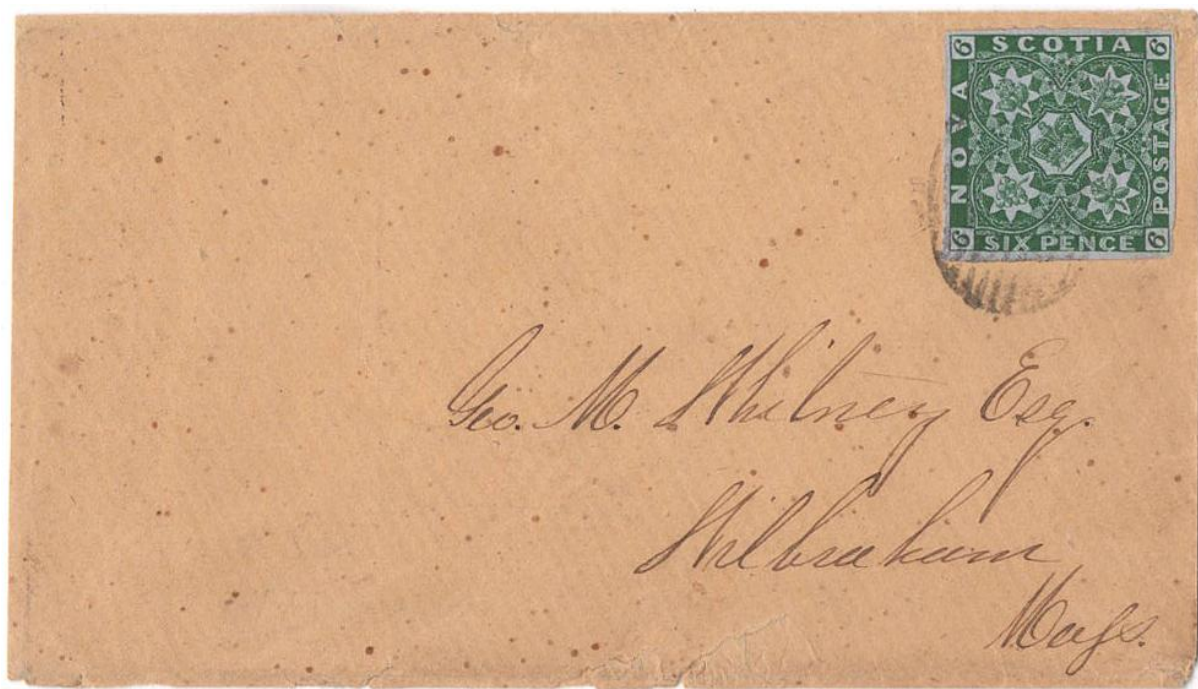
Item 662-04 – **Montreal LC to Vermont** – 1838, legal folded letter from Montreal, LC, dated MR 16 38, paid 4½d to the lines, with 12½¢ US collect to Stratford, Vermont (81–150 miles). Exchanged at Highgate the following day (struck in black), as was typical for letters destined for Vermont. Written by J. A. Perkins and relating to legal matters. \$125.00

Paid 10 in red; routed via Amherst and through New Brunswick. Light staining upper left. Greene cert accompanies. Unitrade No. 4, cv \$2,000.00. \$1,250.00





Item 662-06 – **6d dark green Halifax to Massachusetts** — 1859, Nova Scotia 6d dark green (blue wove, large margins) tied by oval grid cancel on cover from Halifax, NS, paying 6d letter rate to Wilbraham, Massachusetts. Routed via St. John, NB (b/s). Ex Carey Fox (Harmer, May 1968 sale, lot 190), described as extremely fine. Unitrade No. 5, cv \$5,000.00. Price \$3,500.00

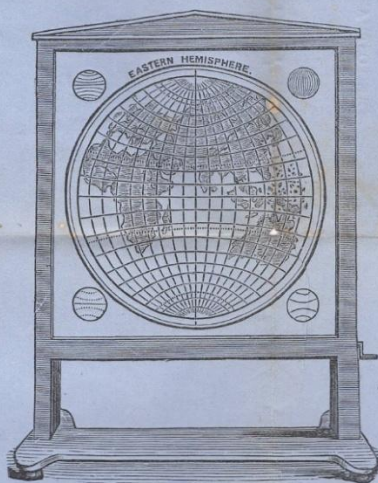

The Chief Superintendent will add *one hundred per cent.* to any sum or sums not less than five dollars, transmitted to the Department from Grammar and Common Schools; and forward Maps, Apparatus, Charts, and Diagrams, to the value of the amount thus augmented, upon receiving a list of the articles required by the Trustees. In all cases it will be necessary for any person, acting on behalf of the Trustees, to enclose or present a written authority to do so, verified by the Corporate Seal of the Trustees. A selection of articles to be sent can always be made by the Department, when so desired.

### PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARIES.

"Township and County Libraries are becoming the crown and glory of the Institutions of the Province."—*Lord Elgin, at the Upper Canada Provincial Exhibition, September, 1854.*

