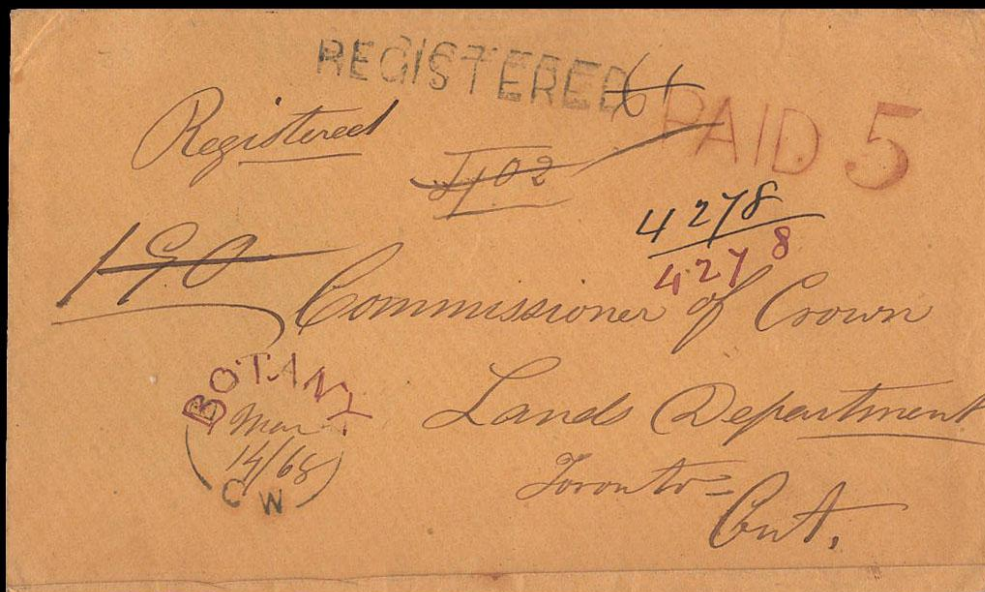

This week's catalogue offers a varied selection of Canadian postal history, highlighted by a very attractive CAN PAC RY perfin registered Scroll cover, the sole recorded Botany CW strike (Kent County), a 4¢ Empire underpaid to Uganda, a 1778 Colonel Thomas Carleton letter to the 29th Regiment at Montreal, a Clarenceville Que airmail registered to Hong Kong, a 10¢ Chamber single-use to the Azores, a Quebec to Madeira Archipelago 1788 letter, and a broad assortment of general postal history. Item 667-01 – **Colonel Thomas Carleton to 29th Regiment at Montreal** – 1778, folded letter from Colonel Thomas Carleton, Quebec 2 July 1778, to Lt Monk, 29th Regiment, Montreal. Endorsed On His Majesty's Service in Carleton's hand. Dual rated 8d Sterling and 9d Currency. Thomas Carleton, brother of Sir Guy Carleton (Lord Dorchester), was at this date Quarter Master General of the forces commanded by his brother, then Governor of Quebec. Thomas would later become Governor of New Brunswick in 1784; Sir Guy would be named Commander in Chief of His Majesty's forces in British America in 1782. Letter concerns Lt Monk's request for employment on the recruiting service, which Carleton granted, seeing no likelihood of the Regiment being engaged in action in the coming year. \$3,000.00



Item 667-02 – **Quebec to Madeira Archipelago** – 1788, grain market and exchange letter from Quebec, dated JY 6 1788, signed Robert Lester & Company, to Newton Gordon & Johnson, Madeira Islands, Portugal (*spirits and wine merchants*). Endorsed per Steamer Brothers, Capt Flynn, likely a West Indies private trader. Lester, an Irish-born Quebec merchant established by 1772, operated from 7 Rue Saint-Pierre and built a trade in imported cloth and spirits and in the export of wheat; he served as a militia captain during the 1775–76 siege. Some separations at fold. \$2,000.00

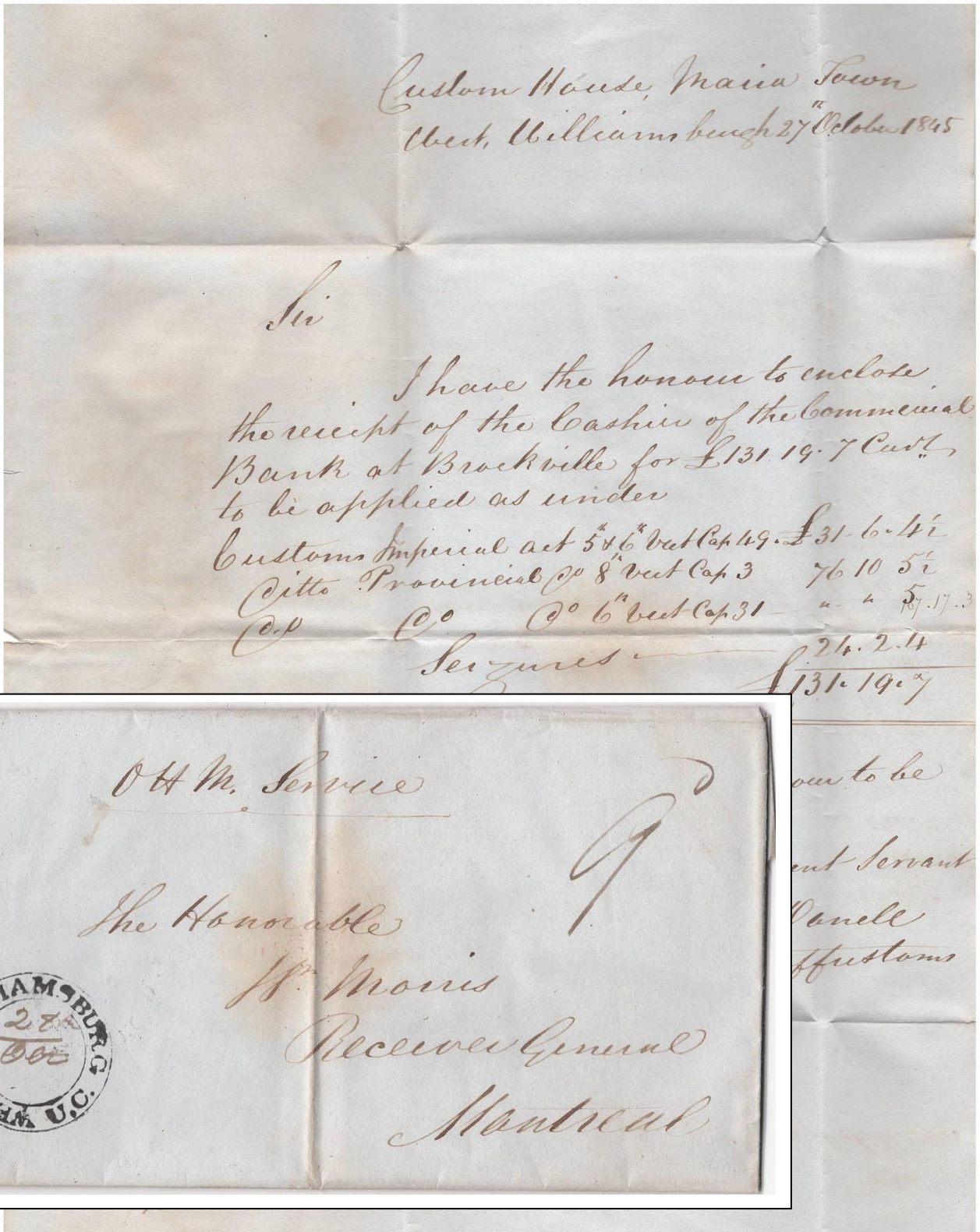

Item 667-03 – **Brome LC double circle (Italic lettering)** – 1834, folded letter from Brome LC with double-circle struck in black and manuscript date in red, rated 7d collect to Montreal. Superb strike of the Brome double circle, recorded for only five years and the finest example I have handled. Letter of legal nature discussing fees in a lawsuit. \$300.00 **SOLD**

