

(Sudbury District). Also included are good RPO postmarks, a 55¢ triple-weight airmail registered cover to Bulgaria, gold-mining material, Canadian National and Canadian Pacific ephemera, and a varied selection of additional general postal history. 






Item 664-01 – **Ship Letter crown Quebec** – 1801, folded letter from Quebec to Liverpool bearing a crisp outbound Ship Letter crown Quebec, no BNA and Sterling postage, and endorsed per Sarah. Top edge trimmed with a few lines of text lost. A notably sharp and attractive strike. \$500.00




Item 664-02 – **Ship Letter crown Montreal** – 1824, folded cover possibly from Montreal to London with the rare outbound Ship Letter crown Montreal, rated 1/4 collect; entered as ship letter at Dover on reverse with the very scarce Dover Ship Letter handstamp. Rare. \$1,500.00




Item 664-03 – **Robert Franklin Sutherland (Essex North, Ontario)** – 1906, Senate of Canada free-franked cover signed by Robert Franklin Sutherland, Speaker of the House, addressed to Senator Joseph Shehyn at Quebec, then serving as Senator for The Laurentides (1900–1918). Sutherland was first elected to the House of Commons as Liberal MP for Essex North in 1900 and was returned in 1904 and 1908. \$75.00






Item 664-04 – **St. Lawrence & Ottawa Railway and Customs** – 1876, Customs free-franked cover with family letter accompanies from Ottawa to Stanstead, Que. Carried by the St. Lawrence & Ottawa Railway (St. L & O.R.R. / No. 1 / South / FE 18 76; Gray RY-171, RF E). The Customs Canada Crown marking, recorded as DCS-2 and known in duo with this railway, unlisted in CS, Boggs, and Jarrett. Very scarce! Ex Libra. 400.00




Item 664-05 – Aldboro CW, Canada Southern Railway – 1875, 2¢, 3¢ SQ tied by two faint target cancels on cover from Aldboro, CW (Elgin County), paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Colonel O'Malley, Wardsville. Reverse with boxed Registered C.S.R. (RY-34), CA Southern R double broken circle (RY-33), boxed Registered G.W.R. (RY-69), split ring (RY-68), Rodney and London transit (b/s). Neatly restored at right. An appealing registered usage carried by two railway companies. \$200.00






Item 664-06 – **Salmonhurst NB manuscript postmark** – 1882, Salmonhurst NB manuscript postmark (FE 12, 1882) on 2¢ UPU stationery postcard to Denmark, receiver on front, routed via London England (b/s). MacManus notes the Salmonhurst postmark was proofed on AP 20, 1882. A scarce Victoria County New Brunswick office usage. \$200.00




Item 664-07 – **Toronto roller No.2 ties 1¢ Jubilee** – c.1897, 1¢ Jubilee tied by an exceptionally sharp Toronto No. 2 roller cancel on The Globe cover paying 1¢ printed-matter rate to Truro N.S.; attractive address-label usage. \$125.00



Item 664-08 – **Penetanguishene Jubilee registered** – 1897, 1¢ (2) and 3¢ (2) Jubilee tied by four superb Penetanguishene Ont broken-circle strikes on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Hamilton (b/s). Hamilton & Allandale MC South with two strikes on back. \$300.00



Item 664-09 – **10¢ UPU registered to ship in Gibraltar** – 1897, 2¢, 3¢, 5¢ Jubilee (on the edge) tied by Ottawa roller cancel on cover, with boxed Registered Ottawa handstamp, paying 10¢ UPU registered letter rate to HMS Rodney in the Mediterranean. Redirected to Gibraltar in blue crayon, where the ship was stationed. A striking and scarce Jubilee registered usage. \$750.00





Item 664-10 – **Yarmouth Iron Company, engineers and founders** – 1897, 3¢ Jubilee tied by Yarmouth N.S. cds on Burrell Johnson Iron Co. (*engineers and iron founders*) advertising cover, paying 3¢ letter rate to Bridgewater (b/s). A scarce Yarmouth-origin advertising cover. Ex Bursey. \$350.00




