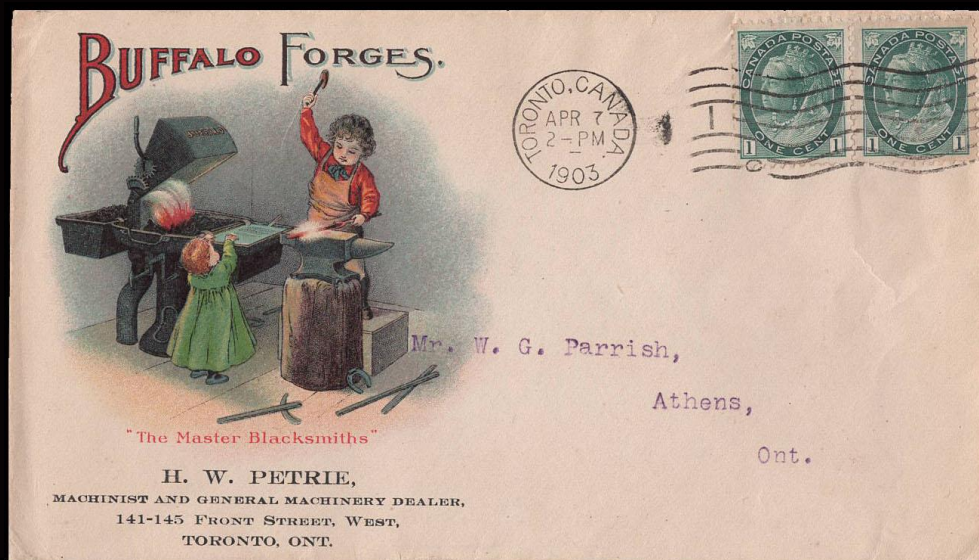

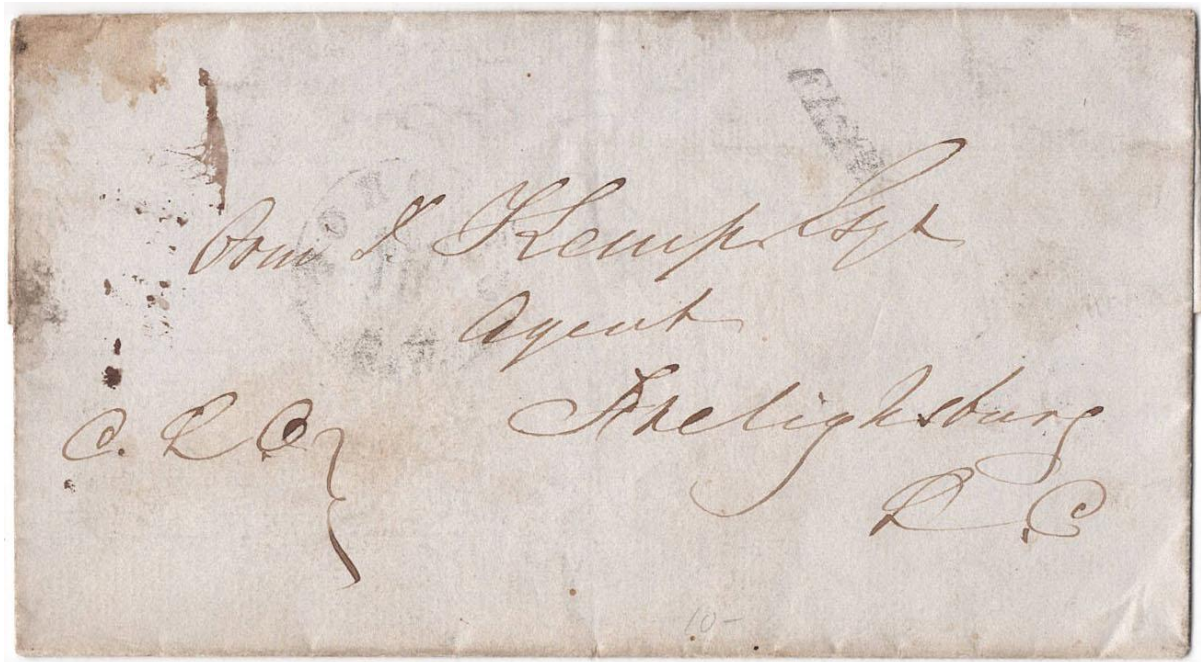

Item 671-01 – **Crown Land Toronto to Frelighsburg CE** – 1857, Crown Land Department free-franked cover from Toronto to Frelighsburg CE, via Montreal, St. John CE (Ruggles indicia A) and Dunham (b/s). Light edge staining. \$75.00



Item 671-02 – **Rockton CW to New York State (Wentworth)** – 1861, stampless cover from Rockton, CW; superb strike with manuscript date, paid 10¢ with Canada Paid Cts exchange marking paying the letter rate to Warsaw, NY. Routed via Hamilton (b/s). \$125.00 **SOLD**



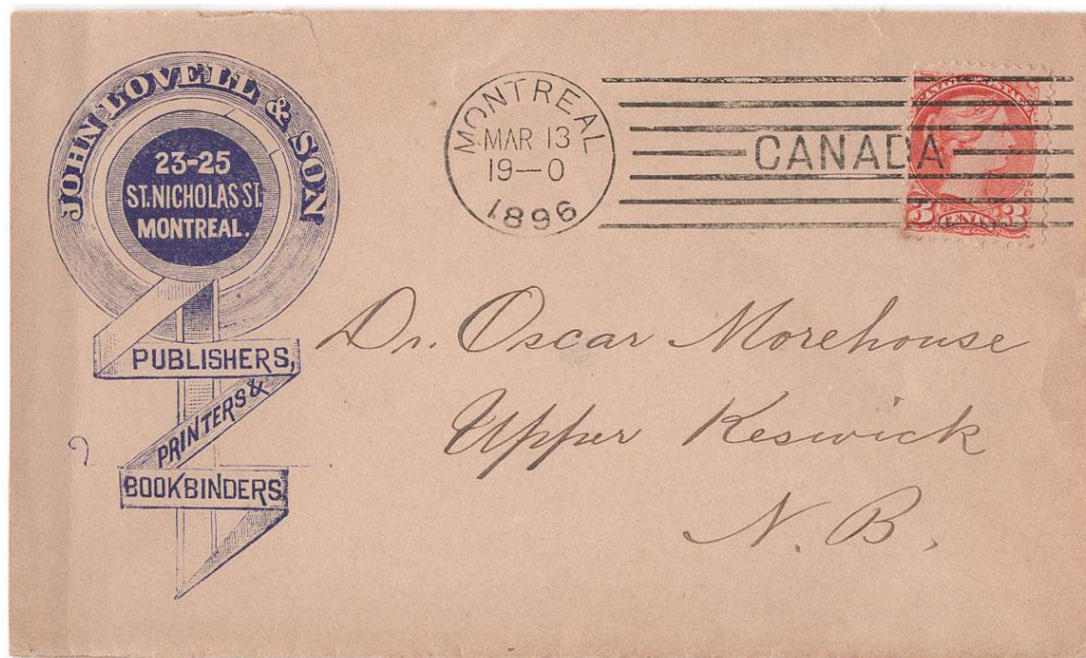
Item 671-03 – **Three Rivers LC (Ruggles indicia A)** – 1860, stampless cover from Three Rivers, LC, with Ruggles indicia A postmark; sent unpaid with 7¢ collect to Quebec (b/s). Choice exhibit-quality strike. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-04 – **St. Hyacinthe LC (Ruggles indicia B)** – 1857, stampless cover from St. Hyacinthe, CE, with Ruggles indicia B struck in red; rated 6d paying the cross-border letter rate to Rhode Island. Routed via Montreal (b/s). A very attractive St. Hyacinthe cover. \$150.00 **SOLD**

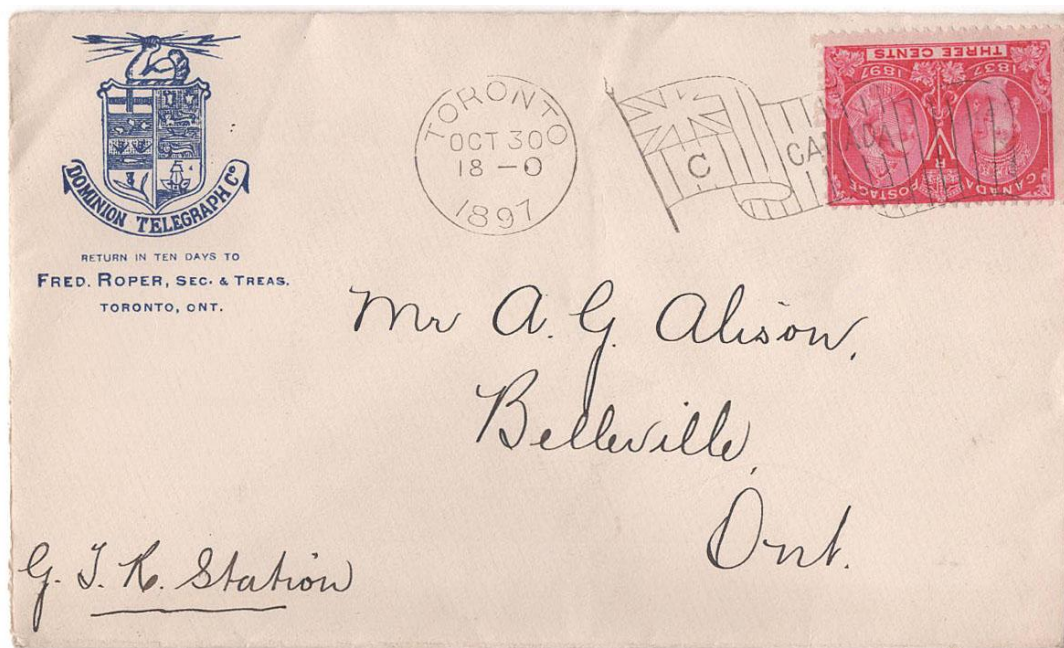


Item 671-05 – **Sorel CE mourning cover to Hamilton** – 1863, 5¢ Beaver (crisp printing, position 5) cancelled by a neat concentric-ring cancel on mourning cover from Sorel, CE; paying 5¢ letter rate to Hamilton (b/s), routed via Montreal (b/s). Lower left shows a manuscript B, possibly an annotation relating to steamboat carriage. A very attractive mourning cover from Sorel. \$125.00 **SOLD**

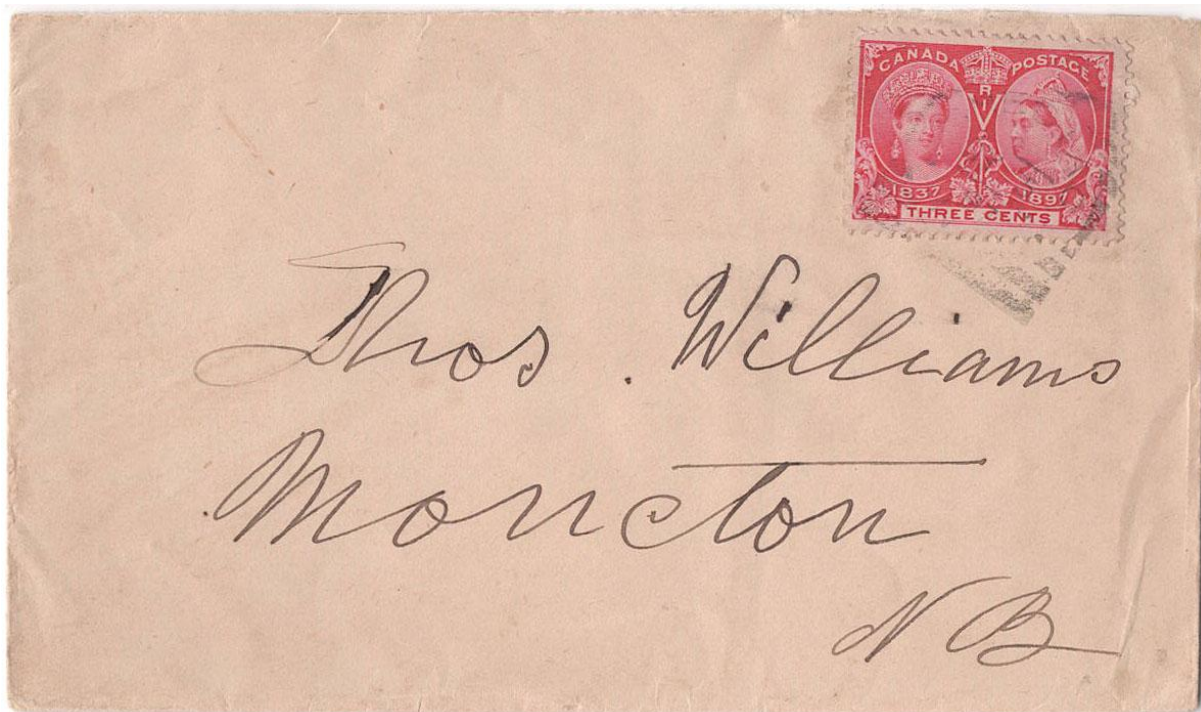

Last week I listed and it is still available an M1(b), the revived die used again on JA 30 97. It is a reworked version of the original die that had been rejected in March 1896.

