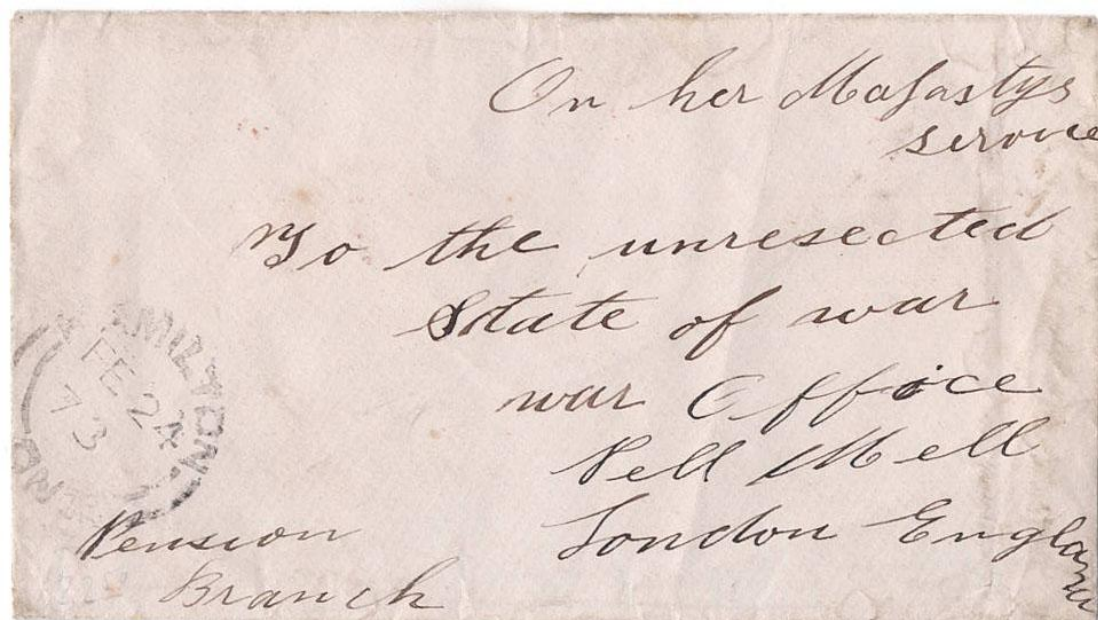
Item 683-01 – **Middleton UC (Norfolk County)** – 1844, folded letter datelined Middleton OC 10 44 from Thomas Jenkins to Francis Walsh at Vittoria, no postmark and no rate despite the post office being in operation from 1831 to 1853. Middleton later became Delhi UC. The letter expresses gratitude for a new job as poll clerk. \$75.00



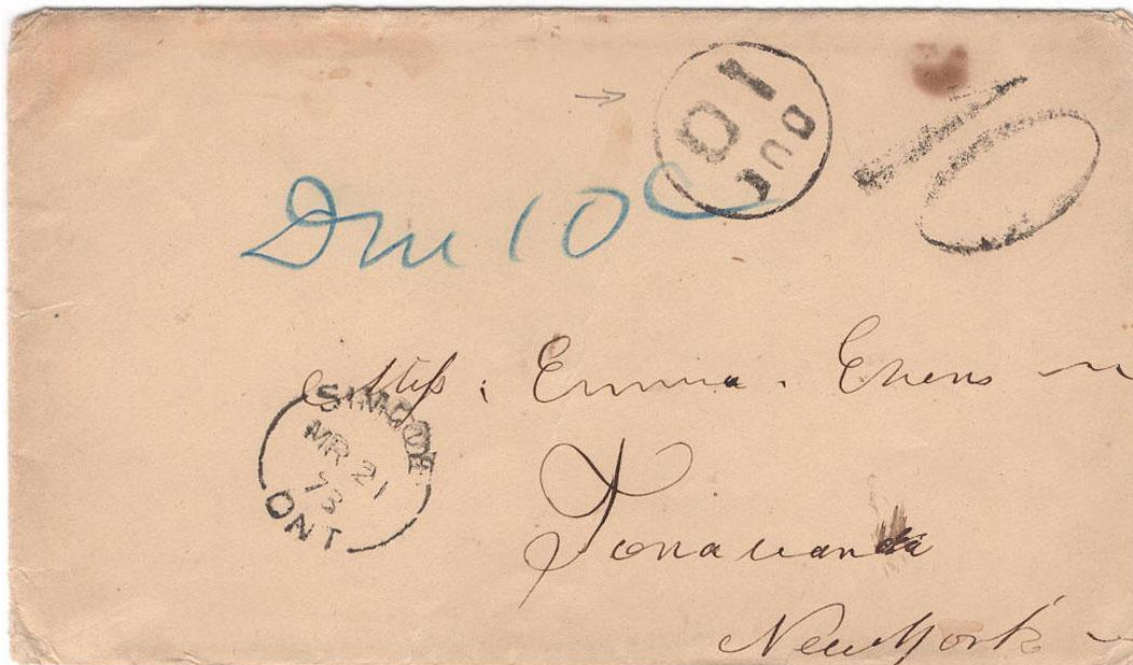
Item 683-02 – **Port Hope UC 1829 type in red** – 1837, folded letter from Port Hope UC with a very pretty 1829-type postmark struck in red, rated 7d collect to Toronto. From the inspector's office at Port Hope, relating to remittances on inspections within the Newcastle District. \$125.00 **SOLD**



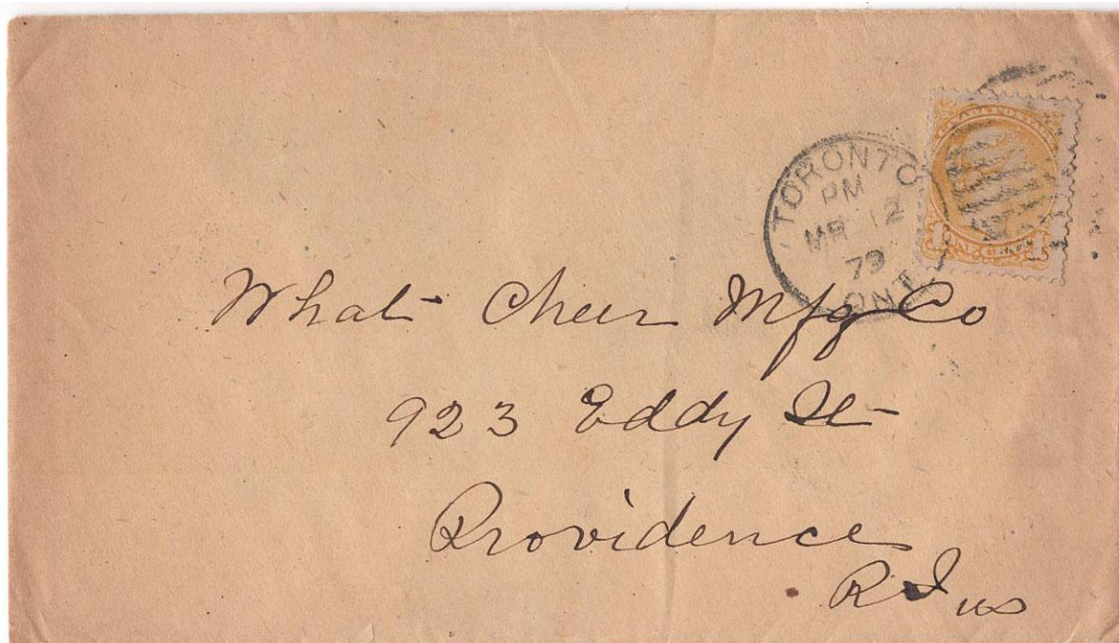
Item 683-03 – **Port Hope UC "Promissory Note" to Connecticut** – 1856, partially printed, partially written notary-public promissory-note from Port Hope UC, paid 6 with exchange Canada Paid 10 Cts marking to Bristol, Connecticut. Linked to the Bank of Upper Canada, addressed to the Bristol Brass & Clock Co. for the sum of \$149.81. A very scarce cross-border promissory-note usage showing a very pretty 10c exchange marking. \$150.00



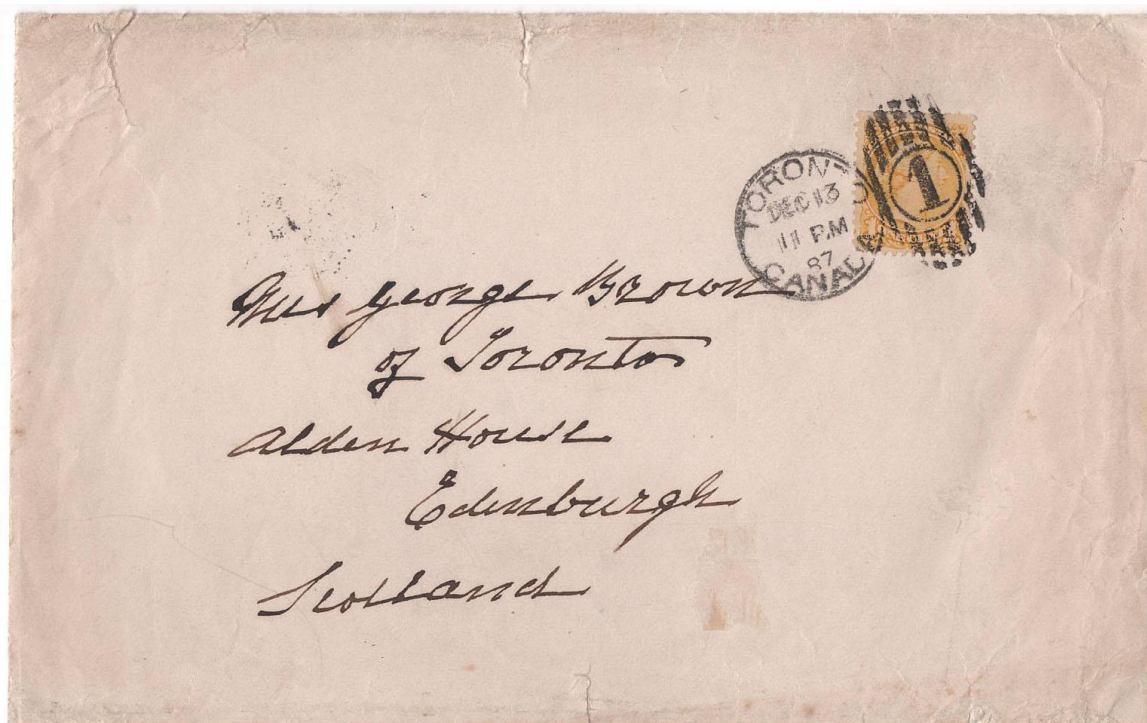
Item 683-04 – **Hamilton Ont to War Office, London England** – 1873, stampless cover from Hamilton Ont, recorded device with the characteristic and somewhat bizarre placement of the year indicia “73”, endorsed On Her Majesty’s Service, to the Under Secretary of the War Office (Pall Mall) London England (b/s). Correctly sent free frank, as only three Imperial Departments of State held external free-mail privileges: the Civil, Military, and Naval Departments. An interesting OHMS use showing the known but very scarce Hamilton postmark, and a desirable pre-UPU free-franked cover to England. \$200.00