Item 664-11 – **Boer War - to Ottawa (Governor General's Foot Guards)** – 1900, Cape of Good Hope 1d letter card from Orange River dated FE 13 00 to Ottawa (b/s), written by Pte L. J. Street to his mother. Message refers to an enclosed photograph, no longer present, with instructions to deliver it to the Ottawa Citizen Office for publication. Street was serving with the Governor General's Foot Guards, then stationed at Belmont Camp and preparing to move to Modder River. A pretty GGFG Second Boer War cover. \$250.00



Item 664-12 – **Port Perry's Great Fair by Whitby & Manilla RPO** – 1899, 1¢ Numeral pair tied by Whitby & Manilla RPO cds (ON-876, RF E) on Port Perry Great Fair advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Dated AP 27 99, several months prior to the September fair. 125.00 **SOLD**





Item 664-13 – **3 different Canada Hair Cloth Co special order PSE** – 1891–93, three different 3¢ postal stationery envelopes, EN5 and EN8, with “privately added” Canada Hair Cloth Company corner cards, all mailed from St. Catharines paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa (b/s). Interesting trio from the same period. \$75.00 **SOLD**




Item 664-14 – **EN12 Hamilton stamp dealer underpaid to New York** – 1899, 1¢ stationery envelope with R.S. Mason Stamp Dealer c/c, Webb EN12, from Hamilton attempting 1¢ printed-matter rate to New York. Possibly sealed, caught, lettered, and charged 1¢ postage due. Double Hamilton Bickerdike strike and four New York receivers. An interesting pre-1900 postage-due cover. \$50.00




Item 664-15 – **Dunchurch Ont registered (Parry Sound)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Dunchurch Ont, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Burk's Falls and Toronto (b/s). \$50.00



Item 664-16 – **Commanda Ont registered (Parry Sound)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Commanda Ont, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via North Bay and Trout Creek, carried by Tor & N. Bay RPO No. 2 and Mont & North Bay RPO (b/s). \$50.00





Item 664-17 – **Grand Valley Ont registered (Dufferin)** – 1926, 1¢, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by registered handstamp on Herald and Star reply cover from Grand Valley Ont, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Orangeville & Teeswater RPO No. 1, with Toronto transit (b/s). \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 664-18 – **Avonmore Ont registered (Stormont)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Avonmore Ont duplex cancel on Herald and Star reply cover, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Mont & S. Falls RPO train 30. \$25.00 **SOLD**








Carried by multiple RPOs: Tor & Lon MC, Tor & Ottawa CPR No. 3, Montreal, Rigaud & Ottawa RPO. \$25.00 **SOLD**





Item 664-21 – **Iona Station Ont registered (Elgin)** - 1926, 1¢, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Iona Station Ont, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Lon & Walk RPO Train No. 4 (b/s). \$50.00





Item 664-22 – **Clarke Ont registered (Durham)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Clarke Ont, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Montreal & Toronto RPO 10 (two strikes). \$50.00





Item 664-23 – **Northfield BC registered (RF C)** - 1926, 1¢, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on Herald and Star reply cover from Northfield BC, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Nanaimo (oval), carried by %C&V% BC and Vic & Well RPO. Northfield became Nanaimo Sub No.7. \$100.00 **SOLD**





Item 664-24 – **Great Central BC registered, Victoria Courtenay RPO clerk** - 1926, 1¢, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Great Central BC broken circle on Herald and Star reply cover, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Alberni (b/s) and handled by Vict & Court A. L. Robinson R.M.C. railway clerk postmark, Gray WT-813. RF E. \$200.00 **SOLD**




Item 664-25 – Williams Lake BC registered (RF B) – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by registered handstamp on Herald and Star reply cover from Williams Lake BC, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by &C&V RPO& (ornament 152) and S&Q RPO (b/s) the Squamish & Quesnel track. \$75.00