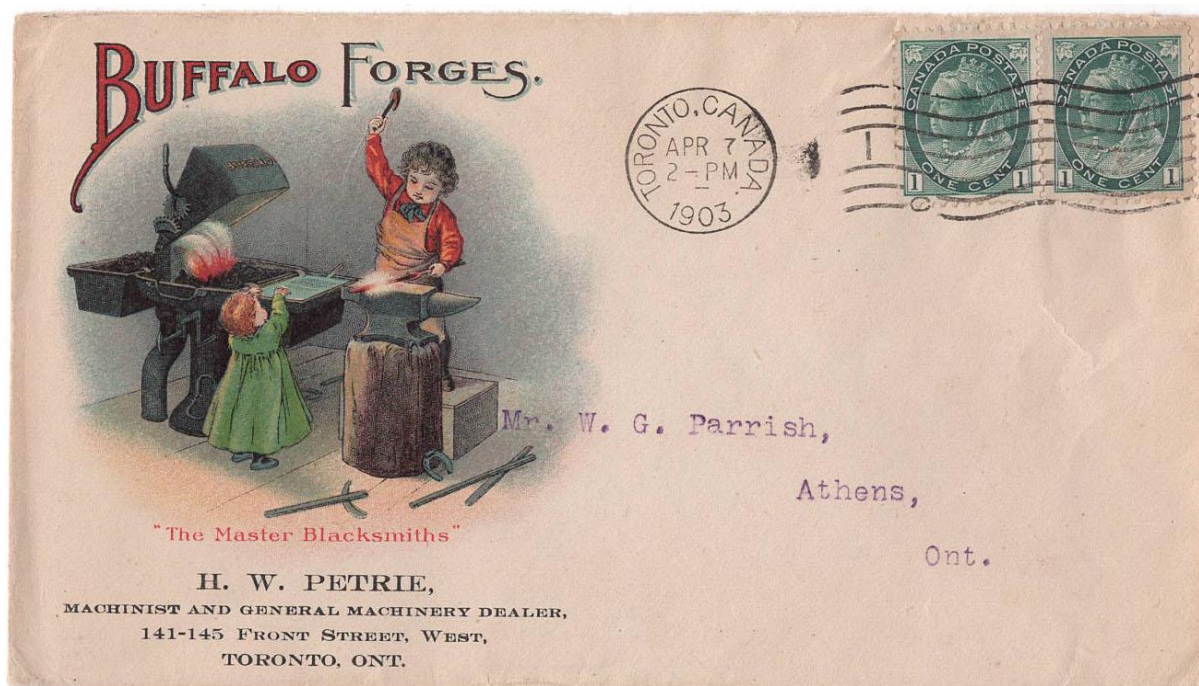
Item 671-06 – **M1 machine MR 13 96** - 1896, 3¢ SQ tied by Montreal Imperial machine M1 cancel dated MR 13 96 on John Lovell & Son advertising cover, paying 3¢ letter rate to Upper Keswick via Fredericton (b/s). This Imperial machine cancel comes from the electric stamping machine delivered to Montreal on March 10, 1896, marking the start of the trial of Canada’s first mail-marking machine. Although commonly called an Imperial, it was in fact a Boston machine owned by the American Postal Machines Company of Boston. The first day of use is March 10. This obliterator was withdrawn after only ten days due to over-inking caused by its heavy lines; the latest recorded date is March 20. A very attractive cover, used on day three of Canada’s first electric postal machine. \$350.00



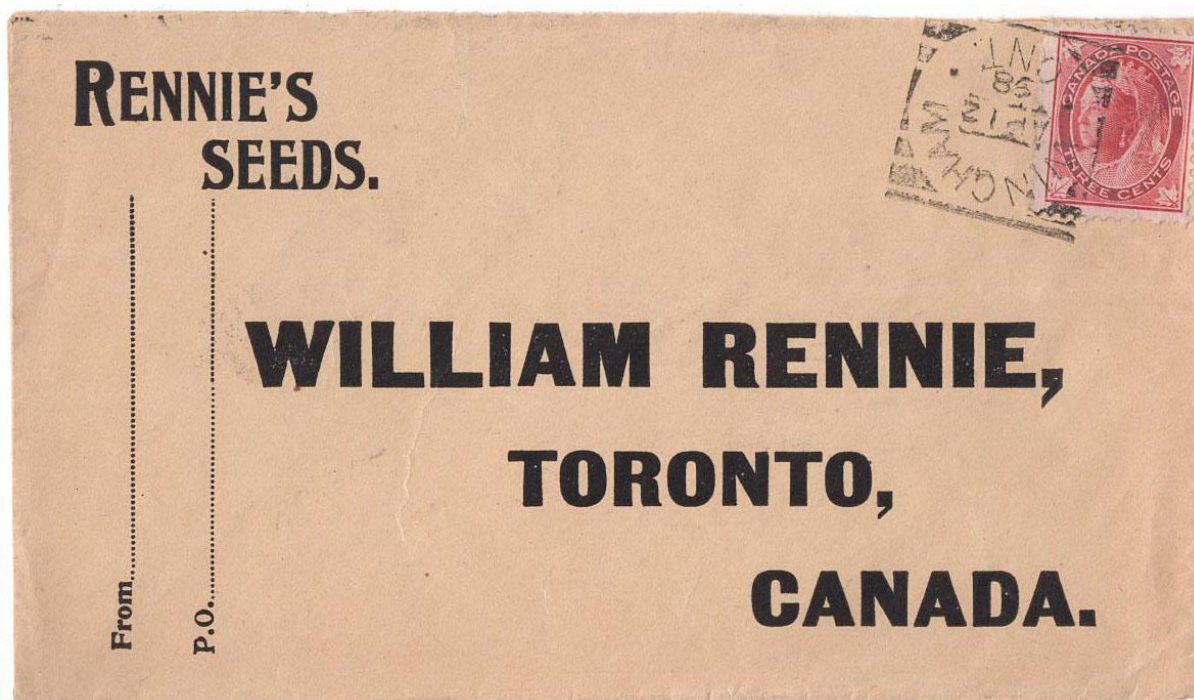
Item 671-07 – **Jubilee on Dominion Telegraph Company cover** – 1897, 3¢ Jubilee tied by Toronto Bickerdike machine cancel die C on Dominion Telegraph Co. advertising cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Belleville (b/s). Endorsed GTR Station, received at Belleville Station 1885-1919 (b/s). \$75.00



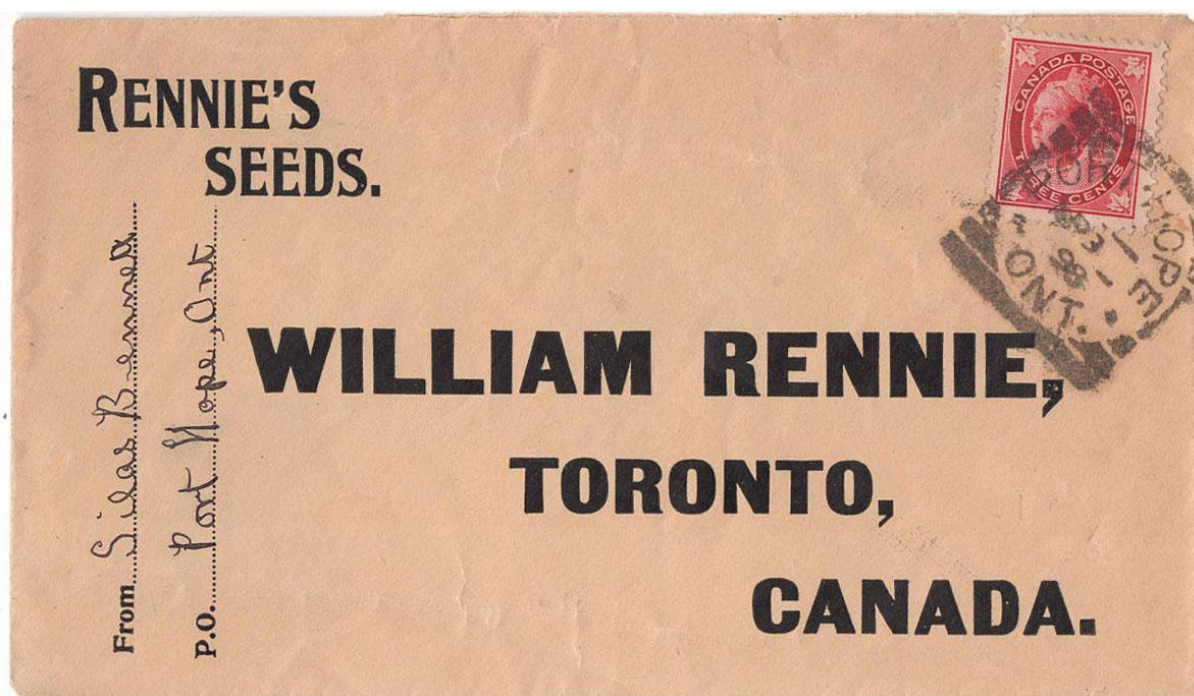
Item 671-08 – **Shediac NB squared circle on Jubilee (2 reported)** – 1897, 3¢ Jubilee tied by Shediac, NB, squared circle dated JY 5 97 on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Moncton (b/s). Only two Shediac squared-circle strikes on Jubilee covers are recorded; this one is a faint but identifiable example. Ex Jim Hennok. \$100.00 **SOLD**



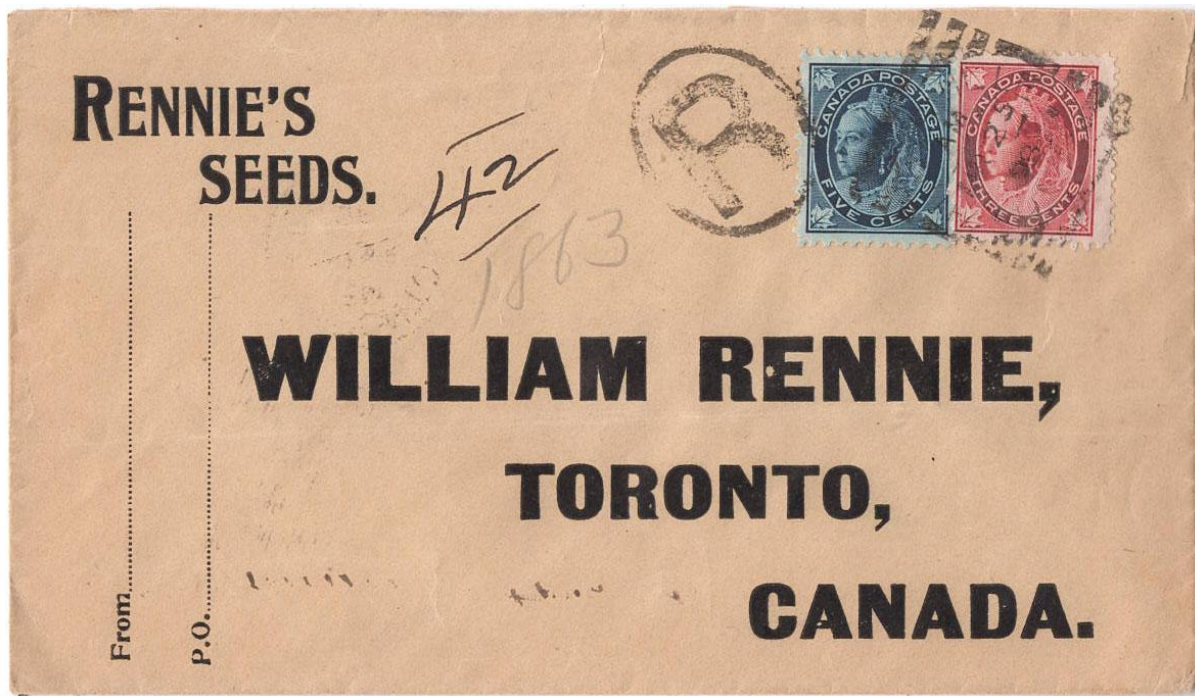
Item 671-09 – **Master Blacksmiths multicolour illustrated advertising** – 1903, 1¢ Numeral pair tied by Toronto International machine cancel on Buffalo Forges H. W. Petrie Master Blacksmiths multicolour advertising cover, paying 2¢ letter rate to Athens (b/s). I've sold this cover twice already and it looks like it has made its way back into Monday's catalogue for a third appearance. \$750.00



