
Item 663-01 – **Toronto Boiler and Blacksmith** – c.1856, stampless cover from Toronto with James Currie Boiler and Blacksmith cameo and embossed advertising, rated Canada 10 Cts paying the cross-border letter rate to New York. A handsome early advertising use. \$400.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-02 – **London – Farmer's Company and Mutual Assurance** – 1866, 5¢ Beaver tied by London CW Berri duplex on Agricultural Mutual Assurance Association advertising cover paying 5¢ letter rate to St. Thomas (b/s). A true farmer-run company, reflected in the straightforward advertising style. Light reduction at left. \$125.00



Item 663-03 – **Orwell UC hand-drawn floral arrangement** – 1872, 6¢ SQ yellow brown tied by a neat concentric-ring cancel on cover from Orwell Ont, JU 18 72, paying 6¢ cross-border letter rate to Vermont. The cover bears a black hand-drawn illustration depicting an elegant fancy leaf or floral arrangement. \$200.00



Item 663-04 – **Corporal Highlanders Illustrated** – 1889, 3¢ SQ tied by oval grid cancel on Corporal Highlanders illustrated cover from Long Point N.B., paying 3¢ letter rate to Hillsboro. Postmark neatly centred within the soldier's backpack. Reduced at left, light age stain, and a genuinely rare cover. \$250.00



Item 663-05 – **Miss Hooper – Kittens, pussy willows and cat-tails** – 1887, 5¢ SQ tied by Montreal cds on a fully hand-illustrated cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to England. Struck with red Paid Liverpool U.S. Packet on front. Addressed to Mrs. Hooper, 87 Newby Street, Kirkdale, Liverpool. The cover is delightfully hand-drawn, featuring kittens, pussy willows, cat-tails, and birthday greetings at upper left. Small hole at right just below "street." Unsigned. \$250.00




The Miss Romaine cover fronts are all striking examples of philatelic folk art, each showing areas of paper adhesion likely from an old scrapbook.

All are addressed to Miss Romaine at either 14 Connaught Place, Hyde Park, London G.B., or the Priory in Old Windsor.

Several recorded pieces bear the initials or signature C.H.L. The artist is almost certainly Lieutenant C. H. Lane, a British military officer stationed at Halifax in the 1890s.

Item 663-06 – **Horses and British soldiers dismounting** – c.1890, ½¢ SQ (perfs trimmed and affixed as a vignette) on hand-illustrated cover front to Miss Romaine, decorated with a scene of British soldiers dismounting before a doorway, the signpost forming a frame for the stamp. Not used postally, as the ½¢ SQ was insufficient for the UPU rate to England, and no postal markings are present. No C.H.L. initials. A very pretty piece of folk-art illustration. \$250.00



Item 663-07 – **Ray Street & Co Bankers, Port Arthur** – 1895, 3¢ SQ tied by Port Arthur Ont squared circle on embossed Ray Street & Co. Bankers advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Crown Land Dept file fold. A rare bank. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-08 – **20¢ Numeral usage** – 1902, 2¢, 5¢ (3), 20¢ Numeral tied by partially legible Westmount Que roller cancel on large trimmed linen cover paying 37¢ Empire registered letter rate to Ireland (b/s) via London (b/s). Sixteen times 2¢ per ½ oz plus 5¢ registration. Some gum-toned perfs. An impressive piece and a must-have for a gold-medal collection. Ex Hogg, Cantor. \$2,000.00




Item 663-09 – **Canadian Horse Show** – 1900, 2¢ Numeral left-margin copy tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel on Canadian Horse Show back advertising cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. \$50.00





Item 663-10 – **Craigvale Ont 8¢ Numeral use in period (Simcoe)** – 1898, 8¢ Numeral tied by Craigvale Ont broken circle (socked-on-the-nose) on cover dated NO 4 98 paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Danville Que (b/s). Carried by Tor & Gravenhurst MC GTR (4 strikes), Ott & Toronto MC No.1 (2 strikes), and Montreal transit (b/s). The 8¢ Numeral was issued SE 24 98 and is in-period until DE 31 98. An appealing 8¢ Numeral cover to a seldom-seen Danville Quebec stamp dealer. \$200.00 **SOLD**




