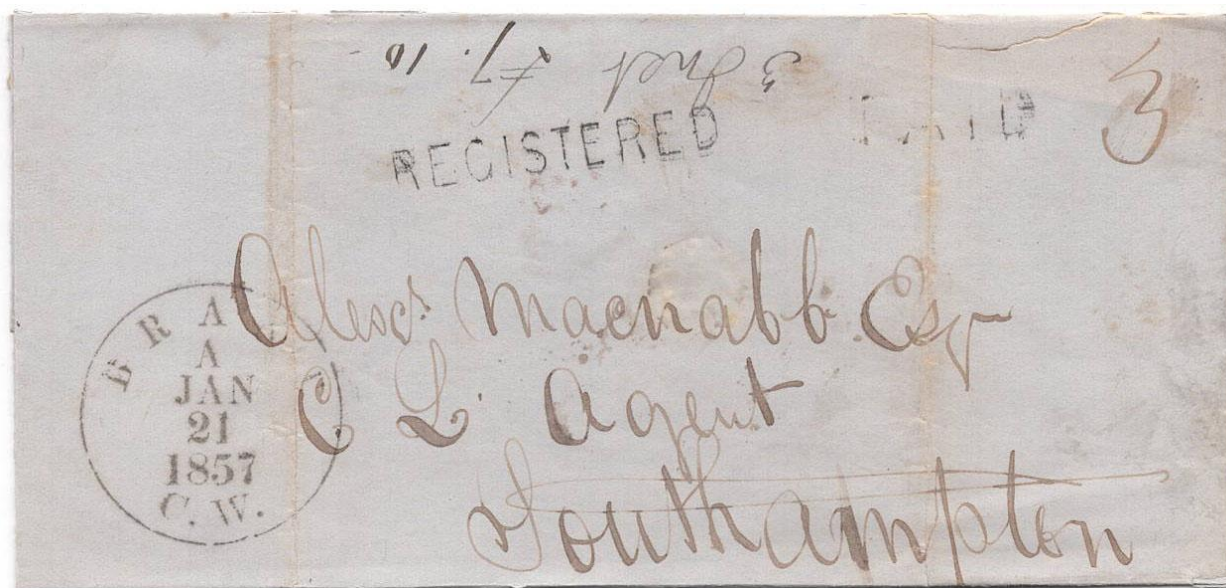

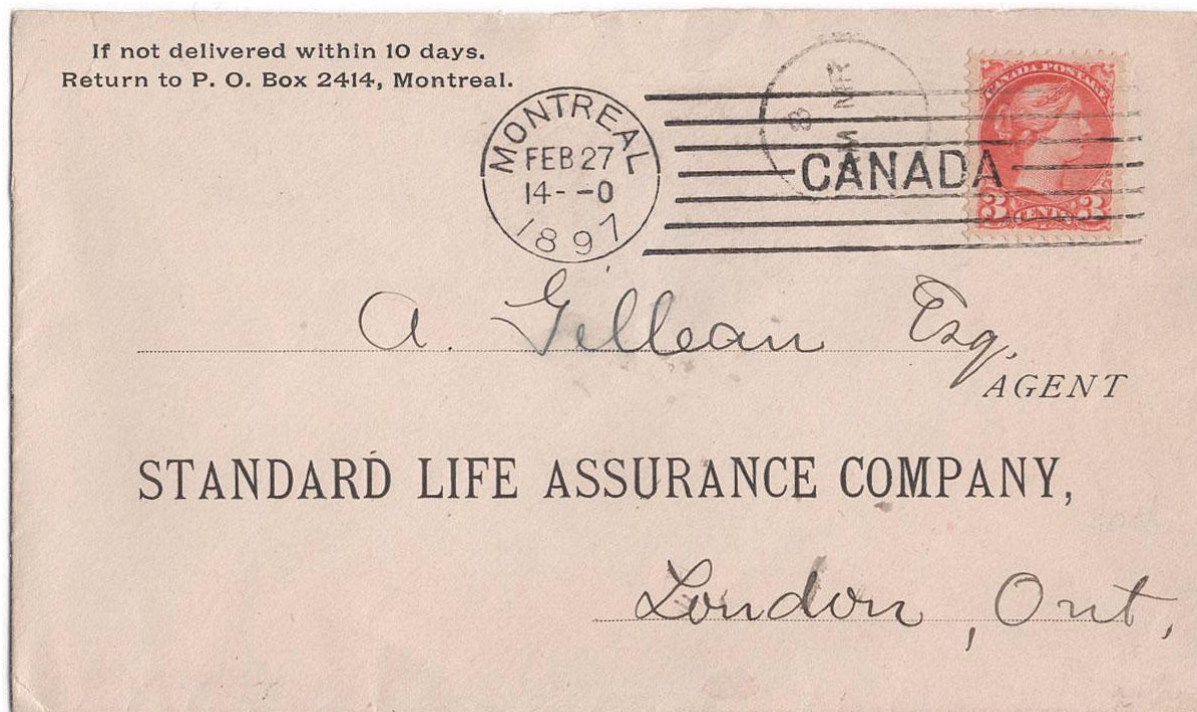
Item 670-01 – **Brant CW registered (Ruggles postmark)** – 1857, stampless folded registered cover from Brant CW, paid 3d to Southampton with the 2d registry fee paid in cash. Saugeen backstamp as customary on mail to Southampton. A very attractive cover with an almost perfect strike showing indicia A of this scarce Ruggles town postmark, recorded from 1856 to 1857. Ex Lussey (exhibit BNAPS book, p.18). According to Lussey, the replacing “*Reristered error*” instrument put in use sometime in 1856, early 1857. \$250.00



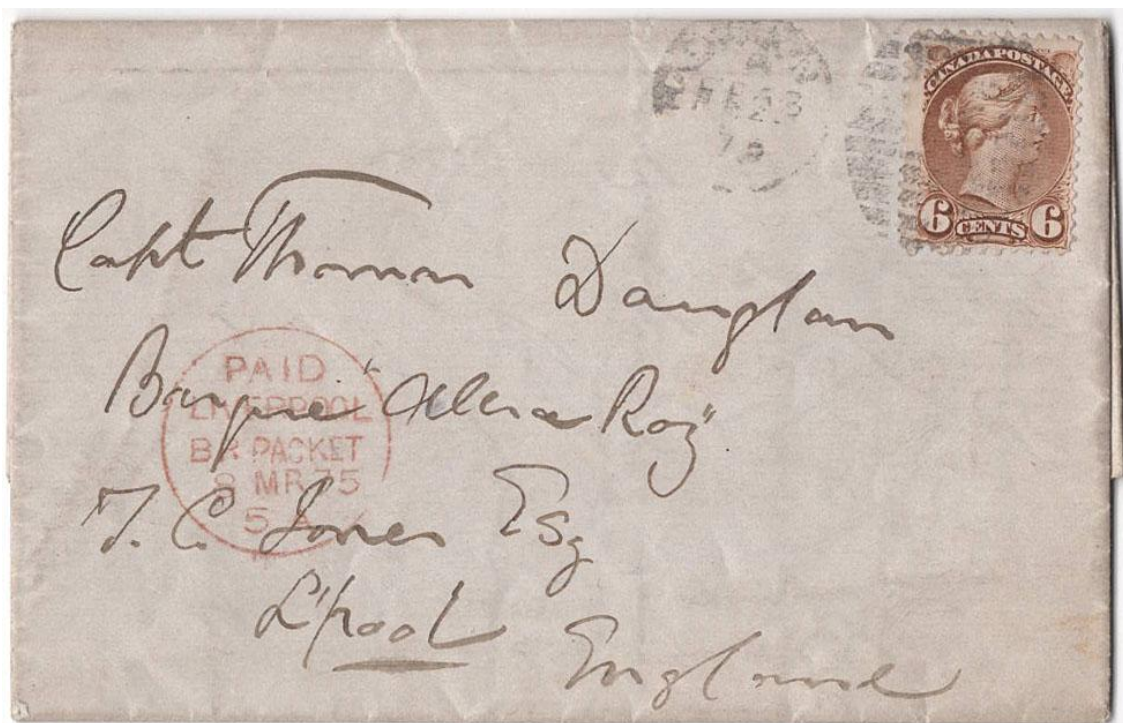
Item 670-02 – **Owen Sound CW (Ruggles postmark)** – 1861, stampless cover from Owen Sound CW, Ruggles postmark indicia B dated MY 22 61, paid 5d to Quebec (b/s). A lovely strike showing little wear for this late use, recorded from 1858 to 1867, though examples after 1862 are seldom encountered. The 25.5 mm hammer was also in service concurrently until the Berri order arrived in 1865. In theory, Owen Sound represents one of the longest periods of use among the seventeen Canada West Post Offices employing the Ruggles device (12 years) but in facts, possibly 1858 to 1861-2). \$200.00