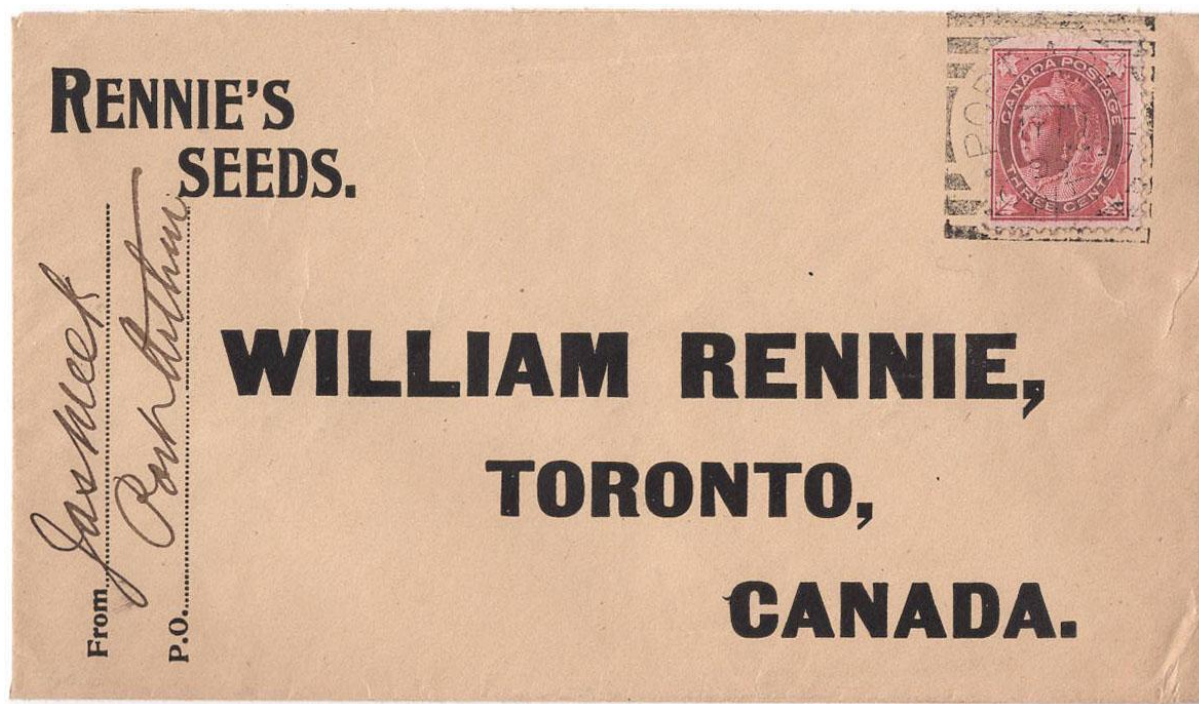
Item 671-10 – Wingham Ont squared circle – 1899, 3¢ Maple Leaf tied by Wingham Ont squared circle on Rennie cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). A very decent strike! \$50.00 **SOLD**



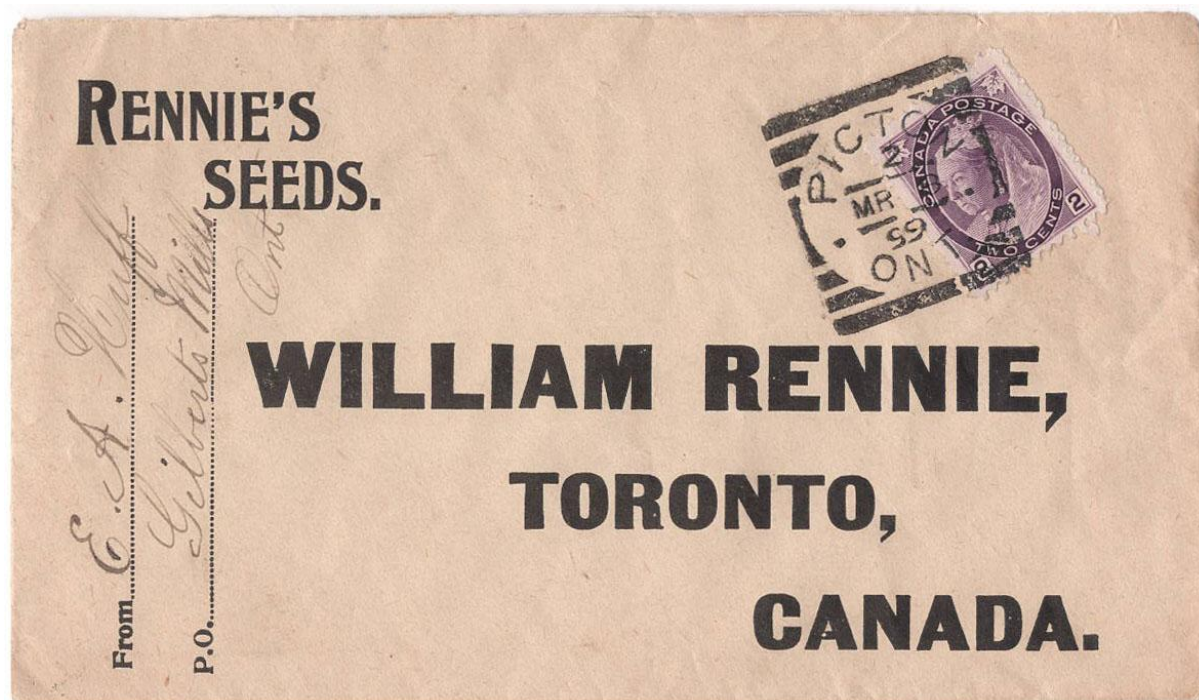
Item 671-11 – Port Hope Ont squared circle – 1898, 3¢ Maple Leaf tied by Port Hope Ont squared circle, odd date arrangement MR3_/98, on Rennie cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). A very pretty cover. \$50.00 **SOLD**



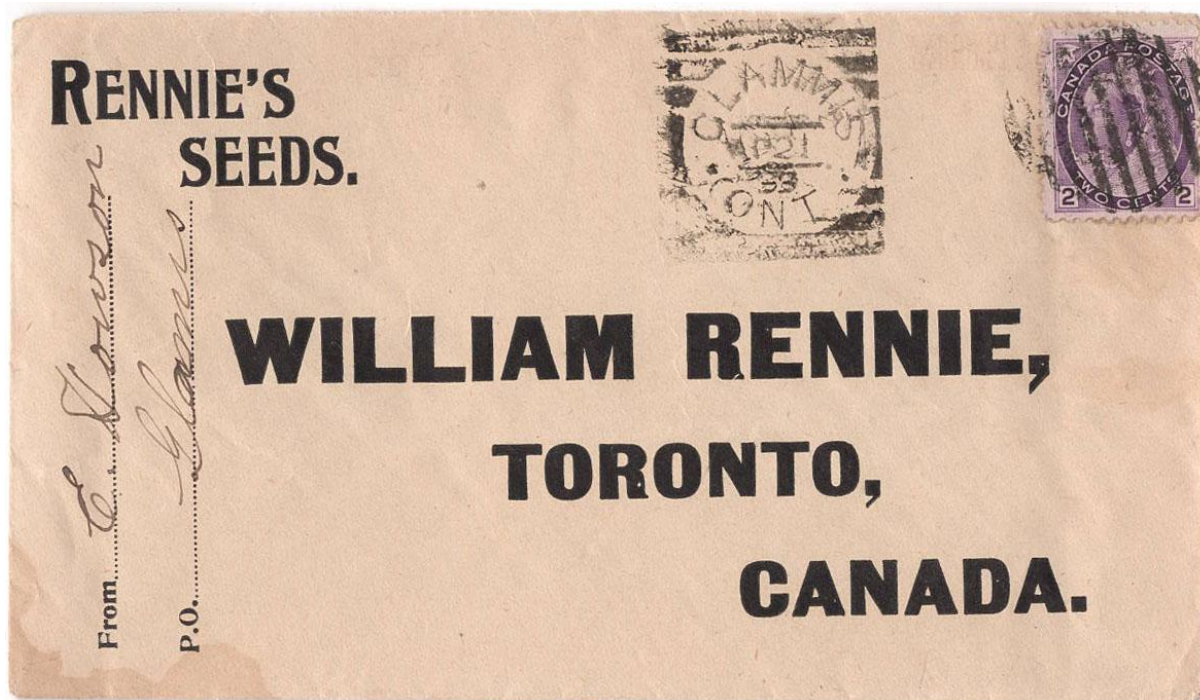
Item 671-12 – Huntsville Ont squared circle, registered – 1898, 3¢, 5¢ Maple Leaf tied by Huntsville Ont squared circle on Rennie cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Toronto (b/s). A very pretty cover. \$100.00 **SOLD**



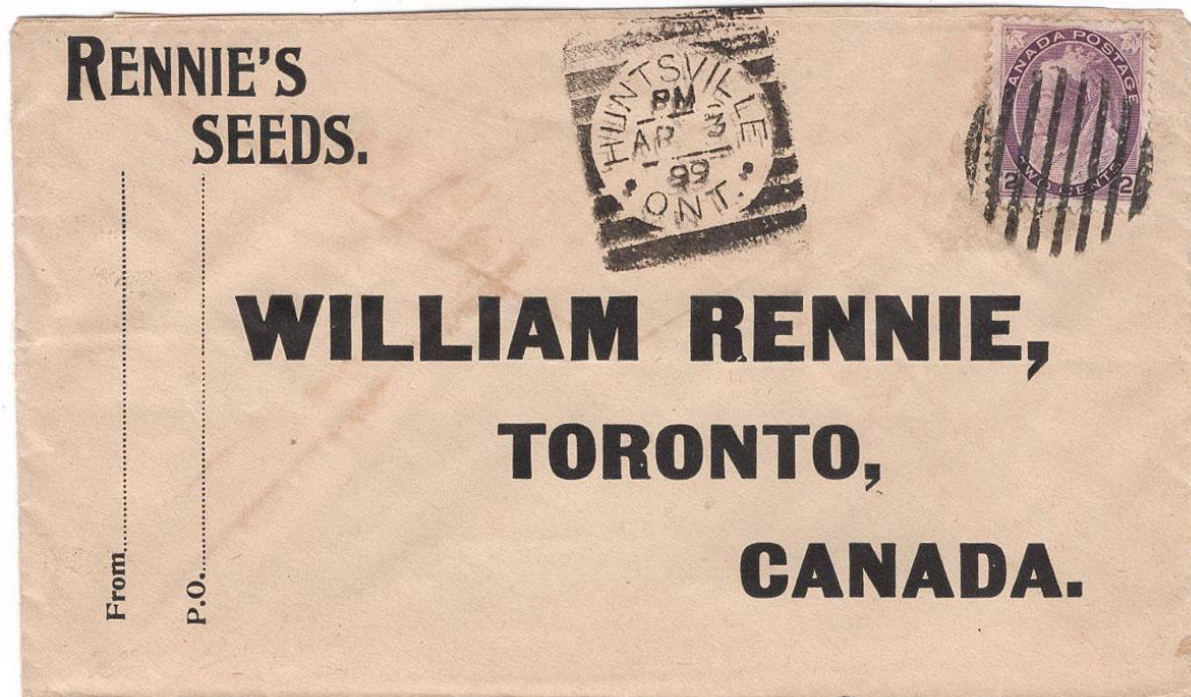
Item 671-13 – Port Hope Ont squared circle – 1898, 3¢ Maple Leaf tied by Port Hope Ont squared circle on Rennie cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Socked on the nose. Ex Hennok, Cohen. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-14 – Picton Ont squared circle – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by Picton Ont squared circle on Rennie cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). A great strike! \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-15 – Glamis Ont squared circle – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by grid cancel on Rennie cover from Glamis Ont paying 2¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). Squared circle Am 21 99 \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-16 – Huntsville Ont squared circle – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by grid cancel on Rennie cover from Huntsville, Ont., paying 2¢ letter rate to Toronto (b/s). An exhibit-quality strike, exceptionally strong. \$50.00 **SOLD**