Item 667-04 – **Middleton UC manuscript (Later Delhi, Norfolk County)** – 1837, Postmaster free-franked letter datelined Middleton OC 24 37, signed Middleton Postmaster, to St Thomas. The Post Office at Middleton (*twp of same name*) was opened JY 6 31 with Robert de Cou as first PM; Nelson Eagles, writer of this letter, was the third Postmaster. Office renamed Delhi in 1853 and remains in operation. A rare letter from the 1837 rebellion era with Norfolk County origin. \$400.00




Item 667-05 – **West Williamsburg UC, a superb strike (Dundas)** - 1845, Customs House folded letter datelined Maria Town OC 27 45 and endorsed OHMS, mailed from West Williamsburg, rated 9d collect to Montreal. Superb, bold strike in black of this Dundas Office marking. Known from 1839 to 1848 in both red and black; the office closed in 1851. A particularly choice example from this short-lived period. \$300.00

Item 667-06 – **East Williamsburg UC, LRD (Dundas)** - 1848, folded letter datelined Charlesville JU 17 48, mailed from East Williamsburg UC, showing the 29mm hammer in red (postmark previously recorded 1842–46; this being the latest recorded). Paid 9d to Montreal (b/s). Letter of business between two brothers, likely partners in Eastern Ontario. Charlesville or Charleville Post Office, located in Augusta Township, Grenville County, did not open until 1853. \$200.00

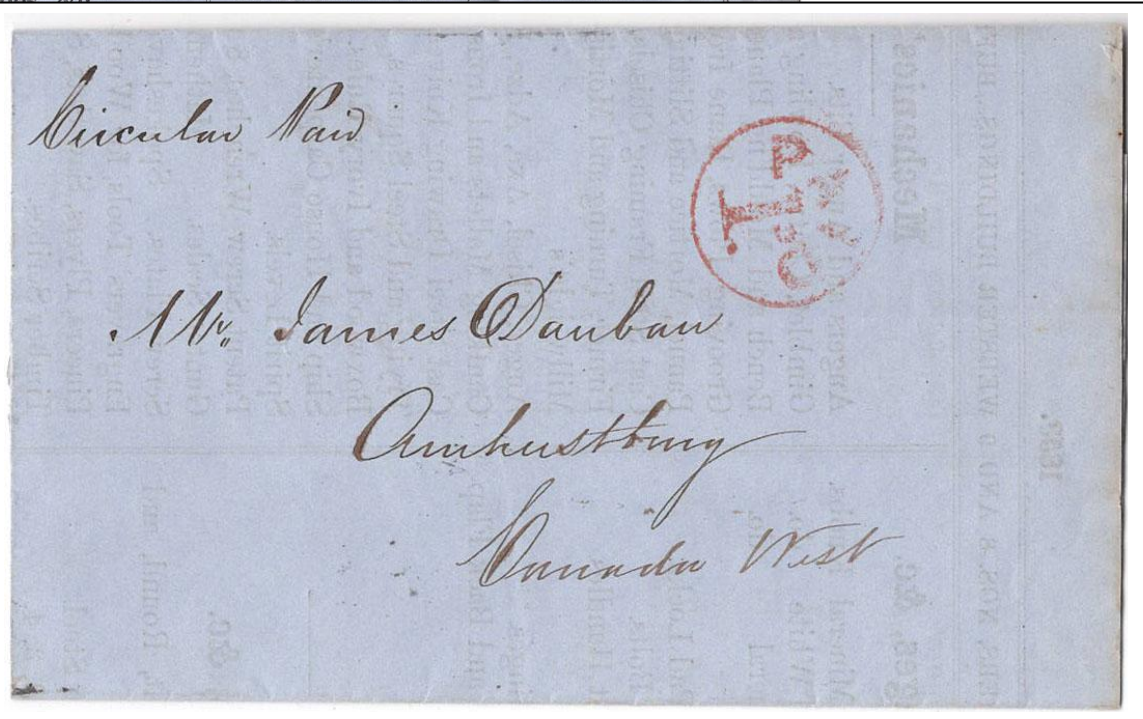

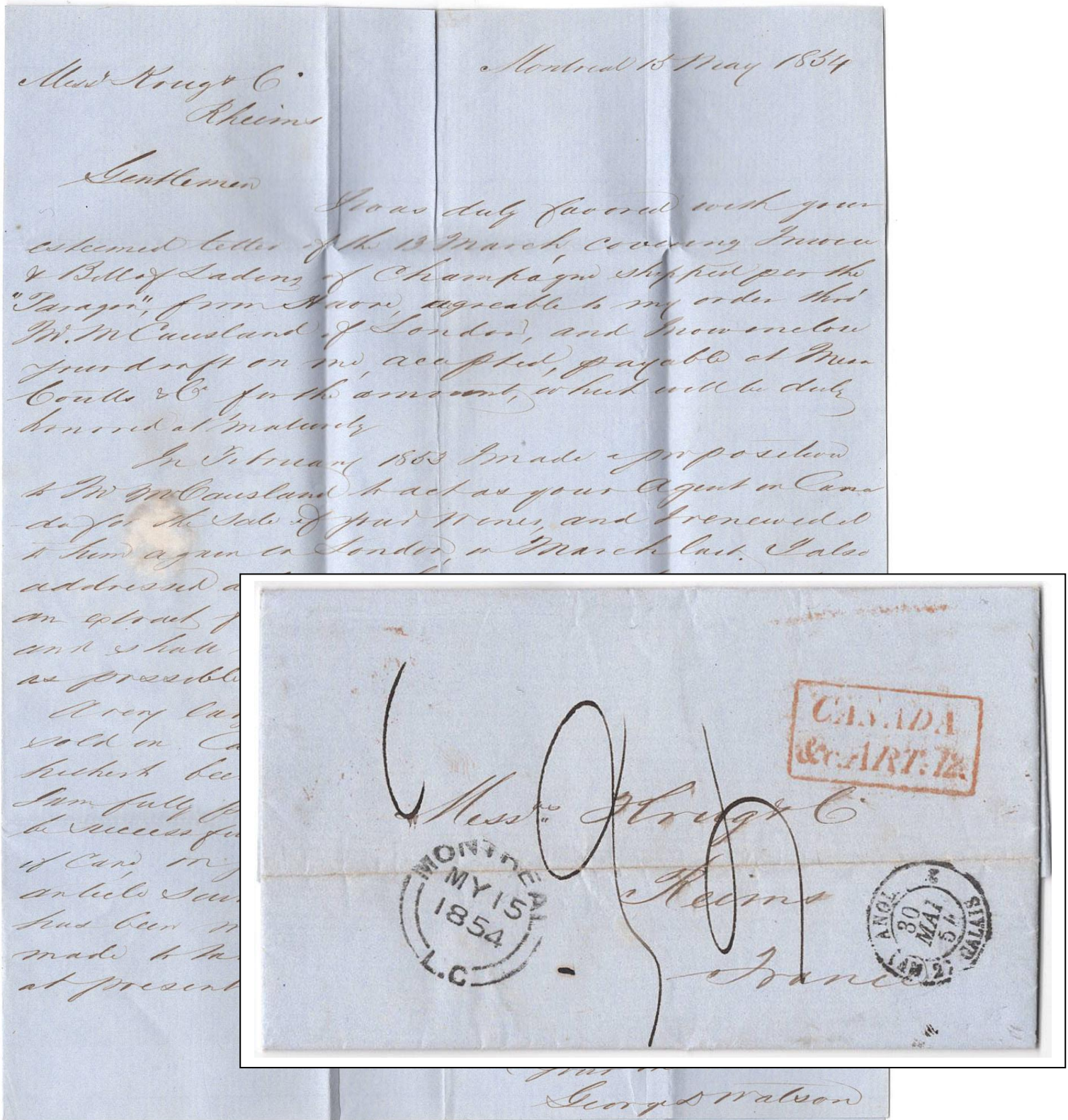

Item 667-07 – **Buffalo NY circular prepaid in Chatham to Amherstburg UC** – 1853, Thomson Brothers Steel, Iron and Tool circular from Buffalo NY, endorsed *Circular Paid*, paid 1d to Amherstburg via Chatham (b/s). The paid 1d marking indicates that a batch of circulars was carried to Chatham and mailed onward to surrounding citizens and businesses in Upper Canada. The two backstamps, Chatham and Amherstburg, are highly unusual, as routing is seldom seen on circulars. A scarce Paid 1d usage in Southern Ontario. \$300.00