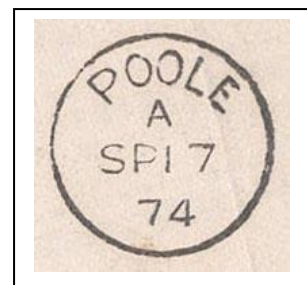
Item 683-05 – **Simcoe Ont mailed unpaid to Tonawandas, New York** – 1873, stampless cover mailed unpaid from Simcoe Ont to Tonawandas, Upstate New York via Brantford Ont (b/s). Rated 10¢ in three different ways: 10 Canadian handstamp, American Due 10 in circle, and Due 10¢ in blue crayon, likely added on arrival at destination. The 10¢ unpaid letter rate to the U.S. was in effect until FE 1 74. \$125.00



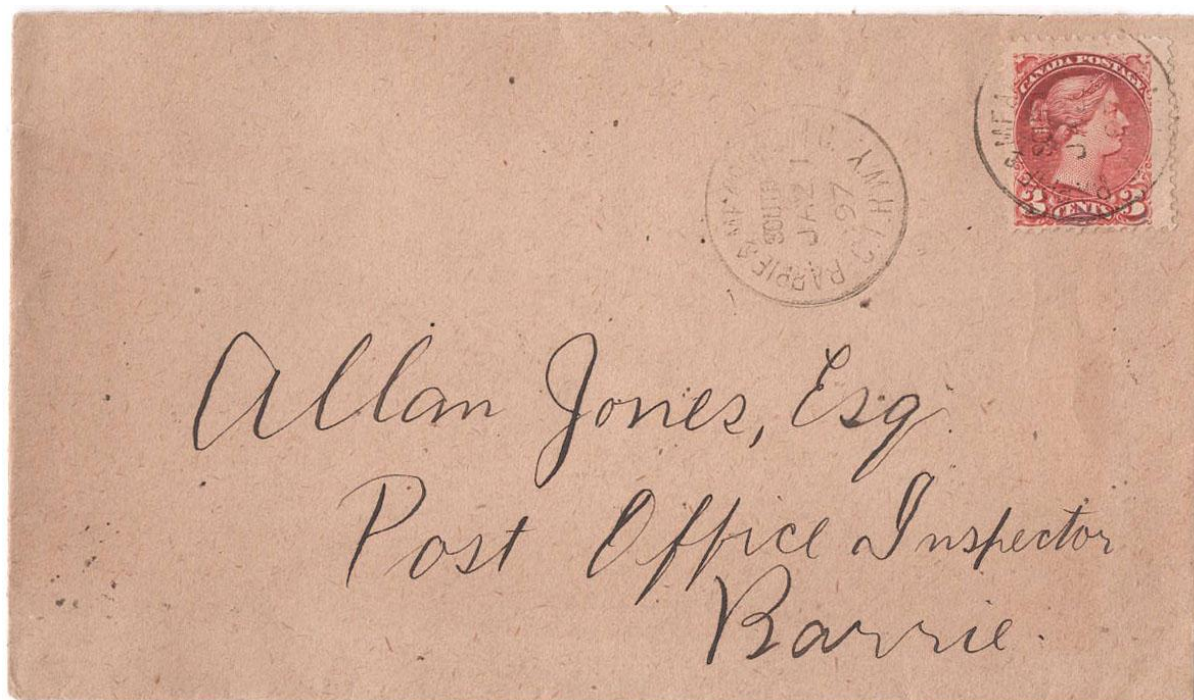
Item 683-06 – **1¢ printed matter rate to Rhode Island** – 1879, 1¢ SQ tied by Toronto duplex cancel on cover paying 1¢ printed-matter rate to Rhode Island. Providence carrier marking (b/s). This Toronto duplex falls within the difficult 1870s–1880s period of numerous overlapping and poorly documented devices, where proof-book entries are unclear and transparencies are required to identify the correct hammer, a perennial challenge for devoted specialists. \$50.00



Item 683-07 – **1¢ printed matter rate to Scotland** – 1887, 1¢ SQ tied by Toronto duplex cancel on a slightly oversized cover paying 1¢ printed-matter rate to Scotland (b/s). At this time the letter rate was per ½ oz, while the printed-matter rate was per 2 oz, in effect since AP 1 79. Addressed to the widow of George Brown, a Father of Confederation (an appealing historical association). A clean and quite respectable 1¢ SQ single-use to Scotland. \$150.00 **SOLD**



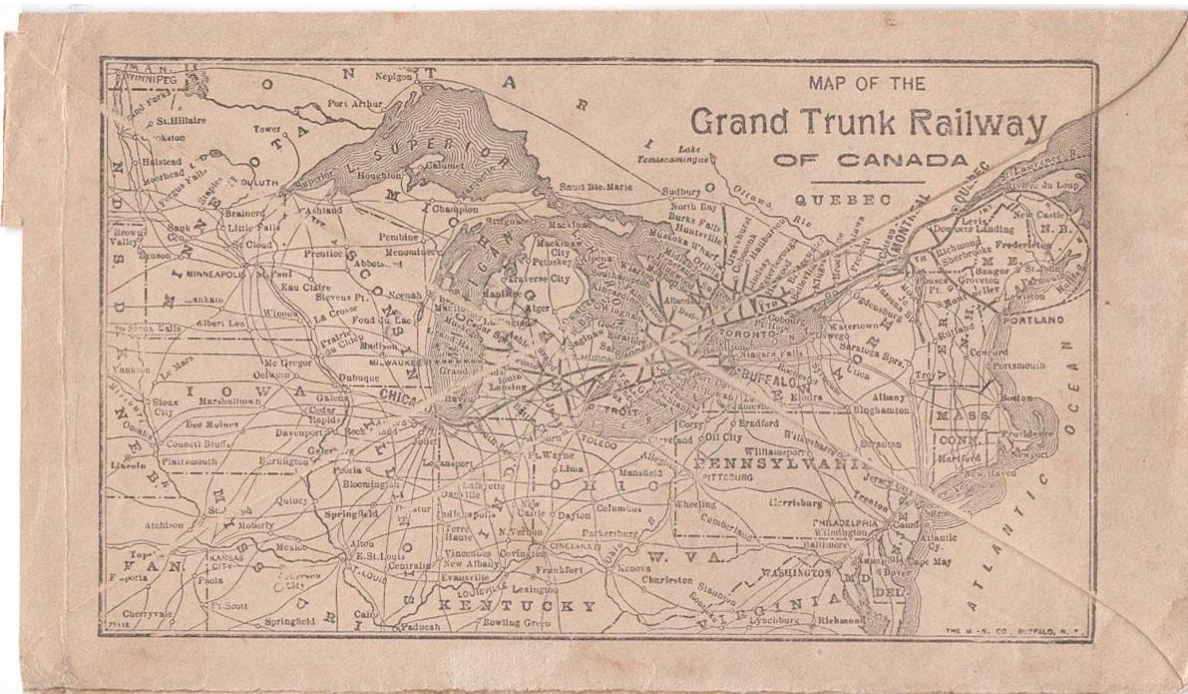
Item 683-08 – **2¢ Prices Current to England** – 1874, 2¢ SQ tied by cork cancel on Prices Current printed circular from Montreal paying 2¢ Prices Current rate to Poole, Dorset, England (b/s). This long-established Poole correspondence is well known, with examples surfacing only occasionally. This one is a clean and attractive example with a sharp cancel. About one inch of the lower portion of the price list is missing, likely separated along the fold and lost over time, yet still a solid and representative 1874 printed-matter rate usage. \$200.00



Item 683-09 – **Barrie & Meaford GTR 'W'Y M.C. (RF E)** – 1897, 3¢ SQ tied by Barrie & Meaford GTR 'W'Y M.C. South cds on cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Barrie (b/s). Gray ON-14, 1894-1897, RF E. \$100.00



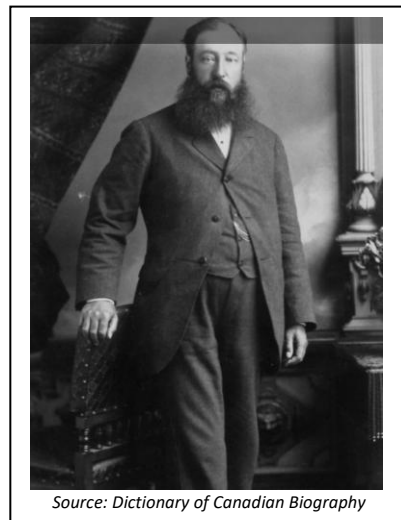
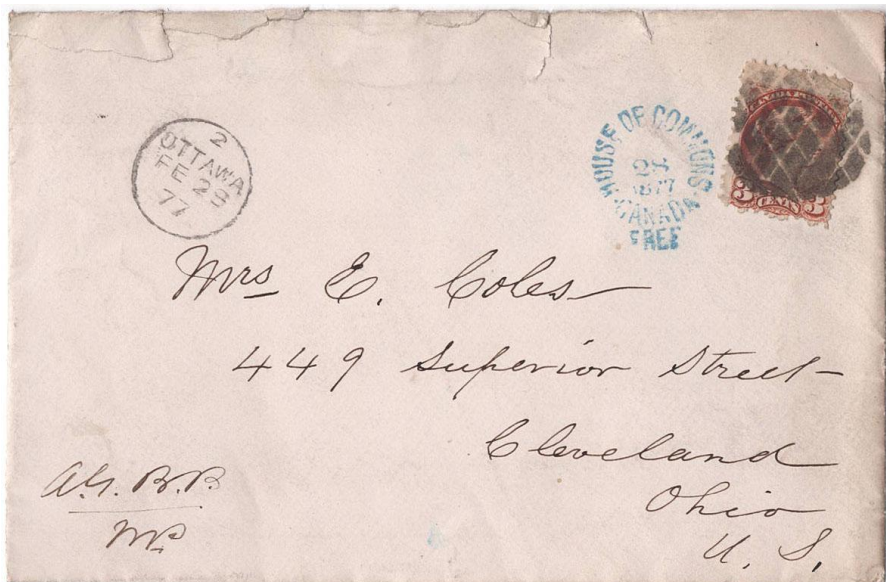
Item 683-10 – **Orillia Ont registered** – 1888, 3¢ SQ (vermillion, 1887 printing) and 2¢ RLS tied by grid cancel on cover from Orillia Ont paying 5¢ registered letter rate to Craighurst (b/s) via Barrie (b/s). A bit rough at the opening, otherwise fine. \$75.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-11 – **Map of the GTR of Canada** – 1893, 3¢ SQ tied by Brampton Ont cds on Grand Trunk Railway and World's Fair Route advertising cover, the front promoting the Niagara Falls and St. Clair Tunnel route, the reverse showing the GTR system map. Slightly cut down at right and to the contour of the stamp, otherwise a very pretty and seldom-encountered GTR advertising cover. \$200.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-12 – **Shortpaid mourning cover to England – OVER ½ OZ.** – 1874, 3¢ SQ pair (perf faults from placement over the edge) tied by fancy cancel on mourning cover from Woodbridge Ont underpaying 12¢ double-weight Allan Line letter rate to England (Reading and Bristol b/s). Struck with Over ½ oz handstamp, More to Pay circular marking, and boxed Deficient Postage Half-Fine 3d plus Fine 1½d total 4½d, then scratched out and replaced with 6d collect for the double deficiency of 3d. Redirected, with a further 1d charge on reverse showing 7d total to collect. Back flap off. A spectacular and highly instructive mourning cover. Ex Ayre, Murphy. \$500.00