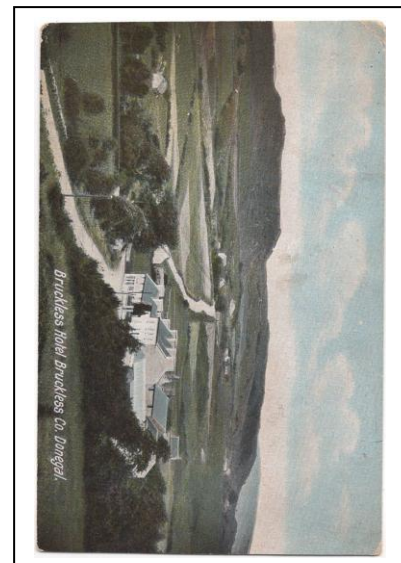
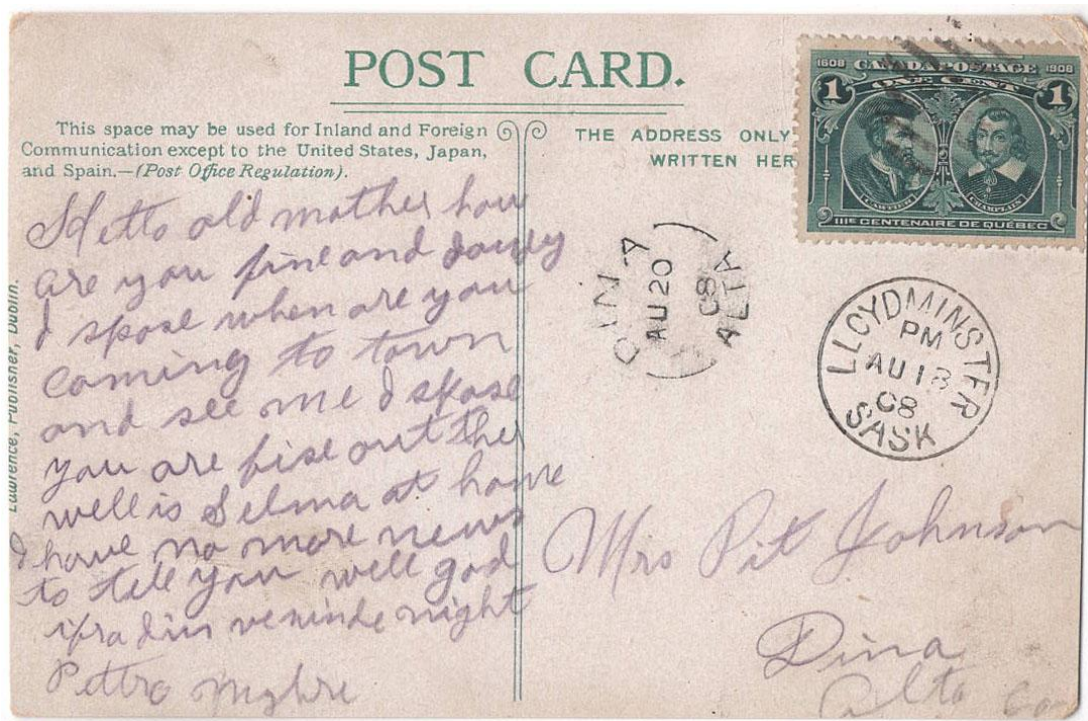
Item 671-17 – **Bloomfield NB (Carleton County)** – 1899, 2¢ Map (muddy-water effect, dark sand-brown shade) tied by grid cancel on cover from Bloomfield, NB, paying 2¢ letter rate to St. John (b/s), routed via Woodstock (b/s). Addressed to R. Colter, Post Office Inspector. \$50.00 **SOLD**



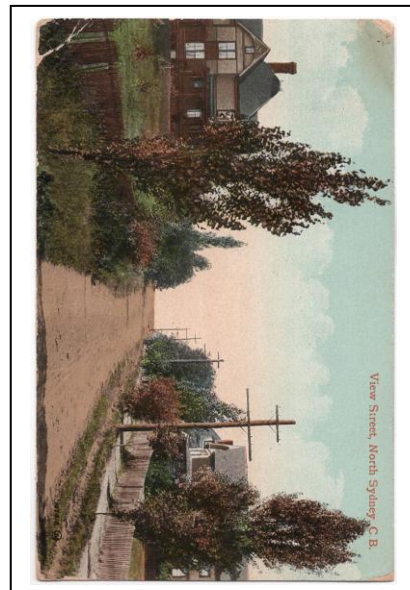
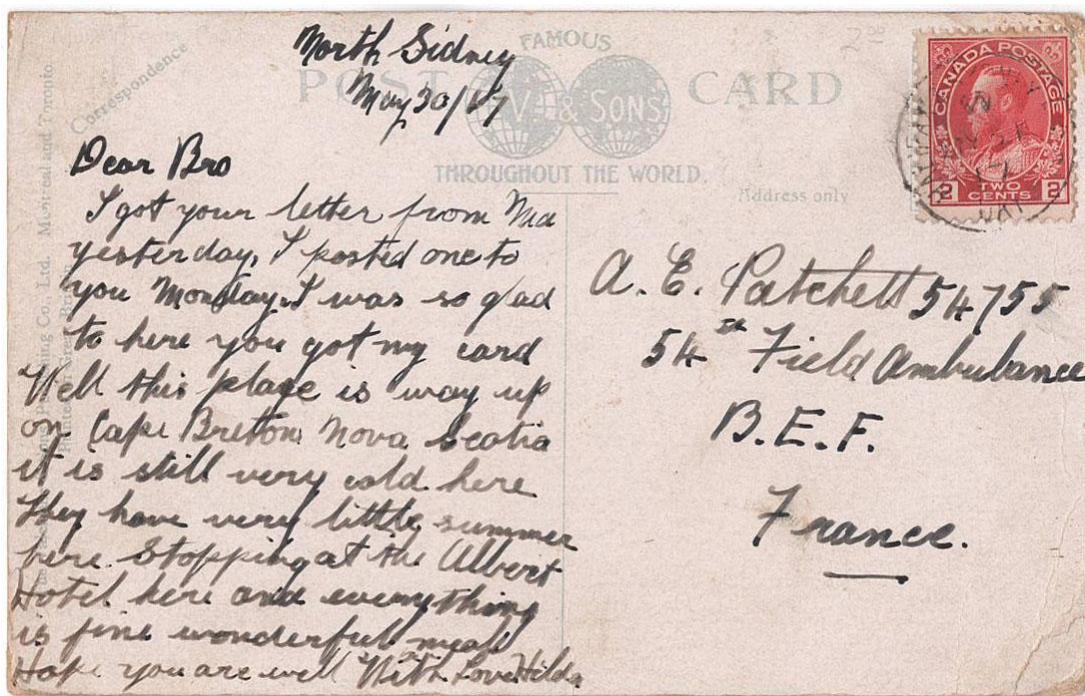
Item 671-18 – **GB wrapper to Fort Saskatchewan NWT (Territorial)** – 1903, GB ½d tied by Birmingham cds on ½d wrapper, paying 1d Empire printed-matter rate to Fort Saskatchewan, NWT. A desirable territorial period incoming printed-matter item to Alberta. \$25.00 **SOLD**



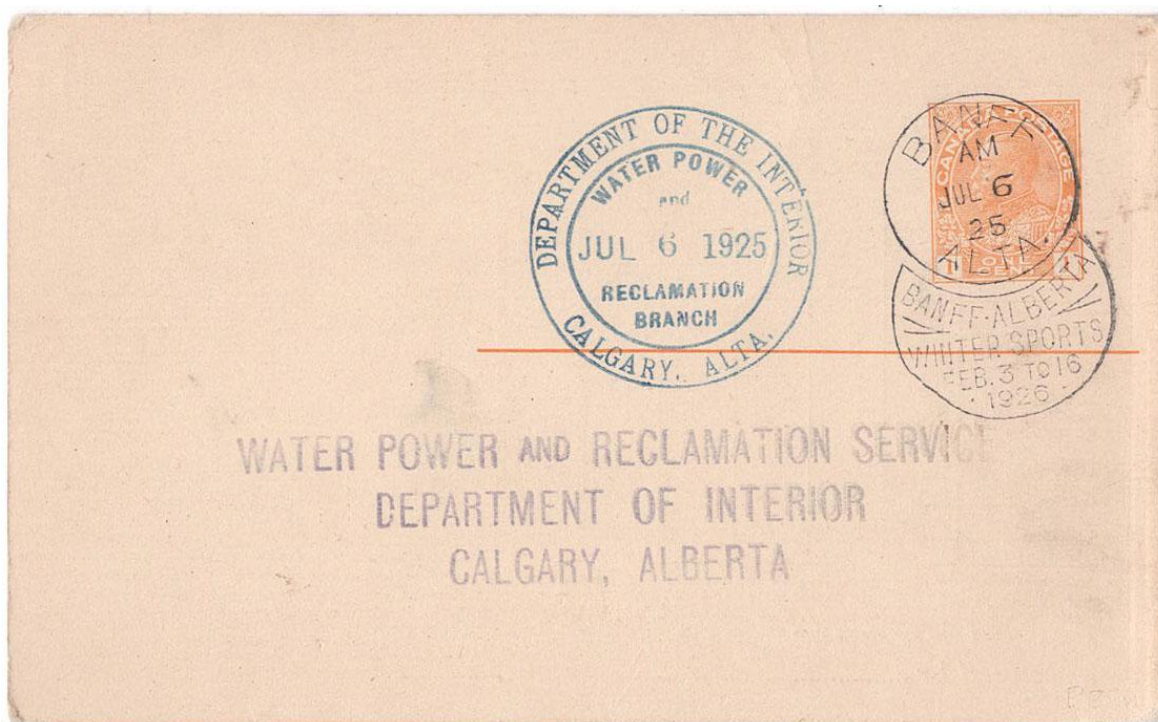
Item 671-19 – **Manitoban farmer illustrated** – 1904, 2¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on Louis van Brabant Farmer Owner illustrated cover, paying 2¢ letter rate to Vermont (b/s) via Mariapolis, Man (b/s). Flemish name and Franco-Manitoban related. \$100.00



Item 671-20 – **Dina Alberta (RF E)** – 1908, 1¢ Quebec tied by grid cancel on postcard from Lloydminster, Sask., paying 1¢ postcard rate to Dina, Alberta (RF E, 1908–1937). \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-21 – North Sydney NS to 54th Field Ambulance, BEF – 1917, 2¢ Admiral tied by Halifax & Sydney RPO cds (MT-187) on North Sydney Valentine postcard paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to France. The card is addressed to A.E. Patchett 54755, 54th Field Ambulance BEF, France. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-22 – A perfect Banff Winter Sports duplex cancel – 1925, 1¢ Admiral stationery card cancelled by Banff Winter Sports duplex/slogan cancel, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Calgary. Cloutier DAB-25; Coutts B-50. A superb, perfectly struck example, impossible to improve upon. \$50.00



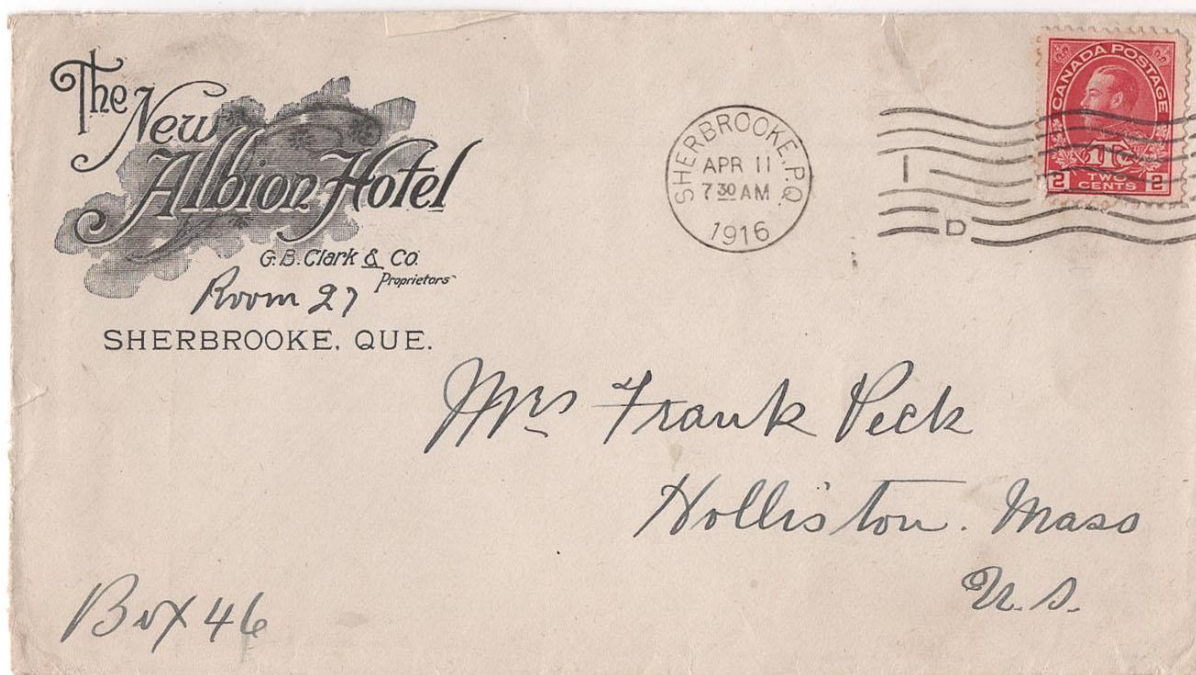
Item 671-23 – 7c Admiral red brown with 5c Scroll accompanies – 1930, 7c Admiral red brown and 5c Scroll tied by Berwick, NS MOOD handstamp on cover, paying 12c registered letter rate to Massachusetts (b/s). Carried on the Halifax–Digby & Yarmouth RPO. A very scarce combination, 7c red brown use with MOOD is especially elusive. A real eye-catcher. \$100.00