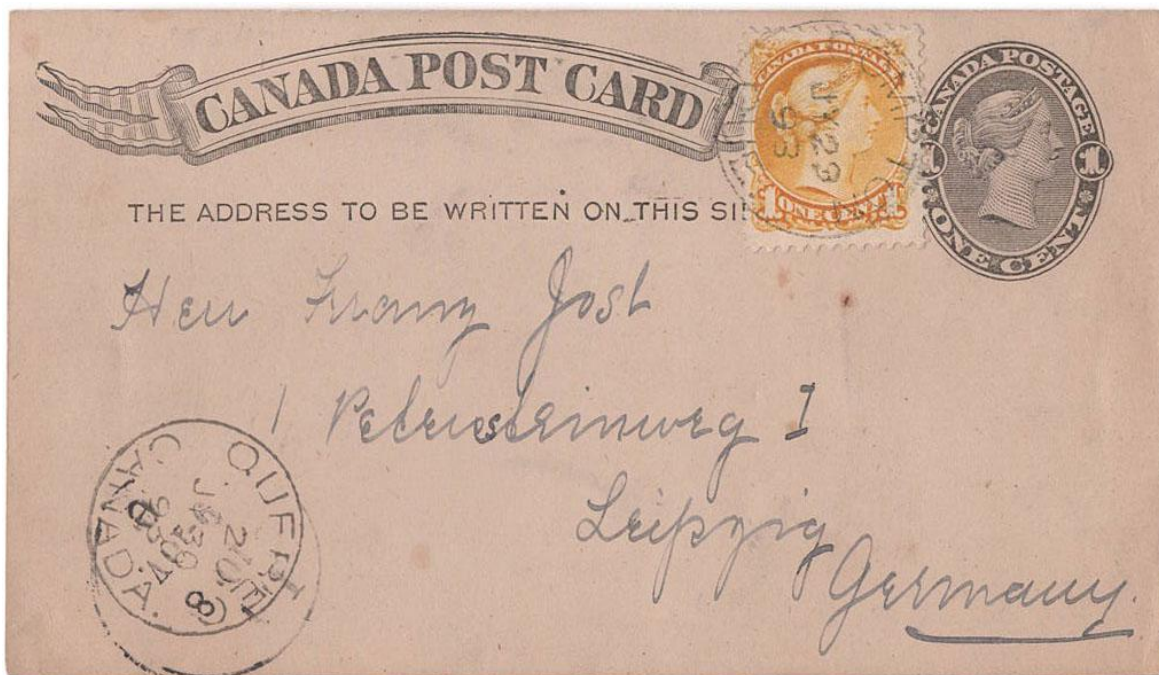
Item 667-08 – **Montreal to France, Canada Article 12** – 1854, cognac and champagne business letter from Montreal to France (b/s), carried under the Anglo-French postal agreement, Article 12. Rated 34 décimes collect: 24 décimes to Great Britain (MY 29 54 with crown b/s) and 10 décimes French internal postage. Carried by Cunard Africa on her 29th voyage. A very attractive letter about champagne shipped etc and great Art 12 strike. \$250.00



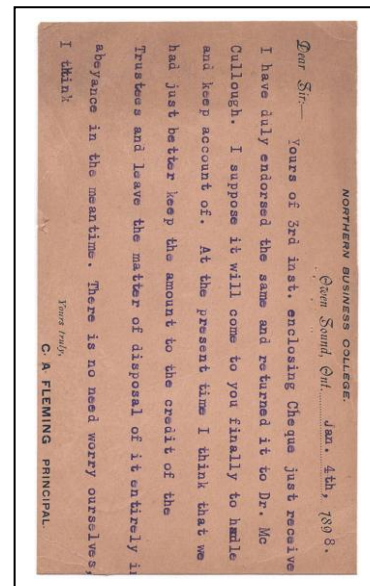
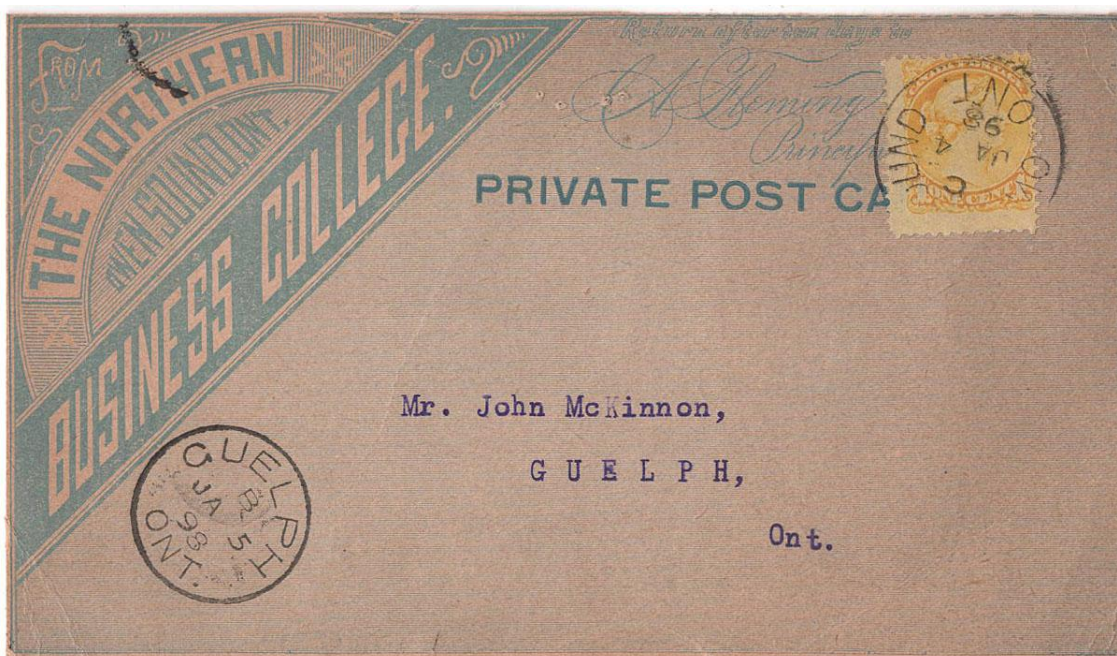
Item 667-09 – **The sole recorded Botany CW strike (Kent County)** – 1868, stampless registered cover from Botany CW paid 5¢ for postage and registry fee to Toronto (b/s), routed via Thamesville and London (b/s). The cover shows the Botany Berri hammer, the only recorded example, with contemporary red enhancement matching the ink of the 4278 registration number. The Botany hammer with ONT is recorded only 1895–96; the office closed in 1900. In all periods, Botany is a very rare Southern Ontario office, located in Howard Township, five miles south of Thamesville. \$450.00 **SOLD**



Item 667-10 – **Collingwood Ont bulk mailing receipt** – 1895, 1¢ SQ pair tied by Collingwood Ont cds on recto of a bulk-mailing receipt for 23 ounces of newspaper paper. Verso with single 1¢ SQ similarly tied by Collingwood cds paying for 10 ounces. An unusual bulk-postage item from Collingwood, being a page from a booklet. \$100.00



Item 667-11 – Compton Que to Germany via Quebec – 1893, 1¢ SQ tied by Compton Que cds on 1¢ stationery card paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Germany via Quebec. Both transit and receiver on front. Message in English refers to Jadassohn’s Manual of Harmony, requesting songs and musical pieces to be sent to a new address in Atlanta, Georgia. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 667-12 – Owen Sound Business College – 1898, 1¢ SQ tied by Owen Sound Ont cds on The Northern Business College private postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to Guelph (receiver on front). Card from the Principal of the College relating to payment and account. \$100.00



