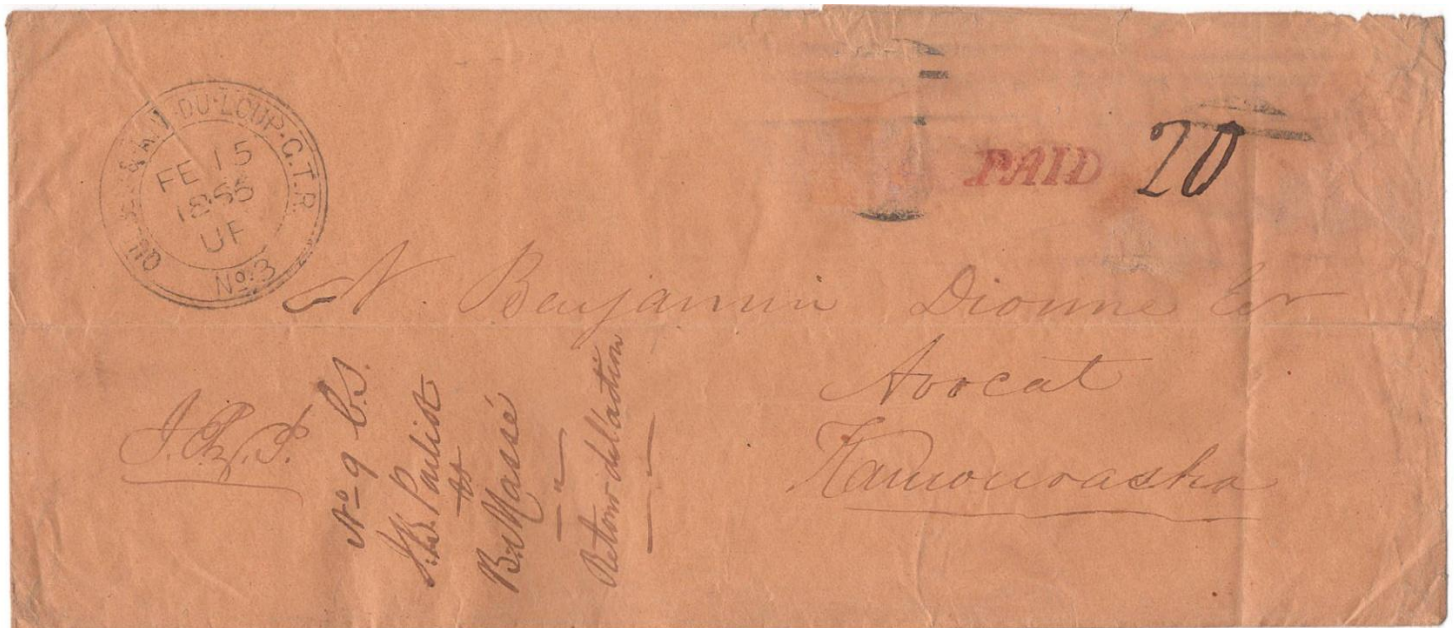

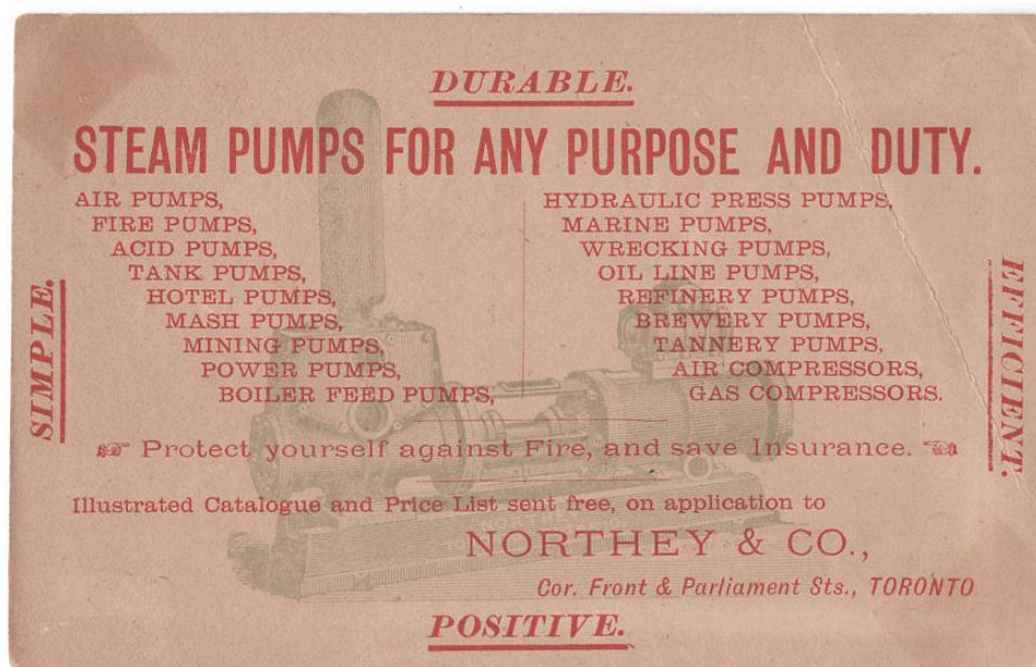
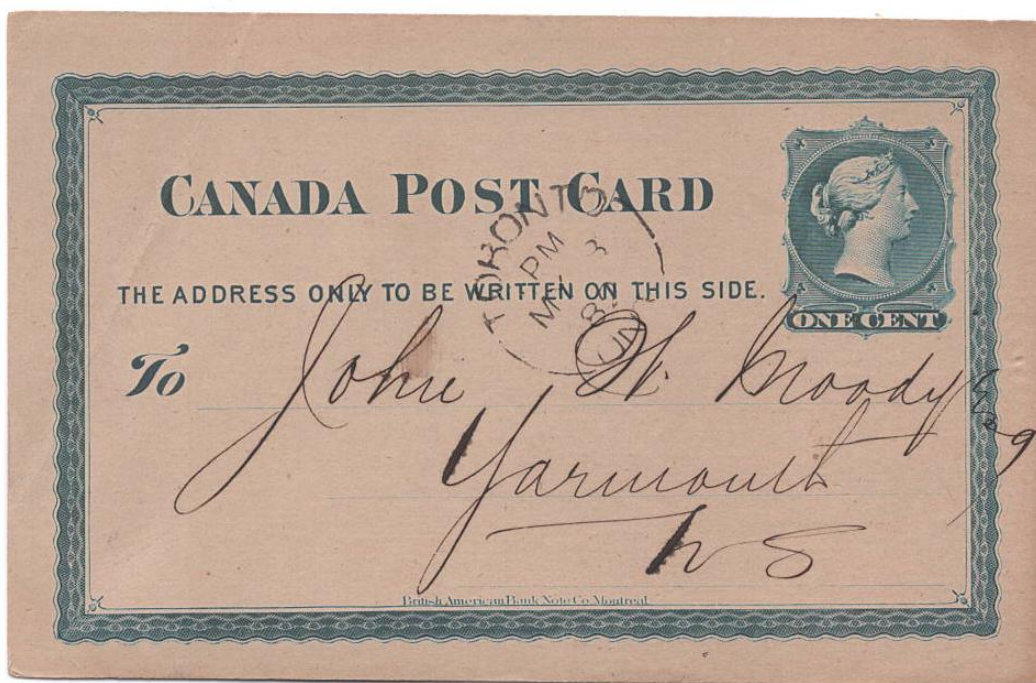




Item 680-01 – Double "Paid at Quebec" crown – 1845, Bank of Montreal Quebec City Branch folded letter paid 11½d and 10¢, with a lovely pair of Paid at Quebec crown markings, fully prepaying the BNA and American postage to New York. \$200.00 **SOLD**



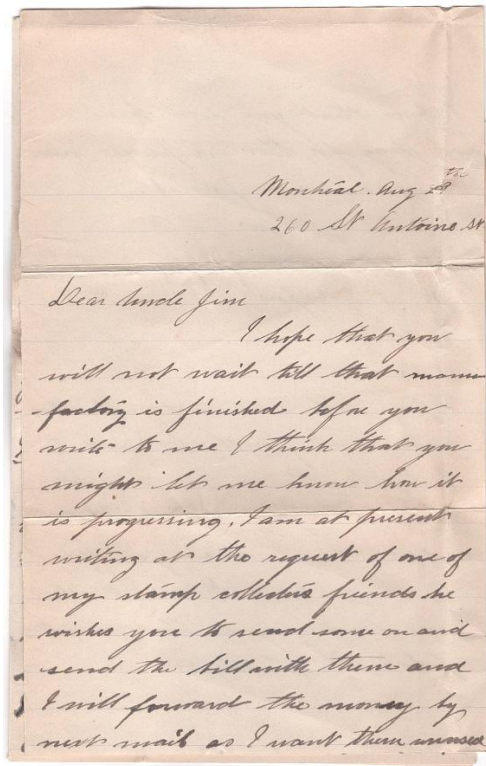
Item 680-02 – Quebec & Riv du Loup GTR No.3 – 1866, legal-size cover presumably from Quebec, paid 20¢ paying the quadruple letter rate to Kamouraska; carried by Quebec & Rivière-du-Loup GTR No.3, Gray Q-443 RF E (1865-1873), dated FE 15 66. Docketing notes indicate it relates to stock returns. A very pretty front strike of the Quebec Riv du Loup GTR No.3. \$350.00 **SOLD**



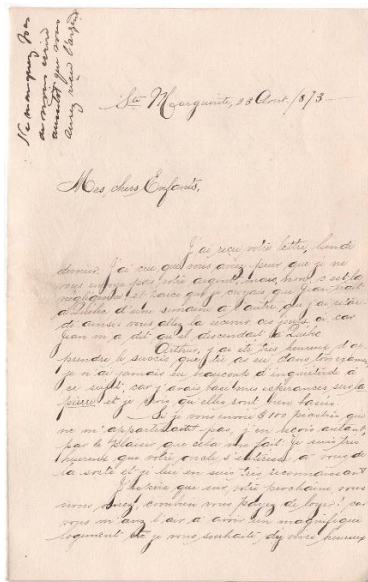
Item 680-03 – **Toronto pump manufacturer** – 1882, 1¢ stationery card from Toronto to Yarmouth, reverse with Northey & Co. advertising showing an illustrated pump. Between 1862 and 1878 Thomas Northey manufactured steam engines and boilers in Hamilton; in 1876 he patented a new steam pump that soon became his principal product. In 1878 he relocated to Toronto and operated as Northey & Co., continuing to develop and market his patented steam pumps. By 1885 his son, John Pell Northey, was running the firm, employing 25 to 50 workers and two travelling salesmen. A nice card. \$75.00