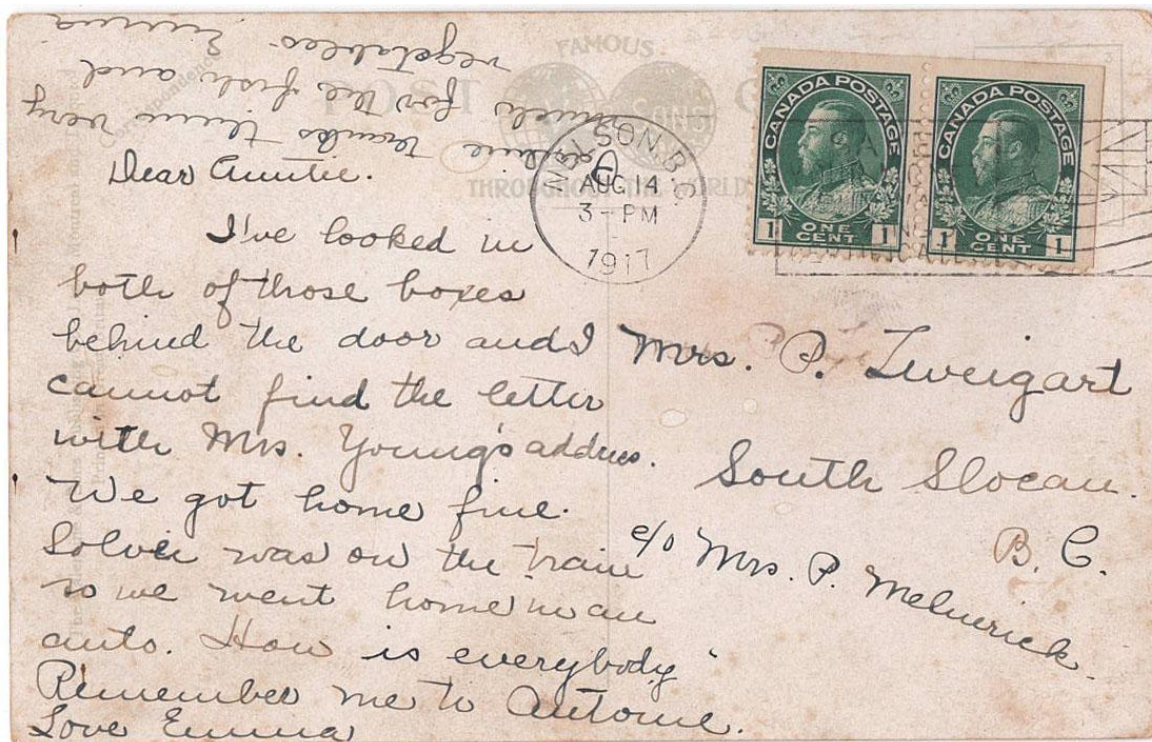
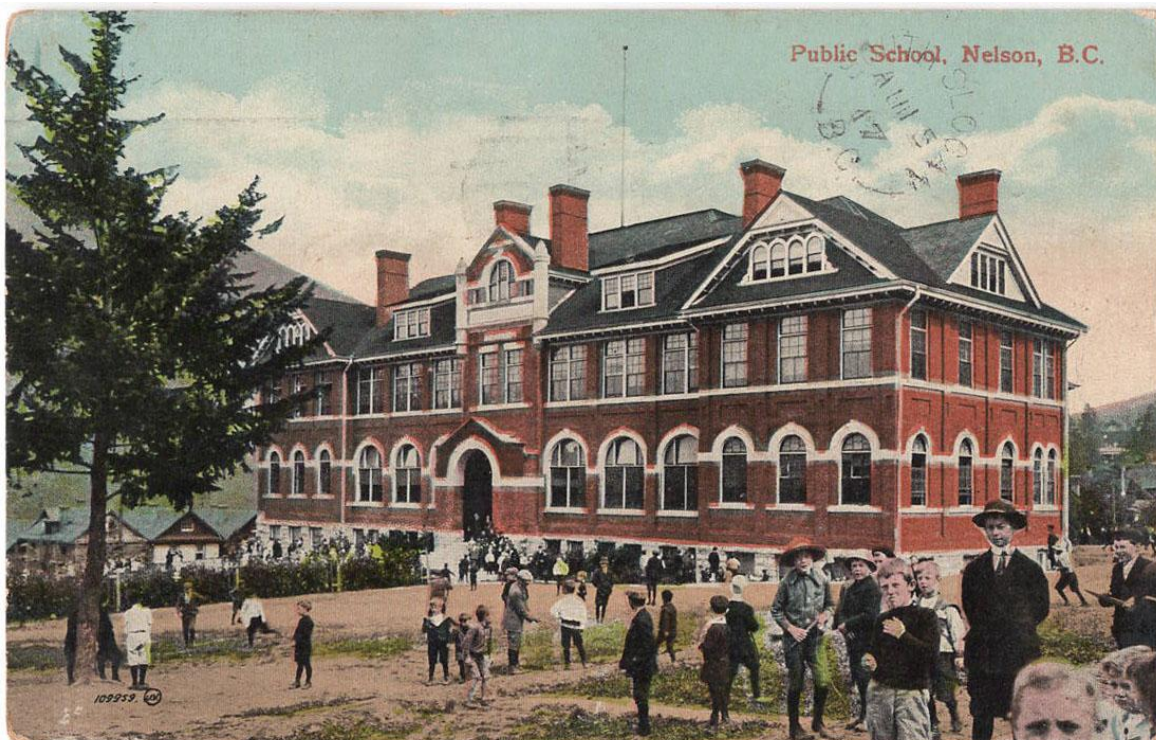
Item 671-24 – **Middleton NS planning mills advertising** – 1921, 3¢ Admiral tied by Middleton NS cds on Valley Planning Mills advertising cover (A.W. Allen & Son) paying 3¢ letter rate to Kingston (Kingston Station b/s). A clean and attractive Annapolis County item. \$75.00



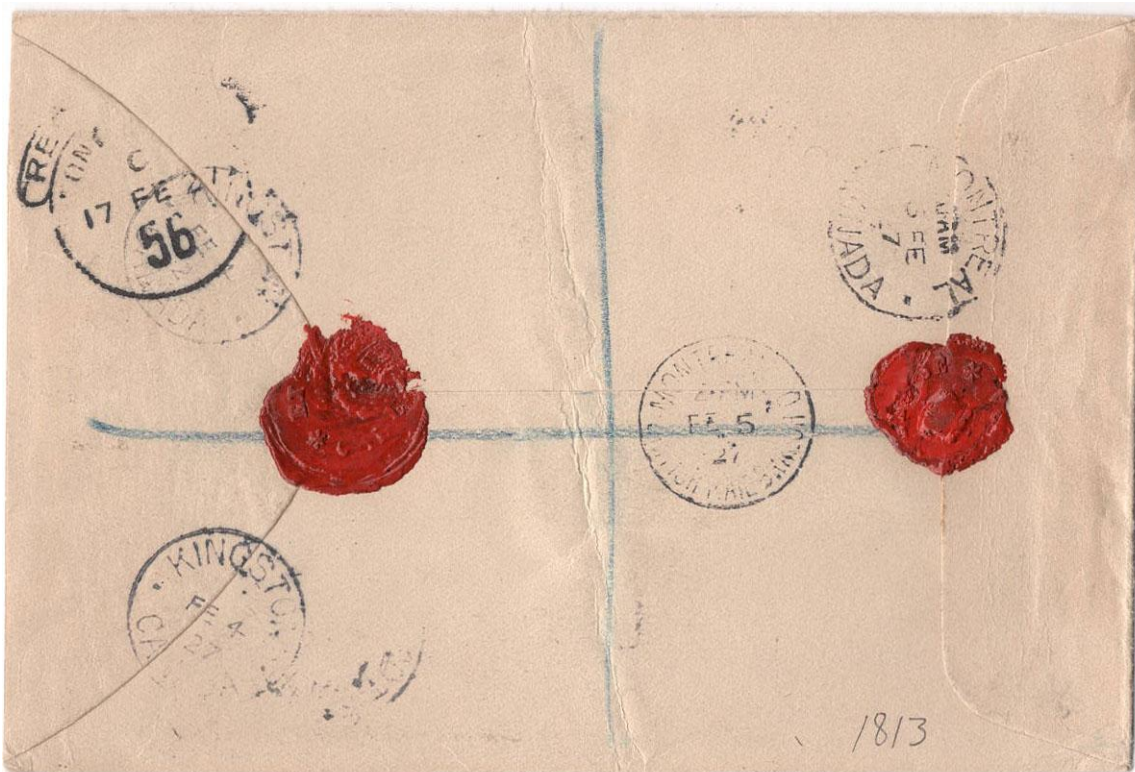
Item 671-25 – **Quebec bilingual Diamond Jubilee free strike** – 1927, 2¢ Admiral not tied but clearly belonging with Quebec Diamond Jubilee bilingual flag cancel, type 44-2, paying 2¢ postcard rate to Massachusetts. The cancel missed the stamp but produces a very attractive, full free-strike impression. \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-26 – **Civil censorship label, Sherbrooke PQ** – 1916, 2¢+1¢ Wartax tied by Sherbrooke PQ International machine cancel on The News Albion Hotel advertising censored cover, paying 3¢ letter rate to Massachusetts. Civil censorship label. A neat cover. \$75.00 **SOLD**



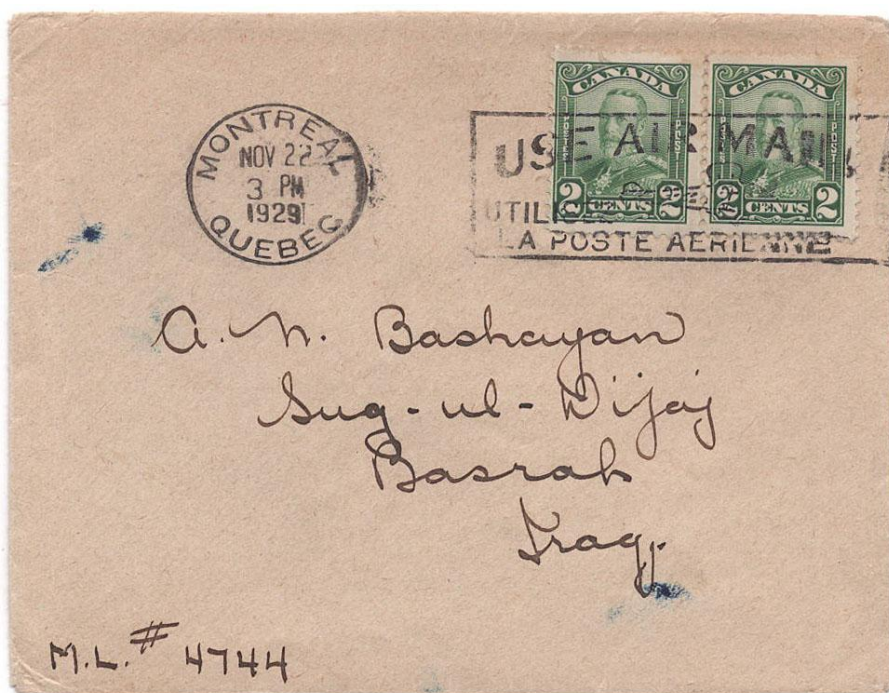
Item 671-27 – **Nelson BC flag cancel 35-6** – 1917, 1¢ Admiral booklet-stamp pair tied by Nelson, BC flag cancel 35-6 on postcard, paying 2¢ postcard rate to South Slocan. A rare flag cancel. \$100.00 **SOLD**



