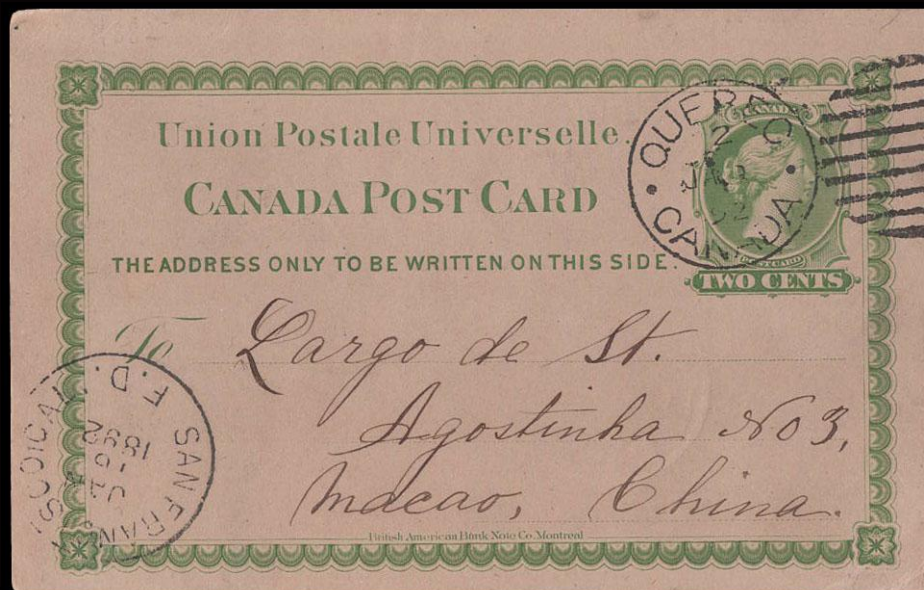

Item 675-01 – **A very early turned letter** – 1839, folded letter from Quebec rated 1/8 collect to Vittoria. The letter is addressed to F. L. Walsh, land surveyor and former Postmaster of Vittoria. Walsh refolded the letter and redirected it to Cortland Olds in Port Dover, mailed from Vittoria and rated 4½d collect. The contents concern an offer to sell 200 acres of land in Woodhouse Two for £400. Excellent exhibit piece and a very early example. \$400.00



Item 675-02 – **The rare Elizabethville UC (Durham County)** – 1858, stampless cover from Elizabethville UC paid 3d to Toronto. Routed via Port Hope and Perrytown (b/s). This Elizabethville represents the latest recorded date of only two reported examples. Excellent and rare cover. \$300.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-03 – **Toronto letter carrier greeting card** – c.1887–88, Toronto letter carrier greeting folded card, addressed to Mrs. Cartier, with the printed message “to their friends everywhere” The card is separated and held together with scotch tape. Printed by Alex & Cable of Toronto. A scarce carrier greeting card, priced in accordance with its condition. \$200.00

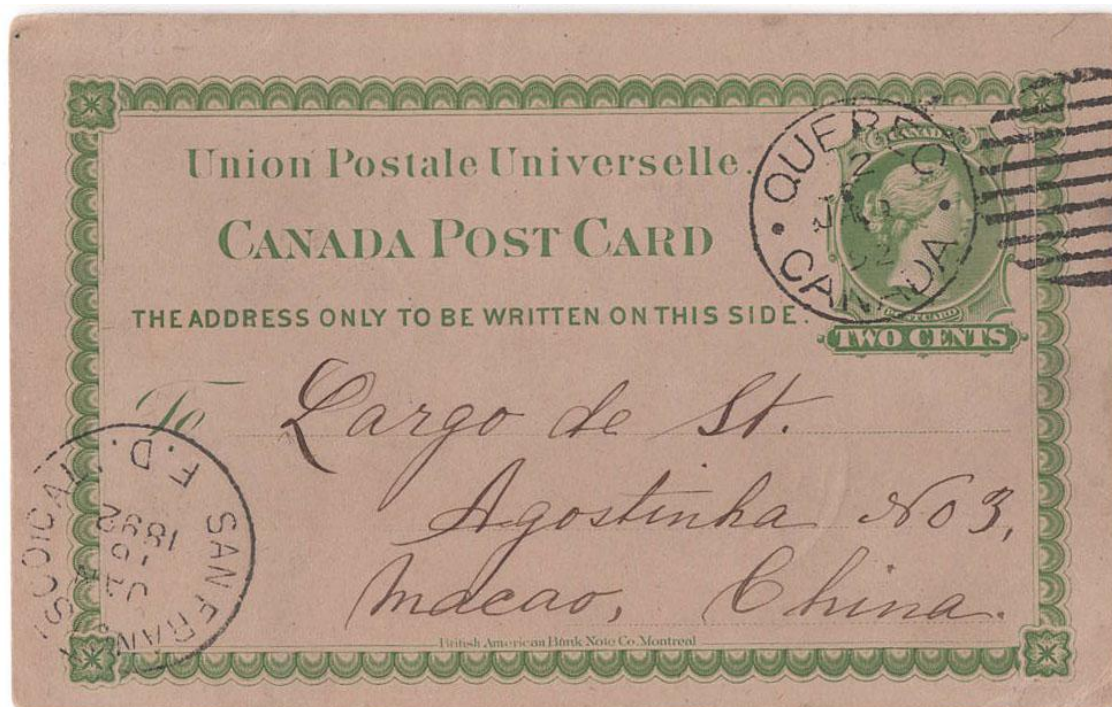




Item 675-04 – **Nicksville Ont 1874-1876 (Norfolk)** – 1876, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Nicksville Ont., in operation under that name for only two years, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Hamilton. This is the latest recorded date among only a few known examples, and a great strike. Nicksville became Nixon in 1879. The first Postmaster of both Nicksville and later Nixon was F. H. Crabb; interestingly, this card is in his handwriting and signed. One of the rarest Norfolk County postmarks. \$275.00

Item 675-05 – **2¢ UPU card P4 to Macao via Hong Kong** – 1892, 2¢ UPU P4 stationery card from Quebec dated JA 9 92, paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Macao, China (*Portuguese Colony*). Routed via San Francisco and Hong Kong, FE 11 92. This card is illustrated in Arfken's *Canada and the Universal Postal Union* handbook, p.93. Ex Lamb. Rare. \$1,000.00



Item 675-06 – **1897 damaged by Immersion in sea water** – 1897, 5¢ SQ (stamp no longer present, though almost certainly a 5¢ Small Queen) on cover from St. Norbert, Manitoba, paying the 5¢ UPU letter rate to France. Carried by the American Line St. Paul and damaged in transit, with boxed “Damaged by Immersion in Sea Water” cachet and British officially sealed VR crown label. Routed via London and Cholet receiver (b/s). A seldom-seen 1890s wreck cover, if not a wreck, likely the result of flooding in the mail hold or freight compartment. \$500.00



Item 675-07 – **Mount Forest Ont letter card registered** – 1897, 3¢ carmine setting 1 letter card uprated with a 5¢ Jubilee, mailed from Mount Forest, Ont., paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Brougham. Routed via Toronto and Markham (b/s). Type I squared circle dated NO 2 97. A very elusive and appealing registered letter card. \$350.00



Item 675-08 – **PEI registered Jubilee cover with 6¢** - 1898, 2¢ and 6¢ Jubilee tied by St. Eleanors PEI broken circle on cover paying 8¢ registered letter rate to Summerside (b/s). A very interesting and rarely seen use of the 6¢ Jubilee within PEI. \$500.00



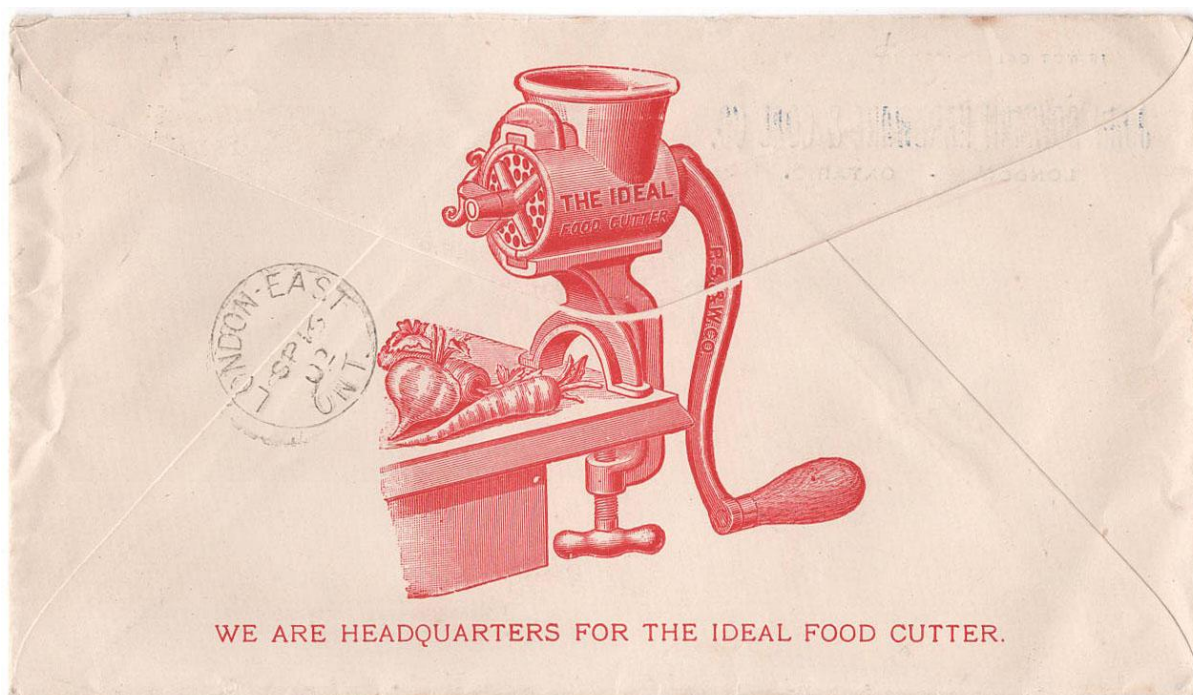
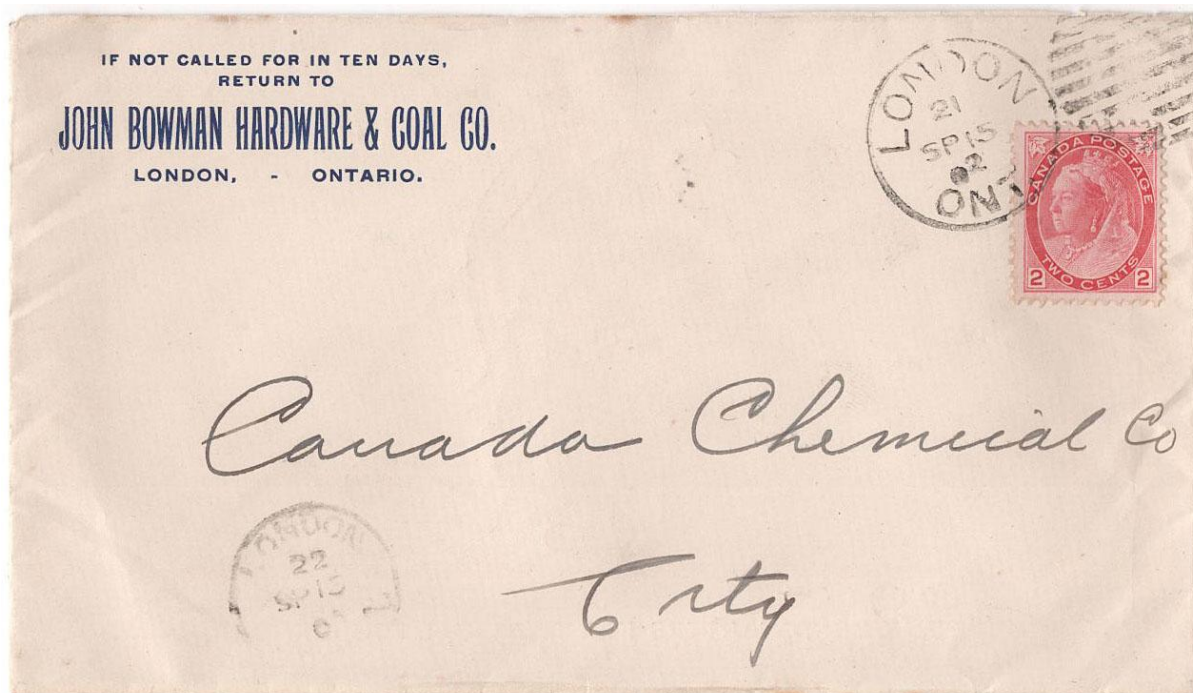
Item 675-09 – **20¢ triple weight UPU registered to Argentina** – 1900, 3¢ postal stationery envelope uprated with a 15¢ Jubilee and 2¢ Map (both cancelled by matching purple pen, registry number in same ink), mailed from Coteau Station Que., paying 20¢ triple-weight UPU registered letter rate to Argentina (b/s). Routed via Montreal and New York (b/s), with U.S. exchange registry label affixed in NYC. A spectacular and striking cover, combining a high-value 15¢ Jubilee with a Map stamp. Slightly reduced at left. \$1,000.00 **SOLD**