Item 663-11 – **Montreal Keyhole precursor, Bayard Que (Labelle County)** – 1910, 2¢ and 5¢ Edwards tied by grid cancel on cover from Bayard Que paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Napierville. Carried by Mont & Labelle RPO South (b/s), received in Montreal with dotted cds (b/s) and the seldom-seen Keyhole precursor. Bayard office opened in 1909 (proof dated JA 16 09) and closed in 1941. A scarce Labelle County office cover with a very scarce early Montreal Keyhole registration handstamp. \$100.00 **SOLD**





Item 663-12 – **Ottawa bathroom illustrated** – 1909, 2¢ Edward margin copy tied by Ottawa International machine cancel on M.W. O'Connell Plumbing & Heating advertising cover, bathroom illustrated, paying 2¢ letter rate to Iowa (b/s). \$100.00




Item 663-13 – **Lower Burlington NS registered, Keyhole (Hants)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Lower Burlington N.S., with Keyhole registration handstamp, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Newport N.S., by Halifax & Yarmouth RPO and Halifax & St. John RPO (b/s). Lower Burlington opened in 1899 and closed in 1936. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-14 – **Goat River BC registered (RF E – 1923-1945)** – 1926, 1¢, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by oval registered cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Goat River B.C., paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Edmonton & Prince George RPO and Prince George & Prince Rupert RPO (b/s). A rare B.C. post office, RF E, opened in 1923 and closed in 1945. \$300.00 **SOLD**




Item 663-15 — **Minnedosa Manitoba registered** — 1926, 1¢, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by oval registered cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Minnedosa Man, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Wng & Bws RPO and Fort William & Winnipeg RPO No.5 (b/s). RFA. \$50.00 **SOLD**




Item 663-16 – **Butedale BC registered (RF C)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Butedale B.C., paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Vancouver (b/s). Post office operated 1917–1974. \$75.00 **SOLD**




Item 663-17 – **Newcastle N.B. registered, Keyhole (Northumberland)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Newcastle N.B. duplex cancel on Herald and Star reply cover, with Keyhole registration handstamp, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Halifax & Campbellton RPO 15. A very pretty Keyhole cover. \$50.00 **SOLD**




Item 663-18 – **Longworth BC registered (RF B)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Longworth B.C., paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Edmonton & Prince George RPO No.2 (b/s). Longworth RF B. \$50.00 **SOLD**





Item 663-19 – **Novar Ont registered (Muskoka and Parry Sound)** - 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Novar Ont, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). All strikes are extra sharp, making a very attractive Muskoka and Parry Sound registered cover. \$75.00




Item 663-20 – **Lang Bay BC registered (RF C)** - 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by oval registered cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Lang Bay B.C., paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Oval "Registration Branch Vancouver" transit and Toronto & Fort William RPO No.4 (b/s). Lang Bay post office operated from 1918 to 1955. RF C. \$75.00 **SOLD**




Item 663-21 – **Wellington Station PEI registered** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Wellington Station P.E.I., paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Charlottetown & Tignish RPO and Charlottetown & Sackville RPO (b/s). \$50.00 **SOLD**




Item 663-22 – **Moricetown B.C. registered (RF D – 1921-1936)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Moricetown B.C., paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Prince George & Prince Rupert two-lozenges RPO (b/s). Moricetown post office operated from 1921 to 1936 and reopened from 1948 to 1966. A very fine registered example from the first period. RF D. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-23 – **Morristown N.S. Keyhole (Antigonish)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Morristown N.S., with Keyhole registration handstamp, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Antigonish (b/s) and carried by Halifax & Campbellton RPO (b/s). A scarce Antigonish County cover; closed in 1947. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-24 – **Mine Centre Ont registered (Rainy River District)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Mine Centre Ont, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Port Arthur (b/s). Mine Centre was an important gold-mining hub in Northwestern Ontario, located northwest of Fort Frances. A very pretty RRV registered cover. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-25 – **Morristown N.B. Keyhole (Kings)** – 1926, 1¢ (2), 10¢ Admiral tied by Hatfield Point N.B. cds on Herald and Star reply cover, with Keyhole registration handstamp, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Norton and carried by Halifax & St. John (b/s). \$50.00



Item 663-26 – **West Bay Road N.S. Keyhole (Inverness)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by West Bay Road broken circle on cover, with Keyhole registration handstamp, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Halifax & St. John RPO (b/s). \$50.00




Item 663-27 – **Grande Prairie Alta (Edmonton & Spirit River RPO)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Grande Prairie Alta broken circle on cover paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Edmonton & Spirit River No.2 RPO (Gray WT-227.02. 1922-1928, RF E). \$100.00