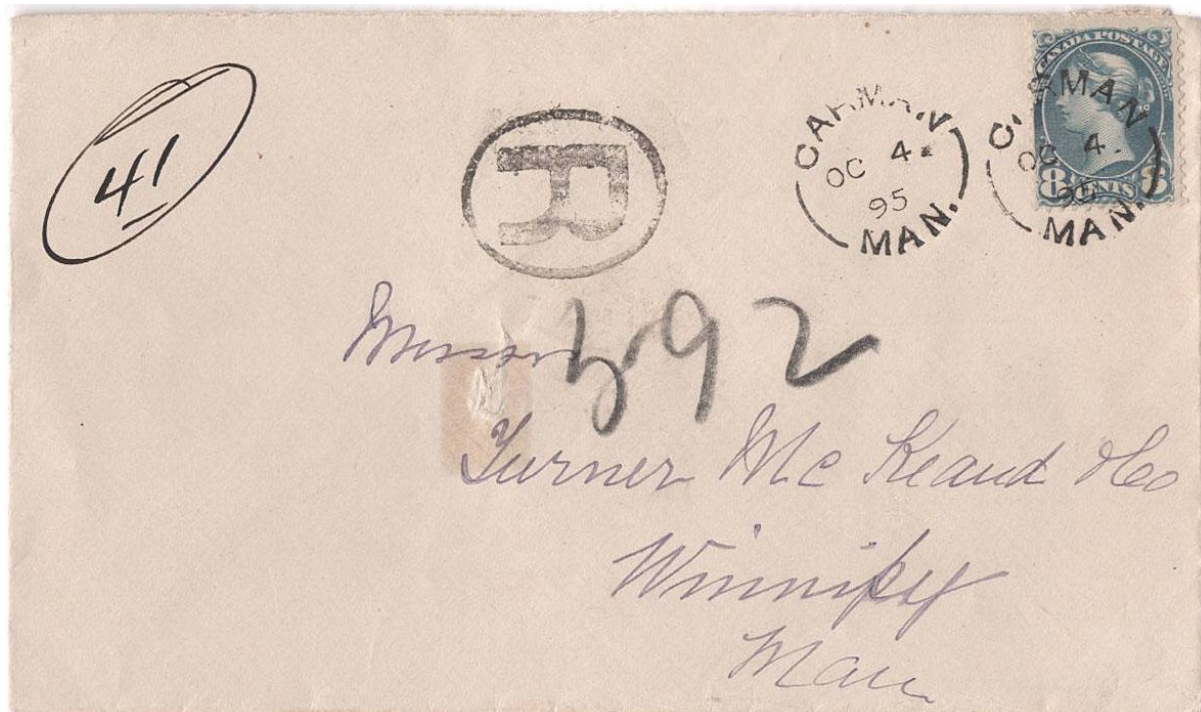
Item 670-03 – **Hamilton WCTU Concert and prohibition related** – 1893, 1¢ SQ tied by Hamilton cds on cover with WCTU Concert invitation card paying 1¢ drop letter rate. Delivered by letter carrier H JA 27 4 30. In 1893, Ontario held a provincial referendum on prohibition, a moment that galvanized temperance organizations across the province. In Hamilton, the Women's Christian Temperance Union stood out as one of the most influential branches in Canada, orchestrating an intensive campaign to sway public opinion. Their activities ranged from rallies and public lectures to so-called temperance concerts, events that used music and children's choirs to attract large audiences before delivering pointed political and moral appeals. These gatherings served as an effective vehicle for mobilizing voters and amplifying the WCTU's message during the referendum campaign. \$75.00 **SOLD**



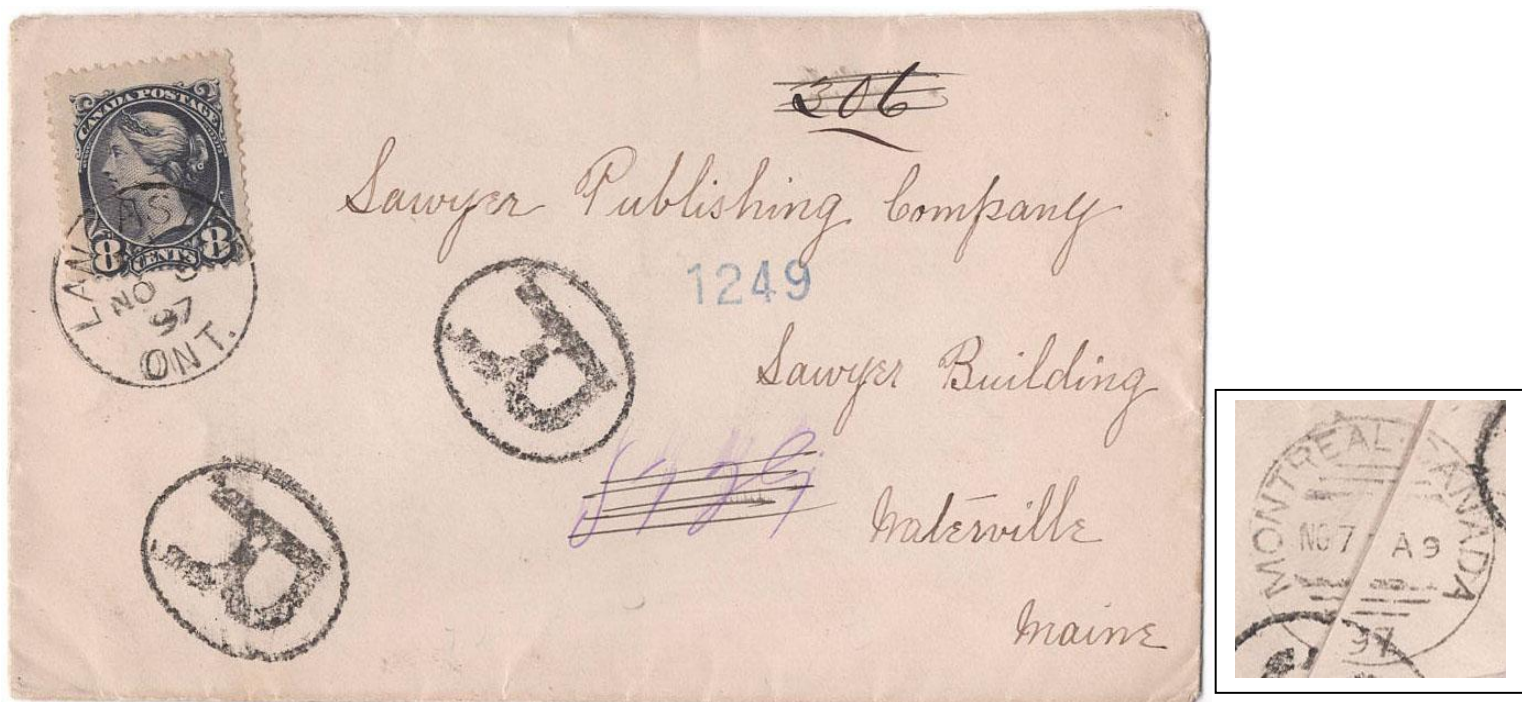
Item 670-04 – **Montreal Imperial machine M1** – 1897, 3¢ SQ tied by Montreal Imperial machine M1(b) cancel on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to London (b/s). The Montreal M1(b), within the Imperial machine sequence, is recorded from JA 30 97 to MR 30 97. An ordinary-looking usage at first glance, but in fact a very scarce machine marking. \$100.00



Item 670-05 – **6¢ Allan Line rate to Liverpool** – 1875, 6¢ SQ tied by Halifax NS duplex “H” cancel on banking folded letter paying 6¢ Allan Line letter rate to Liverpool. Paid Liverpool British Packet on front MR 8 75. Carried by Allan Line Peruvian from Portland to Liverpool. \$150.00