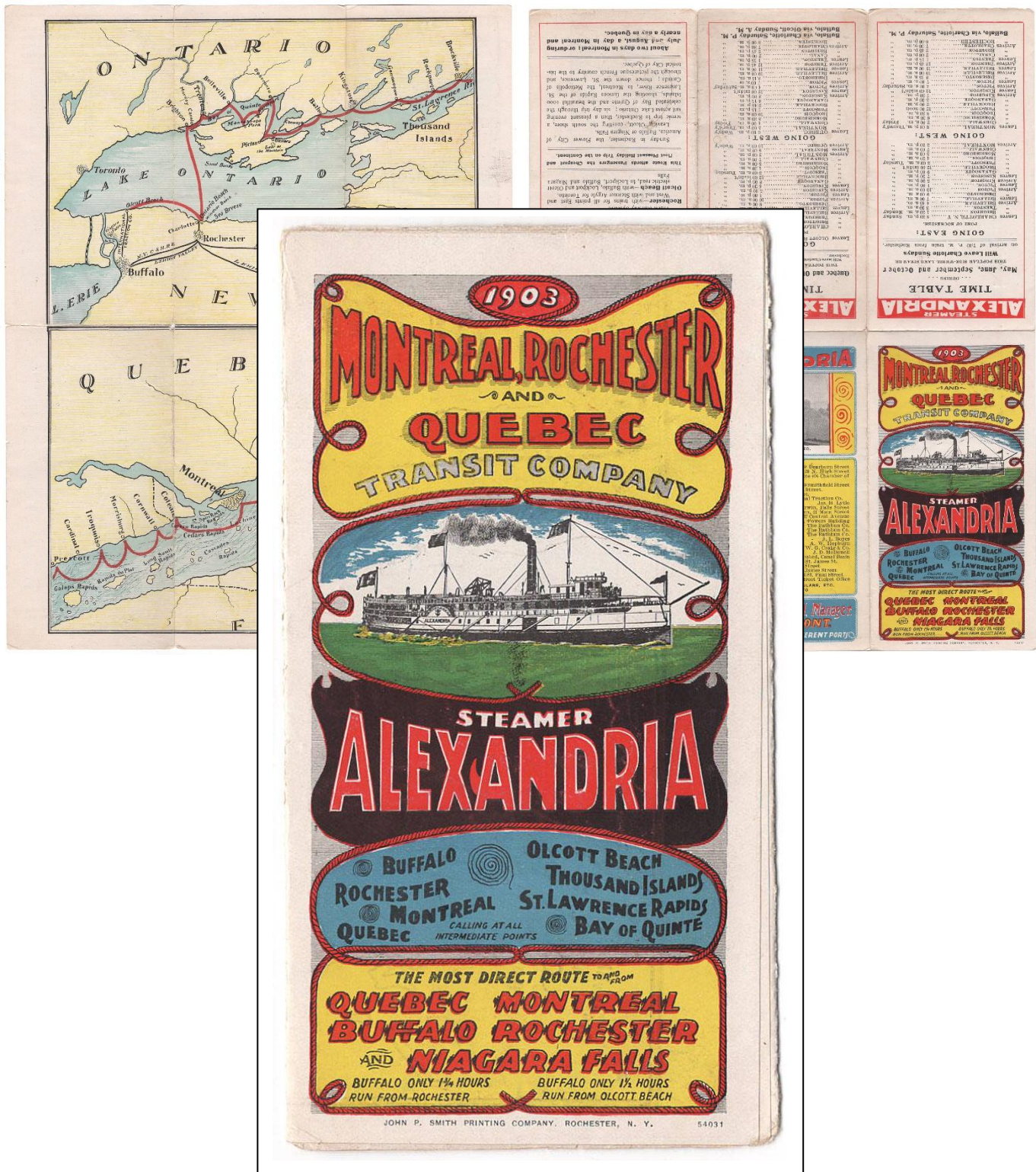
Item 675-10 – **British American Bank Note Co.** – c.1890, chopped Montreal BABN engraved memorandum letterhead with Queen Victoria portrait. \$100.00



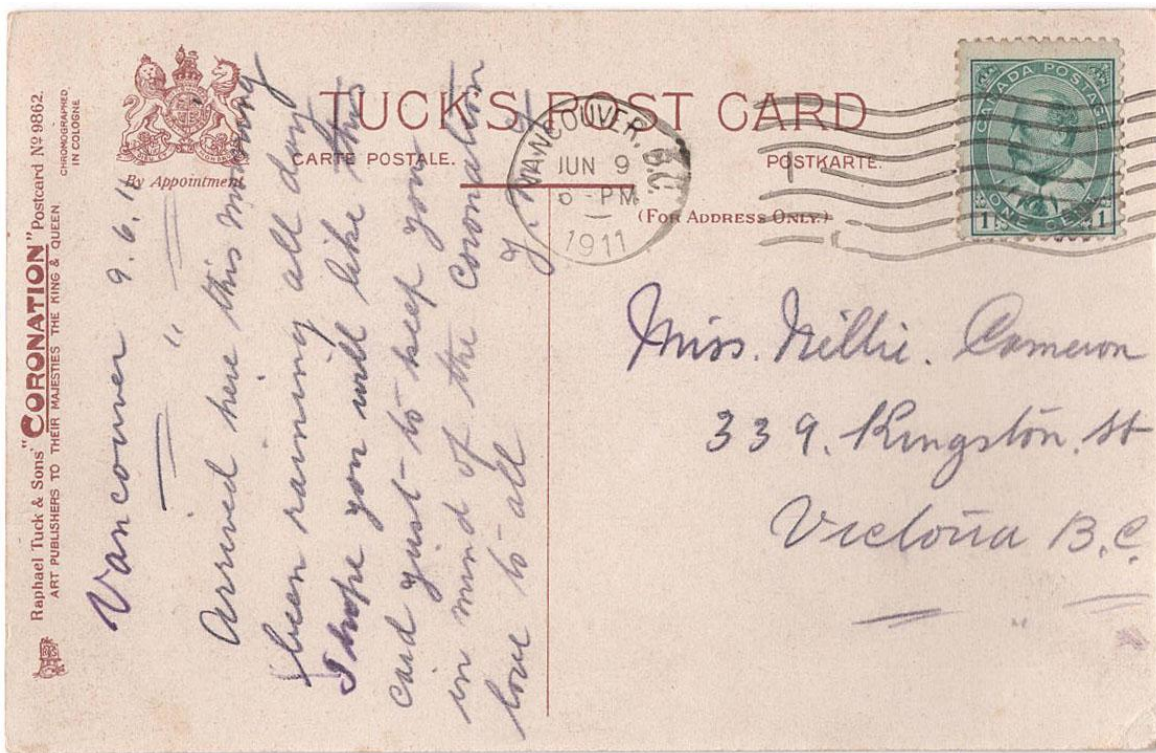
Item 675-11 – **The Canada Engraving & Litho. Co.** – c.1894–98, Canada Engraving & Litho. Co. promotional print panel, 6.5×4 inches, on cream paper, with Queen Victoria portrait. Promotes the firm's capabilities in engraving, photo-engraving, electrotyping and lithography for bonds, cheques, stamps, certificates, cards, monograms and crests. Produced when Montreal was a major centre for commercial printing and the manufacture of bank notes and postage stamps. Strong exhibit-title-page material. \$750.00



Item 675-12 – **London Hardware and Coal advertising** – 1902, 2¢ Numeral tied by London duplex cancel on John Bowman Hardware and Coal Company advertising cover; reverse with illustrated vegetables and food cutter, paying 2¢ drop-letter rate. A charming and visually appealing advertising cover. \$100.00 **SOLD**