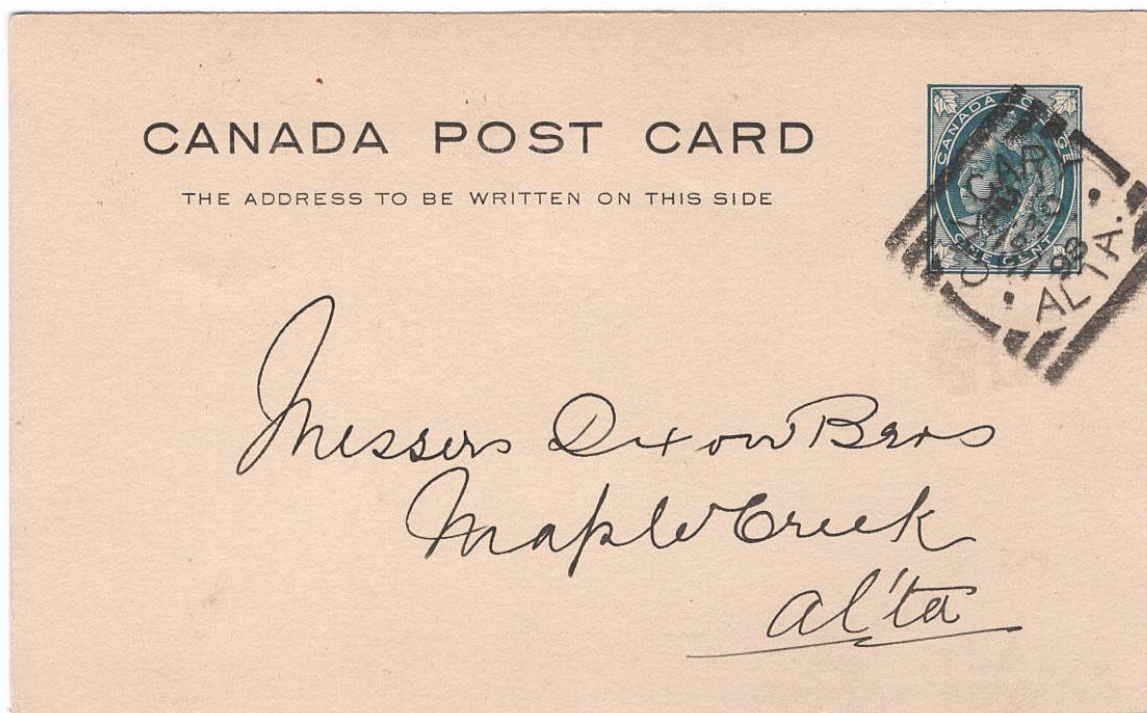
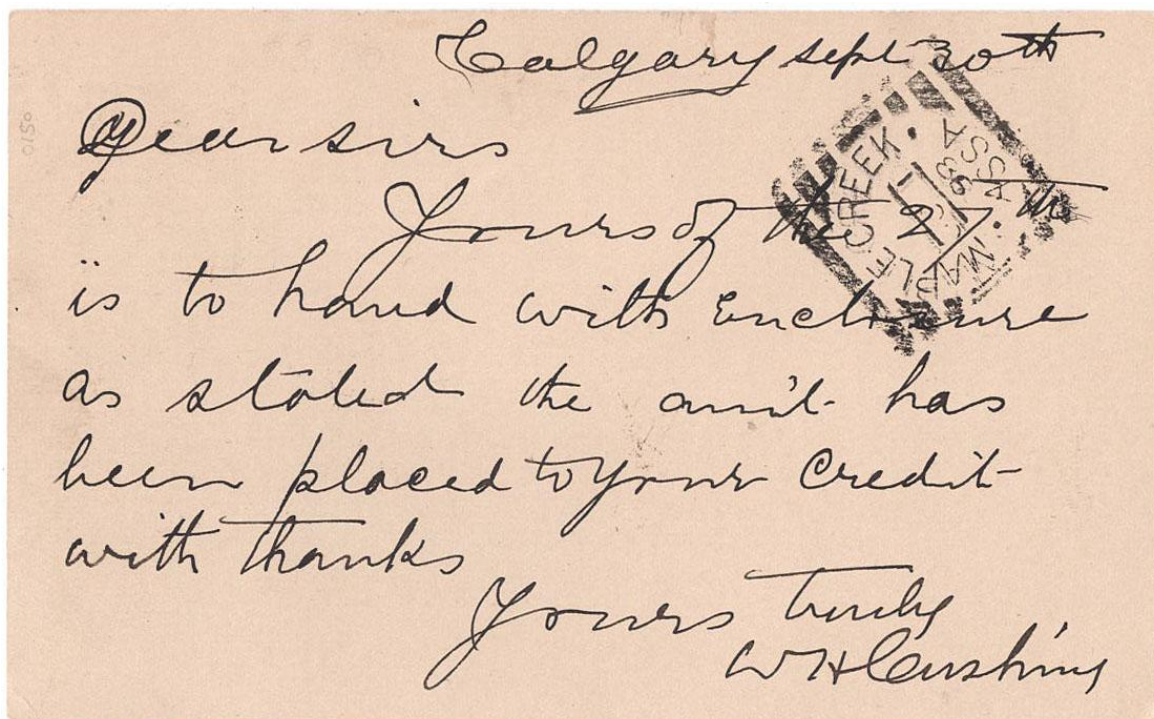
Item 667-13 – **Norham Ont registered (Northumberland)** – 1886, 3¢ SQ tied by concentric ring cancel, 2¢ RLS tied by Registered cancel on cover from Norham Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (oval Registered b/s). Colborne Ont cds (b/s). An early example of the Norham second hammer (1886–1895). \$75.00



Item 667-14 – London lithographers and printers – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by London Orb cancel on Lawson & Jones Lithographers and Printers advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Three Rivers (b/s). \$50.00



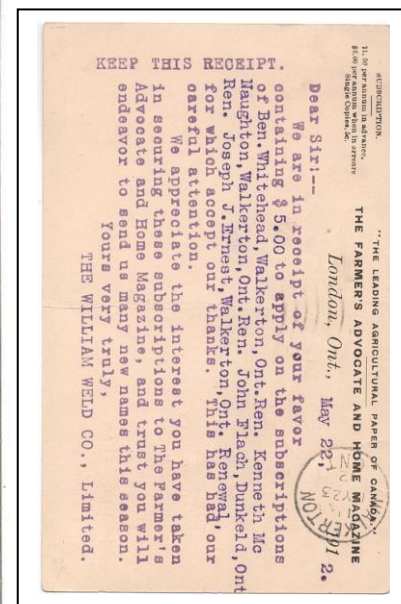
Item 667-15 – Maple Leaf Issue, Calgary Alta – 1898, 1¢ (2) and 3¢ Maple Leaf Issue tied by Calgary Alta squared circle dated MR 12 98 on Rennie cover, overpaying 3¢ letter rate or underpaying 6¢ double-weight letter rate to Toronto (b/s). \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 667-16 – **Calgary Alta and Maple Creek ASSA squares** – 1898, 1¢ Maple Leaf stationery card from Calgary to Maple Creek Assa with two squared circles: Calgary SP 30 98 and Maple Creek OC 1 98. \$100.00 **SOLD**