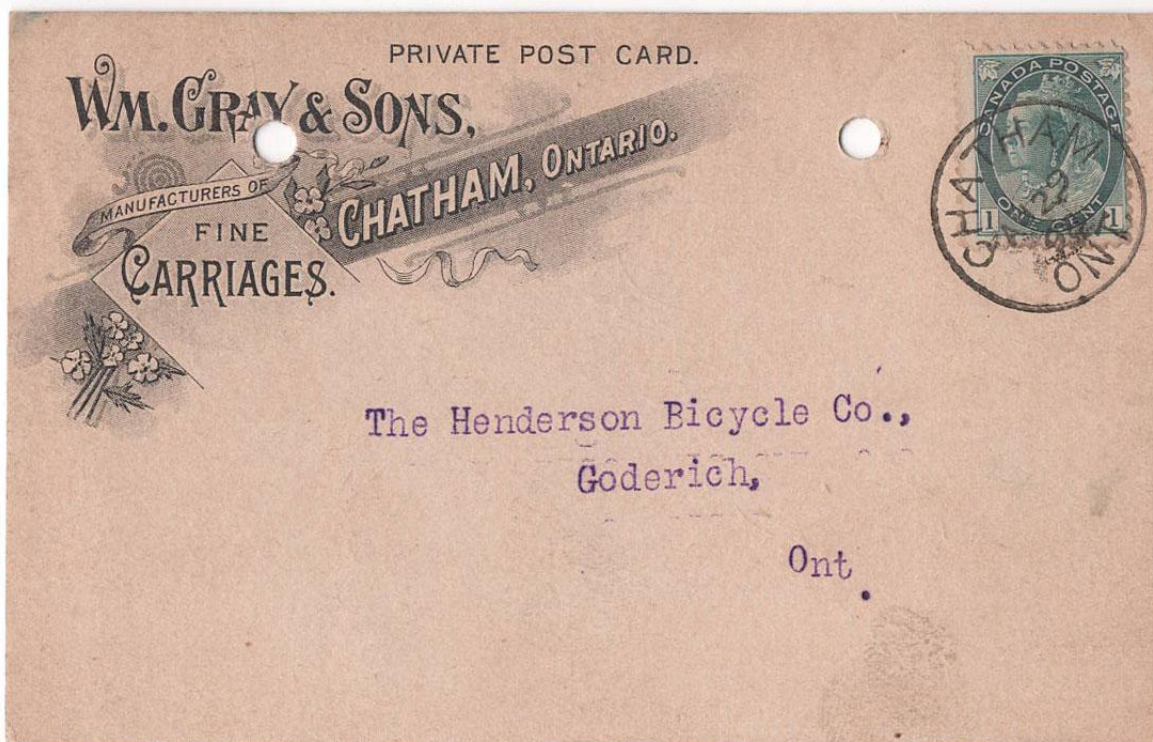
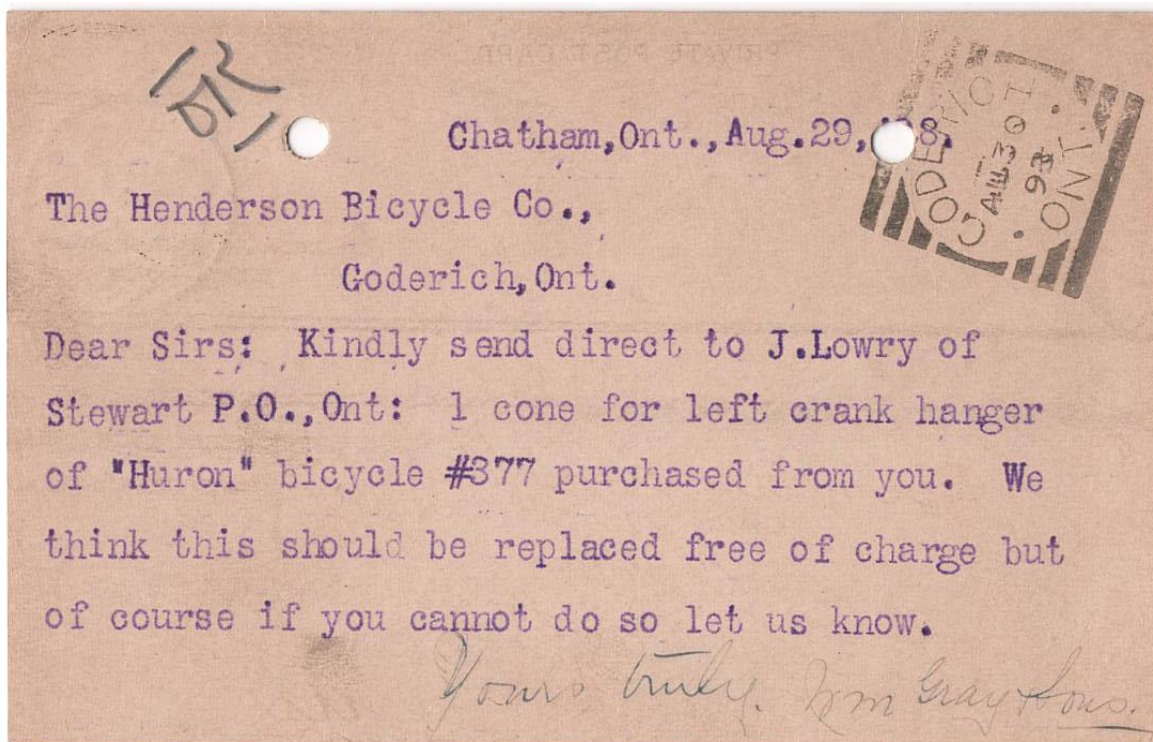
Item 670-06 – **Carman Manitoba registered** – 1895, 8¢ SQ tied by Carman Man broken circle on cover, OC 4 95, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Winnipeg (b/s). \$75.00 **SOLD**



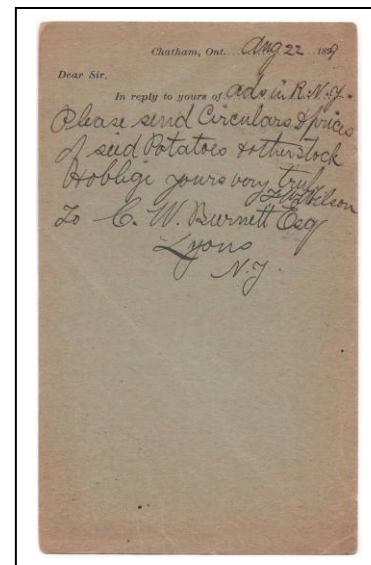
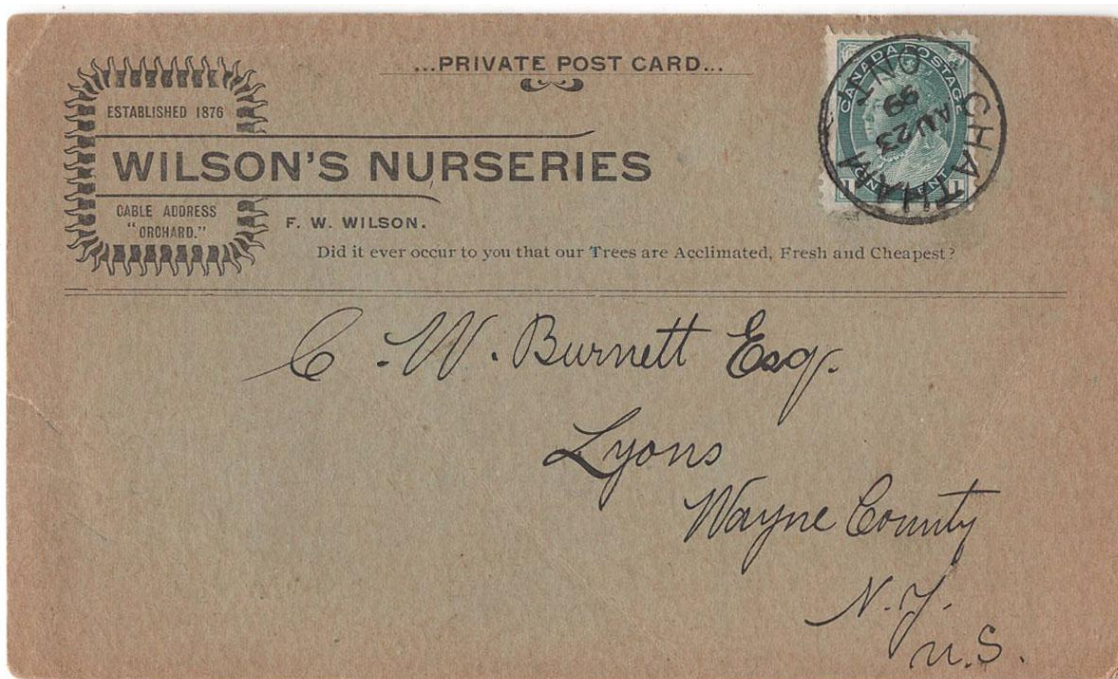
Item 670-07 – **Lancaster Ont registered** - 1897, 8¢ SQ tied by Lancaster Ont cds on cover, NO 5 97, paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Maine via Montreal (b/s). \$50.00 **SOLD**