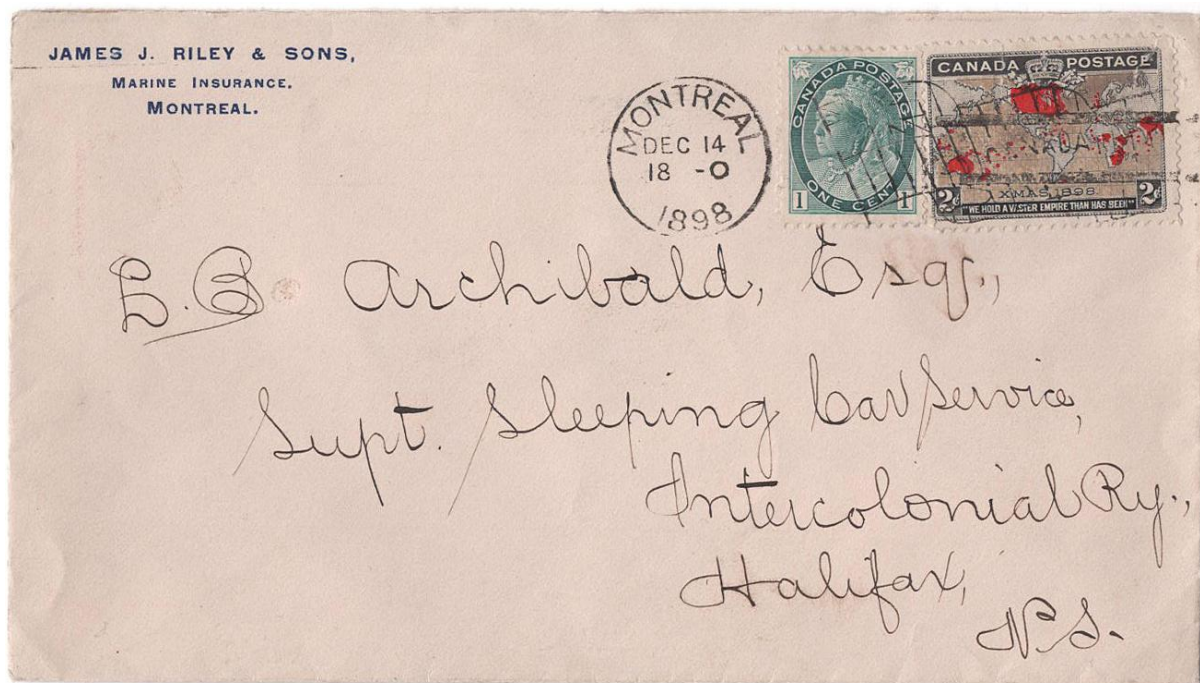
Item 675-13 – Montreal Rochester and Quebec Transit Co. – 1903, Montreal, Rochester & Quebec Transit Company timetable and map trifold pamphlet, printed in colour with the steamer Alexandria illustrated on front. Produced by J. P. Smith, Rochester, N.Y. A very scarce and attractive early navigation pamphlet. Some separations. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-14 – **George V Coronation patriotic postcard** – 1911, 1¢ Edward tied by Vancouver machine cancel, dated JU 9 11, on George V Coronation Souvenir patriotic postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to Victoria. Published by Raphael Tuck & Sons, Coronation Special Edition No. 9862. \$75.00 **SOLD**



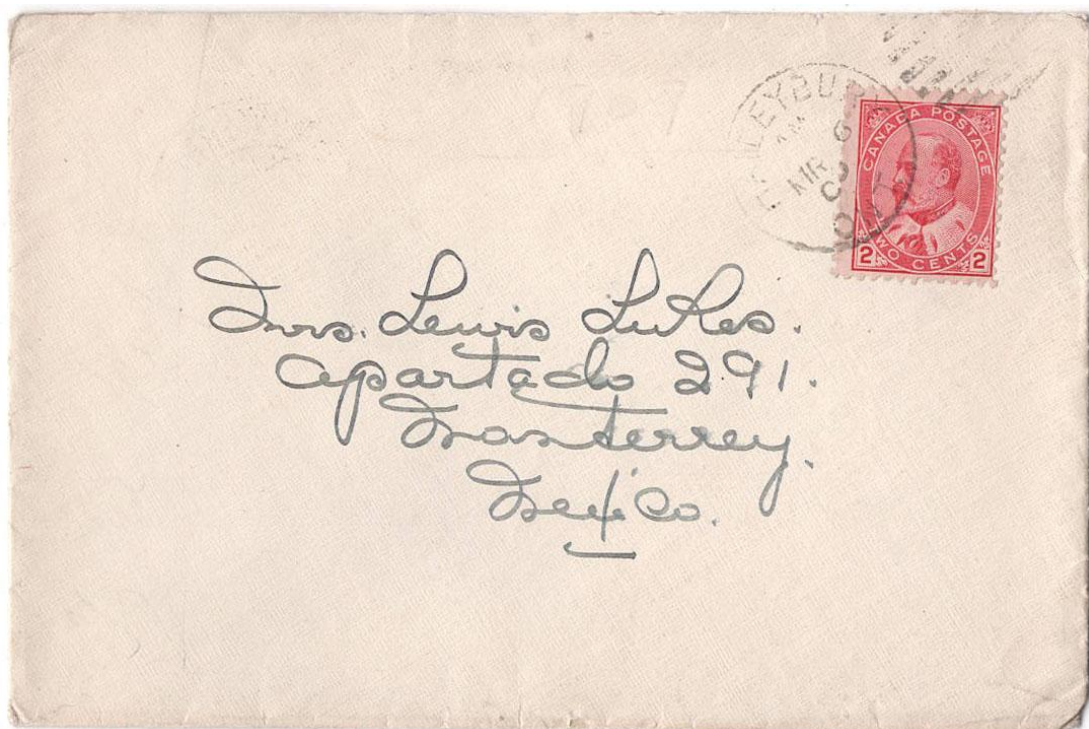
Item 675-15 – **New York to Walsingham Centre Ont (promissory note related)** – 1907, 5¢ Lincoln pair (perfs gum toned) tied by Great Kills, N.Y. duplex cancel on cover paying 10¢ registered letter rate to Walsingham Centre, Ontario (b/s). Routed via New York City and Hamilton (b/s) and carried by Canfield Junction and St. Thomas RYPO. Enclosure includes a promissory note, a letter regarding a \$5 payment, and several additional notes and pieces. A nice registered cross-border usage incoming to Norfolk County. \$75.00 **SOLD**



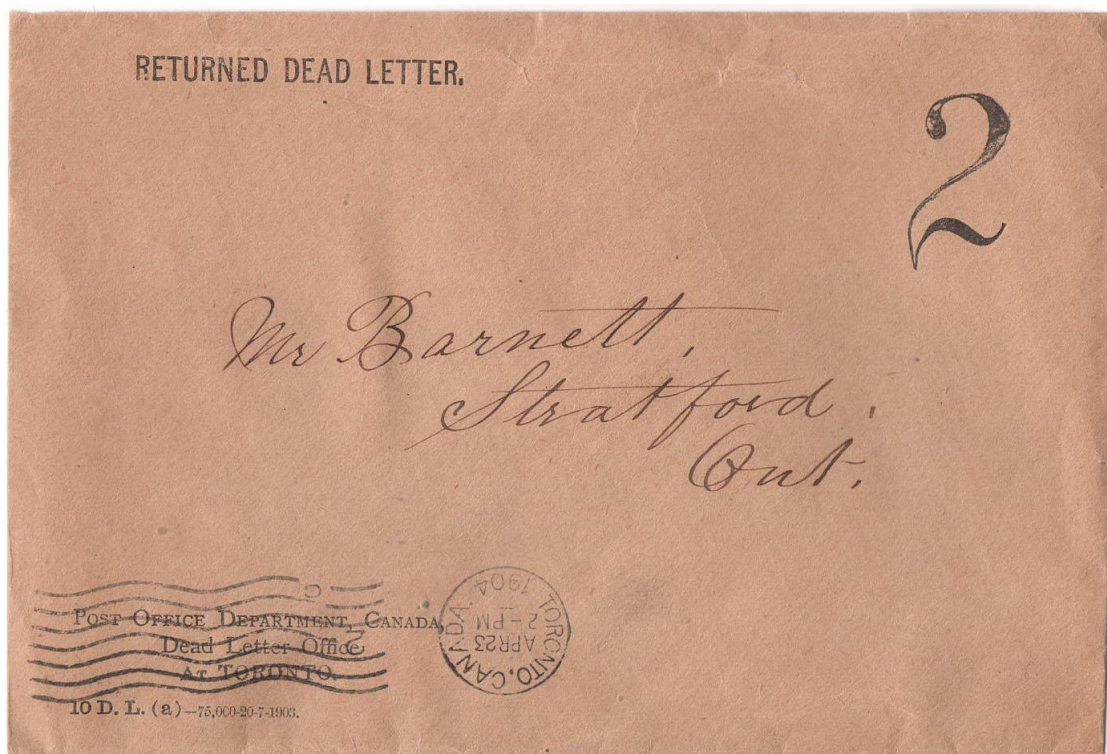
Item 675-16 – **December 14** – 1898, 1¢ Numeral and 2¢ Map tied by Montreal Bickerdike machine cancel dated DE 14 98 paying 3¢ letter rate to Halifax (b/s). A clean and attractive early pre-official first-day use. Ex Smallman. \$250.00



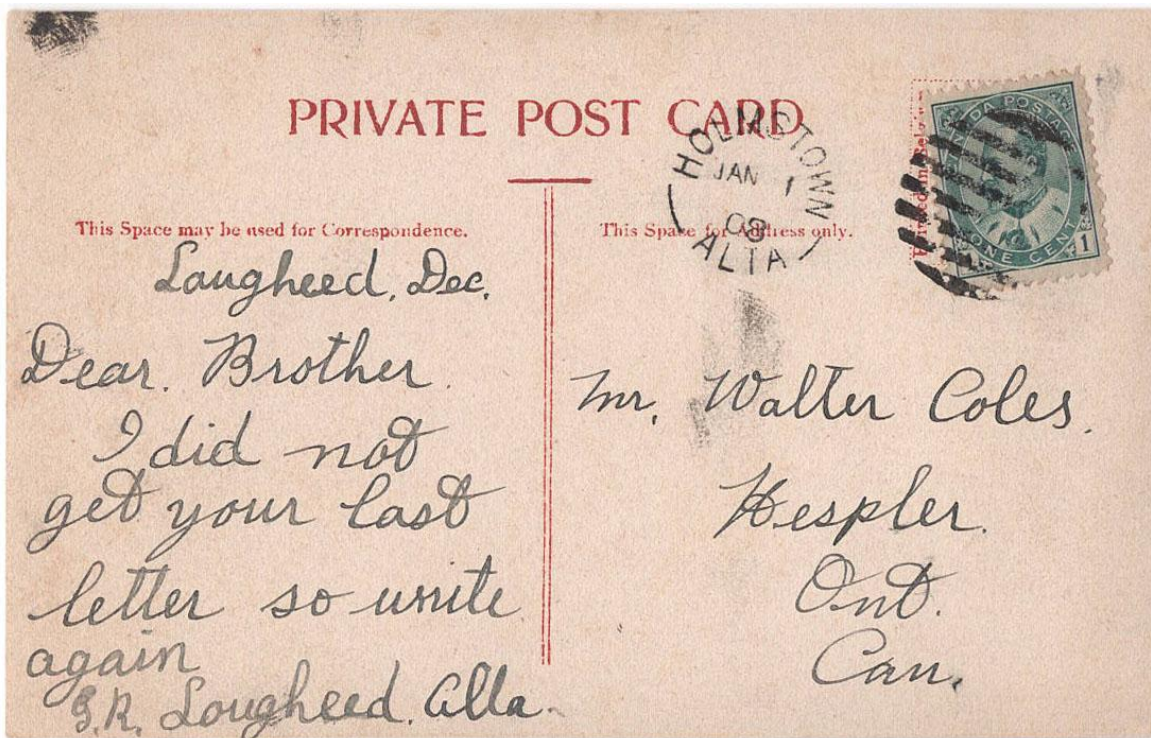
Item 675-17 – **Group of lady snowshoeing postcard** – 1905, 1¢ Edward tied by Montreal machine cancel on Groupe de Raquetteuses / Group of Lady Snowshoeing postcard, paying 1¢ postcard rate to St. Jean Port Joli. Published by J. P. Garneau. A charming postcard. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-18 – **2¢ letter rate to Monterrey, Mexico** – 1909, 2¢ Edward tied by Haileybury, Ont. duplex cancel on cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Mexico (b/s). A very scarce destination for any era. \$75.00