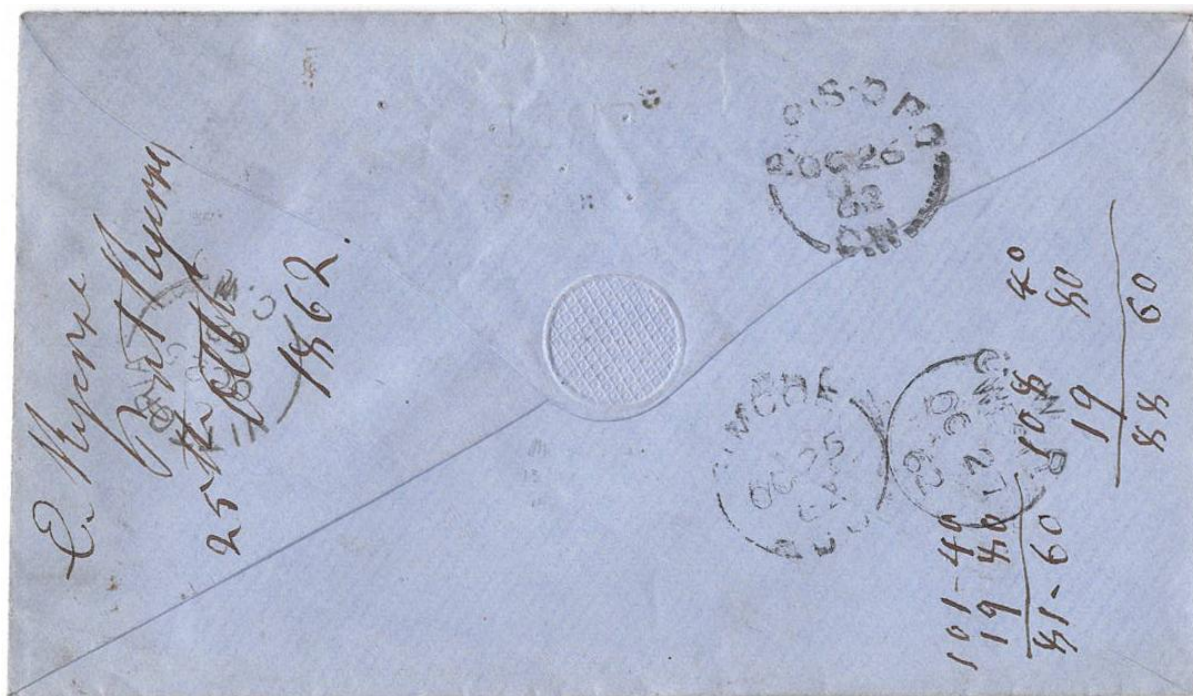

An appealing illustrated circular promoting Canadian-made school apparatus, maps, charts, and various teaching tools designed to facilitate learning. \$1,200.00 **SOLD**



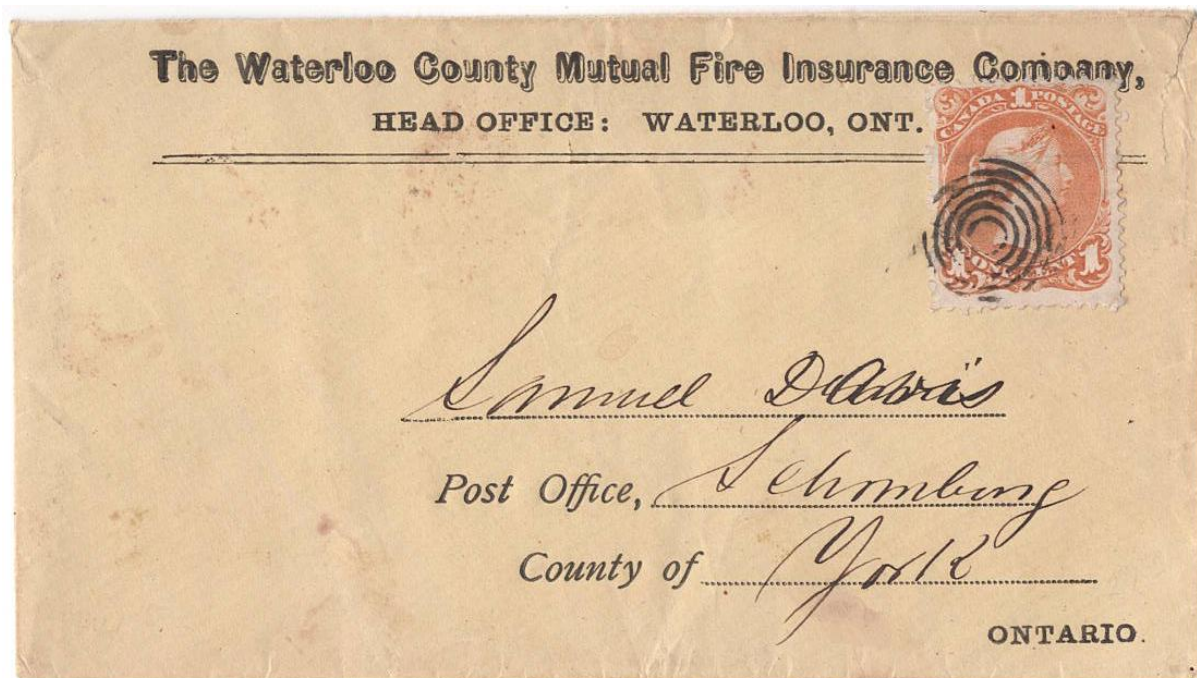


Item 662-08 – **Port Ryers UC registered - struck in green (Norfolk)** – 1862, 5¢ Beaver tied by concentric-ring cancel on registered cover from Port Ryers, UC, paying 5¢ letter rate to Eldon House, London, with 2¢ registry fee paid in cash. All markings struck in a remarkable bright green. Routed via Simcoe and Vittoria (b/s), then carried by the GWR to Paris DPO (b/s). A very attractive and eye-catching cover. \$300.00 **SOLD**





Item 662-09 – **Madoc UC to Fort Smith, St. Louis MO** – 1864, 5¢ Beaver pair (showing characteristics of the thick-paper printing) tied by matching blue concentric-ring cancels on cover from Madoc, UC, paying 10¢ cross-border letter rate to Fort Smith, Saint Louis, MO. Routed via Belleville (b/s). Addressed to F. W. Nosdall & Co., a mercantile and dry-goods firm in St. Louis that supplied military goods including goods for soldiers. A clean and appealing cross-border usage. \$300.00 **SOLD**



Item 662-10 – **1¢ Large Queen, circular from Waterloo Ont** – c.1868, 1¢ Large Queen tied by concentric-ring cancel on Waterloo County Mutual Fire Insurance Company cover, paying 1¢ circular rate to Schomberg, Ont. A neat printed-matter LQ usage. \$300.00 **SOLD**





Item 662-11 – Nova **Scotia to California before completion of U.S. Transcontinental RR** – 1868, 6¢ Large Queen (pulled perfs at top) cancelled by oval grid on cover from Sydney, NS, dated AU 4 68, paying the 6¢ cross-border letter rate to California, sent prior to completion of the U.S. Transcontinental Railroad. The line was completed on May 10, 1869 in Utah. Back flap missing and small tear at bottom. \$400.00