Item 663-28 – **North River PEI Keyhole (RF C)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on cover from North River PEI, with Keyhole registration handstamp, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Charlottetown and carried by Halifax & Campbellton RPO (b/s). \$75.00



Item 663-29 – **Mount Robson B.C. registered (RF C – 1923-1955)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on cover from Mount Robson B.C., paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Edmonton & Prince George RPO (b/s). A seldom-seen office, RF C, in operation from 1923 to 1955. \$75.00 **SOLD**




Item 663-30 – **Pollockville Alta registered (RF C)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on cover from Pollockville Alta, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Hanna Alta and carried by Sask & Cal RPO and Regina & North Battleford RPO No.2 (b/s). \$75.00 **SOLD**





Item 663-31 – **Cliffordvale N.B. Keyhole (Victoria)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admirals tied by grid cancel on cover from Cliffordvale N.B., with Keyhole registration handstamp, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). A seldom-seen Victoria County New Brunswick office, active from 1908 to 1955. \$50.00



Item 663-32 – **Boxed "Registered / Sudbury Ont"** – 1921, 1¢, 10¢ Plum Admiral tied by boxed Registered Sudbury Ont handstamp on 2¢ postal stationery envelope, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Hamilton (b/s). Carried by Toronto & North Bay MC GTR No.3 (b/s). \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-33 – **Meeting Creek Alberta (RF C)** – 1912, 2¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on CPR Hotel of Victoria postcard from Meeting Creek Alta, dated SE 17 12, paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Switzerland. Redirected within Switzerland. Meeting Creek office opened in February 1912, RF C. \$50.00




Item 663-34 – **Port Arthur, 2¢ Empire PC rate to Bermuda** – 1915, 2¢ Admiral stationery card mailed from Port Arthur Ontario, paying 2¢ Empire postcard rate to Bermuda. Passed by censor in Bermuda, with triangular Passed Postal Censor Bermuda handstamp on front. \$50.00




Item 663-35 – **Timmins street view RPPC to Denmark** – 1916, 1¢ Admiral (5) tied by Timmins Ont duplex cancel on a very pretty Timmins Fifth Avenue real photo postcard, paying 5¢ letter rate to Denmark. Written in Danish, possibly by a miner writing back home; the sender may have misunderstood the applicable UPU postcard rate and franked it at the letter rate. A nice card. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-36 – **Vernon Camp BC real photo card to England** – 1915, 2¢ Admiral (booklet stamp) and 1¢ Wartax MR1 tied by Vernon BC duplex cancel on Vernon Camp RPPC, paying 3¢ Empire postcard rate to England (receiver just left of the MR1 stamp). Card published by Vernon Photo Company. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-37 – **Abitibi Power and Paper Co. to Denmark** – 1917, 1¢ Admiral (3) tied by Iroquois Falls Ont duplex cancel on Abitibi Power and Paper Co. real photo postcard showing the Iroquois Falls plant; overpaying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Denmark, likely a 1¢ overpayment due to Wartax confusion. Written in Danish. \$75.00





The villa was an annex of the Beauport Asylum used to secretly house religious and political figures with alcohol or drug addiction issues


Item 663-38 – **Monument PQ 1913-1946 (Giffard, Quebec City)** - 1913, 1¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on 1¢ Admiral stationery card from Monument PQ paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Germany; routed via the Quebec main office (b/s). The Monument Post Office stood near the Sanatorium Mastaï and served a territory divided between two seigneuries west of the Beauport River, including the former municipalities of Giffard and Saint-Michel-Archange in the southeastern portion of the seigneurie of Notre-Dame-des-Anges. The office operated from 1913 to 1946, making this a very early example from this rare Quebec City post office. \$100.00



Item 663-39 – **1¢ Washington used in Port Arthur** – 1914, 1¢ Washington improperly used on postcard mailed at Port Arthur Ont, squared circle AU 9 14, attempting to pay the postcard rate to Illinois. Detected and returned for postage to Winnipeg Branch DLO; 1¢ paid, added, and then forwarded to destination. An interesting Port Arthur squared circle item. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-40 – CN Telegraph telegram cover – 1920, 1¢ Admiral (2) tied by Hamilton machine cancel on Canadian National Telegraph telegram service cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. \$30.00



Item 663-41 – CN Telegraph telegram cover – 1920, 2¢ Admiral tied by Hamilton "Buy War Savings" International machine cancel on Great North Western Telegraph Company telegram service cover paying 2¢ drop letter rate. \$40.00