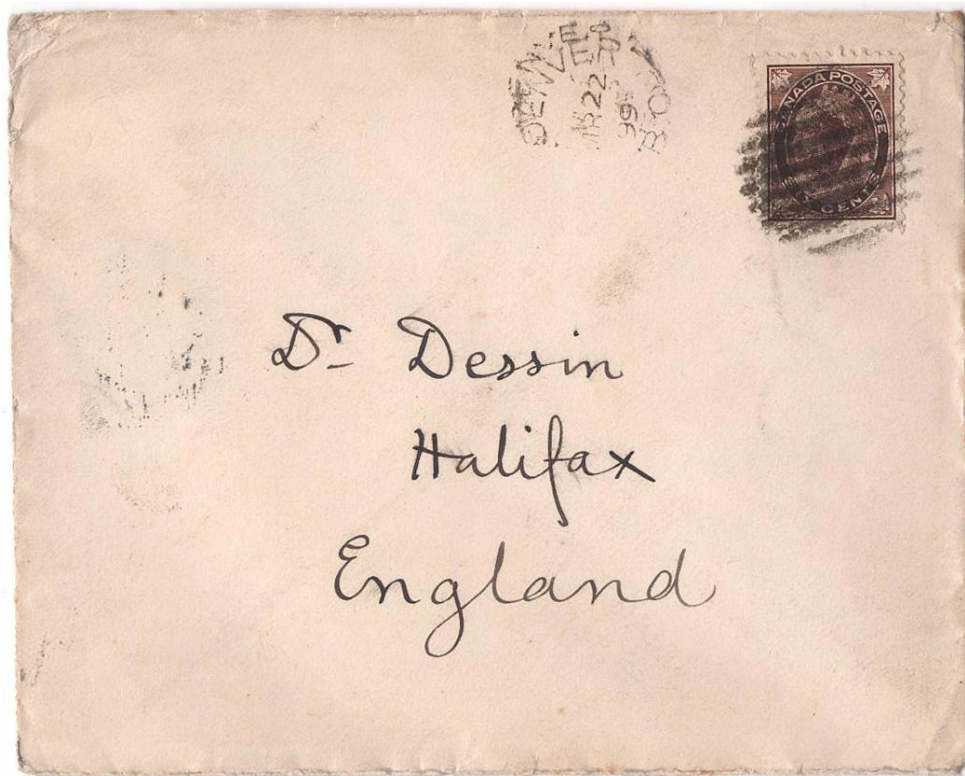
Item 680-04 – **Sherbrooke mining company remailed cover** – 1886, 1¢ SQ (4), oddly placed with one pre-affixing fault, tied by fancy cancel on Sherbrooke Mining & Smelting Co. belt-and-buckle advertising, overpaying 3¢ letter rate to Stanstead (b/s). With the postage placement and the two Sherbrooke postmarks, I have tendency à croire the cover was initially underpaid, additional postage added, and then re-processed. Addressed to C.C. Colby (Charles Carroll Colby, 1827-1907), Canadian lawyer, businessman and politician; born in Derby, Vermont, settled in Stanstead in 1832, called to the Quebec bar in 1855, and elected Liberal-Conservative MP for Stanstead in 1867. \$25.00



Item 680-05 – **Family letter to Newfoundland** – 1895, 3¢ SQ tied by Montreal duplex cancel on cover with letter paying 3¢ preferred letter rate to St. John’s, Newfoundland (b/s); routed via Halifax (b/s). An 8-page family letter to an uncle, with photograph, also accompanies. The 3¢ preferential rate to Newfoundland came into effect in July 1893. Light reduction at right. \$100.00



Item 680-06 – **Family letter to Minnesota** – 1893, 3¢ SQ tied by concentric ring cancel on cover from St. Marguerite-de-Dorchester Que paying 3¢ letter rate to Minneapolis, Minnesota (b/s). Family letter accompanies, written in neat French from a mother to her children now living in the Midwestern United States. Cover with paper staining and cut down at right. A very unusual destination from Dorchester, Bellechasse and south shore of the St. Lawrence region. \$50.00



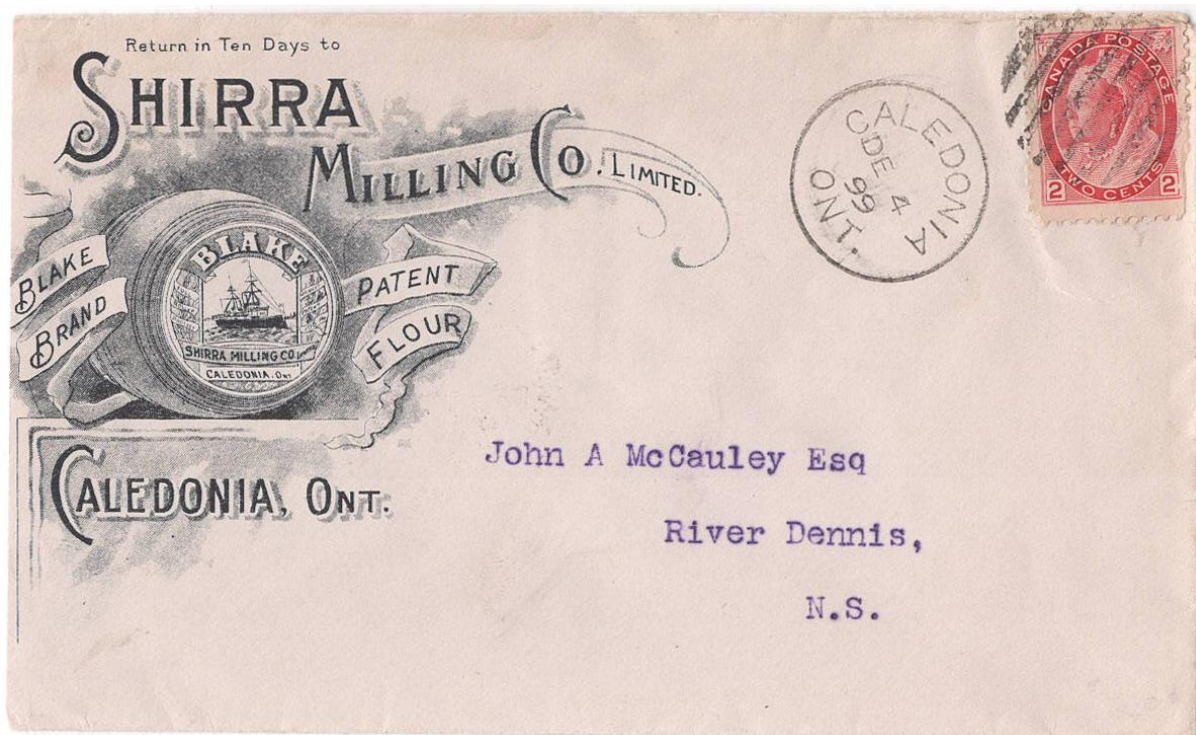
Item 680-07 – **6¢ Leaf single paying triple weight to England** – 1899, 6¢ Maple Leaf tied by grid cancel on cover from New Denver BC paying 6¢ triple-weight Empire letter rate to Halifax, England (b/s). A nicely paid cover using a single 6¢ Leaf. \$500.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-08 – **Lakefield Ontario (Peterborough)** – 1903, 1¢ Numeral (2) tied by grid cancel on Craig House Hotel advertising cover from Lakefield Ont, squared circle AP 1 03, paying 3¢ letter rate to Peterboro (b/s). \$150.00



Item 680-09 – **SQ era inbound Japan to Upper Caverhill N.B. Canada** – 1895, Japan 1 sen, 2 sen (2) tied by cds cancel on Sakurai c/c cover from Tokyo paying the UPU letter rate to Upper Caverhill N.B. (York County). Routed via San Francisco, crossed the continent to show in Fredericton, via Keswick Ridge (b/s). \$125.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-10 – **Caledonia Milling Company** – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by grid cancel on Shirra Milling and Flour Company advertising cover from Caledonia Ont, paying 2¢ letter rate to River Dennis Station N.S. (b/s). Light reduction at left. \$50.00