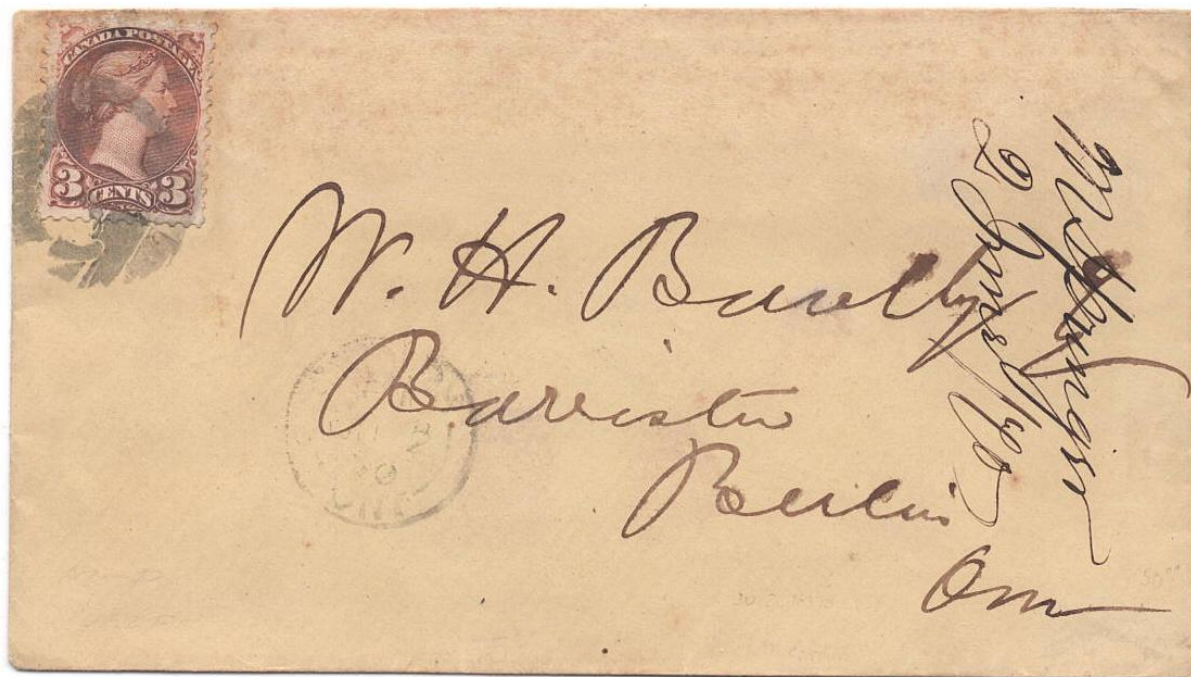


Item 662-12 – **15¢ Large Queen block, 29i** – c.1868, 15¢ Large Queen block of 4, 29i, purple, mint OG, fine with disturbed gum; Firth's 11B gray-purple shade. Bottom margin shows E CO, MONTREAL & OTTAWA Type IV imprint. Accompanied by 2024 certificate. \$400.00

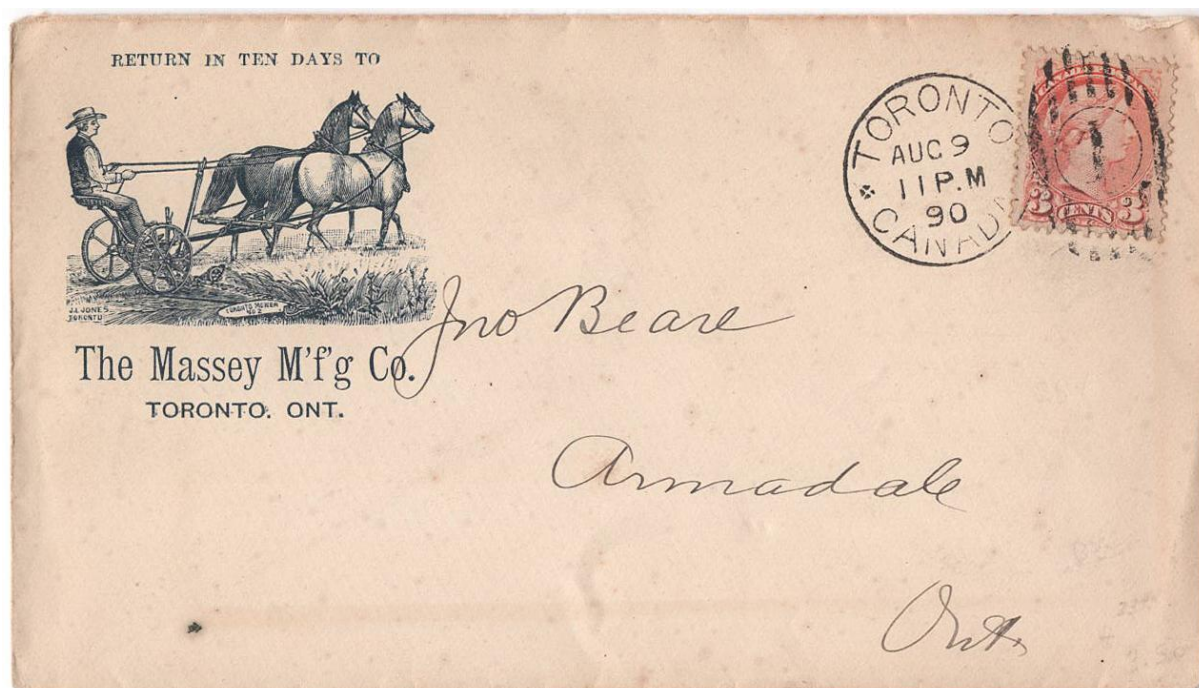


Item 662-13 – **St. Lawrence Hall advertising** – 1868, 3¢ Large Queen (sulfurized) tied by Montreal CE Berri duplex cancel on St. Lawrence Hall advertising cover, paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa (OC 26 68 b/s). This leading hotel hosted many prominent guests, including the Prince of Wales, Charles Dickens, John A. Macdonald, and George Brown. \$150.00