Item 664-26 – **Cranbrook BC registered** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Cranbrook BC cds on Herald and Star reply cover, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Med. Hat & Nel RPO No. 7, indicia 68, WT-344.07, RF C (b/s). \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 664-27 – **Powell River BC registered (C&V with Swastika ornament)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Powell River BC duplex cancel on cover paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Vancouver (b/s) and carried by Cal & Van RPO with Swastika ornament (ornament 104), listed by Gray as WT-101.104, 1916–1928, RF C. \$75.00 **SOLD**




Item 664-28 – **Ladner BC registered** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by Ladner BC cds on cover paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Vancouver transit (b/s) \$25.00 **SOLD**





Item 664-29 – **Vancouver BC drop registered with 10¢ plum 116** – 1921, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral (plum, 116) tied by Vancouver BC cds on Provincial Collector c/c cover paying 12¢ drop registered letter rate. Vancouver (b/s). A very scarce drop registered cover bearing a 10¢ plum. \$50.00



Item 664-30 – **Vancouver Heights BC registered (RF D)** - 1926, 2¢ and 10¢ Admirals tied by grid cancel and cds on Herald and Star reply cover from Vancouver Heights Post Office BC, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Vancouver transit (b/s). A seldom-seen Vancouver registered cover from a post office in operation from 1919 to 1948. RF D. \$150.00



Item 664-31 – **Victoria BC roller No.8 registered** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admirals tied by a neat Victoria BC roller No. 8 cancel on Herald and Star reply cover, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). \$50.00



Item 664-32 – **Springfield N.S. registered (Annapolis)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admirals tied by Springfield N.S. cds on Herald and Star reply cover, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by Bridgewater & Middleton RPO as week as St. John & Montreal RPO (b/s) \$25.00




Item 664-33 – **North Edmonton Alta registered** - 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by North Edmonton Alta duplex cancel on Herald and Star reply cover, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Carried by North Battleford & Edmonton RPO. \$25.00 **SOLD**




Item 664-34 – **M. Villeneuve Mont & Calumet RPO (a new discovery)** – 1923, 1¢ (3) and 10¢ Admiral tied by Ste. Thérèse-de-Blainville Que duplex cancel on cover, with Keyhole, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to St. Hermas Que. Reverse with Railway Post Office clerk handstamp Mont & Calumet RPO M. Villeneuve West AUG 11 1923. Similar to QC-146 but with short Montreal. Unlisted; presumably a new Quebec RPO discovery. \$300.00



Item 664-35 –**St. Henri Letter Carrier Depot** – 1923, 1¢, 2¢, 5¢ (2) Admiral tied by Montreal roller cancel on insurance company advertising cover paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Pointe Claire. Routed via Montreal L.C.D. St. Henri the next day (b/s). \$75.00



Item 664-36 – **RE1 10¢ registered envelope used locally** - 1928, 2¢ Confederation tied by large oval registered cancel, struck in purple, on RE1 10¢ stationery registered envelope from Winnipeg, paying 12¢ drop registered letter rate. I have seen only a few drop-registered RE1 covers; certainly uncommon. \$50.00 **SOLD**




Item 664-37 – **Hamilton PEI registered (Keyhole)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral cancelled by matching pen zigzag on cover from Hamilton PEI, with keyhole registration handstamp, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Kensington and carried by Charlottetown & Tignish and Charlottetown & Sackville RPOs (b/s). Hamilton PEI is scarce, in operation until the end of 1934, Murray RF D. \$75.00




Item 664-38 – **Compulsory registered River Hebert NS to Montreal** – 1928, 2¢ postal stationery envelope EN29 mailed from River Hebert N.S., paying 2¢ letter rate to Montreal (b/s). At the office of origin, the cover was compulsorily registered either under the Postmaster's suspicion of containing valuables or because valuables were actually found, and assigned registration number 4881. No 10¢ or 20¢ postage due was charged, as this was not an underpaid registered item but a compulsory registration. Carried by Halifax & Campbellton RPO and treated throughout as registered mail, as confirmed by the backstamps. H.B. Robinson Co. was an import-export freight-forwarding business. \$300.00