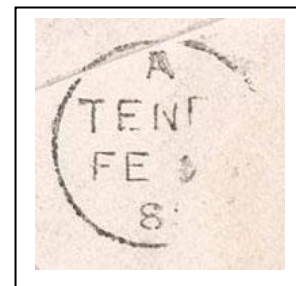
Item 683-13 – **A.G. Ballenden Bannatyne (succeeded Louis Riel)** – 1877, 3¢ SQ tied by Ottawa fancy cancel on cover from the House of Commons to Cleveland, Ohio (b/s). Initially mailed free with the signature of Andrew Graham Ballenden Bannatyne, correctly franked with a 3¢ SQ as it was addressed to the United States. Andrew Graham Ballenden Bannatyne (1829–1889) was a Canadian politician, fur trader, and leading Winnipeg figure. He began his career with the HBC stationed at Norway House, Rupert's Land, later leaving the company and enter business at Red River. Arrested by the HBC for illegal trading in violation of its monopoly, he was released by order of the London office. He rose to prominence in Red River as a major merchant and public official, serving as judge, postmaster, and councillor of Assiniboia and fully aware of the settlement's uncertain future. He acted as a conciliator during the Red River resistance, supporting Métis efforts to secure terms; during the Red River Rebellion he agreed to serve as postmaster in Louis Riel's Provisional Government of the Red River. He later succeeded Louis Riel as the member for Provencher in the Parliament elected in 1875. Rough opening somewhat repaired. \$250.00



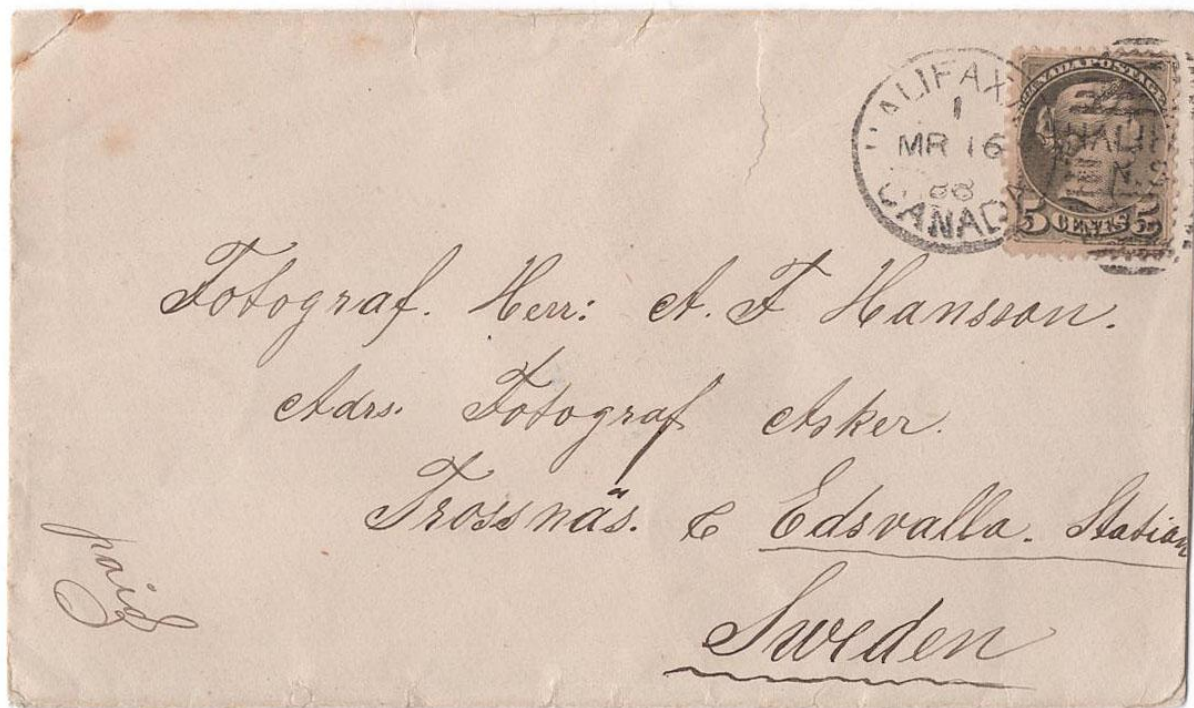
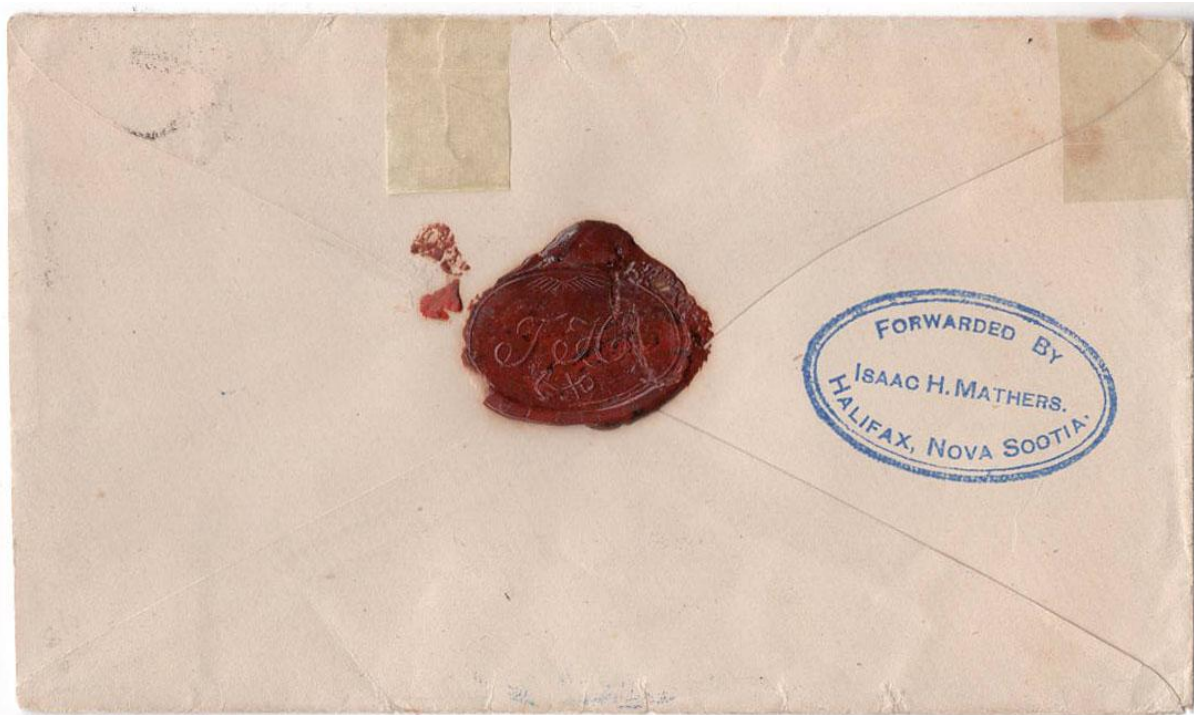
Item 683-14 – **15¢ UPU registered letter rate to England** – 1888, 10¢ SQ (perfs gum-toned) and 5¢ RLS (jumbo, perfs gum-toned) tied by cork cancel on legal-size cover from Montreal paying 15¢ double-weight registered UPU letter rate to London, England. Oval Liverpool and London registered markings on front. Approximately ten covers are recorded bearing this 5¢ RLS and 10¢ SQ combination. \$275.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-15 – **5¢ UPU to Jamaica** – 1881, 5¢ SQ olive-green tied by Halifax duplex cancel on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Jamaica (b/s). Endorsed via New York. Although the monthly British packet from Halifax required 10¢ postage to Jamaica, routing via New York reduced the rate to 5¢, correctly paid here. The cover is addressed to Miss Musgrave, Lady Jeanie Lucinda Musgrave (1833–1920), wife of Sir Anthony Musgrave, Governor of Jamaica from 1877 to 1883, remembered for her philanthropic work and lasting cultural influence on the island. Item 683-16 – **10¢ double weight UPU rate to Wales** – 1891, 5¢ SQ olive-green pair tied by Halifax duplex cancel on cover paying 10¢ double-weight UPU letter rate to Wales (b/s). Carried by the Allan Line Circassian to Liverpool. Mail to Wales is notably rare: study of collections and published data shows that only about 1% of UK-addressed covers are destined for Wales. \$250.00



Item 683-17 – **Halifax to Sweden forwarded by Isaac H. Mathers** – 1888, 5¢ SQ dull olive tied by Halifax duplex cancel on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Sweden. Reverse with wax seal and oval *Forwarded by Isaac H. Mathers Halifax Nova Scotia*. Isaac H. Mathers of Newry, Ireland, established his Halifax shipping agency in 1872, operating the Carvill Line of clipper packets between Halifax and English ports; the firm, now with over 140 years of continuous operation, remains one of North America's most respected marine services and logistics providers, still family-owned and active today. Small tear reinforced by hinge. A very pretty UPU cover to Sweden, forwarded by a Halifax shipping company. \$500.00



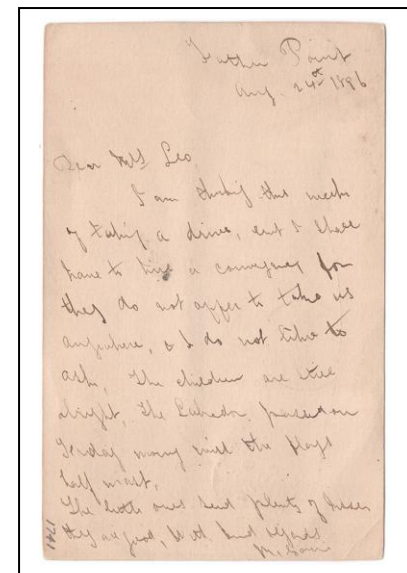
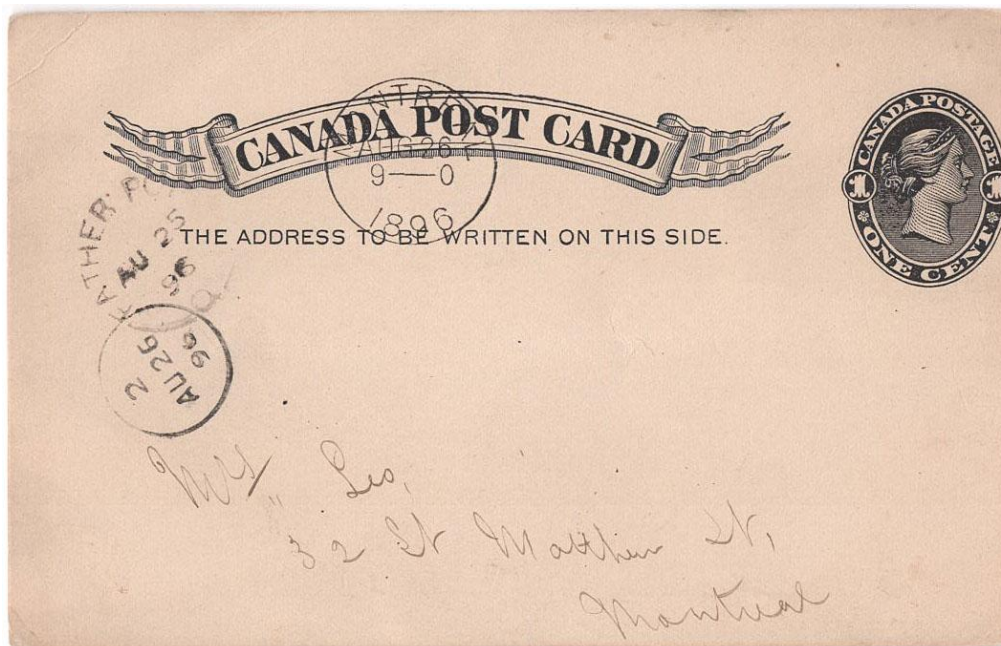
Item 683-18 – **Goderich to Holland** – 1895, 5¢ SQ grey tied by Goderich Ont squared circle on U.S. Consulate cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Holland (b/s). Via Hamilton (b/s). Light staining, exaggerated by the scanner. \$75.00 **SOLD**