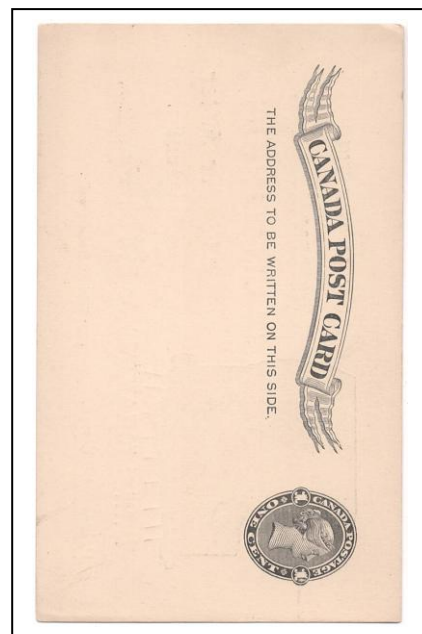

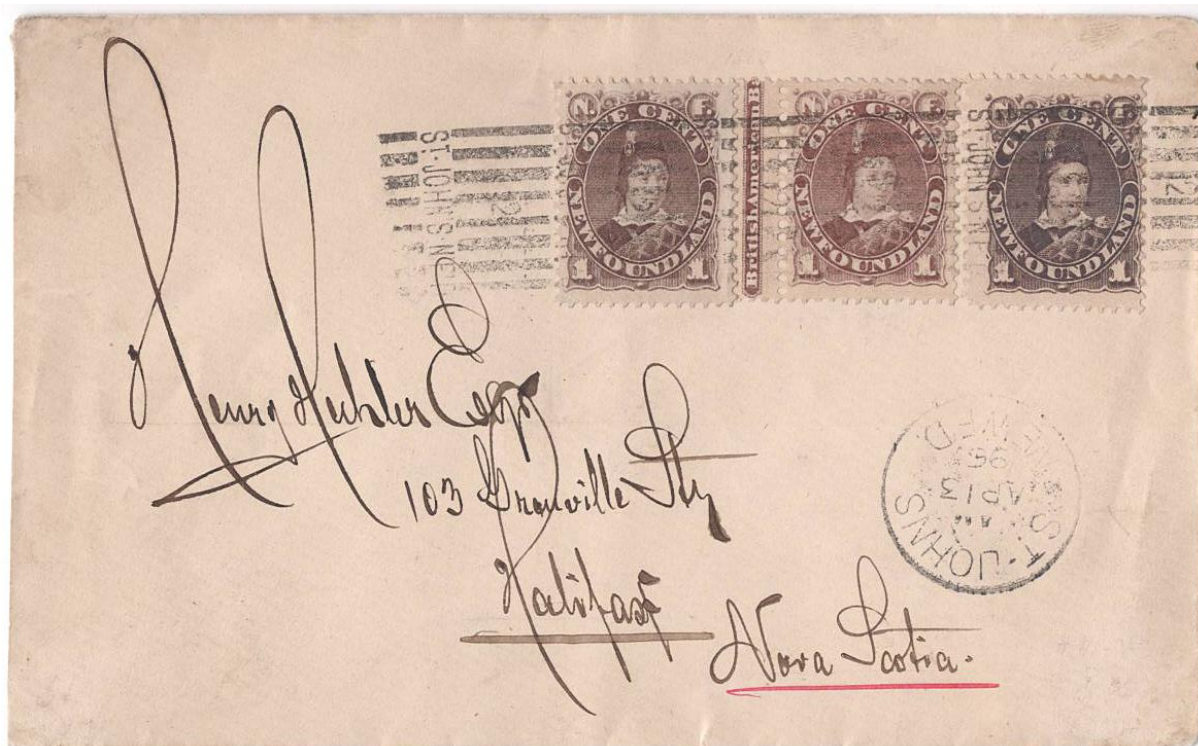

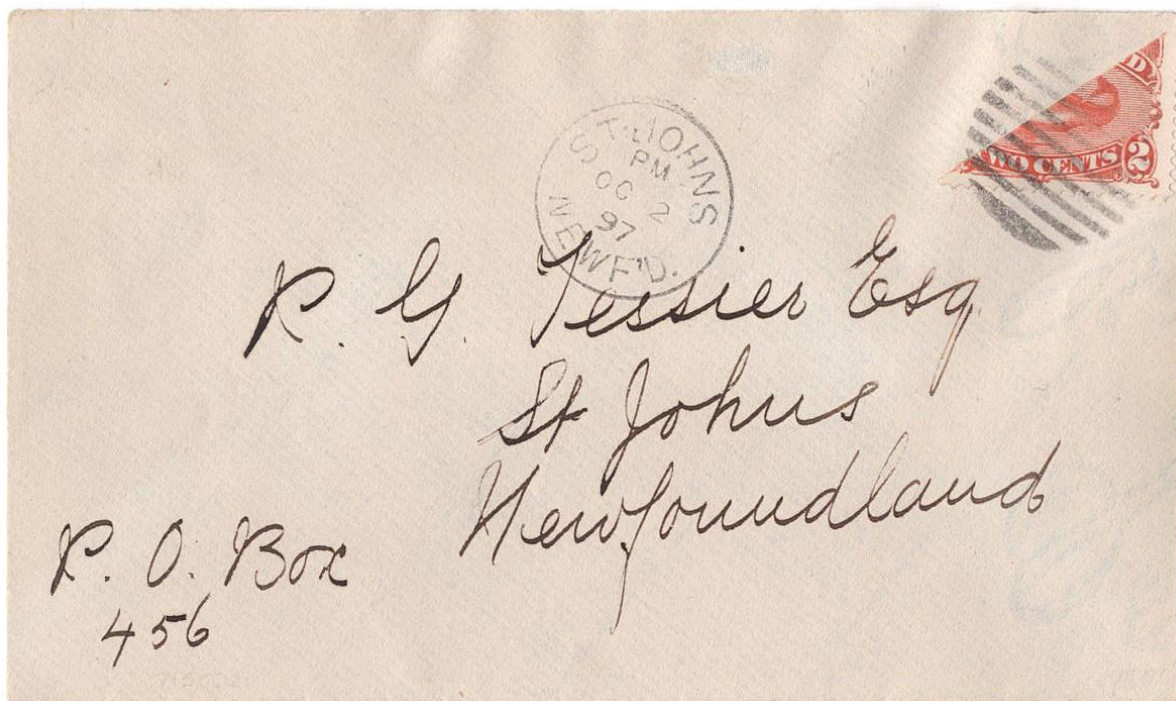

Item 680-11 – **Hamilton Meakins & Sons advertising** – c.1895, 1¢ stationery card, unused, reverse with Meakins & Sons Manufacturing Company advertising, coal-cinder sifter illustrated; the firm also produced paintbrushes, brushes, brooms and rollers. \$25.00



Item 680-12 – **1¢ Prince of Wales, three different shades** – 1896, 1¢ violet-brown with British American Bank Note imprint, 1¢ grey brown and 1¢ brown (41,42,43) tied by St. John's N.F.L.D. roller No. 2 cancel on Henry Hechler cover, written in his hand, paying 3¢ letter rate to Halifax (b/s). Philatelic origin, but a pretty beauty. \$400.00



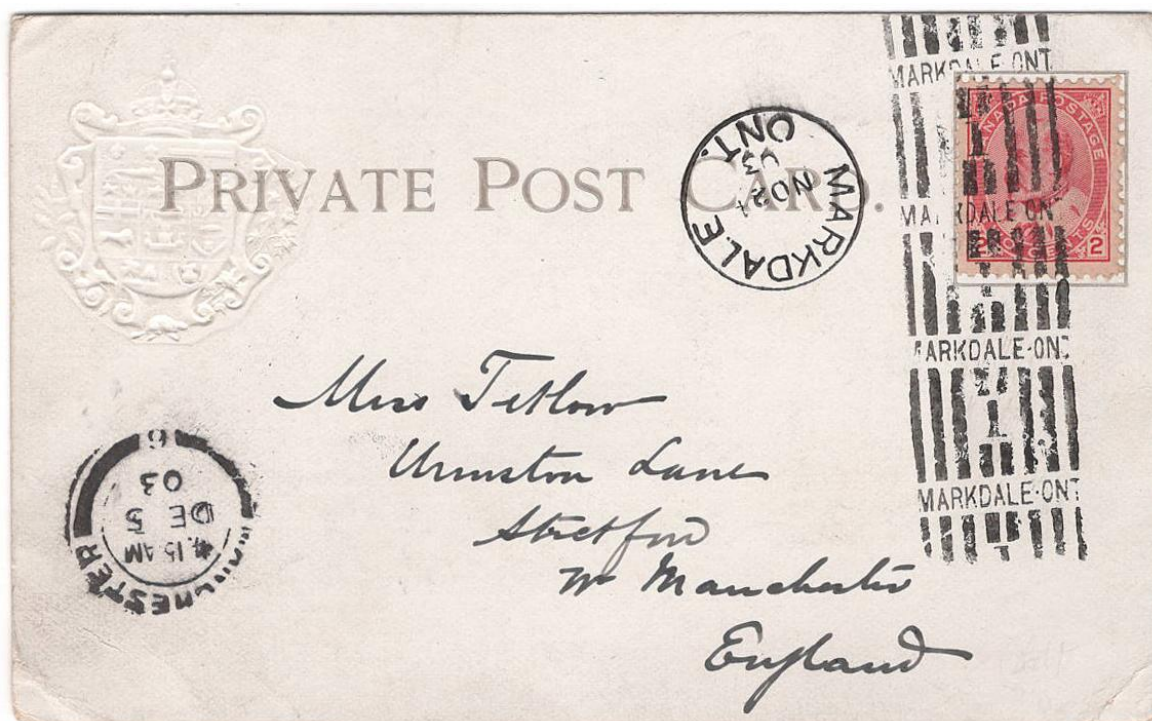
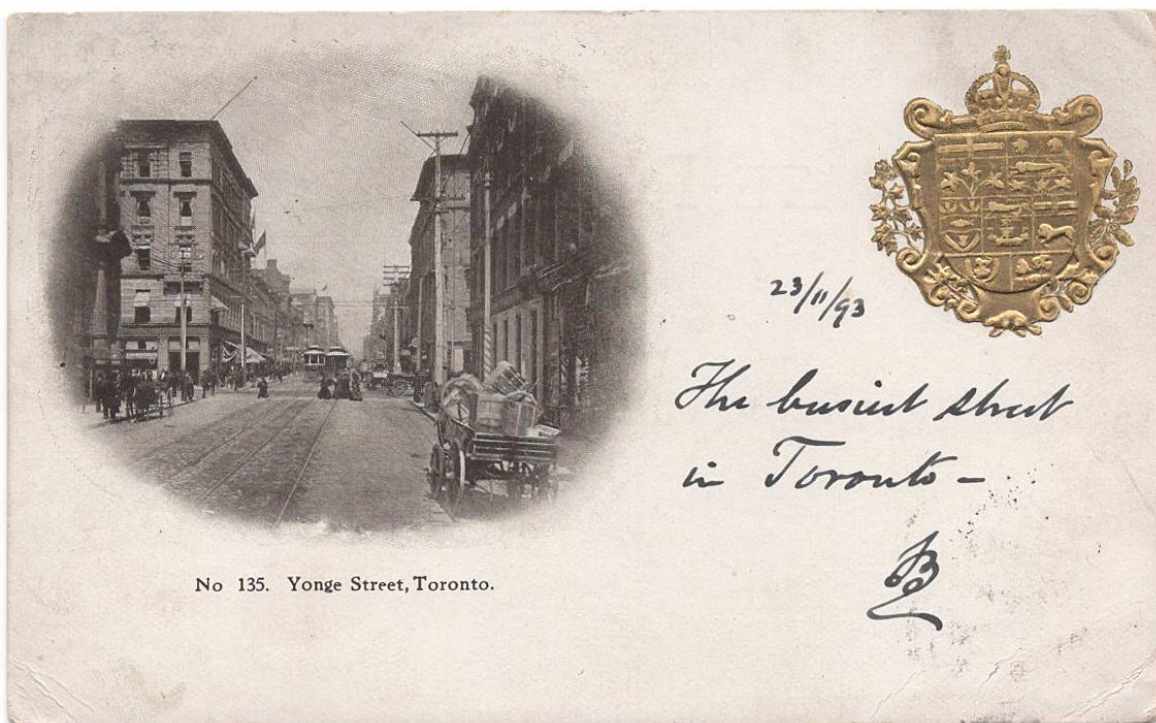
Item 680-13 – **2¢ Codfish orange bisect use** – 1897, 2¢ Codfish orange bisect tied by grid cancel on Tessier cover from St. John's paying 1¢ drop-letter rate. Philatelic origin, but a very pretty Unitrade 48c usage. \$500.00