Item 664-39 – Cartier Ont registered ( Sudbury District ) – 1922, 3¢, 5¢ (2) Admiral tied by Cartier Ont broken circle on cover paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Brockville (*oval registered Brockville b/s*). Carried by North Bay & Fort William RPO 1 and 2 (two different hammers, same day), routed via Ottawa (b/s). \$100.00





Item 664-40 – **Sudbury to Parry Harbour registered, returned** – 1922, 5¢ Admiral, 2¢+1¢ MR3 (pre-affixing fault) tied by oval Sudbury registered cancel on barrister cover, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Parry Harbour (Parry Sound receiver). Carried by Tor & Fort William RPO No. 5 and routed via Toronto (b/s). Not called for in Parry Harbour and returned registered to Sudbury via the same line, Tor & Fort William RPO No. 4, with Sudbury receiver and Fowler private receiver on face. Slightly reduced at left. \$50.00



Item 664-41 – **RE1 10¢ registered envelope used locally** - 1928, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto Sub Office No.43 cds on RE1 10¢ stationery registered envelope paying the 12¢ drop registered letter rate. An interesting Toronto Sub Office use. \$50.00



Item 664-42 – **Courtland Ont registered (Norfolk)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on cover from Courtland Ont paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via Toronto and carried by Hamilton & St. Thomas RPO East (b/s). A pretty Courtland "Original No" registration handstamp in blue. \$25.00



Item 664-43 – Londesborough Ont registered (ON-638, RF F) – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on cover from Londesborough Ont paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Routed via London, carried by London & Wingham RPO and with by Train No. Tor & London GRT RPO (Gray ON-638, 1920-1928, RF F). \$200.00



Item 664-44 – **Spurgrave Manitoba registered (RF C)** – 1929, 12¢ Historical tied by grid and RPO cancel on cover from Spurgrave Man, paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Massachusetts (b/s). Carried by Fort Frances & Winnipeg RPO No. 4, indicia 20, and by U.S. RPO Warroad & Duluth (b/s). A pretty RF C Manitoba cover with a Historical Issue stamp, registered and very scarce RPO track. \$75.00


Item 664-45 – Swift Current to Germany – 1929, 2¢ Scroll (2) tied by Swift Current Sask machine cancel on 2¢ Admiral stationery card, overpaying 4¢ UPU postcard rate to Germany. Written DE 31 28 and entered the mails JA 1 29. \$25.00



Item 664-46 – **Hawkshaw NB Keyhole (York County)** – 1939, 13¢ Pictorial of 1935 cancelled by grid on cover from Hawkshaw NB, with keyhole registration handstamp, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Woodstock (b/s). Fredericton transit (b/s). \$25.00



Item 664-47 – **10¢ RCMP positional copy on cover** – 1936, 3¢ and 10¢ Pictorials of 1935, 10¢ Mountie position 3 with Canadian Bank Note Co. Ottawa imprint in margin, tied by London cds on cover paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s) \$25.00




Item 664-48 – **Egoist Book Shop registered cover** – 1938, 3¢ Mufti and 10¢ Pictorials of 1935 tied by Ottawa Station B cds on Royalty/Royal Visit illustrated cover, with book shop return-address cinderella added, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 664-49 – **Toronto Station C Orb cancel type 3-TC7** – 1933, 13¢ Ottawa Conference tied by Montreal Station B cds on cover paying 13¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Toronto Station C Orb cancel, type 3-TC7, dated JA 24 33, used as receiver. A notably difficult Toronto postmark. The Orb hammer was used in the six major cities: Hamilton, London, Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, and Winnipeg and also by the Dead Letter Office during the Great War. For this Toronto Station C, recorded from 1920 to 1936, this indicia "10" strike is the first reported example. For the specialist. \$75.00