Item 683-19 – 1 of the 2 - 9¢ pre-UPU rate to Hawaii – 1878, 2¢ (2) and 5¢ SQ tied by grid cancel on restored cover from Victoria, BC, paying the extremely rare 9¢ pre-UPU letter rate to Honolulu, Hawaii. San Francisco transit (b/s). Red crayon 6 indicating the Canadian Post Office credited 6¢ to the U.S. Post Office for its postage to Honolulu. As previously noted, the front of the cover has been restored; however, the 9¢ pre-UPU rate to Hawaii is itself an exceptional rarity. This cover is believed to be one of only two recorded examples. If you collect pre-UPU rates and are not seeking perfection, this is a remarkable opportunity. \$750.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-20 – **5¢ UPU to Germany, by the Steamship Majestic** – 1897, 5¢ SQ tied by Montreal Imperial machine cancel on cover paying 5¢ UPU letter rate to Germany (b/s), via London (b/s). Endorsed Per S. Majestic / via New York. The Majestic once held the Blue Riband for the fastest Atlantic crossing, later carrying troops to the Boer War; her withdrawal and scrapping in 1912 were delayed by the loss of the Titanic. A clean, attractive cover showing a crisp Imperial machine cancel. \$75.00 **SOLD**

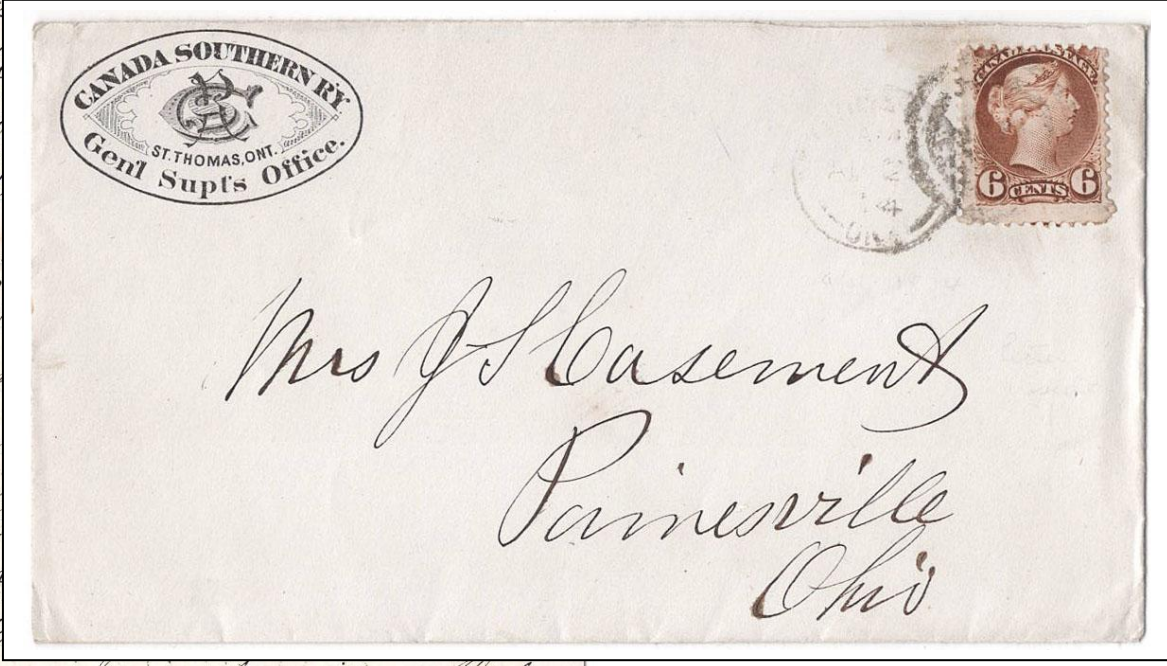


Item 683-21 – **Father Point Q (Q broken circle by Berri)** – 1896, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Father Point Que paying 1¢ postcard rate to Montreal (receiver and carrier marking). The Father Point Q is a Berri device recorded from 1873 to 1897. Only a few examples have been seen over the years, including earlier strikes showing a defaced “Q,” suggesting that more than one hammer was in use during the period. A better-than-average strike. The card itself is reduced at right but with no message lost. \$50.00