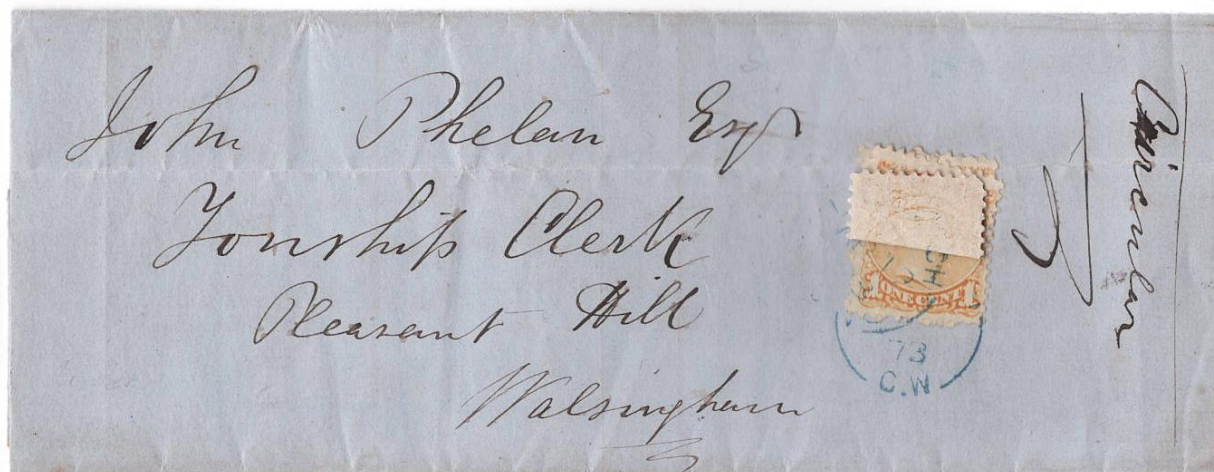




Item 662-14 – **3¢ SQ JU 2 70** – 1870, 3¢ SQ (sulfurized copper red) tied by Toronto fancy intaglio cancel, possibly a large intaglio “2”, on cover dated JU 2 70, paying 3¢ letter rate to Berlin (JU 3 70 b/s). \$100.00



Item 662-15 – **Massey Manufacturing Co.** – 1890, 3¢ SQ tied by Toronto duplex cancel on Massey Manufacturing Co. advertising cover to Armadale. Massey relocated to Toronto in 1890 and merged with A. Harris, Son & Co. Ltd. in 1891. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 662-16 – **Lynedoch CW re-used printed-matter cover, 5 months apart** – 1873, 1¢ SQ tied by Lynedoch CW Berry hammer dated AP 19 73 on township clerk partial folded cover, paying 1¢ printed-matter rate to Walsingham. Re-used with a second 1¢ SQ, also tied by Lynedoch CW, this time dated SP 11 73. The two stamps overlap, clearly showing the sequential re-use. The cover was first mailed in April 1873; the recipient likely answered questions or a township survey and returned it under cover. The original sender then replied and re-mailed the same cover in September 1873, adding the second 1¢ SQ. The recipient appears to have removed part of the cover, leaving it incomplete. This is a genuine re-used cover, not a turned cover. A highly unusual and decidedly scarce 1¢ SQ usage. \$350.00

