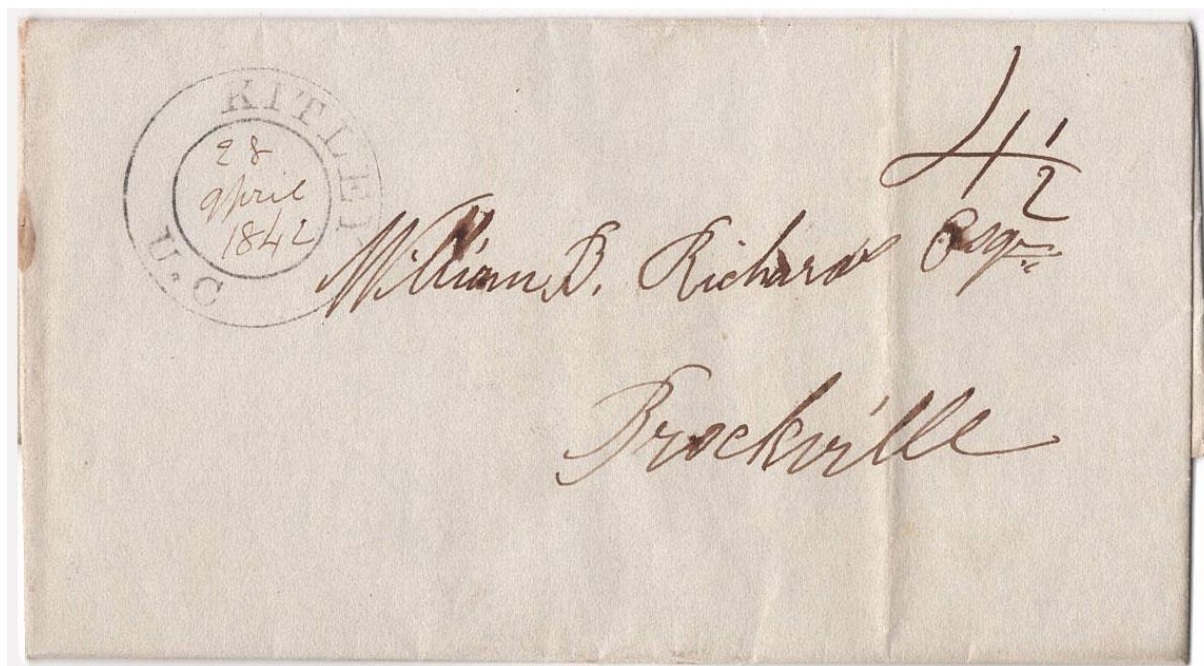

Item 665-01 – **St. Thomas UC 1829 type in red with typeset** – 1835, folded letter from St. Thomas, UC, prepaid with a "Paid." handstamp to Chippawa. This St. Thomas marking, known as the 1829 type, is recorded from 1829 to 1839. The typeset hammer is known only in 1835–1836, struck in red; thereafter the typeset disappears and the marking is found in green. \$300.00



Item 665-02 – **Kitley UC (Leeds County)** – 1842, folded letter from Kitley, UC, rated 4½d collect to Brockville. Kitley is an exceptionally rare office; its double-circle marking is recorded only from 1840 to 1848, while the office itself operated from 1832 to 1856. Exhibit-quality letter. \$500.00

Item 665-32 – **6¢ UPU postcard rate to Switzerland, short** – 1925, 3¢ Admiral tied by Winnipeg Garden Show slogan cancel on 2¢ Admiral stationery, underpaying 6¢ UPU postcard rate to Switzerland; assessed T30, with manuscript "20" applied in Switzerland and paid by a 20-centimes Swiss postage due stamp. Sample rate	98. Samples of merchandise or of goods for sale are subject to the rate of one cent for each two ounces or fraction thereof.
Limit of weight and size of sample packets.	99. The limits of weight and size for sample packets are as follows:—weight 1 lb.; size 18 inches x 8 inches x 4 inches, or if in the form of a roll, 18 inches in length by 6 inches in diameter. Samples exceeding these limits of weight and size are transmissible by parcel post.
Restricted application of sample rate.	100. The sample post rate is restricted to bona fide samples, which are not of saleable value. An article of saleable value even if it is intended to serve the purpose of a sample is liable to parcel post rate. Agents' equipments, goods sent for sale or in execution of any order (however small the quantity may be) or articles sent by one private individual to another which are not actually samples, are not transmissible at sample rate, but as an exception saleable individual packages of canned food (e.g. sardines, etc.) may be sent as samples provided they are properly packed.
Canned food, prohibition.	Samples of intoxicating liquors are not admitted to Sample Post.
No writing allowed.	101. There must be no writing upon or in any packet of samples, except the address of the person for whom it is intended, the address of the sender, a trade mark or number and essential elements of the price of the articles, or such words as may be necessary to indicate precisely the origin and nature of the merchandise.



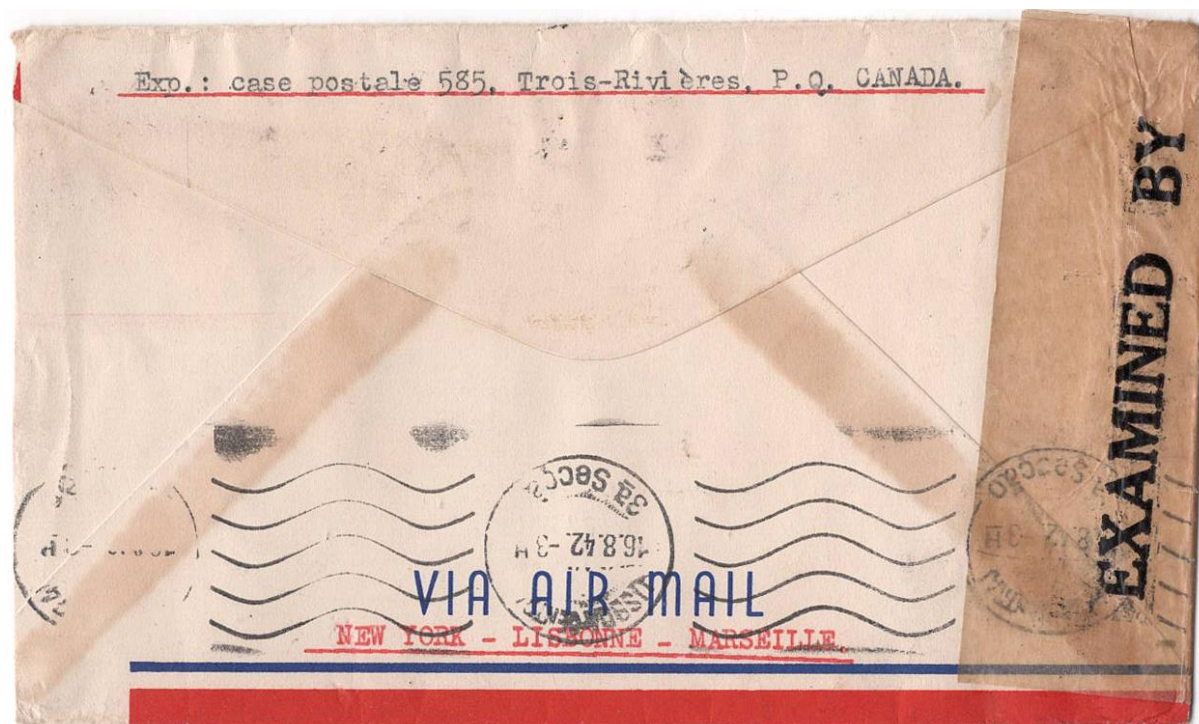