Item 664-50 – **Stratford Ont, by travelling letter box** – 1940, 3¢ Mufti tied by Toronto machine cancel on Empire Stamp Co. reply cover from Stratford, Ontario, with RPO handstamp reading “*This mail was carried in travelling letter box to Toronto.*” The stamp was cancelled on arrival in Toronto. \$25.00




Item 664-51 – **Arctic Fur, 1¢ UPU printed matter rate to Switzerland** – c.1939, 1¢ Mufti precancel on Vancouver Arctic Fur Trading Co. advertising cover, censored in Canada with DB/C.205 and censor label affixed over the stamp, paying 1¢ UPU printed-matter rate to Switzerland. Addressed to a Hudson's Bay fur store in Geneva. \$75.00 **SOLD**




Item 664-52 – **Cornwall Ontario to 1 Canadian General Hospital** – 1941, 2¢, 3¢, 5¢ Mufti and 20¢ Pictorial tied by Cornwall Ont duplex on Motor Sales Co. c/o cover dated AU 5 41, paying 30¢ airmail letter rate to Canadian Army Overseas. Addressed to Staff Sgt W. J. A. Benoit, 1 Canadian General Hospital (near Birmingham, England). The RCAMC notation indicates Benoit was serving there rather than hospitalized. Uncensored, routed via Ottawa base APO and onward to APO SC1 in England (AU 12 41). A remarkably fast 7-day transit. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 664-53 – **Sherbrooke "Postage Paid in Cash" permit** – 1932, 1¢ Sherbrooke PQ GR *Postage Paid in Cash* permit No. 5 on Seminary cover, paying 1¢ printed-matter rate to New York. These permit covers are typically undated, and we usually have to infer their period of use from context, having a private receiver handstamp on the back that confirms the date is especially appealing. Just a wow dated example. \$100.00 **SOLD**




Item 664-54 – **4¢ GEOVI stationery envelope cutout use** – 1944, 4¢ GEOVI Offset Issue stationery-envelope cutout affixed to Imperial Oil reply cover, tied by Moose Jaw & Calgary RPO No. 9 cds, paying 4¢ letter rate to Toronto. A charming unauthorized usage that was either overlooked or quietly accepted in transit. \$25.00 **SOLD**




Item 664-55 – **3¢ Ottawa Conference plate block on cover** – 1944, 2¢ Arch, 3¢ Ottawa Conference plate block tied by Chatham Ont cds on cover paying 14¢ registered letter rate to Quebec (b/s). Carried by Tor. Lon & Wind RPO, Montreal transit and Quebec City Blackout cancels (b/s). \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 664-56 – **55¢ triple weight airmail registered Bulgaria** – 1948, 5¢ War and 50¢ Peace tied by Toronto Station E cds on FECB cover; reverse bears a striking Christmas cinderella block of 12, also tied by Toronto Station E, paying 55¢ triple-weight airmail registered letter rate to Bulgaria. Passed for export with initials and routed via Montreal (b/s). \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 664-57 – **Two Pilot Mound Manitoba postage due cards** – 1973, two identical shortpaid mail cards (form 33-86-055 12-56), each bearing 2¢ and 4¢ red Due stamps. One is cancelled with a Pilot Mound circular date stamp, the other with the POCON 514128, both in 1973. A pretty and appealing pair. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 664-58 – **Empress Consolidated Gold Mines Ltd** – 1936, Gibson M. Todd Investments, Toronto. Empress Consolidated Gold Mines Limited. Axometric projection of surface, diamond drilling, and underground workings. Information compiled from reports on the property by R. W. Howe (1935-1936) and M. B. Craig (1936). Approved NO 30 36 by Charles Desrosiers, President and General Manager. [Toronto, 1936]. Pictorial plan printed in red and black, overall 12½ x 24½ inches; minor creasing, previously folded—likely for mailing—otherwise in very good condition.