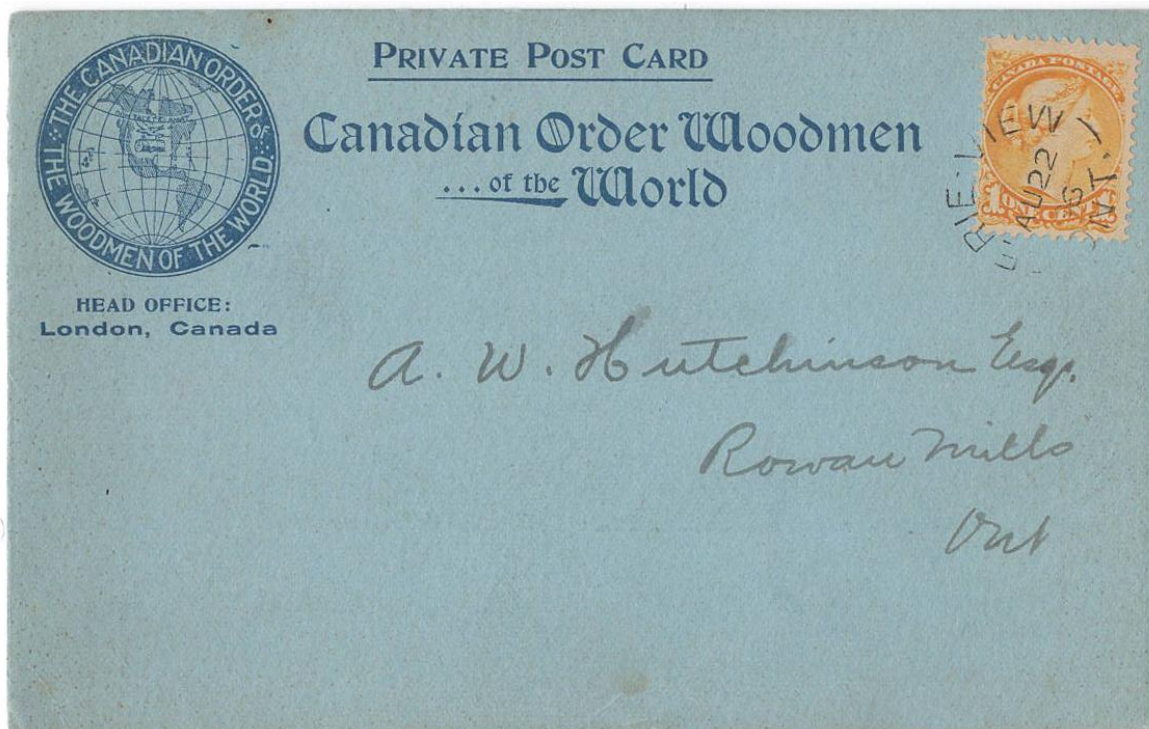

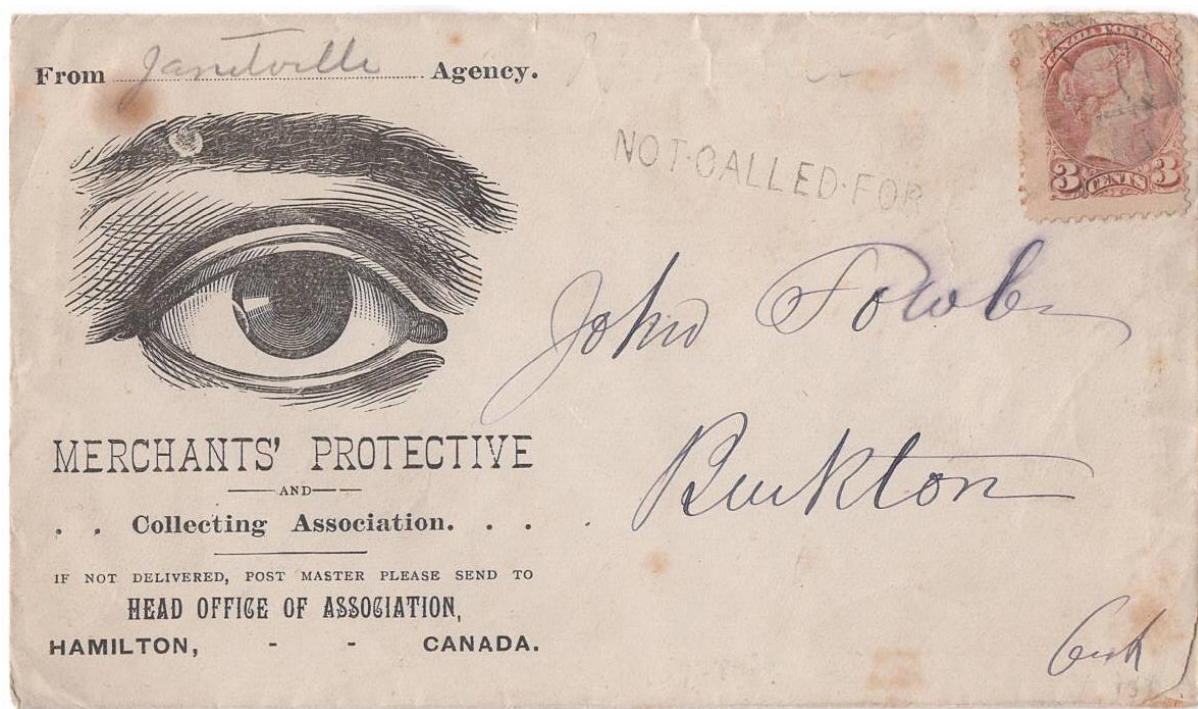

The Erie View Post Office opened on JY 1 94 under Postmaster E. L. Foster and closed on AU 31 14 with