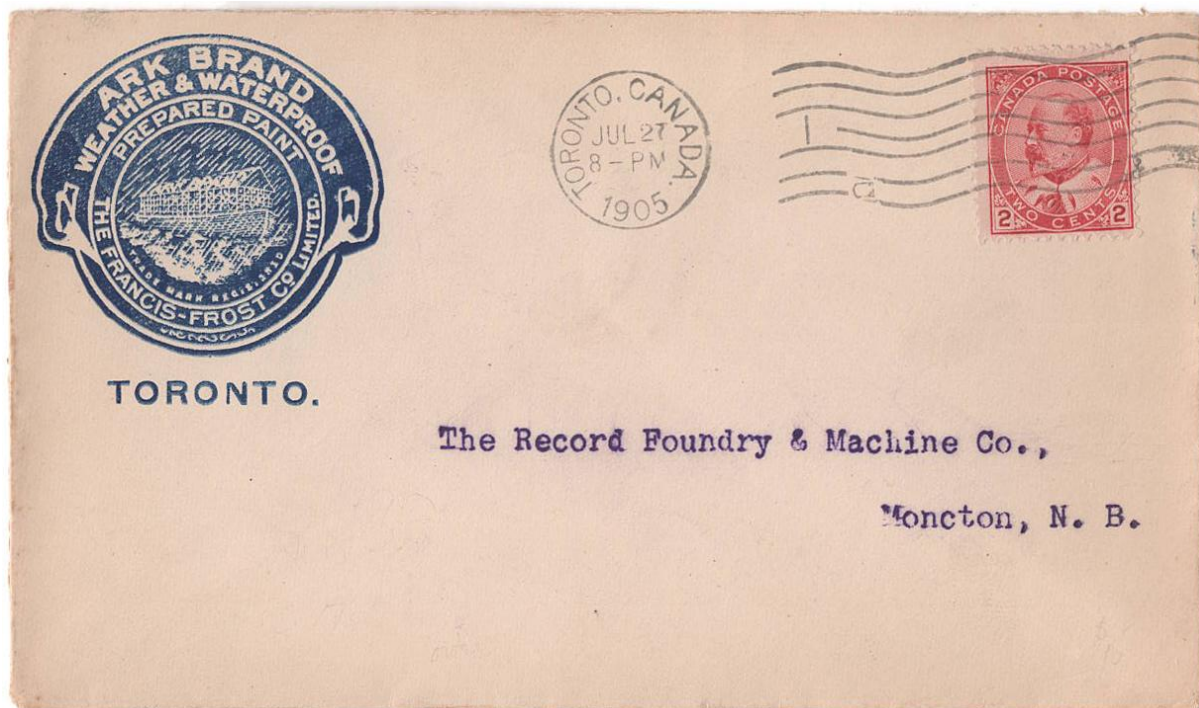
Item 680-14 – **St. John's 18¢ double wgt registered to England** – 1899, Royal Family franking ½¢, 1¢, 2¢, 3¢ stamps totalling 18¢, all tied by grid cancel on cover from St. John's, barred circle JU 14 99, paying 18¢ double-weight registered letter rate to England (b/s). Glasgow, Manchester and Altringham (b/s). \$150.00 **SOLD**



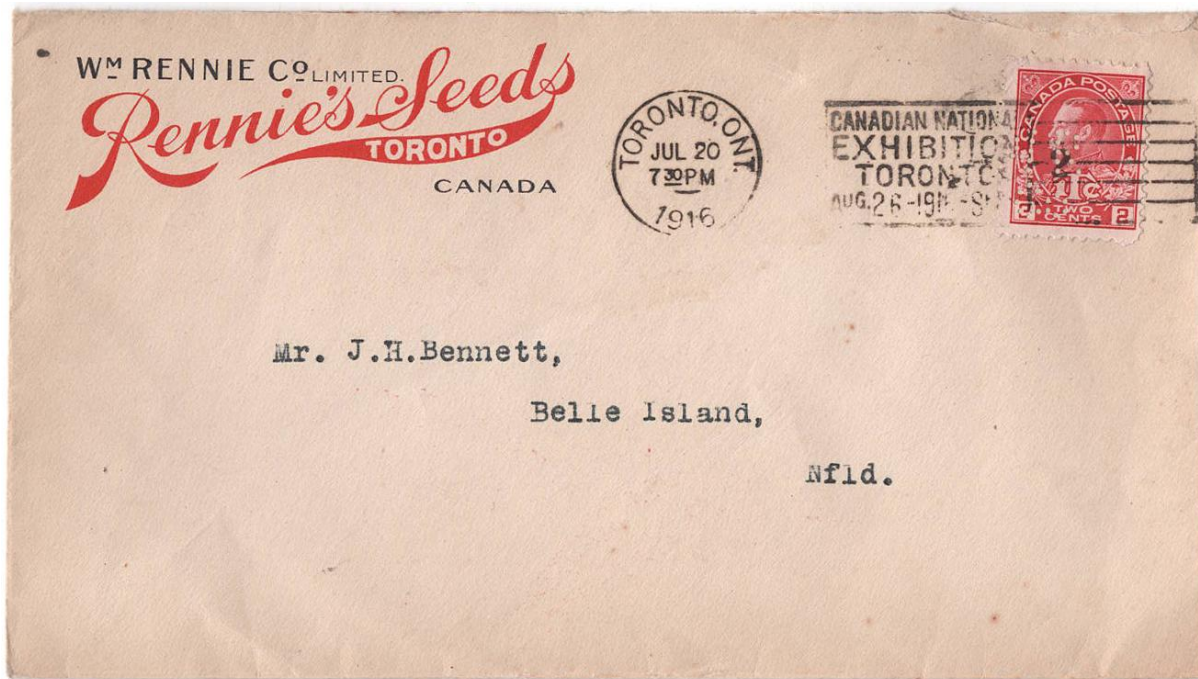
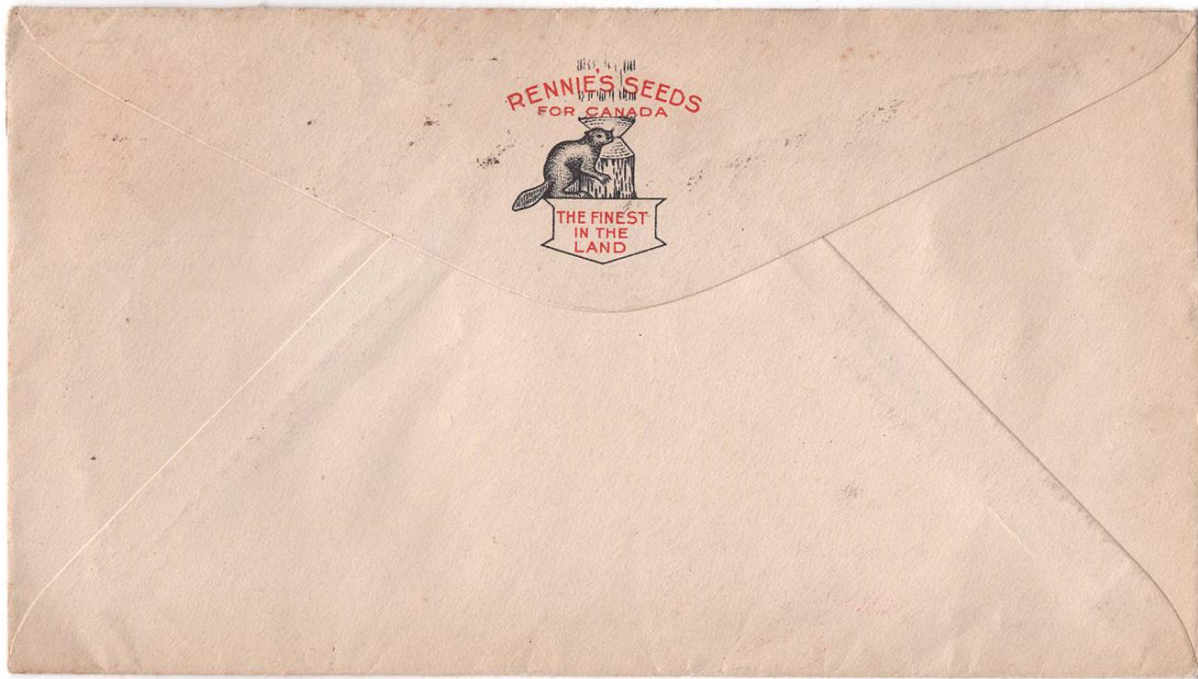
Item 680-15 – St. John's 6¢ letter rate to England – 1905, ½¢ Royal Family (12) tied by St. John's cds dated FE 18 05 paying 6¢ letter rate to England (b/s). Some trivial edge faults. \$150.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-16 – Toronto patriotic card from Markdale Ont – 1903, 2¢ Edward tied by a spectacular Markdale Ont roller No. 1 cancel on Toronto Yonge St. embossed patriotic postcard, paying 2¢ Empire postcard rate to England (receiver). \$50.00



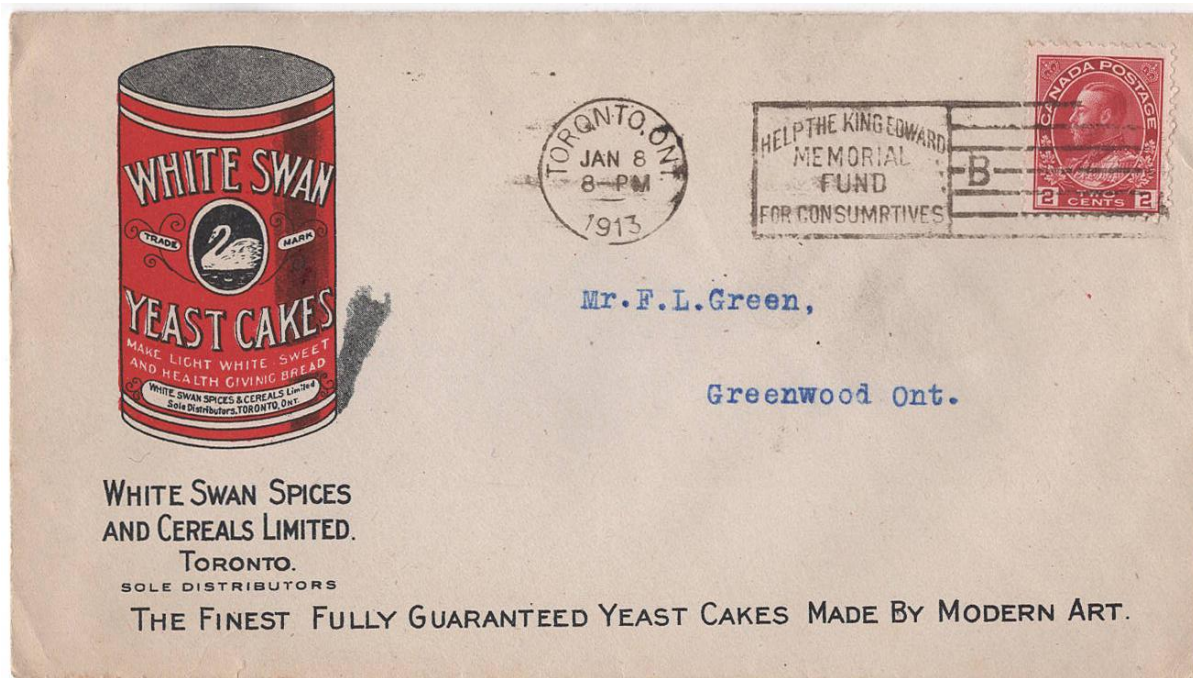
Item 680-17 – Cameo Toronto paint company advertising – 1905, 2¢ Edward tied by Toronto machine cancel on Francis Frost and Benjamin Moore Paint Company advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Moncton (b/s). Front with cameo advertising showing a building in rain promoting weather and waterproof prepared paint; reverse with Benjamin Moore wall and ceiling paint. A pristine Toronto cover. \$100.00 **SOLD**