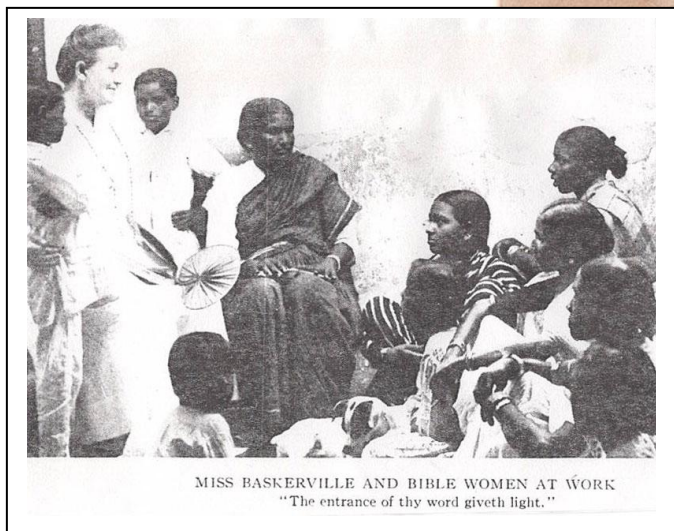

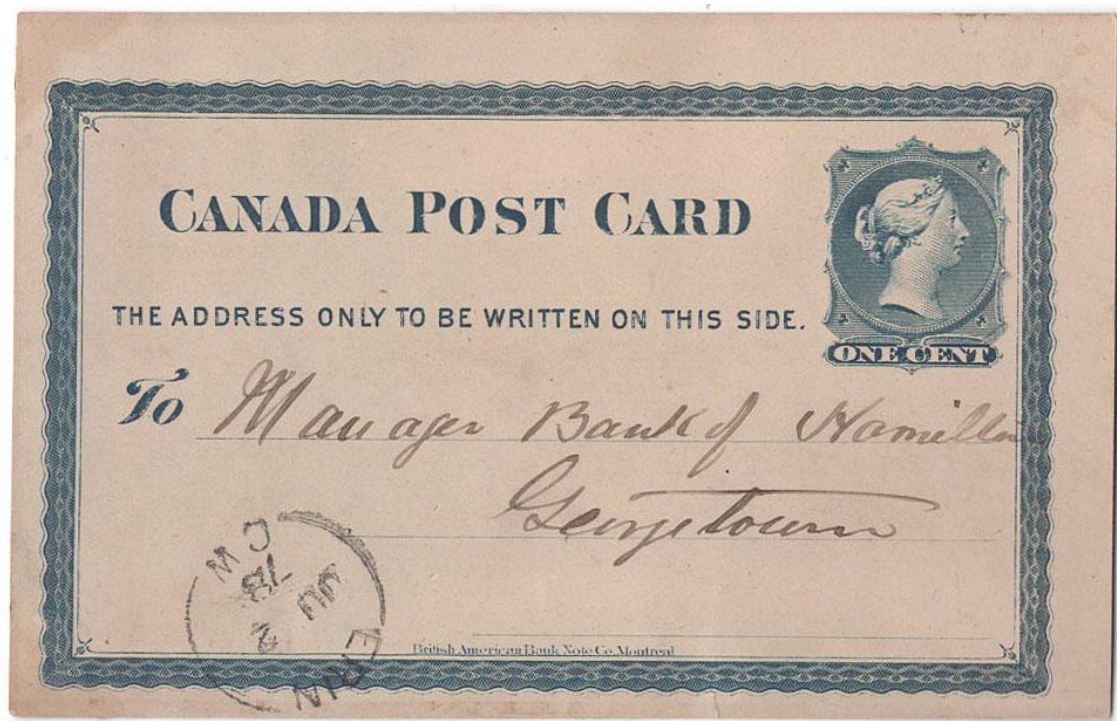

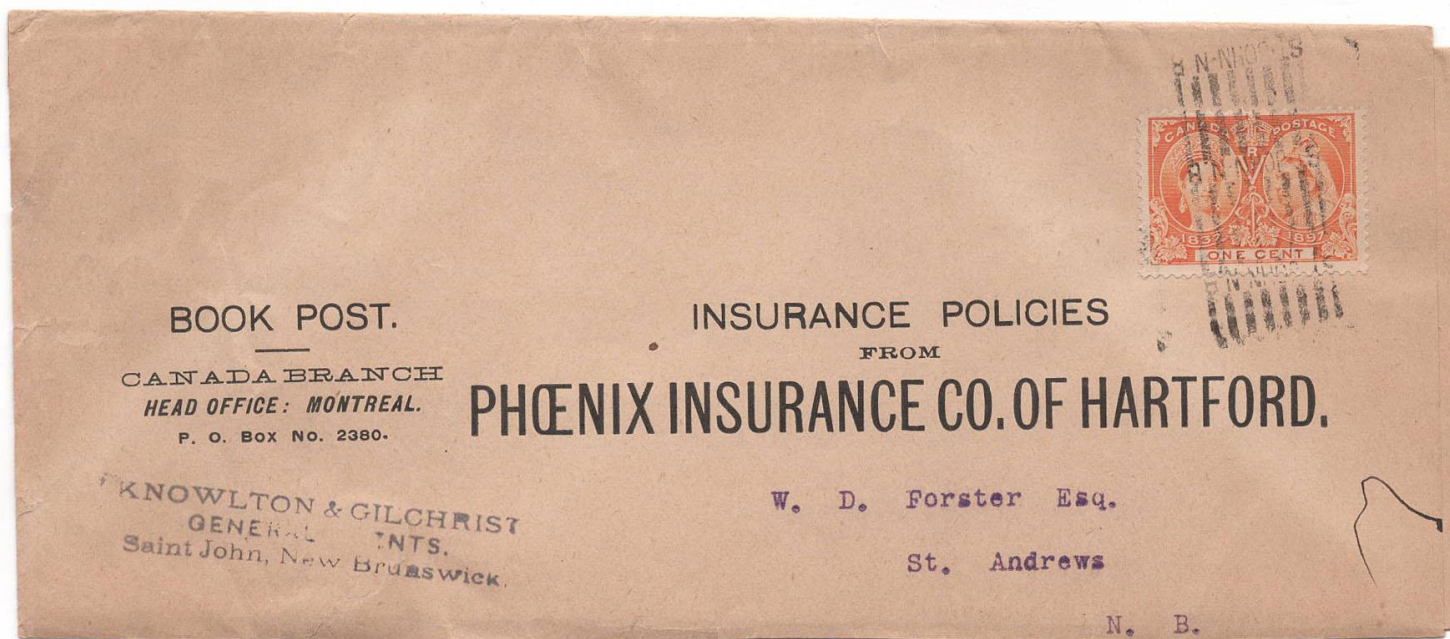
Item 683-22 – **St. Thomas Canada Southern Railway** – 1874, 6¢ SQ tied by target cancel on Canada Southern Railway cover with letter from St. Thomas paying 6¢ cross-border letter rate to Ohio. The letter appears to be from a crew member, mentioning movements toward St. Clair and possibly Buffalo. From St. Thomas, the newly opened Canada Southern Railway, whose major operations were based there, connected Amherstburg (near Detroit/St. Clair) to Fort Erie, providing direct access to the International Railway Bridge and onward to Buffalo, New York. A very rare railway cover with matching letterhead, written by a conductor or brakeman. \$300.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-23 – **Agnes Baskerville 10¢ UPU surtax rate to India** – 1891, 10¢ SQ tied by Dundas Ont cds on cover paying 10¢ UPU surtax rate to India. Hamilton transit, Sea Post Office and Cocanada (b/s). The official rate reduction to 5¢ took effect on OC 1 91. Agnes Baskerville (1862–1939) had arrived in India in October 1888 and spent most of the next fifty years there as a missionary. Approximately 275 covers dated from October 1888 to mid-1895 from this Dundas, Ontario correspondence were released to the market by Sessions in 1962. A decent example with a lovely stamp. \$175.00



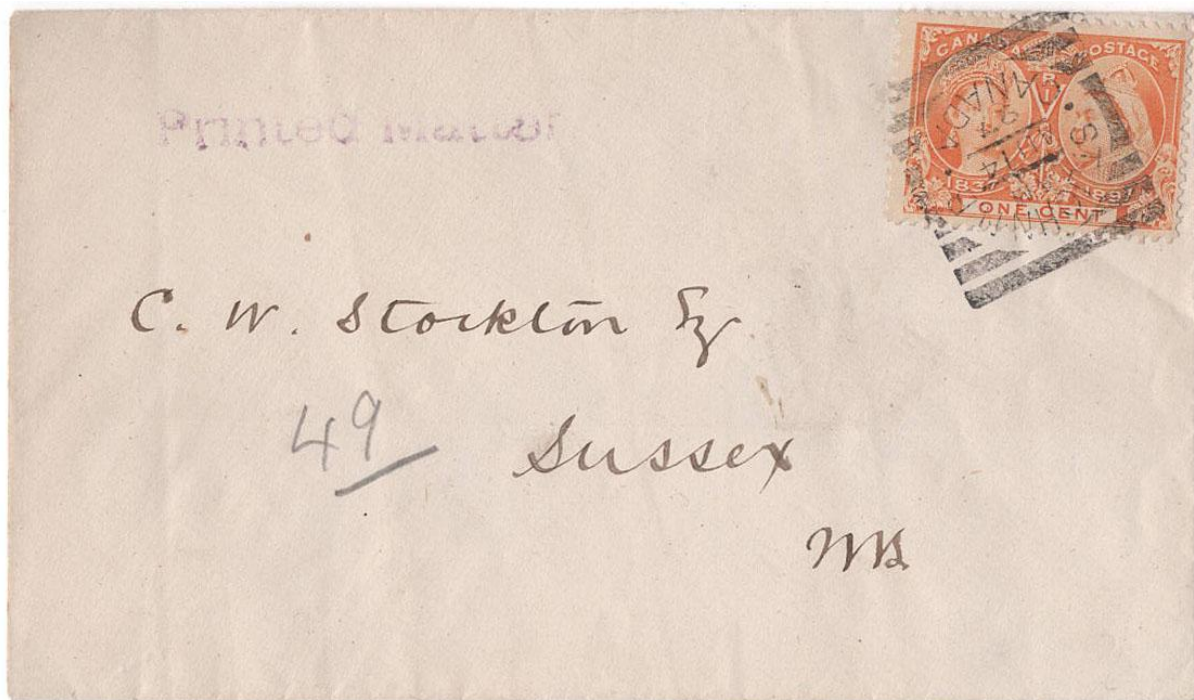
Item 683-24 – **Erin CW (Berri hammer recorded for 4 months only)** – 1878, 1¢ stationery card mailed from Erin, C.W., with Berri hammer C.W. dated JU 2 78 paying 1¢ postcard rate to Georgetown. This scarce Wellington County postmark is recorded from FE 20 78 to JU 2 78, making this card the latest recorded use in a four-month period. \$100.00



Item 683-25 – **1¢ Jubilee on wrapper St. John to St. Andrews NB** – c.1897, 1¢ Jubilee tied by St. John, N.B., roller cancel on insurance-company wrapper, endorsed "Book Post", paying 1¢ printed-matter rate to St. Andrews. According to the Post Office Guide, January 1897, the rate for insurance policies was 1¢ for each two ounces. \$100.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-26 – **1¢ Jubilee paying drop in Stratford** – 1897, 1¢ Jubilee tied by Stratford Ont duplex cancel on cover paying 1¢ drop-letter rate. Very fine. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-27 – **1¢ Jubilee paying printed matter rate** – 1897, 1¢ Jubilee tied by St. John, N.B., squared-circle cancel on cover, endorsed "Printed Matter", paying 1¢ printed-matter rate to Sussex. \$50.00



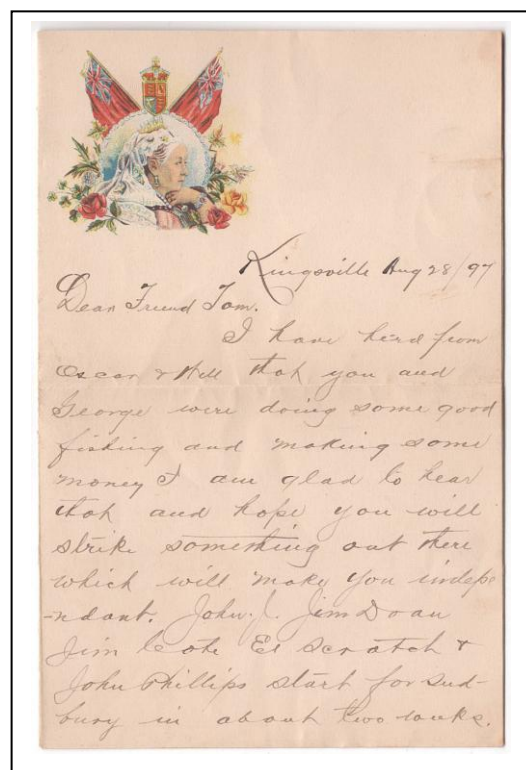
Item 683-28 – **2¢ Jubilee paying drop in Hamilton** – 1897, 2¢ Jubilee tied by Hamilton Orb cancel on cover paying 2¢ drop-letter rate. City of Hamilton letter-carrier marking H J Y 2 5. \$75.00



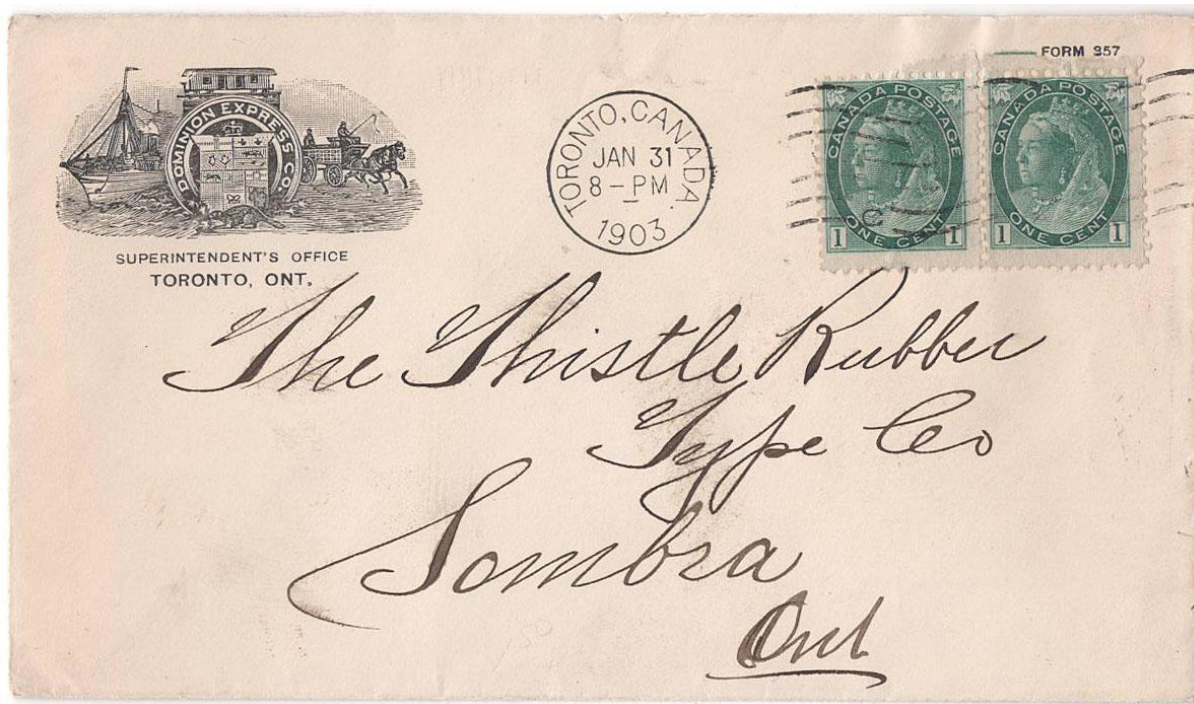
Item 683-29 – **2¢ Jubilee - Notre Dame St. West Montreal** – 1897, 2¢ Jubilee cancelled by fancy dotted cancel on Woollen Mill Co. embossed cover from Notre Dame Street West Montreal, sheep illustrated, paying 2¢ drop-letter rate (b/s). \$150.00



Item 683-30 – **Jubilee - 7¢ drop registered** – 1897, 2¢ (2) and 3¢ Jubilee tied by Victoria BC roller cancel on Bank of BNA cover paying 7¢ drop-registered letter rate. A decidedly uncommon Jubilee registered drop usage much scarcer than its modest appearance suggests. \$150.00 **SOLD**