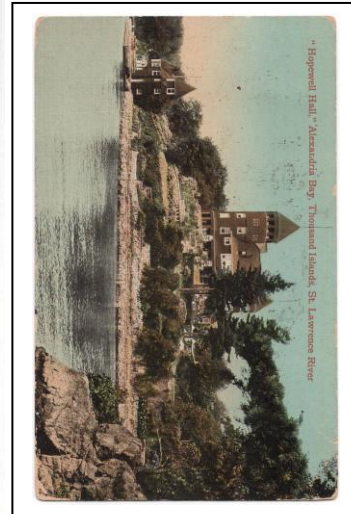
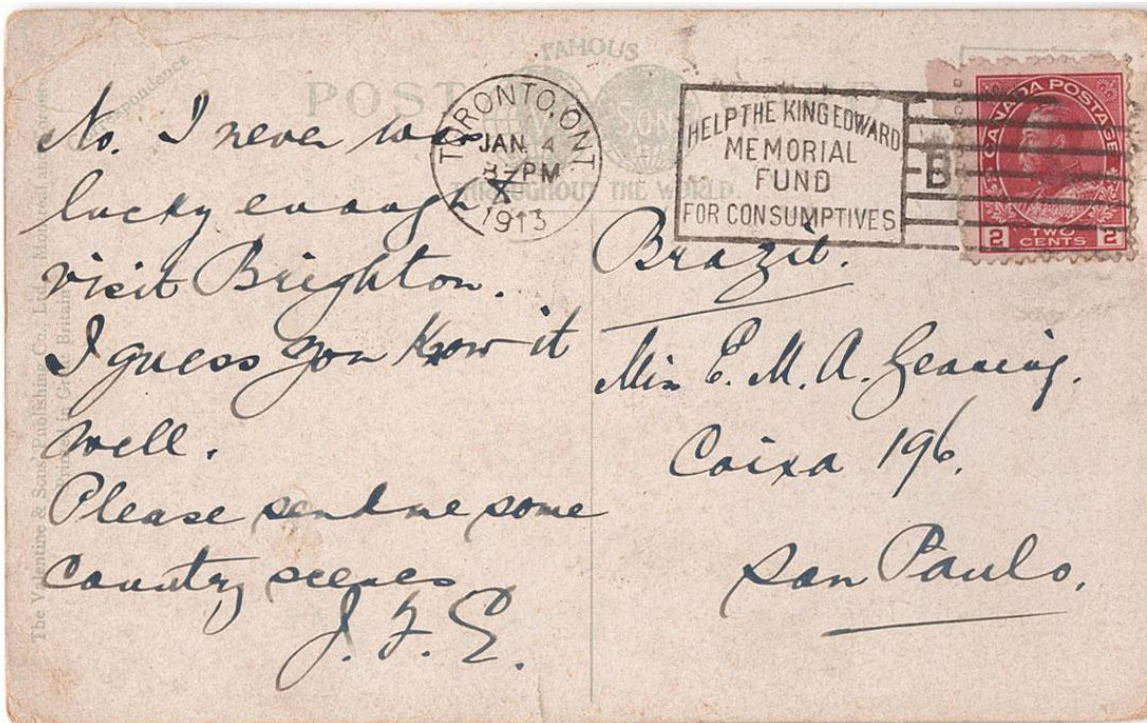
Item 667-17 – **Maple Leaf Issue, Calgary Alta** – 1898, 3¢ Maple Leaf Issue tied by Calgary Alta squared circle dated JU 30 98 on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Ottawa (b/s). Addressed to Colonel William Patrick Anderson, Chief Engineer, Department of Marine and Fisheries of Canada. \$75.00



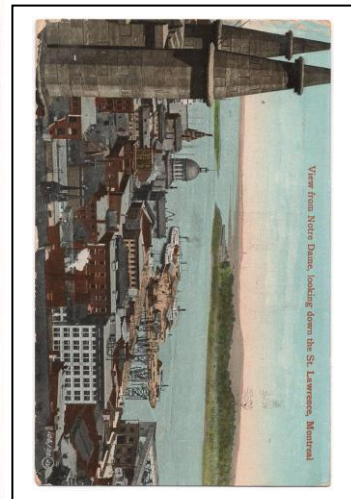
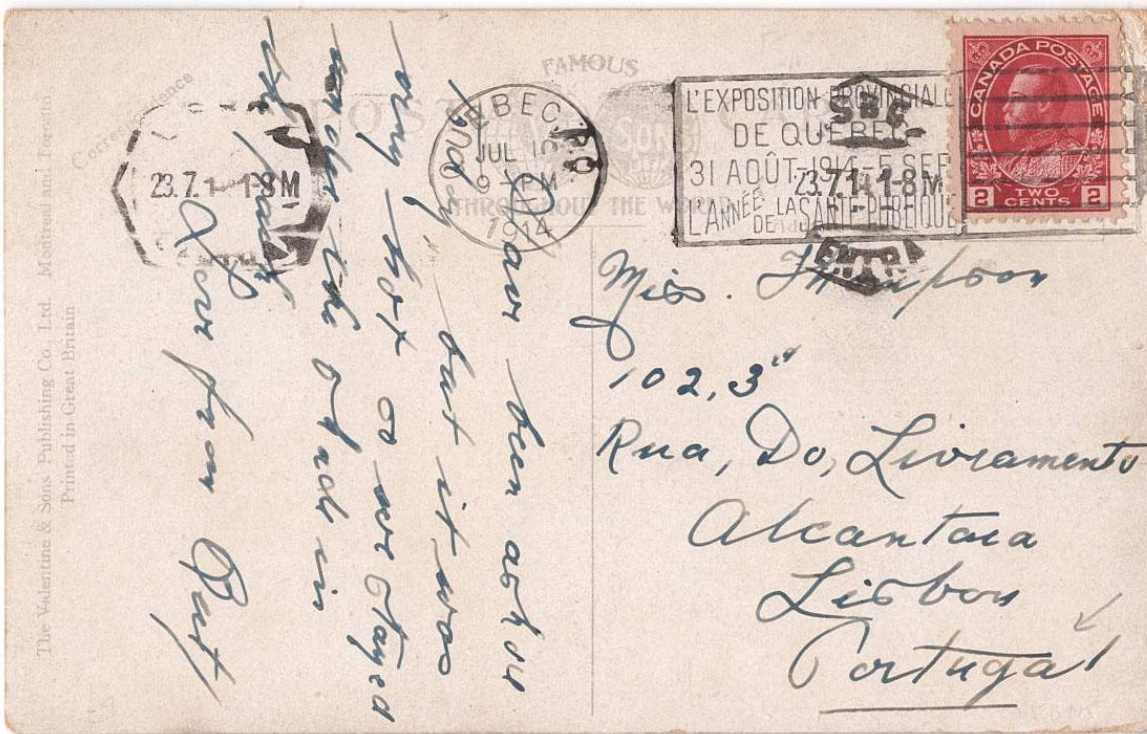

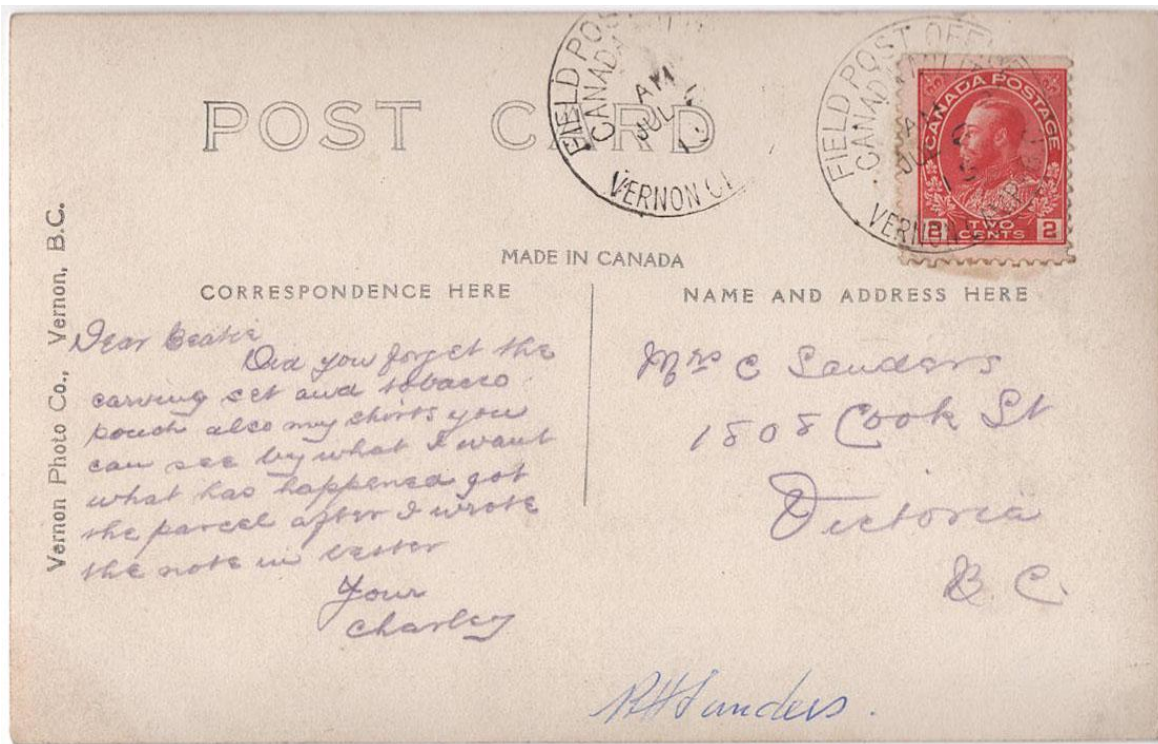
Item 667-20 – 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Brazil – 1913, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto King Edward Memorial Fund International machine cancel on postcard paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Brazil. \$50.00