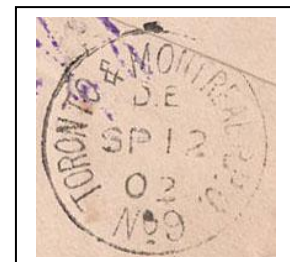
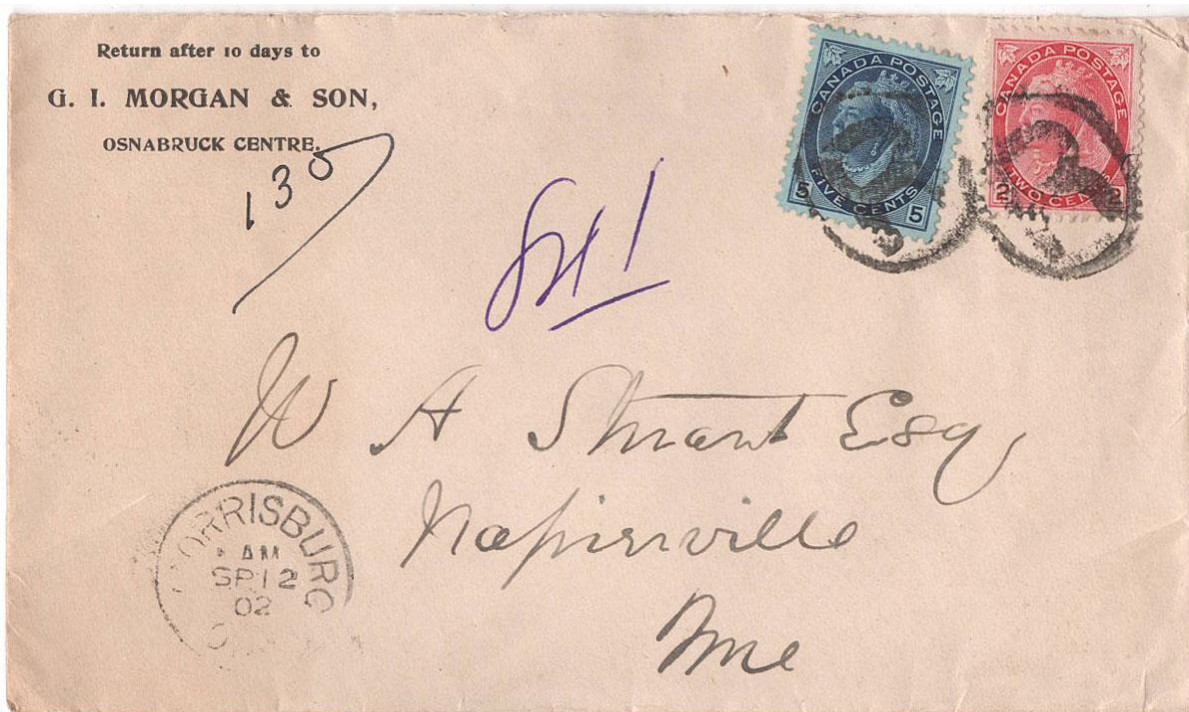
Item 670-08 – **Selkirk Manitoba registered to DLO** – 1885, 3¢ PSE with 2¢ RLS tied by pen cancel from Selkirk, Man., paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Middle Church, redirected to Winnipeg. Oval Registered Winnipeg Canada (b/s). Not called for and sent to the Dead Letter Office (b/s). A very pretty oval Winnipeg strike. \$100.00



Item 670-09 – Chatham Ontario fine carriages private card – 1898, 1¢ Numeral tied by Chatham, Ont. cds on William Gray & Sons, Manufacturers of Fine Carriages private postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to Goderich (squared b/s). Punch holes that can be easily hidden. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 670-10 – Chatham Nurseries private postcard – 1899, 1¢ Numeral tied by Chatham, Ont. cds on Wilson's Nurseries private postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to New York. Message refers to circular and seed potatoes. \$75.00



Item 670-11 – Osnabruk Centre and Morrisburg Ont – 1902, 2¢, 5¢ Numeral tied by oval registered cancel on G.I. Morgan & Son of Osnabruk Centre cover, mailed from Morrisburg, paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Napierville via Montreal (b/s). Carried by Toronto & Montreal No.9 RPO (b/s). \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 670-12 – **Nails and horseshoes** – 1892, 1¢ Numeral (2) tied by Montreal International machine cancel on Pillow & Hersey Manufacturing Co. advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to London (b/s). \$50.00



Item 670-13 – **Pelee Island North Ont (Essex 1896-1903)** – 1899, 5¢ Maple Leaf and 2¢ Numeral tied by Pelee Island North, Ont. broken circle on Rennie Seed cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Routed via Leamington (b/s). A rare Southern Ontario office, in operation from 1896 to 1903 only. \$200.00



Item 670-14 – **Sheridan Ont registered (Peel/Halton)** – 1902, 2¢, 5¢ Numeral tied by grid cancel on Toronto printer reply cover from Sheridan, Ont., partly printed advertising reply envelope, paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Carried by Toronto & Niagara Falls MC East (b/s). A scarce Peel County cover. \$75.00 **SOLD**



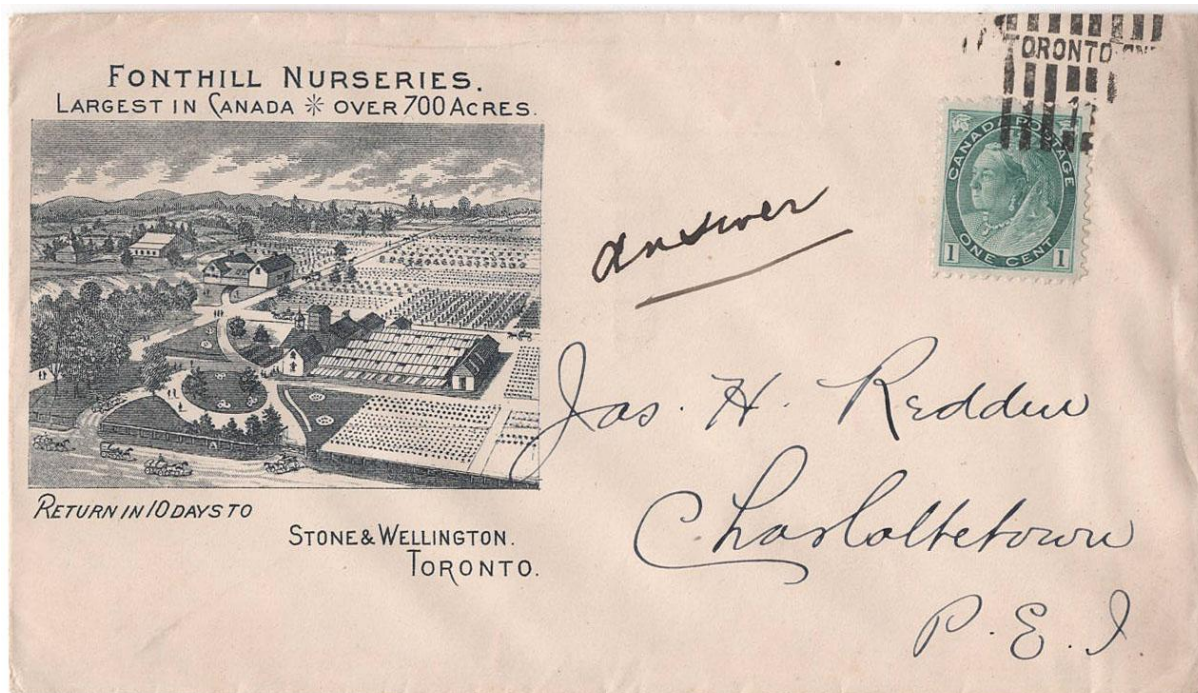
Item 670-15 – **Dorland Ont registered (L&A County)** – 1902, 1¢, 2¢ (3) tied by Dorland Ont broken circle on cover paying 7¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Routed via Napanee (b/s) and carried by Mont & Tor GTR (b/s). \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 670-16 – **10 GB covers to Aweme Manitoba (RF D)** – 1901–1904, group of ten GB covers from the Evelyn Criddle correspondence to Aweme, Manitoba (closed in 1917). Most bear the Aweme, Man., receiver (RF D) and Treesbank (RF C) transit marking. No contents. A pretty group of Aweme RF D covers. \$300.00