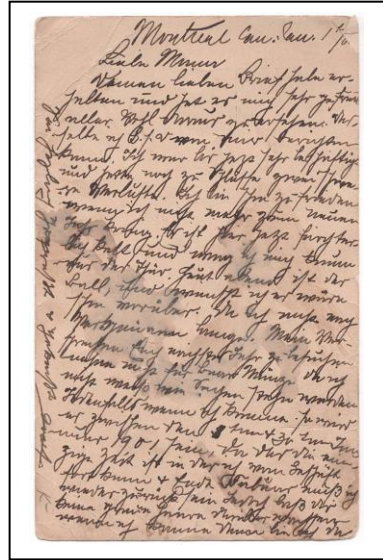
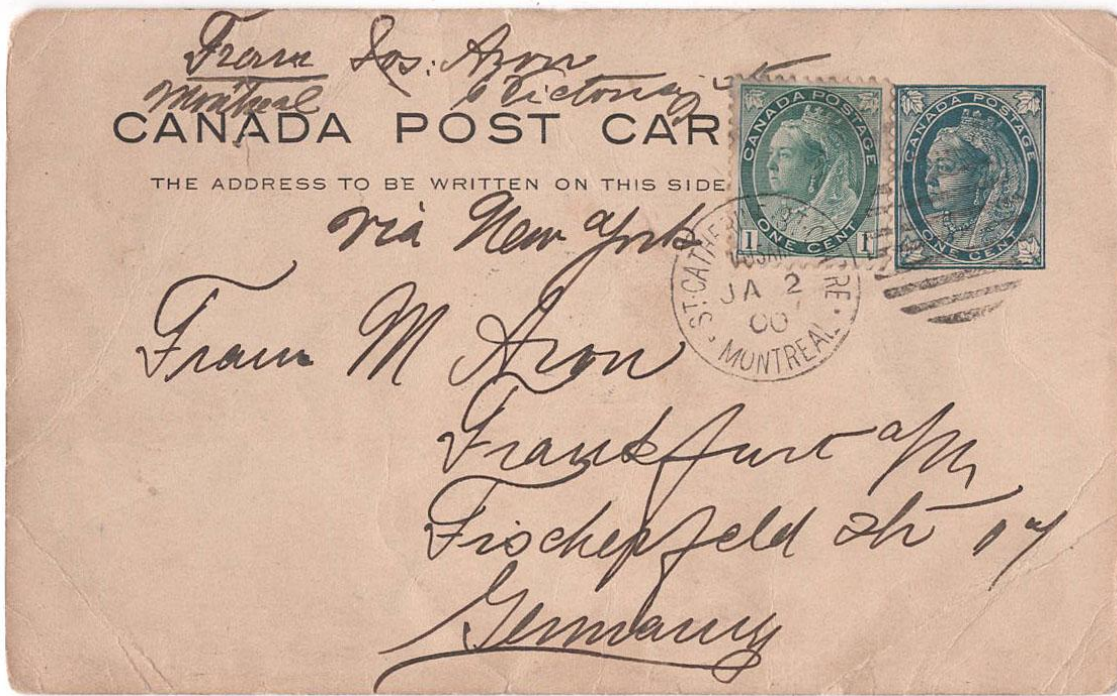
Item 683-31 – **Victoria patriotic cachet with matching letterhead** – 1897, 3¢ Jubilee tied by Kingsville Ont cds on Queen Victoria patriotic cachet cover with matching letterhead, created to celebrate her Diamond Jubilee, paying 3¢ letter rate to Mission City, BC (b/s) via Windsor (b/s). A seldom-seen side-profile portrait of the elderly Queen, adorned with royal jewellery and white veil within a floral frame. A striking and uncommon patriotic design. \$350.00



Item 683-32 – Dominion Express Company advertising – 1903, 1¢ Numeral (2) tied by Toronto International machine cancel on Dominion Express Co. illustrated advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Sombra (b/s). The design features heraldic elements, steamship, train car, and horse-drawn delivery wagon, an eye-catching full-theme express vignette. Just wow! \$150.00 **SOLD**



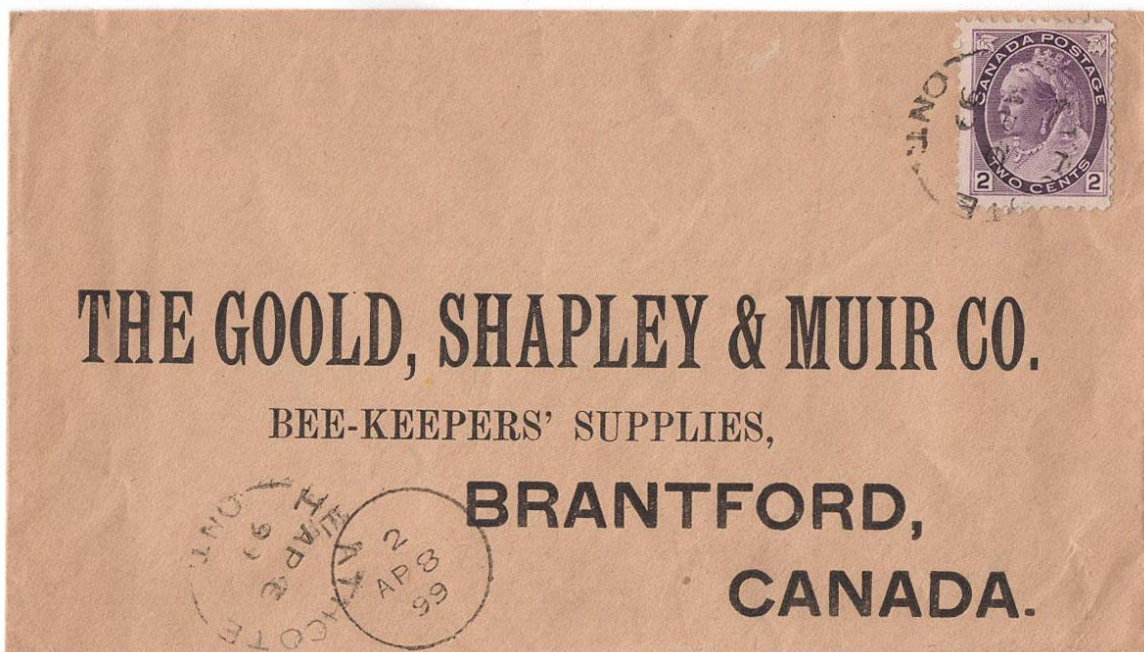
Item 683-33 – The Usher Steamship Co. advertising – 1903, 2¢ Numeral tied by Yarmouth N.S. duplex cancel on Usher Steamship Co. advertising cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Cape Breton (b/s). The design shows the company steamer tall funnel and two masts flying a flag. An appealing and very scarce Yarmouth steamship company cover. \$125.00



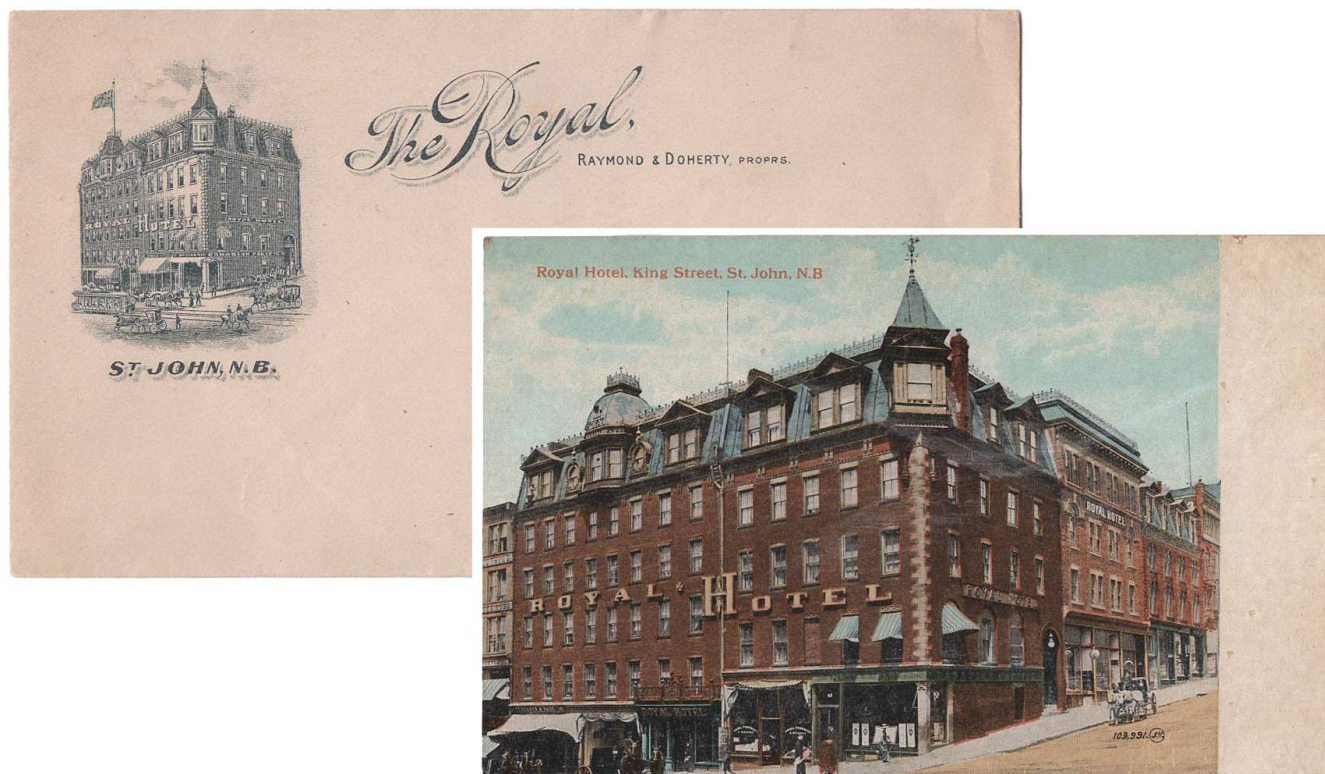
Item 683-34 – **St. Catherines St. Centre to Germany** – 1900, 1¢ Numeral tied by St. Catherines Street Centre, Montreal, duplex cancel on 1¢ stationery postcard paying 2¢ UPU postcard rate to Germany. A common foreign destination, but decidedly scarce from a street office. \$100.00



Item 683-35 – **Owen Sound biscuits and confectionery** – 1898, 3¢ Numeral tied by Owen Sound Ont cds on J. McLauchlan & Son Biscuits and Confectionery c/c cover paying 3¢ letter rate to Little Current (Cheese Factory). 3¢ Numeral covers are all scarce. \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-36 – **Brantford letter carrier** – 1899, 2¢ Numeral tied by Heathcote Ont broken circle on bee-keepers' supplies cover paying 2¢ letter rate to Brantford (b/s) via Clarkson (b/s). Delivered in Brantford by letter carrier with small circle 2 AP 8 99. A very elusive Brantford letter-carrier cover, this is the first example I have encountered in years. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-37 – **St. John Royal Hotel cover and card** – c.1905, attractive pair of unused Royal Hotel items comprising a Valentine-published street-view postcard and an illustrated advertising cover naming the proprietors. A clean, appealing duo from this period. \$25.00