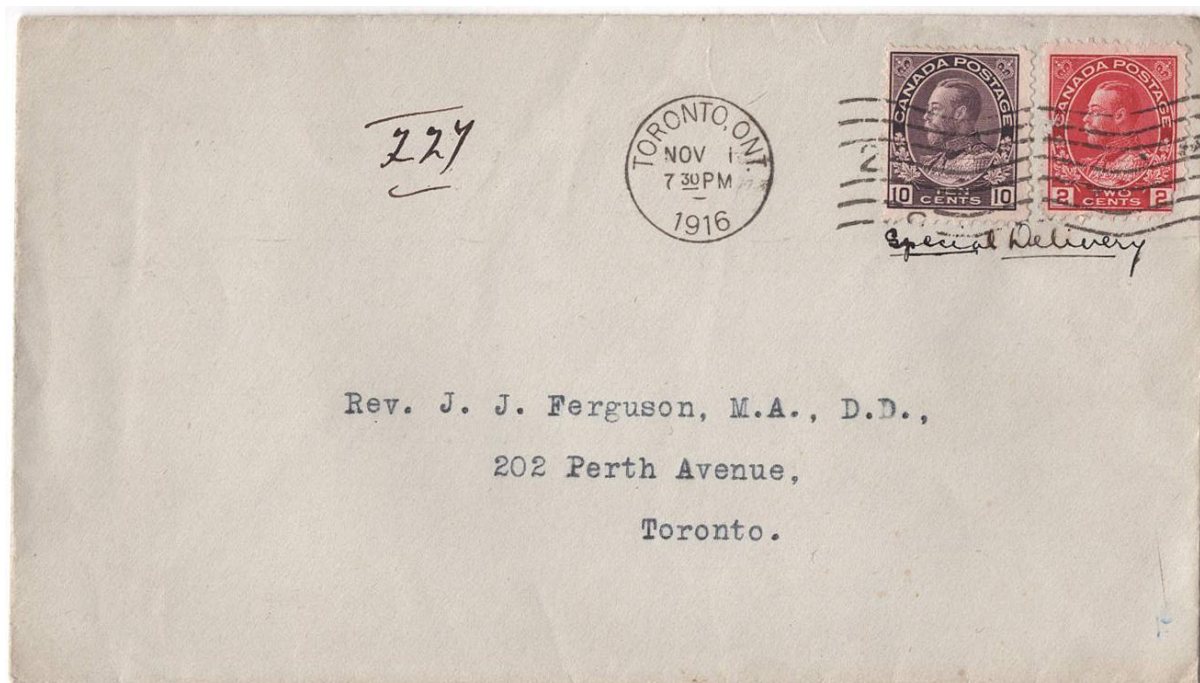
Item 680-18 – Rennie Seed perfin cover to Newfoundland – 1916, 2¢+1¢ Wartax MR3 with WR Co perfin tied by Toronto machine cancel on Rennie's Seeds advertising cover paying 3¢ Empire letter rate to Belle Island, Newfoundland. A rare Empire-destination Rennie perfin cover. \$125.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-19 – **52¢ 1lb parcel post rate to Germany** – c.1927, 10¢, 20¢ (2) Admiral and 1¢ Confederation (2) tied by smudge parcel cancel on parcel piece with address label from Toronto, paying the 52¢ parcel-post rate to Germany for a 1-lb parcel, the rate routed via England. Stamps wrinkled, as commonly seen on parcel items. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-20 – **Spices, yeast and cereals advertising** – 1916, 2¢ Admiral tied by Toronto King Edward Memorial Fund Die B machine cancel on White Swan Company illustrated advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Greenwood (b/s), via Whitby (b/s). \$125.00 **SOLD**



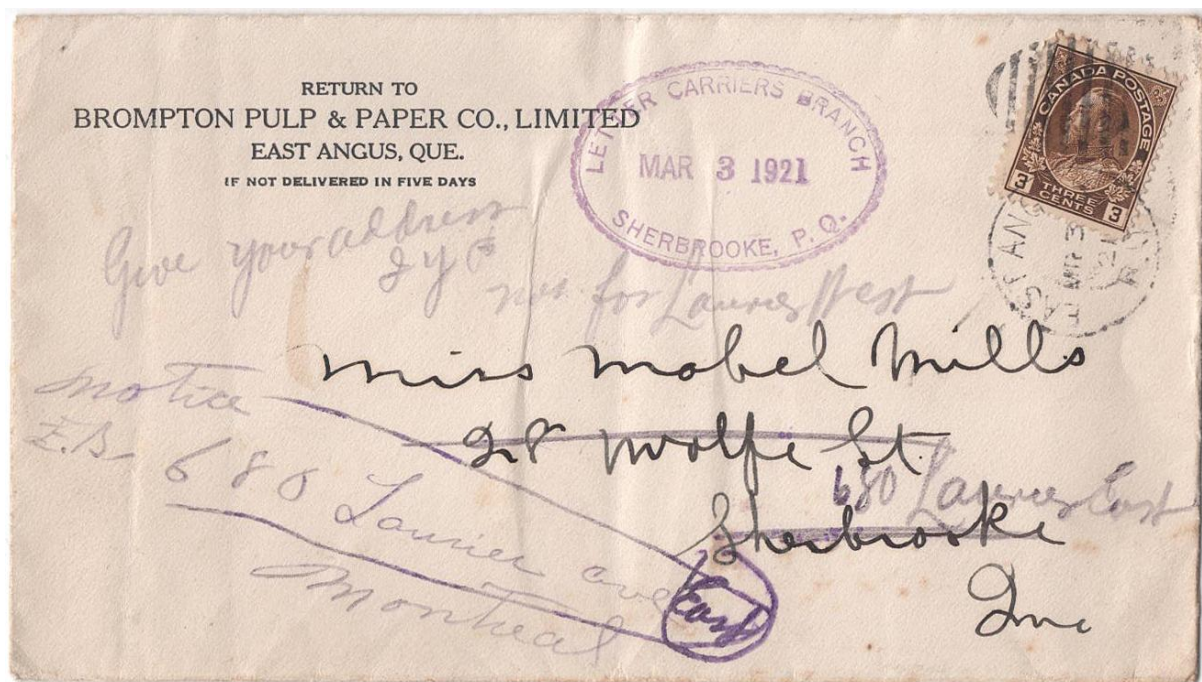
Item 680-21 – **10¢ Admiral plum paying special delivery service** – 1916, 2¢+1¢ Wartax MR3 and 10¢ Admiral plum, manuscript “*special delivery*” beneath, tied by Toronto machine cancel on cover paying 12¢ drop special-delivery letter rate. An uncommon local use of the 10¢ plum paying the SD fee, and one that also passed through a machine. The 2¢ shows a left-side scuff and lower-right flaw, both pre-affixing, and priced accordingly. \$75.00



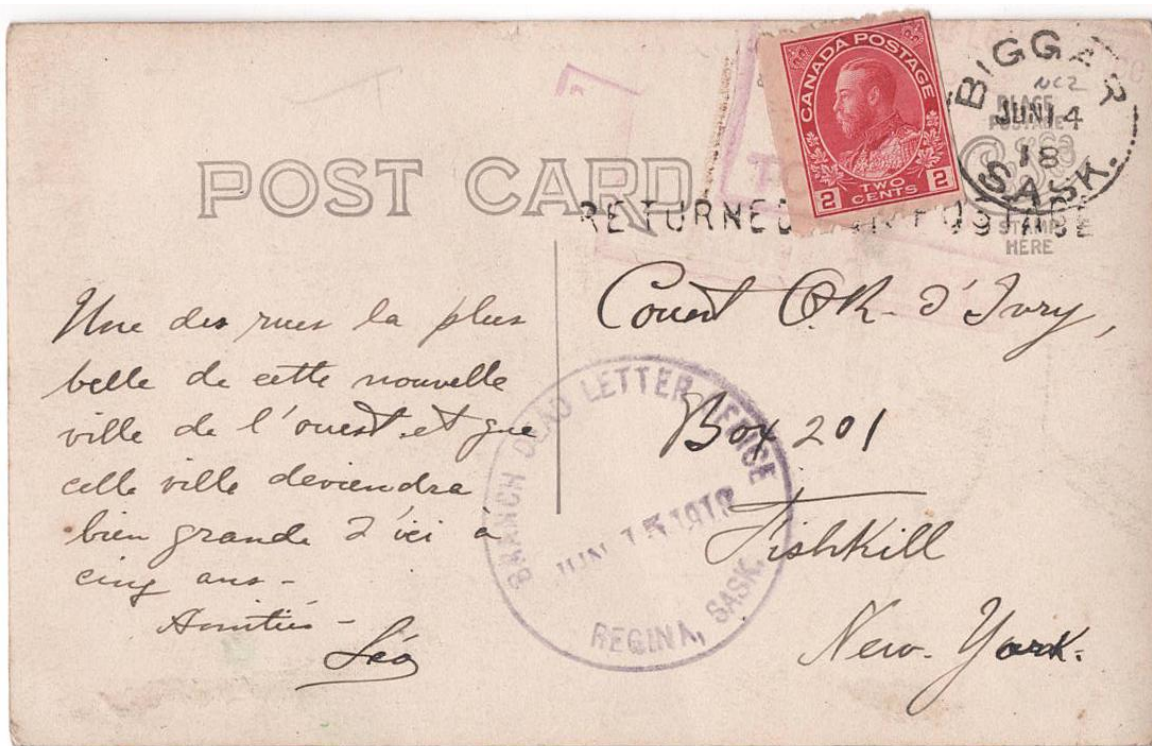
Item 680-22 – **Glassine envelope returned for Wartax via DLO** – 1920, glassine envelope mailed unpaid from Toronto, a common practice when sending glitter or mica postcards to protect workers and machinery, caught and returned for postage with both Returned for Postage and Wartax handstamps. 1¢ and 2¢ Admirals added and forwarded to destination. This is the first glassine postcard envelope I have seen caught and handled in this manner by the Dead Letter Office. \$100.00



Item 680-23 – **Ste. Agathe des Monts Province Quebec** – 1923, 3¢, 10¢ Admirals tied by grid cancel on cover from Ste. Agathe des Monts Que, registration handstamp with Province Quebec designation, paying 13¢ registered letter rate to St. Hermas (b/s). Routed via Montreal and carried by the Montreal & Calumet RPO (b/s). Terrebonne County. \$50.00