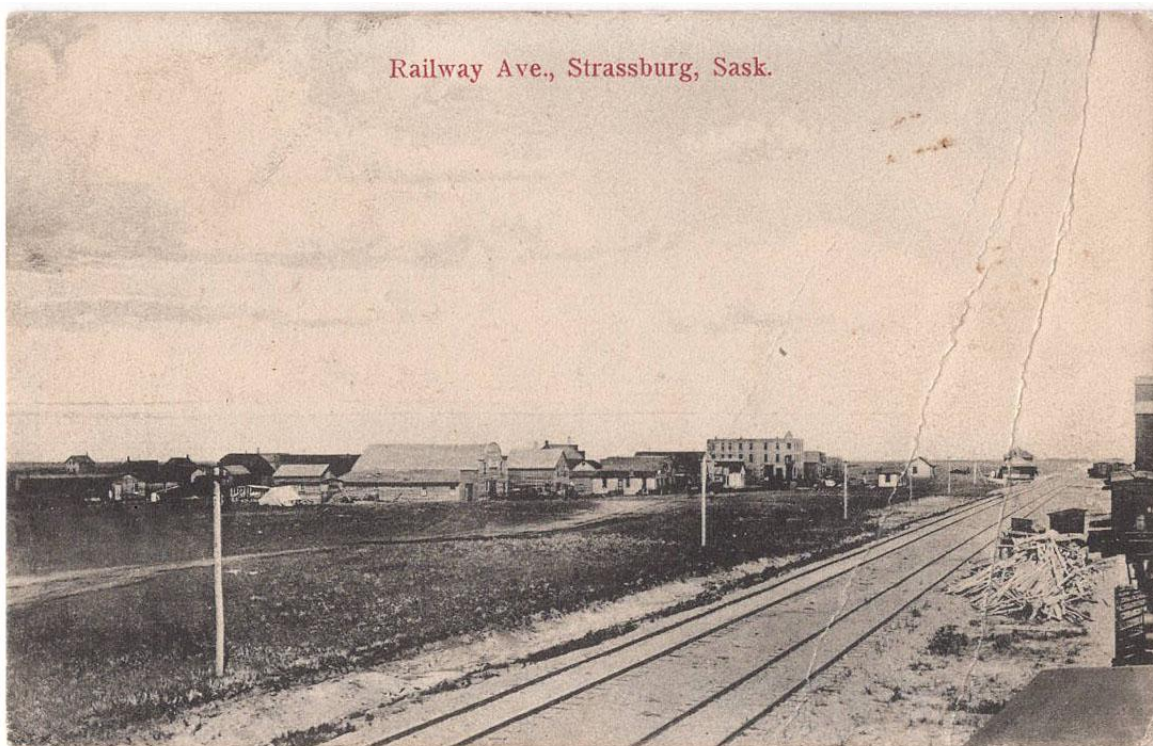
Item 675-19 – **Dead Letter Office return envelope to Stratford** – 1904, Post Office Dept. Dead Letter Office return envelope (Form 75,000, 20-7-1903), mailed from Toronto and rated 2¢ collect to Stratford (b/s). Features a sharp, bold "2" rate handstamp. \$50.00 **SOLD**



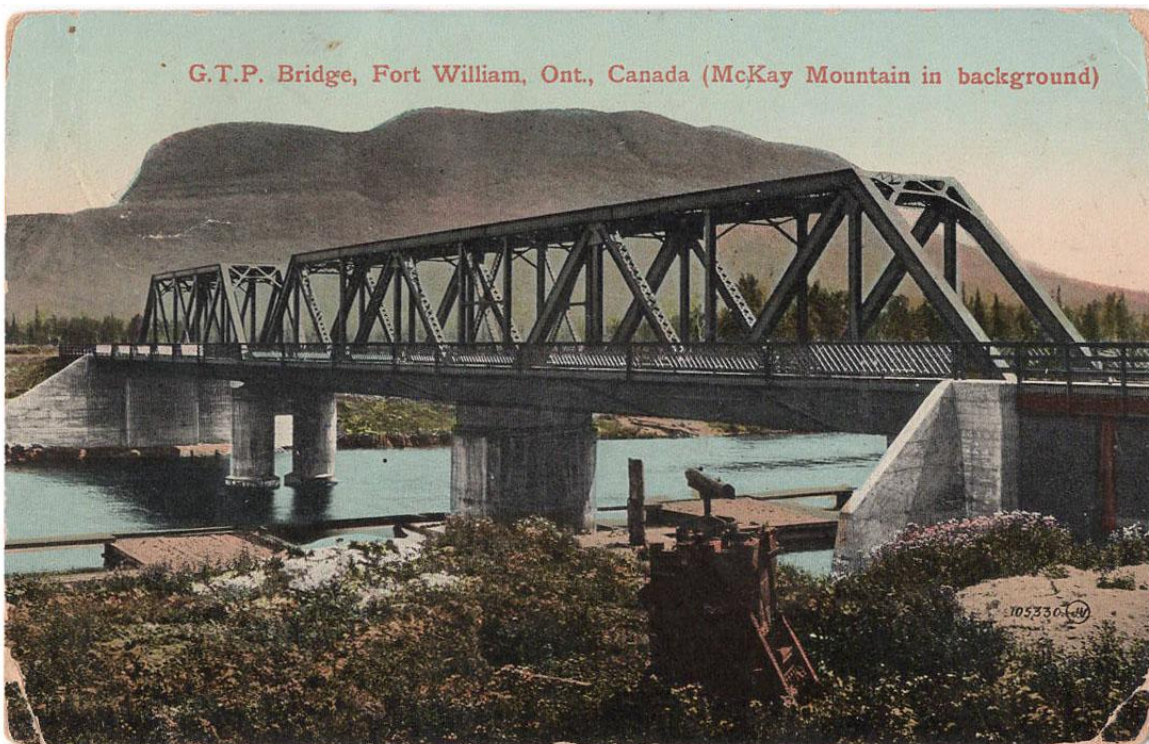
Item 675-20 – **Holmstown Alberta (RF E, 1906-1909)** – 1908, 1¢ Edward tied by grid cancel on Carberry, Manitoba CPR Station picture postcard from Holmstown, Alta. (RF E, 1906–1909), paying 1¢ postcard rate to Hespeler. A superb strike of this very elusive Albertan office. \$200.00



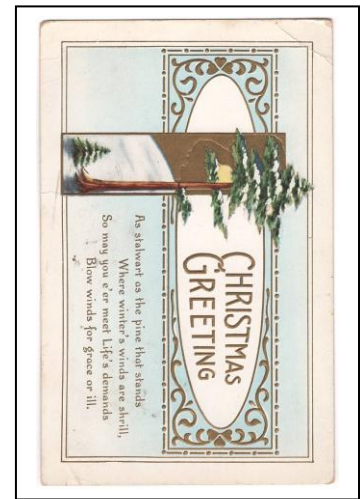
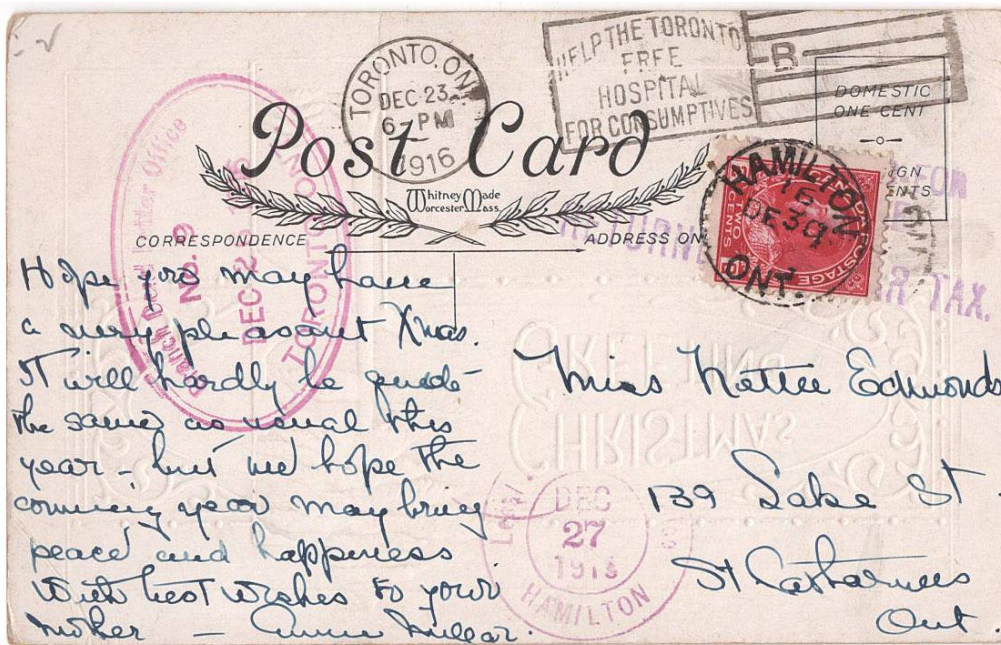
Item 675-21 – **Lakeside Que (Island of Montreal, 1899-1922)** – 1908, 2¢ Quebec Tercentenary cancelled by partial grid cancel on ND Photo postcard No. 314 (*Cape Diamond and Old Houses*), paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to France and redirected to Switzerland. Lakeside, Que. is a scarce Montreal office, in operation from 1899 to 1922; later reopened as Montreal-Lakeside Sub Office, located in Pointe-Claire. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-22 – **Whitewater Man and Strassburg Station Sask (old spelling RF D)** – 1909, 1¢ Edward tied by Strassburg Station, Sask. duplex cancel on Strassburg Railway Avenue postcard, paying 1¢ postcard rate to Whitewater, Man. (RF C). This duplex shows the original spelling Strassburg (Robinson RF D), with only one hammer known, Cloutier DSA-802, proofed JA 06 09. A decidedly scarce Saskatchewan duplex cancel. \$100.00