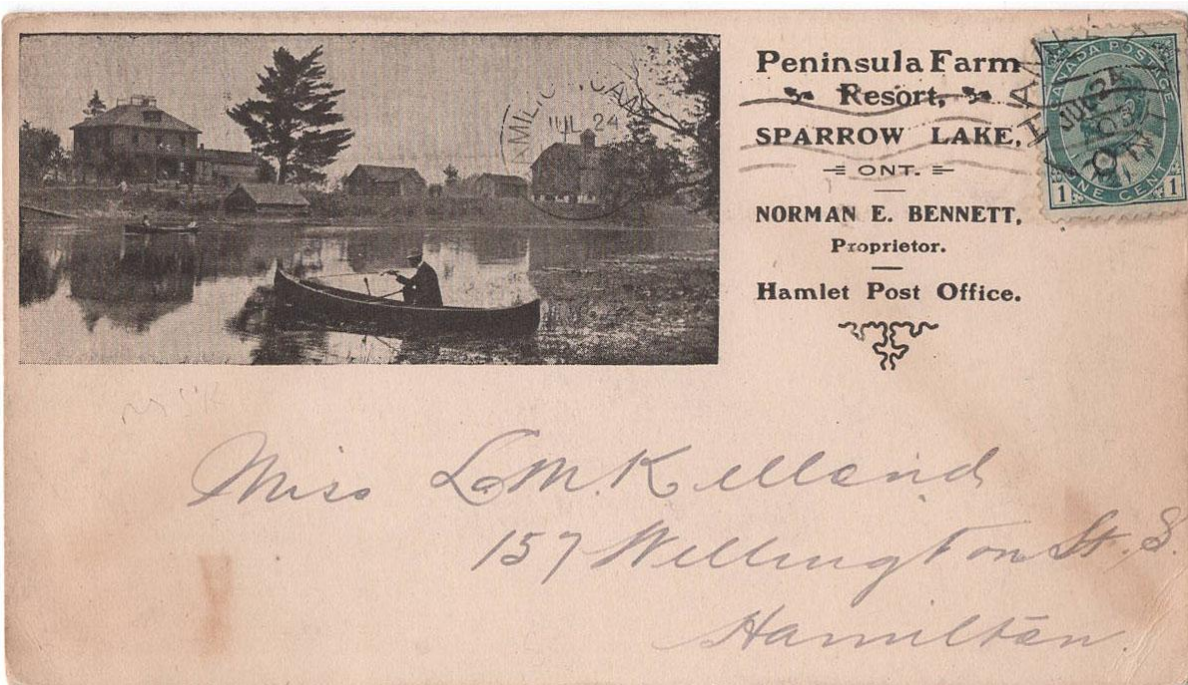
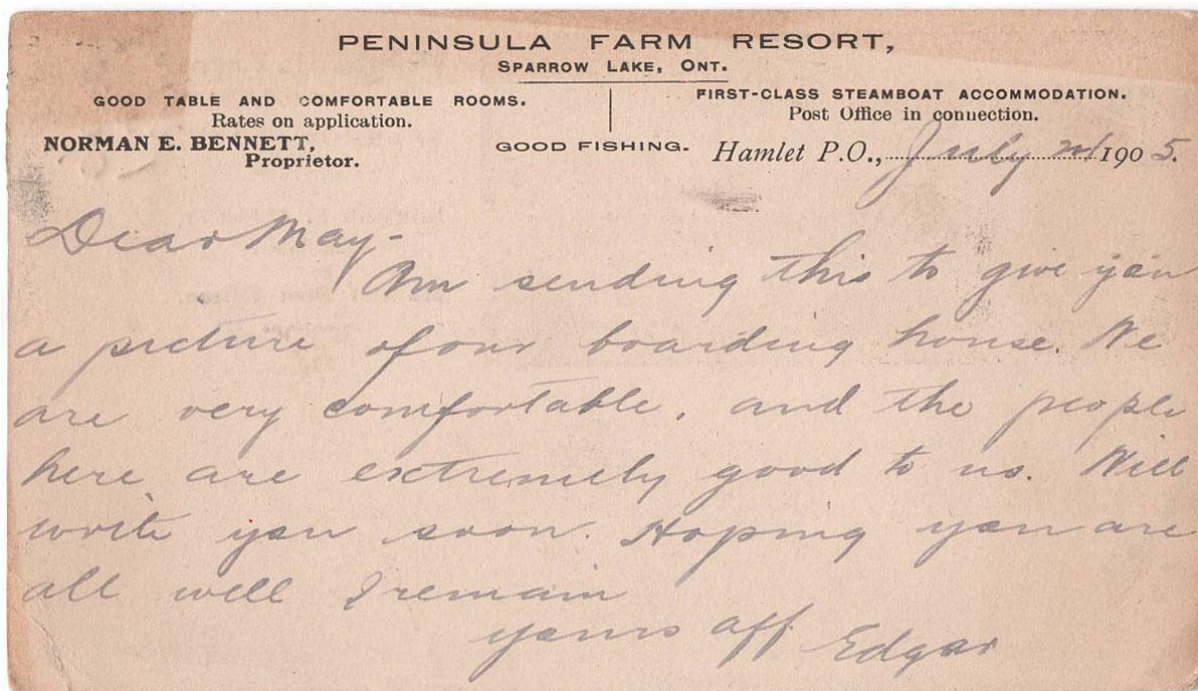
Item 670-17 – Port Kusam BC forged usages (lot of 4) – c.1910, lot of four Victorian-era cards and a cover with forged usages showing Port Kusam, B.C., broken circle. All fakes, but useful and attractive collateral material. \$75.00

Item 670-19 – **Eden Grove Ont, Carriage Manufacturer** – 1899, 2c Map tied by Harrisburg & Southampton MC cds on John Seiler Carriage advertising cover from Eden Grove, Ont., Bruce County, paying 2c letter rate to Palmerston (b/s). Addressed to the Palmerston Carriage Co. \$200.00



Item 670-20 – Peninsula Farm and Resort, Hamlet Ontario – 1905, 1¢ Edward (on the edge) tied by Hamlet, Ont. broken circle on Peninsula Farm and Resort advertising private postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to Hamilton (receiver on front). \$150.00

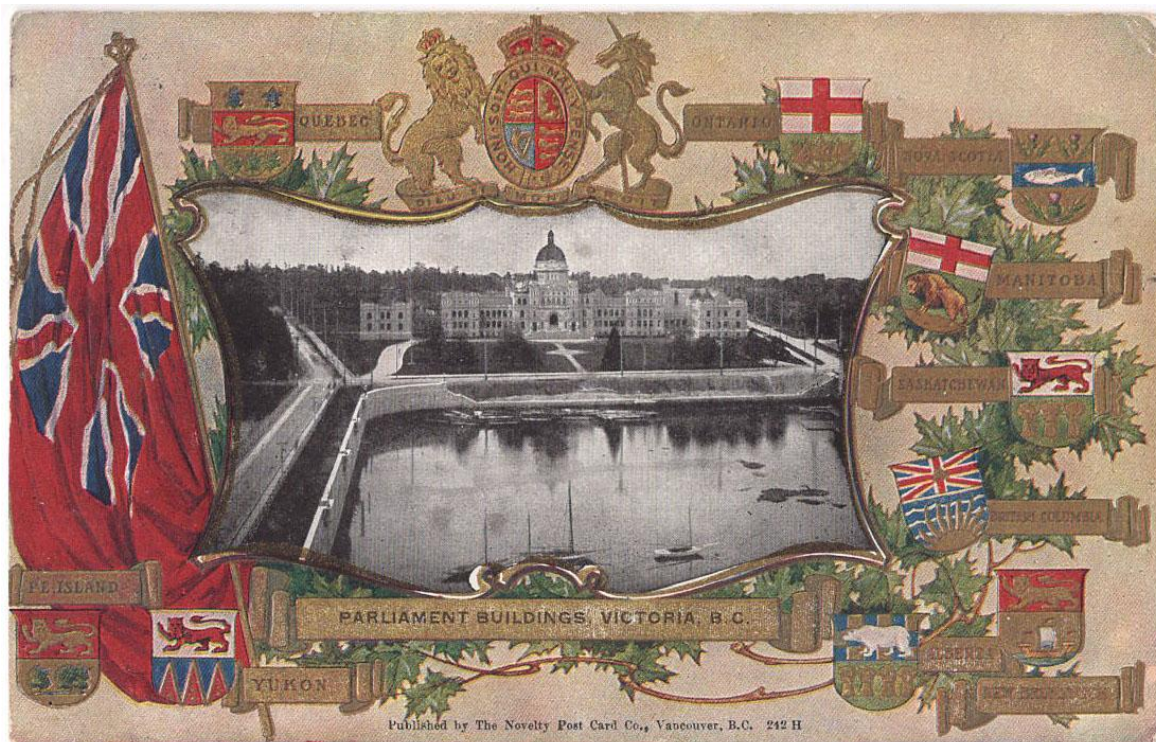
Item 670-21 – **Paints and Varnishes, St. John NB** – 1905, 2¢ Edward tied by Saint John, N.B., International machine cancel on Monarch Paints and Varnishes advertising cover for James Roberson Co., paying 2¢ letter rate to Moncton (b/s). \$150.00



Item 670-22 – **Medicine Valley Alta (RF E, 1909-1914)** – 1905, 1¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on postcard from Medicine Valley, Alta., paying 1¢ postcard rate to Somerset, N.S. Medicine Valley is an RF E office, in operation from 1909 to 1914. \$150.00



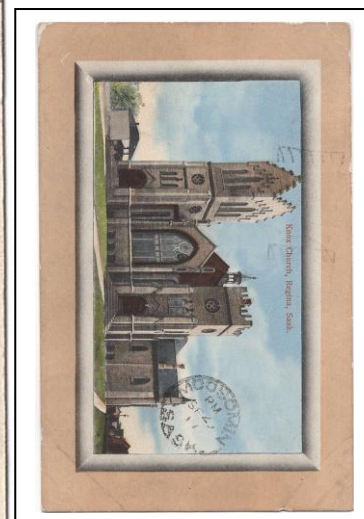
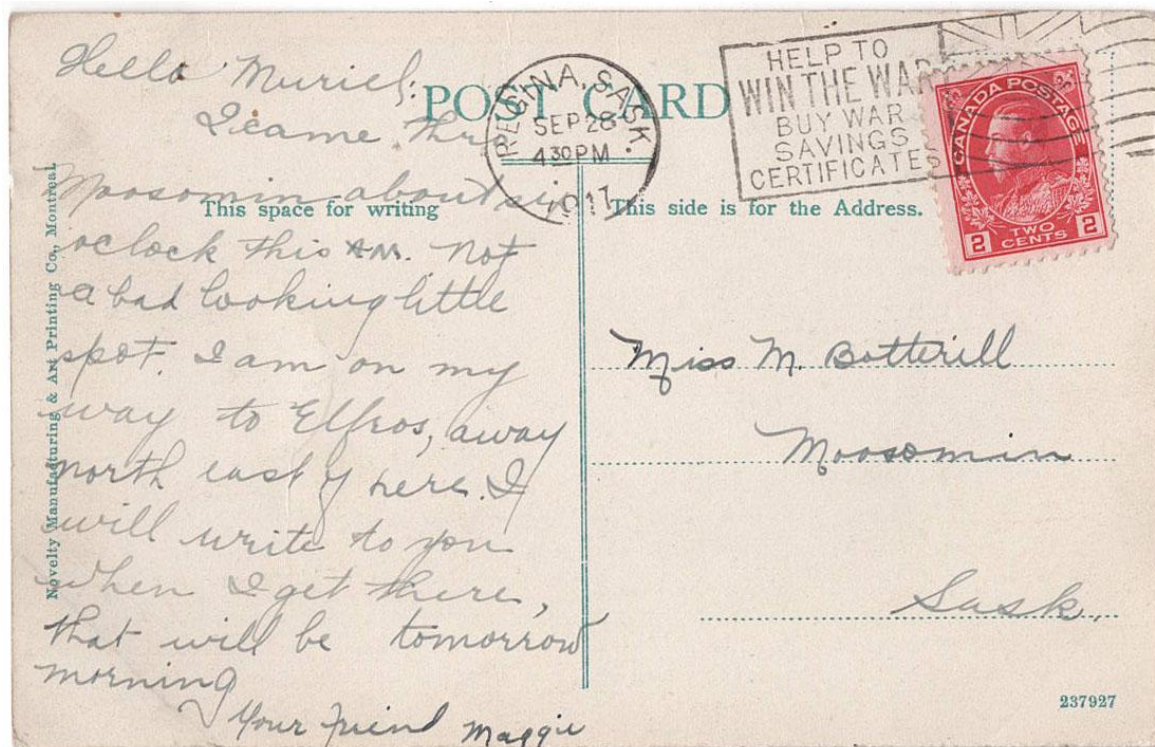
Item 670-23 – **5¢ UPU letter rate to Norway** – 1906, 5¢ Edward tied by Montreal International machine cancel on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Norway (b/s). \$150.00