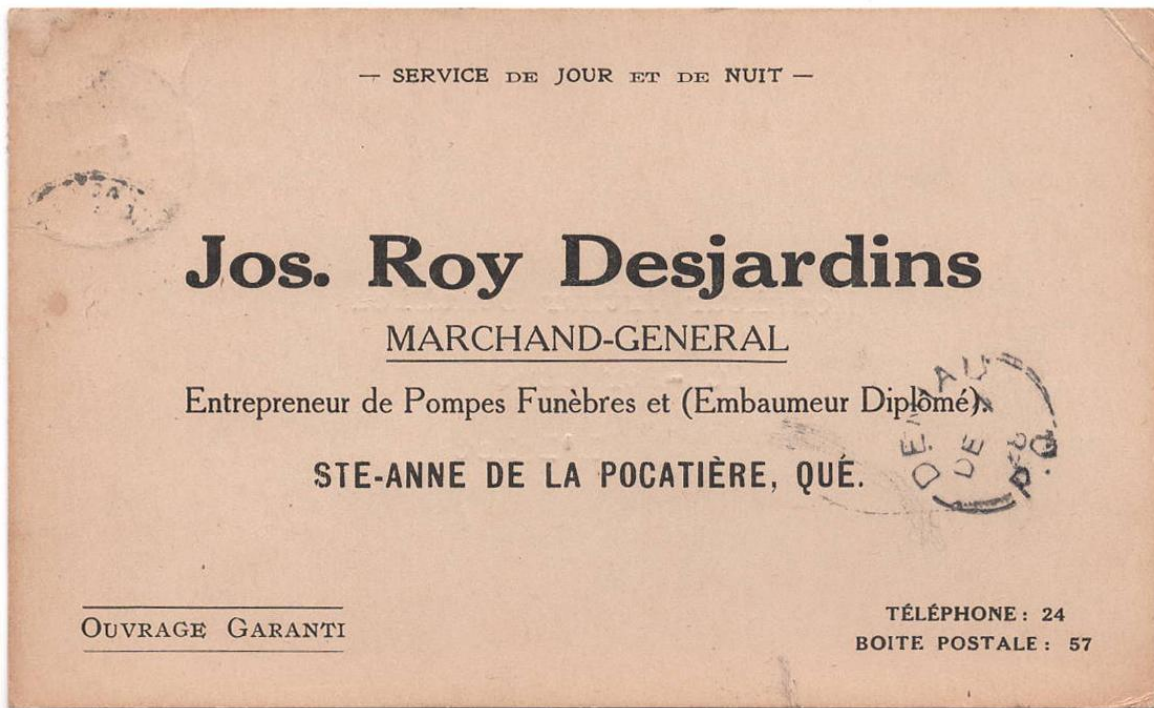
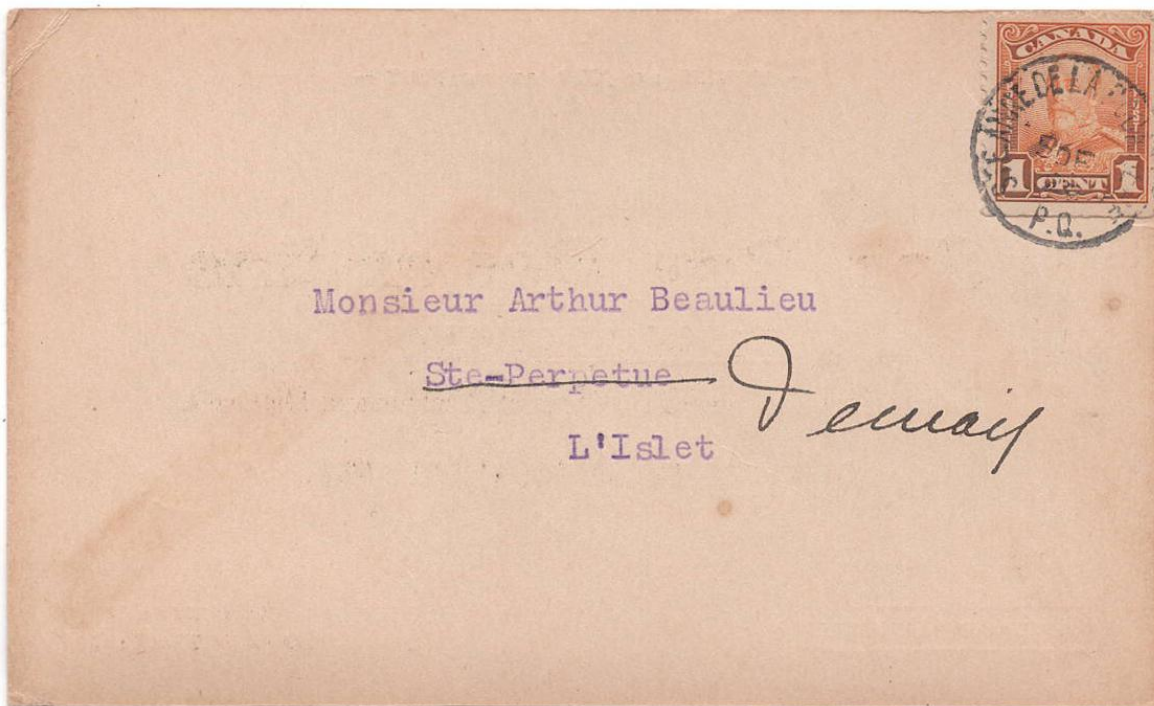
Item 680-24 – **East Angus Que with oval Sherbrooke letter carrier** – 1921, 3¢ Admiral tied by East Angus PQ duplex cancel on Brompton Pulp & Paper Co. c/c cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Sherbrooke. Redirected within Sherbrooke with letter-carrier branch marking, then forwarded to Montreal. \$25.00 **SOLD**



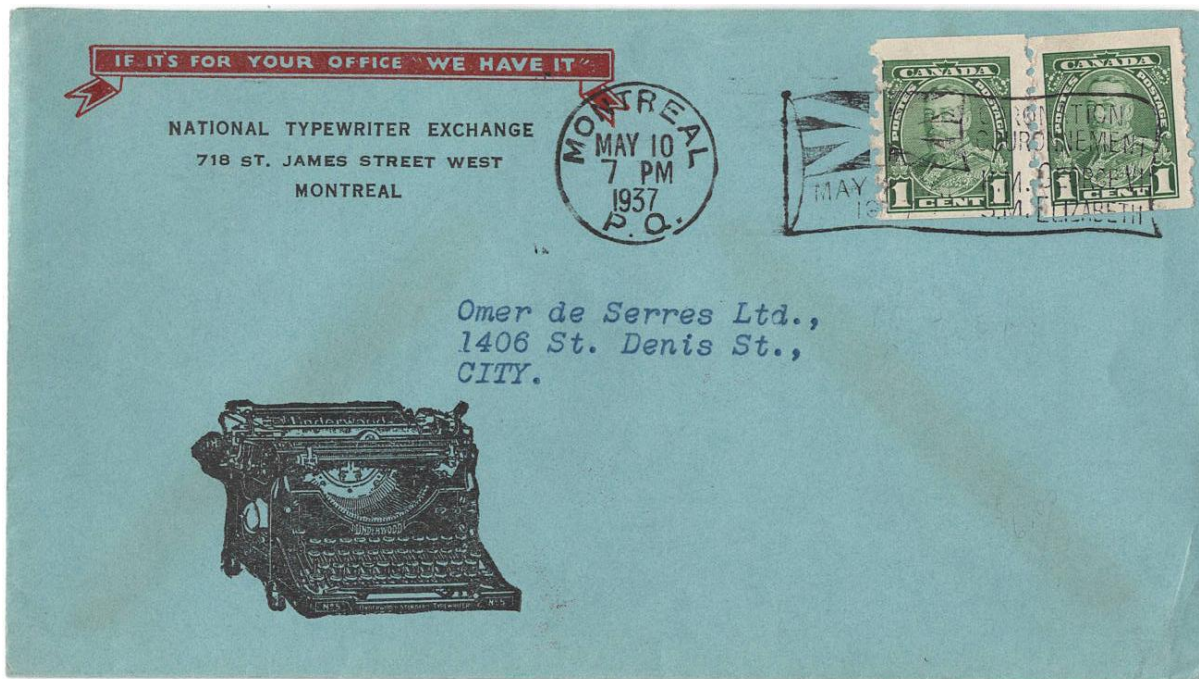
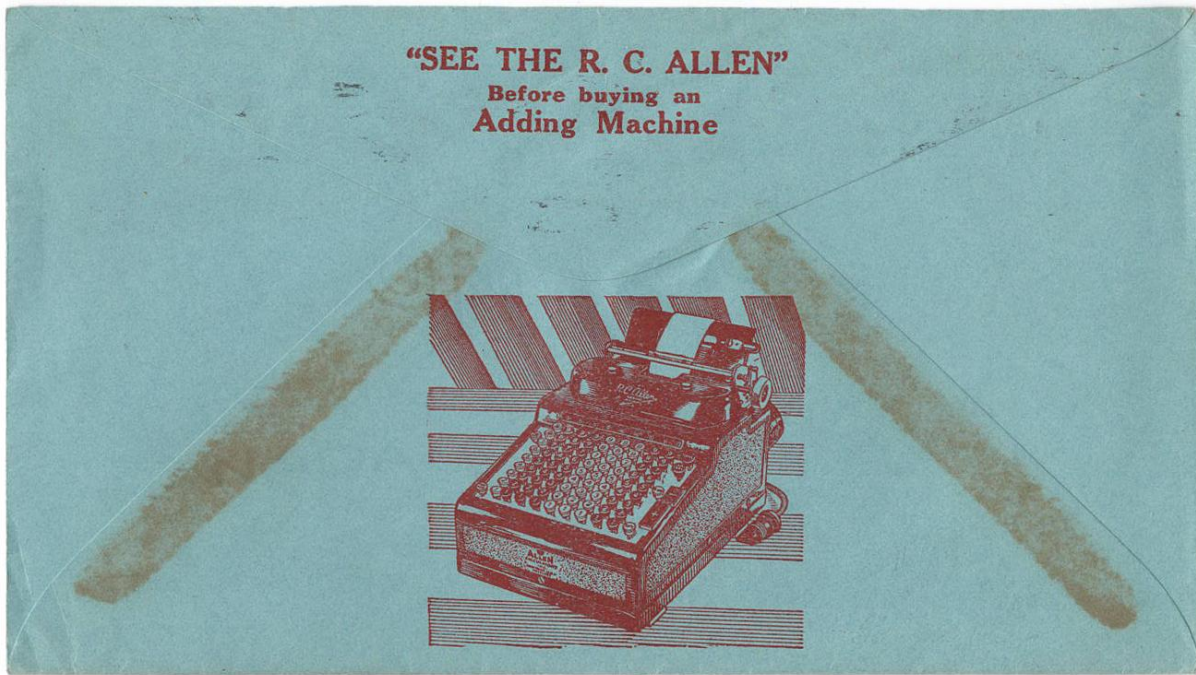
Item 680-25 – **2¢ Admiral coil perf 8 applied by DLO** – 1918, Biggar Sask street-view real photo postcard mailed unpaid from Biggar to New York State, caught by clerk and sent to the Regina Dead Letter Office for postage. Once paid, a 2¢ Admiral coil perf 8 was affixed by the D.L.O. and the card forwarded to destination. An interesting and scarce D.L.O. use of the 2¢ coil perf 8. \$100.00