CPR81G; reverse with French freight notice “La Compagnie de Chemin de Fer du Pacifique Canadien,” Form 13B. \$50.00

Item 663-43 – **1¢ Recut George V stationery cut square use** – 1930, 2¢ Recut George V issue PSE cut square (EN38-41) glued and tied by grid cancel on cover from Lamartine Que paying the 2¢ letter rate to St. Pascal-de-Kamouraska. The enclosure is a mourning letter. An interesting institutional use from that period within the Diocese of Quebec. \$50.00



Item 663-44 – **Scroll Issue, 8¢ UPU letter rate to Denmark** – 1929, 1¢ (2) 2¢ (3) Scroll tied by Montreal Use Air Mail slogan cancel on cover (white aircraft facing right type) paying 8¢ UPU letter rate to Jutland, Denmark. Accompanied by the original Christmas card, written in Danish. \$50.00





Item 663-45 – **1¢ PSE precancelled typographed ENX14-2** – c.1926, 1¢ typographed GEOV postal stationery envelope on laid kraft paper with Toronto precancel and Lowndes Company c/c, paying 1¢ printed matter rate to Kitchener. Webb ENX14-2, size 160 x 102 mm. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-46 – **Ponemah Beach Manitoba (Summer Office)** – 1936, 13¢ Pictorial tied by oval registered cancel on cover from Ponemah Beach Manitoba paying 13¢ registered letter rate to London Ont (b/s). Winnipeg transit markings (two ovals), Tor & Fort William RPO No. 1, and North Bay & Fort William RPO (b/s). A very scarce postmark from this summer office, which operated only from May to September between 1929 and 1968. RF C. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 663-47 – **Seldom-seen franking to France** – 1936, 4¢ Pictorial, 6¢ Airmail C5 Daedalus tied by Dundas Ont cds on cover paying 10¢ airmail letter rate to France (b/s). Carried by airmail within North America and by surface onward to Europe. A pretty cover. \$50.00



Item 663-48 - Canadian Airways, Sioux Lookout, Sandy Lake Party - 1937, 1¢ Pictorial tied by Sioux Lookout Ont duplex cancel on 1¢ stationery postcard, dated AU 3 37, paying 2¢ postcard rate to Port Arthur. The message is datelined c/o Canadian Airways, Sioux Lookout Ont., Sandy Lake Party and reads: Dear Mum, couldn't get a room in town so had to take berth on Toronto train. Am leaving in  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour,  $8\frac{1}{2}$  hour trip. He didn't have enough money, sorry, please pay Bunkie I'll fix it up in Sept. \$50.00 **SOLD**




Item 663-49 – **17¢ triple wgt registered, Hamilton Sub.15** – 1940, 4¢ Mufti, 13¢ Pictorial tied by Hamilton Ont Sub No. 15 cds on cover paying the 17¢ triple-weight registered rate to London (b/s). Reverse with Sub No. 15 MOTO handstamp. A highly appealing registered usage. \$50.00




Item 663-50 – **House of Assembly special delivery to Maple Leaf Gardens** – 1940, 2¢ Royal Visit, 10¢ Special Delivery E7 tied by House of Assembly Toronto P.O. cds on cover paying 12¢ drop special delivery letter rate (b/s). Addressed to the Toronto Skating Club, Maple Leaf Gardens. \$125.00



Item 663-51 – **Canadian Postal Corps No.6 - Emergency Hammer** – 1946 cover from Vienna, Austria dated FE 25 46 to POW Camp 132 Medicine Hat Alta, censored with Canada Int Op crown No.5 and redirected to POW Camp 23 Monteith Ont. Routed via the C.P.C. in Ottawa with Canadian Postal Corps No. 6 emergency hammer MR 27 46 (Sayles F155). A genuine World War II-era rarity. \$500.00



Item 663-52 – **Not Interned in Canada** – 1944, Italian Red Cross postcard from Rome (Roma Ferrovia RPO) to an Italian prisoner of war in Great Britain, passed by British censor with red crown handstamp. Apparently redirected to Canada, bearing the two-line handstamp "Not Interned in Canada" with no additional Canadian markings or receiver. POW mail was often redirected in this manner; however, the "Not Interned in Canada" handstamp is a notably scarce marking and seldom encountered. Written in Italian. \$150.00 **SOLD**