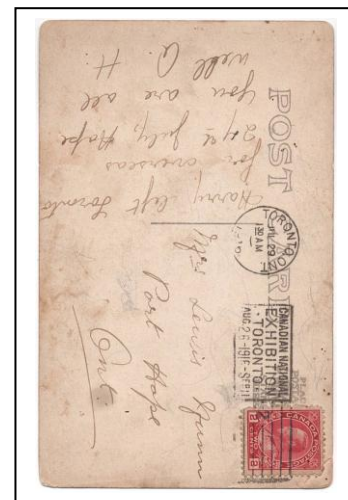
Item 670-24 – **Grove Avenue Ont (Pelee Island, Essex County)** – 1910, U.S. 1¢ Franklin tied by Columbus, Ohio, duplex cancel on Canadian patriotic Warwick Rutter postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to Pelee Island (receiver), then to Grove Avenue, the post office next door. A rare Essex County office, in operation from 1908 to 1911 only (closed OC 13 1911). \$150.00



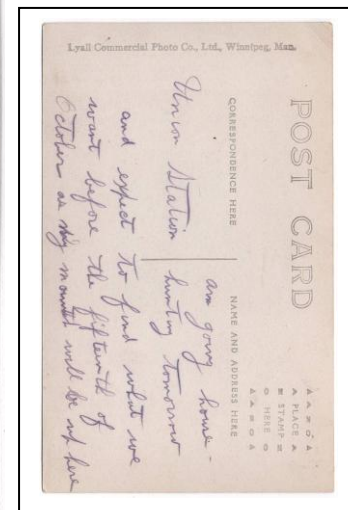
Item 670-25 – **Calgary flag cancel 23-1** – 1917, 1¢ Admiral (2) tied by Calgary flag cancel 23-1 on postcard paying 2¢ postcard rate to Victoria. *Help to Win the War / Buy War Savings Certificates*. Very scarce. \$75.00



Item 670-26 – **Regina Sask flag cancel 21-2** – 1917, 2¢ Admiral tied by Regina Sask flag cancel 21-2 on postcard paying 2¢ postcard rate to Moosomin. *Help to Win the War / Buy War Savings Certificates*. Rare. \$125.00



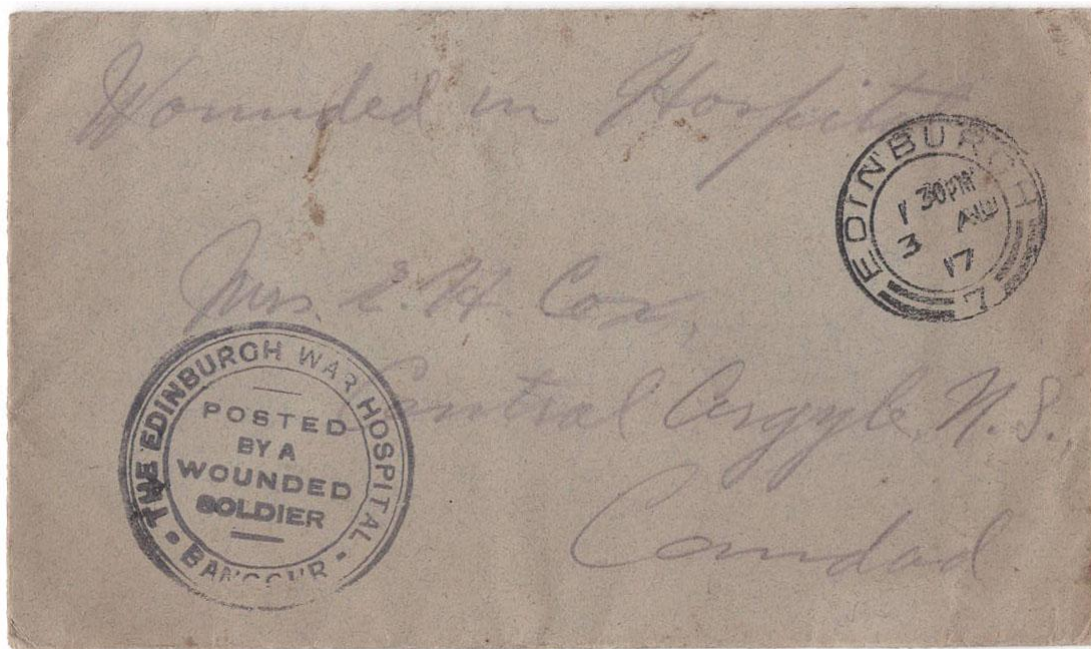
Item 670-27 – **Signal Company 123rd Battn CEF Toronto** – 1916, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto machine cancel on Signal Company 123rd CEF real photo postcard paying 2¢ postcard rate to Port Hope. *B Class Company Signal and 123rd Overseas Battn CEF Toronto*. A very attractive photo showing a signal troop with their flags. A rare RCCS related postcard. \$150.00 **SOLD**



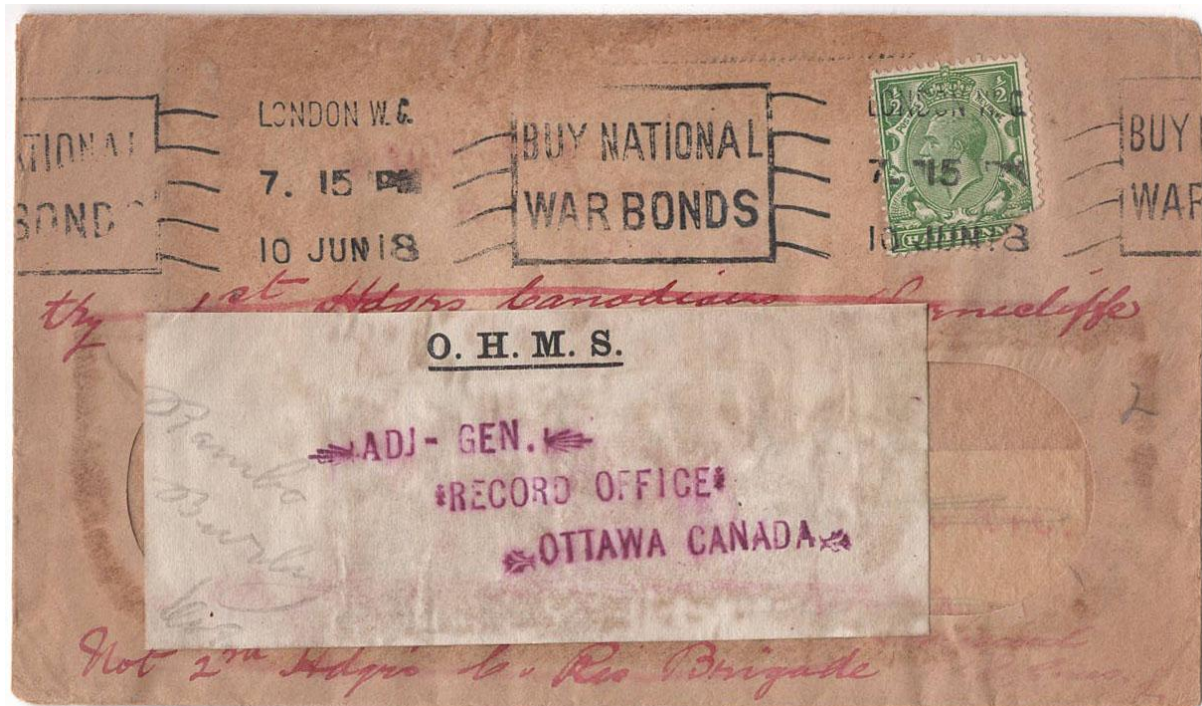

Item 670-29 – **14¢ Empire registered to England** – 1921, 7¢ Admiral (2) tied by oval registered handstamp on cover from Toronto Station L, paying 14¢ Empire registered letter rate to Leeds, England. Keyhole precursor registration handstamp in purple, with registry cross in blue crayon. \$150.00