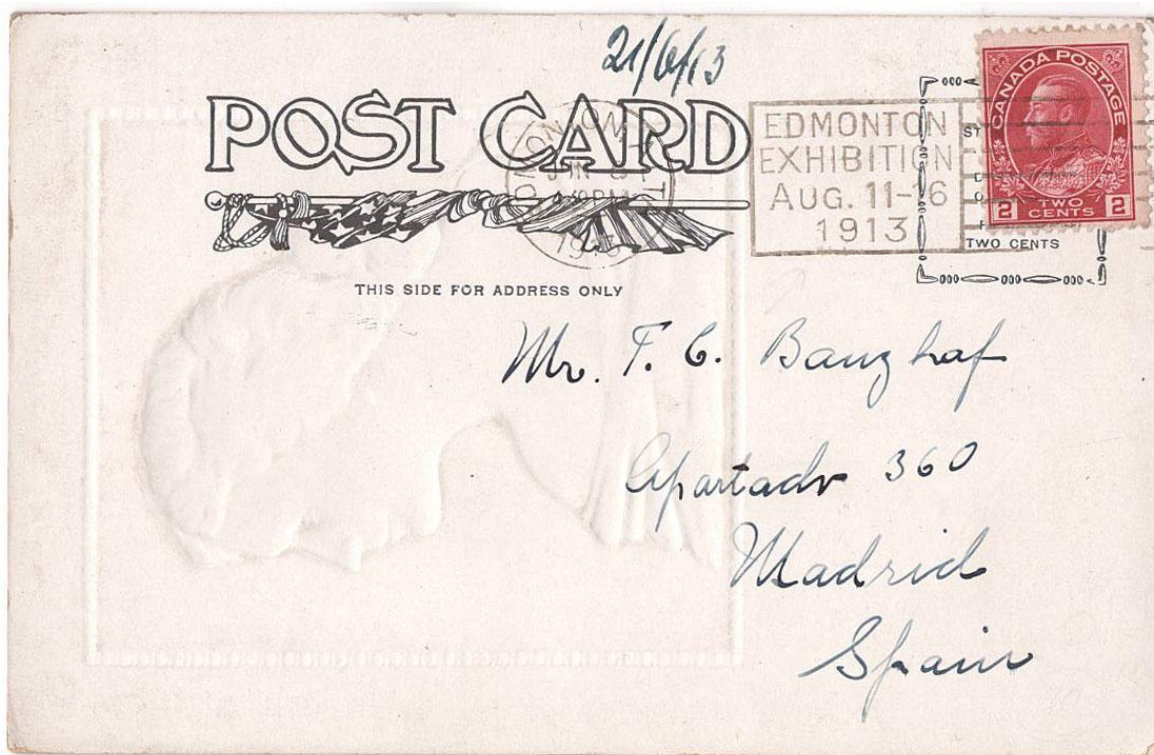
Item 667-21 – 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Portugal – 1914, 2¢ Admiral tied by Quebec Exposition Provinciale de Quebec International machine cancel on postcard paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Portugal (receiver). \$75.00



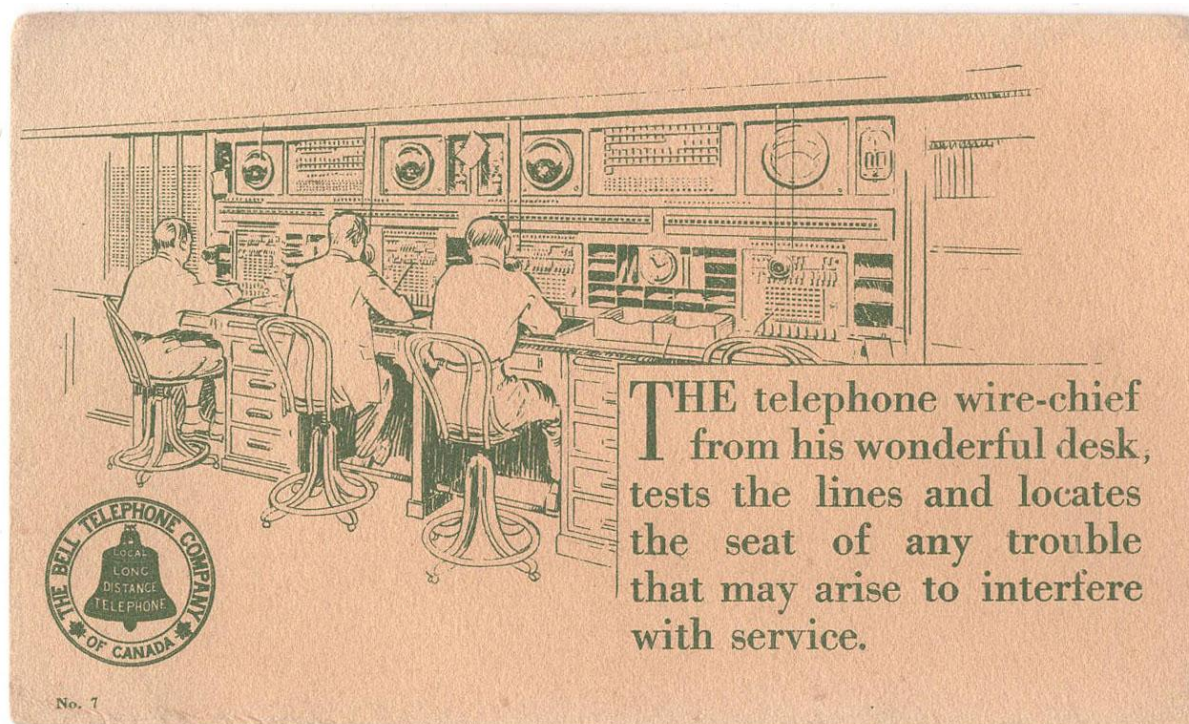
Item 667-22 – **Ice cream with George Vanier, Perkins Canadian Hospital** – 1919, letter and cover dated JU 5 19 from a nurse of the Perkins Bull Hospital for Convalescent Canadian Officers, embossed letterhead, cover with proper hospital handstamp, from a nurse to her mother or possibly to her Mother Superior if she was a nursing sister, to New Jersey. In her letter she describes life, travels, and mentions meeting George Vanier. It reads in part: "Have I mentioned the name of Major George Vanier, DSO, MC, to you? He is about thirty, a French-Canadian, and a member of the staff. He is absolutely the most finished gentleman and widely educated man that I have ever met. I am not alone in this observation; he is frequently spoken of as the gentleman of the hospital. The day before yesterday he took me to London to a matinée. We went to see Fay Wray. After the theatre we went to Rumpelmayer's for tea. But he didn't have tea; instead we had the most delicious ice cream I've had since I left the States, and some French pastry. After tea Major Vanier insisted upon going to a bookshop to 'treat me to a moment of the afternoon.' He selected a volume of Keats' lyrical poems. His favourite is Shelley, etc." A very special letter in the life of a nurse who met one of Canada's greatest and most distinguished figures, a Voodoo, a future General, and the 19th Governor General of Canada. \$300.00