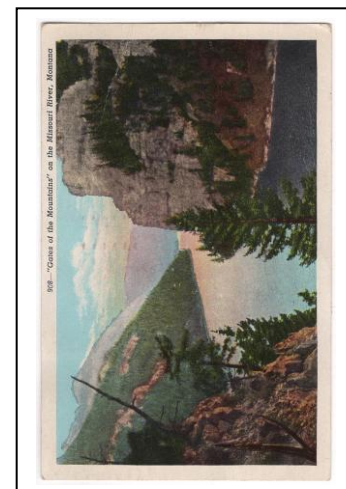
Item 680-26 – **Fine Varnishes Company calendar postcards** – 1912 and 1915 Sanderson Percy & Co. Fine Varnishes calendar postcards, one mailed with compliments of the season from Toronto and the other written and mailed on GTR train to Madoc Ont (b/s). A nice pair. \$75.00



Item 680-27 – **1¢ Scroll booklet stamp, licensed embalmer** – 1928, 1¢ Scroll booklet stamp tied by Ste. Anne de la Pocatière PQ cds on Joseph Roy Desjardins general-merchant, undertaker and licensed-embalmer advertising postcard paying 1¢ postcard rate to Deniau Que (b/s). L'Islet County. \$25.00



Item 680-28 – **Typewriter advertising** – 1937, 1¢ Pictorial coil stamps (2) tied by Montreal flag cancel 51-1B on all-over typewriter-company advertising cover paying 2¢ drop-letter rate. \$50.00




Item 680-29 – **Consecon Ont mailed unpaid** – 1956, monotonous Montana postcard mailed unpaid from Consecon Ont to East Angus Que, charged 8¢ on arrival and paid with four 2¢ Fourth Issue postage-due stamps, all tied by East Angus duplex DPQ-232. Scarce. \$25.00



Item 680-30 – **Seldom seen Special Delivery label** – 1941, 3¢ Mufti and 10¢ Special Delivery E7 tied by Sault Ste Marie Ont cds on cover with eye-catching private *Special Delivery* label, likely of American origin, paying 13¢ special-delivery letter rate to Toronto (faint b/s). \$50.00

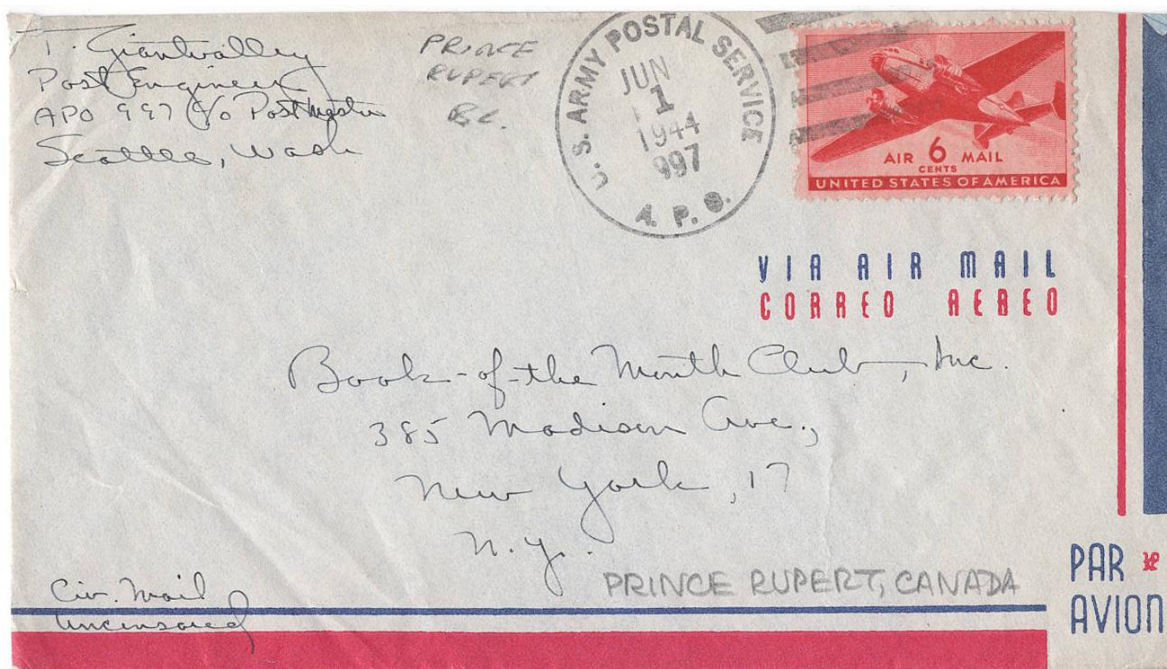

The Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada has grown under the rule of five sovereigns and is now the largest Company of the British Empire transacting Life Assurance solely.

Item 680-32 – **Royal Train itinerary fold-out** – 1939, The Royal Visit of Canada, May 1939 fold-out published by The Sun Life Assurance Company. When opened, it reveals the full itinerary from the May 15 departure in Quebec to the June 15 arrival in Halifax. An appealing collateral piece; although folded to letter size, it was never mailed. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-33 – **COD parcel piece with Chambers** – 1940, 5¢ Mufti and 10¢ Chamber (2) tied by Toronto Station B roller No. 2 cancel on parcel piece with C.O.D. label also tied by Toronto Station B handstamp, paying 25¢ parcel-post rate to an unknown destination. Amount due to sender \$3.06 plus 8¢ C.O.D. fee. \$50.00



Item 680-34 – **U.S. APO 997 Prince Rupert BC** – 1944, US 6¢ tied by U.S. APO 997 duplex cancel on cover, located at Prince Rupert BC, paying 6¢ airmail letter rate to New York. APO 997 operated at Prince Rupert, British Columbia, a major U.S. and Canadian Army sub-port of embarkation from 1942–45 supporting Pacific Coast defence and supply operations. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-35 – U.S. APO 702 White Horse Yukon – 1944, US 6¢ tied by U.S. APO 702 duplex cancel on cover, located at White Horse YT, paying 6¢ airmail letter rate to Vancouver via Edmonton (b/s). APO 702 post office served from 1942–46 the HQ of the Northwestern Service Command. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-36 – World War II, Damaged by Sea-Water – 1945, 4¢ Empire letter-rate cover from Toronto to England with stamp lost in transit, struck by Damaged by Sea-Water handstamp and manuscript Fire. Almost certainly connected to wartime North Atlantic hazards involving Merchant Marine sailings and U-boat activities. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-37 – **Crabtree Mills Que (Joliette)** – 1947, 5¢ War and 10¢ Peace tied by grid cancel on cover from Crabtree Mills Que underpaying 30¢ airmail letter rate to the Netherlands, taxed T150 centimes UPU collect. The return address is noteworthy: from Mrs. E. Crabtree, almost certainly a descendant of founder Edwin Crabtree. Crabtree Mills refers to the industrial core of Crabtree, Quebec, established around Edwin Crabtree's 1905 paper mill on the Ouareau River, today the site of a Kruger Products tissue-paper plant. \$50.00 **SOLD**



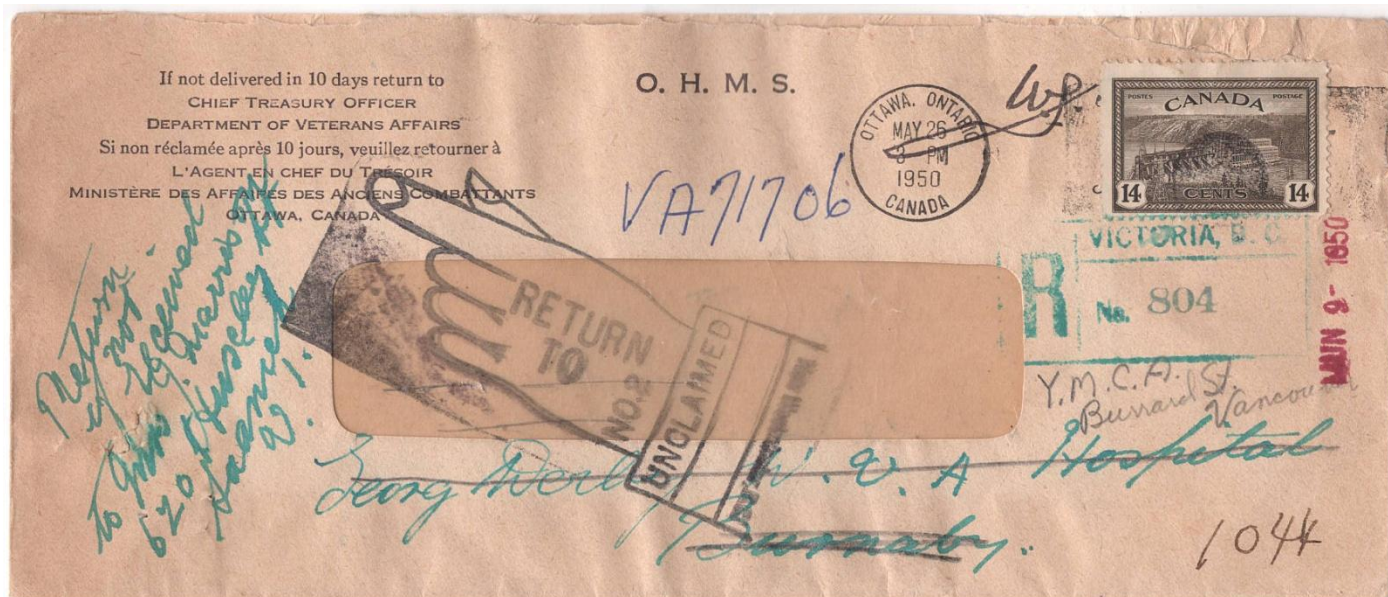
Item 680-38 – **30¢ airmail underpaid to England, T90** – 1948, 7¢ and 8¢ Peace tied by Vancouver BC cds on cover underpaying 30¢ double-weight airmail letter rate to England. Charged T90, representing 15¢ short × 2 × 3 centimes for a total of 90 centimes. Forwarded airmail despite being half the postage short. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-39 – **St. Gabriel de Brandon PQ shortpaid to Germany** – 1948, 4¢ War tied by St. Gabriel de Brandon PQ duplex cancel on cover underpaying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Germany. T6 centimes converted to 15. \$25.00