the inauguration of Rural Mail Delivery. A scarce Norfolk County Victorian-era post office. \$100.00



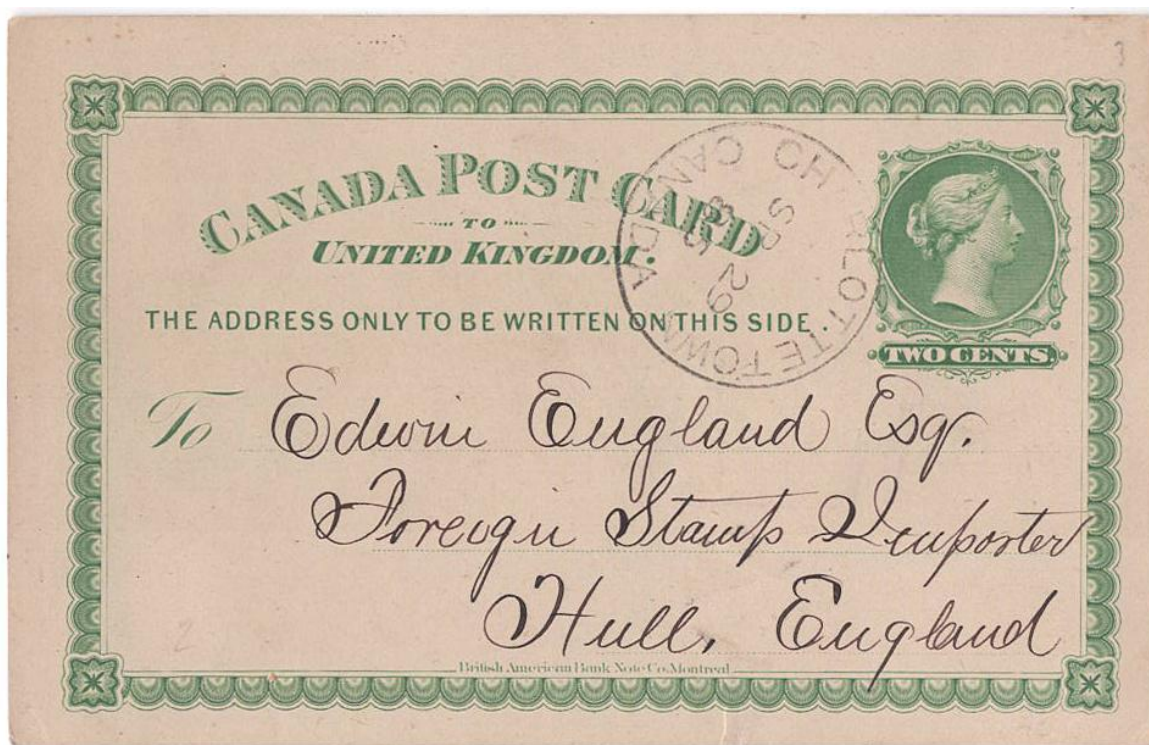
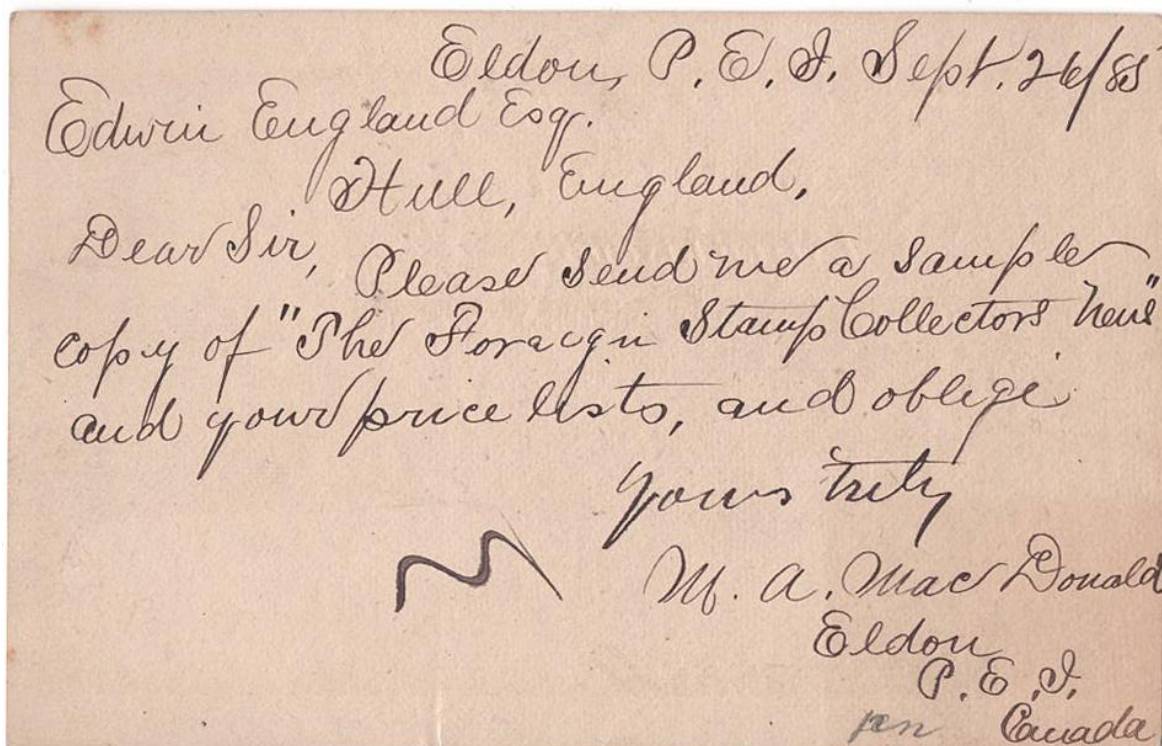