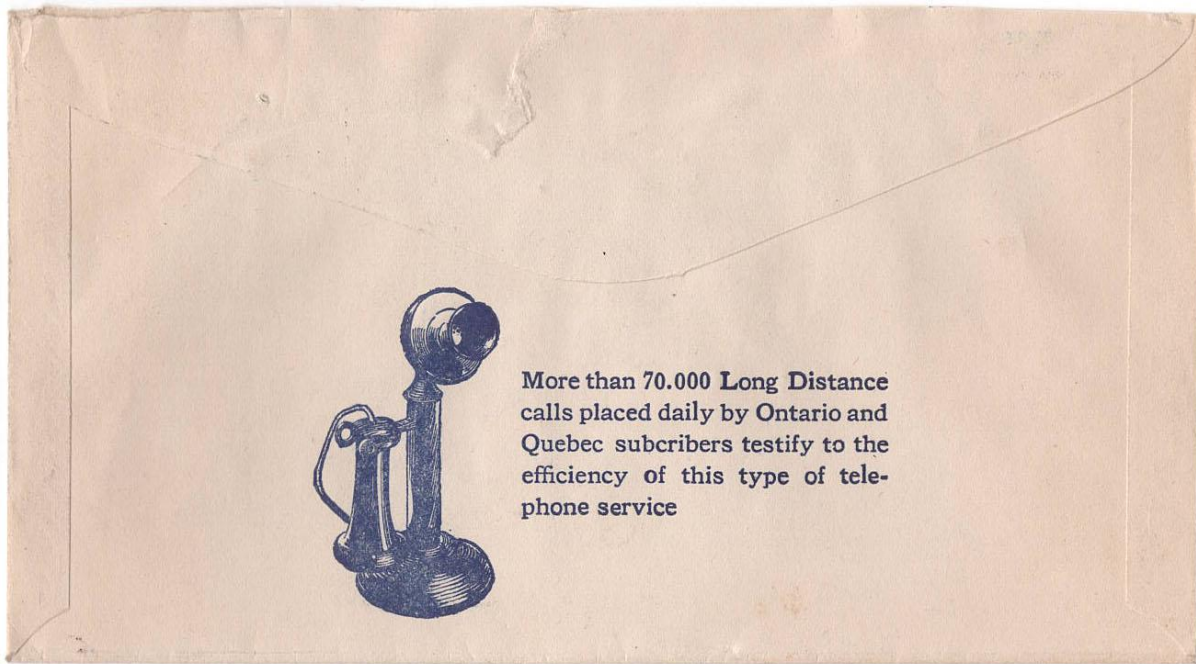

Item 667-26 – **CAN PAC RY registered Scroll cover** – 1929, 1¢ Scroll strip of 6 with CPR perfins tied by roller cancel on Canadian Pacific Express c/c cover from Rosetown Sask paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Winnipeg (b/s). CAN PAC RY Rosetown Sask (b/s). \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 667-27 – **1¢ Arch BT perfin, drop letter** – 1932, 1¢ Arch pair with BT perfins tied by Amherstburg Ont duplex cancel on Bell Telephone Company paying 2¢ drop letter rate. Scarce with Arch Issue. \$35.00