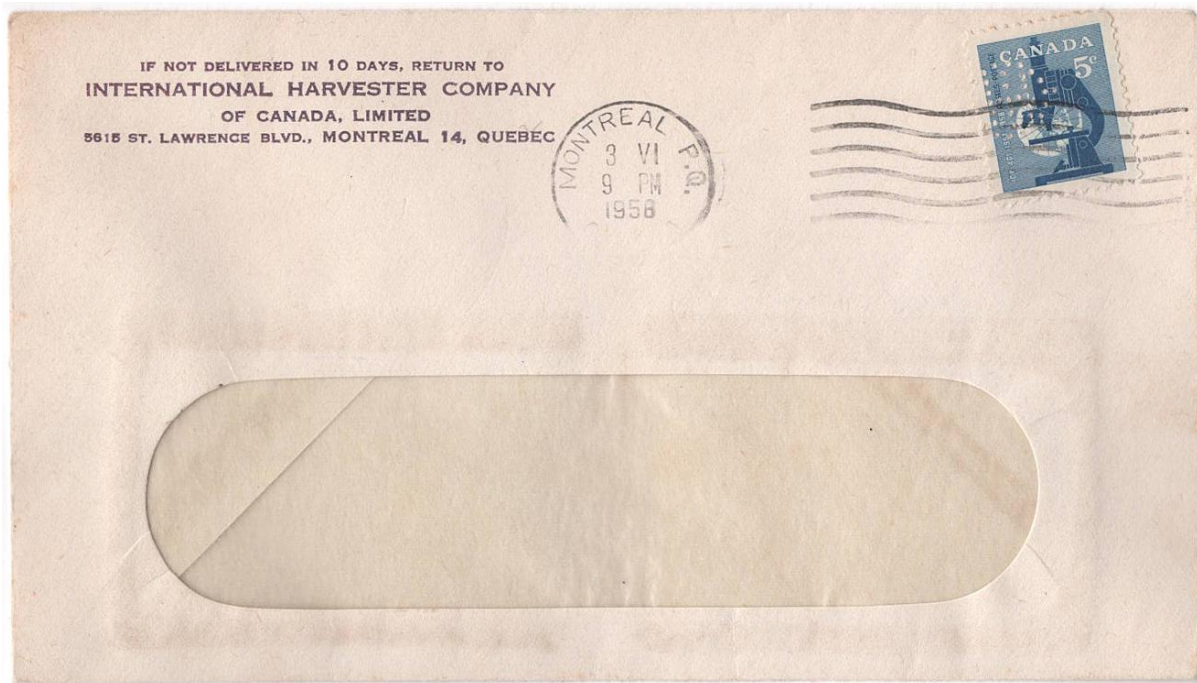
Item 680-40 – **45¢ triple weight airmail to Holland** – 1951, 5¢ Postes-Postage and 10¢ Fur tied by Simcoe Ont machine cancel underpaying 45¢ triple-weight airmail letter rate to Holland. Rate was 15¢ per ¼ oz; 30¢ short converted to 1,20 Guilder postage due. \$75.00



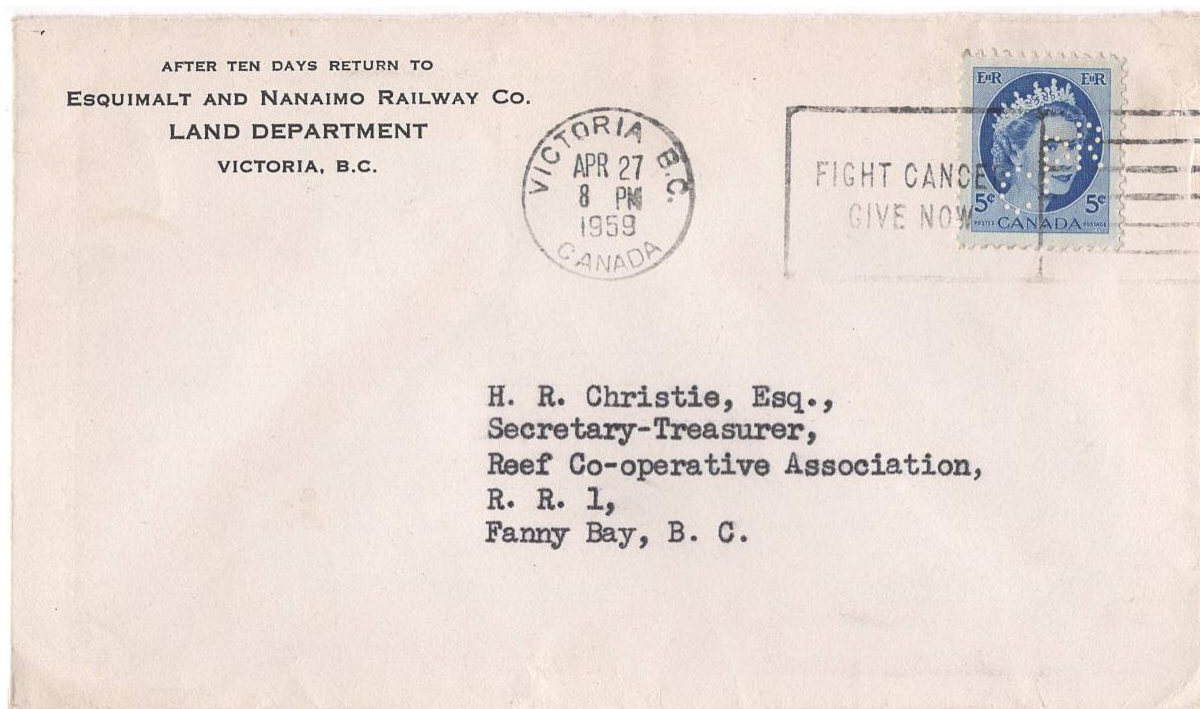
Item 680-41 – **Ottawa free franked cover compulsory registered** - 1950, Veterans Affairs free-franked cover from Ottawa to Saanich BC. On arrival, redirected to the George Derby War Veterans' Hospital in Burnaby. Likely contained a pension cheque and was compulsorily registered by the Victoria Post Office, with 14¢ Peace added to pay postage and registration. New Westminster (b/s), then forwarded to the YMCA on Burrard Street, Vancouver; unclaimed and returned to Ottawa (June 6). A rare Peace-Issue compulsory-registered cover. \$150.00 **SOLD**



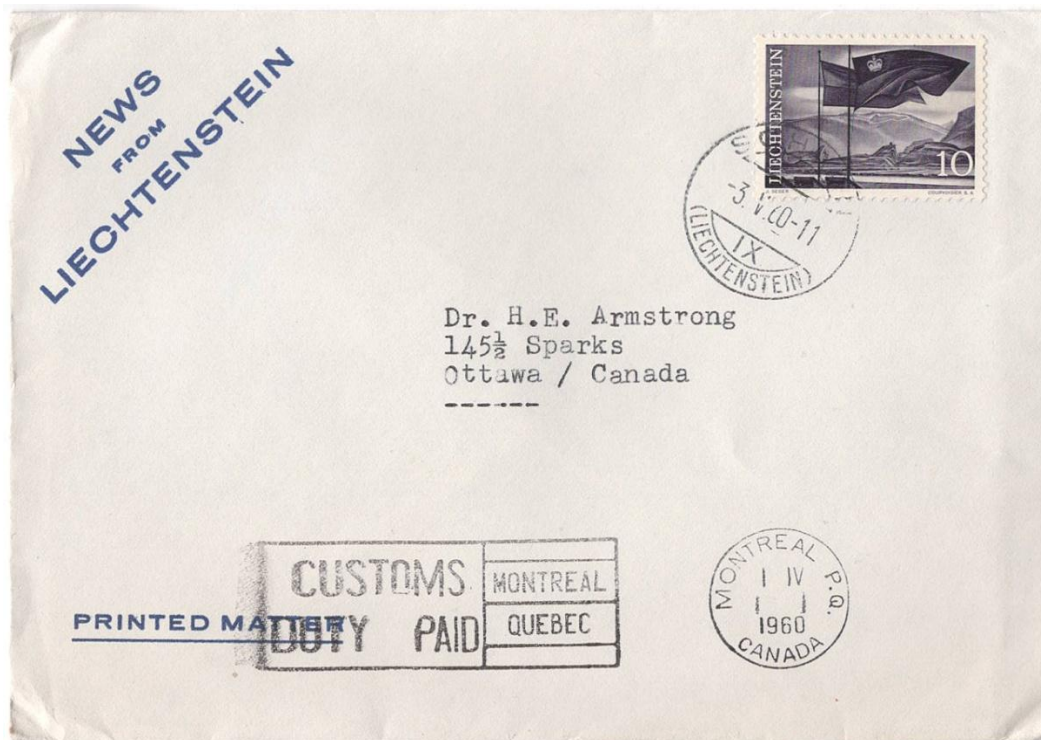
Item 680-42 – **Pelee Island Ont 4th class matter rate and insured** – 1951, 50¢ Peace (faulty) and 2¢ Postes-Postage tied by Pelee Island Ont MOON cancel on 3¢ postal stationery, the entire piece initially scotch-taped to a parcel, paying either 55¢ parcel rate for 7 lb 3 oz (insurance paid in cash) or 55¢ parcel rate for 5 lb 3 oz with 12¢ insurance (paid with stamps). Rare usage. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-43 – **5c Microscope IHC perfin** – 1958, 5c Microscope with International Harvester Co. perfin (IHC, I16) tied by Montreal machine cancel on International Harvester Co. corner-card window cover. A very common perfin, but seldom encountered on a commemorative. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-44 – **Esquimalt & Nanaimo Railway Co.** – 1959, 5c Wilding with CPR perfin on Esquimalt & Nanaimo Railway Co. cover, the E&N being a CPR subsidiary, paying 5c letter rate to Fanny Bay BC (b/s). \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-45 – **Customs Duty Paid Montreal** – 1960, Liechtenstein printed-matter cover to Ottawa, entered Canada via Montreal Customs with Pitney Bowes die machine SSM-35 Customs Duty Paid / Montreal / Quebec. \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 680-46 – **4c Fourth Issue Postage Due stamp perfin** – 1965, 5c Civil Aviation tied by Trail BC cds on cover underpaying 8c double-weight drop-letter rate. Shortpaid with 6c postage due, paid by a remarkable combination of two 1c Wilding and one 4c Fourth-Issue Postage Due stamp, all with CMS perfin. This is the first postage-due stamp perfined CMS I have ever seen or heard of. \$150.00 **SOLD**