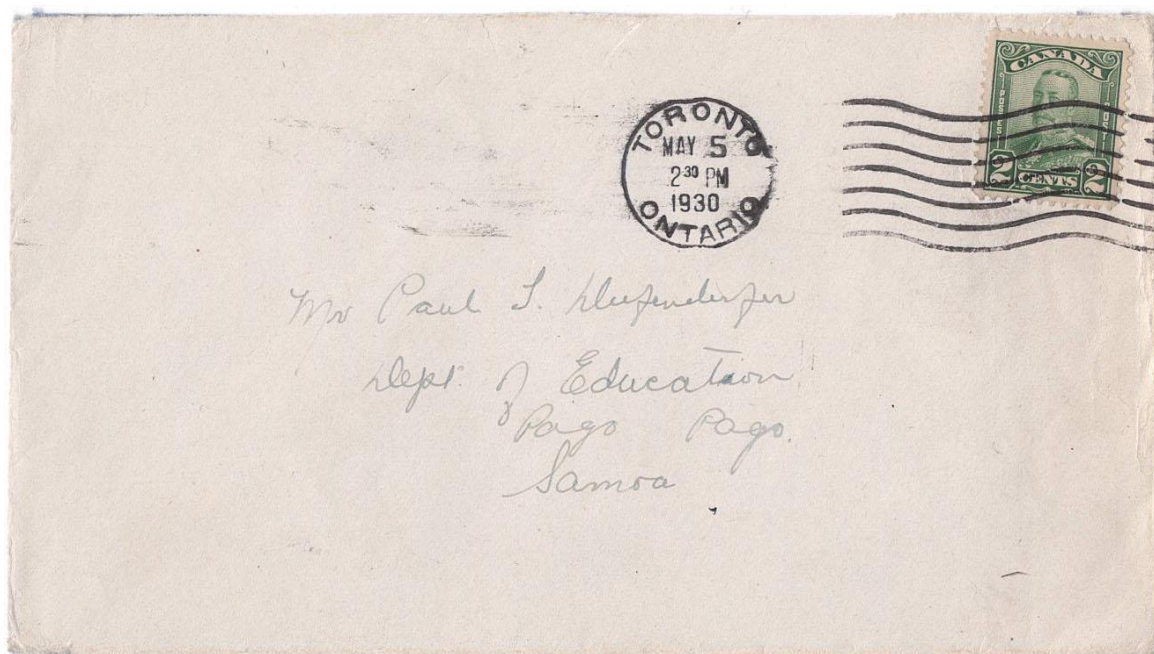
Item 671-28 – **8¢ Admiral pair 16¢ double wgt Empire registered** – 1927, 8¢ Admiral blue vertical pair tied by Kingston Ont cds on cover paying 16¢ double weight Empire registered letter rate to England (b/s). Montreal transit (b/s). A very unusual franking. \$200.00 **SOLD**



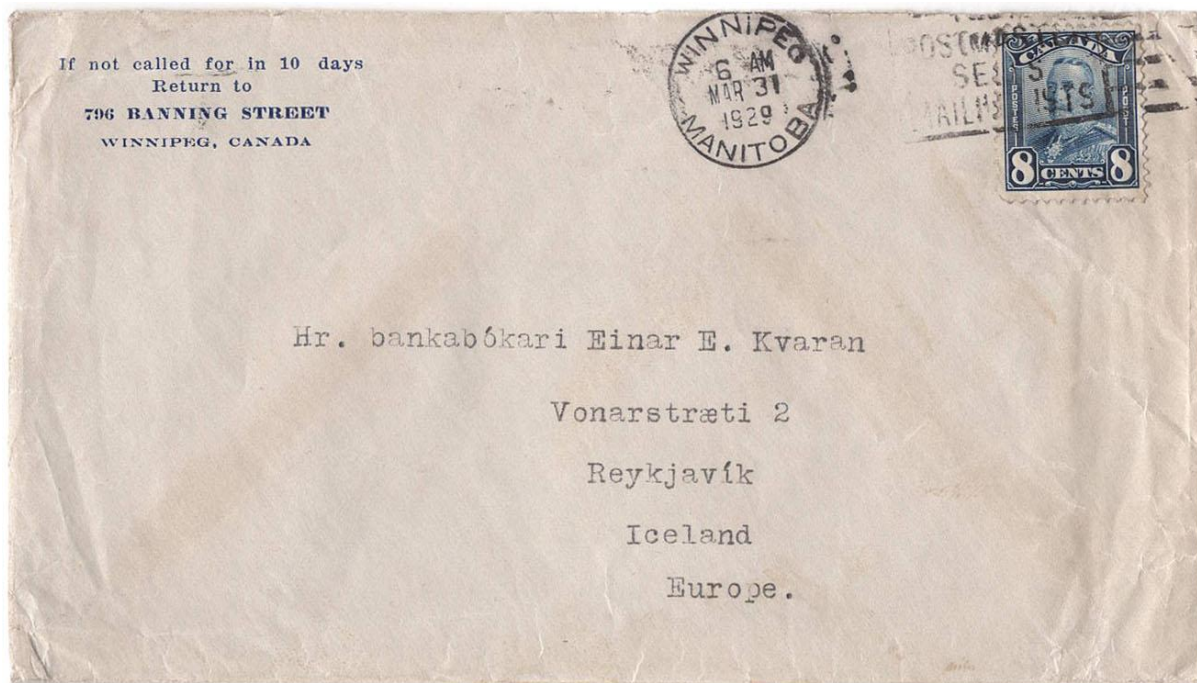
Item 671-29 – **13¢ Empire registered to Kenya** – 1935, 1¢ Admiral and Medallion, 2¢ Admiral to Arch tied by Quebec PQ Sub No.8 cds on cover paying 13¢ Empire registered letter rate to Nairobi, Kenya Colony (b/s). Quebec main office (b/s). \$150.00



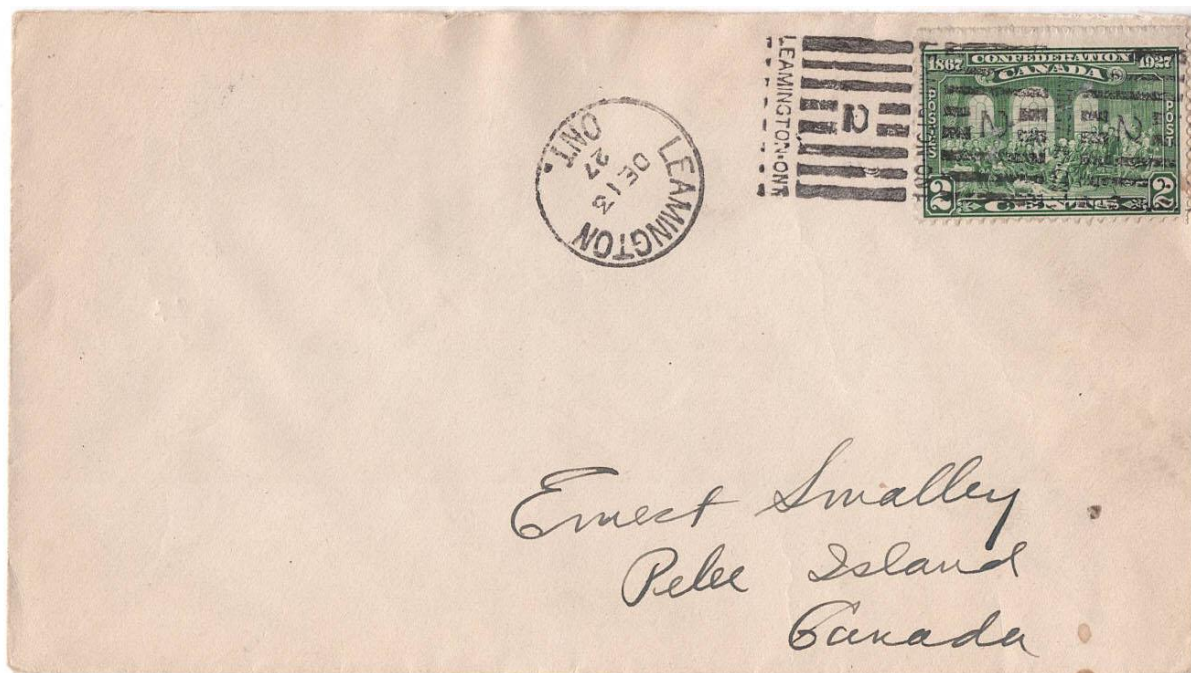
Item 671-30 – **4¢ Empire letter rate to Iraq** – 1929, 2¢ Scroll pair tied by Montreal Use Air Mail machine cancel on cover, white airplane-facing-right slogan, paying 4¢ Empire letter rate to Basrah, Southern Iraq. In 1929, Iraq was under British administration as a League of Nations mandate (*the British Mandate for Mesopotamia*), with the kingdom established in 1921 but full independence not achieved until 1932. A scarce and striking destination cover. \$200.00



Item 671-31 – **2¢ letter rate to Pago Pago, Samoa** – 1930, 2¢ Scroll tied by Toronto machine cancel on cover paying 2¢ letter rate to American Samoa. No backstamp as customary. Samoa was a U.S. territory in 1930. The islands of Tutuila and Aunu'u were ceded to the U.S. in 1900, followed by the Manu'a Islands in 1904, with the U.S. Congress formally ratifying these treaties in 1929 to establish it as an unincorporated territory. A nice clean cover. \$100.00



Item 671-32 – **8¢ UPU letter rate to Iceland** – 1929, 8¢ Scroll tied by Winnipeg Man machine cancel on cover paying 8¢ UPU letter rate to Reykjavik, Iceland. \$100.00



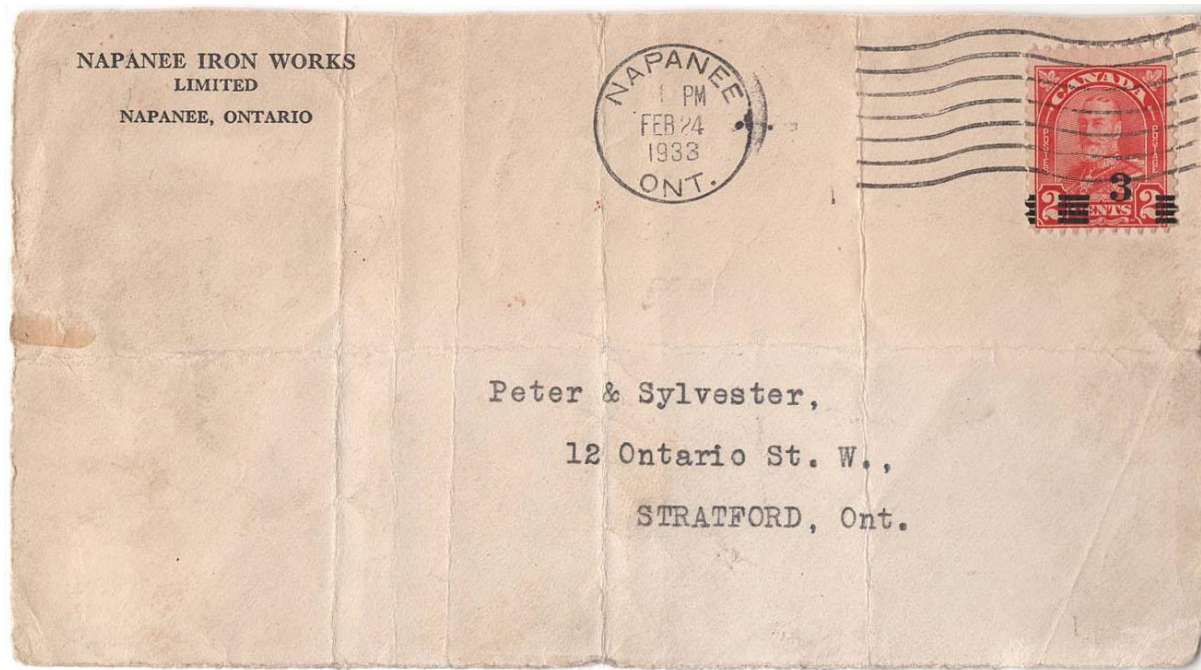
Item 671-33 – **Leamington Ont roller No.2** – 1927, 2¢ Confederation tied by a neat Leamington, Ont. roller No. 2 on cover, cds alongside, paying 2¢ letter rate to Pelee Island (b/s). \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-34 – Oliver BC 45¢ airmail to Venezuela – 1931, 2¢ (2), 3¢ booklet stamps (2), 10¢ and 20¢ Arch, plus 5¢ Airmail C1, all tied by Oliver BC duplex cancel on cover paying 45¢ airmail letter rate to Venezuela (½ ounce rate). \$100.00