Item 675-23 – **Fort William returned for Wartax** – 1911, 1¢ Admiral booklet stamp tied by Fort William, Ont. cds on GTP Bridge picture postcard to Upland, Nebraska. Caught and returned for War Tax via Winnipeg DLO, bearing the very scarce scalloped oval Branch DLO Winnipeg handstamp; postage collected, 1¢ added, and forwarded to destination. An unusual and appealing DLO/War Tax handling. \$100.00



Item 675-24 – **Returned for Wartax** – 1916, Christmas postcard mailed unpaid from Toronto, bearing Toronto Free Hospital slogan, to St. Catharines, Ont. Caught in Toronto with Returned for War Tax and struck with oval Toronto DLO No. 9. Not returned, but sent on to the Hamilton local DLO for collection; 2¢ Admiral added about a week later and forwarded to destination. A nice card! \$75.00



Item 675-25 – **Royal Army Medical Corps** – c.1915, Great War Medical Corps personnel posing with carriage, real photo postcard showing three sergeants and medical troops. Unused, divided back. Although British RAMC and Canadian RCAMC uniforms appeared very similar during WWI, often sharing Red Cross patches and other medical gear, they were not identical: Canadians typically wore higher-quality cloth, different buttons, distinct cap badges, and RCAMC-specific insignia. The men here show none of the Canadian traits; with no leather boots and no Sam Browne belts, this group is unquestionably British RAMC. \$50.00

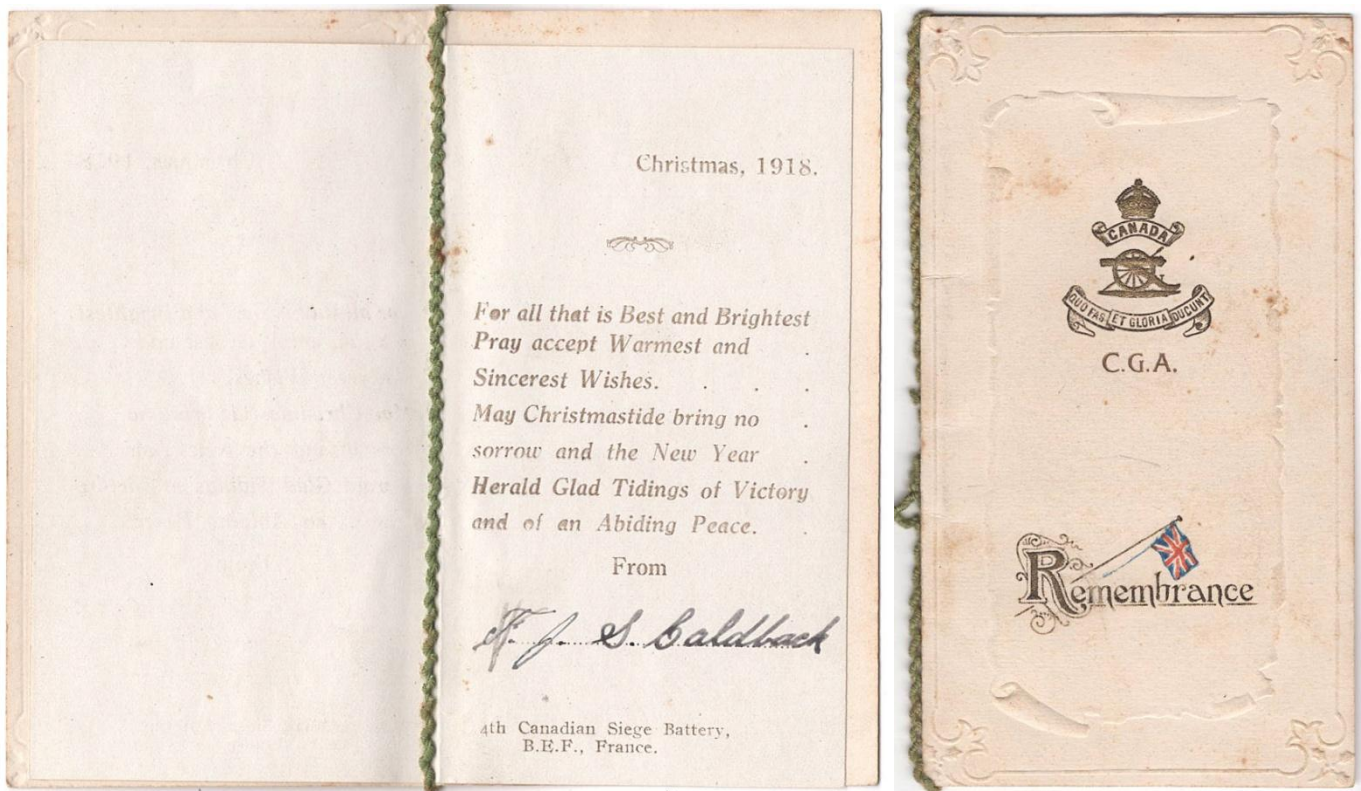

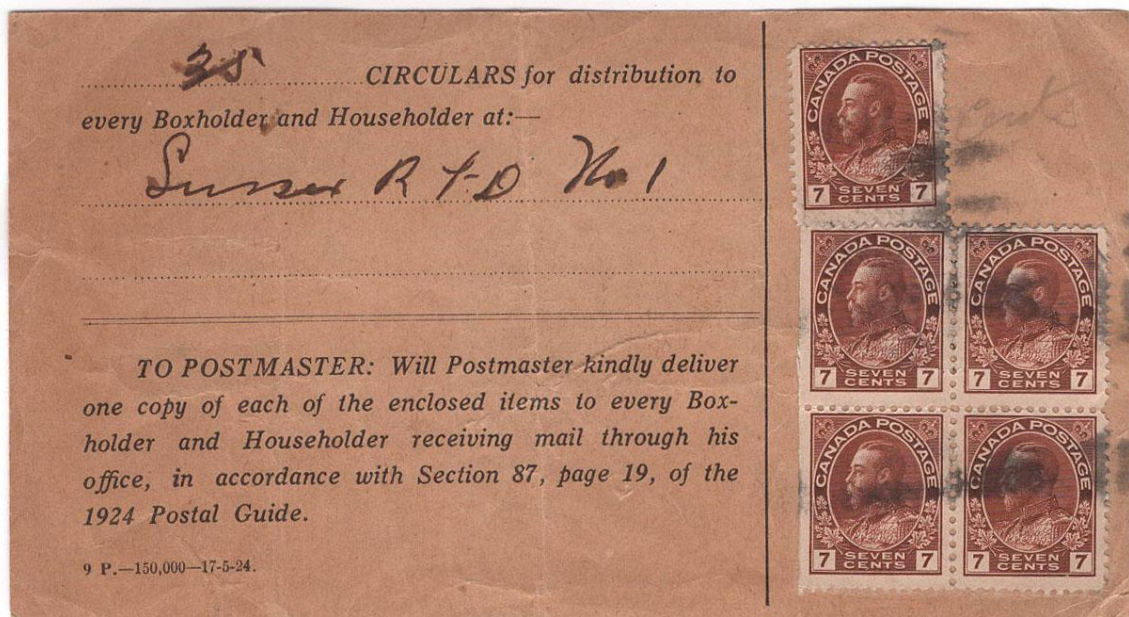

The pamphlet promotes excursion tickets and afternoon trips between Oka, Como, Hudson, and Montreal, with additional illustrations etc. Good condition and scarce. \$150.00 **SOLD**



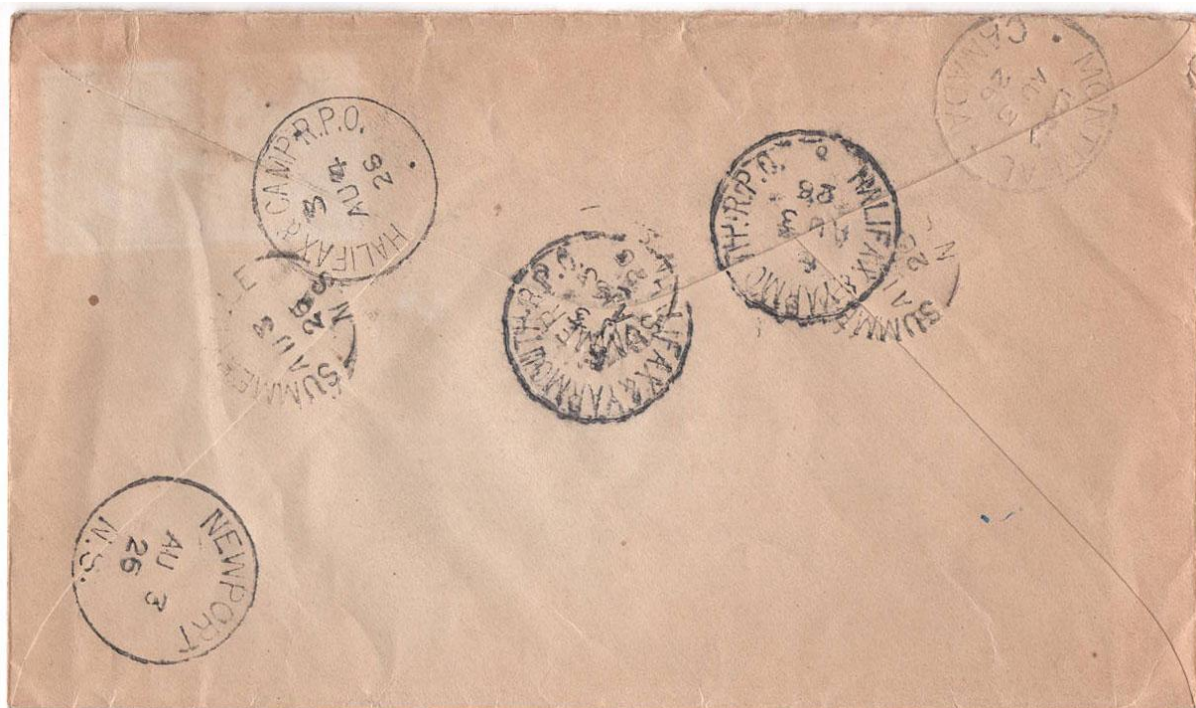
Item 675-27 – **Director-signed funeral home letter** – 1917, 3¢ Confederation (#135) tied by Winnipeg machine cancel on J. Thomson Co. Funeral Home advertising cover, with letter, paying 3¢ letter rate to Iowa. WWI Liberty Loan slogan cancel on front. The enclosed letter, written on an attractive illustrated letterhead, discusses funeral arrangements and business matters, and is signed by Director J. Thomson. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-28 – **Christmas 1918 4th Canadian Siege Battery** – 1918, Christmas card in booklet form, signed from the 4th Canadian Siege Battery, B.E.F. in France. The cover features an RCA crest with “CGA,” representing the Canadian Garrison Artillery, which evolved from coastal defence units into heavy and siege artillery formations within the CEF. A very attractive Great War Christmas item with strong character. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-29 – **7¢ Admiral brown on distribution receipt** – c.1924, 7¢ Admiral brown (one single and one block) tied by smudge cancels on circular receipt for 35 circulars distributed on Sussex, NB Rural Mail Route No. 1. An exceedingly unusual franking and a very scarce usage of the 7¢ brown. \$150.00 **SOLD**