Item 683-38 – **Hydraulic B.C. (Quesnelle Hydraulic Gold Mining Co.)** – 1912, 2¢ Edward vertical pair tied by grid cancel on Quesnelle Hydraulic Gold Mining Co. c/c cover from Hydraulic B.C. paying 4¢ double-weight letter rate to Pennsylvania (b/s). Light edge wrinkling consistent with a heavier enclosure. A rare RF D office and a highly desirable Cariboo mining-camp usage. \$400.00

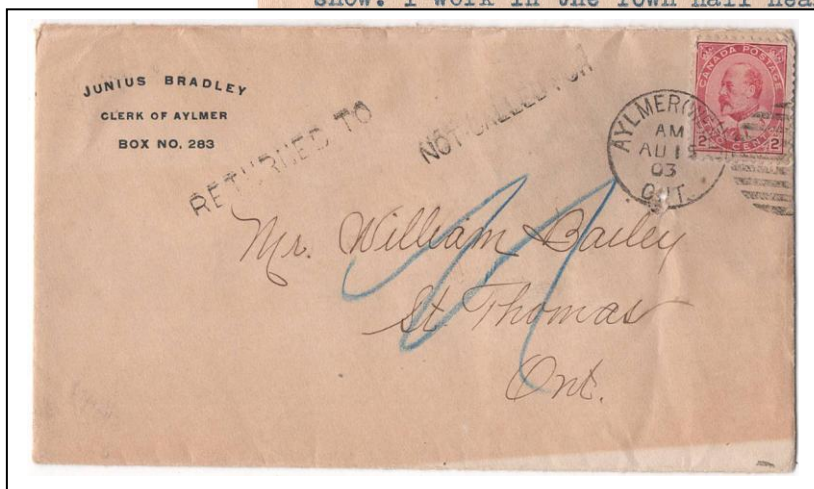

Item 683-39 – **Police case about hugging a girl** – 1903, 2¢ Edward tied by Aylmer West Ont duplex cancel on Clerk of Aylmer c/c cover, with letter, paying 2¢ letter rate to St. Thomas (b/s). Not called for and returned to sender. The enclosed letter discusses local business matters and cases, including an amusing note about a boy hugging a girl, and being let go. \$25.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-40 – **Earl of Dundonald E1 special delivery with seal** – 1904, 2¢ Edward and 10¢ Special Delivery E1 tied by Sherbrooke Que cds on cover paying the 12¢ special-delivery letter rate to Ottawa (b/s). Sealed on the reverse with the Sherbrooke Crown wax seal. Addressed to the Earl of Dundonald, Douglas Cochrane, 12th Earl of Dundonald, appointed General Officer Commanding the Militia of Canada in April 1902. He arrived in Ottawa that month, residing with his wife at Crichton-Lodge, and served for over two years. A notable figure, related to the famed naval hero Thomas Cochrane, who led the Chilean navy in its struggle against Spain during the Chilean War of Independence. A choice special-delivery usage to a distinguished military recipient; top back flap off, premium in the Crown wax seal. \$275.00



Item 683-41 – **Seaforth Ont registered (Huron)** – 1928, 10c Admiral and 2c Scroll tied by Seaforth Ont cds on cover paying 12c registered letter rate to Toronto (House of Assembly duplex b/s). Carried by Tor & Strat & Goderich RPO 36. A clean late-Admiral/early-Scroll mixed franking. \$25.00

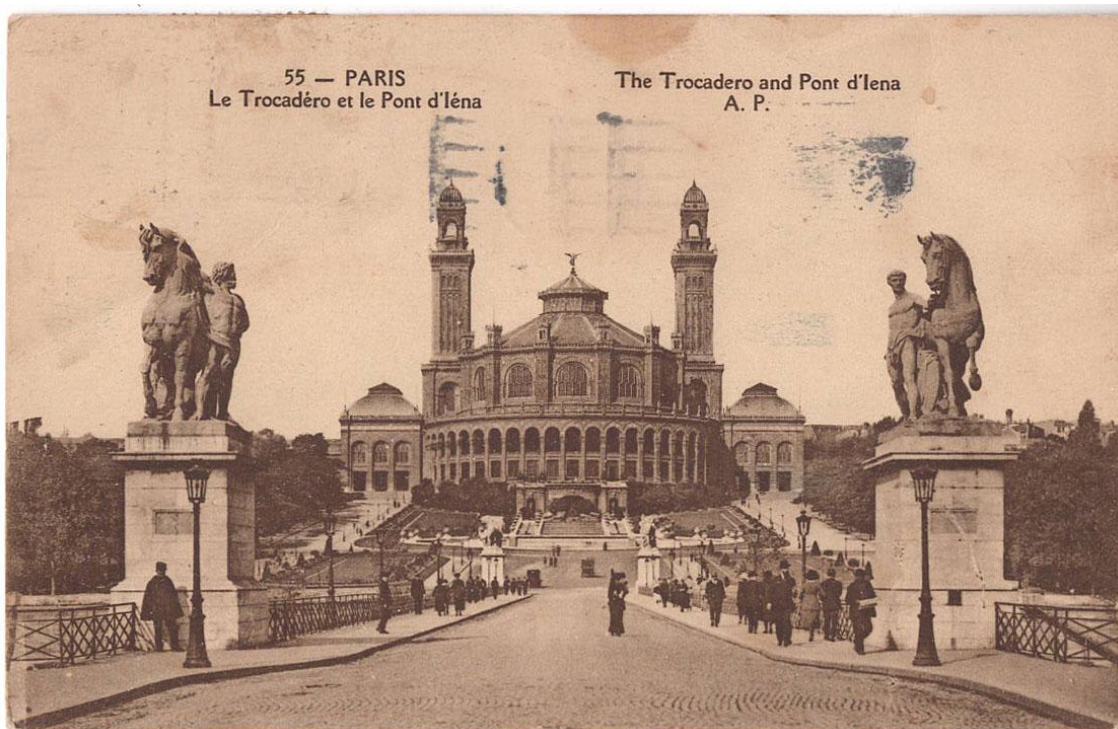

Item 683-42 – **12¢ registered with AR service to Detroit** – 1928, 10¢ Admiral and 2¢ Confederation tied by Hamilton Ont cds on cover with contents paying 12¢ registered letter rate to Detroit. AR service requested, unclaimed and returned to sender. Enclosed is a final notice before suit from a doctor, an interesting AR usage where the enclosed content clearly explains why the service was paid for. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-43 – **French postcard mailed at Quebec** – 1923, 2¢ Admiral and France 15 centimes Sower pair tied by Quebec Que machine cancel on postcard paying 2¢ postcard rate to New York, with an additional Germany 100 Mk stamp. Message notes in part: leaving Paris today (July 23), it is so beautiful... Eiffel Tower, etc. Originally franked in France and ready for mailing, but most likely posted on board ship en route to North America or at the Quebec docks on arrival, then processed by the Quebec Post Office on AU 4. An interesting card. \$50.00



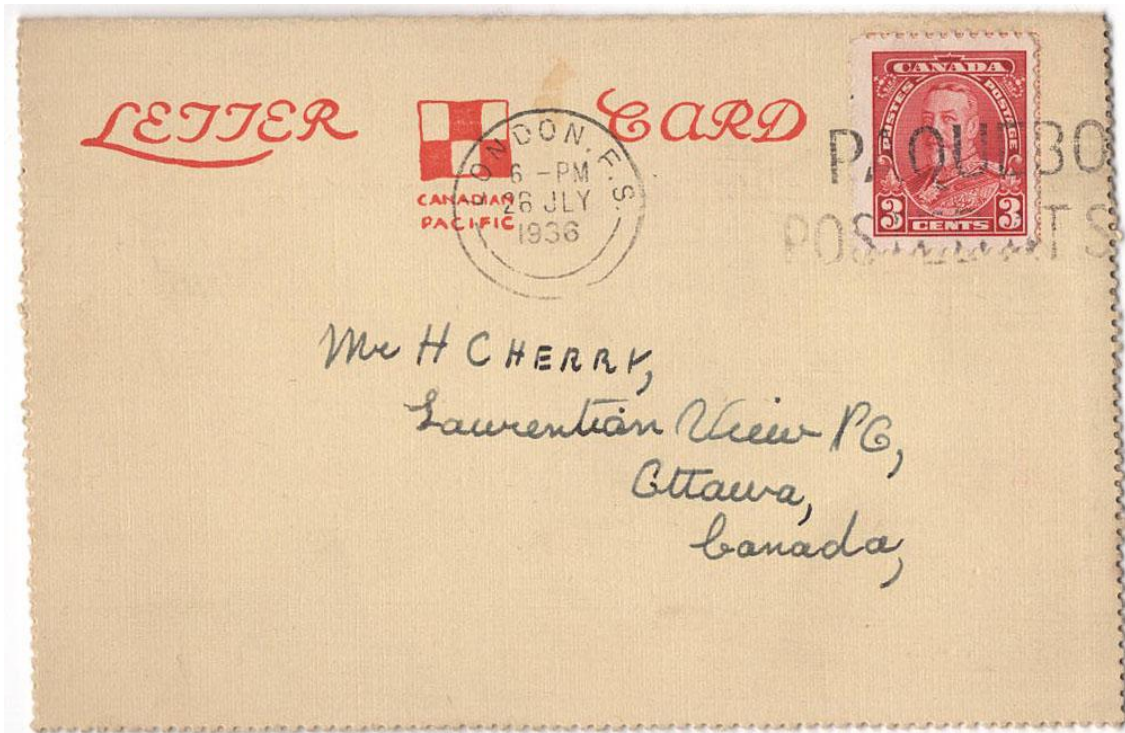
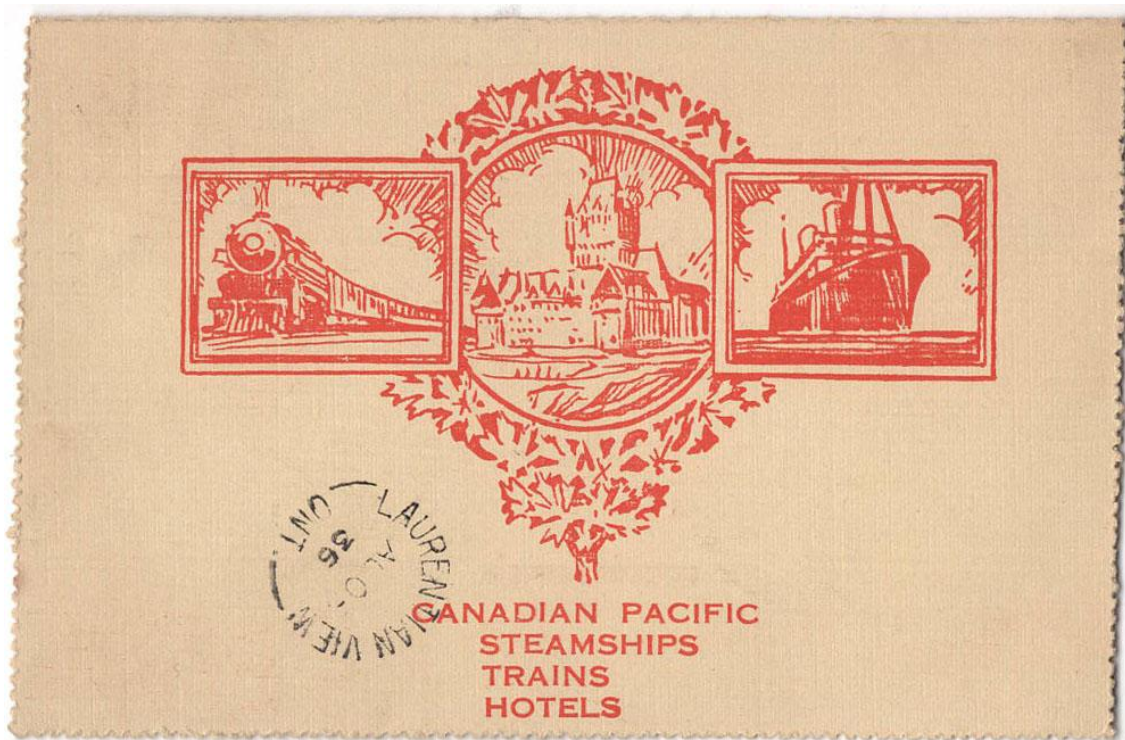
Item 683-44 – **23¢ special delivery rate with E1 pair** – 1922, 3¢ Admiral and 10¢ Special Delivery E1 pair tied by Toronto duplex “C” cancel on cover paying 23¢ special-delivery letter rate to Ottawa (b/s). Light gum perf toned. \$200.00