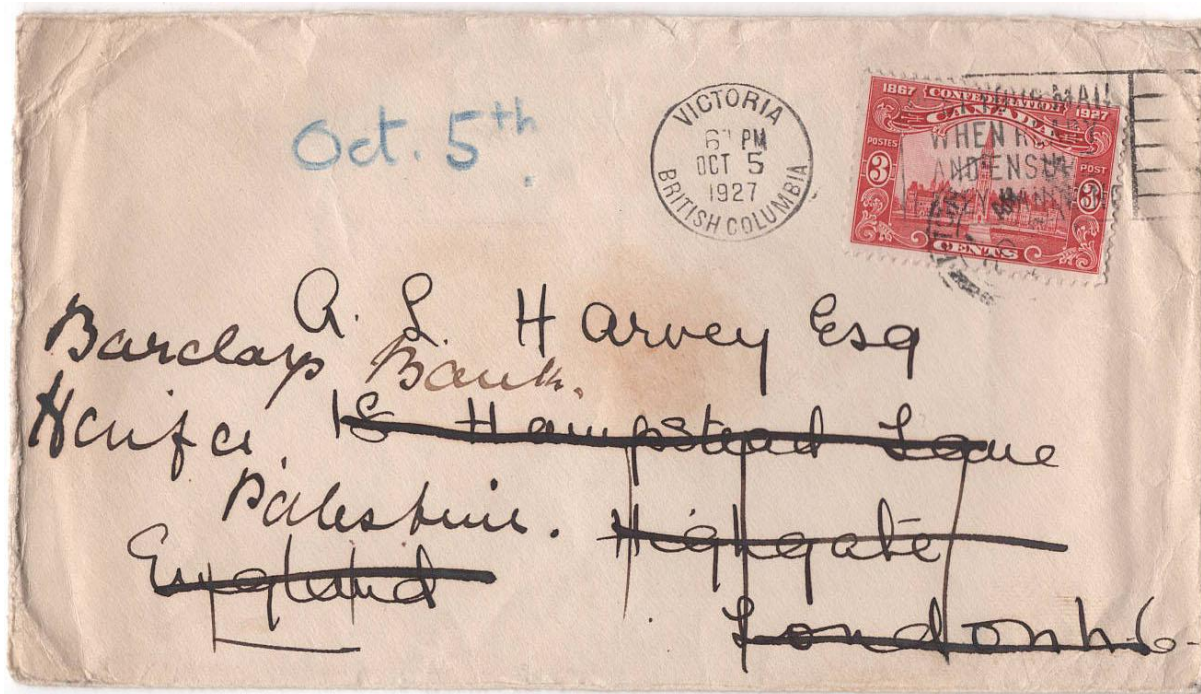
Item 670-30 – **Posted by a Wounded Soldier** – 1917, OAS cover from Edinburgh with *Edinburgh War Hospital* handstamp Posted by a Wounded Soldier, with hospital endorsement, addressed to Central Argyle, N.S. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 670-31 – **Canadian Base Shorncliffe** – 1918, GB ½d (pre-affixing fault) tied by War Bonds machine cancel on window cover paying the Empire printed-matter rate to Burlington, Ont. (b/s). Reverse with rare Canadian Base Shorncliffe datestamp JU 20 18 and the scarce Canadian Recorded Office Postal Despatched JU 25 18. Once in Canada, redirected twice and ultimately sent to the National Adjutant General Record Office in Ottawa. \$100.00 **SOLD**



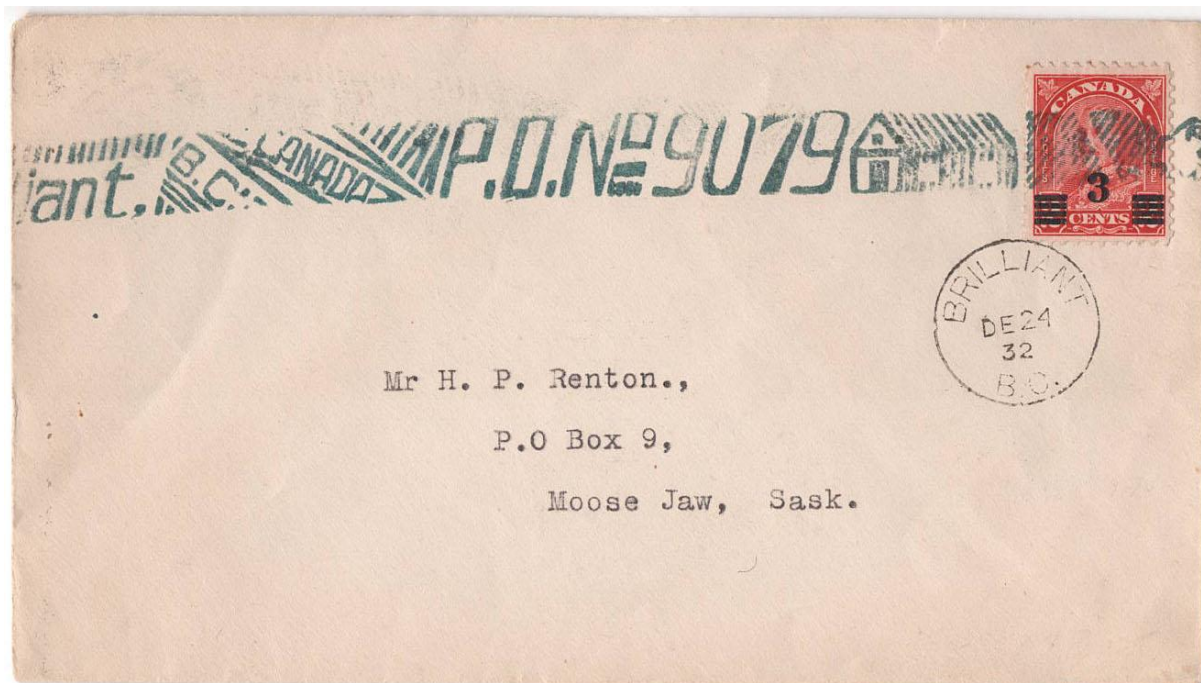
Item 670-32 – **Domestic airmail registered Pelee Island to Anticosti** – 1928, 2¢, 12¢ Confederation tied by Pelee Island Ont. cds on cover paying 14¢ double-weight domestic airmail registered letter rate to Port Menier, Anticosti Island (b/s). Routed via London, carried by Mont & Tor RPO No. 16, then via Montreal and Quebec. Unclaimed and returned to sender in Portland, Oregon (b/s). An obvious philatelic-origin cover, but a spectacular and seldom-encountered double-weight airmail registered domestic rate. \$150.00



Item 670-33 – **3¢ Empire to Haifa, Holy Land** – 1927, 3¢ Confederation tied by Victoria, B.C., machine cancel on CPR B.C. Coast Steamship Service cover paying 3¢ Empire letter rate to Highgate, London, England. Redirected to Haifa, Holy Land, with OC 27 27 receiver (b/s). No postage due, as it was forwarded to territory under the British Mandate for Palestine. A rare Confederation Issue cover. \$300.00



Item 670-34 – **18¢ UPU registered to Austria** – 1929, 5¢ Confederation, 1¢, 2¢ (2), 8¢ Scroll tied by Montreal, P.Q., Delorimier cds on cover paying 18¢ UPU registered letter rate to Austria. Montreal and Montreal B&F transits (b/s). A lovely four-colour franking combining Scroll and Laurier issues. \$125.00