Item 671-35 – 3¢ Cartier on shortpaid airmail cover to NY – 1934, 3¢ Cartier tied by Montreal duplex S cancel on 3¢ postal stationery envelope, underpaying 12¢ double-weight airmail letter rate to Syracuse, NY. Montreal postal clerk handstamp (b/s) in the same ink as the postage due and airmail marking. The 12¢ due represents the double 6¢ shortpaid. A very unusual Cartier usage. \$75.00 **SOLD**



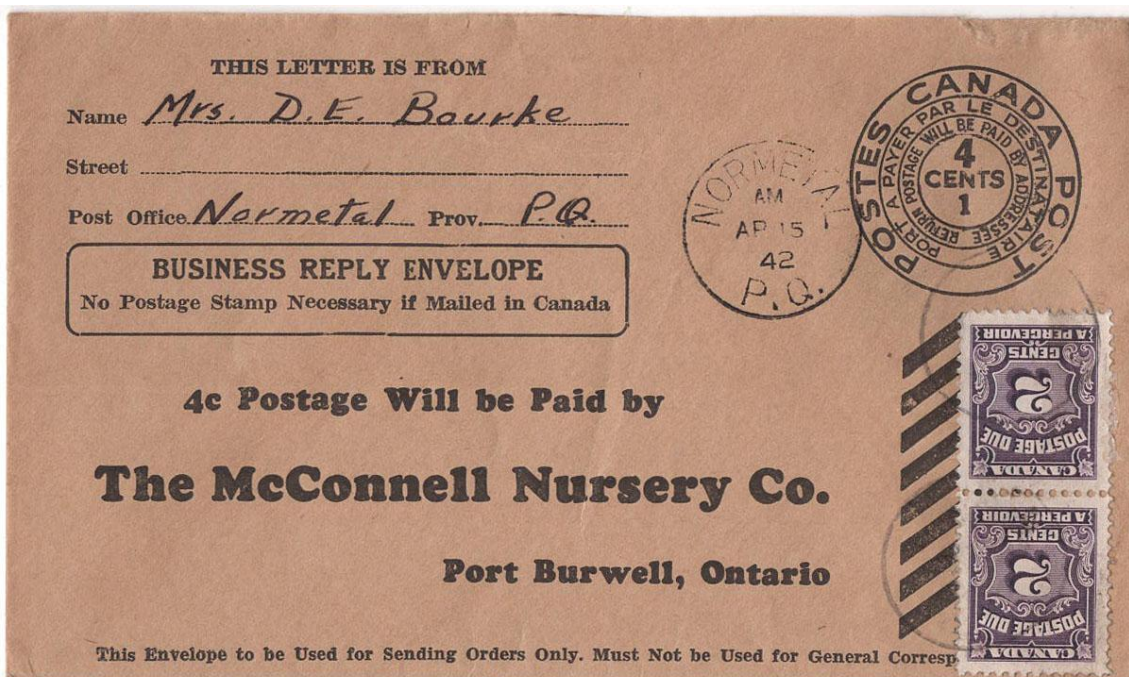
Item 671-36 – **3¢ Arch Provisional 191aii on cover front** – 1933, 3¢ Arch Provisional with shifted surcharge, Unitrade 191aii, die II with P of Postage appears almost like a D, tied by Napanee Ont machine cancel on cover front paying 3¢ letter rate to Stratford. Numerous folds. A spectacular surcharge variety on a commercial cover. \$200.00



Item 671-37 – **3¢ Medallion printed matter rate to Panama** – 1933, 3¢ Medallion tied by Windsor Ont Station A roller cancel on wrapper paying 3¢ printed matter rate to Canal Zone, Panama. 1¢ per 2 ounces. \$50.00



Item 671-38 – **Montreal Longueuil Keyhole** – 1938, 2¢ Mufti and 10¢ Pictorial tied by Montreal, PQ Longueuil duplex cancel on Chambly County c/c cover, paying 12¢ drop registered letter rate. Although located on the south shore of the St. Lawrence, Longueuil was considered part of Montreal for postal purposes, and the 12¢ drop registered rate was accepted. \$25.00 **SOLD**



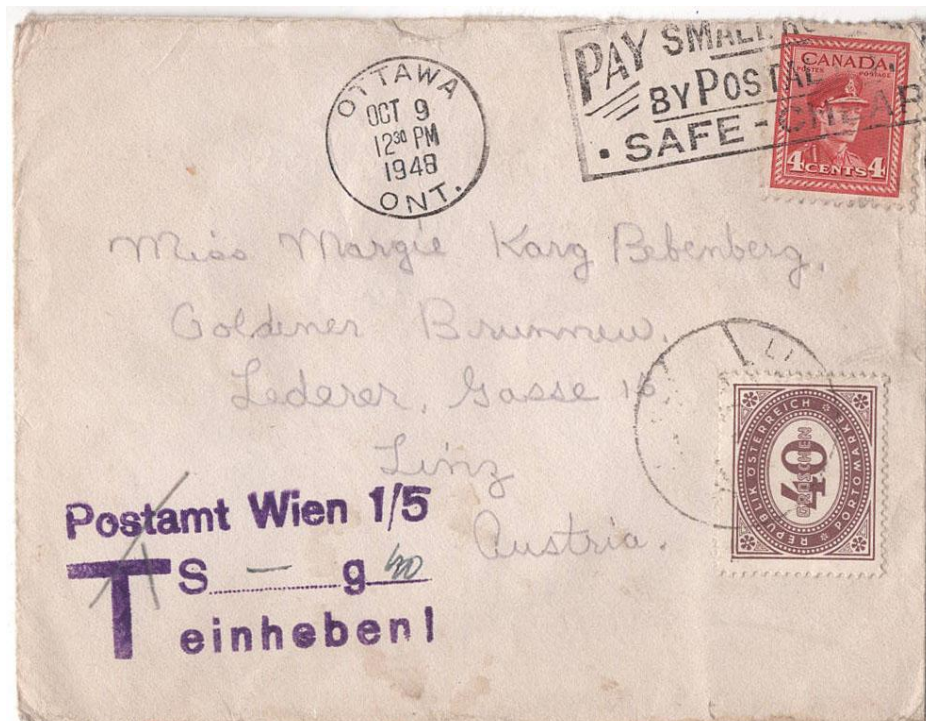
Item 671-39 – **Normetal PQ (Abitibi Region)** – 1942, 4¢ permit reply cover from Normetal, PQ to Port Burwell, postage paid by the addressee's permit, collected in Port Burwell with 2¢ Postage Due Fourth Issue, tied by a homemade or improvised blackout circular device. Normetal is located in northwestern Quebec in the Abitibi-West region, known for its zinc and copper mining. \$25.00



Item 671-40 – **Ukrainian refugees in Munich, US Zone** – 1947, 5¢ War and 10¢ Peace tied by Hamilton machine cancel on cover, paying 15¢ airmail letter rate to Germany, U.S. Zone. Censored in Munich by American authorities, as the addressee was possibly living in a specialized camp in the city. After 1945, more than 200,000 Ukrainians remained in the western zones of occupied Germany, but Canadian covers with a Ukrainian connection are not common. Nice and exhibit quality. \$75.00 **SOLD**



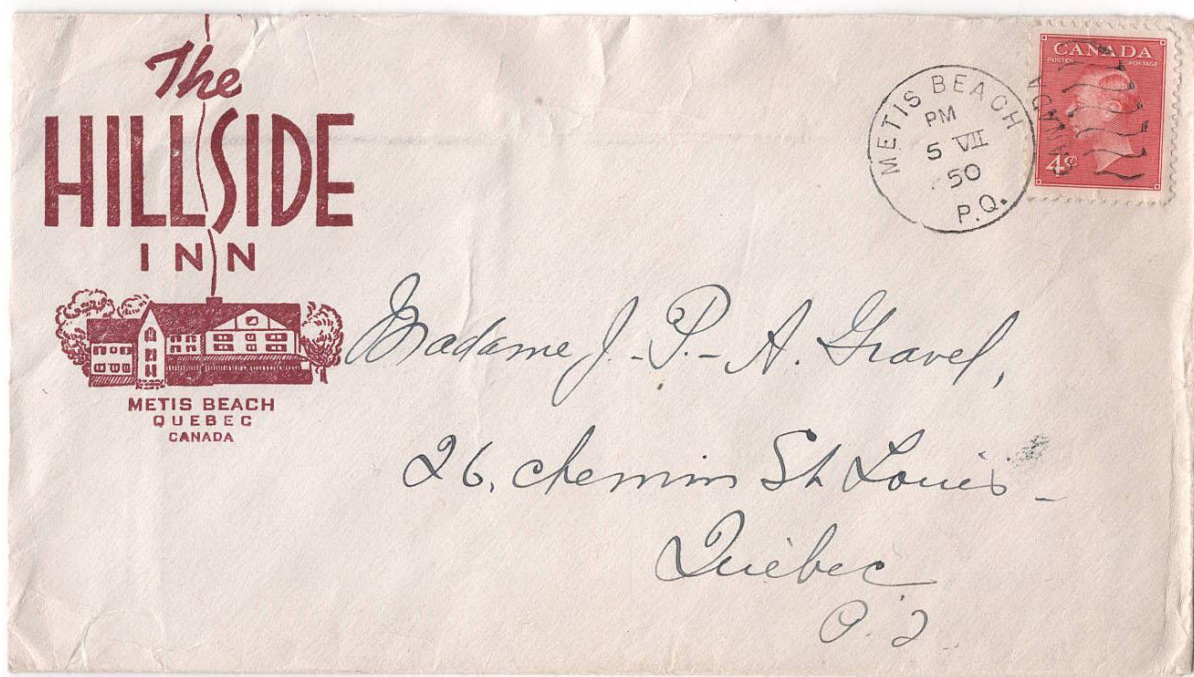
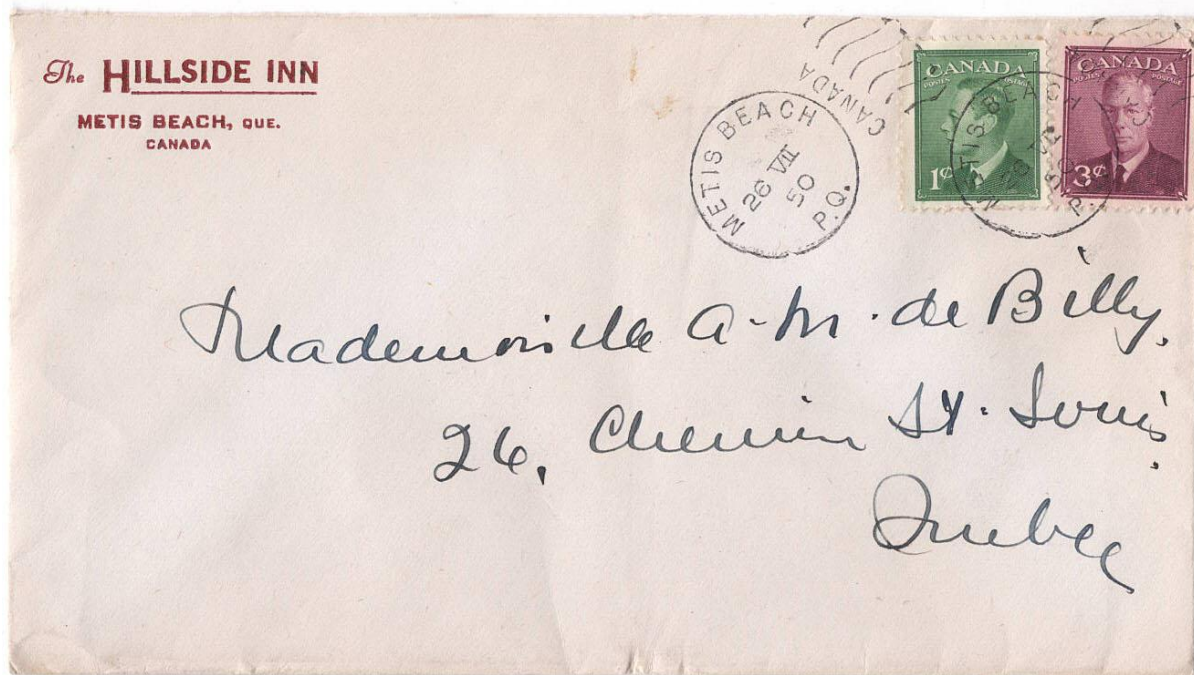
Item 671-41 – **FECB registered airmail to Hong Kong** – 1948, 5¢ War, 10¢, 20¢ and 50¢ Peace tied by Welland, Ont. cds on FECB cover, paying 85¢ triple-weight airmail registered letter rate to Hong Kong (no receiver but R6 Hong Kong postmen marking in purple). Routed via Hamilton (b/s) \$150.00