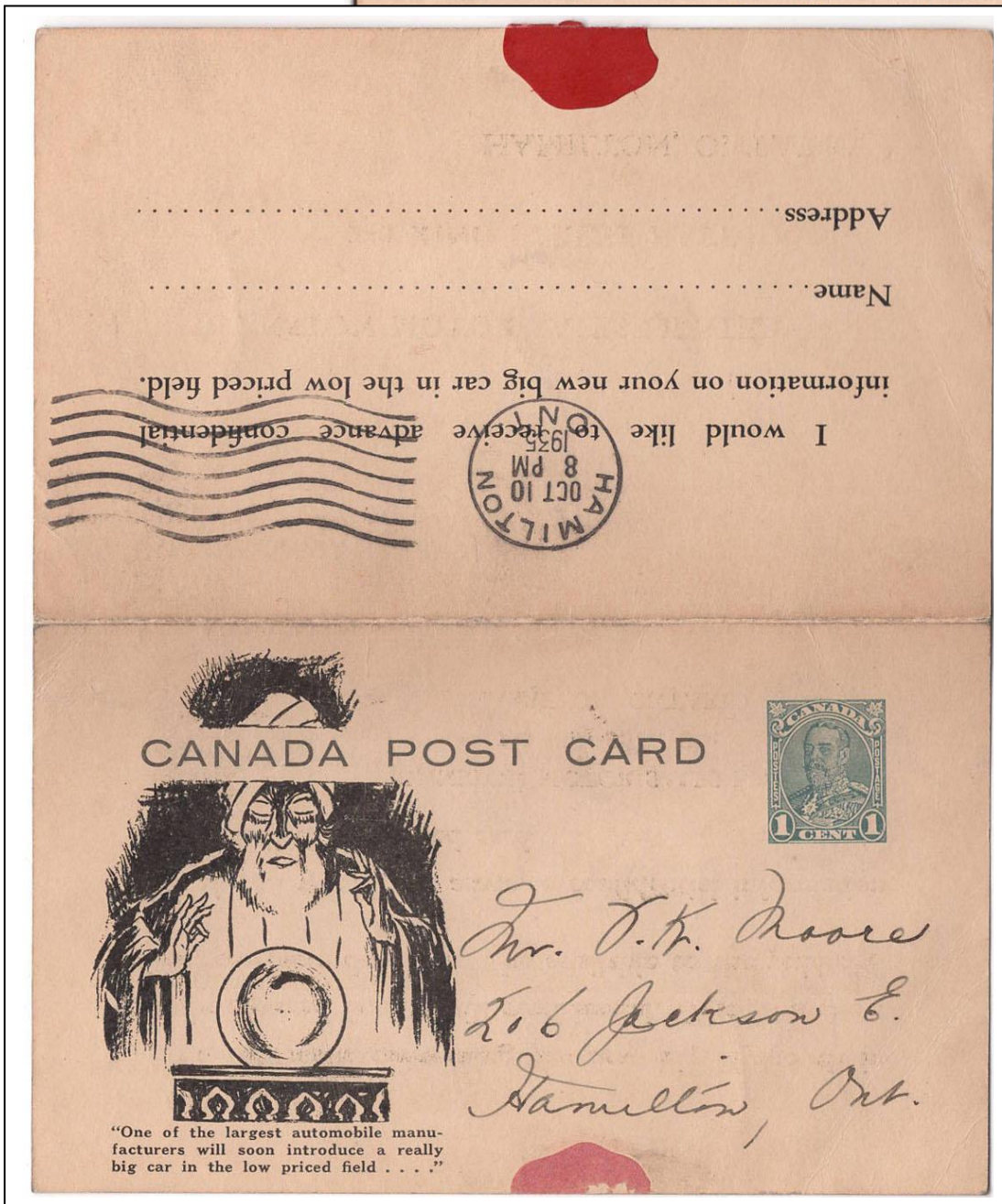

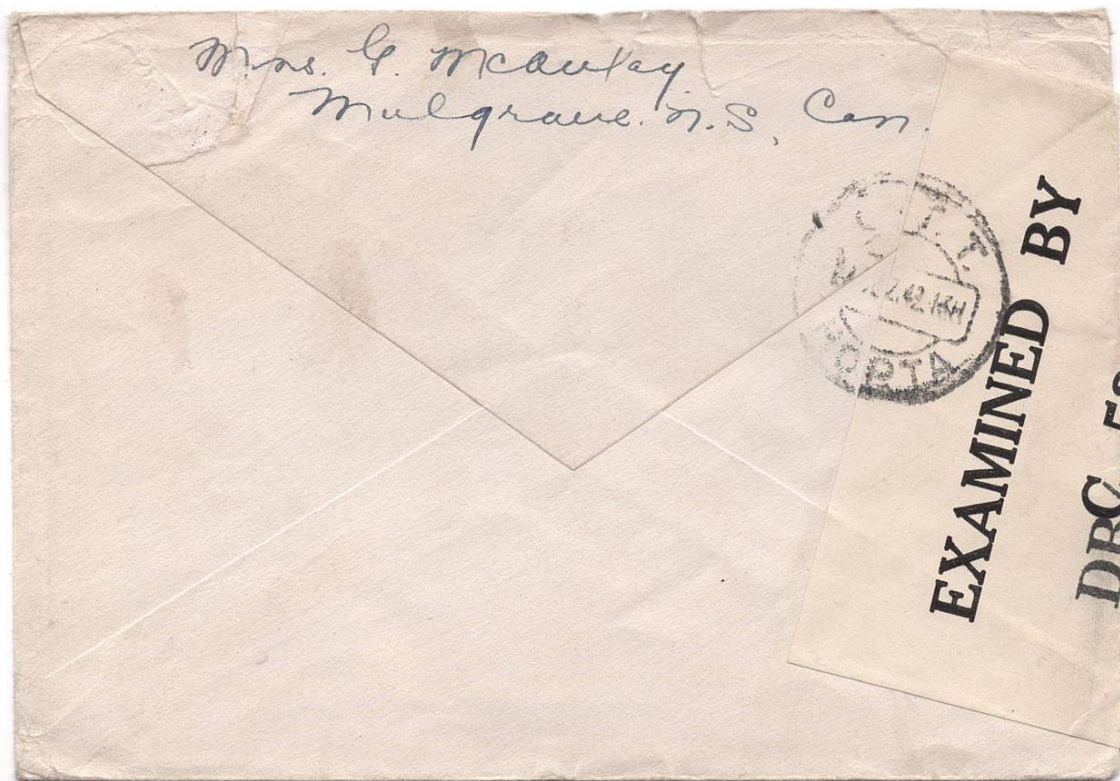
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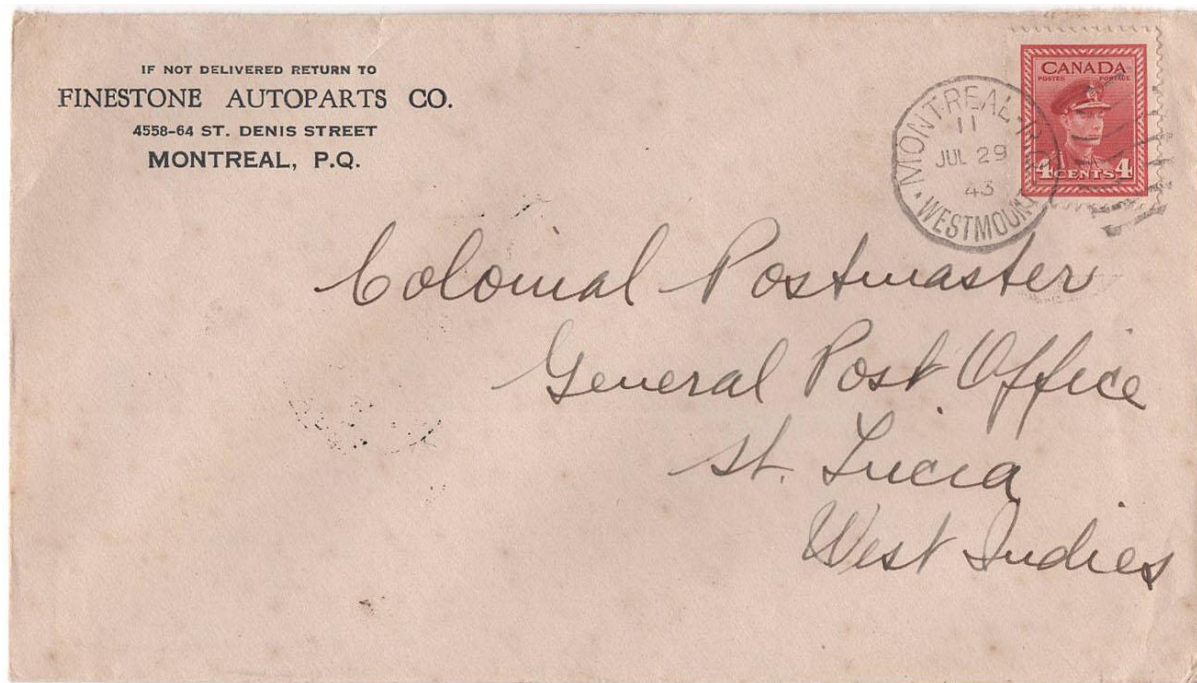
Item 667-28 – **Plymouth car and magic crystal ball** – 1935, 1¢ stationery card with ½¢ reply half attached, Webb P145, with magician studying crystal ball promoting the new big Plymouth car to be available at Johnston Motor Sales of Hamilton; local use. \$50.00



Item 667-29 – **10¢ Chamber single use on cover to Azores** – 1942, 10¢ Pictorial tied by Mulgrave N.S. cds on censored cover paying 10¢ airmail letter rate for 1 ounce to the Portuguese island of Fayal, Azores (b/s). Light staining and rough opening at top, slightly repaired. \$150.00



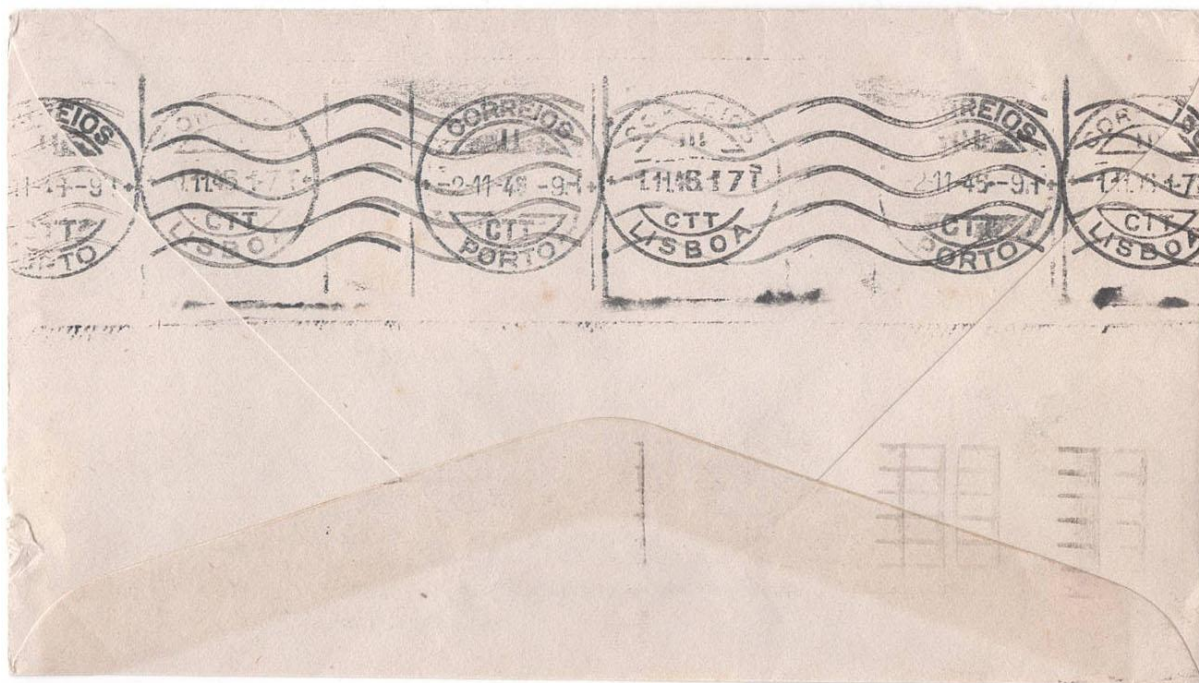
Item 667-30 – 4¢ Empire to Uganda, postage due– 1943, 3¢ War tied by Sherbrooke Que machine cancel on censored cover underpaying 4¢ Empire letter rate to Uganda, British East Africa (b/s). 2¢ postage due marking applied in Canada. Covers to Uganda in the 1940s are very scarce, the country being affected by wartime conditions and subsequent political disturbances. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 667-31 – **Montreal Westmount to St. Lucia** – 1943, 4¢ War tied by Montreal Westmount PQ duplex cancel on Finestone Autoparts Co. c/c cover paying 4¢ Empire letter rate to St. Lucia (b/s). Castries St. Lucia receiver dated SP 1 43. One-month surface transit. \$75.00



Item 667-32 – **Clarenceville Que airmail registered to Hong Kong** – 1938, 5¢ Mufti, 10¢ and 20¢ Pictorial tied by grid cancel on cover from Clarenceville Que with perfect Keyhole registration handstamp, paying 35¢ airmail registered letter rate to Hong Kong (b/s). Routed via Montreal, New York and San Francisco (b/s), not Vancouver. Kowloon receiver b/s with K8 handstamp on front. A scarce and particularly attractive registered airmail cover to Hong Kong. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 667-33 – 30¢ airmail letter rate to Portugal – 1946, 10¢, 20¢ War Issue tied by Toronto machine cancel on Brunswick c/c cover paying 30¢ airmail letter rate to Portugal. Brunswick was in the sporting goods and recreational marine business. \$50.00