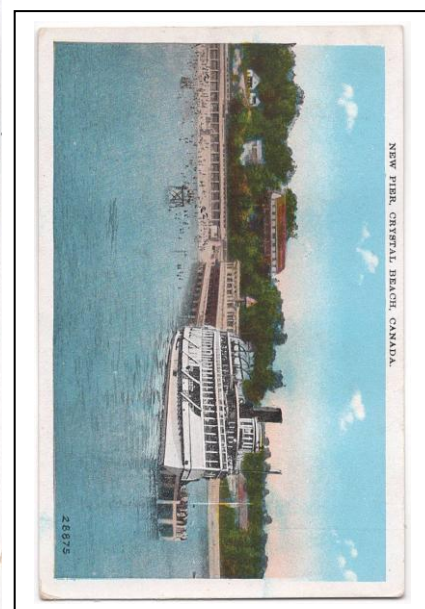
Item 675-30 – **Summerville NS Keyhol (Hants)** – 1926, 2¢, 10¢ Admiral tied by grid cancel on cover from Summerville N.S. paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Montreal (b/s). Keyhole registration handstamp. Newport transit and carried by Halifax & Yarmouth RPO and Halifax & Camp RPO. Hants County. \$25.00 **SOLD**



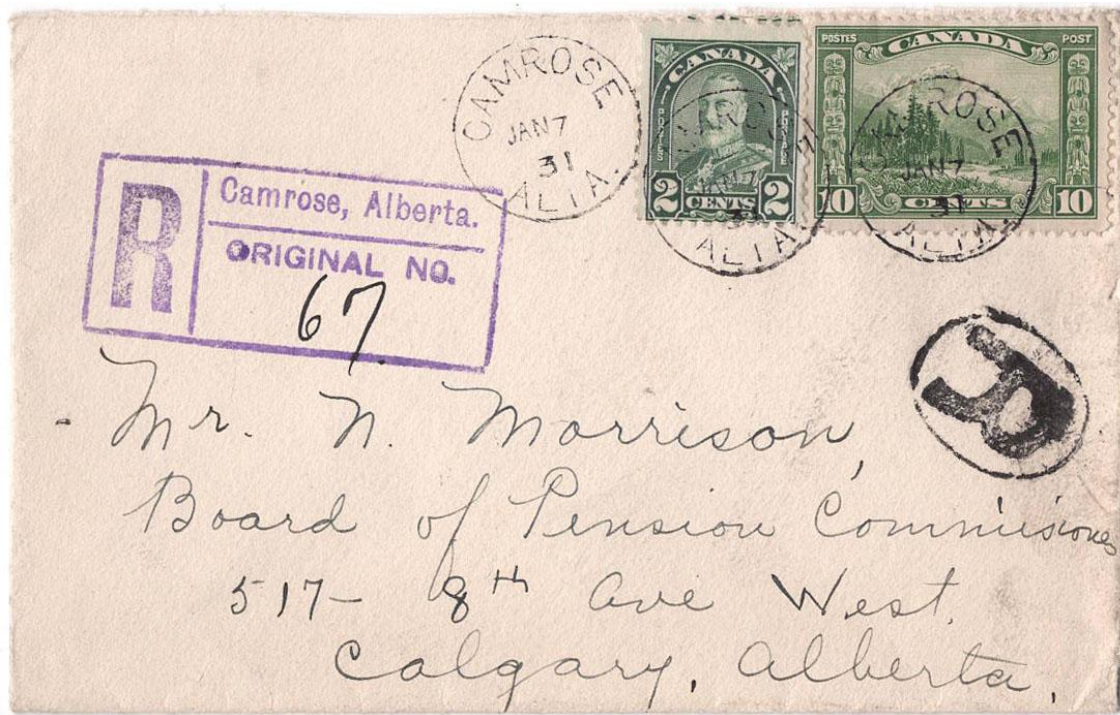
Item 675-31 – **Reindeer Flour advertising** – 1923, 1¢, 2¢ Admiral tied by grid cancels on C.B. Hamm c/c and Reindeer advertising cover from Queensboro Ont, all struck in purple ink, paying 3¢ letter rate to Hamilton. A striking and really nice advertising usage. Hastings County. \$100.00



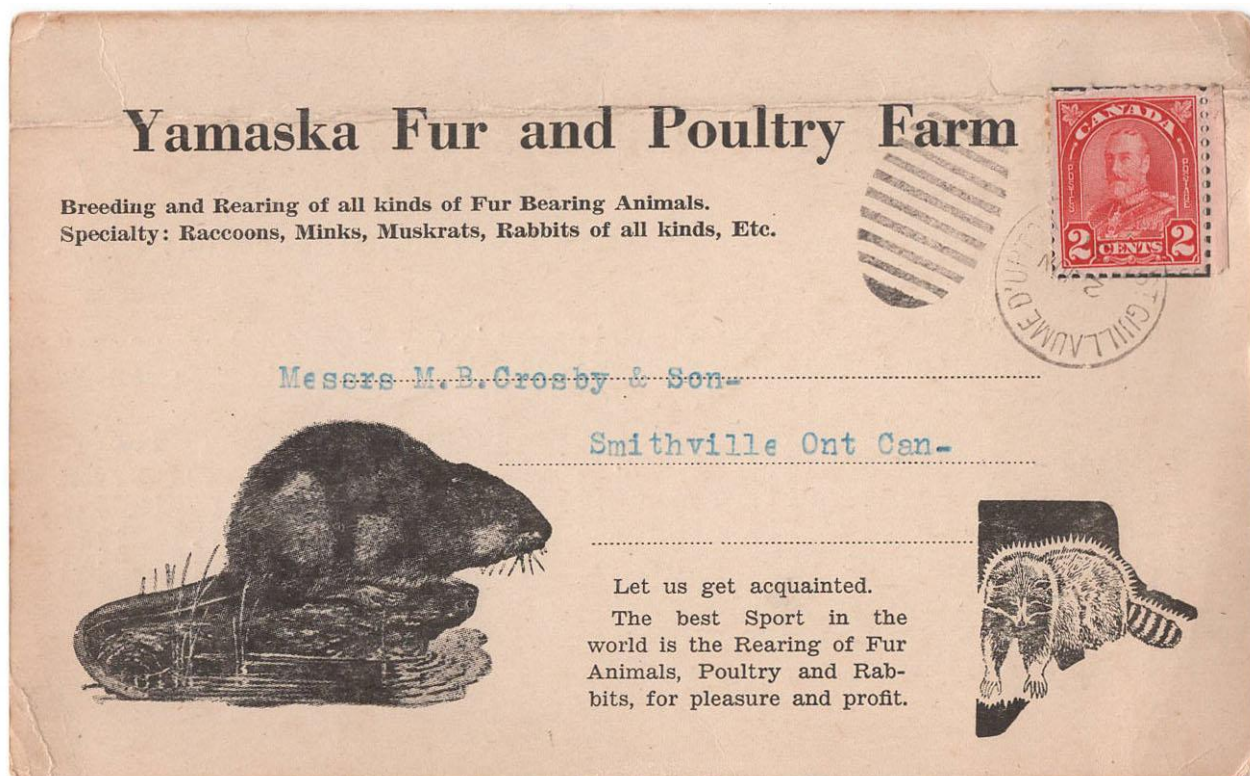
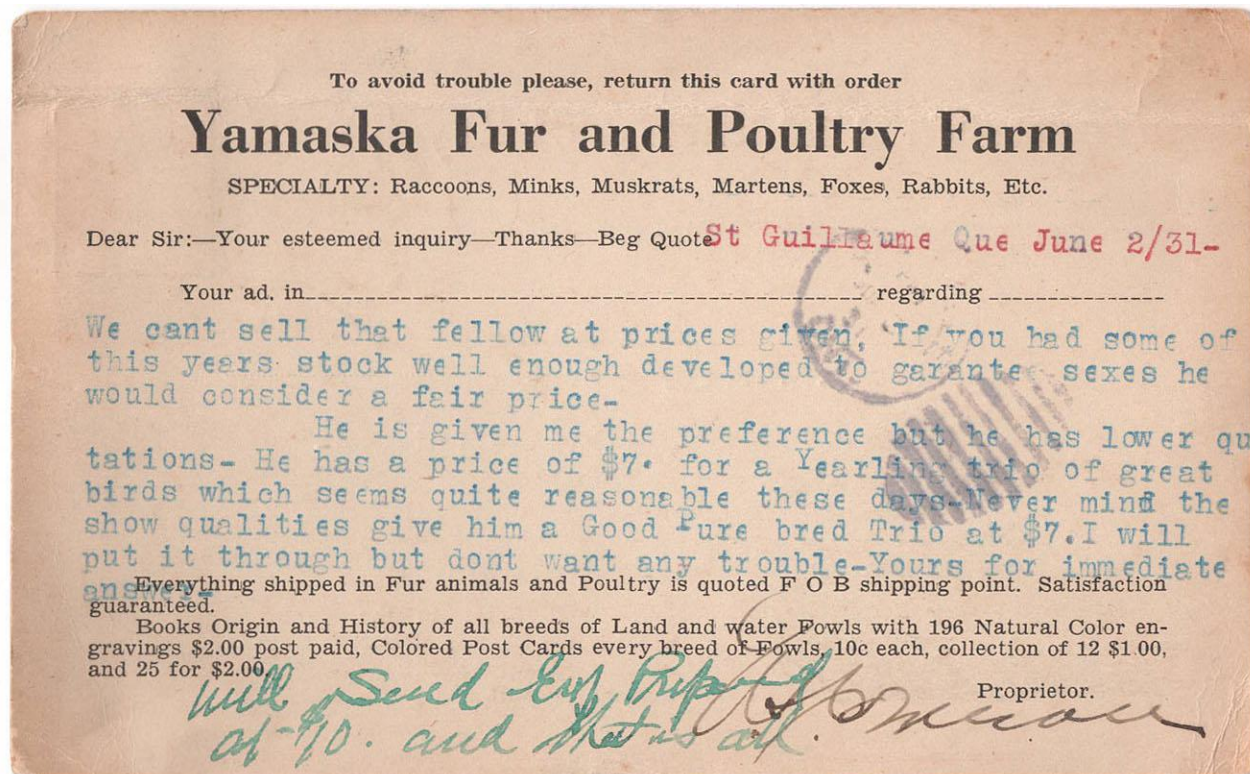
Item 675-32 – **Port Nelson Ont compulsory registered in Burlington** – 1930, 2¢ Scroll tied by Port Nelson, Ont. cds on cover dated JU 19 30, paying 2¢ letter rate to Hamilton. Received in Burlington the same day (JU 19 30). While in Burlington, the cover was presumably found to contain valuables and was therefore compulsorily registered, with a pair of 5¢ Scroll added and tied by Burlington cds dated JU 20 30, then forwarded to Hamilton and received the same day. Compulsory registered covers are very scarce and seldom encountered. A fascinating illustration of the registry system in action. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-33 – **Two 2¢ Arch on card to Germany** – 1931, two 2¢ Arch stamps tied by Crystal Beach, Ont. duplex cancel on Steamer docked at Crystal Beach pier picture postcard, paying 4¢ UPU postcard rate to Germany. A very unusual and particularly nice use of the 2¢ Arch. \$25.00