Not called for and forwarded to the Dead Letter Office (a great strike of the hammer 3). A real wow cover! \$200.00





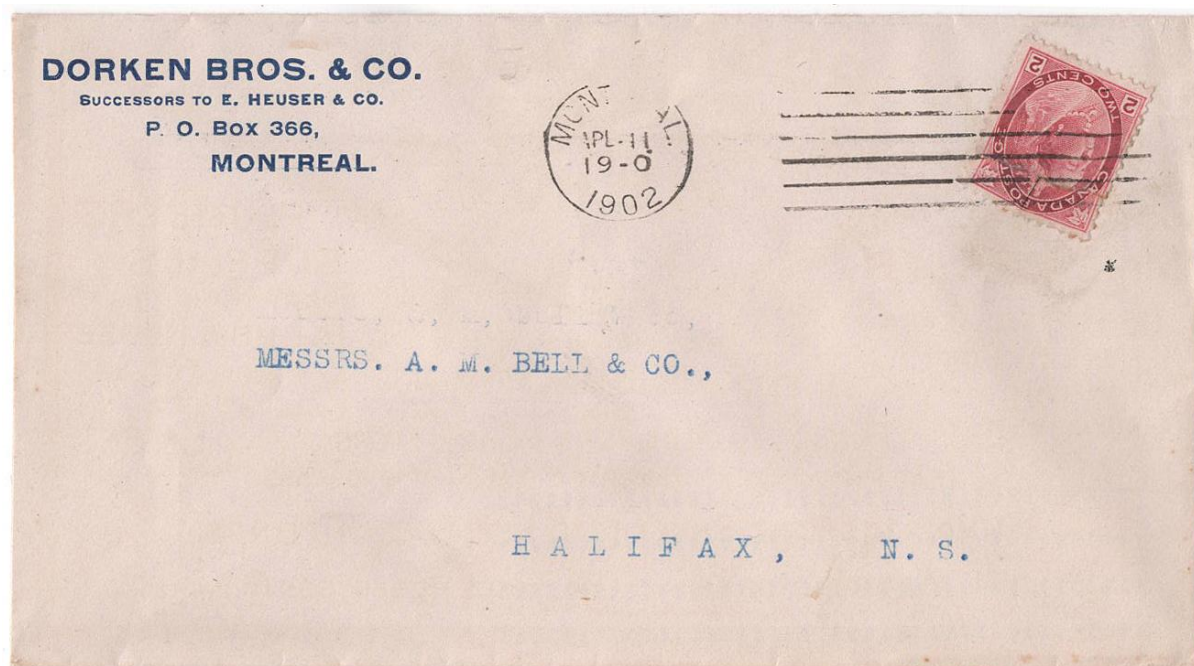

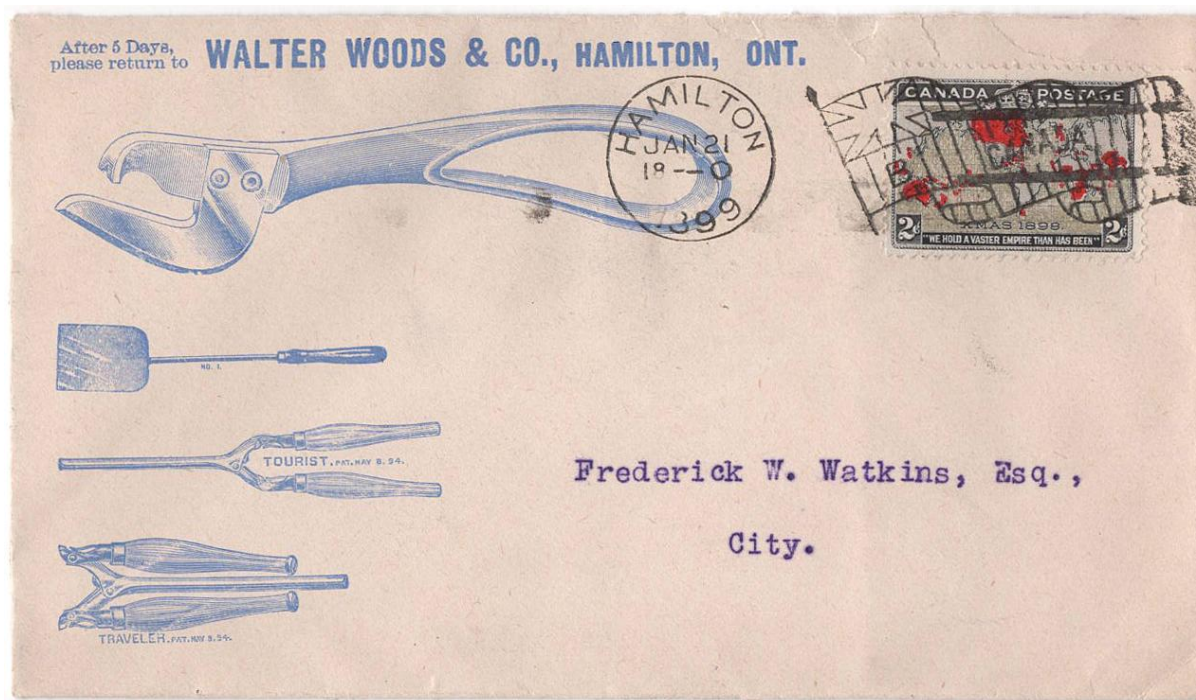
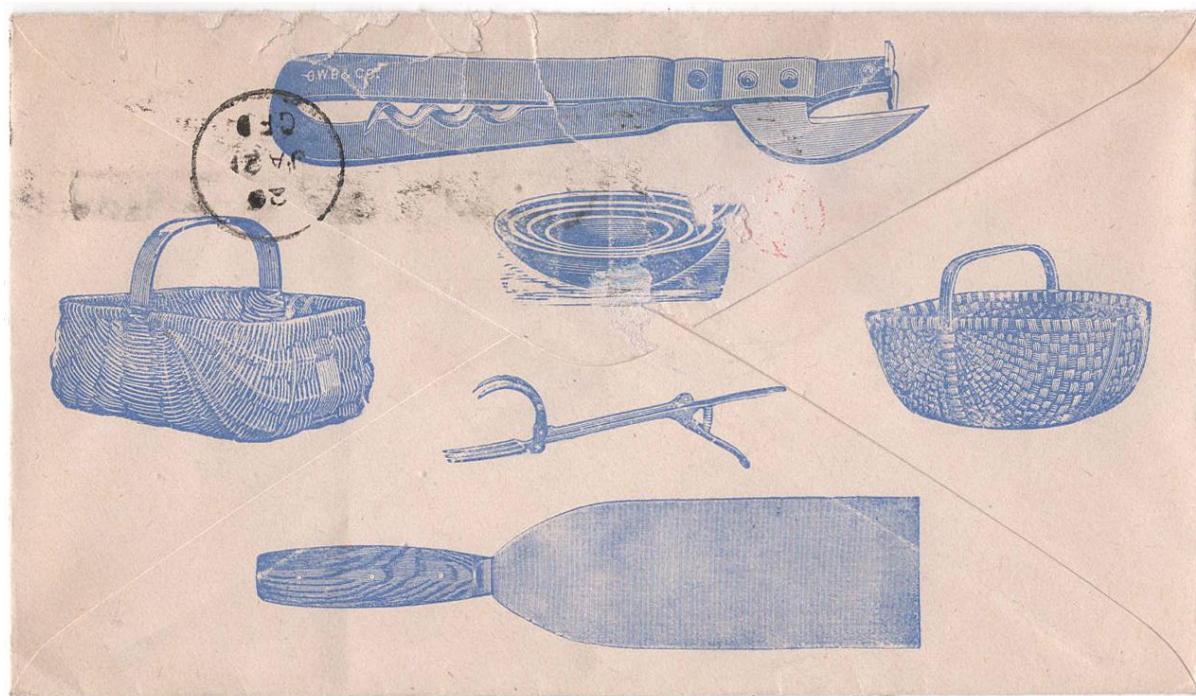


Item 662-32 – **Sherbrooke Que City Butcher and Bacon** – 1899, 2c Map (dark yellow brown) tied by Sherbrooke, Que. cds on Alex Ames City Butcher advertising cover, paying 2c letter rate to Danville (b/s). Parent pigs and piglets illustrated. Light reduction at left. A scarce Eastern Townships advertising cover. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 662-33 – **December 25 1898 Latchford cover to Niger Coast Protectorate** – 1898, 2¢ Map tied by Ottawa machine cancel dated December 25, 1898, on Latchford Christmas first day cover, paying 2¢ Empire letter rate to the Niger Coast Protectorate (b/s). Addressed to the Postmaster at Benin (*To Postmaster or Commandant*). The numerous folds are integral to its history, as the cover was requested to be returned to Canada in a smaller self-addressed envelope to Latchford. Eleven Latchford covers to eleven different countries are recorded. Ex Fred Fawn and unique. \$2,000.00

Redirected to Lucerne Switzerland with Paris France transit (b/s), 20 centimes Swiss postage due assessed as a double UPU letter rate; unclaimed and returned to the Ottawa Dead Letter Office (trio of backstamps). \$250.00