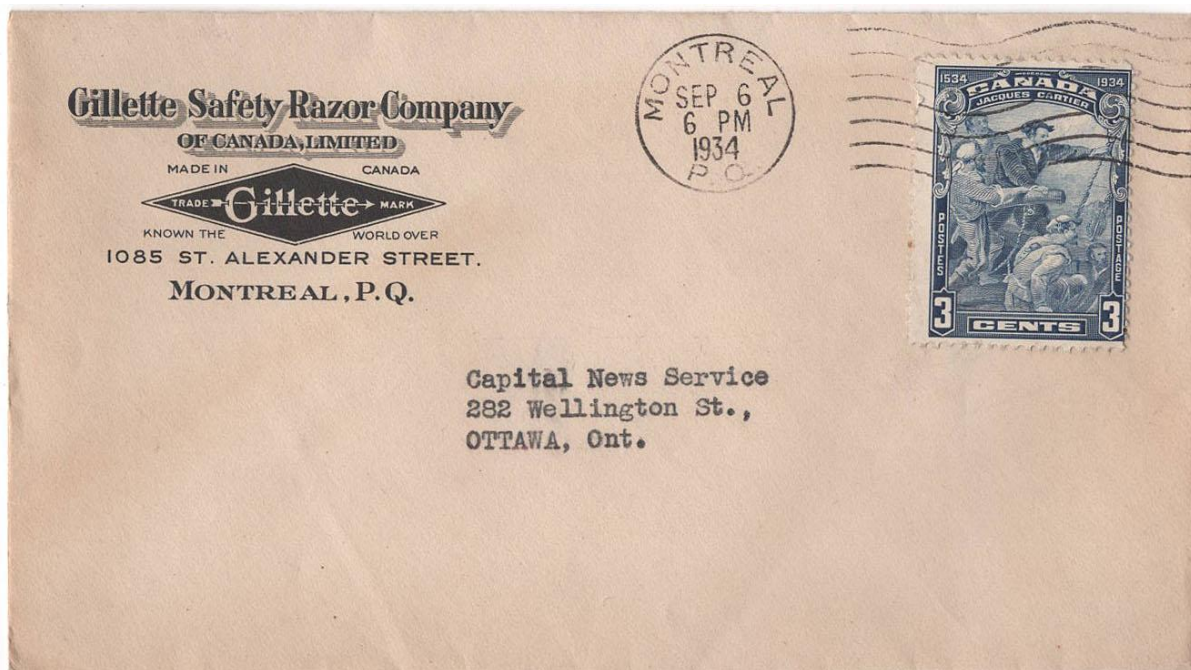
Item 683-45 – **3¢ UPU postcard rate to Romania** – 1933, 1¢ Arch tied by Toronto machine cancel on 2¢ Arch postal stationery card, correctly paying 3¢ UPU postcard rate to Roumania; an attractive usage with a pair of Romanian receiver markings. \$75.00



Item 683-46 – **Western Fair and Cowan Hardware Ltd** – 1935, 3¢ Pictorial tied by London machine cancel on Western Fair advertising cover with Cowan Hardware Ltd c/c, paying 3¢ letter rate to Hamilton. Reverse promoting London as the “*centre of the universe*” with distances in miles from surrounding towns to London. An appealing fair-themed advertising usage. \$50.00 **SOLD**



Item 683-47 – Canadian Pacific letter card to Laurentian View Ont – 1936, 3¢ Pictorial tied by London Paquebot Posted at Sea machine cancel on CP letter card, paying 3¢ letter rate to Laurentian View Ont (b/s). 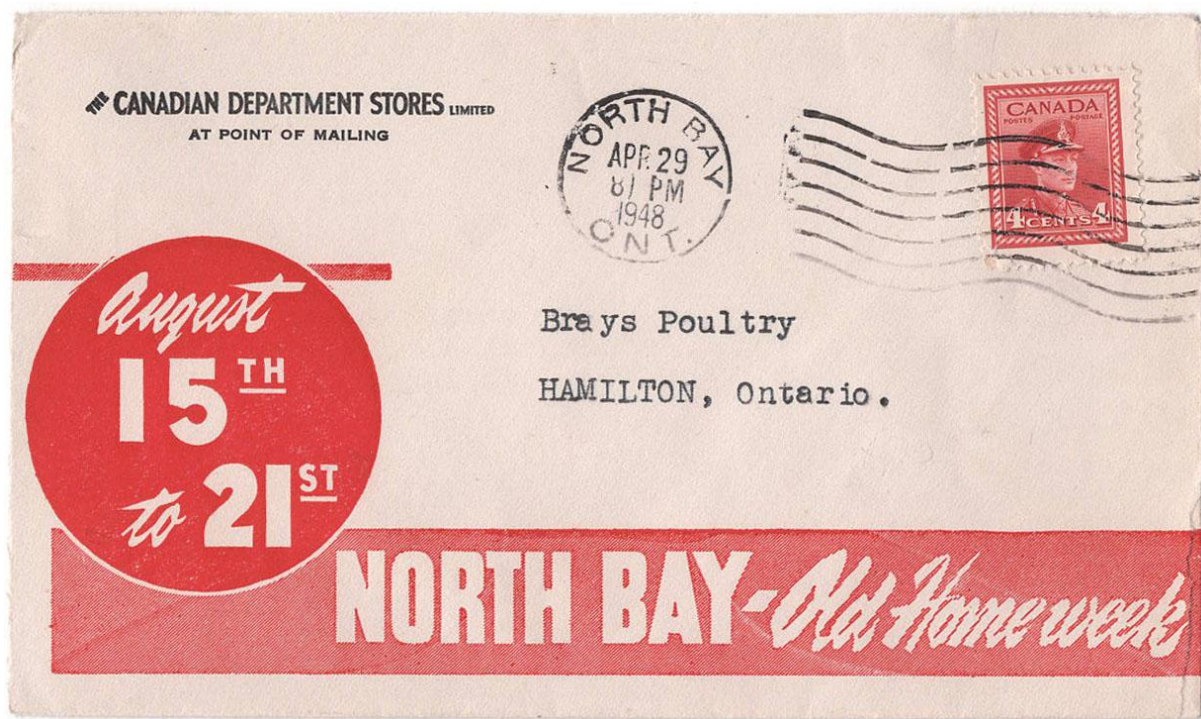

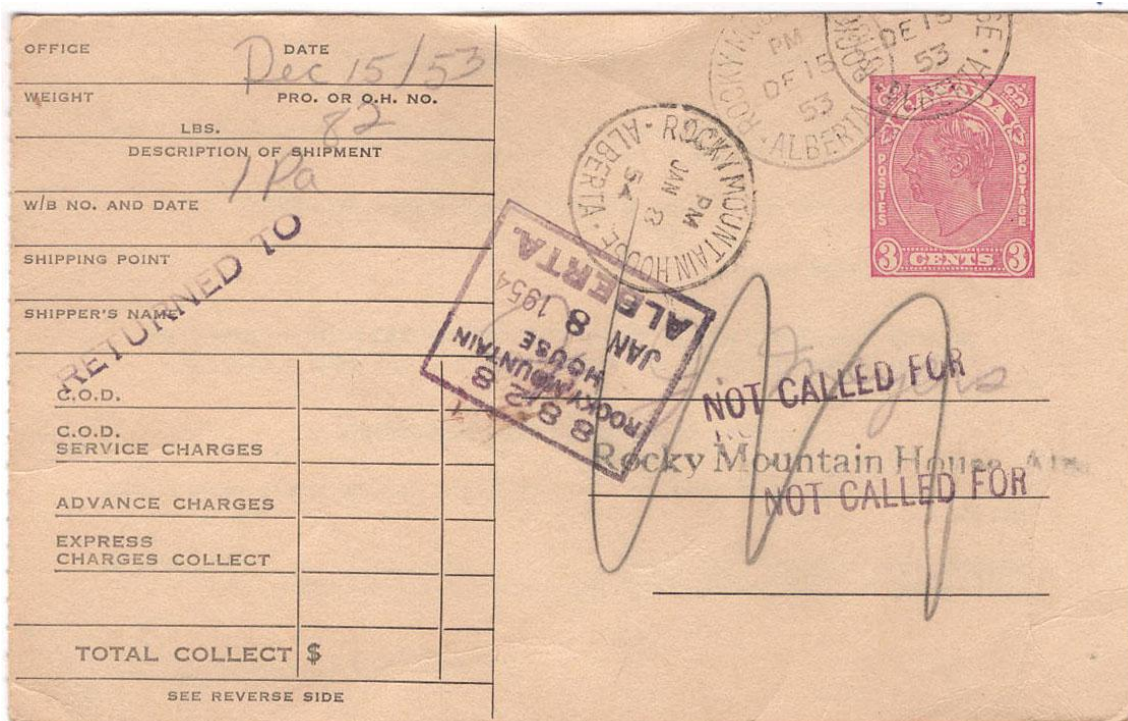

Item 683-50 – **Saskatoon to Hungary via Egypt, suspended** – 1941, 2c and 3c Mufti tied by Saskatoon machine cancel on cover with physician-and-surgeon letter, paying 5c UPU letter rate to Hungary. Censored in Canada with C.57 label and dispatched, but mail service to Hungary was suspended on April 19 1941 (P.O. Weekly Bulletin XXI #1050). The cover was intercepted in Egypt, where it was censored again, resealed with bilingual blue-on-white tape, and struck with T.5795 censor marking. Returned to Canada and handled by the Inspection Division at the Dead Letter Office (DE 3 41). A highly unusual routing via Egypt, adopted because direct overland transmission to Hungary through Europe had become impossible. Rare. \$400.00 **SOLD**