Item 675-34 – **Camrose Alberta registered** – 1931, 10¢ Scroll and 2¢ Arch tied by Camrose, Alta. cds on cover paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Calgary (b/s). Carried on the Saskatoon–Hardisty & Edmonton RPO No. 4. Reverse shows an attractive family crest Coat of Arms. A nice cover. \$25.00 **SOLD**



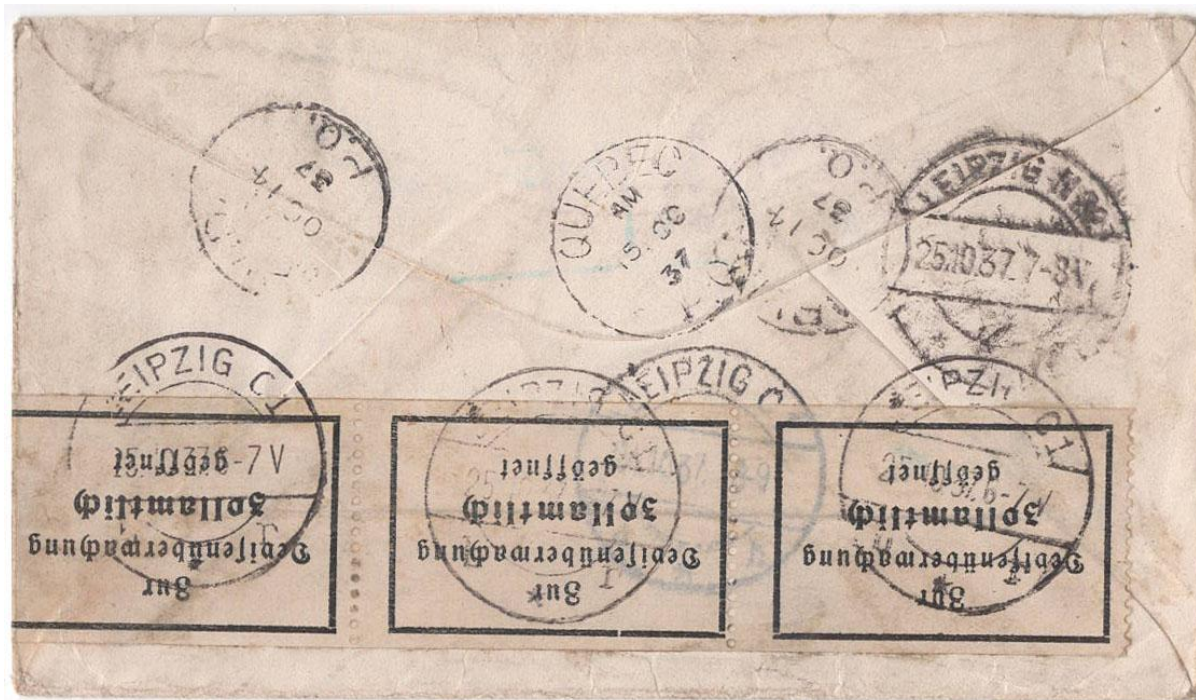
Item 675-35 – Yamaska Fur and Poultry Farm private postcard – 1931, 2¢ Arch tied by St. Guillaume-d’Upton PQ duplex cancel on large Yamaska Fur and Poultry Farm private postcard, paying 2¢ postcard rate to Smithville Ont. Illustrated with Beaver and Raccoon. A light fold at the upper part of the card. \$50.00 **SOLD**



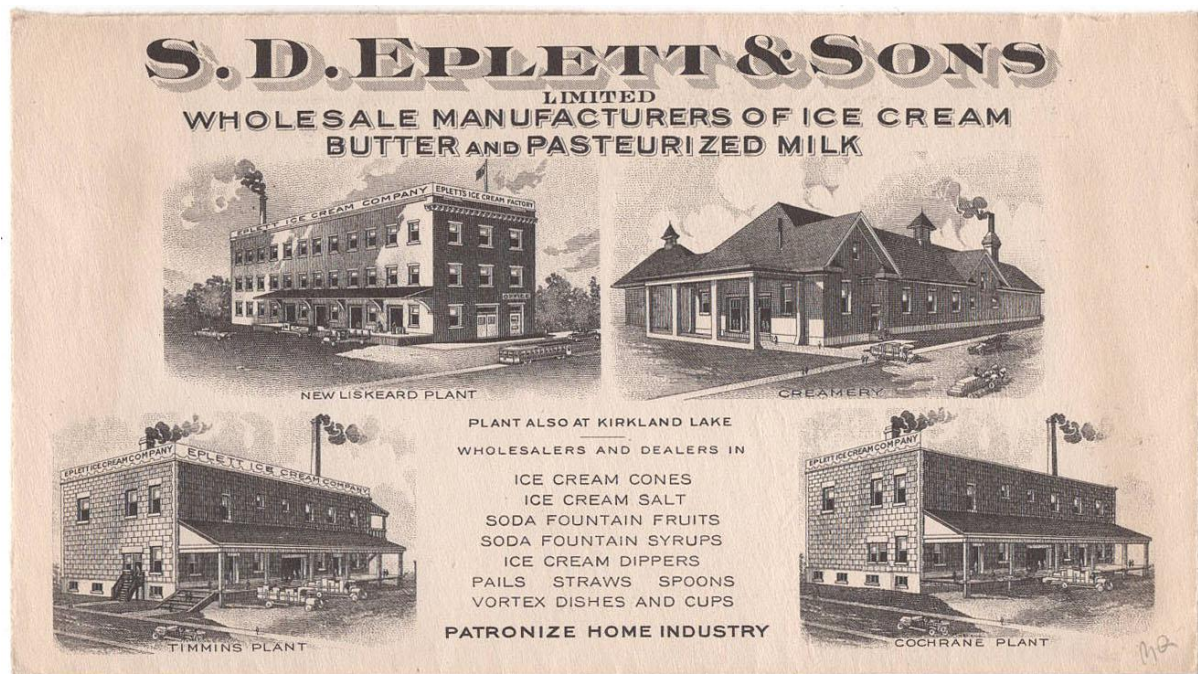
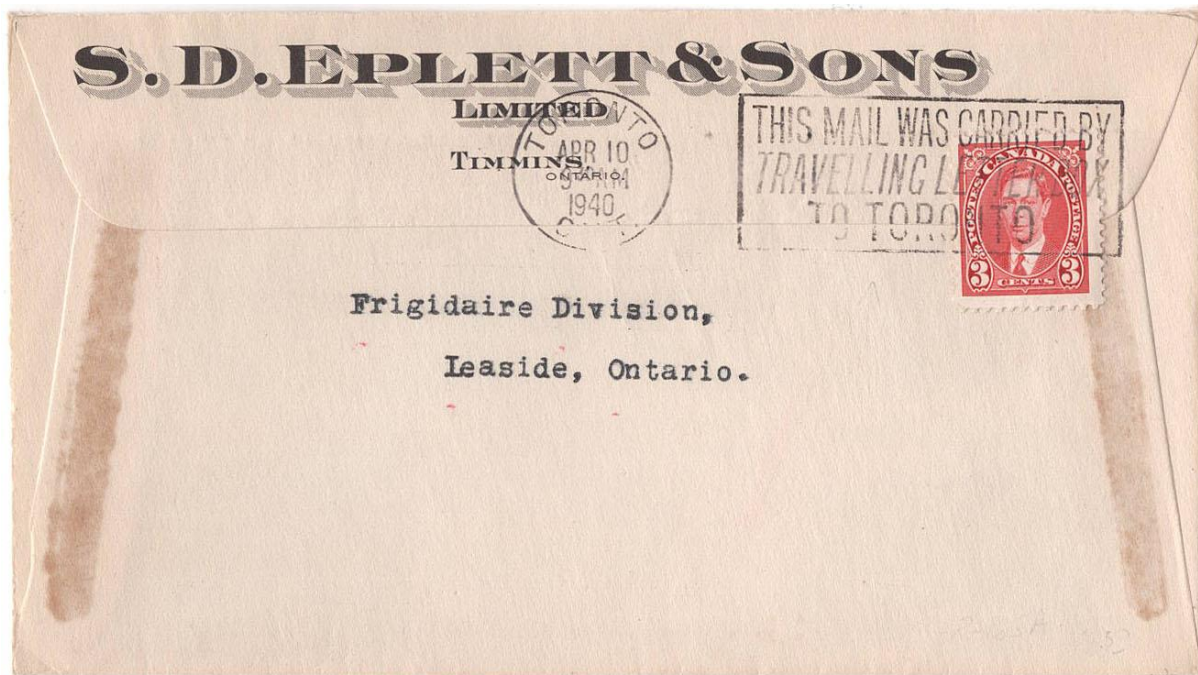
Item 675-36 – **CPR Airmail Special Delivery underpaid** – 1936, 2¢ (5), 3¢ (2) Pictorial tied by North Bay & Fort William RPO cds on Canadian Pacific Railway c/c cover underpaying 26¢ airmail special delivery rate to California. Manuscript "Tax 20¢" in black crayon. Two U.S. 10¢ postage due stamps were applied and cancelled upon payment in Los Angeles. At this time, the special delivery fee had remained at 20¢ for 15 years. An interesting underpaid special delivery usage with foreign postage due stamps. \$150.00