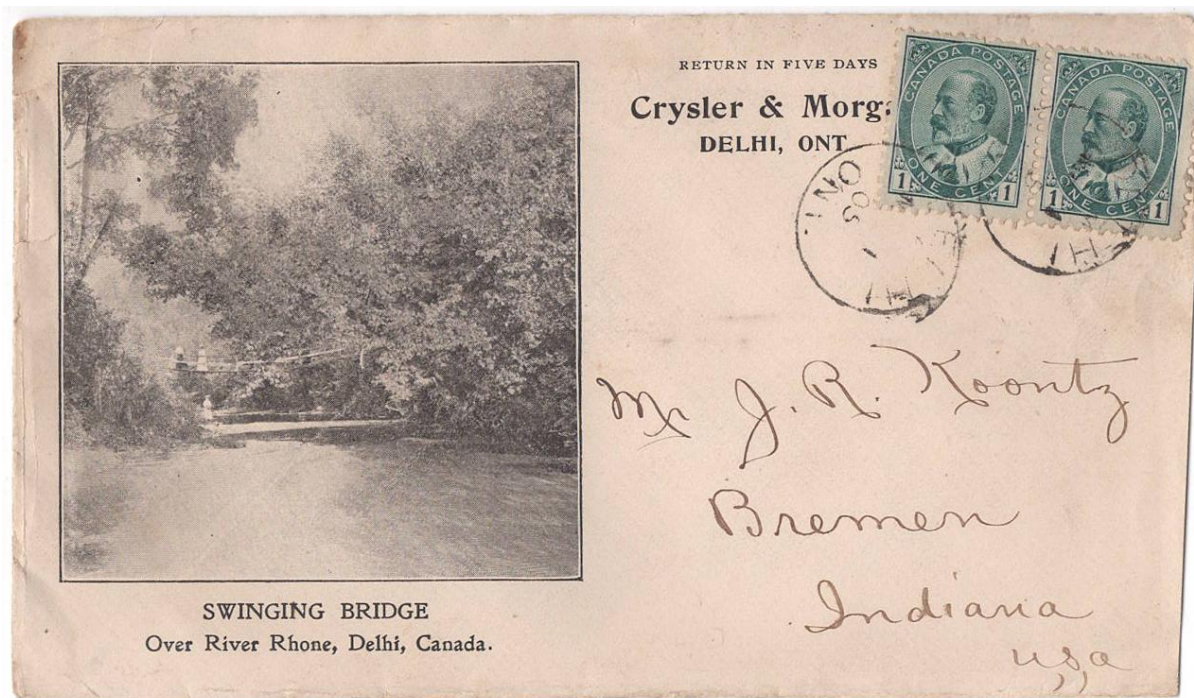

Return address: *Last Chance P.O., Yukon Ter.* Routed via Dawson and Skagway, Alaska (b/s). Possibly the earliest recorded cover from Last Chance. The Post Office was located on Hunker Creek, ten miles southeast of Dawson. According to Robinson, it is the 9<sup>th</sup> Yukon Post Office and the first opened in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Between JA 1 12 and MR 31 22, the money-packet rate was 2¢ per ounce plus registration, with either a 5¢ or 10¢ registry fee, all registered tags from this ten-year period are very scarce. \$150.00 **SOLD**

VEC 2026 is open to all, not just BNAPS members. Attendance is free, but registration is required.

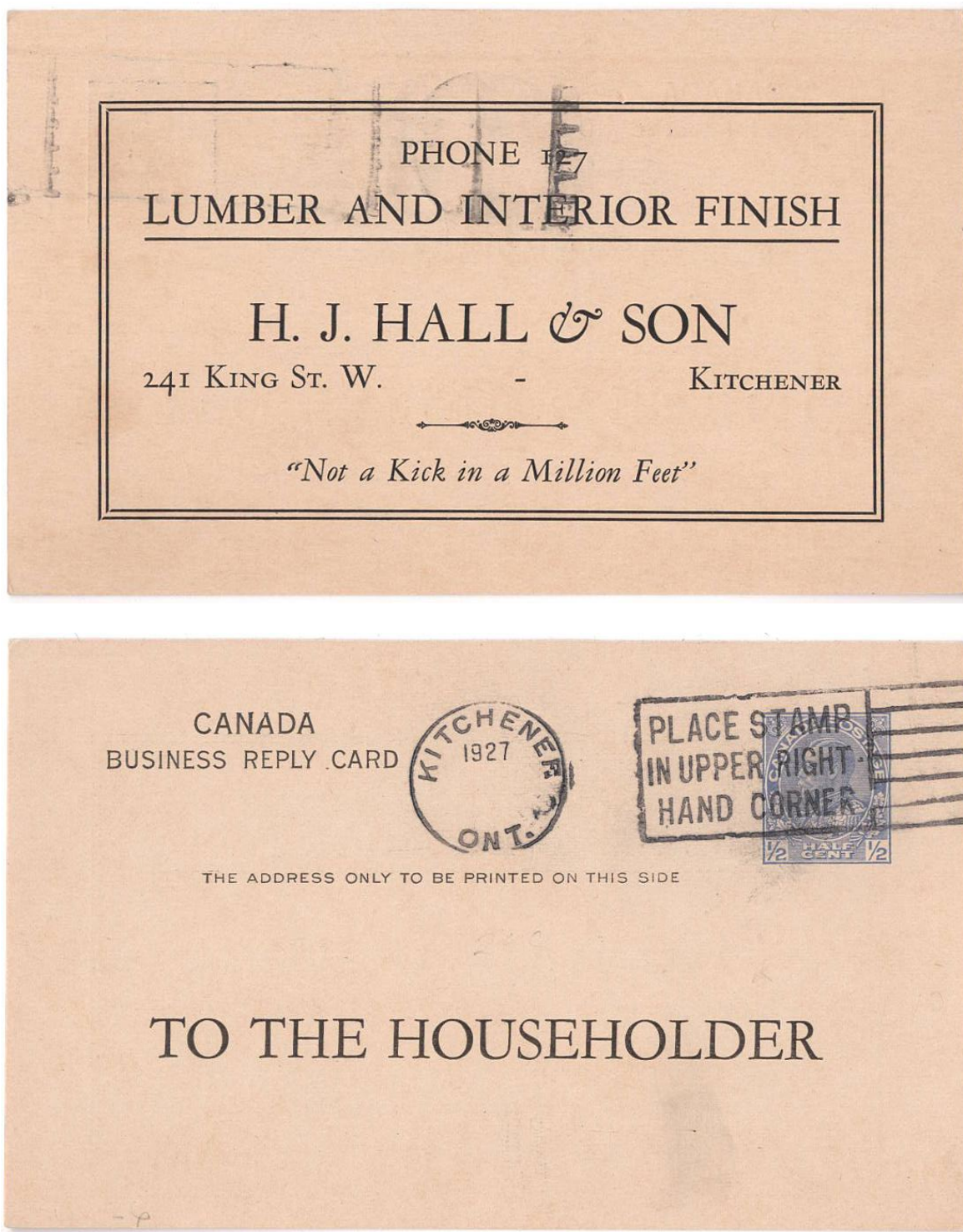