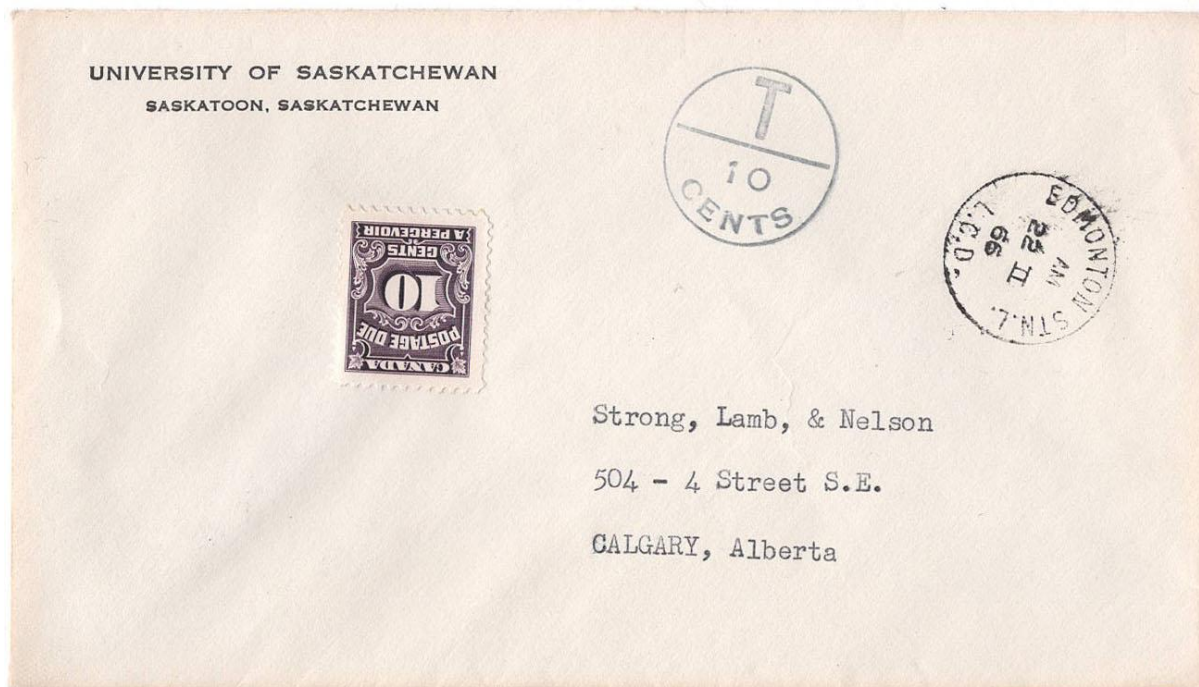
Item 671-42 – **5¢ UPU letter to Austria, short** – 1948, 4¢ War tied by Ottawa, Ont. machine cancel on cover underpaying the 5¢ UPU letter rate to Austria. Fractional postage-due marking showing UPU 1/5, converted to 40 Groschen due and paid with the proper 40 Gr Portomarke stamp. \$125.00



Item 671-43 – **CFPO 27 Yongsan South Korea** – 1951, 7¢ Airmail C9 tied by CFPO 27 cds on cover dated AU 6 51, paying the 7¢ airmail letter rate to New York. Airmail from Vancouver to New York State. No return address, but possibly from a member of the 2nd Battalion, 2 PPCLI, which arrived in Korea in February 1951 and later defended Hill 677 during the Battle of Kapyong in April/May 1951. Faint pencil annotation on front “Rec’d AU 15 51,” showing 12 days in transit. A very scarce CFPO. \$75.00 **SOLD**



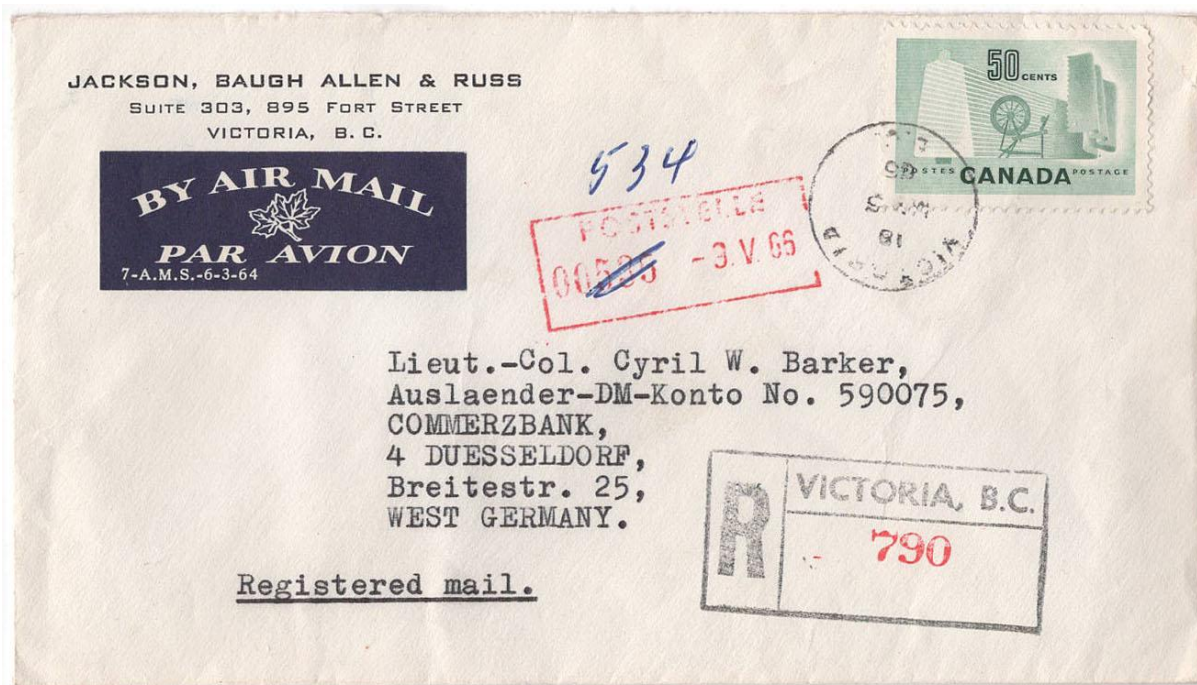
Item 671-44 – **Pair of Metis Beach Hillside Inn covers** – 1950, two different Hillside Inn advertising covers of Metis Beach, Que., one bearing the 4c Carmine, the scarcest value of the Postes-Postage Issue on an advertising cover. Pair \$25.00

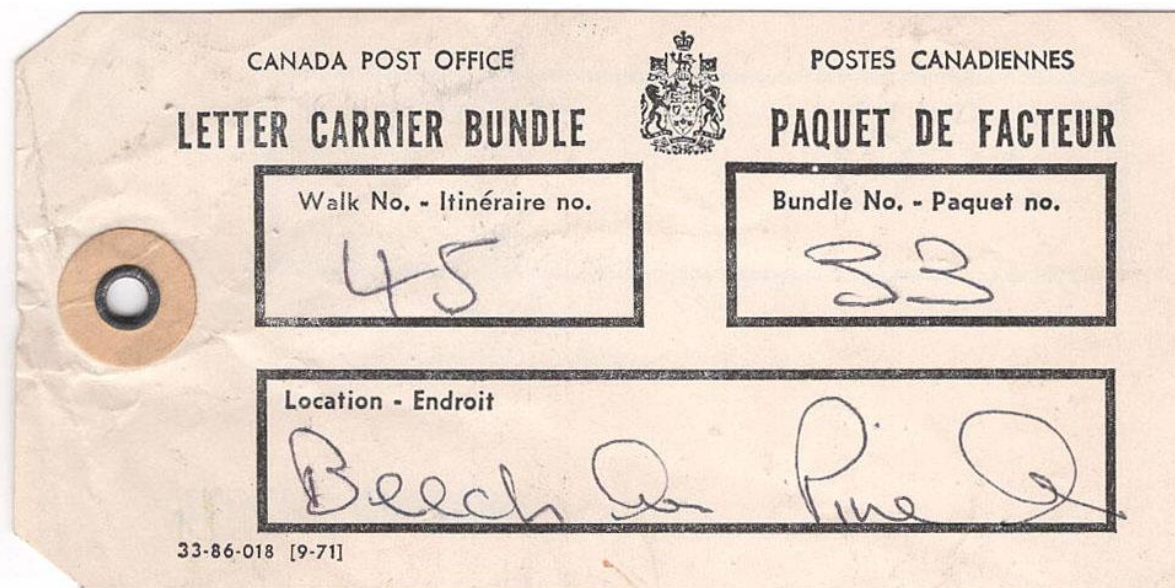
Item 671-45 – **Edmonton Station L LCD (Letter Carrier Depot)** – 1966, U of Sask unpaid cover from Saskatoon to Calgary, handled by the Edmonton Station L Letter Carrier Depot, charged 10¢ for the double deficiency. \$25.00



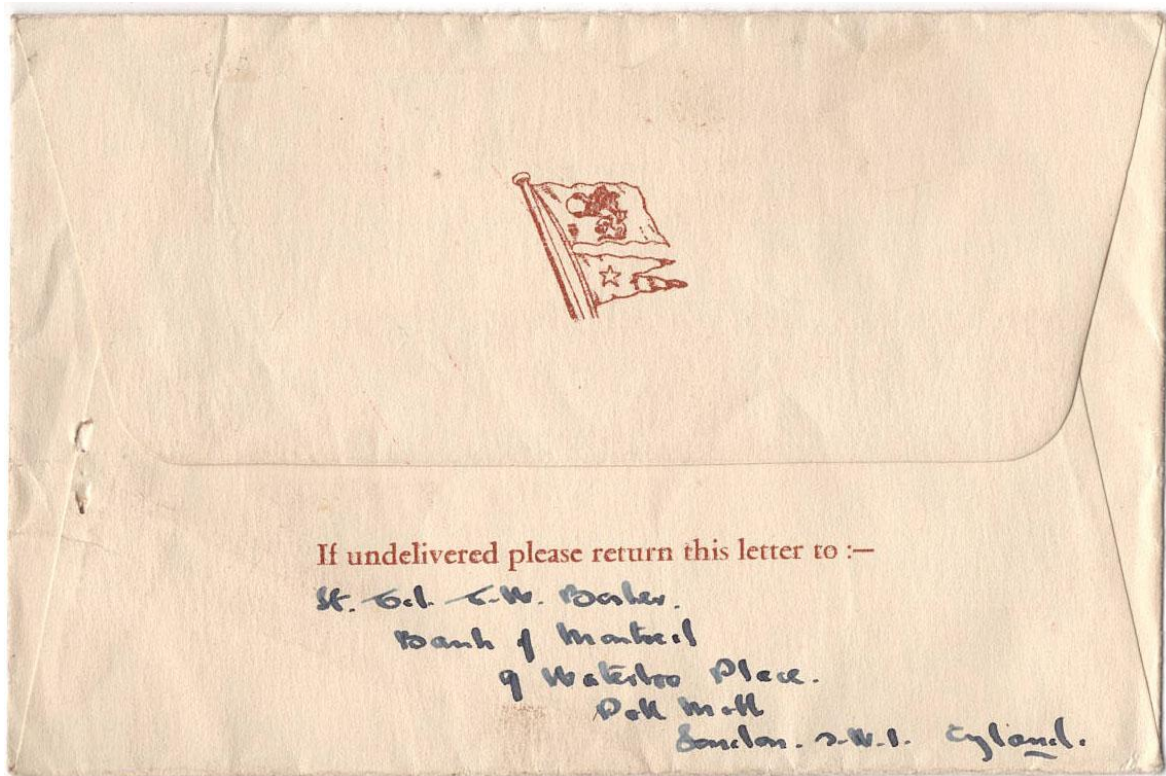
Item 671-46 – **A trio of 15¢ meters to Germany** – 1956, a trio of 15¢ Vancouver meters on Bank of Montreal cover paying 45¢ triple weight airmail letter rate to Germany. Very unusual. \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-47 – **50¢ Textile single to West Germany** – 1966, 50¢ Textile tied by Victoria, BC cds on cover, paying 50¢ airmail registered letter rate to West Germany. Vancouver transit (b/s). Rate composed of 15¢ airmail plus 35¢ registry fee. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-48 – **Letter carrier bundle tag** – c. 1971, Canada Post Office letter-carrier bundle tag, form 33-86-018 (9-71). Possibly used in Pine Hill, Que. A terrific piece of collateral. \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 671-49 – Point au Pere / Father Point Que – 1954, 3¢ Karsh pair tied by Point-au-Père Father Point PQ cds on steamship cover with British return address, paying 5¢ letter rate to West Vancouver. \$25.00 **SOLD**