Item 675-37 – **Dead Letter Office return envelope, 5¢ collect** – 1937, Canada Post Office return envelope with boxed Inspection Service D.L.O. Ottawa handstamp, Form 6D (100,000-6-1-37), mailed from Ottawa with "5¢ collect" to St. Catharines and redirected to Toronto. Shows a very attractive and sharp "5" rate handstamp, with due stamps affixed as proof of payment. Roughly opened at top. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-38 – **Arvida Que 15¢ UPU registered to Germany** – 1937, 13¢ Pictorial and 2¢ Mufti tied by Arvida PQ cds on cover paying 15¢ UPU registered letter rate to Germany, routed via Quebec (b/s). Upon arrival, the cover was opened by the German Currency Control Authority, officially sealed, and struck with the handstamp “Opened under the Currency Control Act.” Germany had introduced strict currency-control legislation in 1937, both to support large-scale rearmament and to exert pressure on domestic financial assets. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-39 – Timmins Ont, ice cream & dairy advertising – 1940, 3¢ Mufti on S.D. Eplett & Son Ice Cream, Butter and Pasteurized Milk advertising cover from Timmins Ontario, paying 3¢ letter rate to Leaside. Carried by Travelling Letter Box to Toronto, where it was cancelled on arrival at Union Station. A pretty Northern Ontario advertising cover. \$100.00

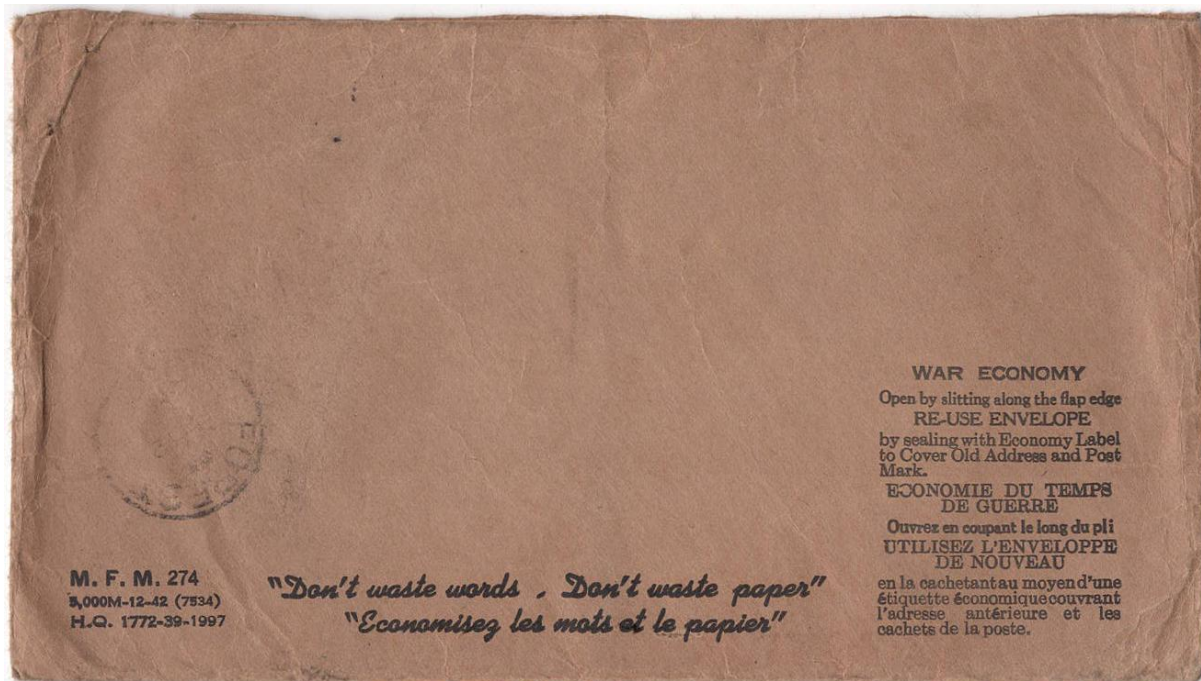

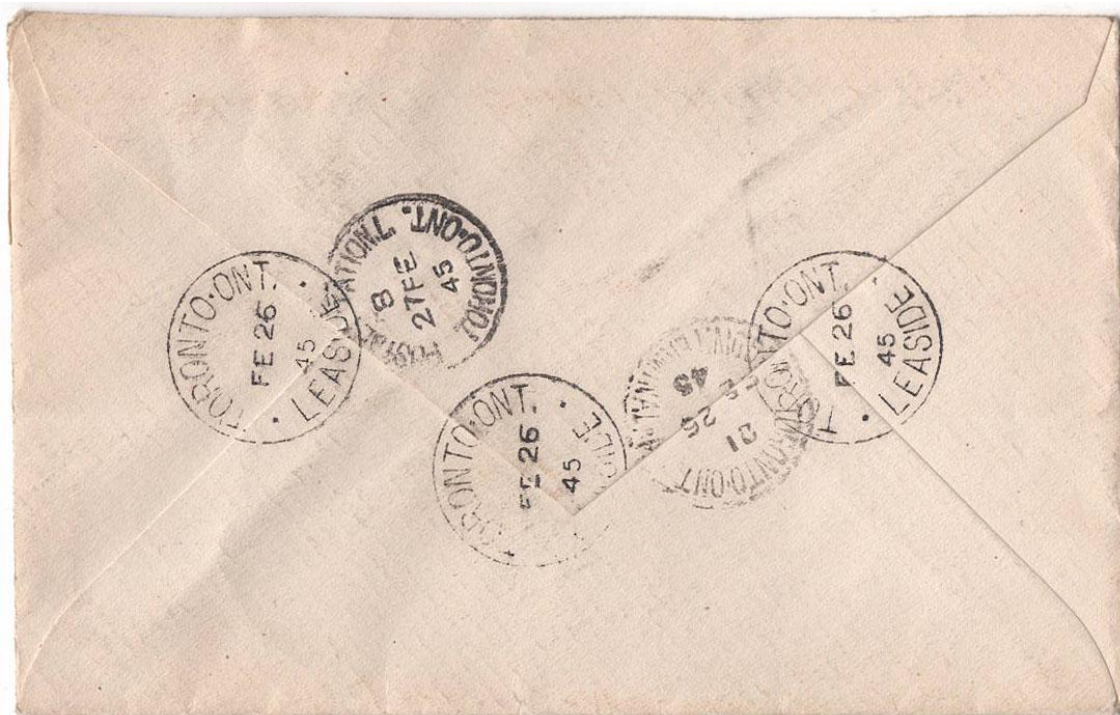
Item 675-40 – **RBC shortpaid cover to Belgium** – 1940, 3¢ Mufti tied by Charlottetown PEI machine cancel on censored RBC cover underpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Belgium. Rated “T20” converted to 1Fr40c postage due. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-41 – **Buckingham Cigarettes** – 1942, Hamilton 1¢ meter with radio-program slogan on Tuckett Ltd. and Buckingham Cigarettes advertising cover paying 1¢ printed-matter rate locally. A neat cover. \$25.00 **SOLD**



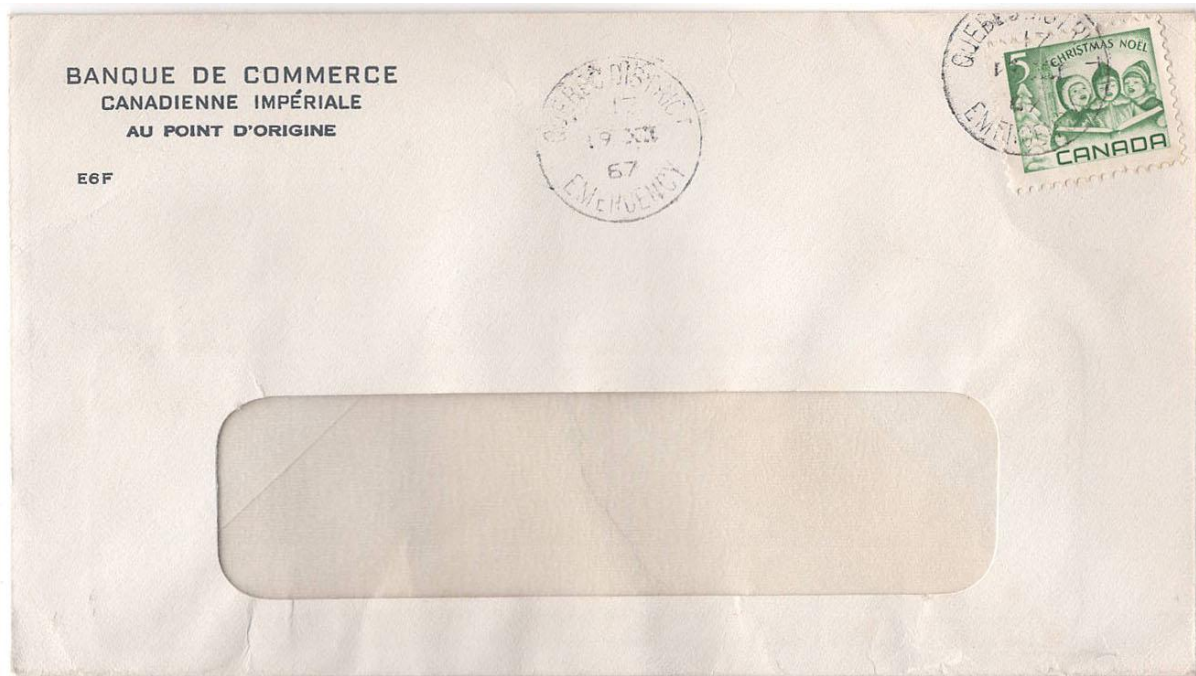
Item 675-42 – London Ont MPO 113 registered – 1946, 4¢, 10¢ War tied by London MPO 113 cds on War Economy envelope with label (both military forms), paying 14¢ registered letter rate to Forest Ont. (b/s). Addressed to Pte. W.D. Brand, A-125425. Scarce. \$75.00



Item 675-43 – **Toronto Leaside double weight drop registered** – 1945, 14¢ War tied by Toronto Ont Leaside cds on cover paying 14¢ double weight drop registered letter rate (3¢+1¢+10¢). Toronto Leaside and Station L (b/s). \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-45 – **8¢ War use to Jamaica** – 1942, 8¢ War, 6¢ Airmail tied by Debert MPO 603 cds on cover paying 20¢ airmail letter rate to Jamaica (b/s). A scarce use of the 8¢ War issue to a foreign destination. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 675-46 – **Quebec District Emergency** – 1967, 5¢ Christmas tied by Quebec District Emergency cds on window banking cover dated DE 19 67. An appealing and timely use of the emergency postmark during the Christmas period. \$50.00 **SOLD**