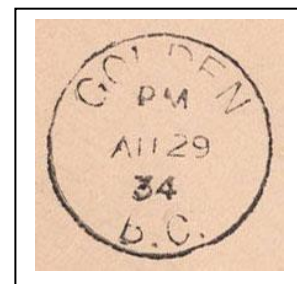
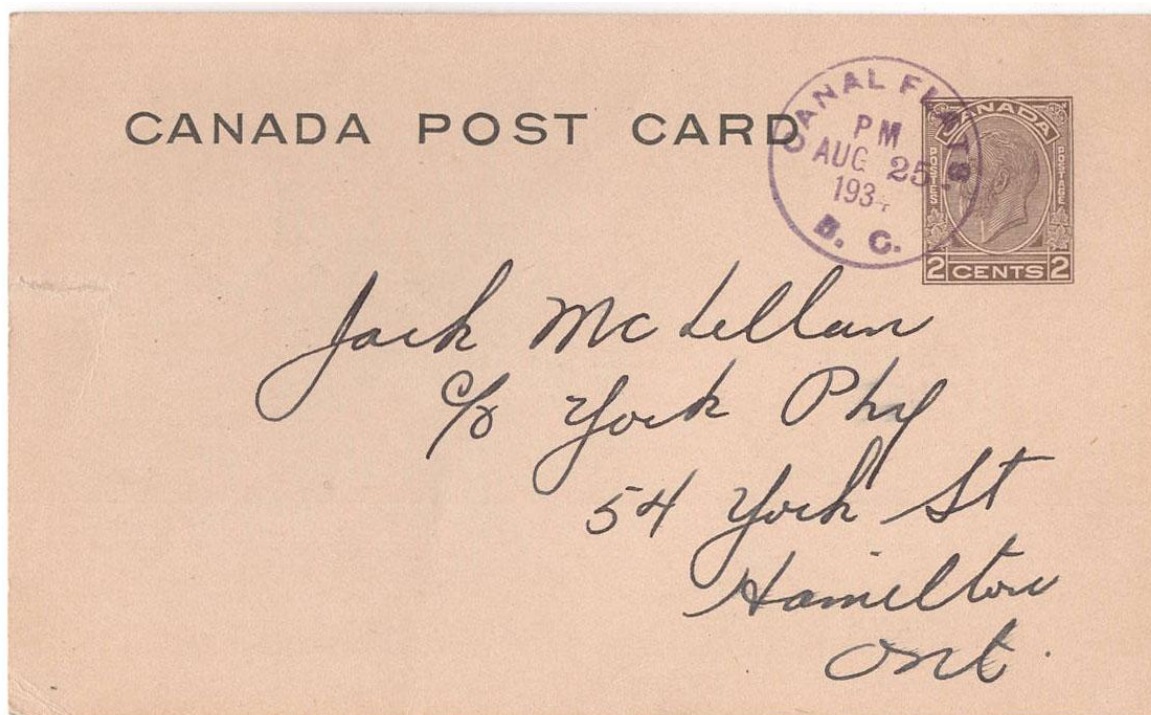
Item 670-35 – **Dukabour fancy cancel (Lacelle 310)** – 1929, 3¢ Arch Provisional tied by Doukhobor fancy cancel on philatelic cover from Brilliant, B.C., paying 3¢ letter rate to Moose Jaw. This roller cancel depicts a Doukhobor house along with traditional headwear and beard. According to Lacelle, the Doukhobors were a mid-European religious sect that settled in the area. The postmaster was P. A. Katasonoff, and most recorded uses are philatelic. It is a famous one! \$200.00



Item 670-36 – **Hamilton Crown Point registered** – 1932, 12¢ Arch tied by boxed Hamilton Crown Point handstamp on cover, with cds and registered markings free strikes, paying 12¢ drop registered letter rate. From 1905 to 1992, this sub-office opened and closed eleven times. A scarce Hamilton 1930s cover. \$50.00



Item 670-37 – **World's Grain Exhibition Conference 203** – 1933, 20¢ World's Grain Exhibition Conference tied by Ottawa, Canada cds on cover, dated AU 17 33, paying 20¢ quintuple-weight printed-matter registered rate to New York (b/s). The condition and edge wear suggest the enclosure was a thick document, booklet, or pamphlets. The Regina conference took place from July 24 to August 5, 1933, during the Great Depression. Although sent from the Financial Branch, P.O. Dept., Philatelic Section, this is a fully legitimate use of the Regina 1933 stamp. If assessed under the letter-rate table, the franking corresponds to the 19¢ quadruple-weight registered letter rate to the U.S. (3¢+2¢+2¢+2¢+10¢), with a 1¢ convenience overpayment. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 670-38 – **Canal Flats BC MOOD cancel** – 1934, 2¢ Medallion stationery card mailed from Canal Flats BC, MOOD handstamp dated AU 25 34, paying 2¢ postcard rate to Hamilton. Reverse totally blank with Golden BC transit (b/s). This postmark was produced by Pritchard and Andrews of Ottawa. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 670-39 – **5¢ UPU to Sweden, T20, 200re** – 1936, 3¢ Pictorial tied by Gardenvale PQ duplex cancel on cover underpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Sweden. Assessed and taxed 20 centimes, converted in Sweden to 20 öre postage due, paid by a 5 öre coil strip of four. A nice Montreal-Island cover. \$125.00 **SOLD**



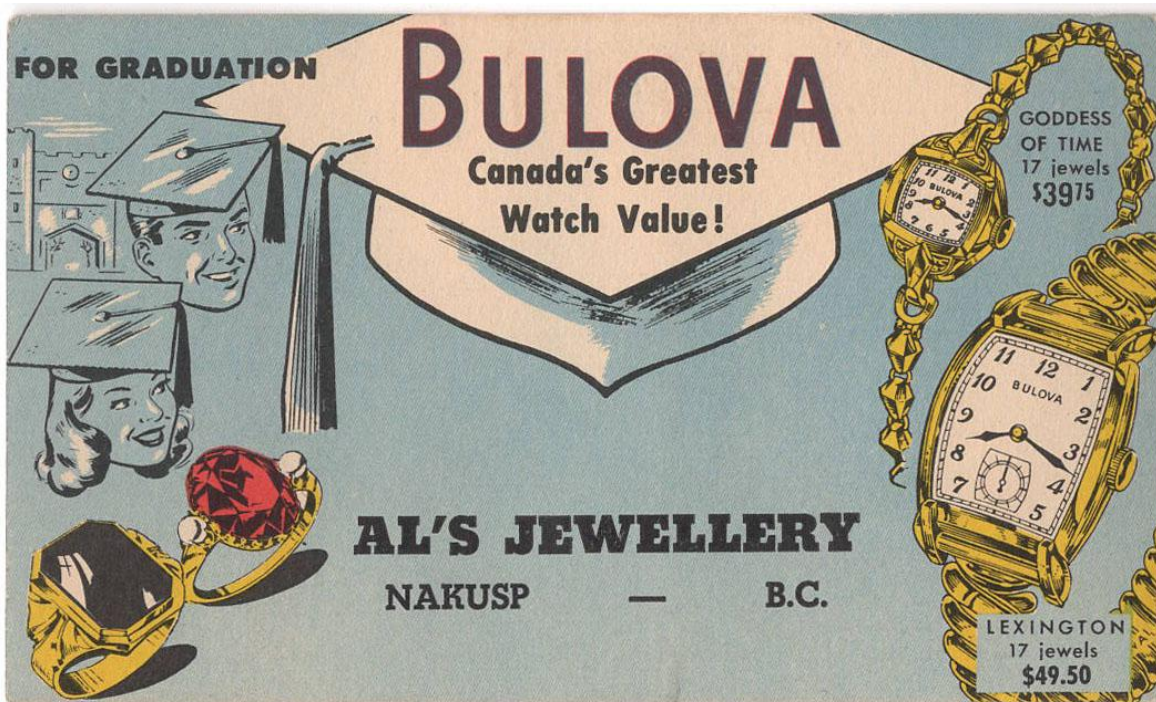

Item 670-41 – Nakusp BC Bulova and Jewellery – c.1938, 1c GEOVI stationery card, unused, reverse with Bulova Watch and Jewellery advertising from Nakusp, B.C. Hinge residue. \$50.00 **SOLD**

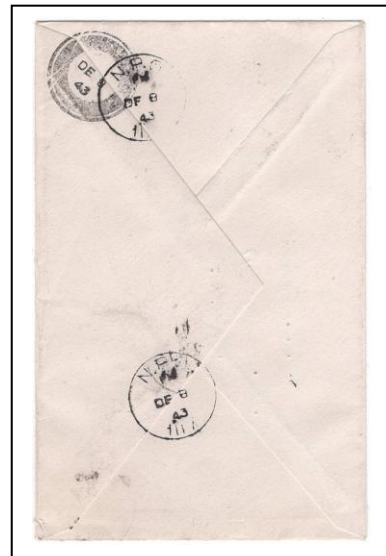

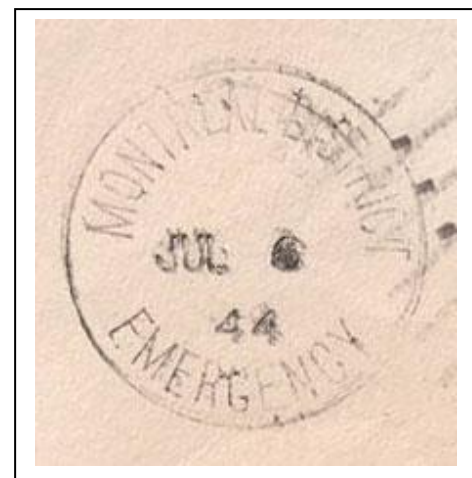

Item 670-42 – **Hudson's Bay "Parcel for the Boys"** – 1944, Edmonton HBC mailing dated MY 29 44 comprising cover with 4¢ meter paying letter rate to Jarvis (b/s), the mail-order form, the retail-store letter signed with overseas parcel suggestions, and, most importantly, the pre-formatted package list detailing items, postage, and insurance. A spectacular, all-original archive seldom encountered on the market. An exceptional ensemble for an exhibitor or for the collector who has everything and can't find something new to add to his collection. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 670-43 – **NPO 1117 registered (West Coast Naval HQ)** – 1943, 3¢ and 10¢ War tied by NPO 1117 cds on cover, censored with DB/N 770 handstamp, paying 13¢ registered drop-letter rate. Blackout transit on reverse. NPO 1117 was the West Coast Naval Headquarters in Vancouver. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 670-44 – **Montreal District Emergency on RCN cover** – 1944 HMCS cover entered at Halifax with blackout machine cancel and censor DBN/95, addressed to Sutton Junction, Quebec.
